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KEY MATCHES WITH IOWA STATE, NO. 7 K-STATE ON TAP THIS WEEK

THE MATCHES: The University of Colorado volleyball team will travel to play Iowa State University on Wednesday, Oct. 29, at 6 p.m. MST at the Hilton Coliseum in Ames, Iowa. The Buffs will return home to host No. 7 ranked Kansas State University on Saturday, Nov. 1, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Conference Center.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: CU is 14-7 overall and tied for fifth place in the Big 12 with the University of Kansas at 6-5. The Buffs will be out for win No. 15 this week, which would match their entire win total from 2002 when they finished 15-15.

The Buffs have enjoyed home cooking this season to the tune of a 7-0 record. CU has won eight straight overall at Coors dating back to the end of the 2002 season. It has been a different story on the road. The Buffs are 3-6 on the opponents home court, and just 1-5 in the Big 12. It should be pointed out that four of their five league road losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 25.

Senior middle blocker **Monique Gerlach** leads the Buffs in hitting percentage (.338) and kills (3.56 kpg). Gerlach, a 2002 All-Big 12 selection, became the fifth Buff in school history to achieve 1,300 career kills in last week's win over Kansas.

Junior setter **Allison Barnes** averages 11.83 assists per game, fourth in the Big 12. Against KU, Barnes became just the sixth CU player to record 1,000 career kills and currently ranks fifth on the school's all-time list (1,043).

The Buffs sport four players averaging at least three kills per game. Following Gerlach, outside hitter **Maragda Santillana** is second (3.30 kpg), middle blocker **Allie Griffin** is third (3.27 kpg) and outside hitter **Nicole Carr** is fourth (3.00 kpg).

Defensively, Carr leads the Buffs in digs (3.53 dpd) while Griffin tops the club in blocking (0.82 bpg).

LAST WEEK: Maragda Santillana had a career-high 24 kills to lead CU to a 31-29, 26-30, 30-26, 20-30, 15-13 Big 12 victory over Kansas On Oct. 24 at the CECC.

Kansas won game four comfortably, 30-20, and jumped on the Buffs for an 8-2 lead in game five. The Jayhawks built their

lead to 10-5, when CU stormed back. **Monique Gerlach** recorded one of her 15 kills to cut the lead to 10-6. The Buffs promptly scored the next five points on the serve of **Monica Vesanovic**, including a pair of aces by the senior defensive specialist, to put CU up 11-10. The Buffs took advantage of two KU hitting errors and received kills from Gerlach and setter **Ashley Nu'u** to close the match.

Allie Griffin had 13 kills and a team-high five blocks while **Nicole Carr** had a match-high 19 digs.

The Buffs dropped to 0-5 against ranked teams this season as No. 24 University of Missouri defeated CU 31-29, 30-27, 30-25 on Oct. 22.

Griffin had 14 kills and Santillana had 11 for the Buffs who hit just .184 for the match (50k-27e-125att).

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Colorado head coach Pi'i Aiu is in his seventh season with a career record of 128-73. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to five NCAA Tournaments in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported two All-Americans, six All-Region, and 15 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu has led the Buffs to an 82-49 record in Big 12 Conference play. He is 13-0 all-time against Iowa State and 5-8 against Kansas State.

ABOUT THE CYCLONES: Iowa State is 10-12 overall and in ninth place in the Big 12 at 2-9. Both of ISU's Big 12 wins this season have come on the road -- at Oklahoma and at Texas Tech. The Cyclones are 0-5 in conference play at Hilton Coliseum this season. Overall ISU has lost 10 of 13 matches after beginning the season 7-2. Junior outside Brittany Dalager leads the Cyclones in kills (3.22 kpg) and is fifth in the Big 12 in digs (3.57 dpg). Senior defensive specialist Dana Koziol averages 3.46 digs per game.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: Kansas State is 20-3 overall and leads the Big 12 with a 10-1 record. The Wildcats have won eight-straight and 20 of their last 21 matches. KSU jumped from No. 8 to No. 7 in the *USA Today*/AVCA Top 25 Poll this week after a road win at Iowa State (3-1) and at home in a revenge match against Baylor University (3-0). The Bears gave the Wildcats their lone Big 12 loss this season on Sept. 24 (1-3). KSU's Lauren Goehring continues to show why she was named the Pre-season Big 12 Player of the Year. The senior middle blocker leads the conference in hitting percentage (.402) and averages 3.2 kills, 1.35 digs and 1.09 blocks per game.

BUFFS VS THE COMPETITION: CU holds a 34-7 series lead over Iowa State. The Buffs have won 15 straight over ISU. The Cyclones' last win in the series came in the 1995 Big 8 Tournament. CU has won seven straight in Ames, dating back to the 1995 season. The Buffs hold a 21-13 edge over KSU, but the Wildcats have had the upper hand in recent meetings. Kansas State has won four straight and six of seven from CU. The Buffs' last win in Manhattan came in 1999, in five games.

GRIFFIN'S 21 KILLS LEAD BUFFS PAST IOWA STATE: Allie Griffin had a match-high 21 kills to lead CU to a 30-22, 30-21, 32-34, 30-19 victory over Iowa State earlier this season in Boulder. Griffin, who recorded a career-best 27 kills in CU's previous match (Texas A&M), hit an outstanding .447, recording her 21 kills on 38 attempts with just four errors.

Monique Gerlach finished with 13 kills and had a team match-high 15 digs. Austin Zimmerman also recorded a double-double ending with 10 kills and 10 digs.

CU VOLLEYBALL "QUICK SETS"

1 Lynsey Mann, 6-3, So., MB -- Has not seen match action in 2003. Transfer from Western State (Colo.) College. Was the runner up for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002.

2 Ashley Nu'u, 5-10, Fr., S -- Has played in nine of the last 10 matches after missing eight matches early in the season with lower back pain. Has 173 assists, which ranks 15th on CU's all-time list. Has totaled 29 digs, 16 kills and 13 blocks. Had a career best 39 kill assists against No. 11 Penn State.

3 Amber Nu'u, 5-11, Fr., OH -- Assumed a new role, playing libero for the first time in her career against Baylor recording four digs. Sported career-highs with 13 kills and 19 digs in the loss to Texas A&M. Had seven kills on just eight attacks with no errors for an outstanding .875 average against Oregon.

4 Maragda Santillana, 6-4, So., OH -- Has led the Buffs in kills in four of the last five matches. Recorded a career-high 24 kills in CU's five-game win over Kansas. Has double digit kills in the last six matches, averaging 4.5 kills per game over that span. Ranks seventh in the Big 12 during league matches with 3.82 kills per game. Second on the team in overall kills (3.3 kpg), fourth in hitting percentage (.233) and fifth in digs (1.93 dpg). Hit .500 (7k-1e-12att) during the Colorado Invitational. Matched a career high with 15 digs against Illinois State.

5 Allison Barnes, 6-0, Jr., S -- Fourth in the Big 12 in assists (11.83 apg) and actually leads the league in assists (12.64 apg) in conference only matches. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team, hitting a team-high .583 (8k-1e-12att) with 14.33 kill assists per game. Earned a career high with 63 assists in the loss to Texas A&M. Her 51 assists against Texas are the most in a three-game match in the Big 12 Conference this season. Moved into fifth place on CU's all-time assists list with 1,043.

6 Kelly Masumiya, 5-3, So., DS/L -- Played at the libero spot in eight matches. Has played in 33 games, logging 0.76 digs per game. Recorded an ace on her first serve attempt of the season, coming against No. 11 Penn State.

7 Austin Zimmerman, 6-0, Fr., OH/MB -- The lone freshman to have started every match and played in every game this season. Ranks third on the team with a .298 hitting percentage (150k-50e-338att). Named to the Denver Invitational All-Tournament Team. Hit .309 (34k-10e-67att) and averaged 2.27 digs and one block per game at the tournament. Led the Buffs over Texas Tech with a career-high 19 kills.

9 Allie Griffin, 6-0, So., MB -- Had a personal-best and team season-high 27 kills against Texas A&M. Leads the Buffs in blocking (0.82 bpg) and is third in kills (3.27 kpg). Has started every match and game this season. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team. Had a personal best seven blocks in CU's win over Illinois State. Notched a personal-best nine digs against Maine.

10 Nicole Carr, 6-0, So., OH -- Recorded 20 digs against Texas A&M, a team season high and the second-best dig performance of her career. Has recorded double-doubles (kills and digs) in 11 of 21 matches. Notched double digit digs in all but four matches. Ranks sixth in digs (3.53) in the Big 12. Earned MVP honors at the Denver Invitational, compiling 44 kills and 35 digs in the tournament.

11 Lara Bossow, 6-0, Fr., OH -- Has seen action in a total of 13 games this fall, with four kills four digs and six blocks.

12 Monica Vesanovic, 5-5, Sr., DS/L -- Has served as CU's libero in eight matches this season. Recorded a career-high with three aces and a season high eight digs in the win over Villanova. Has 13 aces on the season.

13 Krislen Morgado, 5-6, So., DS/L -- Made her collegiate debut in CU's 3-0 win over Villanova, recording one dig. Won a Hawai'i state volleyball title with Punahou High School as a senior, bettering its runner up mark from the previous season.

15 Monique Gerlach, 5-11, Sr., MB -- MVP of the Colorado Invitational. All-Tournament team at the Denver Invitational and the Maine Sea-Sun Invitational. Seven double-doubles in 2003. Has hit .400 or better in eight matches. Nearly recorded a triple-double against Denver, ending with 13 kills, 13 digs and nine blocks. Recorded a single-match personal best hitting percentage of .700 (15k-1e-20att) against Rhode Island, a mark that remains the best in the Big 12 this season. Maintains her hold on the school's career hitting percentage lead at .332 (1,311k-396e-2,752att). Currently ranks in CU's top 10 in kills, attacks and blocks.

K-STATE TOO MUCH FOR BUFFS IN MANHATTAN:

CU saw its three-match winning streak end at the hands of No. 8 ranked Kansas State 30-25, 30-27, 30-16 on Oct. 18 at Ahearn Field House. After hitting .214 in game one (16 kills - seven errors - 42 attacks, CU hit just .086 (18k-13e-58att) in the last two games combined. KSU hit .400 (52k-14e-95att), the first time a Buffs opponent has even reached .300 in 2003.

Maragda Santillana led the Buffs with 10 kills. **Austin Zimmerman** had the team's best hitting night at .455, with five kills on 11 attacks with no errors. **Allison Barnes** had 30 assists and topped the Buffs with six digs.

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CU PICKED SEVENTH, NU'U PRE- SEASON FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR:

CU's Ashley Nu'u was selected the Big 12 Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Year by a vote of league coaches. Nu'u, a native of Aurora, Colo., led Smoky Hill to back-to-back Class 5A state titles in 2002-03 and was a two-time *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 5A Player of the Year. She was nominated for Sportswoman of Colorado as a junior and senior. CU was picked to finish seventh in the annual coaches preseason poll. The Buffs finished seventh in the league in 2002 at 9-11.

BUFFS AT HOME: CU calls the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 16th full season (The Buffs played only a portion of the 1987 season at the CECC). CU is 168-52 all-time at the CECC for a .764 winning percentage. Under Aiu, CU is 69-23 at home, a .750 mark. A closer look shows that 16 of those losses have come from ranked teams and four of the eight others have come to teams that were receiving votes.
