FOR STARTERS: Colorado enters today's game at 0-2 in the Big 12 Conference for the third straight season. Back in 1999-2000 and 1998-99, CU lost its first three conference games and in 2004-05, fell in their first four conference games.

CU vs. TEXAS A&M: Coach Patton teams are 8-4 against the Aggies, however, A&M has won the last three straight games (one each at home, away, neutral court). CU holds a 4-1 advantage in Boulder. This season's match up is a little different, the Aggies are the No. 8 (AP)/No. 9 (USA Today Coaches Poll) nationally. Since A&M defeated CU, 61-58, Feb. 8, 2006, the Aggies are 23-4 (.852), while the Buffs 9-15 (.375).

BROADCAST: Tonight's game will be televised on Fox Sports Net Rocky Mountain. All Colorado men's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. Mark Johnson will handle play-by-play duties and is joined by Charles Johnson with the color commentary. Live internet audio can be accessed through Yahoo! Sports. Live video streaming of Saturday's battle will be available to Stampede Online subscribers at CUBuffs.com.

AT HOME vs. RANKED OPPONENTS: Since the 2002-03 season, CU has defeated at least one ranked opponent at the Coors Events Cen-

HOOK SHOTS: In two Big 12 games, **Richard Roby** is averaging 25.0 ppg. and **Xavier Silas** is runner up with 12.0 ppg ... On the boards in two conference games, **Dominique Coleman** and **Jeremy Williams** average 7.0 rpg. ... **Dwight Thorne** made his first 3-pointer of the season at OU. He's now 1-of-19 (.053) and 4-of-27 from the field (.148) ... In three career games vs. A&M, Roby is 18.3 ppg., 4.7 rpg., 16-of-47 FG% (.340), 16-of-22 (.727) ... **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** has a concussion and broken nose suffered at OU; he did not practice Thursday and Friday and is probable vs. A&M ... Thorne and A&M star **Acie Law IV** are cousins ... **Marcus Hall** returned to practice this week, even though he's eligible to play, he's redshirting season. **TEAM:** First time CU opens Big 12 Conference season with three straight opponents (Texas, OU, A&M) who made NCAA Tournament a year ago ... CU is 0-2 to begin Big 12 play for the third straight season and eighth time in Patton's 11 years ... CU 10-13 (.435) at home against ranked opponents since 1996 ... CU has used eight different starting combos through 12 games ... Twice this season CU has allowed 100 points (at New Mexico and Texas). The last time the opponent scored 100+ three times in a season was 2001-02 (KU twice, Texas) ... CU is 0-7 when trailing at the half and 2-55 when trailing by 10 or more half (0-3 this season).

ter. This Saturday, No. 8/9 Texas A&M (14-2) visits the Events Center. Last season, it was No. 18/19 Oklahoma, 84-75 (Feb. 15). In 2004-05, the Buffs defeated No. 23/22 Texas, 88-79. In 2003-04 it was No. 22/23 Texas Tech and during the last NCAA Tournament team in 2002-03, it was four opponents, including No. 3 Texas and No. 6 Kansas.

THE FUTURE?: For the first time this season five freshmen were on the court at the same time in the game. It happened briefly at 12:50 of the first half at Oklahoma. Kal Bay, James Inge, Dwight Thorne, Jeremy Williams and Xavier Silas. The next substitution came at 11:31 (Roby for Inge).

CU vs. RANKED TEAMS: Entering this season, the Buffaloes and coach Patton are 11-48 (.186) against nationally ranked schools. In the last four years, CU has beaten at least one ranked school at home. However, on the road it's a much different story having lost their last 22 straight (last at No. 20 Texas Tech, Jan. 11, 80-78).

SCOUTING THE AGGIES: Texas A&M retains 85 percent of its scoring from 2005-06 as four starters and eight other lettermen return from a team which fell to No. 18 LSU, 58-57 in the second round of the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

Texas A&M travels to CU with a seven-game winning streak and a 14-2 overall record, with it's only blemishes coming in back-to-back losses at No. 9 LSU and to No. 1 UCLA in the John R. Wooden Classic. In Texas A&M's 12 non-conference wins, the Aggies were hardly tested, winning by an average of 37.4 points per game. The closest contest was a 74-62 win against Pacific in College Station. The maroon and white have opened their Big 12 slate with two-straight victories, a year after dropping their first four conference games. This is the first time the Aggies have started with a 2-0 Big 12 record.

Texas A&M won a close battle with Kansas State to start the Big 12 schedule. The game was back-and-forth the entire game until a three-pointer by sophomore Josh Carter with just over four minutes left gave the Aggies the lead for good in a game they would win 69-65. Against Baylor, Texas A&M battled to a tie with the Bears through the middle of the second half before pulling away with a 61-51 victory in Waco, Texas; the win came

despite the Aggies shooting a season-low .372 from the field and dishing out a season-low five assists. Nearly half of the team's points came on converting 26-of-33 free throws.

The Aggies are led by Acie Law who is averaging 15.6 points and 5.5 assists per game; the senior has scored in double figures in eight straight games and in 12 of 16 overall. Three other players are also averaging 12 points or more on the season: junior Joseph Jones (13.6 ppg, double figures in 13 of 16 games); Carter (12.3 ppg); and senior Antanas Kavaliauskas (12.0 ppg). Law and Jones are the only players averaging double figures in their two conference games with 19.0 ppg and 15.5 ppg, respectively.

Texas A&M has been very efficient offensively, as eight players have a FG percentage of .500 or better. The team also shoots for a very good three-point percentage (.402), led by Carter who is second in the Big 12 in three-point FG percentage (42-of-80, .525). Jones currently leads the conference in free throw percentage (68-of-78, .872).

LAST TIME OUT: Nate Carter came off the bench to score 15 points and grab eight rebounds as Oklahoma defeated CU, 78-54 Wednesday. OU (9-5, 1-1 Big 12) have beaten Colorado 22 straight times at the Lloyd Noble Center, a streak that dates to February 1980. Freshman Tony Crocker, who entered the game with a 10.9-point scoring average, had 16 points and eight rebounds. The Sooners controlled the basketball game on the defensive end, holding the Buffaloes to five points in the first 8:18. Colorado's final point total was about 17 below its previous season average. Oklahoma also harassed the Buffaloes into a season-high 25 turnovers - stepping into passing lanes for 14 steals - and blocked three shots. The loss was Colorado's fourth in five games. It's the eighth time in Big 12 history that the Buffaloes have started league play 0-2.

ON THE ROAD IN THE BIG 12: Since the Big 12 formed (1996-97), CU has played 81 regular season games on the road. Heading into 2006-07, the Buffaloes under coach Patton are 21-60 (.260). That means an average of 2.1 wins a season and 5.9 losses in eight road games. The highest win total was 4-4 in 1996-97; their lowest was one win in each of the 2002-03 (Baylor), 2001-02 (Texas A&M) and 1999-2000 (Kansas State) seasons.

NONCONFERENCE PLAY: CU finished 4-6, their first losing season in nonconference play since 1988-89 when they finished 5-8. It's also the fewest nonconference games the Buffaloes have played since the 1997-98 campaign when they finished 6-4.

CANCELLED GAMES: The CU/UC Davis game (Dec. 23) was cancelled due to the inclement weather in the Denver area that caused severe travel difficulties; and on Saturday, Dec. 30, both the Texas Christian (men) and Houston (women) schools opted not to board their respective flights to Colorado. Officials from both schools cited the weather conditions in Colorado, despite the fact that their flights were not cancelled. The doubleheader had the TCU men playing the CU men at 1 p.m. at the Coors Events Center, with the Houston women playing the CU women at 7 p.m. The games will not be rescheduled this season.

THE REST OF THE BIG 12: CU was the only team not to play a game during their extended holiday break due to the inclement weather, the Christmas holiday and final exams. Texas, Iowa State and Nebraska played the most games (5) from Dec. 10-31. The schools playing four games were Baylor, Kansas State, Missouri, Texas A&M and Oklahoma State; Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas Tech have played three.

INJURY LIST UPDATE: Freshman center Marc Van Burck is currently back as a reserve after suffering a right foot stress fracture. He was active for the Oklahoma, Texas and Central Florida games, but did not play. He has not played in a game since the season opener against Denver (Nov. 10). Freshman walk-on Trent Beckley is still out with a left Achilles tendon strain.

GETTING CLOSE: Richard Roby is nearing the school's top-10 field goals attempts list. Entering tonight's game, Roby has 997 attempts nearing the 10th spot held by Jay Humphries (1980-84) with 1,058. As for field goals made, Roby is a bit behind Scott Wedman's 10th place of 516. Roby has 418 field goals made.

FREE THROWS WHEN IT COUNTS: After 12 games, we're starting to see whose cool under pressure from the free throw line. Listed below are totals with five and two minutes remaining in the game.

"X" MARKS THE SPOT: Xavier Silas is averaging almost 30 minutes a game (29.3). In his six starts, Silas is averaging 32.7 minutes, 11.8 ppg., 3.8 rpg. and is 17-for-21 (.810) from the free throw line. He's also shooting 22-for-58 from the field (.379). Overall, he's averaging 10.1 ppg and 3.5 rpg. Six of those starts was a career-best 19 points against Pepperdine and seven rebounds against Central Florida. He scored 17 points against Texas on Jan. 6.

SCORING 60 POINTS OR LESS: Four of CU's 12 games have resulted in scoring 60 points or less, a first in the 11 years under coach Patton.

HOW ABOUT 59 PTS. OR LESS?: That's happened three times this season (46 vs. Air Force; 54 at Oklahoma; 55 at UNC Wilmington). When CU flirts with 59 points or lower they are 1-34 in the last 11 plus years under coach Patton [scoring 30-39 (0-1), 40-49 points (0-3), 50-59 points (1-31)]. The lone win came at Iowa State, 54-52 (OT), the Buffs first win in Ames since Feb. 19, 1991 (14 games).

"YOUNG GUNS" Eight of the team's 13 players are freshmen and are know as another name on the 2006-07 roster, the 'Young Guns.' If you haven't already done so, check out the back cover of the 2006-07 media guide, they're the future of CU Basketball. After 12 games, Kal Bay and Xavier Silas have made the most of the opportunity in the CU lineup. Bay has started eight of 12 games at the point and ranks first on the team in 3-pointers (23), second in assists (30; 2.5 app.) and is fifth in scoring (7.3 ppg.).

THIS DAY IN BUFF MBB HISTORY: CU is 11-7 on this date in history. Ironically, back in the 2000-01 season the Buffs defeated Texas A&M, 88-58. Five players were in double figures to lead CU in their most lopsided conference victory in 32 years.

SURPRISE LINEUP ADDITION: Chase Perkowski became the second player in the 11 plus years under Coach Patton to start a game as a non-scholarship player. The first came in Patton's

1995-96 season (where he was named interim then head coach) toward the end of the year. Jamie Miller started Feb. 28, 1996 against Nebraska and played only three minutes and only six games for the season. Perkowski came off the bench in the early stages of the first half at UNCW. The sophomore from San Juan Capistrano, Calif. took a charge in four minutes.

BIG 12 FOES: The Buffs conference opponents have a combined win percentage of .572 (195-146) from last season...Six conference opponents played in postseason tournaments last year...Four opponent played in the NCAA Tournament (Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Texas); two played in the NIT (Oklahoma State, Nebraska).

20 SHOTS+20 PTS. = CU WIN (sometimes): Three times this season when Richard Roby shoots 20 times in a game, he scores 20 points, CU is 2-1 when this occurs. ROOKIES IN THE STARTNG LINE UP: Kal Bay became only the fifth rookie in Coach Patton's 11 years to start the first game of the season (vs. Denver). The others were guard Alan Barkdale (1996-97), guard/forward Michel Morandais (2000-01), point-guard Antoine McGee (2002-03) and guard Richard Roby (2004-05). Remember, Chauncey Billups started at CU in 1995-96 when Patton was an assistant under Joe Harrington.

HALL COMING BACK...next season: With Marcus Hall redshirting the 2006-07 season, this means the 6'1" guard from Houston, Texas will be returning next year. Hall will join seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton and it will seem like old times again, but with a new coach. Hall has played 88 career games played (44 starts) and averages 8.3 points and 3.4 assists per game. He ranks ninth on the school's all-time assist list (295), 10th in 3-pointers made (99) and 19th in steals (82). Hall was also one of the captains on the 2005-06 team.

NO 3-POINT THREAT: After setting the 3-point school record last season with 240, CU is shooting a Big 12 Conference low .286 percent (70-for-245) from the 3-point arc in 12 games. At this pace CU is averaging 5.8 treys a game good enough for 140 3-pointers, their lowest since the 1993-94 season when they made 88. In case you were wondering, that team had seven freshmen.

PRESEASON ROBY REVIEW: Before the season started Richard Roby was named to a trio of preseason honors lists: the top-50 preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy ... one of 50 preseason candidates named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team. Roby is the first CU player to be named to the Wooden List since David Harrison in 2003-04 ... Roby was named to the preseason All-Big 12 Team along with sophomores Brandon Rush and Julian Wright (Kansas), junior Joseph Jones (Texas A&M) and seniors Acie Law (Texas A&M) and Jarrius Jackson (Texas Tech).

CU vs. MOUNTAIN WEST: With the cancellation of the CU/TCU game (Dec. 30), the Buffs played five games against the Mountain West Conference and finished with a 1-4 record. CU is only 11-11 (.500) since 1996-97 and since 2002-03, 6-6 (.500) against the conference.

LEAVING AT THE END OF SEASON: On Oct. 25, coach Patton announced this would be his last basketball season of coaching at CU. Patton said he would not seek nor accept an extension of his contract, which runs until July 1, 2007. In 10 years as head coach, Patton has 180 victories, four NIT appearances, two NCAA Tournaments, and three 20-win seasons.

TEAM TIDBITS: The Nov. 10 match up with Denver, was the earliest CU has started the season in its 105-year history...CU's 96 points scored against Central was the most scored since beating up Savannah State, 116-52 on Jan. 3, 2006...CU's 12 blocked shots vs. Northern Colorado was the most since swatting 12 on Dec. 22, 2005 (Mercer) ... Allowing New Mexico to score 100 points on Nov. 14, was the first time CU allowed that many in a game since falling to Oklahoma State, Jan. 30, 2004 (L, 86-104). The 41-point loss at New Mexico is the most since losing by 32 points at Utah (80-48) on Dec. 30, 2004 and by 43 to Texas at the Big 12 Tournament, March 10, 2000 (78-35) ... The win at Utah was its first in seven road games (at Oklahoma State, Jan. 21, 80-78, OT) ... CU losses to New Mexico (41 points) and Air Force (38 points) were the worst back-to-back losses since losing consecutive 30+ point games Jan. 29, 1994 (Kansas, 87-53) and Feb. 1 (at Iowa State, 99-69)...CU's 46 point loss versus USAFA is the lowest point total since scoring 48 points at Utah (Dec. 30, 2004) ... CU remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton (9-0 in Boulder)...CU successfully kept its win streak alive during the exhibition season winning their 18th and 19th in a row defeating Concordia-Montreal (97-85) and Regis (73-37). CU improved to 24-1 (.960) under Patton. Their lone setback occurred Nov. 8, 1998 to the California All-Stars, 91-89. In their history, CU is 44-6 (.880) during the exhibition season.

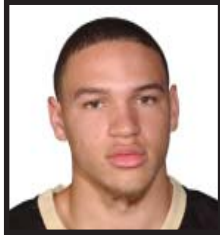

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - Richard Roby scored 20 points and Colorado remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton during the Buffaloes' 78-64 win over Denver.

Colorado's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on Colorado's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists.

DaShawn Walker led Denver with 16 points. Joseph Jackson and Tyler Bullock each added 15 points.

It's the first time the two teams have played since 2000. Colorado leads the all-time series 56-25 and has won the last five in a row. Patton, who announced he'll step down at the end of his 11th season, is 4-0 against the Pioneers.

The Buffaloes led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

Roby had a play late in the first half that probably won't make his highlight reel. Roby attempted a one-handed dunk on a breakaway but was rejected by the rim and fell to the floor. He smiled as he headed back down the court. The Buffs were up 17 points at the time.

Xavier Silas was assessed a technical with 9:23 left in the first half for hanging on the rim.

The Pioneers trimmed a 17-point deficit in the first half to 37-24 at halftime with a 5-1 run to close out the half.

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) - J.R. Giddens scored a career high 25 points and New Mexico got a huge first half lift from its bench in a 106-65 win over Colorado.

Giddens, the former Kansas guard who sat out last season after transferring to New Mexico, shook off a slow start and dissected the Buffaloes' defense with his quickness, slashing moves to the basket and outside jumper that repeatedly found the hoop.

Guard Xavier Silas led the Buffaloes (1-1) with 14 points. Richard Roby and Calvin Bay each scored 12.

New Mexico (3-0) took its first lead at 15-14 on a pair of free throws by Jeffrey Henfield with 11:46 left in the first half. New Mexico's reserves, who scored 25 points in the first half, and some solid free throw shooting, carried the Lobos' offense until Giddens found his stroke.

The Lobos hit their first 13 free throws and reserves Daniel Faris, Chad Toppert and Ryan Kersten provided much of the offense in the first 20 minutes.

Toppert hit a trio of 3-pointers in the first half, Faris scored 8 points and Kersten 6. Toppert's back-to-back 3s gave the Lobos a 36-25 lead with 5:02 left in the first half.

Faris, the sophomore backup center, finished with career highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds.

New Mexico led 47-34 at halftime and broke it open from there as the Lobos shot 67 percent in the second half. Giddens was the catalyst. He scored on a jumper in the lane, then came up with a steal and dunk that pushed the lead to 62-39 with 12:55 left.

Giddens, a junior who New Mexico coach Ritchie McKay has tabbed a likely lottery pick in next summer's NBA draft, flexed his muscles to the crowd of more than 12,000 after the dunk.

Giddens hit 11 of 19 shots and along with Faris and Aaron Johnson led the Lobos to a 51-35 edge in rebounding. Giddens had 9 rebounds and Johnson 11.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

The first came on a bad pass after Utah's Shaun Green drew a charging foul on Roby, and the second came when the Utes lost the ball on a fast break following a blocked shot by Nevill. Borha fouled Jackson-Wilson in the ensuing scramble to set up the winning free throws.

Jackson-Wilson added 10 for the Buffaloes, who forced 17 turnovers and held the Utes to 43.6 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 17 turnovers in the first half, and the Utes made 6-of-22 shots. Neither team led by more than six points.

WILMINGTON, N.C. - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

UNC surged back closing the game 77-73 by a 3-pointer from Archibeque with 3:17 left, then 13 seconds later Archibeque was called for a technical foul (after slamming his hands on the floor) after fouling Roby. Roby subsequently made his two free throws and one from the technical pushing the lead to 80-73 with 3:06.

The Bears kept clawing back with four 3-pointers in the last 3:17, none bigger than Will Figures' trey with 30 seconds remaining tying the score at 86-86 setting Jackson-Wilson heroics after CU called a timeout with 24 seconds remaining. CU gained the final possession and it would take two missed jumpers before Jackson-Wilson picked up the offensive rebound and hit the game-winning shot to end the game.

Jackson-Wilson also added seven rebounds, six blocked shots, four assists and three steals.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - Jason Smith's 15 points and 16 rebounds led the Colorado State Rams past the Colorado Buffaloes, 72-69 for their first win in Boulder in nearly half a century.

The Rams (7-2), who frittered away most of their 16-point second-half lead, won their sixth straight and prevailed on the road against their biggest rival for the first time since Dec. 2, 1957, snapping a 13-game losing streak in Boulder.

Richard Roby's 20 points led the Buffaloes (3-6), marking his fifth 20-point effort of the season. Roby also had four assists, three blocks and a steal.

Smith's three-point play with 1:28 left in the first half ignited the Rams on a 17-3 run spanning halftime to turn a tie game into a 51-37 lead. Colorado State led 55-39 on Smith's dunk with 11:56 left. But the Rams' runaway didn't pan out as the Buffs went to a fullcourt press, chipped away and pulled to 70-65 on Kal Bay's 3-pointer with 50 seconds left.

Roby's basket after a Smith turnover made it a three-point game with 33 seconds left. Tim Denson sank one of two free throws to make it 71-67 and Roby raced downcourt to make it 71-69 with 22 seconds left.

He fouled Denson with 18 seconds left and Denson again hit one of two, giving the Rams a 72-69 lead. Roby was long a 3-pointer that would have tied it with 10 seconds left and the Rams got the ball out of bounds.

This time, they weren't trapped and go the ball upcourt to dribble out their rare win in Boulder.

Cory Lewis added 13 points for the Rams and Stephan Gilling had 12 on 4-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc. Jermyl Jackson-Wilson added 10 points for the Buffs.

The Buffs began the game with a 9-0 run as the Rams turned the ball over four times and missed five shots in the first five minutes before finding their range.

Roby and Durant nearly matched shot for shot in the first half. Durant, who had 21 points and three 3-pointers by halftime, had a scoop shot layup and free throw to put Texas up 50-43 with 2:23 before the break.

CU got four free throws from Roby in the last 1:34 as the Buffaloes closed the gap to 51-48 at intermission. Roby was 3-for-5 on 3-pointers and had 22 points in the first half.

NORMAN, Okla.(AP) - Nate Carter came off the bench to score 15 points and grab eight rebounds as Oklahoma defeated Colorado, 78-54 on Wednesday in the Sooners' Big 12 Conference home opener, giving rookie coach Jeff Capel his first league win.

Oklahoma (9-5, 1-1 Big 12) snapped a two-game losing streak. The Sooners have beaten Colorado (4-8, 0-2) 22 straight times at the Lloyd Noble Center, a streak that dates to February 1980.

Carter has 28 points and 17 rebounds in the Sooners' two league games. Freshman Tony Crocker, who entered the game with a 10.9-point scoring average, had 16 points and eight rebounds, and point guard Austin Johnson added 10 points for Oklahoma.

The Sooners controlled the basketball game on the defensive end, holding the Buffaloes to five points in the first 8:18. Colorado's final point total was about 17 below its previous season average.

Oklahoma also harassed the Buffaloes into a season-high 25 turnovers - stepping into passing lanes for 14 steals - and blocked three shots.

The loss was Colorado's fourth in five games. It's the eighth time in Big 12 history that the Buffaloes have started league play 0-2.

After scoring 30 points in CU's last game, against Texas, Richard Roby scored 20 points. Freshman forward Jeremy Williams had eight points to go with a season-best 12 rebounds for the Buffaloes.

The Sooners never trailed, jumping out to a 16-5 lead early behind five early points from Carter.

A layup by Dwight Thorne and a 3-pointer by Roby pulled the Buffaloes to within two points with just over four minutes left in the first half. Carter responded with a short jumper and Crocker took a charge on Colorado's next possession, then hit two free throws to extend the Sooners' lead.
