TAR HEEL GOLF NOTES

•**CAROLINA IN THE NCAA REGIONALS:** The Tar Heels' participation in the 2012 NCAA West Regional marks their 19th appearance in the NCAA Regionals. Carolina has played in the NCAA East Regional 17 times since the regional format was instituted in women's golf in 1993 – 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011. Carolina's other two appearances have been in the NCAA West Regional in 2008 and 2012. In the Tar Heels' 18 previous Regional appearances, Carolina's top performance came last year when it was the runner-up at the NCAA East Regional played at LPGA International in Daytona Beach, Fla. Carolina finished in fourth place in 1993 as Tar Heel Kimberly Byham won the individual title by two strokes with a 213 total. Tar Heel Meaghan Francella was the individual medalist at the 2004 NCAA East Regional with a seven-under-par 209 total.

The Tar Heels advanced on to the NCAA Championships from the East Regional in 1993, 1994, 1995, 1998, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2009 and 2011. Carolina has been to the NCAA Championship 13 times – 1982, 1984, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1998, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2009 and 2011.

•**THIS YEAR'S WEST REGIONAL:** This year's NCAA West Regional will be played at Colorado National Golf Club in Erie, Col., with the University of Colorado serving as host. Twenty-four teams and six individuals will compete in the three-day, 54-hole West Regional, May 10-12, for the chance to move on to the NCAA Championships to be played May 22-25 at Vanderbilt's Legends Club, North Course in Franklin, Tenn. The top eight teams and top two individuals not on those eight teams will advance to the NCAA Championships from each of the three regionals -- the East Regional in State College, Pa., the Central Regional in Columbus, Ohio, and the West Regional in Erie, Col.

The teams competing in this year's NCAA West Regional are as follows (listed in order of seed): UCLA, LSU, North Carolina, Colorado, California, Baylor, Pepperdine, UC Davis, Oklahoma, Texas Tech, Tulsa, TCU, Iowa State, Stanford, Denver, UNLV, New Mexico, Oregon State, Illinois, Kennesaw State, San Jose State, Missouri State, Northern Colorado and Jackson State. The six individual participants in the West are Kayla Mortellaro of Idaho, Ally McDonald of Mississippi State, Amy Anderson of North Dakota State, Maggie Yuan of BYU, Brianna Espinoza of Colorado State and Demi Mak of New Mexico State.

•**CAROLINA IN THE POLLS:** Carolina is ranked sixth in the latest Golfstat's Rankings and seventh in the Golfweek/Sagarin Rankings and the Golf World/NGCA Coaches' Poll.

•**CAROLINA'S SPRING CAMPAIGN:** Carolina has carded five top-10 finishes in five events this spring. Carolina was the runner-up at the ACC Championships and the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate, finished third at the LSU Golf Classic, tied for fourth at the Bryan National Collegiate and placed eighth at the Central District Invitational. After missing the final event of fall and first of the spring due to a thumb injury, Catherine O'Donnell tied for first place at the LSU Golf Classic, the second win of her collegiate career. Katherine Perry led the Tar Heels at two spring events, finishing third at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate and tying for 16th at the Central District Invitational. Casey Grice was the top Tar Heel at the ACC Championships, where she placed fifth, and the Bryan National Collegiate, tying for 16th.

•**CAROLINA'S FALL CAMPAIGN:** Carolina posted three top-five finishes in four events last fall. The Tar Heels were the runners-up at the Cougar Classic, the first event of the fall. They finished fourth at the Tar Heel Invitational and tied for fifth place at the Mason Rudolph Fall Preview. In its other event, Carolina tied for eighth at The Landfall Tradition. Jackie Chang led Carolina at the Cougar Classic by finishing fifth. Casey Grice led the Tar Heels at their other three events, tying for eighth place at the Mason Rudolph Fall Preview and the Tar Heel Invitational and tying for 10th at The Landfall Tradition.

•**ALL-ACC HONORS:** North Carolina placed three players, Casey Grice, Catherine O'Donnell and Katherine Perry, on the 2012 All-ACC Women's Golf Team. This marks O'Donnell's fourth straight year on the all-conference squad, the first Tar Heel to accomplish that feat. This was Grice's and Perry's first time on the squad.

Lindy Duncan, a junior at Duke, was selected the ACC Player of the Year while NC State's Augusta James was chosen as the ACC Freshman of the Year. Duke's Dan Brooks was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the 12th time in his career, the first time since 2007.

Casey Grice ••• Sophomore **College Station, Texas (A&M Consolidated)**

Casey Grice broke into the starting lineup as a freshman and quickly made her mark on the Tar Heel program. She was recently selected to the 2012 All-ACC team and has carded five top-10 and eight top-20 finishes in nine events. Grice's top performance came at the ACC Championships where she placed fifth to lead the Tar Heels to a runner-up finish. Last fall, Grice tied for eighth at the Mason Rudolph Fall Preview and the Tar Heel Invitational. She finished eighth at the Cougar Classic, competing as an individual, and tied for 10th at The Landfall Tradition. This spring, in addition to ACCs, Grice was the top Tar Heel at The Bryan National Collegiate, tying for 16th place. She finished 20th at the Central District Invitational and tied for 20th at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate. Grice tied for 36th place at the LSU Golf Classic.

Grice leads the team with a 73.62 stroke average. She has scored three even par rounds and six under-par rounds, two in the 60s. Her low round of 4-under-par 68 came in the second round of the Cougar Classic, the first event of the year.

This is Grice's second appearance in the NCAA Regionals. She tied for 20th at last year's NCAA East Regional played at LPGA International in Daytona Beach, Fla.



Allie White ••• Senior **Lancaster, Ohio (Lancaster)**

Allie White played in all nine of Carolina's tournaments this year. She carded six top-30 finishes including four in the top 20. Her top performance came at the ACC Championships where she placed sixth. This spring she also tied for 10th place at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate. White tied for 15th place at the Tar Heel Invitational, tied for 16th at the Mason Rudolph Fall Preview, tied for 22nd at the Cougar Classic and tied for 28th at the Central District Invitational. She also tied for 40th at the LSU Golf Classic, tied for 65th at the Bryan National Collegiate and tied for 66th at The Landfall Tradition.

White has a 75.12 stroke average. She has carded four even par rounds and two under-par rounds, including one in the 60s. Her low round of 3-under 69 came in the second round of the Cougar Classic. In 2009 and 2011, White was selected to the All-ACC team, named NGCA All-America Scholar and named to All-ACC Academic Women's Golf Team. She was also a 2009 Golfweek All-America Honorable Mention.

This is White's third appearance in the NCAA Regionals. She tied for 15th place at the 2009 NCAA East Regional played in Gainesville, Fla., and tied for 18th place at the 2011 NCAA East Regional played in Daytona Beach, Fla.



Katherine Perry ••• Sophomore **Cary, N.C. (Athens Drive)**

Katherine Perry, a 2012 All-ACC selection, has played in eight of Carolina's tournaments this year. After one top-30 finish last fall, a tie for 26th at the Cougar Classic, Perry has turned it around this spring with four top-20 and five top-30 finishes. Her top performance was a third-place finish at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate when she led the Tar Heels to a runner-up finish in the team race. She finished in 10th place at the ACC Championships, tied for 10th at the LSU Golf Classic, tied for 16th at the Central District Invitational and tied for 30th at the Bryan National Collegiate. Last fall, Perry also tied for 55th at the Tar Heel Invitational and tied for 59th at The Landfall Tradition.

Perry has a stroke average of 74.70. She has fired four under-par rounds including two in the 60s, and one even par round. Her low round of 69 occurred twice – in the first round of the Cougar Classic and the second round of the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate.

This will be Perry's second appearance in the NCAA Regionals. She tied for 11th at last year's NCAA East Regional played at LPGA International in Daytona Beach, Fla.



Catherine O'Donnell ••• Senior **Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla. (Nease)**

Catherine O'Donnell, recently chosen to the 2012 All-ACC team, broke into the starting lineup in just her freshman year and has been a starter ever since. She played in all of Carolina's tournaments this year except the last one of the fall and first one of the spring due to a thumb injury and surgery. After returning to the lineup, O'Donnell tied for first place at the LSU Golf Classic by firing a 2-under-par 214 total. That was her second collegiate win as she also tied for first at the 2008 Tar Heel Invitational. In addition to her win, she tied for 12th at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate, tied for 14th at the ACC Championships and tied for 25th at the Bryan National Collegiate. O'Donnell was hampered by the thumb injury throughout the fall campaign as she tied for 37th at the Tar Heel Invitational, tied for 44th at the Cougar Classic and withdrew prior to the final round of the Mason Rudolph Fall Preview due to the injury.

O'Donnell boasts a 74.11 stroke average for the year. She has fired one even par round and four under-par rounds, one in the 60s. Her low round was a 3-under-par 69 which she fired in the second round of the Bryan National Collegiate. O'Donnell was selected the ACC Freshman of the Year in 2009 and is a four-time selection to the All-ACC team (2009-2012), Carolina's first four-time honoree. She was named 2011 Ping Golfweek All-America Third Team and was an Honorable Mention in 2009. O'Donnell was selected to the 2011 NGCA All-East Region Team and a 2011 NGCA All-America Honorable Mention. She was chosen to the 2010 All-ACC Academic Women's Golf Team.

O'Donnell has played in three NCAA Regionals – she tied for 14th at the 2009 NCAA East Regional, tied for 30th at the 2010 NCAA East Regional and tied for sixth at the 2011 NCAA East Regional.



Courtney Gunter •• Junior Matthews, N.C. (Porter Ridge)

Courtney Gunter has played in eight tournaments this year, competing in four as an individual. Her top performance was a 12th-place finish at the Cougar Classic, the first event of the year. Also in the fall, she tied for 53rd at The Landfall Tradition, tied for 39th at the Mason Rudolph Fall Preview and tied for 76th at the Tar Heel Invitational, competing as an individual. This spring, Gunter tied for 31st at the LSU Golf Classic, tied for 38th at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate and tied for 72nd at the Bryan National Collegiate, playing in all as an individual. She also finished 70th at the Central District Invitational.

Gunter as a 76.74 scoring average. She has scored two even par rounds and two under-par rounds. Her low round of 2-under-par 70 came in the second round of the Cougar Classic.

This is Gunter's second appearance in the NCAA Regionals. She tied for 39th at the 2010 NCAA East Regional played at Ironwood Golf and Country Club in Greenville, N.C.



Head Coach Jan Mann •• 3rd year

Jan Mann is in her third year as head coach of the Tar Heels. A proven and experienced head coach, Mann became the third head coach in Carolina history taking over the program July 2009. It didn't take long for Mann to make her mark as the Tar Heels won two tournaments last year – the 2011 ACC Championships, the second in school history, and the 2010 Cougar Classic, the first event of the year.

In Mann's first three years at the helm, the Tar Heels have won two team championships and carded 16 top-five finishes, including seven so far this year. After winning the ACC Championship last year by a whopping 24 strokes, the Tar Heels went on to a runner-up finish at the NCAA East Regional and then tied for eighth at the NCAA Championships. In 2010, Carolina earned an NCAA bid to the NCAA East Regional where they finished 13th.

Mann was crowned the 2011 ACC Coach of the Year, the second time she has received that honor. She was also selected the 2005 ACC Coach of the Year while at Virginia.

Mann was the first head coach at the University of Virginia from 2002-2007, establishing the inaugural women's golf program there, with 2003-04 being its first year of competition. Mann's teams participated in the NCAA Regionals in 2005, 2006 and 2007 advancing to the NCAA Championships in 2005 and advancing an individual in 2006. Mann's teams received 20 ACC academic honors and the Cavaliers were presented the ACC Sportsmanship Award in 2006.

Mann coached an All-America, Leah Wigger, who was selected to the team two times and her players received National Golf Coaches Association's (NGCA) Academic All-America honors eight times (one at UNC). Her players were selected to the All-ACC team seven times (one at UNC) and to the All-ACC Academic Women's Golf Team 10 times (three from UNC).

Mann, a graduate of UNC Wilmington, also coached the Seahawks 1994-2002, taking Wilmington to the NCAA Regionals for the first time in school history (1998). Mann has served on several NCAA committees.



Assistant Head Coach Patricia Earley •• 9th year

Patricia Earley is in her ninth year as assistant head coach for the Tar Heels. Earley teams up with head coach Jan Mann with the day-to-day operations of the program in addition to her on-course duties as coach and instructor. Earley, two-time Big South Player of the Year, joined the Tar Heels after playing on the Futures Golf Tour in 2002 and 2003.

During Earley's career at Carolina, eight Tar Heels have been selected to the All-ACC team on 12 occasions and Catherine O'Donnell was selected the 2009 ACC Freshman of the Year. There have been four All-Americans on five occasions. The Tar Heels have performed well in the classroom as well. Seven players have been named to the All-ACC Academic Team 13 times and three Tar Heels have been chosen NGCA All-American scholars on four occasions.

A native of Marion, Iowa, Earley played collegiate golf at Charleston Southern 1997-2001 and was inducted into Charleston Southern's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. She won four collegiate tournaments, was two-time Big South Champion and Player of the Year and MVP of the Buccaneers all four years. She also won the 2000 Iowa State Amateur. A 2001 Charleston Southern graduate, Earley excelled academically as well as she was three-time Big South Scholar Athlete of the Year for Golf.

Earley and her husband, Jeff, have a two-year old son, Grayson.
