this weekend. Oregon leads the Pac-12 with 197 3-pointers (9.4 3mpg) while the Beavers are second with 190 on the season (8.6 3mpg).

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 13-8 and tied with Oregon and Utah for ninth place in the Pac-12 at 3-7, but just two games out of the upper half of the conference standings with eight to play. The Buffaloes split their home-and-home series with Utah last week, each team winning at home.

Colorado is averaging 70.0 points per game while hitting 42 percent from the field and 71 percent from the free-throw line. Colorado has three players averaging double-digits and eight players scoring at least five per contest.

The Buffaloes lead the Pac-12 in 3-point defense (.272) while ranking second in scoring defense (61.0), free-throw percentage (.705) and blocked shots (3.9 bpg) and third in scoring margin (+9.0).

Sophomore forward **Arielle Roberson** leads Colorado in scoring, at 12.8 points per game, and rebounding at 7.8 per contest. She had a game-high 18 points and eight rebounds in the win over Utah. Roberson played well defensively in the Utah series. Matched up against All-Pac-12 forward Michelle Plouffe for much of the series, she held the Utes' leading scorer to 7-of-27 from the field over two games; and just seven points in Colorado's 61-45 win on Feb. 2.

Last season's Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, Roberson has a team-best four double-doubles on the season which all occurred within the final five nonconference games, including the Southern Utah contest where she scored 18 points and grabbed a career-high 14 rebounds. She recorded three straight double-doubles (Wyoming-Illinois-Denver), becoming the first Buff to do that since Chucky Jeffery had three in a row from Feb. 3-Feb. 10, 2013 (at USC, vs. Oregon State, vs. Oregon). She had a season-high 22 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Denver. In that game she established team-season and career-highs in free throws made (13) and attempted (17).

Roberson was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for Dec. 2-8 averaging 15 points and 11 rebounds while hitting 48 percent from the field in the wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She ranks seventh in offensive rebounds (3.2 orpg), eighth in overall rebounds, 14th in defensive rebounding (4.6 drpg), 15th in blocked shots (0.7 bpg) and 19th in scoring on the Pac-12 charts.

Junior forward **Jen Reese** leads Colorado and ranks seventh in the Pac-12 in field-goal accuracy at 49.2 percent. She is the Buffaloes' second leading scorer and rebounder at 12.5 points and 5.8 rebounds an outing. Reese had just 10 points combined in the two games against Utah, but played well all around in the home win hitting 3-of-5 shots (7 points) while collecting six rebounds.

Reese had an outstanding weekend against the Arizona schools averaging 22 points and 7.5 rebounds on 55 percent from the field and 91 percent from the free-throw line. In the win over Arizona she tied her career-best with 22 points, hitting 62 percent from the field and 86 percent from the free-throw line. Reese matched her scoring output on Jan. 26 against No. 14/23 Arizona State for her third career 20-point outing, two of which came over the weekend. She established career-highs in field goals made (9), attempted (18) and minutes played (36) while hitting a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line and pulling down eight rebounds.

She has scored in double-figures in 13 of her 20 games including four straight prior to the Utah series, averaging 18.0 during that span. Reese recorded the second double-double of her career with 14 points and a team season-best 14 rebounds at Louisville. Her 14 rebounds also matched her career high which she also achieved against UCLA in 2011.

Senior guard **Brittany Wilson** leads the team in assists (67) and steals (27) while ranking third in scoring (11.2 ppg). She averaged 16 points and 5.5 rebounds in the Utah series, including a game-high 22 points in Salt Lake City. She was 8-for-8 from the foul line in that game, a team-season best in terms of free throws without a miss. Wilson, who leads Colorado in scoring during Pac-12 play (12.3 ppg), is averaging 14.4 points and 4.8 assists over the last five games. She nearly recorded her second career double-double with 12 points and a career and team season-high nine assists in the win over Arizona. On the overall Pac-12 charts, Wilson ranks 13th in assists, 14th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.1) and 24th in scoring.

Wilson is third in the Pac-12 in free-throw accuracy during league games at 84.3 percent hitting 43-of-51. She has made 38-of-42 over the last seven games (.905) and 24-of-27 in the last three alone (.889). Her 3.6 assists average during Pac-12 play ranks sixth on the league charts.

Sophomore forward **Jamee Swan** has started eight of the last 11

contests and is averaging 5.9 points on 49 percent from the field and 77 percent from the line. She leads the Buffaloes and ranks ninth in the Pac-12 in blocked shots (1.0 bpg). Swan recorded 15 points, nine rebounds and a season-high three blocked in the loss at Utah. Swan recorded her second career double-double in the Stanford game with career-highs in points (20) and rebounds (13). She hit 9-of-17 from the field and dished out a personal best five assists.

Senior guard **Ashley Wilson** registered six points, seven rebounds and three assists in the win over Utah. She hit 6-of-6 from the free-throw line in that game, increasing her season free-throw percentage to .774, ranking sixth on the Pac-12 leaderboard. Wilson's status is just as good in league only games, ranking sixth at 80.5 percent. She scored 12 points off the bench, including a career-high tying six free throws against Arizona State, her third double-digit effort of the season.

Wilson scored a career-best 14 points in the win over Southern Utah, and then backed up that performance with 12 points and six rebounds against USC. Her back-to-back double-figure scoring games are a first for her, in fact she only had two double-figure scoring games in her first 97 career outings.

Freshman guard **Lauren Huggins** has provided a nice scoring punch off the bench. Huggins leads Colorado from 3-point range with 29 on the season with multiple 3-pointers seven games. She tied her own career and team season high with five 3-pointers in the win over Arizona, finishing with 15 points. She made 5-of-8 from downtown after making only one of her previous 10 and 2-of-16 during her first six Pac-12 games. Huggins also played great defense against the Wildcats recording a personal-best two blocked shots while also coming up with three rebounds and two steals. Huggins ranks 14th in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made (1.5 3mpg).

Freshman **Haley Smith** has started the last seven games for the Buffaloes, putting together one of the best all-around efforts of her young career against Utah. She recorded career-bests with eight points, eight rebounds and dished out four assists against the Utes. After grabbing a total of only 12 rebounds in her first 14 games, she's become more of a presence on the boards, averaging 4.4 over the past five games.

Junior guard **Lexy Kresl**, returned to game action against Utah after missing three games with an injury to her right leg. She started the first 16 games and had been running a solid point prior to her injury averaging 9.2 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game. Kresl continues to lead the Pac-12 in free-throw accuracy at 89.4 percent (42-of-47) while ranking ninth in assists and 11th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.5).

Kresl was the MVP of the 2013 Omni Hotels Classic averaging 15.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists. She dished out a career-high six assists, with no turnovers, and added 12 points in the first round win over South Alabama. Kresl scored 19 points in the championship game, just one point off her career high, hitting 7-of-14 from the field and adding four assists, five rebounds and three steals.

Junior guard **Jasmine Sborov** started the first 14 games averaging 7.8 points and 4.6 rebounds per game but is sidelined with a broken bone in her right foot. Over her last four games she averaged 7.0 rebounds which included her first career double-double, scoring 12 points and grabbing a career-best 10 rebounds against Southern Utah. Sborov was solid in the UCLA game, scoring 11 points on 4-of-7 from the field along with eight rebounds. She played a career-high 33 minutes against the Bruins and also matched her personal best by drilling a pair of 3-pointers.

Sborov has hit 72.4 percent from the foul line, delivering a pair of clutch performances on the road. She hit two foul shots at Colorado State with under a minute left to give Colorado a three point lead. In the win over Wyoming, she iced the game for the Buffaloes with

CORVALLIS, Ore. - The No. 19 Colorado women's basketball team turned a slow start into a 66-63 overtime victory Sunday against Oregon State to finish the Pac-12 Conference season 13-5.

The Buffs' 13 league wins this season trail only the 1989 and '95 squads, both of which finished their seasons 14-0 and made it to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

CU shot just 33.8 percent from the field but outrebounded the Beavers 49-36. Senior guard **Chuckie Jeffery** scored a game-high 25 points, while redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** earned her second career double-double Sunday with 10 points and a team-high 11 rebounds. Eight of those were on the offensive end, a number just two off from the program record.

"We knew how we wanted to end the regular season, but now it's one-and-done from here on out," said Jeffery, who also contributed seven rebounds. "We had a heck of a regular season, but now it's Pac-12 tournament time, and anybody can win."

With a win over Oregon on Friday, the Buffs secured a No. 4 seed and first-round bye at the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Tournament, set for March 7-10 at the KeyArena in Seattle.

But even with a first-round bye already locked down, the Buffs had no easy go of Sunday's matchup against the Beavers.

"Coach said this was probably how the game was probably going to go," Jeffery said of OSU's aggressiveness. "They weren't going to come out and give it to us, we were going to have to earn it, and that's what they did. I think it was a good game for us to end our regular season on, it was very competitive."

It was senior day for the Beavers at Gill Coliseum, and the strength of the OSU upperclassmen showed early. Four OSU seniors hit the court at some point in the first nine minutes of the game, helping the Beavers to a 22-9 lead with 11:05 left in the half.

OSU seniors Mollee Schwiegler, Quortni Fambro and Patricia Bright put up a combined 15 points in the half, including two Schwiegler three-pointers in the first four minutes. The Beavers built their largest lead, 18, at the 6:50 mark, but CU responded with a 14-2 run to head into the locker room trailing by just five (28-33).

"We don't give up," Jeffery said. "They were hitting shot after shot, and it was kind of draining us, but we just had to keep plugging . . . we started cutting the lead, and we started getting settled, getting stops on defense and making baskets."

Jeffery opened the second half with a layup and made two free throws to bring the Buffs back within one (33-32), but a strong OSU defense held CU to just four points over the next six minutes.

But then it was OSU's turn for a scoring drought, as CU turned up the energy on both ends of the court with a 15-4 run. Junior center **Rachel Hargis** gave the Buffs their first lead of the game with a jumper at the 7:09 mark, and while CU would build a five-point lead with 2:12 on the clock, the Beavers weren't done yet. With nine seconds remaining, OSU freshman guard Jamie Weisner hit a three-pointer to tie the score at 56-56 send the game into overtime.

The Buffs went on a 7-1 run to gain a six-point overtime lead, but OSU would fight to the finish as Weisner hit another three with 30 seconds on the clock. Jeffery then hit one of two free throws, but OSU guard Ali Gibson responded with a deep, nearly half-court trey to close CU's lead to one (64-63) with 6.3 seconds remaining.

Roberson was fouled on the next possession and made two crucial free throws, and OSU missed its buzzer-beater shot to give the Buffs the 66-63 win.

"You can't ever think that it's not your day," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said of the Buffs' comeback. "You've just got to find different ways to get things done . . . you've got to make sure that little things don't affect you. We could have even let that half-court shot affect us, but we didn't, and I really liked our resolve."

another two free throws that provided the final margin, 63-59, with five seconds remaining. She has scored in double-digits in seven games, including a career-high 13 points in the season opening win over Colorado State. She came into this season with just three double-figure scoring games over the first 62 games of her career.

ABOUT THE BEAVERS: Oregon State is 13-9 overall and tied with Washington for sixth place in the Pac-12 at 5-5. The Beavers started Pac-12 play with 7-of-10 on the road and will have 6-of-8 at home to close the regular season beginning Friday. Oregon State averages 73.1 points on 43.2 percent from the field. One of the top 3-point shooting teams in the Pac-12, the Beavers rank second on the league charts in both 3-pointers made (8.6 3mpg) and percentage (.369). Oregon State also holds its own defensively. The Beavers lead the Pac-12 in blocked shots at nearly six per game, and two more a contest than second place Colorado (3.9 bpg). OSU also ranks second in rebounding margin (+7.5) and third in field-goal defense (.362) on the league charts.

Sophomore guard Jamie Weisner tops Oregon State in scoring at 13.8 points per game. She has 47 3-pointers on the season and ranks second in the Pac-12 in free-throw success at 87.1 percent. Freshman guard Sydney Wiese, who is second in scoring at 13.1 points per game, tops the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made with 67, hitting 42 percent from downtown. Sophomore center Ruth Hamblin leads the Pac-12 at 3.5 blocks per game while averaging 8.9 points on 55 percent shooting along with a team-best 7.8 rebounds. Sophomore forward Deven Hunter is second on the team in rebounding (7.2 rpg) while pitching in 8.6 points an outing.

Scott Rueck is in his fourth season at Oregon State with a record of 52-64. Overall Rueck is in his 18th year as a collegiate head coach with a career record of 340-152.

THE SERIES: This will be the seventh meeting between Colorado and Oregon State, with the Buffaloes holding a 5-1 series edge. Colorado has won three straight over the Beavers and three of four Pac-12 meetings. The Buffaloes swept a home-and-home series last season, winning 61-47 in Boulder on Feb. 8 and rallying for a 66-63 overtime win in Corvallis on Mar. 3 in the regular season finale. Oregon State's lone win in the series came in Corvallis, a 65-45 decision on Feb. 2, 2012, in the first Pac-12 meeting between the two teams.

Colorado head coach **Linda Lappe** is 3-1 against Oregon State. Scott Rueck is 1-3 against Colorado.

CONNECTIONS: Colorado sports one Oregon native on its roster, junior forward **Jen Reese** hails from Clackamas, and was a two-time Oregon Gatorade Player of the Year.

REBOUNDING FOR THE WIN: Colorado had one of its best rebounding efforts of the season in the 61-45 win over Utah on Super Bowl Sunday. The Buffaloes tied a season-high with 51 rebounds (Illinois, Southern Utah) and their plus-16 margin over the Utes was their best in the Pac-12 this season and tied for the second-best mark overall (+21 vs. Illinois, +16 vs. Rice & Alcorn State).

Colorado outrebounded the Utes 27-12 in the first half. That plus-15 margin is Colorado's best of the season for a half and Utah's 12 rebounds was an opponent low.

Six players had at least five rebounds for Colorado led by Arielle Roberson and Haley Smith who both had eight. The last time Colorado had six players with at least five rebounds was during its 65-49 win at USC on Feb. 3, 2013 which was also played on Super Bowl Sunday.

The Buffaloes are 13-2 when winning the battle of the boards; 0-6 when trailing on the glass. Colorado faces one of the league's better rebounding teams on Friday. Oregon State enters the contest

averaging 45.2 rebounds per game, ranking second in the Pac-12.

3-POINT STREAK ENDS, NEW ONE BEGINS: Colorado's 285-game streak with at least one 3-point field goal came to an end on Jan. 26 against Arizona State. The Buffaloes were 0-of-4 from beyond the arc against the Sun Devils. The last time Colorado had gone without a 3-point field goal prior to the Arizona State game was a 56-51 win at Missouri on Jan. 18, 2005 (0-for-8).

The Buffaloes did not score from 3-point range against Utah either (0-for-7), marking the first time since Dec. 1-2, 1995, Colorado went back-to-back games without a 3-pointer.

Junior forward **Jen Reese** put an end to the scoreless string from downtown in the opening minutes of the win over Utah, ending a

stretch of 88 minutes, 56 seconds with out a 3-pointer (0-for-13).

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS: Colorado has a record of 38-15 since the beginning of the 2012-13 season. Of those 15 losses, 10 have been to ranked teams and nine of those ranked higher than Colorado at the time the game was played. The Buffaloes have won 35 of their last 40 games against unranked opponents.

Colorado prepared for the Pac-12 season with a 10-1 nonconference record, with the lone loss coming on the road at then No. 7/7 ranked Louisville. The Buffaloes have been dominant in the nonconference in the last four years with an overall record of 41-5, including wins in 34 of their last 35 games.

TIGHTENING UP THE 'D': Colorado set a school record for field-goal percentage defense in 2012-13 at 35.0 percent and the Buffaloes are on pace to flirt with that mark again.

Colorado is allowing just 36.0 percent from the field which ranks second in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes have been even more stingy from long range by allowing a league-best 27.2 percent shooting beyond the arc.

The Buffaloes, who rank second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (61.0 ppg), have held 13 opponents under 60 points. Colorado has held its opponents under 70 points in 49 of the last 53 games.

Colorado held Utah to 45 points in its last game, a season-low in Pac-12 play and the 10th time in the last two seasons the Buffaloes have held a conference opponent under 50 points.

MORE OFFENSE: Colorado has hit 80 points in five games this season, with four coming in succession from the Alcorn State through South Alabama contests. It marked the first time that the Buffaloes had hit 80 points in four consecutive games since late in the 1982-83 season when Colorado achieved the mark in five straight (Feb. 12-Mar. 5, 1983).

Colorado's 94 points against South Alabama were its most since a 96-90 overtime win over TCU in the third round of the 2008 Post-season WNIT, and the most in regulation since the last time the Buffaloes hit the century mark, a 100-71 win over Cal State-Fullerton on Nov. 18, 2005.

The Buffaloes scored 85 at New Mexico, the most on the road, in regulation time, since a 101-56 win at TCU on Dec. 7, 1993. Colorado scored 90 on the road in a one-point overtime loss at Baylor on Feb. 23, 2000 and that same number in a 9-point overtime win at Kansas on Feb. 24, 1995.

SCORING BALANCE: Colorado has three players averaging double-digits in scoring and eight averaging at least five points.

Seven different Buffs have led the team, or tied for the team lead, in scoring led by **Arielle Roberson** who has been in the drivers seat seven times. Colorado has had five players score in double-digits in three games and four in double-digits in five others. The Buffaloes didn't register any five-player double-digit games in 2012-13, but were 8-0 in games with four in double figures.

FREE THROW HISTORY: Sophomore **Arielle Roberson** had one of the top free-throw performances in team history in the win over Denver. Her 13 free throws made tied for the fifth best single-game performance in team history and most since Jackie McFarland had 13 against TCU in the 2008 WNIT, just days after setting her school record of 15 against Villanova. Roberson's 17 attempts tie for the second most in team history, just one off the school-record 18 attempted by LeaAnn Banks at Colorado State on Dec. 5, 1984.

ROBERSON PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore **Arielle Roberson** was named the Pac-12 Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of Dec. 2-8, the league office announced on Dec. 9.

For Roberson it's her first Player of the Week honor and sixth conference weekly award overall. She was a five-time winner of the Pac-12's Freshman of the Week award last season.

Roberson averaged 15 points, 11 rebounds while hitting 48 percent from the field in Colorado's wins over Wyoming (63-59) on Dec. 4, and Illinois (79-56) on Dec. 7.

Roberson scored 13 points and matched a season-high with 12 rebounds in the win at Wyoming. Eight of her rebounds were on the offensive end, one less than she had in her previous four games combined. She hit 6-of-15 from the field and also dished out an assist.

Against Illinois, Roberson led Colorado in scoring, tying a season-high with 17 points, hitting 58 percent from the field (7-of-12). She pulled down 10 rebounds, logging her fifth career double-double.

Roberson's honor is CU's ninth weekly award in the Pac-12 since the Buffaloes joined the conference in 2011; fourth in the Player of the Week category.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 0-4 against ranked teams this season after dropping a 68-66 decision to No. 14/23 Arizona State. The Buffaloes have lost their last 10 to ranked opponents and are 3-14 under Linda Lappe. Only one of those opponents, No. 19/19 California on Jan. 10, was ranked lower than Colorado at the time. Eleven of Colorado's last 14 ranked opponents have been ranked No. 8 or higher.

CU is 62-152 all-time against ranked opponents.

FAST OUT OF THE GATE: Colorado's 9-0 mark to start the season is the fifth best in team history. Three of the top five all-time best starts in program history have come in the last three seasons. CU's best start was a 15-0 mark to begin the 1992-93 season. Here are Colorado's top-eight all-time season starts:

LIGHTS OUT: Colorado had one of their best shooting stretches in recent memory during the three-game span of New Mexico through the Omni Classic. CU hit an impressive 52.8 percent (93-of-176) during that span and finished above 50 percent in all three contests, including a season-best 55.6 percent (30-of-54) at New Mexico.

In 2012-13 Colorado had only two games above 50 percent for the entire 32-game season. The last time the Buffaloes had hit 50 percent in three consecutive games was from Nov. 27-Dec. 4, 1998, current head coach Linda Lappe's freshman season.

NUMBERS FROM DEEP: Colorado hit 10-of-18 3-pointers at New Mexico, its best performance percentage wise since the home game against the Lobos last season. The Buffaloes hit 62 percent from long range (8-of-13) in their 84-39 win over New Mexico in Boulder on Dec. 29, 2012. The 10 3-pointers were Colorado's most in a game on the road since hitting 15 at Oklahoma State on March 25, 2012, in the WNIT Quarterfinals. Colorado also had 10 at home against Oregon on Feb. 10, 2013.

Jen Reese and **Jasmine Sborov** both went 2-for-2 from long range against the Lobos, setting new career-highs for 3-pointers made for both players. In fact the duo, 4-for-4 on the day, had been a combined 7-for-48 (.146) in their careers prior to the New Mexico game.

ROAD WARRIORS: Colorado is 4-5 on the road this season and has won 22 of its last 37 true road contests. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule. Overall the Buffaloes are 26-18 away from Boulder dating back to the tail end of the 2010-11 season.

BIG WIN STREAKS: Colorado saw its 33-game regular season nonconference win streak come to an end at Louisville a string that had began with a 74-52 win over Colgate on Dec. 30, 2010. This run is just one of several enjoyed by the Buffaloes over the last three seasons.

Colorado had claimed perfect 11-0 nonconference marks in each of the last two seasons, comprising of two of the top eight overall winning streaks in team history. The 2011-12 team actually began the season 12-0, including a win in its first ever Pac-12 Conference game, tying for the fifth-best streak in team history and the second longest to begin a season.

The Buffaloes' 11-game streak to start the 2012-13 season ties for the eighth best overall. Throw in a 10-game streak at the end of the 2012-13 campaign, and the Buffaloes have registered three separate double-digit winning streaks in the last two seasons.

Colorado has 10 double-figure win streaks in its history. Head coach **Linda Lappe** has presided over three of those streaks, one behind her mentor Ceal Barry who coached the Buffaloes to four different double-figure win streaks over her 22 seasons on the bench.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Colorado was ranked in the first 11 polls this season (including preseason), reaching as high as No. 11 in the *Associated Press* poll and No. 14 in the *USA Today Sports Coaches* Poll.

The Buffaloes were ranked in 25 straight AP polls from Dec. 17, 2012 to Jan. 13, 2014. Colorado has been ranked in 183 all-time AP polls, ranking third in the Pac-12 behind only Stanford and USC.

For the first time since 2003, Colorado was ranked in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today Sports Coaches* Top 25 Preseason polls, coming in at No. 19 in each.

Prior to the 2003-04 campaign the Buffaloes were ranked 20th in both polls. The preseason rankings were Colorado's highest since debuting at No. 12 (AP) and No. 13 (Coaches) heading into the 2001-02 campaign.

Colorado was not ranked in the final 2012-13 Coaches poll, coming in as the first team listed in the receiving votes category. The Buffaloes appeared in 11 Coaches polls in 2012-13, reaching as high as No. 18 the week of March 4, 2013.

The Buffaloes currently have four ranked teams on their schedule, three of which were preseason No. 10 picks. Stanford is No. 3 and Louisville is No. 4 in both. California is No. 23 in the AP and No. 22 in the coaches. Arizona State is No. 11 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the coaches.

WILSON CLIMBING CAREER CHARTS: Senior guard **Brittany Wilson** is in 23rd place on Colorado's all-time scoring list with 1,085 points and just 22 shy of cracking the top 20. She became the 25th player in team history to reach 1,000 points during the Stanford game.

She is ninth in career 3-pointers made (120) and attempted (389), 14th in steals (153), 15th in minutes played (3,122) and 20th in assists (261).

IRON WOMEN: The senior duo of **Brittany Wilson** and **Rachel Hargis** have a good chance to end their careers ranking No. 1 & No. 2 in games played at Colorado.

The two have combined for 243 out of a possible 244 games played during their careers. Wilson has not missed a game in her career, playing in all 122 possible contests. Hargis has played in 121 missing only one contest, the 2013 NCAA Tournament game against Kansas, with a knee injury.

Barring any unforeseen setbacks, and with a modest postseason run, the two will be looking to catch Erin Scholz who set the school record at 132 games played from 1993-97. By playing Friday against Oregon State, Wilson will jump into a four-way tie (Bianca Smith, 2006-10; Jenny Roulier, 1998-02; Mandy Nightingale, 1998-02) for 13th place on CU's all-time list with 123 games played, while Hargis will join Britt Hartshorn (1998-02) and Alexis Felts (1994-98) in 17th place at 122.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS: Colorado won its 17th Omni Hotels Classic championship, and fifth straight by defeating South Alabama 94-61 in the first round on Nov. 29 and then Rice, 75-58, in the championship game on Nov. 30. Junior guard Lexy Kresl was named Classic MVP while classmate Jen Reese joined her on the all-tournament team. Colorado improved to 44-10 all-time in its home holiday classic and has won 17 of the 26 tournament titles contested (no team champion was crowned in 2006 due to a format change). This was the 27th straight year Colorado has hosted an

early season women's basketball tournament. For the first 22 years the tournament was known as the Coors Classic, and is in its fifth year of being called the Omni Hotels Classic.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 35-5 (.875) in all-time openers with its win at Colorado State. It marked just the 13th time in 40 seasons that Colorado opened away from Boulder and the 10th time in a true road game. The Buffaloes improved to 6-4 in overall season openers on the road. Colorado is an outstanding 38-2 (.949) all-time in home openers.

BUFFS SIGN PAIR TO NLI's: **Zoe Correal** and **Brecca Thomas** have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2014-15 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Correal, a 6-4 center from El Cerrito, Calif., is gearing up for her senior season at Salesian High School a program where she has contributed to the last two NorCal Division IV titles. She averaged 9.4 points, 7.6 rebounds and 2.4 blocks as a junior, guiding the Pride to a 29-8 record, the NorCal title and runner-up finish at the 2013 CIF Division IV State Tournament. Correal was named to the 2012-13 Cal-Hi Sports Division IV All-State Second Team.

Thomas, a 5-5 point guard from Houston, is entering her senior season at the Kinkaid School. She has scored nearly 1,700 points and dished out over 400 assists in three years for the Falcons who have won back-to-back Southwest Preparatory Conference Division I titles. A three-time All-SPC Division I selection, Thomas averaged 20.6 points, 5.5 assists and 3.5 steals as a junior, leading the Falcons to a 28-5 record.

BUFFS PICKED THIRD: On the heels of its best season in a decade, Colorado was picked to finish third in the 2013-14 Pac-12 Conference race in separate Preseason Polls conducted by league coaches and media members who cover the league.

In the coaches' poll, Colorado received 91 points trailing only defending co-league champions Stanford and California. The Cardinal and Golden Bears were essentially a unanimous pick to finish 1-2 respectively. Stanford received 121 points including 11 first place votes. California scored 111 points and received the other first place nod. Coaches were not able to vote for their own teams.

The third place preseason ranking is Colorado's highest since a similar third place status in the 1997-98 Big 12 Coaches poll. The Buffaloes have climbed the ladder in three short seasons in the Pac-12 Preseason Poll. Colorado was picked to finish 11th in 2010-11 (eventually tied for 10th) and ninth in 2011-12 (placing fourth).

Washington, which finished one spot behind Colorado last year in the final standings, was picked to do so again coming in fourth with 85 points. UCLA, last year's third place team, was sixth (80) followed by USC (77), Utah (59), Oregon State (51), Washington State (50), Arizona State (29), Arizona (21) and Oregon (17).

In the media poll, Colorado received 129 points trailing only Stanford and California. Stanford was picked to win the 2013-14 league race, receiving 166 points including 12 of 14 first place votes. California had 156 points and received the other two first place nods.

The top eight selected by the media mirrored the order of the coaches' poll. Washington finished just behind the Buffaloes in fourth with 122 points followed by UCLA (112), USC (99), Utah (79) and Oregon State (64).

Arizona State was ninth (62) and Washington State 10th (50) flipping spots from the coaches' poll. Oregon and Arizona did the same, with the Ducks coming in at 11th in the media poll (27) and the Wildcats in 12th (21).

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado will be featured on the Pac-12 Networks 15 times during the 2013-14 regular season, a school record number for television appearances in one campaign.

Colorado's appeared on a program-best 13 national and regional telecasts in 2012-13, a figure that also included three postseason contests. Entering this season, the Buffaloes have tipped off on 112 national or regional contests since the Fall of 2001.

Colorado made its 2013-14 Pac-12 Network debut by hosting Iowa on Nov. 20.

Fourteen of Colorado's 18 conference games will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks, including eight of nine at home. All home games not televised on the Pac-12 Networks, will be available online through Colorado's Pac-12.com video player. Pac-12 road games that are not televised will be available on the opponent's Pac-12.com video player.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 24-0 in exhibition games with its 91-42 win over the Colorado School of Mines on Nov. 2. The Buffaloes have outscored their opponents by an average of 32.0 points in those 24 contests (86.2 to 54.2)

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams. This was the fourth time Colorado and Colorado Mines played in an exhibition game.

TOUR OF ITALY: Colorado took a 10-day tour of Italy this past summer (Aug. 12-21) as players, coaches and staff took in the opportunity to visit historic destinations including Lake Como, Venice, Florence, and Rome.

Per NCAA rules, the Buffaloes were allowed to have 10 full team practices prior to leaving for Italy. The trip was funded by donors of the basketball program.

Colorado played two full games against a pair of all-star teams made up of professional players from around Italy. The Buffaloes won handily in both contests, 80-47 against the Toscana All-Stars on Aug. 16 near Florence and then 96-22 against the Lazio All-Stars in Rome on Aug. 18.

A third game against the Lazio/Latina All-Stars provided a unique twist. The Buffaloes and their Italian counterparts played one normal 10-minute quarter that ended in a 20-7 Colorado advantage. For the remaining three periods, the teams started over on the scoreboard and then shuffled rosters to form a Black and Gold squad. Senior guards Ashley & Brittany Wilson, junior guard Lexy Kresl, sophomore forward Jamee Swan and freshman center Bri Watts, joined the Italian coach and players on the Black team, along with Colorado assistants Jonas Chatterton and LaTonya Watson. Several Italian players joined the rest of the Buffaloes and head coach Linda Lappe and assistant Kelly Rae Finley on the Gold.

The contest proved to be highly spirited and competitive with the Black team, led by Brittany Wilson, staging a last-minute comeback for a 48-46 win. Wilson sank two free throws with under 20 seconds left for the deciding margin.

HUGGINS RECEIVES HARDSHIP: Colorado guard/forward Lauren Huggins was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA this summer, allowing her to regain her freshman year of eligibility.

Huggins played in five games as a true freshman before a stress fracture in her right leg sidelined her for the remainder of the season. She had six points and three rebounds in the win over Colorado State on Dec. 5, in her final appearance before the injury. Huggins is a fantastic outside shooter that will help the Buffaloes extend the floor.

CHATTERTON PROMOTED TO ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH: Fourth-year assistant Jonas Chatterton has been promoted to Associate Head Coach.

Chatterton has been a member of Lappe's staff since the very beginning of her reign, joining the program on June 9, 2010. He assists with recruiting, opponent scouting, post play development, offensive and defensive schemes and serves as the program's liaison with marketing and promotions.

Chatterton's record on the CU bench is a sterling 71-37, including three-straight postseason appearances. The Buffaloes had one of their best seasons in over a decade in 2012-13, finishing at 25-7, fourth in the Pac-12 Conference, and advancing to the 13th NCAA Tournament in program history, and first since 2004.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 391-132 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.748), and finished the 2012-13 season with a record of 15-3. The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 24 of 35 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

Colorado, 9-3 at Coors in 2013-14, has won 16 of its last 20 and 27 of its last 34 at home.

ALBUQUERQUE – The popular question around the University of Colorado women’s basketball team this past off season is who would step up and take over the scoring punch from all Pac-12 Conference guard Chucky Jeffery.

The early returns on the answer? Everybody.
No. 16 (AP)/20 (USAT) Colorado had five players in double-digits led by **Jen Reese’s** 18 points as the Buffaloes ran away with an 85-53 decision over New Mexico Saturday afternoon at The Pit.

Reese, a 6-2 junior forward, hit 7-of-10 from the field and drilled two early 3-pointers for the second best scoring output of her career. She received the start-ing nod for **Arielle Roberson**, who missed Saturday’s game with a concussion.

Lexy Kresl had 13 points, **Lauren Huggins** had 12 connecting on 4-of-7 from 3-point range. **Jasmine Sborov** had 11, all in the first half. **Jamee Swan** came off the bench to add a season-best 10 points.

The Buffaloes, who have hit 80-plus in their last three games, scored their most points in a true road game, in regulation, since a 101-56 at TCU on Dec. 7, 1993. The win was also the 28th straight for Colorado during regular season nonconference play.

Colorado was efficient on offense hitting a season-high 56 percent from the field. The Buffaloes were just as potent from the 3-point line, making 10-of-18 attempts.

“We did play really well,” CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. “I liked our ver-satility and the way we played together on the offensive side. We moved the ball, moved ourselves, we had nice action towards, nice action away. When you have that many players that can drive, that can score, that can pass and see the open play, you become a very tough team to guard.”

It was outside early and often for the Buffaloes. After spotting New Mexico an early 7-3 lead Sborov scored six straight, including a 3-pointer that tied the game at 9-9. **Ashley Wilson** gave CU its first lead at 12-9 on her first 3-pointer of the year at 14:45 of the first half.

Wilson’s bucket ended up being the first of three straight possessions that ended in Colorado 3-pointers. Huggins followed Wilson’s with her first of the game and Reese connected on her second the next time down the court.

Minutes later Sborov drilled another 3-pointer to cap of a 20-6 run that gave Colorado a 29-15 lead at 8:17 of the first period. The Buffaloes made 8-of-12 from downtown in the first half alone.

The Buffaloes also distributed the ball well once again, dishing out 19 assists, led by Kresl with five.

“When we move the ball, if we get paint touches, we are pretty hard to stop,” Reese said. “Everyone on the floor is so versatile that we can score in so many different ways.”

New Mexico was led by Sara Halasz who nearly single-handedly kept the Lobos in the game in the first half. The senior guard scored 12 of her 16 points in the first half as the Buffaloes held onto a 42-28 lead at the break.

New Mexico pulled within 12 early in the second half, at 48-36 three minutes in, but the depth of Colorado began to break through. As much success as Colo-rado had from long range in the first half, the Buffaloes attacked the basket in the second.

Reese had her two early 3-pointers, but changed gears going 4-of-6 from the field in the second half for 10 points closer to the basket including a couple free throws. Swan had eight of her 10 points in the final frame. Kresl and Wilson both had success driving in the lane as well.

The Buffaloes also clamped down defensively. After allowing the Lobos to shoot 44 percent in the first half, New Mexico made just 35 percent in the second as the Buffaloes closed out the contest with a 26-11 run over the final 12:16.

BOULDER – Colorado’s offense continued to click as the No. 14/19 ranked Buffaloes sprinted past South Alabama, 94-61 in the first round of the Omni Hotels Classic Friday evening at the Coors Events Center.

Colorado (5-0) will play Rice (4-4) in Saturday’s championship game, set for 7:30 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. Rice squeaked by Samford 57-52 in the opener. South Alabama (0-5) will play Samford (1-4) in Saturday’s consolation at 5 p.m.

Colorado had five players score in double-digits for the third straight game and hit at least 80 points for the fourth consecutive contest, and 90 for the second time this year.

Jen Reese and **Jamee Swan** tied for lead scoring honors with 16 points apiece. **Lexy Kresl** had 12 points, seven rebounds and a career-high six assists. **Rachel Hargis** had 11 and **Lauren Huggins** had 10.

“It was another night with really good balance,” head coach **Linda Lappe** said. “Offensively, we moved the ball well. We had a lot of different players contribute; we scored on the inside, we scored on the outside. I really like the flow of some of the things we’re doing offensively.”

Colorado’s balanced shined once again as all 10 players that played scored, in fact that was achieved less than 10 minutes into the contest. Kresl scored 11 of her 12 points in the first half and keyed the Buffaloes fast start, drilling a 3-pointer that gave Colorado an early 11-2 lead.

South Alabama stayed close early on the heels of Rachel Cumbo, who hit two early 3-pointers, the second pulling the Jaguars to within six at 22-16 at the 11:10 mark of the first half.

But Kresl countered with a 3-pointer which sparked a 10-0 run. **Ashley Wilson** scored on a put back of a **Brittany Wilson** miss to double-up the Jaguars at 32-16.

From there the Buffaloes continued to roll. Colorado hit 57 percent in the first half alone en route to a 53-27 lead at the break, its most halftime points since put-ting up 53 against Southern Utah in 2009.

The Buffaloes dominated in the paint outscoring the Jaguars 40-14. The trio of Reese, Hargis and Swan were a combined 15-of-24 from the field. They also got it done at the foul line, making 12-of-13 combined, including a career-best 7-of-8 from Hargis.

Swan’s 16 points were a career high and came in a variety of ways, she had put back on offensive rebounds, mid-range jumpers and even a steal and coast-to-coast lay-in. She finished 7-of-10 from the field and grabbed eight boards, leading the Buffaloes in rebounding for the second straight contest.

“It was pretty even, it just came down to who wanted it more,” Swan said. “They were good on the inside and strong, but again, it came down to who wanted it more.”

Colorado as a team was outstanding from the line sinking 83 percent (20-of-24).

“We keep working on that every day,” Hargis said. “It was nice to get some fouls and get to the line.”

Reese was 6-of-8 from the field and pulled down seven rebounds. Ashley Wilson finished with six points, six rebounds and tied a personal best with four assists.

Colorado ended up at 52 percent for the game (34-of-65) and dished out 19 assists. The Buffaloes also enjoyed a 42-28 edge on the boards.

Cumbo had a game-high 19 points for South Alabama while Jennifer Johnson scored 18 off the bench.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - Outside, negative temperatures and raging winds chilled Laramie, Wyo., but inside the Arena-Auditorium, the No. 11 Colorado women's basketball team burned a fire in the second half to power them to a 63-59 victory over Wyoming.

Colorado, 7-0, wins its 31st straight regular nonconference game and improves its all-time record against Wyoming to 36-9.

Brittany Wilson led the Buffs and finished the game with 19 points. **Arielle Roberson** added 13 points and 12 rebounds, her fourth career double-double and the Buffaloes' first of the season. Kayla Woodward recorded 17 points for the Cowgirls.

Wyoming (4-2) tied the game up at 57 with 57 seconds left on the clock after a dribble-drive through the lane by Chelan Landry. **Lauren Huggins** missed a shot on the Colorado end, but Wilson came up with the rebound in a crowd in the paint and scored on a layup to give the Buffs a two point lead with 35 seconds left.

From there, the Buffs and Cowgirls traded free throws. Tough defense disallowed a shot from by Kaitlyn Mileto and brought **Lexy Kresl** to the charity stripe. She made both free throws to give the Buffs a 61-57 lead.

A foul on the other end put the Cowgirls at the line, and Fallon Lewis capitalized to cut the Buffs lead to two once more. **Jasmine Sborov** was fouled with five seconds left on the clock, and she went to the line and made both free throws to seal the 63-59 victory.

"You got to give our players a lot of credit," Colorado head coach Linda Lappe said. "We figured it out, we bared down, and I think Arielle [Roberson] and Brittany [Wilson] got some key shots. We were resilient again. It's nice to be able to pull out with wins. Lot of things to take away, but I'm proud of the way we stepped up."

Colorado was without leading scorer **Jen Reese**, who suffered a concussion earlier in the week, and backup guard **Ashley Wilson** who injured her shoulder against Rice.

The Buffs got off to a rough start and struggled to drain a bucket. They fell behind and could not match Wyoming's quick four points. **Rachel Hargis** made both of her free throws to narrow the Cowgirls' lead to 4-2. Just before the first media timeout, Huggins gave the Buffs their first lead at 5-4 after draining a big three.

From there, Colorado continued to maintain its lead in the first half with some big plays. Hargis gobbled a ball up defensively at half-court, and the Buffs turned it around to add a three from Kresl. A Wilson 3-pointer put the Buffs ahead 13-8 at the 12:10 mark.

Colorado held the lead for a majority of the first half, but the Cowgirls closed on a 10-2 run in the final 4:26, capped off by a Kaylee Hoffman 3-pointer at the buzzer, to take a 27-21 lead at the break.

The Buffs shot a season-low 26.7 percent from the field in the first half.

In the second half, Wyoming opened the scoring with a Woodward 3-pointer. Soon afterward, the Buffs went on an 11-0 run, including Huggins' 18th try of the season. The Buffs took a 32-30 lead with 16:44 remaining in the half, but the Cowgirls evened the score once more. Huggins let another three fly to give the Buffs a 35-32 advantage going into the media timeout.

Wilson added another three from the left corner to give the Buffs a 40-32 edge with 14:06, their largest lead to that point.

But Wyoming came back strong. After a Woodward missed free throw, Hoffman grabbed the rebound to keep possession. Mileto then drilled a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 40-36.

Roberson stopped Wyoming's momentum with a jumper that sparked an 11-2 Colorado run ended by five straight points from Wilson.

The Buffaloes kept their lead near double digits until one final run by the Cowgirls in the final five minutes. Wyoming embarked on a 10-0 run, including a pair of tough shots by Landry that tied the score which led to the Buffaloes final clutch shots.

BOULDER – Strange afternoon of hoops in Boulder, but strange was good. The No. 11 Colorado women remained unbeaten with a 79-56 win over Illinois, but it was anything but business as usual in the Coors Events Center.

For starters, the Buffs (8-0) and Illini (5-5) had their pregame warm-up time shortened due to the aftermath of the CU's men's last-second upset of No. 6 Kansas. That game started at 1:20 p.m., with the women's contest scheduled to begin just after 5 p.m. But it took longer than anticipated to clear the CEC court after it was stormed by CU students and fans following the electrifying 75-72 win.

Then, with 8:30 left in the first half of the women's contest and the Buffs up 27-20, alarms sounded in the CEC. Play continued, but after a couple of possessions, the court and stands were cleared. A sprinkler head had burst in the loading dock area of the Events Center, triggering the alarms and stopping play for 20 minutes. Players went to their locker rooms, fans went to the building's upper concourses.

Meanwhile, second-year Illinois coach Matt Bollant might not have known what he was missing. He was ill and remained at his Boulder hotel, which made associate head coach Mike Divilbiss the head man for the afternoon.

"There's not much you can say in that situation," Divilbiss said of the delay. "We're a young team and it's just one of those things – you just have to learn to get past the environment."

Once back on the court, Illinois guard Amber Moore got a quick score but the Buffaloes quickly went up by double-digits for the first time on a three-pointer by **Jen Reese** (16 points) and a jumper by **Rachel Hargis** (12) for a 32-22 lead.

Forward Jacqui Grant (game-high 20) helped keep Illinois close. When the Illini cooled off from the outside, they started going in and the 6-3 freshman scored four of her 15-first half points on a run that cut Colorado's lead to 40-35.

But **Lauren Huggins** hit another 3-pointer and Hargis matched an Illinois score with a layup of her own to give the Buffaloes a 45-37 halftime advantage.

Reese hit her first three field goals of the second half as the Buffs built their lead to 20. A **Jasmine Sborov** trey and a soft Hargis layup pushed CU in front 62-42. But Illinois increased its press, contributing to the Buffs' 20 turnovers, and crept to within 14 (62-48).

CU finally settled down as Sborov (10) hit a three-pointer at the 7:56 mark to push the lead back to 17 and the Illini were done.

"I thought it was a great win for our team," CU coach **Linda Lappe** said, acknowledging Illinois' athleticism, quickness and different defensive looks. "There were a lot of different obstacles and adversities through the game – not having the normal warm up time, having a fire alarm . . . I liked how we came out of being in the locker room for 15 minutes and got back into it. So, there were a lot of positives to take out of it."

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Lexy Kresl had 17 points and Jen Reese corralled her second career double-double, but Louisville had a little bit more Saturday afternoon at the KFC Yum! Center as the No. 7 ranked Cardinals outlasted No. 11 Colorado 69-62.

Louisville' Shoni Schimmel had a game-high 30 points, including 13-of-16 from the line as Cardinals improved to 12-1.

Reese had 14 points and pulled down a team-season-high 14 rebounds for the Buffs (9-1) who saw their 33-game nonconference regular season win streak end.

It was a tough, physical battle, the kind one would expect from a game between two of the nation's top teams. But that aggressiveness cost both teams at times; and Colorado a little more in the end. A total of 56 fouls were called, 32 on Colorado. The teams combined for 70 free throw attempts, Louisville hitting 24-of-40 while the Buffaloes were 17-of-30.

Colorado held a potent Louisville offense well below its average. The Cardinals entered the game averaging over 90 points per game, and over 100 in their last four. The Buffaloes were able to slow Louisville down and force the 2013 NCAA runner-ups to score in the half court.

But Colorado gave the Cardinals more opportunities than they hoped. The Buffs were outrebounded for the first time this year, 52-47. Louisville crashed the offensive glass, pulling down 21 offensive boards. Even though second-chance points were even (11-11), it was missed opportunities for stops that hurt the Buffs.

Despite the rebounding struggles, Colorado was in the game the whole way as neither team led by more than seven points and featured nine lead changes.

Kresl gave Colorado an early 8-5 lead with a 3-pointer, but Bria Smith hit back-to-back jumpers to even the game at 10-10. The Cardinals pushed their lead to 24-18 on a Sara Hammond layup with 8:01 left in the first half, but Colorado answered with its biggest run.

Kresl, who scored 15 of her 17 points in the first half, answered Hammond with a jumper that set off a 13-0 run. Arielle Roberson put back a Reese miss and a pair of Kresl free throws tied the game at 24-24.

Lauren Huggins broke the tie with a long 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 27-24 lead, forcing a Louisville timeout. At the beginning of the timeout Louisville's bench received a technical foul giving the Buffs an opportunity to extend the lead.

Kresl hit the two technical free throws coming out of the timeout to give the Buffaloes their largest lead at 29-24. Unfortunately that was it for Colorado in the first half and the Cardinals came storming back.

Schimmel finally ended Colorado's run with a runner in the lane, drew a foul and completed the 3-point play. Younger sister Jude Schimmel then connected on a pair of fast break layups in the closing minutes as a 9-0 run gave the Cardinals a 33-29 lead at the half.

Colorado quickly erased the Louisville halftime lead as a Sborov 3-pointer ended a 7-2 CU run out of the break for a 36-35 Buffs lead. However, shortly after that the fouls started to catch up with Colorado. Sborov picked up her third moments after her 3-pointer. Brittany Wilson then picked up No. 4 with nearly 13 minutes left with Ashley Wilson and Roberson matching that total moments later.

Still the Buffaloes continued to stay close. Sborov hit a bucket to tie the game at 46-46 with 9:44 remaining, but the Cardinals reeled off seven straight behind the Schimmel sisters.

In the end, the game was put away at the line. Louisville hit 18-of-24 from the line in the second half compared to just 10-of-18 for Colorado.

The Buffs did get a few stops, a pair of free throws by Kresl and one each from Roberson and Reese cut the Louisville lead to 63-59 with 1:10 left. The defense came up big when Jude Schimmel missed a jumper with under a minute left, and Roberson grabbed the rebound. Rachel Hargis eventually ended up at the line, hitting 1-of-2 to make it a one possession game at 63-60. But that was it as Shoni Schimmel clamped down hitting four free throws down the stretch, and scored the final points on a breakaway basket in the closing seconds.

BOULDER – If Sunday afternoon was a tune-up for Pac-12 Conference play, the No. 12 Colorado women's team likely left the Coors Events Center knowing the fine-tuning isn't finished.

But putting into practice what they had emphasized recently in practice, the Buffaloes showed if they continue to grind they can succeed. Applying the brakes to stubborn Southern Utah Sunday in the last 8 minutes, the Buffs finally put away the Thunderbirds 75-59 and now can turn their full attention to the Pac-12.

Although CU did enough against Southern Utah to claim its 10th non-conference win (10-1), the Buffs often had difficulty getting in sync offensively and let a 14-point second half lead dwindle to two with 8:09 to play.

But that was as close as the Thunderbirds (7-3) would get. After Carl Moreland hit a pair of free throws to bring Southern Utah to 54-52, the Buffs launched a 19-2 run to take a 19-point lead (73-54) with 1:24 remaining.

Outscored 21-7 over the final 8:09, the T-Birds were toast.

"Overall, I liked how we responded to the last three days of practice," CU coach Linda Lappe said, noting the Buffs had focused on rebounding, tighter defense and setting screens. "I saw all three things improve."

Most apparent, according to guard Jasmine Sborov, was the defensive factor: "To be honest, it didn't really feel like the score was that close leading up to the two-point deficit . . . we looked at scoreboard and we were like, 'All right, we need to get down, get some stops and just extend our lead.' I think that's one negative thing with this game – we were up and then we were down and we were up and we let them get closer. We didn't step on their throats and just keep going."

Not until they needed to, anyway. During the decisive 8-minute surge, Arielle Roberson scored seven of her team-best 18 points while Ashley Wilson, who finished with career highs in points (14) and assists (5), contributed four points. Roberson added 14 rebounds for her fourth double-double in five games and seventh of her career.

Down by 12 points at halftime, the Thunderbirds crept to within four before the Buffs answered with a 12-2 run to take what appeared to be a comfortable 50-36 lead. Not so. The visitors kept competing, climbing back to within 54-52 before CU delivered its final answer.

"We relaxed instead of keeping our foot on the gas," Wilson said. "They play hard (but) we responded every single time; it shows what kind of team we have."

CU also got double-figure scoring from Jen Reese (11) and Sborov (12), who also recorded her first career double-double with a career-high 10 rebounds.

Desiree Jackson led Southern Utah with 21 points and was her team's only player in double figures.

"Slow start" doesn't come close to describing what the Buffs overcame to eventually pull away and take a 36-24 halftime lead. Just under 9 minutes into the first half, CU had one more turnover (five) than baskets (four) but still led 10-7.

But after Moreland, a 6-1 senior forward from Broomfield, tied the score at 13-13 on a 3-pointer, CU made its move. Over the next 6 minutes, the Buffs outscored the Thunderbirds 17-6 to take their first double-digit advantage (30-19) on a basket by Ashley Wilson.

Southern Utah rallied briefly, closing to within six points (30-24) before CU used a 6-0 run – four free throws by Roberson, a layup by Jamee Swan, who made her second career start – to establish its 12-point halftime advantage. But the T-Birds quickly cut into that, forced the Buffs to make a run, then the whole process was repeated.

Neither team shot impressively from the field – CU checked in at 37.9 percent, Southern Utah at 34.0 – and between them the Buffs and Thunderbirds committed 45 turnovers (CU 21, Southern Utah 24). And long-range accuracy was lacking: the teams were a combined 2-of-26 from beyond the arc, with each getting one trey in 13 attempts.

LOS ANGELES – No. 12/14 Colorado erased a late nine-point second half deficit to edge UCLA, 61-59, Sunday night at Pauley Pavilion.

Jen Reese scored 15 points and **Jamee Swan** had nine points and nine rebounds.

Trailing 52-43 with 6 minutes, 20 seconds left, the Buffs clamped down on defense and held UCLA scoreless for 4:06 as CU embarked on a 10-0 run.

Reese started the run off with a made free throw. She missed the second but Swan corralled the layup and scored to cut the Bruins lead to six.

UCLA missed three shots and had a couple of turnovers as the Buffs whittled the lead down to 52-48 with 4:09 left on a pair of **Ashley Wilson** free throws.

After two more defensive stops, **Arielle Roberson** drilled a long two-pointer at the top of the key at the 2:53 mark. On the next possession, **Brittany Wilson** tied up Thea Lemberger with the arrow in the Buffs favor.

Brittany Wilson was fouled and hit one of two free throws to cut the UCLA lead to one at 52-51. She missed the second one, but the scramble for the ball fell out of bounds in CU's favor. Wilson then drove the lane and scored on a layup in traffic as CU regained the lead at 53-52 with 2:32 left.

UCLA's Luiliana Livulo hit a couple of free throws at 2:14 as the Bruins briefly retook the lead. But Reese hit a jumper at the top of the key to give Colorado a 55-54 lead with 1:55 left. After a defensive stop for CU, and both teams swapping turnovers, Swan scored on a layup for a 57-54 lead.

The Buffaloes kept the Bruins out of reach at the free throw line. **Lexy Kresl** hit a pair to extend the lead to five. UCLA's Nirra Fields, who led all players with 23 points, countered with a layup. She was fouled and hit the subsequent free-throw to cut the CU lead to 59-57 with 16 seconds left.

Brittany Wilson was fouled immediately and hit one of two from the line to up the CU lead to three. Lemberger attacked the rim and scored with eight ticks left to knock the lead back to one at 60-59.

Wilson again was sent to the line and again hit one of two. With no timeouts left, Lemberger hustled down the floor took a contested runner in the lane. Livulo grabbed the offensive rebound but her put back fell short at the buzzer.

Jasmine Sborov had 11 points and eight rebounds for the Buffaloes. Atoney Nyningia had a double-double for the Bruins with 13 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

Late in the first half it looked as if Colorado's comeback heroics weren't going to be needed. The Buffaloes shook off some early turnovers and offensive rebounds by UCLA and went into the lockerroom with all the momentum.

Colorado had an early 8-4 lead, hitting two of its first four shots, but went scoreless for four minutes. A UCLA 9-0 run capped off by a Madeline Brooks jumper with 6:55 left in the half gave the Bruins a 17-13 lead.

After missing her first four 3-point attempts, Kresl finally found the nylon to end UCLA's run with a 3-pointer. The Buffs then got a stop and Kresl found Sborov with a long pass that resulted in a transition layup and a conventional 3-point lead returning the lead to the Buffaloes at 19-17.

UCLA briefly retook the lead at 20-19 on a Corinne Costa jumper in the paint. Reese then went on a nice sprint to allow the Buffaloes to end the half in style. She answered Costa and then hit a pair of free-throws as CU retook the lead. Colorado's ball movement continued to shine as Reese scored her sixth straight point on the left elbow in motion off a nice pass from Kresl.

Kresl then drained her second straight 3-pointer to put the Buffaloes up 28-20. Livulo ended the Colorado run with a pair of free throws, but then Wilson drained a 12-foot jumper at the halftime buzzer to cap off a 9-2 run and give the Buffaloes a 30-22 lead at the break.

Fields and Nyningia led a 10-0 run that tied the game at 32 with 14:33 left. Sborov ended the run with her second 3-pointer of the contest and the Buffaloes were able to stay even until the decisive run.

BOULDER – California never stopped grinding, Colorado couldn't step up with a stop. It was the recipe for a gut-wrenching, frustrating Friday night at the Coors Events Center.

Outscoring CU 14-2 in the final 4:08, No. 19 Cal rallied from a 10-point deficit to edge No. 17 CU, 57-55.

If the Buffs left their home court Friday night feeling they had been taken advantage of, it was justified. It was also mostly self-inflicted. CU (11-3, 1-2) held a 10-point halftime lead, led by 10 with just over 4 minutes to play and still couldn't finish what was shaping up to be a milestone Pac-12 win. Cal (11-3, 3-0) wouldn't allow it.

"We just didn't play to win necessarily...they were the aggressors and we didn't buck up to that challenge," said **Arielle Roberson**, who rebounded from a subpar West Coast trip last weekend with a game-high 21 points – including 11 during a 15-6 run that opened a 50-40 CU advantage with 5:55 to play.

But after Jen Reese hit a jumper to put the Buffs up by 10 for a second time, they failed to hit a field goal in the final 4:08. Roberson's two free throws were CU's only points in that span.

The Bears, led by Reshanda Gray (15) and Brittany Boyd (13), never considered going away. After CU called a timeout with 25 seconds remaining – 22 on the shot clock – Roberson was fouled and went to the free throw line with 16.2 seconds showing. She hit both, putting the Buffs up 55-54, prompting a Cal timeout with 12.1 seconds to play.

Afure Jemerigbe drove the right baseline and scored to give Cal a 56-55 lead with 6 seconds left. Head coach **Linda Lappe** set up a play for Roberson, but **Jamee Swan's** side-court inbound pass was stolen by Courtney Range, who was fouled by Roberson and hit one of two free throws at the 2.9 second mark.

Lexy Kresl's half-court fling at the buzzer bounded off the back iron and the Buffs' night of late frustration was complete.

Employing full-court pressure to begin the second half, the Bears forced the Buffs into nine turnovers in the final 20 minutes and converted CU's 16 errors into 16 points. Cal also outscored CU 36-34 in the paint, outrebounded the Buffs 40-39 and limited them to 37.5 percent from the field. The Bears shot only 39.7 percent, but they were at 45.5 percent (15-of-33) in the second half.

CU's biggest lead of the first half – 28-18 – came courtesy of a 10-4 run and a nearly 8-minute lockdown of the Cal offense. With 7:44 left before intermission, Mikayla Lyles hit a 3-pointer to bring the Bears to within 18-17, but that would be Cal's last field goal of the half.

In the first 2 minutes of the second half, it was Cal's turn to turn up the 'D.' Opening with full-court pressure, the Bears disrupted the Buffs offensive rhythm just enough to force three turnovers and outscored them 10-2 to pull to within 30-28 on a conventional three-point play by Gray with 17:08 to play.

Over the next 51/2 minutes, Cal cut CU's lead to one on two occasions, but after the Bears had closed to 35-34 the Buffs answered with an 8-0 surge on three baskets by Roberson and one by **Rachel Hargis** to go up 43-34 with 9:40 to play.

And Roberson wasn't finished. After scoring in the paint, she backed up for a trey that opened a 10-point CU lead (50-40) with just under 6 minutes to play. But the Bears wouldn't roll. They cut the deficit to five (53-48) on a three-point play by Gennifer Brandon with 3:33 left, got a fast break layup by Gray to pull to 53-50, then crept to 53-52 on a jumper by Boyd at the 2:07 mark.

A turnover caused by Cal's full-court pressure followed a CU timeout, and Courtney Range sank two free throws to give Cal a 54-53 lead – its first since 12-11 – with 1:59 left. Roberson's pair of free throws gave the Buffs a 55-54 lead and their fans hope, but a stop at the other end was needed – and it didn't happen.

SEATTLE – Washington freshman guard Kelsey Plum scored 35 points as the Huskies handed No. 21/20 Colorado its fourth straight loss, 81-71, Sunday afternoon at Alaska Airlines Arena.

Plum and backcourt mate Jazmine Davis combined for 55 of Washington's 81 points. Plum made a CU opponent record 18 free throws, on only 19 attempts, and drilled three 3-pointers. Davis had 20 points on 6-of-14 from the field and 6-of-6 from the line.

The Huskies (10-7, 3-3) won the battle mostly from the free throw line. Washington was 38-of-46 from the charity stripe, setting a CU opponent mark for free-throws made in one game.

"We put them to the free throw line way too much. We outshot them, but we didn't shoot as well as we needed to. They were scoring, and they were getting to the free throw line," coach Linda Lappe said.

Washington made 21 of those in the first half as the Huskies used a 10-0 run midway through the period to build a double-digit lead at the break, 39-27.

Colorado (11-6, 1-5) tightened up its defense early in the second half and started turning the Huskies over. The Buffaloes were able to completely erase Washington's advantage, taking a 54-53 lead on a Jamee Swan layup with 8:42 remaining.

But Plum scored the game's next six points to spark a 17-2 Washington run and the Huskies built their lead back to 70-56.

Brittany Wilson scored 10 of her 16 points during a final Colorado push. The Buffaloes knocked Washington's lead back down to five with under a minute left with a 13-4 run. However, time ran out on the Buffaloes. Forced to foul, Plum sank her final four tries from the line to put the game away.

Colorado was held to 38 percent from the field. Washington also limited the Buffaloes to one shot, winning the battle of the boards, 45-33.

Arielle Roberson led Colorado with 20 points on 8-of-16 shooting. Jen Reese added 13 points and six rebounds. Haley Smith also grabbed a career-high seven rebounds for the Buffaloes.

"I just think we have to find a way to win games," Wilson said. "We have to find some type of competitive fire and win some games. We have to get it together. We'll definitely figure it out. We'll go home, put our hats together and go hard at home."

BOULDER – Colorado stayed with No. 14 Arizona State for the better part of 40 minutes Sunday at the Coors Events Center. Unfortunately for the Buffaloes, the final half minute was no time to come undone.

Getting a pair of free throws from Adrienne Thomas with 4.4 seconds to play, the Sun Devils edged the Buffs 68-66.

With the score tied at 66-66, CU coach **Linda Lappe** called timeout with 21 seconds to play to set her final strategy. It didn't go as planned; **Brittany Wilson** lost her dribble, ASU got the loose ball and Thomas was fouled with 4.4 seconds to play.

After Thomas hit both free throws, Wilson lost the ball coming up court, recovered, but could manage only a three-quarter court heave that only added to CU's afternoon of frustration.

Jen Reese, who matched her career high with 22 points for a second straight game, said she believed the Buffs were focused coming of their timeout when the score was tied at 66. "But we should have gotten a shot up," she added. "We didn't finish...they were fouled and hit their free throws."

Aiding Reese in the scoring column were Brittany and **Ashley Wilson** with 12 points each and **Jamee Swan** with 10.

CU outrebounded ASU 42-35 and hit 20-of-23 free throws – including 11-of-11 in the first half. ASU led by 10 points in the first half before CU regained its shooting touch and made the afternoon competitive in the second half.

From the 15:05 mark until 7:23 before intermission, they dropped from 75 percent shooting to 35 percent – going one for 12 and watching the Sun Devils launch a 12-0 run. That surge enabled ASU to take a double-digit lead – 24-14 – and appear to be in control.

But CU wasn't ready to roll. If their shooting touches from the field occasionally went icy, it was a different story at the free throw line. The Buffs were perfect at the foul line, hitting all of 11 of their attempts – which kept them in the game. By halftime their field goal percentage was a humbling 30.3 (10-of-33), while the Sun Devils checked in at 42.9 percent (12-of-28).

After Mann scored consecutive baskets to open the second half scoring and push ASU ahead 38-31, Reese – her nine field goals were a career high – hit a put-back to open a 6-0 run that pulled the Buffs to within 38-37. It was the closest CU had been since 13-12.

The Buffs got their first lead since 12-11 on a layup by Roberson that sent them up 39-38 with 15:16 remaining. CU matched its largest lead to that point – three points at 43-40 – on back-to-back baskets by Reese.

But Promise Amukamara matched Reese's two buckets, giving ASU a 44-43 advantage and promising a back-and-forth final 10 minutes – if the Buffs didn't encounter another Ice Age. They didn't, and even a five-point ASU lead (52-47) didn't deter them.

The Buffs lost their perfection from the foul line when Ashley Wilson finally missed the first of two with 8:58 to play. But "A-Will" hit the second attempt, followed with two more on the next possession and tied the score at 52-52.

Neither team led by more than two over the final 8 minutes, with CU taking a two-point advantage (66-64) on a three-point play by Ashley Wilson with 2:51 left.

With the Buffs leading 66-65, Reese missed a foul line jumper with 45 seconds left ASU called a time out with 41.9 seconds to play. Fouled by Brittany Wilson on a loose ball battle, Kelsey Moos hit one of two free throws to tie the score at 66-66 at the 28.5-second mark.

Reese controlled the rebound on Moos' miss and it was CU's turn for a timeout to set its final strategy in the last 21.1 seconds. If both of the Buffs' final possessions went bust, the Sun Devils have been there and conquered that.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah – Utah used a decisive 10-3 run over the final 3 minutes, 48 seconds to edge Colorado 58-55 Wednesday night at the Huntsman Center.

Brittany Wilson scored a game-high 22 points and Jamee Swan had 15 points and nine rebounds as the Buffaloes dropped to 12-8, 2-7 in Pac-12 play.

Swan scored four straight points to give Colorado a 52-48 lead, but Cheyenne Wilson quickly answered with a 3-pointer. After a turnover, All-Pac-12 forward Michelle Plouffe put the Utes on top 53-52 with 2:48 left.

That was the last basket by either team until the final seconds. Utah was able to get stops on three of four possessions allowing only an Ashley Wilson free throw with 41 seconds left. In that time Ciera Dunbar hit four free throws for the Utes and Plouffe added another as the Utes pushed their lead to 58-53.

Brittany Wilson was able to score with six seconds left to cut the lead to three and the Buffaloes forced a Utah turnover on the inbound. With both teams out of timeouts, Colorado tried to get the ball into Lauren Huggins who couldn't catch it cleanly, but the Buffs caught a break as Utah knocked it out of bounds with two seconds left.

But it wasn't enough as a 3-point attempt by Arielle Roberson from the top of the key at the buzzer fell short of the rim.

Colorado was fantastic from the free throw line making 19-of-22, but struggled from the floor hitting only 36 percent and was held without a 3-point field goal for the second-straight game (0-of-7).

"We have to keep fighting, there's no choice," CU head coach Linda Lappe said. "There's still a lot of season left. We just have to keep at it and keep getting better. That's ultimately what we have to do and right now, we're just not quite good enough."

Plouffe led Utah 10-10, 3-6) with 14 points and eight rebounds, although Colorado made her work to the tune of 6-of-17 from the field. The Buffaloes also held second-leading scorer Emily Potter to 6 points on 2-of-7 shooting.

But Colorado's top two scorers, Roberson and Jen Reese, were held to a combined nine points on 3-of-15 shooting.
