COLORADO HOSTS NO. 18 TEXAS A&M IN BIG 12 VOLLEYBALL ACTION

THE MATCH: The University of Colorado volleyball team will host No. 18 Texas A&M University on Wednesday, Nov. 12, at 7 p.m. MST in the Coors Events Conference Center.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: CU is 17-8 overall and tied with the University of Missouri for fourth place in the Big 12 at 9-6. The Buffs and Tigers are 1 1/2 games behind No. 18 Texas A&M for third. CU will play both the Tigers and the Aggies at home in the next two weeks.

Colorado will be looking for its 10th Big 12 win of the season which would not only guarantee a .500 record in conference play, it would surpass the Buffs' entire Big 12 win total from 2002 (9-11).

The Buffs have enjoyed home cooking this season to the tune of a 7-1 record, but it has been a different story on the road. CU is just 5-6 on the opponents home court, and just 3-5 in the Big 12. It should be pointed out that four of their five league road losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 25. Six of CU's eight losses overall have come against ranked opponents.

Senior middle blocker **Monique Gerlach** leads the Buffs in hitting percentage (.322), kills (3.43 kpg) and blocking (0.89 bpg). Gerlach, a 2002 All-Big 12 selection, is closing in on former Buffalo Tina Murray (1987-90) for fourth place on CU's all-time kills list. She needs just six to pass Murray, who had 1,358 kills over her four-year career.

Junior setter **Allison Barnes** averages 11.41 assists per game, sixth in the Big 12. In recent matches the Buffs have also looked to freshman **Ashley Nu'u** who has played in 13 of the past 14 matches, averaging 6.49 assists per game. Nu'u missed eight matches during the preseason, and early in the Big 12 season, with a lower back problem.

The Buffs sport four players averaging at least 2.99 kills per game. Following

Gerlach, outside hitter **Maragda Santillana** is second (3.36 kpg), middle blocker **Allie Griffin** is third (3.23 kpg) and outside hitter **Nicole Carr** is fourth (2.99 kpg).

Defensively, Carr leads the Buffs in digs (3.55 dpg) followed by Gerlach (2.32 dpg) and Barnes (2.23 dpg).

BLOCKING, DEFENSE EARN BUFFSA

WEEK SWEEP: Colorado's recent resurgence in its blocking game continued as the Buffaloes swept Texas Tech University 30-17, 30-23, 30-25, on Nov. 8, at the United Spirit Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

The Buffs, who have risen from ninth to seventh in Big 12 blocking over the past two weeks, reached double-digits in team blocks for the third time in four matches.

CU VOLLEYBALL "QUICK SETS"

CU had 13 1/2 team blocks in the first two games alone, before finishing with 14 1/2 overall. The Buffs are averaging 2.8 blocks per game over the last five matches.

Colorado had seven team blocks in game one. **Ashley Nu'u** had three of the solo variety while **Monique Gerlach** had three block assists. Nu'u had seven blocks, all by the end of game two, just one shy of CU's single match record for a setter. Nicole Vranesh (1990) and Jennifer Sherlock (1988) share the record at eight.

Gerlach had 11 kills and six block assists. Sophomore **Maragda Santillana** and freshman **Austin Zimmerman** each had four blocks.

Nicole Carr recorded her Big 12 leading 14th double-double of the season, finishing with a team-high 12 kills and 21 digs. Carr's 21 digs are a team season-high and the second time this season she has reached the 20 dig figure.

CU hit well, netting a .310 average. The Buffs had 53 kills on 126 attacks with just 14 errors. The Buffs proficiency in blocking led to a .100 hitting percentage for the Red Raiders. (41k-27e-140att).

Carr registered a double-double and Colorado held Baylor University to a .044 hitting percentage as the Buffaloes swept the Bears 30-22, 30-23, 30-15 on Nov. 5, at the Coors Events Conference Center.

Carr had match-highs with 14 kills and 11 digs. Freshman outside hitter **Amber Nu'u** was right behind Carr in digs with 10, and just missed a double-double of her own with nine kills.

Seven Buffs had at least five digs, resulting in Baylor's low hitting percentage. The Bears had just 32 kills on the evening on 114 attacks with 27 errors.

CU's hitting wasn't great in game one, netting just a .167 (16k-9e-42att), but the Buffs held Baylor to a .000 mark (9k-9e-39att) pulling away at the end 30-23. Colorado's hitting improved throughout the match, recording a .209 mark in game two (17k-8e-43att) and a whopping .545 to close the match in game three (19k-1e-33att). Colorado allowed Baylor just 15 points in game three, tying a season-best mark also achieved against Rhode Island on Aug. 30.

Monique Gerlach had 11 kills, five digs and three blocks. **Allie Griffin** had nine kills, two digs and three blocks. **Ashley Nu'u** had 21 assists and five digs.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Colorado head coach **Pi'i Aiu** is in his seventh season with a career record of 130-75. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to five NCAA Tournaments in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported two All-Americans, six All-Region, and 15 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program

1 Lynsey Mann, 6-3, So., MB -- Sitting out the 2003 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Transfer from Western State (Colo.) College. Was the runner up for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002.

2 Ashley Nu'u, 5-10, Fr., S -- Has played in 13 of the last 14 matches after missing eight early in the season with lower back pain. Recorded career highs with seven blocks, six kills and nine attacks against Texas Tech. Her seven blocks, four of which were solo, were one shy of CU's single-match record for a setter. Has 240 kill assists, which ranks 12th on CU's all-time list. Has totalled 44 digs, 30 kills and 23 blocks. Had a career best 39 kill assists against No. 11 Penn State. Hitting .591 over the past three matches (13k-0e-22att).

3 Amber Nu'u, 5-11, Fr., OH/L -- Assumed a new role, playing libero for the first time in her career at Baylor recording four digs. Has double-digit digs in four of the last six matches, averaging 2.5 digs per game over that span. Sported career-highs with 13 kills and 19 digs in the loss to Texas A&M. Just missed a double-double at home against Baylor with nine kills and 10 digs. Had seven kills on just eight attacks with no errors for an outstanding .875 average against Oregon.

4 Maragda Santillana, 6-4, So., OH -- Has led the Buffs in kills in six of the last eight matches. Recorded a career-high 24 kills in CU's five-game win over Kansas. Has double digit kills in seven of the last eight matches, averaging 4.2 kills per game over that span. Ranks eighth in the Big 12 during league matches with 3.78 kills per game. Second on the team in overall kills (3.36 kpg), fifth in hitting percentage (.224) and sixth in digs (1.89 dpg). Hit .500 (7k-1e-12att) during the Colorado Invitational. Matched a career high with 15 digs against Illinois State.

5 Allison Barnes, 6-0, Jr., S -- Sixth in the Big 12 in assists (11.41 apg). Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team, hitting a team-high .583 (8k-1e-12att) with 14.33 kill assists per game. Earned a career high with 63 assists in the loss to Texas A&M. Her 51 assists against Texas are the most in a three-game match in the Big 12 Conference this season. Ranks seventh in the Big 12 during conference matches in service aces (0.37 apg). Fifth on CU's all-time assists list with 1,248.

6 Kelly Masumiya, 5-3, So., DS/L -- Played at the libero spot in nine matches. Has played in 35 games, logging 0.71 digs per game. Recorded an ace on her first serve attempt of the season, coming against No. 11 Penn State.

7 Austin Zimmerman, 6-0, Fr., OH/MB -- The lone freshman to have started every match and played in every game this season. Ranks fourth on the team with a .285 hitting percentage (168k-56e-393att). Matched a career-high with seven blocks at Iowa State and is averaging 1.2 blocks per game over last the four matches. Named to the Denver Invitational All-Tournament Team. Hit .309 (34k-10e-67att) and averaged 2.27 digs and one block per game at the tournament. Led the Buffs over Texas Tech in Boulder with a career-high 19 kills.

9 Allie Griffin, 6-0, So., MB -- Had a personal-best and team season-high 27 kills last time out against Texas A&M. Second on the team in blocking (0.85 bpg) and is third in kills (3.23 kpg). Averaging 2.9 kills and one block per game over the last five matches. Ranks 10th in the Big 12 in conference only matches with 3.43 kills per game. Has started every match and game this season. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team. Had a personal best seven blocks in CU's win over Illinois State. Notched a personal-best nine digs against Maine.

10 Nicole Carr, 6-0, So., OH -- Recorded 21 digs at Texas Tech, a team season high and the second-best dig performance of her career (had 24 against Texas-Arlington in 2002). Her 21 digs are the second most in a three-game match in the Big 12 this season. Has recorded double-doubles (kills and digs) in 14 of 25 matches, tied for first among Big 12 players. Notched double digit digs in all but five matches. Ranks sixth in digs (3.55) in the Big 12. Earned MVP honors at the Denver Invitational, compiling 44 kills and 35 digs in the tournament.

11 Lara Bossow, 6-0, Fr., OH -- Saw her first action since Oct. 18 at Kansas State with two kills and a block against Baylor on Nov. 5. Has seven blocks, six kills and four digs in 2003.

12 Monica Vesanovic, 5-5, Sr., DS/L -- Has served as CU's libero in eight matches this season. Recorded a career-high with three aces and a season high eight digs in the win over Villanova. Has 15 aces and 38 digs in 2003.

13 Krislen Morgado, 5-6, So., DS/L -- Made her collegiate debut in CU's 3-0 win over Villanova, recording one dig. Won a Hawaii state volleyball title with Punahou High School as a senior, bettering its runner up mark from the previous season.

15 Monique Gerlach, 5-11, Sr., MB -- Averaging 1.2 digs over the past five matches. Leads the Buffs in kills (3.43 kpg), hitting (.322), and blocking (0.89 bpg). MVP of the Colorado Invitational. All-Tournament team at the Denver Invitational and the Maine Sea-Sun Invitational. Seven double-doubles in 2003. Nearly recorded a triple-double against Denver, ending with 13 kills, 13 digs and nine blocks. Recorded a single-match personal best hitting percentage of .700 (15k-1e-20att) against Rhode Island, a mark that remains the best in the Big 12 this season. Maintains her hold on the school's career hitting percentage lead at .329 (1,353k-412e-2,858att). Currently ranks in CU's top 10 in kills, attacks and blocks.

Aiu has led the Buffs to an 85-50 record in Big 12 Conference play. He is 3-9 lifetime against Texas A&M.

ABOUT THE AGGIES: No. 18 Texas A&M is 18-6 overall and in third place in the Big 12 at 10-4. The Aggies have won eight of their last nine, with the lone loss coming to No. 10 University of Nebraska in College Station. Texas A&M has won its last four Big 12 road matches, including a 3-2 decision over then-No. 24 ranked Missouri on Nov. 1. The match-up between CU and Texas A&M features the top two teams in the Big 12 in kills. Colorado leads the pack at 16.42 kpg while the Aggies are right behind at 16.37 kpg. Texas A&M is the top defensive team in the Big 12, leading the league in digs (17.23 dpg) and ranking second in blocking (2.59 bpg). Sophomore Laura Jones and junior Melissa Munsch each average over 3.6 kills per game. Senior Beth Skypala averages 2.93 kills per game and ranks third in the Big 12 in digs with 3.69 per game.

BUFFS VS THE COMPETITION: Texas A&M holds a 12-4 series lead over Colo-

rado. The Aggies have won the last two, both coming in College Station. Four of the last five matches contested between CU and Texas A&M have gone the full five games. CU won last season's match in Boulder in five. That match was also CU's last win over a Top 25 team as the Aggies entered the match at No. 17.

BUFFS FALL TO #25 TEXAS A&M IN

EARLY SEASON ACTION: Colorado dropped a heartbreaking five-set match to No. 25 Texas A&M 30-24, 28-30, 28-30, 30-26, 13-15 on Sept. 24 in College Station, Texas.

Texas A&M took advantage of 13 service aces in the closely fought match led by Aggie junior Melissa Munsch had six. In addition, the Buffs had 12 service errors, adding up to a total of 25 points in the Aggies favor in a match that saw no team win the final four games by more than four points.

CU played strong offensively the entire night finishing with a solid .290 hitting percentage. The Buffaloes had 88 kills, compared to 68 for Texas A&M, with 28 errors on 207 attacks.

Allie Griffin had a career night for the Buffs. Griffin personal-best and team season-high 27 kills and hit .351 (27k-7e-57at). **Nicole Carr** had 16 kills and a team season-high 20 digs. Freshman **Amber Nu'u** recorded career-highs with 13 kills and 19 digs. **Allison Barnes** had 63 assists and 16 digs. **Monique Gerlach** had 17 kills and hit .438 (17k-3e-32att).

CU PICKED SEVENTH, NU'U PRE-SEASON FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR: CU's

Ashley Nu'u was selected the Big 12 Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Year by a vote of league coaches. Nu'u, a native of Aurora, Colo., led Smoky Hill to back-to-back Class 5A state titles in 2002-03 and was a two-time *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 5A Player of the Year. She was nominated for Sportswoman of Colorado as a junior and senior. CU was picked to finish seventh in the annual coaches pre-season poll. The Buffs finished seventh in the league in 2002 at 9-11.

BUFFS AT HOME: CU calls the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 16th full season (The Buffs played only a portion of the 1987 season at the CECC). CU is 169-53 all-time at the CECC for a .761 winning percentage. Under Aiu, CU is 70-24 at home, a .745 mark. A closer look shows that 17 of those losses have come from ranked teams and four of the eight others have come to teams that were receiving votes.
