BUFFS WELCOME SOONERS TO COORS, FACE NO. 8 KANSAS STATE

THE MATCHES: The University of Colorado volleyball team will host the University of Oklahoma on Wednesday, Oct. 15, at the Coors Events Conference Center at 7 p.m. The Buffs will then travel to face No.8 ranked Kansas State University on Saturday, Oct. 18, at 6 p.m. MST.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Colorado head coach Pi'i Aiu is in his seventh season with a career record of 125-72. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to five NCAA Tournaments in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported two All-Americans, six All-Region, and 15 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu has led the Buffs to an 80-47 record in Big 12 Conference play. Aiu is 12-0 all-time against the Sooners and 5-7 in matches against Kansas State.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: CU is 12-5 overall and in a four-way tie for fourth place in the Big 12 at 4-3. Looking for their first conference road win of 2003, the Buffs played one of their most complete matches of the season in a 30-21, 30-25, 30-25 sweep over Baylor University on Oct. 11 in Waco, Texas.

The Buffs hit an even .300 for the match, finishing with 55 kills on 130 attacks with only 16 errors. Senior middle blocker **Monique Gerlach** hit .500 for the match, netting 13 kills on 26 attacks with no errors. Gerlach, CU's all time hitting percentage leader, also recorded 13 digs and seven blocks.

Sophomore outside hitter **Nicole Carr** racked up her team-high 11th double-double, amassing 13 kills and 11 digs. Sophomore outside hitter **Maragda Santillana** had a team-high 15 kills to go along with seven digs and six blocks.

Defensively, as a team, the Buffs held Baylor to a .202 hitting percentage (44k-18e-129att), and just .138 through the first two games (25k-13e-87att). CU had 9.5 team blocks, out-blocking an opponent for just the fourth time this season.

ABOUT THE SOONERS: Oklahoma is 9-10 overall and in 10th place in the Big 12

with a mark of 1-6. The Sooners have won just once in their last six matches, a 3-2 win at Baylor on Oct. 1. OU is actually above .500 on the road this season, 4-3, but the Sooners have dropped all four of their home matches in 2003. Freshman outside hitter Joanna Schmitt ranks fourth in the Big 12 in kills (4.30 kpg) and has nearly 100 more kills than her closest teammate.

As a team, the Sooners are last in the Big 12 in kills and assists. Senior Kelly McCarter and freshman Rachel Jackson have split time at the setter position, with Jackson leading the team in assists at 8.81 per game.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: No. 8 Kansas State is 16-3 overall and in second place in the Big 12 at 6-1, just one-half game behind the University of Nebraska (7-1). The Wildcats lost their first two matches of the season to current No. 2 University of Hawai'i and No. 3 University of Florida, and have since won 16 of 17 matches with the lone loss at Baylor on Sept. 24. KSU is coming off an impressive road win at previously No. 7 ranked Nebraska, 3-2, on Oct. 11, which vaulted the Wildcats from No. 12 to No. 8 this week. Senior middle blocker Lauren Goehring is living up to her 2003 Big 12 Conference Preseason Player of the Year billing. Goehring leads the conference in hitting percentage (.421) and is averaging 3.37 kills and 1.04 blocks per game. On the defensive side, senior Laura Downey-Wallace leads the Big 12 in digs (3.97 dpg) and junior Lisa Martin tops the Wildcats in blocks (1.12 bpg) and ranks eighth in the Big 12.

BUFFS VS THE COMPETITION: Colorado holds a commanding 29-9 series lead over Oklahoma. The Buffs have won 12 straight overall in the series and have won 14 straight in Boulder, dating back to the 1988 season. OU's last win in the series came in Norman in 1996 (3-2). CU has a 21-12 series lead against KSU, but the Wildcats have had the upper hand lately winning three straight and five of the last six. The Buffs have also lost three straight in Manhattan, with the last win coming in 1999.

IN THE BIG 12: One of the strongest volleyball leagues in the country, Colorado is part of the Big 12 Conference. Here is where the Buffs stand in the Big 12 standings and statistics:

CU VOLLEYBALL "QUICK SETS"

1 Lynsey Mann, 6-3, So., MB -- Has not seen match action in 2003. Transfer from Western State (Colo.) College. Was runner up for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002.

2 Ashley Nu'u, 5-10, Fr., S -- Has seen her playing time increase as she continues to recover from lower back pain. Played in three of the last four matches. In all averaging 8.69 assists over 16 games. Has totalled 25 digs, 10 blocks and 10 kills.

3 Amber Nu'u, 5-11, Fr., OH -- Assumed a new role, playing libero for the first time in her career against Baylor recording four digs. Sported career-highs with 13 kills and 19 digs in the loss to Texas A&M. Had seven kills on just eight attacks with no errors for an outstanding .875 average against Oregon.

4 Maragda Santillana, 6-4, So., OH -- Led the Buffs with 15 kills and had a season-high six blocks against Baylor. Averaging 4.2 kills per game over the last four matches. Overall, third on the team in digs (2.26 dpg), fourth in kills (2.98 kpg) and hitting percentage (.236). Hit .500 (7k-1e-12att) during the Colorado Invitational. Tied a single match career-high in kills with 19 against Illinois State. Matched a career high with 15 digs against Illinois State.

5 Allison Barnes, 6-0, Jr., S -- Fourth in the Big 12 in assists (12.15) and actually leads the league in assists (14.0 apg) in conference only matches. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team, hitting a team-high .583 (8k-1e-12att) with 14.33 kill assists per game. Earned a career high with 63 assists in the loss to Texas A&M. Her 51 assists against Texas are the most in a three-game match in the Big 12 Conference this season. Needs just 94 assists to become the sixth player in CU history with 1,000. Notched a personal best seven kills vs. ISU.

6 Kelly Masumiya, 5-3, So., DS/L -- Played at the libero spot the last eight of the last nine matches. Has played in 28 of 59 games, logging 0.86 digs per game. Recorded an ace on her first serve attempt of the season, coming against No. 11 Penn State.

7 Austin Zimmerman, 6-0, Fr., OH/MB -- Has started every match for CU this season. Ranks second on the team with a .302 hitting percentage (125k-40e-281att). Hitting .328 (65k-20e-137att) in Big 12 matches, ranking eighth among league players. Named to the Denver Invitational All-Tournament Team. Hit .309 (34k-10e-67att) and averaged 2.27 digs and one block per game at the tournament. Led the Buffs over Texas Tech with a career-high 19 kills.

9 Allie Griffin, 6-0, So., MB -- Had a personal-best and team season-high 27 kills against Texas A&M. Averaging 3.92 kills per game in Big 12 Conference matches, leading the Buffs and ranking eighth among all league players. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team. Had a personal best seven blocks in CU's win over Illinois State. Notched a personal-best nine digs against Maine.

10 Nicole Carr, 6-0, So., OH -- Recorded 20 digs against Texas A&M, a team season high and the second-best dig performance of her career. Has recorded double-doubles (kills and digs) in 11 of 17 matches. Notched double digit digs in all but three matches, and in those three matches she had nine in each. Ranks fifth in digs (3.59) in the Big 12. Second on the team in kills (3.53 kpg). Earned MVP honors at the Denver Invitational, compiling 44 kills and 35 digs in the tournament.

11 Lara Bossow, 6-0, Fr., OH -- Has seen action in a total of 10 games this fall, with four kills four digs and six blocks.

12 Monica Vesanovic, 5-5, Sr., DS/L -- Has served as CU's libero in eight matches this season. Recorded a career-high with three aces and a season high eight digs in the win over Villanova. Has 10 aces on the season, all coming in the last eight matches.

13 Krislen Morgado, 5-6, So., DS/L -- Made her collegiate debut in CU's 3-0 win over Villanova, recording one dig. Won a Hawai'i state volleyball title with Punahou High School as a senior, bettering its runner up mark from the previous season.

15 Monique Gerlach, 5-11, Sr., MB -- MVP of the Colorado Invitational. All-Tournament team at the Denver Invitational and the Maine Sea-Sun Invitational. Seven double-doubles in 2003. Has hit .400 or better in eight matches. Nearly recorded a triple-double against Denver, ending with 13 kills, 13 digs and nine blocks. Recorded a single-match personal best hitting percentage of .700 (15k-1e-20att) against Rhode Island. Her mark is also the best in the Big 12 so far this season. Maintains her hold on the school's career hitting percentage lead at .334 (1,267k-380e-2,654att). Currently ranks in CU's top 10 in kills, attacks and blocks.

CU PICKED SEVENTH, NU'U PRE-SEASON FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR: CU's

Ashley Nu'u was selected the Big 12 Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Year by a vote of league coaches. Nu'u, a native of Aurora, Colo., led Smoky Hill to back-to-back Class 5A state titles in 2002-03 and was a two-time *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 5A Player of the Year. She was nominated for Sportswoman of Colorado as a junior and senior. CU was picked to finish seventh in the annual coaches pre-season poll. The Buffs finished seventh in the league in 2002 at 9-11.

BUFFS AT HOME: CU calls the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 16th full season (The Buffs played only a portion of the 1987 season at the CECC). CU is 166-52 all-time at the CECC for a .761 winning percentage. Under Aiu, CU is 67-23 at home, a .744 mark. A closer look shows that 16 of those losses have come from ranked teams and four of the eight others have come to teams that were receiv-

ing votes.
