QUICKLY...The No. 20/20 University of Colorado Buffaloes (24-8, 11-5 Big 12 in 2002-03) will tip off the 2003-04 regular season this Friday, Nov. 14 when they host the second annual WBCA Classic. The tournament will feature No. 15/16 Notre Dame taking on No. 22/25 Auburn at 6 p.m., followed by Colorado facing Old Dominion at 8:15 p.m. Saturday will feature the consolation game at 6 p.m. and the championship at 8:15 p.m. Both CU contests will be broadcast by BuffVision and the School of Journalism at www.cubuffs.com through Buffs Backstage Pass. The games will be broadcast on KKZN 760 AM with Tim Smile on play by play and Carol Callan on color analysis.

TOURNAMENT GETS MORE IMPRESSIVE EVERYDAY...Every day a new poll comes out, that is. The WBCA Classic will boast three ranked teams and one team that's receiving votes. Notre Dame is the highest ranked squad, checking in at No. 15 in the preseason Associated Press poll and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. The Irish are followed by Colorado, who checks in at No. 20 in both polls, and Auburn, who is No. 22 in the AP poll and No. 25 in the Coaches. Old Dominion isn't ranked in either poll, but they are getting votes in the coaches poll. All this adds up to a stacked tournament and some of the best basketball of the year for Coloradans to see. CU hasn't faced a regular season tournament field this loaded since 1995 when the Buffs faced No. 7 Purdue, No. 12 Penn State and RV Washington in the Kona Women's Tournament in Hawai'i.

YOUTH NIGHT!!!...Friday night is Youth Night at the Coors Events Center with any and all youth 13 or younger getting into the games for \$1. That's it! ONE DOLLAR! Adults are \$7, students are \$3 and CU Students are FREE. Chips Court is in full swing, with a hot dog, soda and a game ticket for just \$5.

OPENING NIGHT...This is Colorado's 30th season opener, and the Buffs are 24-5 in the first game of the season. It's also CU's 30th home opener and Colorado will try to continue a lovely trend of winning their home openers as they are 28-1 in that scenario. The lone home opening loss for Colorado came in 1999-2000, when the Buffs lost to Michigan and not coincidentally lost Linda Lappe for the season.

GETTING TO KNOW THE BUFFALOES...Colorado returns nine letterwinners and welcomes four newcomers this season. Among the nine letterwinners are three returning starters in seniors Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Maria Billingsley. Randie Wirt, who has started 36 games in her tenure at CU will start at the power forward spot, while junior Veronica Johns-Richardson is expected to start at small forward.

LAST TIME OUT...The Buffs topped defending Division II national champions South Dakota State by a score of 82-66. Tera Bjorklund was her typical en fuego self, with 32 points and 10 rebounds, with seven assists and three rejections for measure, all in 34 minutes of play. Amber Metoyer was the only other Buff in double figures with 15 points, five rebounds and four steals at a myriad of positions.

WHAT'S BACK...Nine letterwinners, three starters, four seniors, three juniors and three sophomores. 68.1% of Colorado's scoring is back as well as 65.1% of rebounds and 64.5% of last year's minutes played. Preseason All-American Tera Bjorklund returns for her senior year, as does the Big 12's leading three point shooter and free throw shooter Kate Fagan. The Super Swede, point guard Maria Billingsley, gives CU another veteran at the point guard spot, despite only being at Colorado one season, she's got significant big-game experience. Randie Wirt will be back in the lineup as a senior after coming off the bench last season.

WHAT'S NOT...The trio of Linda Lappe, Sabrina Scott and Diana Spencer. Scott was CU's leading rebounder (6.9 rpg) and dime dropper (3.1 apg), while Lappe was just Lappe, which was just plain great. The two combined to start 154 games for Colorado in their careers, and along with Spencer captained the Buffaloes to the Sweet 16 last season.

NOTING THE TOURNAMENT FIELD

COLORADO...The Buffaloes come off a 24-8 season, where they went 11-5 in the Big 12 Conference, good for fourth. The Buffs made the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year. Coach Ceal Barry is in her 21st season at CU, with a record of 396-215 with the Buffaloes, needing just four wins to join the 400 club at Colorado.

OLD DOMINION...The Lady Monarchs are coming off a 21-11 season (15-3 in the Colonial Athletic Association, league champions). Coach Wendy Larry is in her 17th season at ODU, with a record of 379-126. They return nine letterwinners and three starters off last years team. Colorado has posted a record of 0-1 against the Lady Monarchs, falling on Dec. 30, 1996 by a score of 77-65 at a neutral site. CU was upset, as the Buffs were ranked 10/6 while ODU was 19/20. Colorado is 2-1 all time against the Colonial Athletic Association, with wins over Delaware and Drexel and the loss to ODU. Coach Larry is also the current president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

NOTRE DAME...The Fighting Irish are coming off a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament and a 21-11 season. They were 10-6 in the Big East, good for fifth in the conference. Coach Muffet McGraw led them to the 2001 NCAA Tournament, which coincidentally ran through Denver's Pepsi Center, where they defeated Vanderbilt to win the Midwest Regional. McGraw is in her 17th season at Notre Dame, with a record of 363-138 in South Bend. The Buffs have a record of 2-0 against the Fighting Irish, with both wins coming in neutral venues. The teams first met on Dec. 6, 1986 with CU winning 76-53. Round two came on Dec. 27, 1994, a No. 9 CU win of 91-70. Colorado is 5-6 against the Big East, including two losses to Villanova last year.

AUBURN...The Tigers were 23-11 last season and won the Postseason WNIT. They were 5-9 in the SEC, good for eighth in the conference. Coach Joe Ciampi is in his 25th season at AU, with a record of 546-194 with the Tigers. Colorado and Auburn have met just one time, a 68-61 Tiger win in overtime in the 1996 NCAA Tournament in Boulder. Colorado is 7-11 against the SEC, with their last contest versus an SEC opponent checking in as a win over LSU in Boulder in the NCAA Tournament.

WHAT'S NEW...Howard, Law, Nedovic and Waner. Law is a sophomore transfer from Georgia who sat out her mandatory one year last season, and should provide some depth at guard behind Kate Fagan. Waner has been impressive in preseason partly because she's fit, mostly because she's good. She'll begin the season backing up Maria Billingsley, but Ceal Barry has on more than one occasion referred to her as the team's best passer. Nedovic has been a nice surprise, as her height was expected, but her ability to shoot the three from way downtown and passing ability were not. She'll back up Randie Wirt at power forward. Howard is as good a shooter as anyone on the roster and will likely see time at small forward or shooting guard in her first year.

EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN...It took three years and 24.7 ppg in the 2003 NCAA Tournament, but the powers-that-be are sitting up and taking notice of Colorado's center of attention, senior Tera Bjorklund. After a selection to the All-Big 12 First Team last year, as well as the Big 12 All-Tournament team, she's been picked as a preseason All-American by the John R. Wooden Award and is on the watch list for the Wade Trophy as well. Her honors campaign website "The T In Team" is still up and running for all the latest Tera news and information at <http://buffs.colorado.edu/tera/index.shtml>.

FEELING THE LOVE...Colorado has received mention in both major preseason polls, checking in at No. 20 in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN WBCA Coaches Poll. It marks the seventh time that Colorado has made appearances in both preseason polls, and the first time since 2001-02. The Buffs have also earned mention in Street & Smith's (No. 14), Nancy Lieberman's ESPN Preseason Poll (No. 23), and womenscollegehoops.com (No. 25).

WADE WATCH, WADE WATCH...Not the same ring to it as Wayne's World. Eh. Well anyways, the WBCA has launched a website to follow the progress of this year's Wade Trophy Watch List types, of which Tera Bjorklund is one. It can be found at: <http://www.wbca.org/wadetrophyintro.asp>. Two Wade Trophy watch-listers will play in the WBCA Classic: CU's Bjorklund and Notre Dame's Jacqueline Batteast. Then should CU face Minnesota in the Subway Classic the following weekend, Bjorklund will duel with two other WTWLsters in Janel McCarville (who should draw the task of matching up with Big T straightaway) and Lindsey Whalen.

FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS...Coach Ceal Barry has a few of her former players in the coaching ranks this season. Former CU assistant Jen Warden is in her second season at Boise State University after working at Colorado for 10+ seasons. Also head coaching is Raegan Scott-Pebley at Utah State University, which will start play this season for the first time since 1987. Lastly, there are four former Buffs that are assistant coaches: Linda Lappe (Drake), Benita Martin (Colorado State), Tracy Tripp (Denver) and Shelley Sheetz (San Diego).

WORLD TRAVELERS...Kate Fagan and Tera Bjorklund represented CU, the Big 12 and the United States on the USA Basketball World University Games this summer, which also doubled as the Big 12 All-Star team. The dynamic duo traveled to Daegu, South Korea with the rest of the All-Stars for three weeks in August.

HOBBLIN HOBBS...Sophomore Melissa Hobbs is sidelined for a bit after knee surgery this summer to repair a sublexed patella/osteochondral defect (think Linda Lappe). That means that her kneecap moved around a bit too much for her and trainer Kristen Payne's liking, and some bone was not healing well in there, so she got it fixed. The rehabilitation process is progressing reasonably well.

SIDELINED CECILY...Sophomore center Cecily Jones is out for at least two-to-three months rehabbing a partially torn ACL, partially torn hamstring and patella sublexation. Unfortunately for CJ, it's the same ACL that she's already had reconstructed twice. With Jones out of the lineup indefinitely, look to Randie Wirt and Amber Metoyer (yes, 5-10 Metoyer) to back up All-American Tera Bjorklund in the paint.

PICKING FIGHTS WITH THE BIG DOGS...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs possibly facing at least eight 2003 NCAA tournament teams, with possible NCAA tilts with two more. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as five members played in the NCAA a season ago, with Texas Tech making the Sweet 16 and Texas making the Final Four. The Buffs' opponents that danced last year: Old Dominion, Harvard, Washington, Kansas State (twice), Texas, Oklahoma and Texas Tech. Possible NCAA opponents include Notre Dame (WBCA Classic) and Minnesota (Subway Classic) as well as WNIT participants Missouri, Baylor, Colorado State and possibly Auburn (WBCA Classic). Auburn won the postseason WNIT last season, defeating Baylor.

PLAYING WITH THE BIG DOGS...Historically, the Buffs are 44-79 against ranked opponents, and are 25-20 at home in the same scenario. With CU's win over North Carolina last season, the Buffaloes have wins over ranked opponents in 13-consecutive seasons. Colorado's biggest win ever over a ranked team came when unranked CU upset No. 16 Florida 98-62 in Boulder on Dec. 22, 2000, a 32-point win.

CROWD CONTROL...CU has had success in the games with large groups of people present. Naturally, more of that success has come at home, where the Buffs are 17-9 with crowds of 5,500+. On the road, CU is 15-17 with 4,400+ fans, but 2-8 when there are 10,000 or more fans in the opposition's arena (it must be noted that on nine of those 10 occasions, the opponent was ranked). Take those 10 away, and CU holds their own at 12-7. The Buffs finally proved themselves in front of a really big crowd, winning their first game ever in a visiting arena with 10,000+ with their OT win over Texas Tech in front of 13,123 fans in 2001-02, the biggest road crowd CU has won in front of on the road. The win over Iowa State last season was in front of 10,222.

LEFTY LAND...Colorado has six players, almost half the roster, that are left-handed! But not all of them shoot with their left hand. CU's lefties: Tera Bjorklund, Maria Billingsley, Cecily Jones, Sarah Lini, Whitney Law and Veronica Johns-Richardson. Just for measure, we'll include that assistant coach Tanya Haave is also a left-hander. That's pretty remarkable considering that statistics state that just 1 in 10 people are left-handed.

WERE THE FAB FIVE HERE?...CU fans will notice their Basketball Buffaloes sporting some new threads this season, as the uniforms have gotten their first noticeable "make-better" in four years. CU has switched into Nike dri-fit fabric, and the cut of uniforms are much more sassy and much less baggy. Fabulous!

ANYONE GOT ERIN BROCKOVICH'S DIGITS?...CU frosh Anna Nedovic (pronounced Ned-o-vitch) could use the infamous scrappy legal researcher whose name sounds like hers right about now. Nedovic is awaiting a ruling from the NCAA to determine her eligibility. The NCAA will rule on whether or not Anna has to sit out a few games, and if so, how many. Stay tuned.

CU IN OT...With the win over Syracuse in extra time on Dec. 31 of last season, Colorado moved to 14-15 in overtime games with a mark of 9-12 in road overtime games. The Buffs have played in overtime in back-to-back seasons, last year beating Texas Tech in Lubbock 74-69. Colorado's last five overtime games have all been on the road, including double OT at Iowa State in 1997. CU is 4-1 in those last five road OT contests, and have not been taken to OT at home since the 1996 NCAA Tournament, when they lost to Auburn 68-61 on St. Patrick's Day.

CATCHING A LEGEND...Now in her 21st season at CU, Ceal Barry has now passed Russell "Sox" Walseth for the basketball record for a coach with the most seasons with an individual team. Walseth coached the CU men from 1957-76 for 20 seasons, then joined the women's team for a stint from 1980-83 for a total of 23 seasons between the two teams, the longest overall tenure for a CU basketball coach. Barry also just passed Walseth for the second-most games coached at Colorado. She's got 611, Sox had 604.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 305-88 (.776) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 270-67 (.801). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 218-66 (.768) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s. They're riding a two game home win streak.

THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Net on Saturday mornings at 9:30 a.m. Hosted by Chuck Garfien, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

OTHERS RECEIVING VOTES: Colorado State, Old Dominion

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS... Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Randie Wirt have been selected as the captains of the CU squad for the 2003-04 season. This marks the first time since 1999-2000 that the Buffs have rookie captains.

MOVE OVER BRIDGET JONES... Because the witty Kate Fagan has assumed official duties as CU's online diary writer for her second year. The Fagan Files, a feature on CU's website, will chronicle the season as experienced by Fagan, a fifth-year senior who has seen both the individual and collective ups and downs in her tenure thus far and has become one of the go-to players in Ceal Barry's starting lineup this year.

LOVE AND MARRIAGE... Buff guard Maria Billingsley is the atypical women's college basketball player. Why? She's 24, she's a native of Sweden and she's married. The former Maria Eriksson was married in December 2001 to Brent Billingsley, a former rodeo champion and graduate of Northern Arizona. She's also the oldest player on the CU roster and the only player NOT born in the 80's.

SHOWTIME... Colorado is scheduled to make a minimum of five regional or national television appearances this season, with the possibility of additional television if the Buffs advance in tournament play.

2010... Colorado has won at least 20 games in a season 16 times in its history (28 seasons) and 12 times in Ceal Barry's 20-year tenure. The Buffs have also had at least 10 wins in the Big 12 four times in seven seasons, clinching both marks with the win at Iowa State.

THE WANER WAY... Well-adjusted? You be the judge. When asked what the biggest adjustment from high school to college has been, the Colorado native had this to say: "Time management and having the ability to address all the responsibilities you face daily. You have to budget your time to make sure you are prepared for everything. That means being mentally prepared for class, mentally and physically prepared for practice and disciplined enough to maintain good nutrition through all of that. Eat right, drink enough water during the day, and make sure you take the time throughout the day to get some homework done whenever the opportunity presents itself."

CLIMBING THE CHARTS... Tera Bjorklund has made quick work of CU's statistical charts as a Buffalo. Last season, her 592 points were the most ever by a junior, and the fourth most ever by a Buff in a single season. Her single season average of 18.5 in 2002-03 was the third best in school history. On the career charts, she ranks No. 13 with 1,316 and should pass No. 12, Sandy Bean relatively soon as she's at 1,319 and could conceivably reach No. 11 soon as well (Jeannie Raikes, 1331).

FAGAN FOR FREE. OR THREE... Kate Fagan was the leading three point shooter and free throw shooter in the Big 12 last season, with 70 three's on the year and a 95.4% free throw percentage, including a CU and Big 12 record 44 in a row. Her 70 treys was one short of CU's single season record, whereas her 95+ shooting percentage from the charity stripe is the new CU record.

THE SECOND COMING OF KORDELL...I'VE GOT YOUR SLASH... Former Buff quarterback Kordell Stewart made a name for himself early in his NFL career as "Slash" since he was playing a little quarterback/wide receiver/running back. Well you can call Amber Metoyer the new Slash as she's playing some small forward/power forward/center. When CU backup center Cecily Jones went down with a partially torn ACL on Nov. 2, Coach Barry inserted Metoyer in at the post and liked her so much, she played there in the exhibition against South Dakota State. When the matchup is there, be looking for the 5-10 Metoyer to bang bodies in the post.

Y3K Club... There are now 19 players that are members of Colorado Basketball's 1,000 point club, with three new members looking to join this season. Senior center Tera Bjorklund already did it, and seniors Sabrina Scott and Linda Lappe still may be within striking distance of the 1K club. What follows is a breakdown of Colorado's 19 1,000 point scorers and when they got there:
