CU AT TEXAS, HOME WITH MISSOURI AS SEASON ENTERS FINAL STRETCH

THE MATCH: The University of Colorado volleyball team will travel to play the University of Texas on Wednesday, Nov. 19, at 6 p.m. MST in Austin, Texas. The Buffs will return home to host the University of Missouri on Saturday, Nov. 22, at 7 p.m. MST at the Coors Events Conference Center.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: CU is 18-8 overall and tied with the University of Kansas for fourth place in the Big 12 at 10-6. The Buffs and Jayhawks are one game behind No. 21 Texas A&M University (11-5) for third place in the Big 12. CU has won three straight and five of its last six matches.

By earning their 10th conference win of the season, the Buffs have assured themselves a winning league record for the 15th time in 17 seasons. CU's only two sub-.500 league campaigns came in 1987 (3-9) -- its second season of varsity competition and first in the Big Eight -- and 2002 (9-11).

The Buffs have enjoyed home cooking this season to the tune of a 9-1 record, but it has been a different story on the road. CU is 5-6 on the road in 2003, and 3-5 in the Big 12. Four of the Buffs' five league road losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 25. Six of CU's eight losses overall have come against ranked opponents.

Senior middle blocker **Monique Gerlach** leads the Buffs in hitting percentage (.319), kills (3.42 kpg) and blocking (0.87 bpg). Gerlach, a 2002 All-Big 12 selection, recently passed former Buff Tina Murray (1987-90) for fourth place on CU's all-time kills list and is in the school's all-time top 10 in hitting percentage, attacks and blocks.

Junior setter **Allison Barnes** averages 11.1 assists per game, good for sixth in the Big 12. Freshman setter **Ashley Nu'u** has played in 14 of the past 15 matches, averaging 6.64 assists per game. Nu'u missed eight matches during the preseason, and early in the Big 12 season, with a lower back problem.

The Buffs sport four players averaging

at least 2.90 kills per game. Following Gerlach, outside hitter **Maragda Santillana** is second (3.4 kpg), middle blocker **Allie Griffin** is third (3.2 kpg) and outside hitter **Nicole Carr** is fourth (2.9 kpg).

Defensively, Carr leads the Buffs in digs (3.57 dpg) followed by Gerlach (2.28 dpg) and Barnes (2.12 dpg).

COLORADO STOPS 10-MATCH LOS-

ING STREAK AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado snapped a 10-match losing streak against ranked teams with a five-game win over No. 18 Texas A&M on Nov. 12 at the Coors Events Conference Center. Game scores were 30-25, 23-30, 31-29, 17-30, 15-12.

Ironically, the match was a familiar setting for CU's last win over a ranked opponent. Texas A&M came into Boulder last

season on Sept. 17, ranked No. 17, before the Buffs prevailed in five games. Five of the last six meetings between the two teams have gone the full five games including an Aggies' win in College Station back on Sept. 24.

It was a big night for **Monique Gerlach** who had 16 kills, eight digs and three blocks. She passed former Buffalo Tina Murray for fourth place on CU's all-time kills list and now has 1,369. Murray had 1,358 for the Buffs from 1987-90.

Sophomore outside hitter **Maragda Santillana** led all players with 20 kills. Santillana, who has led CU in kills in seven of the last nine matches also had five digs and five blocks. Sophomore middle blocker **Allie Griffin** had 14 kills.

Nicole Carr had 20 digs for the Buffs as she recorded 20-plus digs for the third time this season. Freshman **Amber Nu'u** had 14 digs while **Austin Zimmerman** tied a career-high with 12.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Colorado head coach **Pi'i Aiu** is in his seventh season with a career record of 131-75. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to five NCAA Tournaments in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported two All-Americans, six All-Region, and 15 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu has led the Buffs to an 86-50 record in Big 12 Conference play. He is 6-7 against Texas and 8-5 against Missouri.

ABOUT THE LONGHORNS: Texas is 12-13 overall and currently resides in seventh place in the Big 12 at 7-9. The Longhorns have lost five of their last seven matches, but one of those wins came at home against then No. 24 ranked Missouri. One of the top hitting teams in the Big 12, Texas ranks second in the conference in hitting percentage (.250) and sports two of the top three individuals in kills per game. Junior Bethany Howden is second in the Big 12 in kills (4.75 kpg) while junior Mira Topic is third (4.46 kpg). Freshman Brandy Magee is second in the Big 12 in hitting percentage (.350) and leads the Longhorns in blocking (0.96 bpg).

ABOUT THE TIGERS: Missouri is 17-9 overall and in sixth place in the Big 12 at 10-7, just one-half game behind CU and Kansas. The Tigers, who had been ranked as high as No. 18 this season, broke a five-match losing streak with a 3-2 win over the University of Oklahoma on Nov. 15. Shen Danru is one of the Big 12's top players and can be found all over the league statistical rankings. Denru is second in service aces (0.51), sixth in kills (4.0 kpg) and seventh in digs (3.5 dpg) in the Big 12. Lindsey

CU VOLLEYBALL "QUICK SETS"

1 Lynsey Mann, 6-3, So., MB -- Sitting out the 2003 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Transfer from Western State (Colo.) College. Was the runner up for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002.

2 Ashley Nu'u, 5-10, Fr., S -- Has played in 14 of the last 15 matches after missing eight early in the season with lower back pain. Tied a career high with 39 assists in the win over Texas A&M. She also had 39 against No. 11 Penn State in August. Recorded career highs with seven blocks and six kills against Texas Tech. Her seven blocks, four of which were solo, were one shy of CU's single-match record for a setter. Has 12 of her 28 season blocks in the last two matches. Has 279 assists, which ranks 11th on CU's all-time list. Hitting .515 over the past three matches (18k-1e-33att).

3 Amber Nu'u, 5-11, Fr., OH/L -- Assumed a new role, playing libero for the first time in her career at Baylor recording four digs. Has double-digit digs in five of the last seven matches, averaging 2.54 digs per game over that span. Sported career-highs with 13 kills and 19 digs in the loss to Texas A&M. Just missed a double-double at home against Baylor with nine kills and 10 digs. Had seven kills on just eight attacks with no errors for an outstanding .875 average against Oregon.

4 Maragda Santillana, 6-4, So., OH -- Has led the Buffs in kills in seven of the last nine matches she has played in (missed the Baylor match due to a sprained ankle). Recorded a career-high 24 kills in CU's five-game win over Kansas. Has double digit kills in nine of the last 10 matches, and 20 or more kills in three of the last five matches. Ranks eighth in the Big 12 during league matches with 3.8 kills per game. Second on the team in overall kills (3.4 kpg), fifth in hitting percentage (.225) and sixth in digs (1.83 dpg). Matched a career high with 15 digs against Illinois State.

5 Allison Barnes, 6-0, Jr., S -- Sixth in the Big 12 in assists (11.1 apg). Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team, hitting a team-high .583 (8k-1e-12att) with 14.33 assists per game. Earned a career high with 63 assists in the loss to Texas A&M. Her 51 assists against Texas are the most in a three-game match in the Big 12 this season. Ranks eighth in the Big 12 during league matches in service aces (0.36 apg). Fifth on CU's all-time assists list (1,268).

6 Kelly Masumiya, 5-3, So., DS/L -- Played at the libero spot in nine matches. Has played in 35 games, logging 0.71 digs per game. Recorded an ace on her first serve attempt of the season, coming against No. 11 Penn State.

7 Austin Zimmerman, 6-0, Fr., OH/MB -- The lone freshman to have started every match and played in every game this season. Ranks fourth on the team with a .275 hitting percentage (175k-61e-415att). Matched a career-high with seven blocks at Iowa State and is averaging 1.1 blocks per game over last the four matches. Named to the Denver Invitational All-Tournament Team. Hit .309 (34k-10e-67att) and averaged 2.27 digs and one block per game at the tournament. Led the Buffs over Texas Tech in Boulder with a career-high 19 kills.

9 Allie Griffin, 6-0, So., MB -- Had a personal-best and team season-high 27 at Texas A&M. Second on the team in blocking (0.82 bpg) and is third in kills (3.2 kpg). Has started every match and game this season. Named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team. Had a personal best seven blocks in CU's win over Illinois State. Notched a personal-best nine digs against Maine.

10 Nicole Carr, 6-0, So., OH -- Averaging a whopping 5.1 digs per game over the last two matches. Recorded 21 digs at Texas Tech, a team season high and the second-best dig performance of her career (had 24 against Texas-Arlington in 2002). Her 21 digs are the second most in a three-game match in the Big 12 this season. Has recorded double-doubles (kills and digs) in 14 of 26 matches, tied for second among Big 12 players. Notched double digit digs in all but five matches. Ranks fourth in digs (3.57) in the Big 12. Earned MVP honors at the Denver Invitational, compiling 44 kills and 35 digs in the tournament.

11 Lara Bossow, 6-0, Fr., OH -- Saw her first action since Oct. 18 at Kansas State with two kills and a block against Baylor on Nov. 5. Has seven blocks, six kills and four digs in 2003.

12 Monica Vesanovic, 5-5, Sr., DS/L -- Has served as CU's libero in eight matches this season. Recorded a career-high with three aces and a season high eight digs in the win over Villanova. Has 16 aces and 41 digs in 2003.

13 Krislen Morgado, 5-6, So., DS/L -- Made her collegiate debut in CU's 3-0 win over Villanova, recording one dig. Won a Hawai'i state volleyball title with Punahou High School as a senior, bettering its runner up mark from the previous season.

15 Monique Gerlach, 5-11, Sr., MB -- Averaging 1.04 blocks per game over the last six matches. Leads the Buffs in kills (3.42 kpg), hitting (.319), and blocking (0.87 bpg). MVP of the Colorado Invitational. All-Tournament team at the Denver Invitational and the Maine Sea-Sun Invitational. Seven double-doubles in 2003. Nearly recorded a triple-double against Denver, ending with 13 kills, 13 digs and nine blocks. Recorded a single-match personal best hitting percentage of .700 (15k-1e-20att) against Rhode Island, a mark that remains the best in the Big 12 this season. Second in career hitting percentage at .328 (1,369k-418e-2,896att).

Hunter, who led the Big 12 in assists last year, is at the top again in 2003 averaging 12.43 assists per game. MU is one of the top defensive teams in the Big 12, ranking in the top three in opponent hitting percentage, blocks and digs. The Tigers will host Iowa State University Saturday before heading for Boulder.

BUFFS VS THE COMPETITION: Texas holds a 12-7 series record over Colorado. The Buffs have won the last two, including a four-game win in Austin last season. Colorado has a 27-6 series lead over Missouri, but it is the Tigers that have the upper hand recently. Missouri has won the last three matches and five of the last seven. CU's last win over Missouri was in three games in Boulder in 2001.

CARR, BARNES LEAD BUFFS PAST TEXAS: After losing three out of their last four matches, CU arrived back on the winning track with a 32-30, 30-28, 30-26 sweep of Texas on Oct. 4 at the CECC.

The Buffaloes received double-double efforts from **Nicole Carr** (16 kills, 10 digs), and **Allison Barnes** (51 assists, 11 digs). **Maragda Santillana** celebrated her 22nd

birthday in a good fashion finishing with 14 kills on 28 attacks. **Allie Griffin** had 12 kills. Bethany Howden led the Longhorns with 20 kills and a .400 hitting percentage. Jenny Andrew had six blocks and four kills.

TIGERS SWEEP CU IN COLUMBIA:

Colorado was swept by a ranked opponent for the second straight match as No. 24 Missouri defeated the Buffs 31-29, 30-27, 30-25 in Big 12 Conference action on Oct. 22 at the Hearnes Center.

Sophomore middle blocker **Allie Griffin** led all players with 14 kills and hit .379, recording only three errors on 29 total attempts. Maragda **Santillana** had 11 kills while **Nicole Carr** had a match-high 12 digs. Jessica Vander Kooi and Lindsey Noll each had 10 kills for Missouri.

Missouri's blocking tandem of Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson were key to the match. The duo combined for 12 blocks in the match and the Tigers had 17 team blocks overall. CU hit just .184 in the match finishing with 50 kills and 27 errors on 125 attacks.

The Buffs were in all three games but let late leads slide. CU fought off two game points in game one to tie the game at 29, but the Tigers promptly ended the game with two quick points of their own.

In game two, the Buffs seemed to turn the momentum their way, building a 27-23 lead. The Tigers had other ideas though, scoring the last seven points of the game to take a 2-0 match lead. CU was down 15-10 in game three, fought back to take a 20-17 lead only to fall 30-25.

CU PICKED SEVENTH, NU'U PRE-SEASON FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR: CU's Ashley Nu'u was selected the Big 12 Conference Volleyball Freshman of the Year by a vote of league coaches. Nu'u, a native of Aurora, Colo., led Smoky Hill to back-to-back Class 5A state titles in 2002-03 and was a two-time *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 5A Player of the Year. She was nominated for Sportswoman of Colorado as a junior and senior. CU was picked to finish seventh in the annual coaches pre-season poll. The Buffs finished seventh in the league in 2002 at 9-11.

BUFFS AT HOME: CU calls the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 16th full season (The Buffs played only a portion of the 1987 season at the CECC). CU is 170-53 all-time at the CECC for a .762 winning percentage. Under Aiu, CU is 71-24 at home, a .747 mark. A closer look shows that 17 of those losses have come from ranked teams and four of the eight others have come to teams that were receiving votes.
