NCAA ACTION



The Buffs have made 12 trips to March Madness, including six straight in the 1990s (one of 15). When Ceal Barry and the Buffs reached the pinnacle as the No. 1 seed in the Midwest Region in 1995, it was a first for Colorado and the Big Eight Conference.

The fans in Boulder came out in full force for the 1995 Midwest Region first and second rounds, selling out the Buffs' games against Holy Cross and Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State) with a then-NCAA record 11,072 for each contest.

From 1993 to 1997, Colorado had one of the more impressive NCAA Tournament runs going 10-5 and advancing to three Sweet 16s and two Elite Eight rounds.

In fact, the Buffs were only one of 10 schools to advance to at least four Sweet 16s in that span and one of 11 to advance to the elite round of eight.

The NCAA Tournament will return to the Coors Events Center for the first time since 2003 as Colorado will play host to first and second round games of the Women's Championship, March 23 & 25, 2013. This will be the 12th different season that Colorado has hosted one or more rounds of the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, including 1992 where the Buffaloes hosted a first round session as well as the Midwest Regional.

CU has hosted two NCAA tournaments at the Pepsi Center in Denver; the 2001 Midwest Regional and 2006 first and second round games.
