Rachel Hargis gives Colorado a strong, physical presence in the low blocks. Combined with her wealth of experience – she's missed only one of a possible 101 games in her career – Hargis solidifies a Colorado defense that smashed program records a year ago. The first signee of the Linda Lappe coaching era, Hargis has hooked up against the nation's best, in both the Big 12 and Pac-12 Conferences.

**Career:** Ranks ninth in career blocked shots with 84, well on pace to become the eighth player in team history to reach 100. Enters her senior year with exactly 100 games played, giving her a shot to eclipse Erin Scholz's mark for career games at 132 – running neck-and-neck with classmate Brittany Wilson who enters the season at 101.

**2012-13 (Junior):** Hargis' year-to-year improvement began to turn heads in the Pac-12 as she earned honorable mention to the league's all-defensive team. She led Colorado and ranked 10th in the Pac-12 in blocked shots at 1.1 per game (34 total). Hargis moved up one rung of the ladder during league play, ranking ninth in that same category during conference games (18, 1.0 bpg). She came up big in Colorado's 70-66 upset win over No. 8/8 ranked Louisville (12/14) recording a career- and team-season high seven blocks, just one off the school single-game record of eight. In addition she pitched in seven points and three rebounds against the eventual national runner-up. While her blocking exploits came as expected, what may have been

more impressive is Hargis' all-around game picked up as a junior. She had a career high 26 steals – nearly equaling her total from her first two seasons combined – and 30 assists. Hargis picked up 15 of her steals during CU's late season 10-game win streak (1.5 spg). One of the most complete games of her career came at home against Oregon (2/10) where she scored a season-best 10 points on 4-of-7 from the field while recording four rebounds, three

assists, a career-best three steals and two blocks. On the season she averaged 4.3 points per game while hitting 42 percent from the field, both improvements from her first two seasons. Hargis started the first 31 games of the season – the only Buffalo to do so – but missed the NCAA Tournament game against Kansas (3/23) with a knee injury.

**2011-12 (Sophomore):** Hargis saw her scoring and rebounding numbers rise slightly in her second year, averaging 3.7 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. She played in all 35 games and started the first 17 before Colorado switched to a smaller, quicker lineup during league play. Hargis had a career night against Texas-Pan American (12/20) at the UTSA Holiday Classic. Playing in her home state, she recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds in 31 minutes against UTPA. She had one other double-digit scoring game, netting 10 in the home loss to California (1/12). Fifteen of her season's 26 blocked shots came during Pac-12 play, ranking 14th in the league in conference only contests. She had nine games with five or more rebounds, including seven in the WNIT win over South Dakota (3/19). Her first collegiate start came in the season opener against Northern Arizona (11/11) where she pitched in a then-personal best nine points on 4-of-7 from the field. She played a career-best 33 minutes in the Omni Classic championship game win over Wisconsin finishing with eight points, seven rebounds, two steals and two assists.

**2010-11 (Freshman):** Hargis played in all 34 games averaging 2.6 points, 2.9 rebounds and 0.7 blocks per game. Hargis, who played double-digit minutes in 30 of her 34 games, became a solid player off the bench, especially on the defensive end. She ranked second on the team in blocked shots with 24, which was also the third best total among freshmen in

the Big 12. She stepped it up in that category during league play as 16 of those 24 blocks came during the conference schedule ranking 11th on the overall league charts. Hargis was a sub .500 free-throw shooter on the season (.489), but she made 14 of her last 18 attempts (.778). Hargis ranked fourth on the team with 17 steals. She had a career night against Nebraska netting personal bests with six points and eight rebounds in 26 minutes. Hargis had seven games with five or more rebounds. She recorded a career and team-season high four blocked shots at No. 20/23 Iowa State (2/19).

**High School:** Hargis is a 2010 graduate of Robinson High School, located just southeast of Waco, Texas. She averaged 14.4 points, 7.1 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game while shooting 52 percent from the field as a senior, guiding the Rockets to an overall record of 20-12, a second place finish in District 19-3A and a spot in the 3A Region Quarterfinals. Hargis had a story book junior season in 2009 as Robinson went 34-5 and won the Texas 3A state championship. She was named the championship game MVP, scoring 20 points and recording 13 rebounds in the Rockets' 49-33 win over Argyle High School. Hargis was named to the All-State Tournament Team and All-Region Tournament Team. She averaged 10.4 points, 6.2 rebounds and 2.2 blocks as a junior, earning *Waco Tribune-Herald* SuperCenTex First Team honors as well as All-District 19-3A First Team accolades. Hargis was named to the *Waco Tribune-Herald's* SuperCenTex Second Team as a sophomore and a senior. She was a three-year all-district performer. She played AAU ball with the DFW Elite on the T-Jack Elite squad. Hargis was rated the No. 43 post player in the nation by *ESPN.com's HoopGurlz* coming out of high school, and she was a 2010 McDonald's All-American Game nominee. She was a four-time academic all-district selection and was also involved in the National Honor Society, volleyball, track & field, Spirit Leading and FCA at Robinson.

**2012-13 (Junior):** She averaged 2.8 points and 2.2 rebounds in 26 games as a junior, including a pair of starts; at UMKC (11/18) and in the 2013 Pac-12 opener against No. 4/3 Stanford (1/4). Wilson missed six games during the nonconference schedule after arthroscopic knee surgery which allowed her to heal and participate in the final 22 games of the season. She scored a season best seven points in the Stanford road game (1/27) including her lone 3-pointer of the season. Wilson had a career-best eight rebounds in the home win over Arizona (1/20) distributed evenly between four offensive and defensive rebounds. Her playing time picked up as she gained strength throughout the season. In the home win over Washington (2/24), which gave the Buffaloes the inside track to fourth place in the league standings, Wilson

shined, contributing six points on 3-of-6 from the field, seven rebounds and an assist in a career-high 32 minutes off the bench. That performance game during a seven-game stretch where she corralled 27 of her season's 57 rebounds (3.9 rpg). Wilson had a solid night against Washington State (2/22) recording a personal-best four steals to go along with four rebounds and two assists. In the Pac-12 Tournament win over Washington (3/8), Wilson had six points on 3-of-5 from the field with four rebounds.

**2011-12 (Sophomore):** Wilson saw her time increase nearly four minutes per game from her freshman to sophomore seasons, playing in all but one contest (missed the Creighton game with a concussion). She developed a knack for rebounding, especially on the offensive end. Wilson totalled 97 rebounds on the season (2.9 rpg), with 43 coming on the offensive side. She had five games with five or more rebounds and six games with three or more offensive boards. She established career-bests with five offensive rebounds, and seven total, in the Omni Hotels Classic win over Valparaiso (11/25). She reached double digits in scoring for the first time as a collegian with 13 against Weber State (12/17) and had nine points on four other occasions. Wilson was one of Colorado's more accurate shooters, making 47.8 percent on the season (44-of-92). She started five games, including the season opener against Northern Arizona (11/11) where she scored seven points and dished out a personal-best four assists. Wilson had a strong end to the season as well, averaging 4.7 points and three rebounds while hitting 7-of-13 from the field in the final six games. She made 5-of-7 from the floor over the four WNIT contests. In the quarterfinal against Oklahoma State, she hit all six of her foul shots, netting career highs for both free throws made and attempted..

**2010-11 (Freshman):** Wilson played in 30 of 34 games averaging 2.1 points and 1.6 rebounds in just under 12 minutes per game. She had her best night against Texas State (12/1) scoring a career-best 10 points with five rebounds, three assists and one steal. Wilson played double-digit minutes in 18 games, including a personal-best 21 against Texas Tech. She had six games with three or more rebounds, including four against Oklahoma State – all on the offensive end. She grabbed 21 of her season's 47 rebounds on the offensive end.

**High School:** Ashley Wilson is a 2010 graduate of Long Beach Poly High School. She played for one of the most storied programs in Southern California, as the Jackrabbits amassed a 131-9 record during her four year

career with three California Division I state titles and one runner-up finish. She averaged 7.4 points, 2.9 steals and 2.3 rebounds per game as a senior, receiving all-Moore League acclaim as well as the Coaches Award for 2010, helping the Jackrabbits to the Moore League title and a runner-up state finish. Wilson averaged 6.2 points and shot 48 percent from the field as a junior, helping the Jackrabbits to a 32-3 record in 2008-09 and a fourth consecutive state title. *ESPN RISE FAB 50* had Long Beach Poly ranked No. 1 in the nation early in the 2008-09 season, ending at No. 30 while *USA Today's* final Super 25 rankings had the Jackrabbits at No. 23. Brittany Wilson has been a mainstay in the Colorado program for the last three years. She was an offensive threat from the day she stepped on campus, but the development of her defense over the last three seasons has elevated her to the upper echelon of guards in the Pac-12. She is quick on both ends of the floor. A tenacious defender, who is not afraid of going up against any player in the country. Her ability to run helps the Buffaloes thrive in transition, either by setting up a teammate or finishing on her own. Her maturity on the court has blossomed, and now as a senior will be counted on to set an example for her younger teammates.

**Career:** The squad's active leader in career scoring, Wilson needs just 151 points to become the 25th member of Colorado's 1,000-point club. Already with 101 career games played, she has a chance to pass Erin Scholz's career record of 132 set from 1993-97. Wilson enters her senior year in 10th place on Colorado's all-time list for 3-point field goals with 102. Her 39 double-figure scoring games rank 28th on CU's all-time list while her 126 steals are just six away from cracking the program's top 20.

**2012-13 (Junior):** Emerged as one of the top defensive players in the Pac-12 Conference, earning all-defensive team honors. Wilson anchored one of the Pac-12's best defenses, which set team records for scoring, field-goals allowed and field-goal percentage defense. She consistently marked the other team's best back court player and repeatedly held her opponent

well below their season averages. Wilson had 43 steals on the season, helping a CU defense that averaged 9.8 per game, ranking second in the Pac-12. She had 10 games with two or more steals including a team season-high five in the home win over Oregon State (2/8). Overall on the season, Wilson ranked second on the team in steals, assists (70) and 3-point field goals (32) while coming in fourth in scoring at 8.3 points per game. Wilson had a great year from the free-

throw line. She ranked sixth in the Pac-12 in overall free-throw percentage (.762) and made her first 19 attempts of the season. Wilson hit a career-best eight free throws in the season-opening win over Idaho (11/11). She became the 10th player to reach 100 career 3-point field goals in the Pac-12 Conference Tournament semifinal loss to Stanford, also hitting the 100 career games played milestone in that same contest. Wilson blocked 13 shots on the season after recording only eight in her first two seasons combined. Three of those blocked shots came in the road loss at No. 6/6 ranked Stanford (1/27). She played in all 32 games, starting in 31. She scored double digits in 11 games, netting a season high 19 in the win at Denver (12/11).

**2011-12 (Sophomore):** She ranked second on the team in several categories including scoring (9.1 ppg), assists (63), steals (47) and 3-point field goals made and attempted (44-of-141). Her 31.2 percent accuracy from downtown was 13th in the Pac-12 while she also ranked 14th in 3-pointers made per game (1.3) and 27th in scoring. Wilson scored in double figures 16 times this season, including in five of six postseason games. She reached 20 points three times, beginning the season with a career-best 22-point effort in the win over Northern Arizona (11/11). Her two other 20-point efforts had a "Southern California" flair for the L.A. native. She scored 21 points, hitting 8-of-15 from the field, in the win over USC (1/26), one of Colorado's most complete games of the season. Wilson also led the Buffaloes with 21 points against Utah (3/7) in the first round of the Pac-12 Tournament, played in front of her hometown crowd at USC's Galen Center. Wilson finished the season strong, averaging 13.7 points, four rebounds and two steals over the final six games, encompassing the Pac-12 Tournament and Postseason WNIT. She led the Buffaloes in scoring during the Pac-12 Tournament at 19.5 points per game while shooting 60 percent from 3-point range (6-of-10). Wilson established a career-high with four 3-point field goals made in the WNIT quarterfinal game at Oklahoma State (3/22). She started in 23 of 35 games, including the final 19 contests.

**2010-11 (Freshman):** Averaged 7.8 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game. She was second on the team in assists (61), behind Chucky Jeffery and ranked third in scoring behind Jeffery and Brittany Spears. She was one of three Buffaloes – joining Spears and Jeffery — with at least 30 assists and 30 steals. Her 36 total steals ranked fifth among freshmen in the Big 12. Wilson worked her way into Colorado's starting lineup and started 21 of the last 22 games played. She made her first career start in the win over North Dakota (1/4), responding with 15 points with career highs in 3-point field goals (four) and steals (four). She recorded her first career double-double with 12 rebounds and 11 points against Missouri (1/22). Wilson had 12 games in double-digits, including 19, to go along with eight rebounds, in CU's 66-60 overtime upset win over No. 17/16 Iowa State (1/15). Wilson scored a personal-best 22 points at Kansas (2/2). She averaged 10.3 points in Colorado's four Postseason WNIT games.

**High School:** Brittany Wilson is a 2010 graduate of Long Beach Poly High School. She played for one of the most storied programs in Southern California, as the Jackrabbits amassed a 131-9 record during her four year career with three California Division I state titles and one runner-up finish. Wilson averaged 8.8 points, 2.5 steals and 2.4 assists per game in her senior season at Long Beach Poly as she was named first team all-state, was Co-MVP of the Moore League and was a McDonald's All-America candidate. She lists the biggest moment of her high school career was scoring 27 points against Fontana Summit in the Southern California semifinals, with a broken wrist. Wilson was named to the 2010 *Long Beach Press Telegram's* Girls Basketball Dream Team. As a junior, she averaged 7.9 points and 3.5 steals, was named to the All-California Interscholastic Federation (CIF)-Southern Section first team and the All-Moore League first team as the Jackrabbits won their fourth-straight California Division I title. *ESPN RISE FAB 50* had Long Beach Poly ranked No. 1 in the nation early in the 2008-09 season, ending at No. 30 while *USA Today's* final Super 25 rankings had

## Lexy Kresl



Guard • 5-11 • Junior • 2L • Paradise Valley, Ariz. (Shadow Mountain)

Lexy Kresl has already made a mark on the CU history books with her 3-point shooting efforts, but an improved defensive presence from her freshman to sophomore seasons is what has pleased the Colorado coaching staff. She's a versatile guard who can no doubt rip the nets, but she knows the offense enough to run the point and is big and quick enough to play out on the wing.

**Career:** Just shy of the century mark on 3-pointers as she ranks 11th Colorado's all-time list with 97. She has made a 3-pointer in 50 of 64 career contests and has 27 games with two or more.

**2012-13 (Sophomore):** Led Colorado in 3-point shooting for the second-straight season connecting on 34 from long range. She ranked 14th in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made per game at 1.2. She hit 32 percent from downtown during the conference season (17-of-54) ranking 15th in the Pac-12 in league-only games. On the season she averaged 6.0 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.3 steals per game. Her 38 steals ranked third on the team and she led the team on seven different occasions. Kresl tied a personal-best with 20 points in the win over New Mexico (12/29). In that game she tied a school record for 3-pointers made without a miss, hitting on all five attempts from beyond the arc. She actually hit six in a row over two games, making her only attempt in the win over Utah Valley (12/22). She also matched a career-best with seven field-goals made against New Mexico. Kresl scored in double-digits four times, the other three coming during the Pac-12 schedule. Kresl had season-highs of seven rebounds in back-to-back games, at home against Arizona (1/20) and at No. 7/7 ranked California (1/25). She was starting to pick up momentum late in the season, averaging 9.0 points and 2.3 steals over a four game stretch before a shoulder injury forced her to miss three games.

**2011-12 (Freshman):** Kresl averaged nine points and led Colorado in 3-pointers made (63) and attempted (198) en route to Pac-12 All-Freshman honors voted on by the media. She earned honorable mention to the coaches' All-Freshman team. Kresl ranked second among Pac-12 freshman in 3-pointers and fifth in scoring. On the overall league charts, she was fifth in 3-pointers made (1.8 3mpg), 12th in 3-point percentage (.318) and 28th in scoring. Her 63 3-pointers were most by a CU freshman breaking the mark of 57 previously held by Brittany Spears (2007-08) and Shelley Sheetz (1991-92). It was the 12th time a CU player has made 60 3-pointers in one season and just the

seventh different player to do so. She made a 3-pointer in 31-of-35 games. Kresl scored a career high 20 points on 6-of-7 from downtown in the win over Oregon State (3/3), the top single-game 3-point percentage in the Pac-12 this season. She was named to the UTSA Classic All-Tournament team, averaging 14.5 points and hitting 50 percent from the field. Kresl topped off the tournament in style by hitting the game-winning 3-point shot at the buzzer against Creighton (12/21). She earned Omni Hotels Classic All-Tournament Team honors, scoring 16 points in the championship game against Wisconsin (11/26) including a team season-best 8-for-8 from the free throw line. She made 36-of-40 free throws on the season, and will carry a string of 17 straight made into the 2012-13 season. Kresl enjoyed a spectacular collegiate debut, tying a school record by hitting five 3-pointers in the first half against Northern Arizona (11/11), finishing with 15 points on 5-of-8 shooting. She registered six straight double-figure scoring games to begin her career, tying Shelley Sheetz for the second most in team history.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Lexy Kresl is a 2011 graduate of Shadow Mountain High School in Paradise Valley, Ariz., where she is the program's all-time leading scorer with 2,404 points. She earned consecutive All-Arizona, first-team all-state and regional player of the year accolades and was Arizona's leading scorer her junior and senior years. As a senior, she was a McDonald's All-American nominee after averaging 25 points and 14 rebounds per game. She was named Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year as a senior and earned an Arizona Women's Wendy's Heisman as a junior. During her junior season, Kresl led Shadow Mountain High School to the 2010 Arizona 4AI state title and was named tournament MVP. She was an *ESPN Rise* All-American after averaging 27 points and 12 rebounds per game. The same year she named Western Sky Player of the Year and earned all tournament honors at the Nike Tournament of Champions. As a sophomore in 2009, she averaged 16 points and seven rebounds, earning all-region honors. Kresl guided Shadow Mountain to a four-year

Forward • 6-2 • Junior • 2L • Clackamas, Ore. (Clackamas)



Jen Reese compliments a solid Colorado front line with her ability to play physical down low and knock down the outside shot. She has a nice soft touch on her stroke and has displayed range out towards the 3-point arc. Reese proved to be a clutch player in many pressure situations for the Buffaloes as a sophomore and is definitely a go-to player for the Buffaloes.

**2012-13 (Sophomore):** Reese made a successful return from a freshman year eye injury, playing in all 32 games. One of the top bench players in the league, she earned honorable mention to the coach's All-Pac-12 team. She was third on the team in scoring (8.4 ppg) and rebounding (4.9 rpg) while hitting 42.5 percent from the field and a team-best 80.6 percent from the foul line. She was especially sharp from the foul line during conference play, sinking 85.3 percent (29-of-34) including a string of 17 straight. Reese scored a career-high 22 points in the comeback win at Arizona State (1/18), where the Buffaloes trailed by as much as 12 in the second half before claiming a 71-63 win. Against the Sun Devils she was 7-of-10 from the floor and recorded a personal and team season-best 8-for-8 from the free-throw stripe. She was especially sharp in the desert that weekend, netting 15 points and six rebounds against Arizona (1/20), tying a career best with seven field-goals made in each contest. She narrowly missed her second career double-double with 14 points and a season-high nine rebounds in the Omni Hotels championship game win over San Diego State (11/24). Her biggest single rebound however came in the final seconds of CU's 70-66 upset over No. 8/8 Louisville (12/14). With Colorado up by two and 11 seconds remaining, Brittany Wilson missed a pair of free throws, but on the second one

Reese grabbed the offensive rebound and scored on the put-back to preserve the final margin. On the season she scored in double digits 14 times and led the team in scoring on four occasions. Reese made her only start of the season, for an injured Rachel Hargis, in the NCAA Tournament game against Kansas (3/23).

**2011-12 (Freshman):** Reese ranked second on the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg) and fourth in scoring (7.8 ppg) as a first year Buffalo. She led all Pac-12 freshmen in rebounding by average and earned honorable mention to the Pac-12 All-Freshman team voted on by league coaches. Reese played in 25 games and moved into the starting lineup for nine straight before suffering a broken orbital bone

underneath her left eye while attempting to take a charge in the opening minutes of the game at No. 2 Stanford (2/23). She had come into her own, leading Colorado in rebounding (or sharing the lead) in six of the last nine games prior to her injury. Reese grabbed a career-best 14 rebounds against UCLA (1/29), the third highest total by a CU player this season. She made her first career start at Arizona, responding with 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Logged her first career double-double with 12 points, on 6-of-7 shooting, and 12 rebounds in the win at Washington State (1/7). She had 11 games with seven or more rebounds, including four in double-digits. Reese was named to the UTSA Holiday Classic All-Tournament Team, averaging 12.5 points over the two games while shooting 66.7 percent (10-of-15). She had a career-high 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting — including her lone 3-pointer made— in the win over Creighton (12/21). She made her collegiate debut against Northern Arizona scoring eight points on 3-of-6 from the field while grabbing three steals. Reese had 11 games of shooting 50 percent or better, finishing her season at 44.9 percent, which would have ranked among the top 12 in the Pac-12, but fell just short of the minimum number of games played to be ranked in the league leaderboard.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Reese is a 2011 graduate of Clackamas (Ore.) High School. A 2011 *Parade Magazine* All-American, Reese averaged 25 points, 20 rebounds, six assists and five blocks as a senior guiding the Cavaliers to a 27-2 record and a second place state finish, the program's best ever state placing. She became the first player to be named Oregon's Gatorade Girls Basketball Player of the Year on two occasions (2010, '11). Reese led the Three Rivers League in scoring as a senior, helping Clackamas to an undefeated (15-0) conference championship season, and a 25-game win streak along the way. She is a three-time Class 6A first team all-state selection and Three Rivers MVP and a four-time first team all-league selection. A 2011 McDonald's All-American nominee, Reese was the MVP of the state of Oregon and the

**Sophomore (2012-13):** Sborov averaged 2.8 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.3 assists, appearing in 30 of 32 contests. She logged a total of 10 starts, six coming during the nonconference schedule and four more at the tail end of the Pac-12 season. Sborov was third on the team in assists with 38. She dished out a career-best four in the home win over Oregon (2/10). The Ducks proved to bring the best out in Sborov as she scored eight in both games of the series, a personal-best during Pac-12 games. She scored a career-high 11 points, hitting 5-of-9 from the field, and grabbed six rebounds in the road win at Illinois (12/1). In that game she also set career marks for field goals made and attempted. Sborov corralled a personal-best eight rebounds in just 19 minutes at UMKC (11/18). She had two double-digit scoring games on the season, the other coming with 10 points against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (11/23) in the first round of the Omni Hotels Classic. **Freshman (2011-12):** Pitched in just under three points and three rebounds per games, but the season averages don't tell the story for Sborov's freshman year. She steadily climbed the ladder throughout the season, moving from the end of the bench, to a starter and key contributor in Colorado's postseason run. Sborov started the final nine games of the season, essentially taking the position of classmate Jen Reese who was lost for the season with an eye injury. She scored 84 of her season's 94 points in the final 20 games of the season and 24 of her season's 32 field goals came in the last 15. Sborov began to see extended action in the home game against No. 4 Stanford (1/14) and played double-digit minutes in all but two of the final 20 contests. She shot 47 percent (8-of-17) during CU's WNIT run averaging 5.8 points and 4.3 rebounds. She tied a career-best playing 29 minutes in the third round win over Villanova (3/22). Sborov had a career night in the home win over Arizona (2/9), setting personal bests with 10 points, on 4-of-6 shooting, with seven rebounds and three assists. She scored her first collegiate points on a layup against Valparaiso (11/25), also logging three blocked shots in that game, the second most by a CU player in a game this season.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Sborov is a 2011 graduate of Round Rock (Texas) High School. She was a was a four-time team MVP, three-time Offensive Player of the Year and two-time first-team all-district 16-5A selection. A McDonald's All-American nominee in 2011, Sborov helped the Dragons to the playoffs for the fourth straight season, averaging 15 points and eight rebounds per game. She led the Dragons to a 15-9 mark in 2010 averaging 12 points and eight rebounds, en route to all-district honors. Sborov led her team in blocks and rebounding while averaging 11 points as a sophomore, earning honorable mention to the all-district team. She averaged 11 points and seven rebounds as a freshman, leading Round Rock in blocked shots. She also

A year proved to be worth the wait as Arielle Roberson exploded onto the scene as a redshirt freshman. An unfortunate injury postponed her debut in a Colorado uniform, but a year of sitting on the bench next to the coaching staff during games helped in her adjustment to collegiate basketball. She is a long, athletic forward with an excellent ability to finish offensively. Roberson can play with her back to the basket or out on the wing, where she's also developed a nice shooting touch which extends out to 3-point range. Chances are she will be the number one priority on most opponents scouting reports, but a successful year in the Pac-12 has Roberson ready to take on that challenge. She was the last signee in Colorado's Class of 2011, waiting until the NCAA's normal signing period (April 2011) to pick the Buffaloes.

**2012-13 (Freshman):** The 2013 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year as voted on by league coaches, Roberson averaged 13.7 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. Her Freshman of the Year honor was the first of its kind for the Buffaloes in any conference. She led Colorado in free-throws made and attempted (97-of-142), ranked second in scoring and rebounding, third in blocked shots (24) and fourth in steals (32). Both the Pac-12 coaches and media members named her to their respective all-freshman teams. Roberson earned honorable mention to the overall Pac-12

All-Conference team as well as its all-defensive squad. She was touted as a third team Freshman All-American by FullCourtPress.com. Roberson ranked seventh in offensive rebounds, 16th in overall rebounds and 17th in scoring on the Pac-12 leaderboard. She dominated the Pac-12's Freshman of the Week honor. In its inaugural season, Roberson won five, including the very first, after recording 16 points, six rebounds and five steals in her collegiate

debut against Idaho (11/11). Her five steals were the most by a CU player in her collegiate debut since Brittany Spears had five in 2007. Her five weekly conference awards in one season are the most by any Buffalo in the Big 12, Pac-12 era (since 1996-97). Roberson was the MVP of the Omni Hotels Classic, the first CU freshman to win that honor, averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over the two-game series. She scored a career-high 25 points to lead Colorado in the win at Illinois (12/1), nailing a clutch 3-pointer in the final minute to put the game away. Roberson hit 41.2 percent from 3-point range, the ninth-best single season mark in team history with a minimum of 50 attempts (21-of-51). She caught fire at the tail end of the season, making 13 of her last 25 (.520). She scored in double-digits 23 times, including the first 13 games which set a school record to start a CU career. Roberson led the Buffaloes in scoring on 10 occasions. She started in 31 of 32 games, coming off the bench against UMKC (11/18) and in that game she scored 23 points on 9-of-12 from the field. Her 23 points off the bench were the second most, and her nine field goals the most, for any Buffalo in the last 10 seasons. Roberson had three double-doubles, all of which came in the final seven games of the season, including an 11-point, 12-rebound performance against Kansas (3/23) in the NCAA Tournament. Her first double-double was a 17-point and personal-best 13-rebound effort against Washington State (2/22). The WSU game was her first of two on the season where she grabbed eight offensive rebounds; the other was her second double-double, a 10-point, 11-rebound performance in the overtime win at Oregon State in the regular season finale (3/3). She averaged 12.8 points and 8.5 rebounds over the final eight games.

**2011-12 (Redshirt):** Sat out the 2011-12 season after developing a torn labrum in her left hip during preseason workouts. She underwent successful surgery to repair the tear in December 2011.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Roberson is a 2011 graduate of Wagner High School in San Antonio where she was a Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC) and Texas Girls Coaches Association (TGCA) All-State pick as a senior. She averaged 18.2 points, 9.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists, three steals and two blocks per game in 2011 while guiding Wagner to a 32-7 record, advancing to the semifinals of the Texas 5A State Tournament. A multiple all-region and all-district performer, Roberson also shot 57 percent from the field and 73 percent from the free-throw line as a senior. A two-time member of the *San Antonio Express-News* All-City Super Team, Roberson finished her career at Wagner with 1,640 points. She was unanimously chosen as the District 25-5A MVP as a senior and was also a McDonald's All-American nominee and the MVP of the Lone Star Invitational Tournament. Roberson, who played in the TABC Girls All-Star Game in May 2011, was a part of three state tournament teams at Wagner sporting a four-year record of 133-15. Roberson also was a three-year letterwinner in volleyball. She played club basketball with TeamXpress.

## Jamee Swan

Forward • 6-2 • Sophomore • 1L • Marana, Ariz. (Marana)



The sky is the limit for Jamee Swan who displayed flashes of dominance during her freshman campaign. She is a fiery, passionate forward that gives Colorado a solid post presence. She is a dynamic rebounder who has the strength to finish down low, but can also move to the outside and play with her face to the basket. Consistency will be key for Swan as she looks for a possible break-out season.

**2012-13 (Freshman):** Swan led Colorado in field-goal accuracy at 45.5 percent (66-of-145) and ranked second in blocks (28) and fourth in rebounding (4.5 rpg). Her success from the field actually improved to 48.1 percent (39-of-81) during Pac-12 play and she was the team's third-best rebounder during the league schedule (4.6 rpg). Swan appeared in all 32 games and logged one start which came in the second contest of her career. In that game at UMKC (11/18), she scored 14 points on 6-of-9 from the field with three rebounds. Swan wasn't intimidated by the nation's best. At No. 6/6 Stanford (1/27) she scored 14 points while recording a personal-best 7-of-9 performance from the field. She had an outstanding Pac-12 Tournament, averaging 10.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and

2.0 blocks in games against Washington (3/8) and No. 4/4 ranked Stanford (3/9). Swan recorded her first career double-double with a personal-best 15 points to go along with 10 rebounds in the Pac-12 quarterfinal win over Washington. In all she scored in double-digits five times and grabbed double-digit rebounds on two occasions. Swan grabbed a career-best 11 rebounds in the home win over Utah (1/8), narrowly missing a double-double with eight points. She had a career-best four blocked shots in the NCAA Tournament game against Kansas (3/23).

ranked as the eighth best forward in the nation and the 38th best overall player by *ESPN HoopGurlz*. Swan averaged 20.8 points, 12.8 rebounds, 3.4 blocks and 3.0 steals as a senior, earning All-Southern Arizona, first team All-Division I, and Division I Player of the Year honors from the *Tucson Citizen*. A 2012 *Sporting News* honorable mention All-American, she had a double-double in all but one contest with game highs of 42 points and 19 rebounds. Despite missing 10 games of her senior season with an injury, Swan received honorable mention to the WBCA All-America team and was a McDonald's All-America nominee. Swan averaged 19.6 points, 13.4 rebounds, 4.1 blocked shots and 4.1 steals for the Tigers as a junior, earning first team All-Southern Arizona and Southern Arizona 4A1 Player of the Year honors from the *Tucson Citizen*. She was also the *Arizona Daily Star* Player of the Year and a member of the Class 4A All-State first team. Swan was a 2009-10 Class 4A All-State performer as a sophomore, averaging 21.5 points, 15.2 rebounds and 6.3 blocks per game. Swan earned a total of 12 varsity letters at Marana, also participating in volleyball and track & field. She was the Arizona 2011 Division II state champion in the shot put. Swan played club basketball with the Arizona Elite out of Phoenix.

## Lauren Huggins



Guard/Forward • 6-1 • Freshman • 1L • Littleton, Colo. (Heritage)

Lauren Huggins is eager to return to the floor after missing the final three months of her true freshman season. A medical hardship was granted this summer which allows her to regain her freshman year of eligibility. She is a great shooter with range that extends well beyond the 3-point arc. The first Colorado signee of the Linda Lappe era, she provides the back court with a fantastic scoring option from long distance.

**2012-13 (Freshman):** Huggins played in five games, averaging 2.4 points and 1.2 rebound in 6.0 minutes per game. She scored all 12 of her season's points on 3-pointers, connecting on 4-of-11 from downtown (.364). Her most extended time came against Colorado State (12/5) where she played 17 minutes and recorded six points, three rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot. Shortly after that game was when she was diagnosed with a stress fracture in her right leg that ultimately ended her season. She was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA in the Summer of 2013.

**High School:** A 2012 graduate of Heritage High School in Littleton, Huggins is the first Colorado signee for Linda Lappe's coaching staff. A two-time All-Continental League first team selection, Huggins helped the Eagles to an 18-7 record as a senior and a spot in the Sweet 16 of the Class 5A Colorado State Tournament. She was rated as the 64th best player in the nation and the 11th best wing by *ESPN HoopGurlz*. She starred at 2012 edition of "The Show" Colorado's annual high school basketball all-star game played at the Pepsi Center. Huggins was named MVP of the contest, scoring a game-high 15 points, hitting on 5-of-6 from 3-point range, in her "Blue" team's 69-48 win. As a junior she averaged 12 points and nearly eight rebounds per game, guiding the Eagles to the 2011 Class 5A Sweet 16. A two-time honorable mention to the Class 5A All-State team, she played her club basketball with the Boulder Rockies.

She averaged 17 points and 10 rebounds as a senior, guiding the Mighty Hoppers to a runner up finish at the District of Columbia Interscholastic Athletic Association (DCIAA) state championship. She owns school single-game records for points (42), rebounds (27), free-throws made (22) and free-throws attempted (24). Beard-Fails was a 2013 *Washington Post* "All-Met" Third Team selection and named to the Independent School League All-Conference team. Additionally, she claimed the Alain-Ciaco Sportsmanship Award and was a McDonald's All-America nominee. She averaged 26 points and nearly 18 rebounds as a sophomore for Georgetown Day in 2010-11, earning fourth team All-Met honors from the *Washington Post*. Beard-Fails played her freshman season at South Lakes High School in Reston, Va., where she averaged 16 points and 7 rebounds, earning first team all-district and second team all-region honors. CU was able to bring Beard-Fails from the east coast in part because she already knew current Buffaloes assistants LaTonya Watson, from her days at American University, and Kelly

Rae Finley from her tenure at Harvard. Beard-Fails was rated the 51st forward in the nation by *ESPN.com's Hoop Gurlz*. She played club ball with the Boo Williams program, participating on the team that was the 2011 Nike National runner-up. Beard-Fails' club experience also extended to national tournaments and camps at Michigan, Duke, Stanford and Tennessee. She participated in the USA U-16 Trials in 2011.

**Academics:** Beard-Fails is a pre-journalism major at Colorado and is also interested in humanities. She was the recipient of the Dean's Student Award as a senior at Georgetown Day. She was the commencement speaker at her high school graduation.
