BUFFS BATTLE NO. 24 MISSOURI, KANSAS AT MID-POINT OF BIG 12

THE MATCHES: The University of Colorado volleyball team will travel to face No. 24 ranked University of Missouri on Wednesday, Oct. 22, at 6 p.m. MDT in Columbia, Mo. CU will return home to begin the second half of the Big 12 Conference season by hosting the University of Kansas on Friday, Oct. 24, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Conference Center.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Colorado head coach Pi'i Aiu is in his seventh season with a career record of 126-73. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to five NCAA Tournaments in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported two All-Americans, six All-Region, and 15 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu has led the Buffs to an 81-48 record in Big 12 Conference play. Aiu is 8-4 in matches against Missouri, and 8-5 against Kansas.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: CU is 13-6 overall and tied for fifth place in the Big 12 with Kansas and the University of Texas at 5-4. The Buffs saw their three-match winning streak end at the hands of No. 8 ranked Kansas State University 30-25, 30-27, 30-17 on Oct. 18, in Manhattan, Kan.

Game one was extremely competitive. Neither team led by more than two points until the Buffs built a 20-17 lead. Kansas State tied it at 22, but the Buffs rallied back to take a 25-23 lead.

That's where the roof caved in. KSU closed out the game with seven straight points off the serve of Molly Lindquist. The Wildcats had four consecutive blocks in the rally and Lindquist ended the game with an ace. Reception errors plagued CU once again as KSU had 11 service aces, four coming from Valeria Hejjas.

The Buffs never recovered. After hitting .214 in game one (16 kills - seven errors - 42 attacks), CU hit just .086 (18k-13e-58att) in the last two games combined. Kansas State hit .400 (52k-14e-95att), the first time

a Buffs opponent has even reached .300 in 2003.

Sophomore **Maragda Santillana** led the Buffs with 10 kills. Freshman **Austin Zimmerman** had the team's best hitting night at .455, with five kills on 11 attacks with no errors. Junior setter **Allison Barnes** had 30 assists and topped the Buffs with six digs.

Santillana had a match-high 16 kills leading CU to a 30-22, 30-24, 30-19 Big 12 Conference win over the University of Oklahoma on Oct. 15 in Boulder.

Not only did Santillana have the most kills of any player, she was extremely efficient with her attempts. She hit an outstanding .444 committing just four errors on 27 attempts. As a team the Buffs hit .336, recording 60 kills with just 21 errors on 116

attacks. Gerlach had 13 kills while sophomore **Nicole Carr** had a match-high 10 digs.

ABOUT THE TIGERS: Missouri is 14-4 overall and in third place in the Big 12 at 7-2, just one game behind first-place Kansas State. The Tigers are coming off one of the biggest wins in program history, a 3-2 win over No. 8 University of Nebraska. The win was the first for Missouri in Lincoln since 1977, and stopped a 44-match losing streak to the Cornhuskers dating back to 1982. Sophomore outside hitter Shen Danru averages 4.16 kills per game, a mark that ranks sixth in the Big 12. Danru leads the Big 12 in aces (0.55 apg) and is one of three Tigers (Lindsey Hunter and Juliana Godoi) in the top six. As a team, MU leads the league in aces with 2.25 per game. Hunter, a sophomore setter, leads the Big 12 in assists at 12.39 per game.

ABOUT THE JAYHAWKS: Kansas is 13-7 overall and tied with CU and Texas for fifth in the Big 12 at 5-4. The Jayhawks are 3-3 over the past six matches and are 3-4 on the road in 2003. KU spreads its offense well with four Jayhawks averaging at least 2.75 kills per game. Freshman Janaina Correa leads the quartet at 3.88 kills per game, a mark that ranks eighth in the Big 12. Correa also ranks sixth in aces at 0.41 per game. Defensively, junior Jill Dorsey is fourth in the Big 12 in digs (3.76 dpg).

BUFFS VS THE COMPETITION: Colorado holds a commanding 27-5 series lead over Missouri. Four of the Tigers' five wins in the series have come in the last six meetings, including the program's first-ever season sweep of the Buffs in 2002. CU has lost three straight in Columbia, with its last win coming on Oct. 31, 1998, in four games. The Buffs hold a 28-7 lead over Kansas, but like the Missouri series, the Jayhawks have held the upper hand in recent meetings. KU has won three straight over CU and five of the last seven. The Buffs last win came in Boulder on Nov. 24, 2001, in three games.

KU TOPS CU IN EARLY 2003 ACTION: Colorado fought hard but lapses at key moments allowed KU to claim a Big 12 victory over the Buffaloes 30-24, 30-28, 30-25, on Sept. 20 in Lawrence. The match dropped CU to 9-3 overall, 1-1 in the Big 12 while the Jayhawks moved to 8-4 overall, 1-1 in league play.

The teams were neck-and-neck for most of the first two games. Game one was tied at 20 before the Jayhawks went on a 10-4 run to close it out. CU hit just .154 (15k-9e-39att) while the Jayhawks hit .242 (14k-6e-33att).

Game one hurt, but game two was the back breaker. The Buffs played much better in game two, out-hitting the Jayhawks with 18 kills and a .289 average (18k-7e-38att). CU looked to finish off the game and make it a best of three with a 28-26

CU VOLLEYBALL "QUICK SETS"

1 Lynsey Mann, 6-3, So., MB -- Has not seen match action in 2003. Transfer from Western State (Colo.) College. Was runner up for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002.

2 Ashley Nu'u, 5-10, Fr., S -- Has seen her playing time increase as she continues to recover from lower back pain. Played in seven of the last eight matches. In all averaging 7.95 assists over 19 games. Has totalled 25 digs, 13 kills and 12 blocks. Had a career best 39 kill assists against No. 11 Penn State.

3 Amber Nu'u, 5-11, Fr., OH -- Assumed a new role, playing libero for the first time in her career against Baylor recording four digs. Sported career-highs with 13 kills and 19 digs in the loss to Texas A&M. Had seven kills on just eight attacks with no errors for an outstanding .875 average against Oregon.

4 Maragda Santillana, 6-4, So., OH -- Has led the Buffs in kills the last three matches. Has double digit kills in the last four matches, averaging 4.58 kills per game over that span. Overall, fourth on the team in digs (2.08 dpg), kills (3.13 kpg) and hitting percentage (.250). Hit .500 (7k-1e-12att) during the Colorado Invitational. Tied a single match career-high in kills with 19 against Illinois State. Matched a career high with 15 digs against Illinois State.

5 Allison Barnes, 6-0, Jr., S -- Third in the Big 12 in assists (12.22 apg) and actually leads the league in assists (13.80 apg) in conference only matches. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team, hitting a team-high .583 (8k-1e-12att) with 14.33 kill assists per game. Earned a career high with 63 assists in the loss to Texas A&M. Her 51 assists against Texas are the most in a three-game match in the Big 12 Conference this season. Needs just 29 assists to become the sixth player in CU history with 1,000. Notched a personal best seven kills vs. ISU.

6 Kelly Masumiya, 5-3, So., DS/L -- Played at the libero spot in eight matches. Has played in 31 of 65 games, logging 0.77 digs per game. Recorded an ace on her first serve attempt of the season, coming against No. 11 Penn State.

7 Austin Zimmerman, 6-0, Fr., OH/MB -- Has started every match for CU this season. Ranks second on the team with a .316 hitting percentage (138k-42e-304att). Hitting .350 (78k-22e-160att) in Big 12 matches, ranking second among league players. Hitting a scorching .462 in the last four matches (30k-6e-52 att). Named to the Denver Invitational All-Tournament Team. Hit .309 (34k-10e-67att) and averaged 2.27 digs and one block per game at the tournament. Led the Buffs over Texas Tech with a career-high 19 kills.

9 Allie Griffin, 6-0, So., MB -- Had a personal-best and team season-high 27 kills against Texas A&M. Averaging 3.65 kills per game in Big 12 Conference matches, leading the Buffs and ranking 10th among all league players. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team. Had a personal best seven blocks in CU's win over Illinois State. Notched a personal-best nine digs against Maine.

10 Nicole Carr, 6-0, So., OH -- Recorded 20 digs against Texas A&M, a team season high and the second-best dig performance of her career. Has recorded double-doubles (kills and digs) in 11 of 19 matches. Notched double digit digs in all but four matches. Ranks eighth in digs (3.49) in the Big 12. Second on the team in kills (3.35 kpg). Earned MVP honors at the Denver Invitational, compiling 44 kills and 35 digs in the tournament.

11 Lara Bossow, 6-0, Fr., OH -- Has seen action in a total of 13 games this fall, with four kills four digs and six blocks.

12 Monica Vesanovic, 5-5, Sr., DS/L -- Has served as CU's libero in eight matches this season. Recorded a career-high with three aces and a season high eight digs in the win over Villanova. Has 11 aces on the season, all coming in the last 11 matches.

13 Krislen Morgado, 5-6, So., DS/L -- Made her collegiate debut in CU's 3-0 win over Villanova, recording one dig. Won a Hawai'i state volleyball title with Punahou High School as a senior, bettering its runner up mark from the previous season.

15 Monique Gerlach, 5-11, Sr., MB -- MVP of the Colorado Invitational. All-Tournament team at the Denver Invitational and the Maine Sea-Sun Invitational. Seven double-doubles in 2003. Has hit .400 or better in eight matches. Nearly recorded a triple-double against Denver, ending with 13 kills, 13 digs and nine blocks. Recorded a single-match personal best hitting percentage of .700 (15k-1e-20att) against Rhode Island. Her mark is also the best in the Big 12 so far this season. Maintains her hold on the school's career hitting percentage lead at .334 (1,287k-386e-2,701att). Currently ranks in CU's top 10 in kills, attacks and blocks.

CU PICKED SEVENTH, NU'U PRE-SEASON FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR: CU's Ashley Nu'u was selected the Big 12 Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Year by a vote of league coaches. Nu'u, a native of Aurora, Colo., led Smoky Hill to back-to-back Class 5A state titles in 2002-03 and was a two-time *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 5A Player of the Year. She was nominated for Sportswoman of Colorado as a junior and senior. CU was picked to finish seventh in the annual coaches pre-season poll. The Buffs finished seventh in the league in 2002 at 9-11.

BUFFS AT HOME: CU calls the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 16th full season (The Buffs played only a portion of the 1987 season at the CECC). CU is 167-52 all-time at the CECC for a .763 winning percentage. Under Aiu, CU is 68-23 at home, a .747 mark. A closer look shows that 16 of those losses have come from ranked teams and four of the eight others have come to teams that were receiving votes.
