TULSA GETS 11th SEED AT NCAA WEST REGIONAL . . .

✓ Tulsa is the 11th seed in the 24-team field at the 2012 NCAA West Regional, May 10-12, in Erie, Colorado. The 54-hole, three-day tournament will be played at the par-72 Colorado National Golf Course.

The tournament field consists of 126 players, including 24 teams of five and six individuals. The field includes the No. 1-ranked and defending NCAA Champion UCLA Bruins. The remaining top-10 seeds are LSU, ranked sixth in the nation, North Carolina, Colorado, California, Baylor, Pepperdine, UC Davis, Oklahoma, and Texas Tech.

Tulsa starts the next 10 seeds at No. 11, followed by TCU, Iowa State, Stanford, Denver, UNLV, New Mexico, Oregon State, Illinois and Kennesaw State. Rounding out the field are San Jose State, Missouri State, Northern Colorado and Jackson State.

TULSA WINS C-USA TITLE . . .

✓ The Tulsa women golfers led wire-to-wire to pick up its second Conference USA Women's Golf Championship, April 23-25, at the par-72 Peninsula Golf and Racquet Club in Gulf Shores, Alabama. With the win Tulsa earned C-USA's automatic qualification to the NCAA Regional Championship.

Tulsa carded rounds of 299-291-294 for 54-hole total of 884 to claim a 13-stroke victory over second-place UCF. The Hurricane placed all five golfers among the top-13 individuals led by senior Marita Engzelius' third-place performance.

Engzelius and junior Kristina Merkle earned all-tournament team honors as the duo finished among the top-5 individuals. Engzelius finished had rounds of 71-72-78 for a 221 score, while Merkle shot rounds of 78-73-73 for a 222 total for fifth place.

Senior Kamryn Ruffin finished in seventh place with a score of 74-78-72 for a 224 total, while fellow senior Sarah Elliot placed 11th overall with a score of 225 and freshman Anna Young turned in her best performance of the season with a 13th place finish.

MERKLE, KECK GET CONFERENCE USA TOP HONORS . . .

✓ Junior Kristina Merkle was selected as the Conference USA Golfer of the Year, while Head Coach Randy Keck was named the C-USA Coach of the Year.

Merkle earned her third straight first-team selection to the all-conference squad and was joined on the first team by senior Marita Engzelius. Fellow senior Kamryn Ruffin earned third-team honors.

Merkle has placed among the top-6 in eight of nine tournaments for the Hurricane with one second-place finish, one third-place performance, two fourth, fifth and sixth-place finishes.

Engzelius placed among the top-25 eight times and had three finishes in the top-10.

ENGZELIUS NAMED TO C-USA ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM . . .

✓ Senior golfer Marita Engzelius was named to the Conference USA Women's Golf Academic Team this season. She has maintained a 3.77 grade point average in exercise and sports science.

Engzelius has placed among the top-25 in eight of nine tournaments this year and has a 74.4 stroke average in 27 rounds. She has finished second and third in her last two events, placing second at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate and third at the Conference USA Championship.

TULSA HAS PLACED AMONG TOP-3 IN LAST FOUR EVENTS . . .

√ The Tulsa women's golf team has finished among the top-3 in each of its last four tournaments.

The Hurricane turned in a third place performance at the 2012 Clover Cup, March 16-18, with rounds of 294-292-306 for a 892 total at the par-72 Longbow Golf Club in Mesa, Arizona. The Hurricane finished behind first-place Colorado (855) and second-place Oklahoma (886) in the 12-team field.

A little more than a week later, Tulsa finished in second place in a 19-team field at the UALR Women's Golf Classic in Hot Springs, Arkansas, March 26-27. The Hurricane carded rounds of 297-303-298 for an 898 total, finishing second to first-place UTEP.

Tulsa placed second in a 15-team field at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate, April 5-6, finishing second to Baylor by eight strokes as Tulsa carded an 879 total at the par-72 Ole Miss Golf Course.

At the Conference USA Championship, Tulsa turned in its first win of the season by claiming a 13-stroke victory for the league title in the 10-team field. Tulsa shot rounds of 299-291-294 for an 884 total.

TULSA'S MERKLE AND ENGZELIUS GET C-USA TOP RANKINGS . . .

√ According to the April 29th edition of the GolfWeek rankings, Tulsa's Kristina Merkle and Marita Engzelius are the top-ranked golfers nationally among Conference USA schools.

Merkle is the only C-USA golfer ranked among the top-35 with a ranking of 35th, while Engzelius is ranked 95th. The only other C-USA golfer among the top-100 is Tulane's Maribel Lopez-Porras with a ranking of 98th.

Merkle has turned in eight top-6 performances in nine tournaments this year. The junior opened the season with a third place performance at Tulsa's own Dale McNamara Invitational with a one-under par score of 215. Merkle followed that with her best fall showing with a second place finish at the GolfWeek Conference Challenge. She then placed fourth at the Windy City Collegiate Championship and sixth at the Betsy Rawls Longhorn Intercollegiate to close out the fall campaign.

In the spring, Merkle finished in fourth place at the Clover Cup, fifth at the UALR Women's Classic, both in March, and April's Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate with a sixth-place performance and a fifth-place finish at the C-USA Championship.

Engzelius has eight top-25 finishes this year with a season-best of second place at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate. Her next best performance was 3rd place at the Conference USA Championship.

ENGZELIUS NAMED C-USA GOLFER OF THE WEEK . . .

√ Senior Marita Engzelius was named the Conference USA Women's Golf Athlete of the Week for the week of April 4-11.

In a field of 87 golfers at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate, Engzelius finished in second place, just one stroke behind the individual medalist Jaclyn Jansen of Baylor. Engzelius carded rounds of 75-67-69 for a five-under par score of 211. After five bogeys in her first round, Engzelius went the next 36 holes with nine birdies and just one bogey to close out the tournament shooting eight-under par in the final two rounds.

It was Engzelius' seventh top-25 performance this year.

FOUR TULSA GOLFERS PLACE AMONG TOP 20 IN LAST TWO OUTINGS, INCLUDING FIVE AT LAST EVENT . . .

√ At the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate, the Tulsa women placed four golfers among the top-20 in a field of 87 players, while as a team the Hurricane finished in second place.

Senior Marita Engzelius carded a five-under par 211 to finish one stroke off the lead, while junior Kristina Merkle placed sixth overall with a score of three-over par 219. Senior Sarah Elliot placed 14th with a score of 224 and freshman Anna Young had her career-best performance in just five tournaments with a score of 225 for 19th place.

While winning the team title at the C-USA Championship, the Hurricane had five golfers place among the top-13, including Engzelius, Merkle, Elliot, Young and Kamryn Ruffin.

GOLDEN HURRICANE TURN IN SEVEN TOP-5 TOURNAMENT PERFORMANCES THIS SEASON . . .

✓ The Tulsa women have turned in seven top-5 performances in nine tournaments this year, including six finishes among the top-3.

The Hurricane began the fall at their own Dale McNamara Invitational and turned in a 5th place finish in a 15-team field. Tulsa followed that with a third place performance at the 18-team GolfWeek Conference Challenge. Four Hurricane golfers placed among the top-27 as junior Kristina Merkle had a team-best second place performance.

Tulsa's best fall finish came in its final fall event with second place tie at the Betsy Rawls Longhorn Intercollegiate. Four of the five Tulsa golfers finished among the top-22, while Merkle had a team-best sixth place finish.

Tulsa tallied a third-place finish at the 2012 Clover Cup in its second spring tournament, as four Tulsa golfers finished among the top-26 players. Tulsa then followed that third-place performance with two consecutive second-place finishes. The Hurricane placed second in a 19-team field at the UALR Women's Golf Classic and second at the 15-team Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate, as four Hurricane golfers placed among the top-20 at the Ole Miss event. Tulsa won the C-USA Championship in its last outing.

TULSA WINS 12TH OVERALL CONFERENCE TITLE . . .

Although the women's golf program at The University of Tulsa began in 1974-75, the Tulsa women were not part of a conference until the 1993-94 season.

Tulsa was first a conference member in the Missouri Valley Conference and the Hurricane captured all three conference championships before leaving the league after the 1996 campaign.

The Hurricane women moved into the Western Athletic Conference, joining another nationally prominent program the San Jose State Spartans. Tulsa began its' membership in the WAC with two straight second place team finishes in 1997 and 1998, before winning the next seven league crowns, from 1999 through 2005.

Tulsa began competition in Conference USA in 2005-06 and finished that first year in third place. Tulsa won its first C-USA title in the 2008 campaign and captured its second C-USA crown in 2012.

In 19 years as a member of a conference, the Tulsa women have now won 12 team titles and placed second three times. Tulsa has placed out of the top three only twice, including sixth place in 2007 and fourth place in 2009.

Tulsa has also had 10 individual conference medalists in those 19 seasons.

SENIORS TO CLOSE OUT CAREERS . . .

✓ Tulsa has three seniors playing their final semester of golf for the Golden Hurricane — Sara Elliot, Marita Engzelius and Kamryn Ruffin. Elliott has placed among the top-20 in 13 of 32 tournaments, while Engzelius has 10 top-10 finishes in 38 career tournaments. Ruffin has finished among the top-15 in seven of 24 career tournaments.

SARAH ELLIOT . . . has played in 32 career tournaments . . . has 13 top-20 performances in her career . . . has five career finishes among the top-10 . . . best finish this year was 11th place at the C-USA Championship . . . also placed 14th at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate . . . has a 76.4 stroke average in 21 rounds this year . . . had a 77.0 stroke average in 30 rounds last season . . . had five top-20 performances in 2010-11 . . . placed among the top-10 twice in 2010-11, including 9th place at the ORU Shootout and 4th place at the Rebel Intercollegiate . . . finished in 12th place at the C-USA Championships . . . played in all 10 events in the 2009-10 season . . . had a 77.9 stroke average in 28 rounds as a sophomore . . . had four top-20 finishes her sophomore season . . . her best performances as a sophomore included a fifth-place finish at the Texas A&M-CC Classic and sixth place at the Conference USA Championships . . . played in five tournaments as a true freshman in 2008-09, all coming in the spring . . . had a 78.5 stroke average in 15 rounds as a true freshman . . . her best career performance was second place as a freshman at the 2009 C-USA Championships, and thus giving her all-tournament team accolades.

MARITA ENGZELIUS . . . has played in all 38 tournaments since coming to Tulsa . . . has 10 top-10 finishes in her career . . . was named C-USA first-team all-league and to the C-USA All-Academic team this season . . . has placed among the top-25 in eight of nine tournaments this year . . . had a season-best second place finish at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate . . . placed third at the C-USA Championship to earn all-tournament team accolades for the second straight year . . . also had a ninth place performance at the Dale McNamara Invitational . . . has a 74.4 stroke average in 27 rounds this season . . . was named the C-USA Golfer of the Week for her 2nd place finish at the Rebel Intercollegiate . . . earned second-team all-Conference USA honors in 2011 . . . had her only career victory in 2010-11 at the ORU Shootout . . . also placed third at the Claud Jacobs Intercollegiate and the C-USA Championships . . . was named to the C-USA all-tournament team after her third place performance . . . had a 75.6 stroke average in 30 rounds in 2010-11 . . . placed among the top-25 in eight of nine tournaments in 2010-11, and among the top-5 three times . . . placed among the top-10 in three tournaments in 2009-10 . . . had the second-best stroke average in 2009-10 at 77.5 in 28 rounds . . . had a third-place performance at the Marilyn Smith Sunflower Invitational as a sophomore . . . was a second-team all-C-USA selection as a true freshman in 2009 . . . had a team-leading 76.3 stroke average in 2009 . . . had a third-place finish in her collegiate debut at the Topy Cup in Tanagura, Japan . . . was named Conference USA Golfer of the Week once as a true freshman.

SHU-YIN LIU . . . has played in 22 career tournaments . . . has played in five of nine tournaments this year . . . has an 81.8 stroke average in 15 rounds . . . did not play in 2010-11 due to injury . . . played in all 10 tournaments in the 2009-10 season . . . had a career-best fourth-place performance at the Marilyn Smith Sunflower Invitational in 2009-10 . . . tallied a 78.3 stroke average in 28 rounds as a sophomore . . . also placed seventh at the Texas A&M "Mo" Morial . . . played in seven tournaments as a true freshman in 2008-09 . . . had a 5th place finish in her first collegiate tournament in the fall of 2008 at the Topy Cup . . . had a 79.0 stroke average in 20 rounds as a true freshman . . . qualified for the 2011 U.S. Women's Amateur.

KRISTINA MERKLE . . . has played in all 29 tournaments since coming to Tulsa . . . has finished among the top-10 in 20 career tournaments . . . was named the 2012 C-USA Golfer of the Year and earned first-team all-conference honors . . . placed fifth at the C-USA Championship to earn all-tournament team accolades in 2012 . . . qualified for the 2011 U.S. Women's Amateur . . . was named the Conference USA Golfer of the Week three times in the 2011-12 fall campaign . . . has placed among the top-6 in eight of nine tournaments this year . . . had a season-best second place finish at the GolfWeek Conference Challenge and placed third at the Dale McNamara Invitational . . . tallied fourth place performances at the Windy City Collegiate and the Clover Cup . . . also has two 5th place and 6th place performances this year . . . has a 72.9 stroke average in 27 rounds this year . . . earned first-team all-Conference USA honors all three years . . . placed among the top-5 in three tournaments in 2010-11 and seven times in the top-15 . . . had a second-place finish at both the ORU Shootout and the Dale McNamara Invitational . . . had a team-best 75.4 stroke average . . . placed ninth at the 2011 C-USA Championships . . . was named the C-USA Freshman of the Year in 2009-10 . . . had a team-best 74.1 stroke average her freshman season . . . placed among the top-10 in seven of 10 tournaments, and in 11th place at an eighth, as a true freshman . . . captured her first career medalist title at the Johnie Imes Invitational . . . also had a second-place finish at the Marilyn Smith Sunflower Invitational, as well as two third-place performances at her first collegiate tournament, the Texas A&M "Mo" Morial, and the Texas A&M-CC Classic . . . placed fifth at the Turtle Bay Resort Collegiate and at the C-USA Championship.

NANNA NIELSEN . . . her only action this year came at the UND Clover Cup . . . has played in five career tournaments, with four coming in the 2010-11 season . . . her best career finish was 48th place at the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic in the 2010-11 campaign.

KAYLA RIEDE . . . saw her first action at Tulsa in the fall . . . has played in eight of nine tournaments . . . her best finish was 26th place at the UND Clover Cup and finished 27th at the GolfWeek Conference Challenge . . . has a 77.4 stroke average in 24 rounds this year . . . did not see action in the 2010-11 season . . . transferred from Sacramento Community College at mid-semester . . . was a Women's Amateur Public Links qualifier in 2010 . . . shot rounds of 75-79-79 at the 2010 California Women's state tournament . . . played four years at Dixon High School . . . earned Team MVP honors all four years . . . was selected the CVC Conference Player of the Year three times and earned all-conference accolades four years . . . earned first place at the California Divisional Championship play as a senior with a round of 72 .

KAMRYN RUFFIN . . . has played in 24 career tournaments . . . has seven top-15 finishes in her career . . . has played in six tournaments this year with her best finish of seventh place at the Conference USA Championship . . . also finished in 11th place at the UND Clover Cup . . . has a 76.1 stroke average in 18 rounds this season . . . played in all 10 tournaments in 2010-11 . . . placed among the top-15 four times as a junior . . . was named third-team all-Conference USA in 2011 . . . was named to the C-USA All-Academic team in 2011 as well . . . earned CoSIDA/Captial One Academic All-District VI second team honors as a junior . . . tied for first place at the Claud Jacobs Invitational, but lost in a playoff . . . placed eighth at the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic in the season opener . . . also had 12th place finishes at the ORU Shoot-out and the Rebel Intercollegiate . . . had a 76.4 stroke average in 30 rounds this season . . . saw action in three tournaments in 2009-10 as a sophomore and had a 78.7 stroke average . . . played in five events as a true freshman . . . finished in 12th place in her collegiate debut at the Topy Cup . . . was a two-time individual state medalist at Pryor High School . . . earned all-conference accolades all four years of high school . . . was the Oklahoma Class 5A state champion as a senior, after carding a final round 69.

ANNA YOUNG . . . a true freshman . . . has played in six tournaments this year . . . her best performance was 13th place at the Conference USA Championship . . . also finished in 19th place at the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate . . . also finished in 22nd place at the Betsy Rawls Intercollegiate . . . won the Saskatchewan Amateur Women's Championship twice, coming in July 2010 and 2011 . . . began her prep career at Holy Cross High School in Saskatchewan, but finished at Windermere Preparatory School in Florida.

KECK IN FIFTH SEASON AS TULSA HEAD COACH . . .

✓ Randy Keck is in his fifth season at the helm of the Tulsa women's golf program. In his five years, Keck has led the Hurricane to eight tournament titles, including two Conference USA Championships.

In his first season as the Tulsa head coach in 2007-2008, Keck led the Hurricane to four team titles, the school's first Conference USA Championship and back to the NCAA Championship finals for the first time since 2005. Tulsa won its four tournament crowns, all in the spring season, with victories at the Fresno State Invitational, Samford Invitational, UALR Invitational and the C-USA Championship.

In 2009-10, Tulsa claimed two tournament crowns, while placing among the top-5 five times. He led his Hurricane team to one team title in the 2010-11 season.

The 2011-12 campaign has seen Tulsa place among the top-3 six times with third place performances at the GolfWeek Challenge and Notre Dame Clover Cup, second place finishes at the Betsy Rawls Intercollegiate, UALR Women's Golf Classic and the Ole Miss Rebel Intercollegiate and first place at the Conference USA Championship.

Keck came to Tulsa after three years as the head coach at Redlands (Okla.) Community College, where his team placed among the top-three at the NJCAA national championship in each of those three seasons.

Keck's 2006 Redlands team was crowned national champions, while his first squad in 2005 finished in third-place and this past season's team placed as the national runners-up. In his three years, Redlands CC has captured 13 tournament titles and placed either first or second in over 50-percent of its tournament appearances. He coached the individual NJCAA national champion in both 2005 and 2006, as current TU golfer Woori Shin captured one of those individual crowns. He was named the 2006 NJCAA Golf Coach of the Year after his team won the national title.

Prior to his stint at Redlands, Keck spent two years as the head coach at Tabor College in Hillsboro, Kansas. He coached both the men's and women's golf teams in that capacity, and was named the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2004.

Before that, he spent four seasons as the head golf coach at Altus (Okla.) High School. In his final season, his Altus team placed second at the 2002 state tournament, while he earned Oklahoma High School Golf Coach of the Year accolades.
