QUICKLY...The No. 14/14 University of Colorado Buffaloes (12-1) return home to the friendly confines of the Coors Events/Conference Center this Saturday, January 10 when they take on the No. 11/12 Kansas State University Wildcats at 11:30 a.m. The game will be carried live on the radio on KKZN 760 AM with Tim Smile on play-by-play and Carol Callan on color analysis. It will also be televised on Fox Sports Net, with Kevin Eschenfelder on play by play and Debbie Antonelli on color analysis. The game will also be on Buffs Backstage Pass at www.cubuffs.com.

LUNCH WITH THE BUFFALOES...Saturday's lunch time tipoff is a great opportunity for fans to take advantage of Chip's Court, CU's specially-priced ticket deal. \$5 will get fans a game ticket, a hot dog and a soda. Heck, five bucks won't even get a student or a senior citizen into a movie, let alone feed them too!

WIN A VISIT FROM A CU PLAYER...The University of Colorado basketball programs and Boulder Valley School District schools are working together on a promotion to encourage BVSD schools attendance at CU games over the winter holiday. Students attending CU games can pick up a slip when they enter the Coors Events Center and write down their school, grade and class. The class with the most students attending CU basketball games over the break will get to select their favorite CU player to come and visit their class. BVSD students can get into Saturday's game for a dollar.

SCOUTING THE BUFFALOES...Colorado returns eight letterwinners and welcomes five newcomers this season. Among the eight letterwinners are three returning starters in seniors Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Maria Billingsley. Bjorklund is a consensus selection for preseason watch lists for every major award, including the Wade Trophy, Wooden Award and Naismith Award, and is the second-leading scorer in the Big 12 Conference. She's averaging 20.1 points per game and has 31 straight double digit efforts dating back to last season. CU's starting off-guard, Kate Fagan, shoots 47.3% from beyond the arc at 43-91 this season. Randie Wirt gets the nod at power forward and is CU's second-leading rebounder at 6.8 per game in 30.8 mpg. The point guard spot has been split between senior Maria Billingsley (1.8 ppg, 1.5 rpg) and CU's fourth-leading scorer this season, freshman Emily Waner (8.7 ppg, 24.5 mpg). Veronica Johns-Richardson rounds out the starting five with 8.8 ppg and 2.9 rpg.

NOT YOUR MOM'S BCS...The Ratings Percentage Index is a "BCS-esque" method of rating teams based on their strength of schedule and therefore quality wins and losses and the not-so-quality wins and losses. Looking at two of the major RPI's, the schedule has been good to the Buffs. According to the WBCA RPI, Colorado is No. 10 in the country and according to CollegeRPI.com, the Buffs are No. 11 with the No. 29 schedule in the country.

LAST TIME OUT...Kate Fagan scored 17 points and Tera Bjorklund added 16 to lead 14th-ranked Colorado to a 69-59 win over No. 24 Baylor in the Big 12 opener for both Wednesday night. Colorado opened the second half with a Fagan three-pointer to go in front 39-16. Colorado closed the first half with a 14-2 run and moved ahead 36-16. Baylor's 16 points represented the third-lowest first half offensive output in school history.

MAKING THEIR OWN HISTORY...Colorado's nine game winning streak is the best the Buffs have had since 1994-95 when CU won 25 consecutive games. Since then, the Buffs have had three different eight game winning streaks: 1996-97 (loss to Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament), 2001-02 (loss at Iowa State) and 2002-03 (loss at Kansas State). While nine wins in a row may not seem like a huge deal at first glance, here's some perspective: Since the 1994-95 season, CU has been to five NCAA tournaments, four Sweet 16's, and won a Big 12 Tournament title, but has not won nine games in a row.

A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING...Colorado's win over Baylor was it's first in Waco since the inception of the Big 12. CU has now won in every Big 12 arena except Oklahoma's. However, the Buffs have won in Norman, it was just during the Big Eight days.

SCOUTING KANSAS STATE...The Wildcats are led by their Big Four: center Nicole Ohlde (15.8 ppg, 6.5 rpg), forward Kendra Wecker (15.7 ppg, 8.6 rpg), guard Laurie Koehn (14.9 ppg, 3.0 rpg) and forward Megan Mahoney (7.7 ppg, 6.8 rpg). Those four have started every game this season, leading KSU to a 10-2 record under head coach Deb Patterson. The other guard spot has been split up this season between Claire Coggins (4.4 ppg, 1.8 rpg), Colorado product Chelsea Domenico (1.1 ppg, 1.8 rpg), and Twiggy McIntyre (5.1, 1.6).

NOTING THE KANSAS STATE SERIES

CU vs. KANSAS STATE...Colorado and Kansas State have met 51 times, with the Buffaloes holding a 29-22 edge, including 14-7 at home in Boulder. This has been one of the more interesting Big 12 series to date for the Buffaloes, as K-State swept the Buffs last year, including an ugly 61-36 KSU win in Manhattan last January.

NOTING THE POLLS...The Buffs check in this week at No. 14 in the Associated Press poll and No. 14 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. CU's highest regular season ranking in the past four seasons was No. 10 in March of 2002. The last time CU was ranked 13/13 was Feb. 11, 2002. This marks the fourth time in the 51-game history of the series that both teams are ranked in the top 25, but just the second time the scenario has taken place at home.

HEY MOM...This the only the second time in the history of television that a Colorado vs. Kansas State tilt has been televised. The first time was also on Fox Sports Net on Feb. 16, 2000. The Wildcats won that one 62-54, the season of the infamous 10-19 record and Magnificent Seven CU players.

LAST TIME OUT...The No. 5/5 Wildcats beat the Buffaloes 67-59 in Boulder, CU's last loss at home. Colorado's Tera Bjorklund was the games' high scorer with 24 points, but it wasn't enough to overcome the Big Four Kansas State double-digit scorers (Mahoney, 23 points, 11 rebounds; Ohlde 17 points, 17 rebounds; Wecker 13 points, 11 rebounds; Koehn 11 points). Sabrina Scott was the only other Buff in double figures with 14. Colorado trailed 23-22 at halftime.

CAREER NUMBERS VS KANSAS STATE...As is the case with most opponents, Tera Bjorklund has the best numbers against the Wildcats, averaging 12.8 ppg in six appearances and three starts. Kate Fagan has 4.8 a game in six appearances and two starts. Bjorklund has double figures in four of the six games against K-State, with her 24 last year a personal high vs. the Wildcats.

OBSCURE NOTE OF THE SERIES...This marks the fourth year in a row that Colorado has faced Kansas State in the second game of the Big 12 season. However, it's the first time that the game has been in Boulder in that scenario.

Coggins has seen the most starts with seven, but Domenico plays more minutes and McIntyre is the best scorer.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL... Against Buffalo, Colorado set a new school record with 16 three pointers. With five different Buffs contributing to the mark (Fagan, Waner, Howard, Johns-Richardson and Nedovic) that included a new single half record of nine (second half). Fagan tied her own individual school record with seven, which she also tied previously this season vs. Harvard. They are hitting an average of 6.9 three's per game and shooting .385 as a team from downtown.

THE BEST OF THE BEST...Not only is Colorado's winning percentage of 92.3 among the best in the country (it was 10th as of Jan. 5) but the Buffs are ranked in several NCAA categories, both collectively and individually. Tera Bjorklund is 18th in the country in scoring, and sixth in field goal percentage. Kate Fagan is fifth in three point field goal percentage and 8th in three's made per game, with freshman Emily Waner ranked 15th in percentage. As a team, CU is 10th in team three point field goal shooting, 12th in assists per game, 14th in scoring offense and 14th in three's per game to round out the categories they are in the top 15 in.

BACK TO BACK...Colorado will be trying for back-to-back wins against ranked opponents on Saturday. The last time the Buffs accomplished that feat was in the 2002 NCAA Tournament when they beat No. 22 LSU 69-58 in Boulder and then upset No. 5 Stanford 62-59 in Boise.

WE WANT DEFENSE...A familiar chant by Buffalo faithful, and in the last four games, they've gotten just what they asked for. In CU's past four games they have held the opponent to an average of 47.7 ppg, 34.3% field goal shooting, 26.9% three point shooting, and 29.3 rpg. The Buffs have forced 18.8 topg, while giving up just 12.5. They held the Baylor, the Big 12's best offensive team, to their lowest point total since the 2002-03 non-conference season. BU's 59 points, 23 field goals and .390 shooting percentage were all season lows. The Lady Bears' 16 first half points was the third-lowest first-half total in school history and is the team's lowest single half total since 15 against Southwest Missouri State in 1999.

ROAD WARRIORS...Wednesday night's win at No. 24 Baylor was Colorado's first over a ranked team in a road game since beating No. 13 Texas Tech 74-69 on Feb. 3, 2002. It was CU's eighth win in school history against a ranked team on the road.

BLOWN AWAY...The Buffalo game marked the third time in school history that Colorado had won three straight games by 30 or more points. In addition to that run (71-39 over Wyoming, 80-45 over Syracuse and 98-47 Saturday over Buffalo), it also happened in 2001-02 (83-44 over San Diego, 96-44 over Bowling Green and 88-58 over Houston) and in 1980-81 (86-39 over Winnipeg, 83-49 over Utah and 134-33 over Fort Carson).

THE NEW KID ON THE BLOCK...Is freshman guard/forward Jasmina Ilic (pronounced E-LITCH as in Elitch Gardens). The native of Serbia started practice with the Buffs on Dec. 29 and the lithe 6-0 Ilic has been cleared to play and could contribute immediately if necessary. Athletic ability runs in the family: her dad was a professional soccer player, her mom was a first division professional handball player and her team's captain, and her uncle was a pro water polo player.

GOOD STARTS...Colorado is off to an 12-1 start is it's best since 1992-93, when CU opened the season 15-0. In 1981-82 the Buffs were 12-1, as well as 1980-81. This is Colorado's second 12-1 or better start through 13 games under coach Ceal Barry.

THE BUFFALOES REPRESENT...Colorado is a combined 23-2 over the past two seasons in non-conference play. CU's two losses were at No. 11 Minnesota and at home to Villanova in the 2002 Coors Classic. That's not the best in school history, however as CU went 21-1 in non-conference play from 1992-93 to 1993-94. The 1992-93 squad was undefeated in non-conference play, so the lone loss was in the fall of 1993, an 86-82 overtime loss at No. 1 Tennessee.

COMEBACK KIDS...The CU comeback over Notre Dame after trailing 12-0 was the biggest deficit the Buffs have overcome since trailing Texas by 16 points on Feb. 19, 2000, and coming back to win the game 79-75. The Buffs scored 53 second half points in that one to come from behind led by Sabrina Scott with 24 points and 13 boards. Since then the Buffs have come from behind with a double-digit deficit to win three more times...first vs. Harvard at Minnesota when they trailed by as many as 15 and won by four, 85-81. Again it happened at CSU, when the Buffs trailed by 10 and won by seven, 81-74, and lastly vs. USC, trailing 12 at halftime and winning 69-67.

IS IT A CLUB IF YOU'RE THE ONLY MEMBER?...CU head coach Ceal Barry became the first coach in CU history to reach 400 wins with the Buff win over Idaho State. She currently boasts 491 total career wins, leaving her just nine from joining the 500 club. She's already the winningest women's basketball coach in CU history, and she's the most tenured coach in a single sport in CU history. Here's how she stacks up against other CU head honchos. AMBER IS THE COLOR OF YOUR ENERGY...Sophomore Amber Metoyer has made leaps and bounds in her second season, averaging 7.7 ppg and 6.1 rpg. She recorded the first double-double of her career against Washington with 16 points and 12 rebounds in 26 minutes off the bench. She also got her first career start at USC.

GO AHEAD AND MOVE THE THREE POINT LINE BACK...The experimental 9-inch distancing of the three point line clearly wasn't a problem for the Buffaloes. Colorado was 12-for-25 from beyond arc in its opener, tying the CU school record for three's in a game, set twice (Jan. 13, 1999 vs. Iowa State and March 22, 2003 vs. BYU in the NCAA Tournament). Emily Waner (5), Kate Fagan (4) and Anna Nedovic (2) all helped the cause.

CHARGE!!!!...Kate Fagan led the Buffs last year in charges taken, and is on the right track again this year with 14. She's taken at least one in 11 of 13 games this season.

NOT EXACTLY MARGINAL...In wins, the Buffs have an average margin of victory of +14.1, with an overall scoring margin of +18.8 per game.

YOUNG GUN...Emily Waner received her first career start at Minnesota, becoming the first true frosh since Randie Wirt to start a game for Colorado. She got her first home start against California.

CENTURY CLUB...It was a big weekend for Tera Bjorklund and Randie Wirt back home in Minnesota. Bjorklund played her 100th game as a Buffalo against Harvard, while Randie Wirt notched her 100th game against Minnesota on Sunday. Kate Fagan joined the club in the game against Southern California.

FEELING THE LOVE...The Buffs are ranked No. 14 in the latest Associated Press Poll and No. 14 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. It's the highest Colorado has been rated since the final polls of the 2001-02 season, when CU was ranked No. 12 in the AP and No. 9 in the coaches poll.

PLAYING WITH THE BIG DOGS...Historically, the Buffs are 47-80 against ranked opponents, and are 27-20 at home in the same scenario. With CU's win over Notre Dame in the second game of the season, the Buffaloes have wins over ranked opponents in 14-consecutive seasons. Colorado's biggest win ever over a ranked team came when unranked CU upset No. 16 Florida 98-62 in Boulder on Dec. 22, 2000, a 32-point win.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS...Colorado is now 49-2 in its last 50 games against unranked teams, dating back to the 2000-01 season. The losses were both last season to Villanova in the Coors Classic and at Missouri on Feb. 2.

COLORADO UPSETS...In the 28 seasons of Colorado basketball, the Buffaloes have achieved upsets over 29 opponents. Colorado's most recent upset was November 15, 2003, 67-63 in overtime against No. 15 Notre Dame in Boulder.

HALFTIME TURNAROUNDS...It must have been some speech. Against Notre Dame, the Buffs allowed the Fighting Irish to open up a 12-0 lead. The Buffs used their stifling defense to get back in the game, and the result was an 18-point Irish second half. That ties for the seventh-fewest second half points for a CU opponent in program history.

THAT IS SO UNCOOL...Whitney Law became the first Buffalo in five years to suffer a season-ending ACL injury when she tore her anterior cruciate and medial collateral and meniscus (that's ACL and MCL and cartilage to you and me) against Minnesota at the Subway Classic. It's truly crummy for Law because she just finished sitting out a year after transferring from Georgia. Look at it this way: now she can maybe get a master's degree too.

WANER FROM WAY BACK...Freshman guard Emily Waner hasn't had much trouble hitting from downtown early in her career. She finished the two experimental games going 7-14 from downtown, a .500 shooting percentage from three point land, and is currently 27-59 on the season for 45.8%.

DAZZLING DEBUT...Freshman Emily Waner wasted no time making an impact in a CU uniform, scoring a game high 17 points in the win over ODU. The 17 points are the third-most ever for a freshman in a debut (25, Lisa Van Goor; 19, Jamillah Lang; 17, Erin Scholz) and fifth most in a debut at CU. She made her first two buckets on her

first two shots, both threes, one from the right baseline and one from the left. All told, she logged 31 minutes and finished 6-11 from the floor.

THERE MUST BE SOMETHING IN THE WATER...After Waner christened her kicks with a three on her first shot, classmate Anna Nedovic wasn't about to be outdone. Her first shot as a Buff: a three, nothing but net. Also not to be shown up was sophomore transfer Whitney Law, who made her first shot at CU...wait for it...a three. Four games later freshman Leslie Howard scored her first career bucket. Yeah, it was a three.

EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN...It took three years and 24.7 ppg in the 2003 NCAA Tournament, but the powers-that-be are sitting up and taking notice of Colorado's center of attention, senior Tera Bjorklund. After a selection to the All-Big 12 First Team last year, as well as the Big 12 All-Tournament team, she's been picked as a preseason All-American by the John R. Wooden Award and is on the watch list for the Wade Trophy as well. Her honors campaign website "The T In Team" is up and running for all the latest Tera news and information at <http://buffs.colorado.edu/tera/index.shtml>.

WADE WATCH, WADE WATCH...Not the same ring to it as Wayne's World. Eh. Well anyways, the WBCA has launched a website to follow the progress of this year's Wade Trophy Watch List types, of which Tera Bjorklund is one. It can be found at: <http://www.wbca.org/wadetrophyintro.asp>.

FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS...Coach Ceal Barry has a few of her former players in the coaching ranks this season. Former CU assistant Jen Warden is in her second season at Boise State University after working at Colorado for 10+ seasons. Also head coaching is Raegan Scott-Pebbley at Utah State University, which will start play this season for the first time since 1987. Lastly, there are four former Buffs that are assistant coaches: Linda Lappe (Drake), Benita Martin (Colorado State), Tracy Tripp (Denver) and Shelley Sheetz (San Diego).

CLIMBING THE CHARTS...Tera Bjorklund has made quick work of CU's statistical charts as a Buffalo. Last season, her 592 points were the most ever by a junior, and the fourth most ever by a Buff in a single season. Her single season average of 18.5 in 2002-03 was the third best in school history. On the career charts, she ranks No. 9 with 1,398, passing No. 10 Diane Hiemstra (1,377) and No. 9 Mandy Nightingale (1,386) against Harvard. She's passed Jenny Roulrier and Erin Carson. Tera is now sixth with 1,577 career points and will be aiming for Jamillah Lang's 1,596 points and fifth place on the charts.

TOUGH OPENERS...The Buffs kicked off this season with their toughest early slate in school history, tipping off against four-consecutive NCAA Tournament participants from last season. The Buffs last opened with back-to-back NCAA teams in 1994-95, when they played Stephen F. Austin and San Diego State, both wins. The last time CU had three NCAA teams in the first four games was 1989-90, when they faced Providence, Illinois State and LSU in games 2, 3 and 4 that year. CU went 1-2 in those contests. This season also marked the first time in school history that CU opened the season with two games within the first four against teams in the Top 25.

WORLD TRAVELERS...Kate Fagan and Tera Bjorklund represented CU, the Big 12 and the United States on the USA Basketball World University Games this summer, which also doubled as the Big 12 All-Star team. The dynamic duo traveled to Daegu, South Korea with the rest of the All-Stars for three weeks in August.

PICKING FIGHTS WITH THE BIG DOGS...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing 10 2003 NCAA tournament teams. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as five members played in the NCAA a season ago, with Texas Tech making the Sweet 16 and Texas making the Final Four. The Buffs' opponents that danced last year: Old Dominion, Notre Dame, Harvard, Minnesota, Washington, Kansas State (twice), Texas, Oklahoma and Texas Tech. The Buffs will also take on WNIT participants Missouri, Baylor and Colorado State.

TURNING OVER A NEW LEAF...For the second this season, Colorado had a game in which the Buffs forced at least 30 turnovers. This season CU first did it against No. 5 Notre Dame, forcing the Irish to giveaway the ball 30 times,

scoring 31 points on the freebies. The second time was against Cal, forcing 30 TO's again, scoring 21 points off of them.

CROWD CONTROL...CU has had success in the games with large groups of people present. Naturally, more of that success has come at home, where the Buffs are 17-9 with crowds of 5,500+. On the road, CU is 15-18 with 4,400+ fans, but 2-8 when there are 10,000 or more fans in the opposition's arena (it must be noted that on nine of those 10 occasions, the opponent was ranked). Take those 10 away, and CU holds their own at 12-8. The Buffs have proved themselves in front of a really big crowd, winning their first game ever in a visiting arena with 10,000+ with their OT win over Texas Tech in front of 13,123 fans in 2001-02, the biggest crowd CU has won in front of on the road. The win over Iowa State last season was in front of 10,222.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT...Colorado has six players, half the roster, that are left-handed! But not all of them shoot with their left hand. CU's lefties: Tera Bjorklund, Maria Billingsley, Cecily Jones, Sarah Lini, Whitney Law and Veronica Johns-Richardson. Just for measure, we'll include that assistant coach Tanya Haave is also a left-hander. That's pretty remarkable considering that statistics state that just 1 in 10 people are left-handed.

CU IN OT...With the win over Notre Dame in extra time on Nov. 15 of this season, Colorado moved to 15-15 in overtime games with a mark of 9-12 in road overtime games. The Buffs have played in overtime in back-to-back-to-back seasons. Five of CU's last six overtime games have been on the road, including double OT at Iowa State in 1997. CU is 4-1 in those last five road OT contests. Prior to the Notre Dame win on Nov. 15, the Buffs had not been taken to OT at home since the 1996 NCAA Tournament, when they lost to Auburn 68-61 on St. Patrick's Day.

CATCHING A LEGEND...Now in her 21st season at CU, Ceal Barry has now passed Russell "Sox" Walseth for the basketball record for a coach with the most seasons with an individual team. Walseth coached the CU men from 1957-76 for 20 seasons, then joined the women's team for a stint from 1980-83 for a total of 23 seasons between the two teams, the longest overall tenure for a CU basketball coach. Barry also just passed Walseth for the second-most games coached at Colorado. She's got 624, Sox had 604.

HALL OF FAMER...Colorado assistant coach and former Evergreen High School prep standout Tanya Haave was recently voted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame, one of the highest honors in the state. Her classmates include Patrick Roy, Terrell Davis and Bill Hanzlik.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 313-88 (.781) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 278-67 (.806). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 226-66 (.774) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 29 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s. They're riding a 10 game home win streak.

THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Net on Saturday mornings at 9:30 a.m. Hosted by Chuck Garfien, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS... Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Randie Wirt have been selected as the captains of the CU squad for the 2003-04 season. This marks the first time since 1999-2000 that the Buffs have rookie captains.

MOVE OVER BRIDGET JONES...Because the witty Kate Fagan has assumed official duties as CU's online diary writer for her second year. The Fagan Files, a feature on CU's website, will chronicle the season as experienced by Fagan, a fifth-year senior who has seen both the individual and collective ups and downs in her tenure thus far and has become one of the go-to players in Ceal Barry's starting lineup this year.

LOVE AND MARRIAGE...Buff guard Maria Billingsley is the atypical women's college basketball player. Why? She's 24, she's a native of Sweden and she's married. The former Maria Eriksson was married in December 2001 to Brent Billingsley, a former rodeo champion and graduate of Northern Arizona. She's also the oldest player on the CU roster and the only player NOT born in the 80's.

SHOWTIME...Colorado is scheduled to make a minimum of five regional or national television appearances this season, with the possibility of additional television if the Buffs advance in tournament play.

2010...Colorado has won at least 20 games in a season 16 times in its history (28 seasons) and 12 times in Ceal Barry's 20-year tenure. The Buffs have also had at least 10 wins in the Big 12 four times in seven seasons.

NEW YEARS RESOLUTIONS...We asked the Buffs and Buff staffers what their New Year's Resolutions are for this year...some of them don't have them, but some do, and here they are:

Ceal Barry: "To get fit and stay fit!!"

LaTonya Watson: "Help my brother successfully complete high school, guide him through the college selection process and hopefully obtain a scholarship (athletic and/or academic) and two, start taking better care of myself (physically, through fitness as I have for the past five months...mentally, and spiritually)."

Leslie Howard: "To wait for clothes to go on sale before I buy them."

Kate Fagan: "To write daily in my journal."

Emily Waner: "Time management! For this next semester I want to continue to stay on top of school and basketball!"

Tera Bjorklund: "To keep closer contact with my friends and family back home."

Sarah Lini: "I have never actually kept one, so this year I have decided to not make one."

Veronica Johns-Richardson: "Consistency in my life with family, school and basketball."

THE WANER WAY...Well-adjusted? You be the judge. When asked what the biggest adjustment from high school to college has been, the Colorado native had this to say: "Time management and having the ability to address all the responsibilities you face daily. You have to budget your time to make sure you are prepared for everything. That means being mentally prepared for class, mentally and physically prepared for practice and disciplined enough to maintain good nutrition through all of that. Eat right, drink enough water during the day, and make sure you take the time throughout the day to get some homework done whenever the opportunity presents itself."

THE SECOND COMING OF KORDELL...I'VE GOT YOUR SLASH...Former Buff quarterback Kordell Stewart made a name for himself early in his NFL career as "Slash" since he was playing a little quarterback/wide receiver/running back. Well you can call Amber Metoyer the new Slash as she's playing some small forward/power forward/center. When CU backup center Cecily Jones went down with a partially torn ACL on Nov. 2, Coach Barry inserted Metoyer in at the post and liked her so much, she played there in the exhibition against South Dakota State. When the matchup is there, be looking for the 5-10 Metoyer to bang bodies in the post.

FOREIGN LEGION...Colorado boast four players from over there, three hail from what is technically Scandinavia. Maria Billingsley is a native of Sweden, Jasmina Ilic from Serbia, and Sarah Lini and Anna Nedovic come from Denmark. The four represent the most non-Americans on a CU roster ever.

BARRY SIGNS TWO PREPS TO LETTERS OF INTENT...Ceal Barry announced the signing of two high school seniors to Letters of Intent on Monday. Kara Richards, a 6-4 center from Graham, Texas and Jackie McFarland, a 6-3 forward from Derby, Kan. McFarland's sister Jessica plays at Kansas State.
