COLONIAL DOMINANCE: Old Dominion has captured 12-straight Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles since joining the league from the Sun Belt Conference during the 1991-92 season. The Lady Monarchs are in the NCAA record books for capturing the most consecutive conference championships. In league play, Old Dominion holds a 213-10 overall record, which includes eight seasons of undefeated play. The Lady Monarchs hold a 114-1 record at home and a 99-9 road record. The lone CAA loss on Old Dominion's homecourt was back at the ODU Fieldhouse, the former Lady Monarch homecourt from 1969-2002, against Richmond, now of the Atlantic-10, with a 70-74 defeat on February 19, 1992. Five schools in the league have yet to beat the Lady Monarchs - Drexel (4-0), George Mason (31-0), Hofstra (5-0), UNC-Wilmington (28-0), and Towson (4-0).

"She is a dynamic leader, who will bring an abundance of enthusiasm which will serve as a great asset to the WBCA and women's basketball." Upon beginning her term Larry commented, "I am truly honored to continue to serve the WBCA and the game that has created so much opportunity for me. I commend my predecessors and look forward to carrying out the vision and legacy of this organization." Founded in 1981 the 5,000-member WBCA promotes women's basketball by unifying coaches at all levels to develop a reputable identity for the sport and to foster the development of the game in all its aspects as an amateur sport for women and girls.

LAST TIME WE WERE HERE: Last time Old Dominion was in Colorado was to play the University of Denver in December of 2001. In the same year the Lady Monarchs had a thrilling run to the Elite Eight, Old Dominion downed the Pioneers 91-69 at Magness Arena. Playing in front of family and friends from her home state of New Mexico, current senior guard Myriah Spence had one of the best games of her career, coming off the bench to nab 18 points. She shot 7-of-12 from the field, including 4-of-6 from behind the arc.

A SORTA HOMECOMING: Look for family and friends of seniors Myriah Spence and Cassie Calwell to be among the fans in the stands. Spence, who hails from New Mexico, is playing the closest the Lady Monarchs will get in the regular season to her homestate. Calwell spent the 1999-2000 season at Colorado State as a redshirt freshman before returning back to her native North Carolina to be near her mother who was battling cancer.

Corrina Turner: The 6-6 sophomore center will miss the 2003-04 season after MRI results revealed a torn with a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her left knee. Turner suffered the injury in practice at the Ted Constant Convocation Center on October 27, one day prior to the Lady Monarchs' annual Blue-White Scrimmage. Turner, who was voted Preseason First Team All-CAA by the coaches and Preseason Second Team All-CAA by the media, averaged 6.2 points and 7.0 rebounds in her first full season in an Old Dominion uniform. In her true freshman season in 2000-01, Turner appeared in six games averaging 10.2 points and 5.7 rebounds before tearing her right ACL. The following season, 2001-02, she retore the same knee forcing her to sit out another season.

Tish Lyons: Newcomer, 5-10 forward, Tish Lyons missed two of the Lady Monarchs exhibitions game with a fracture to the proximal phalanx of the fifth finger on her left hand. Lyons underwent successful surgery to place a pin in the finger on Monday and is looking to return to practice next week.

Shareese Grant: Junior guard Shareese Grant missed the annual Blue-White Scrimmage but has dressed and played in both Lady Monarch exhibition games. Grant, a Preseason Second Team All-CAA selection, suffered a sublexed shoulder in early preseason practice but was not off the court very long and will be wearing a shoulder brace as a precaution.
