THE GAME: The University of Colorado concludes the nonconference portion of its schedule by hosting Pepperdine University on Friday, Jan. 4, at 5:30 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center. The game is the first part of a CU women's-men's doubleheader as the CU men host SMU at 8 p.m.

BROADCAST: All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN 760 AM, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. Mike Rice, in his second season, will have the play-by-play and he is joined by Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. Live internet audio can be accessed through Yahoo! Sports. Live video streaming of Friday's battle will be available to BuffsTV subscribers at CUBuffs.com.

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is off to its best start since 2003-04 at 10-2 and is riding a nine-game winning streak. The nine straight wins are the most for the Buffaloes since a similar nine-game run in 2003-04, which was also the Buffs' last appearance in the NCAA Tournament. CU moved up two spots to No. 23 in the most recent Associated Press Top 25 poll released Dec. 31, and continues to receive votes in the ESPN/USA Today/WBCA poll.

Senior All-America candidate **Jackie McFarland** leads the Buffaloes at 17.2 points and 8.1 rebounds per game while shooting .585

from the field and .792 from the free-throw line. McFarland, who is one of only three players in CU history with 1,500 points and 800 rebounds, ranks second on the team in assists with 36 and is third in blocked shots with 13. The All-Big 12 forward once again can be found among the Top 10 in most league statistical categories ranking second in field-goal percentage and minutes, third in scoring, sixth in rebounding and seventh in free-throw percentage.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** continues to have a solid start to her collegiate career as she ranks second on the team in scoring (13.3 ppg) and is third in rebounding (6.8 rpg). Her scoring and 1.3 blocks per game top all freshmen in the Big 12 Conference this season while she is second in steals (2.3 spg) and third in rebounding and assists (2.2 apg).

Senior guard **Susie Powers** has taken control of the Colorado offense from the point guard position and has been solid in all phases of the game. She is averaging 4.8 points, 4.9 rebounds and a team-best 4.6 assists per game. Powers, who had a career-high nine assists in the win over Wyoming, leads the Big 12 in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.7 and ranked third in the NCAA through games of Dec. 16. She has 55 assists against only 15 turnovers this season. Powers, who had a career-high nine rebounds and matched a personal best with 12 points against Jacksonville State, has 50 assists in the last nine games (5.6 apg).

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** has started the last nine games and has responded with a pair of double-doubles and five double-digit rebounding games. She is averaging 8.7 points, 8.7 rebounds and 1.8 blocks as a starter. Putnina is eighth in rebounding and blocked shots and ninth free-throw percentage (.767) on the Big 12 charts. She had a career night against Jacksonville State scoring 20 points on 8-of-9 from the field including a perfect 4-of-4 from 3-point range. Only Jenny Roulier who hit 5-of-5 from downtown against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2002, had more 3-pointers in a game without a miss. Putnina had just four 3-point field goals in 37 career games prior to the JSU contest.

Junior **Hannah Skildum**, who has started the last seven games, has provided a strong defensive presence to Colorado's back court. She is averaging 4.8 points, 2.1 rebounds and just under one steal per game during CU's nine-game win streak.

Colorado is 8-0 with its current starting line up of Powers-Skildum-Spears-McFarland-Putnina.

It's not just the starters, as the bench has been big too. Sophomore **Bianca Smith** is emerging into a formidable "Sixth-Woman" candidate averaging 10 points off the bench for the Buffs. During CU's nine-game winning streak she has been the team's third-leading scorer at 11.6 points per game while hitting 43 percent from 3-point range (26-of-60). Smith was named Big 12 Player of the Week on Dec. 10 after averaging 19.0 points and hitting 57 percent from the field in games against No. 22 (AP)/21 (WBCA) Wyoming and No. 20/17 Vanderbilt. **Whitney Houston** and **Britney Blythe** have also seen extended minutes in the Colorado backcourt.

Juniors **Caley Dow** and **Kara Richards** have been CU's first front court players off the bench. Dow has played double-digit minutes in six of the last eight games recording two points, two rebounds and one steal against Jacksonville State. Richards is shooting 64 percent from the floor overall and during the nine-game winning streak, she has made 14-of-18 shots (.778).

Colorado is averaging 70.3 points per game, while the Buffs defense is holding opponents to 53.6 per contest. The Buffaloes have been tough on the boards early on, enjoying a +8.8 rebound margin, thanks to the Buffs' ability to keep teams off the boards. CU opponents have averaged just 32.3 per game including a season-low 25 for Wyoming. The Buffaloes on the other hand have had

some big number rebound games this season, including 58 against Colorado State, the most by a CU team since it grabbed 59 against Bowling Green on Nov. 23, 2001, and the most on the road since it had 59 at Oklahoma State on Jan. 28, 1983. CU has outrebounded its opponents in all 12 games this season and has outrebounded the opposition in 16 straight games dating back to last season. The Buffs have not been outrebounded in 18 games (Colorado and Baylor had 35 rebounds each in their game on Feb. 21, 2007).

The Buffaloes currently rank fourth in the nation and top the Big 12 Conference in 3-point field goals (8.8 3's mpg) and are first in the league in free-throw percentage (.745), third in scoring defense (53.6 ppg), fourth 3-point field-goal percentage (.344) and blocked shots (5.4 bpg) and fifth in field-goal percentage defense (.346), rebounding defense (32.3) and rebounding margin (+8.8). CU has been sharing the ball well of late averaging 16.4 assists per game and has netted 20 or more assists in four games in 2007-08.

ABOUT THE WAVES: Pepperdine is 5-7 overall and will be playing its sixth-straight road game and third in a row against a ranked opponent. The Waves have dropped their last five games, all on the road, including losses to No. 22 (AP)/20 (WBCA) George Washington (82-68) on Dec. 30 and No. 6/6 Rutgers (55-45) on Jan. 2. Pepperdine is 1-6 on the road this season with its lone win coming at Washington, 74-56, on Dec. 4. The Waves average 66.2 points per game and pull down 40.7 rebounds per contest. Pepperdine is shooting 41 percent from the field and has a solid 75 percent accuracy from the free-throw stripe.

The Waves are led by senior All-West Coast Conference guard Daphanie Kennedy who averages 17.2 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game. Sophomore forward Miranda Ayim is the WCC's top field goal shooter at 56 percent and she leads the Waves in rebounding at 7.8 per game and is second in scoring at 12.8 per contest. Senior forward Teiosha George is averaging 9.7 points and 6.5 rebounds per game.

FAMILIAR FACES: One of Colorado's legendary players will be on the opposite sideline at the Coors Events Center on Friday. CU Athletic Hall of Famer and former WBCA All-American Shelley Sheetz is in her third season as an assistant coach at Pepperdine. Sheetz is third on CU's all-time scoring list with 1,775 points and led the Buffaloes to four NCAA Tournaments and two Elite Eight appearances from 1991-95.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be just the second meeting between Colorado and Pepperdine. The Buffaloes won the only prior meeting, a 71-67 decision at Pepperdine on Jan. 6, 1981. Colorado is 14-3 against current West Coast Conference teams including a 66-48 win over San Francisco in the 2007-08 season opener. Kathy

McConnell-Miller is 0-2 against Pepperdine as a head coach, both games coming while she was at Tulsa.

HEY, WE PLAYED THEM TOO: Colorado and Pepperdine have one common opponent to date as both teams played at USC. The Trojans had the upper hand on both teams, defeating the Buffaloes 70-57 on Nov. 18 and the Waves 55-52 on Dec. 15. Pepperdine has also seen a future CU opponent as the Waves dropped a 70-59 decision at Iowa State on Nov. 11.

NUMBERS ON NINE STRAIGHT: Colorado's current win streak marks the 12th time in team history the Buffaloes have won nine or more games in a row. A win over Pepperdine would give the Buffaloes their seventh double-digit win streak in team history and their

PERFECT DECEMBER: Colorado registered a perfect 7-0 record for the month of December for the first time since 2003-04, and for just the sixth time in team history. The Buffaloes matched the 1980-81 and 1981-82 teams which were both 7-0 in December. The 1992-93 team had a program best December mark of 9-0, while the 2002-03 squad was 6-0 and 5-0 in 2003-04. CU is 118-54 (.686) all-time in the month of December.

DEFENSE WINS: Colorado has enjoyed some impressive defensive numbers this season.

The Buffaloes have held five opponents under 50 points in 2007; 29-vs. Texas Southern, 38-vs. Southern Utah 43-vs. Dartmouth, 47-at Colorado State and 48-at San Francisco. CU had held their opponent under 50 points just three times total in the previous three seasons.

CU yielded less than 50 points in three-straight games -- Texas Southern, Dartmouth and Southern Utah -- the first such streak since 2003-04. The Buffs' five sub-50 point defensive performances are the most in one season since the 2002-03 squad registered nine.

Against Dartmouth, Colorado had 13 blocked shots, the second highest single-game total in team history, trailing only the school record 16 set against Sam Houston in a 99-60 win on Dec. 14, 2000.

Colorado had a historic performance from a defensive perspective against Texas Southern. The Buffaloes held the Lady Tigers to just 29 points, which ties for the fourth-lowest total in team history (equals a 79-29 win over Iowa State on Feb. 19, 1993). It was just the fifth time in CU history the Buffs have held an opponent under 30 points (the ISU game in 1993 being the last). CU allowed just 13 second-half points, tying for the second-lowest second-half total in team history (also done in the ISU game and against Utah State on Jan. 28, 1981). The Buffaloes forced Texas Southern into 32 turnovers, the most since forcing 35 against Detroit Mercy on Nov. 24, 2002.

SMITH NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 10. Smith captured her first career Big 12 weekly honor and the first for the Buffaloes since **Jackie McFarland** was named Player of the Week on Nov. 13, 2006.

Smith averaged 19 points, two assists and two rebounds off the bench while leading Colorado to wins over No. 22 (AP)/21 (WBCA) Wyoming and at No. 20/17 Vanderbilt. Colorado broke a 23-game losing streak against ranked teams with its 69-55 win over Wyoming on Dec. 5. The Buffaloes then made it wins in back-to-back games over ranked teams for the first time since the 2002 NCAA Tournament with a 62-51 triumph at Vanderbilt on Dec. 9.

Against Wyoming, Smith scored 16 points on 5-of-8 from the floor with three assists as Colorado broke a three-game losing streak against the Cowgirls. She was 4-of-7 from 3-point range and her final two from downtown were clutch as they provided the answer to a 14-3 Wyoming run that cut the CU lead to just one with 5:11 remaining.

Smith had an even bigger game against Vanderbilt. She had a career-high 22 points on 7-of-14 from the field with three rebounds, one steal and one assist as the Buffs handed the Commodores just their second loss in their last 23 home games. Smith scored 13 of CU's first 17 points to erase an early 8-0 Vanderbilt lead, and hit four straight free throws in the final seconds of the game to close it out.

RANK STREAK IS OVER: Colorado had its biggest week in early December in several years in terms of success against ranked teams.

Colorado's 69-55 win over No. 21/22 Wyoming snapped a 23-game Buffs' losing streak to ranked teams. The Buffaloes last win over a ranked opponent had been a 69-59 decision at No. 24 Baylor on Jan. 7, 2004 where CU was ranked No. 14 at the time. The win was Colorado's first against a ranked team while being unranked since knocking off No. 12 North Carolina 86-67 in the second round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament.

The Buffaloes kept the momentum going four days later with a 62-51 win at No. 20/17 Vanderbilt. The win gives CU's its first two-game win streak against ranked teams since knocking off No. 23 Washington and No. 24 Baylor in 2003-04. It's the first pair of wins over two ranked teams in back-to-back games since the 2002 NCAA Tournament when the Buffs defeated No. 22/24 LSU in the second round and No. 5 Stanford in the Sweet 16. It was Colorado's first win on the road over a ranked opponent since defeating No. 24 Baylor 69-59 in Waco, Texas, on Jan. 7, 2004. It was CU's first win over a ranked opponent as an unranked team since defeating No. 12 Texas in Austin, 60-56, on Feb. 26, 1997.

RANKING OF OUR OWN: Colorado moved up two spots to No. 23 in the latest AP Top 25 poll on Dec. 31. The Buffaloes debuted in the 2007 AP poll at No. 25 on Dec. 24 for their first national ranking since finishing No. 17 (AP)/No. 24 (WBCA) in the final 2003-04 polls. Colorado has a rich tradition in the AP poll. This ranking marks CU's 156th appearance in the AP poll since 1980. The Buffs were ranked in 75 straight polls from Mar. 15, 1992 to Dec. 9, 1996 and 30 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 to Mar. 22, 2002. The Buffaloes received votes in the WBCA Coaches' Poll, for the fourth-straight week.

With Colorado being ranked by the AP Poll, Buffs head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller becomes the 22nd person in NCAA Division I women's history to play for and coach an AP ranked team. McConnell-Miller was a four-year letterwinner at Virginia (1986-90) where she played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight.

REVERSING ROAD WOES: Colorado is 3-1 on the road this season and has won two straight for the first time since defeating Pacific and Washington on the same road trip in December 2004. The three wins are one better than the team win total on the road for the last two seasons combined (1-10 in 2006-07 and 1-9 in 2004-05). CU's 82-47 win over Colorado State was significant on several

fronts. The 35-point margin was the Buffs' highest on the road since a 70-35 win over Kansas on Jan. 16, 2002 and it was also their largest win over Colorado State (regardless of venue) since a 112-48 win on Nov. 16, 1979. The 82 points were the most CU has scored on an opponents home court since the Buffs' last trip to Moby Arena, an 86-83 loss to the Rams on Nov. 30, 2005. Colorado broke Vanderbilt's 10-game home winning streak and handed the Commodores just their second loss in 23 home games, the other coming last season against eventual national champion Tennessee.

3-POINTERS FALLING: Colorado is on pace to smash its team records for 3-point field goals made and attempted in one season. The Buffaloes are 105-of-305 (.344) from downtown, the highest 12-game marks in team history. With a guarantee of 18 games remaining on the schedule, CU's current pace of 8.8 3-pointers made per game would give the Buffs 262 for the season, passing the school record of 196 in 2001-02. CU's current pace of 25.4 attempts per game would net 762 in 18 more contests, well over the school record of 501 also set in 2001-02. The Buffaloes need just 26 3-pointers to enter the single-season Top 10.

Colorado leads the Big 12 Conference and ranks fourth in the nation at 8.8 3-point field goals per game. The Buffaloes have a school single-season record six games with 10 or more 3-point field goals. The previous season high was five in the 34-game 2001-02 season. CU had a season-high 14 against Colorado State, its second best single-game total (CU had 16 against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004). That came during a string of netting 10 or more 3-pointers in four straight games for the first time. The Buffs had 10 3-pointers against Wyoming and Northern Colorado and 13 against Rice. Against UNC, the Buffs set a school record for 3-point field goal attempts in one half with 21 in the first stanza and finished the game with 36 attempts, just one shy of the school record of 37 set against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004.

Individually, it hasn't been one player doing the damage. Ten different players on the CU roster have at least two 3-point field goals and nine have attempted at least 10. Sophomore Bianca Smith leads the team with 28 including 24 in the last eight games. Freshman **Brittany Spears** is right behind Smith with 22 and senior **Susie Powers** has 15.

NUMBERS FOR McFARLAND: Jackie McFarland has had four double-doubles this season raking third in the Big 12 Conference. She ranks second in CU history in career double-doubles with 41 and her 42 career double-digit rebounding games are third on the CU career charts.

McFarland became the ninth player in team history to reach 1,500 points during the win over Southern Utah and now ranks eighth on the all-time scoring list at 1,526. She is 49 points from passing Tracy Tripp (1985-89) for seventh place and 74 away from entering the top five.

McFarland is the fourth player in Colorado history with 800 career rebounds, and now stands at 867. She needs 29 rebounds to pass Sandy Bean (1978-82) for third pace on CU's all-time list.

McFarland is third on CU's all-time for free throws made with 444. She is 59 away from catching Bridget Turner (1985-99) for the all-time mark of 494. She ranks 11th in field goals made (531) and 12th in minutes played (3,108).

McFARLAND NOMINATED FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** has been named one of 30 nationwide candidates for the 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

The award – presented annually to the NCAA Division I Student-

Athlete of the Year in eight sports – focuses on the “Four C’s” of classroom, character, community and competition. An acronym for *Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School*, the award was launched during the 2001-02 season to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who remain committed to their university and pursue the many rewards that a senior season and complete college education brings.

A native of Derby, Kan., McFarland is a two-time Academic All-American sporting a 3.89 GPA. She is working on a concurrent degree program which will allow her to earn her MBA while completing her undergraduate degree in accounting. McFarland won CU’s Scholar-Athlete Award in the spring of 2007 for having the highest GPA in her class. McFarland is a three-year team captain and is actively involved in CU’s Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. SAAC is the governing body for student-athletes at CU which assists in the development and implementation of programs that motivate student-athletes to strive for and be recognized for academic excellence and community involvement.

From the list of 30 nominees for each gender, a national media committee will select 10 finalists to be announced in January. Those 10 names will then be put to ballot for a nationwide vote during the NCAA Tournament in March. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the male and female recipients.

CAPTAINS NAMED: Seniors **Jackie McFarland** and **Susie Powers** and junior **Caley Dow** will serve as team captains for the 2007-08 season. McFarland is a captain for a third straight season, Powers is in her second year as captain and Dow is a captain for the first time. CU team captains are voted on by players prior to the first regular season contest each year.

McFARLAND PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12; BUFFS PICKED 11TH: Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** has been named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference Women’s Basketball team by a vote of league coaches.

McFarland is CU’s second preseason All-Big 12 honoree as former Buffaloes standout Erin Scholz was named to the 1996-97 squad. She joins Nebraska forward Kelsey Griffin, Oklahoma center Courtney Paris and Texas A&M guards A’Quonesia Franklin and Takia Starks on the five-member preseason team. All five players were first team All-Big 12 picks last winter.

McFarland topped the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in field-goal accuracy in 2006-07 at 61 percent. She was second in the Big 12 in scoring (17.8 ppg) and rebounding (10.8 rpg) and led the league in minutes at 36.4 per game.

Despite returning eight players from a team that finished tied for seventh last season, the Buffaloes were picked to finish 11th in the Big 12 in 2007-08 in annual preseason coaches poll.

Defending co-champion Texas A&M was picked to win the 2008 title with seven first place votes and 117 points overall, just edging out the league’s other co-champion, Oklahoma who had the other five first place votes and 115 points. The Big South held down the top five spots in the poll as Baylor was third with 97 points followed by Texas (86) and Oklahoma State (66). Iowa State was the top North school (64) followed by Nebraska (56), Kansas State and Texas Tech (54 each), Kansas (43), Colorado (29) and Missouri (11).

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Colorado once again faces a tough schedule with no less than 16 games against 2007 NCAA or WNIT tournament teams. The Buffaloes will travel to perennial NCAA women’s

powers Southern California and Vanderbilt during the non-conference season as well as region rival Colorado State. Colorado will host 2007 WNIT Champion Wyoming and will also see Rice, Clemson and Pepperdine at the Coors Events Center. Texas A&M, Oklahoma State and Texas come to Boulder this year out of the Big 12 South along with the Buffs’ usual Big 12 North opponents.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 314-93 all-time record at the Coors Events/Conference Center (.771). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CECC in 19 of the previous 29 years including, 2007-08 when the Buffaloes went 11-5 at home with four of the five losses coming to ranked teams. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CECC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado’s schedule features 10 games that will be televised either regionally or nationally, nine of which will be carried by Fox Sports Net. Two games are part of the Big 12’s national package with FSN: Sunday, Jan. 13 against Iowa State at home and Saturday, Jan. 26, at Texas Tech. FSN Rocky Mountain is televising six CU home games which began with Wyoming on Dec. 5. FSN Midwest will televise CU’s game at Kansas State on Jan. 19, which could potentially be picked up by FSN Rocky Mountain as well. CU’s game at Colorado State on Dec. 1 was televised by The Mtn. Network.

UP NEXT: Colorado will open Big 12 Conference play by traveling to face the University of Missouri on Wednesday, Jan. 9, at 5:30 p.m. MST in Columbia, Mo.



Kathy McConnell-Miller
Head Coach
Third Season

When **Kathy McConnell-Miller** took over the University of Colorado program just over two years ago, there's no question the Buffaloes were rebuilding and the team was a work in progress.

In two seasons at Colorado, progress is certainly a valid term for McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes.

McConnell-Miller, 40, sports a 22-38 record in her two seasons at Colorado and is 113-126 overall in eight seasons as an NCAA Division I head coach.

She led Colorado to a 13-17 mark in 2006-07, the team's best record since the 2003-04 Buffaloes went 22-8 and advanced to the program's last NCAA Tournament. Colorado also enjoyed its best Big 12 Conference showing in three years, tying Texas and Texas Tech for seventh in the league standings at 6-10. The Buffaloes' six conference wins in 2006-07 were more than the previous two years combined (3-13 in 2005-06 and 2-14 in 2004-05).

McConnell-Miller, who officially became the sixth head coach in the history of CU women's basketball on April 27, 2005, has overseen the development of Jackie McFarland, who has emerged as one of the top players in the Big 12. McFarland has earned All-Big 12 honors in both her seasons under McConnell-Miller including first team acclaim this past season. All-league selections are nothing new to McConnell-Miller as she has had at least one first or second team all-conference performer in each of her eight seasons as a collegiate head coach.

The Buffaloes have also had academic success in the McConnell-Miller era. In her two seasons, McConnell-Miller has coached seven Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball team members and has helped guide McFarland two a pair of Academic All-America second team honors.

She has done well with the players inherited from legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry, but she has also excelled in bringing in her own players.

McConnell-Miller, who from day one has established a family type atmosphere in the lockerroom and a fighting spirit in her players, and her staff have landed back-to-back Top 40 recruiting classes, including the No. 29 class in 2006 according to the All-Star Girls Report. What was remarkable about the class of 2006 is McConnell-Miller and her staff didn't even have the chance to start on the recruiting trail until April when they arrived in Boulder. Despite that late start, McConnell-Miller and her staff managed to sign five top 150 players, including Whitney Houston and Aija Putnina who made significant contributions as first-year players.

Before arriving at CU, McConnell-Miller spent six seasons as head coach at the University of Tulsa where she constructed an impressive turnaround of the Golden Hurricane program. Before her arrival in 1999-2000, Tulsa had just one winning season in its 14-year history, an overall record of 81-250 (.324), and was actually dropped as a varsity sport for nine years following the 1986-87 campaign. In her six seasons at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller recorded a program-best 91 wins (15.2 wins per year), winning seasons in three of the last four years and two postseason appearances.

She left as Tulsa's all-time leader for coaching victories with a record of 91-88 and owns the longest tenure in school history by a women's basketball coach. McConnell-Miller, who earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in her rookie season as a collegiate head coach in 1999-00, led Tulsa to 14 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

Under the direction of McConnell-Miller, Tulsa placed at least one player on either the All-WAC first or second team, each of her six seasons. McConnell-Miller also had the Golden Hurricane excelling in the classroom sporting four *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District first and second team performers. Tulsa players also earned 23 All-WAC Academic Team honors. One of McConnell-Miller's prize players was Allison Curtin who was an

Associated Press honorable mention All-American for the Golden Hurricane and was drafted by the Houston Comets in the first round of the 2003 WNBA Draft.

Prior to her appointment at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller spent four seasons on Theresa Greutz's staff at the University of Illinois (1995-99). She was an assistant coach for her first three years before being promoted to associate head coach for her final season. The Fighting Illini posted an overall record of 76-45 and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments with McConnell-Miller on the bench. Illinois won the Big Ten Conference Championship in 1997 and twice advanced to the Sweet 16. While at Illinois, McConnell-Miller was vital in the signing of a pair of recruiting classes that ranked among the top five in the nation.

McConnell-Miller coached with Greutz for a total of six years as she went with Greutz to Illinois from Rutgers University in 1995. McConnell-Miller was a Rutgers assistant for two seasons (1993-95), helping the Lady Knights post a pair of winning campaigns, the 1994 Atlantic 10 Championship and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Her recruiting expertise was well documented at Rutgers as her last class was rated as the 14th-best nationally, giving McConnell-Miller back-to-back Top 15 classes.

Her first collegiate assistant coaching job came at her hometown school, the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the Panthers in 1991 and served as the recruiting coordinator. She was also an assistant coach for the 1993 Big East All-Star Team which played in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

She is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, and was inducted into the Seton LaSalle High School Hall of Fame in October of 2006.

McConnell-Miller enjoyed a four-year playing career at guard for the University of Virginia (1986-90). She played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight. McConnell-Miller earned her bachelor's degree in rhetoric and communications from Virginia in 1989.

One of eight children, she is one of six McConnell siblings who attended college on a basketball scholarship.

Three McConnell's are presently in the coaching ranks, two at the college level and one at the high school level. Her older sister, Suzie McConnell Serio was the head coach of the Minnesota Lynx of the WNBA for three seasons (2003-06).

Born on Sept. 24, 1967, McConnell-Miller and her husband, Brad Miller, have three children: Brice (7), Mackenzie (5) and Macie (3).

- Eighth in the Big 12 in rebounding (7.9 rpg) and blocks (1.5 bpg) and is 10th in free-throw percentage (.767).
- Had a career-high and team season best 15 rebounds and four blocks against UNC.
- Had a string of four-straight, double-digit rebounding games and has grabbed double-digit boards in five of the last nine games.
- Has hit 80 percent from the free-throw line as a starter (28-of-35).

Career:

- Ranked fifth in rebounds among freshmen in the Big 12 in 2006-07.

- A 2006 graduate of Regis Jesuit High School in Aurora, Colo. An exchange student from Riga, Latvia, she could play only one season of varsity high school basketball in Colorado. As a senior she averaged 12 points, seven rebounds and two blocks per game helping the Raiders to a 24-4 overall record and a second place finish in the Colorado State Class 4A Tournament.
- Earned All-Continental Conference first team recognition and received honorable mention to the *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Class 4A All-State teams.
- She aspires to own her own business and to become a basketball coach.
- She lists the biggest moment of her high school career as going to the state championship game.
- Her best talent not related to basketball is taking pictures.

SAN FRANCISCO — Freshman **Brittany Spears** had 15 points — all in the first half — to spark Colorado to a season-opening 66-48 win at San Francisco Friday night at War Memorial Gymnasium.

Spears, who also tallied seven rebounds and five steals, scored 15 of CU's first 23 points as the Buffaloes erased an early 13-6 deficit and closed the first half with a 30-12 run to take control of the game. Spears was 7-of-11 from the floor and had four of her steals by halftime equaling CU's top individual theft performance from any game all of last season. Her scoring output tied for the 10th best Buff debut in team history.

"I felt comfortable because we were prepared," Spears said. "We worked all week on (San Francisco's) plays, all the screens; flare screens. (The coaching staff) told us what they were going to do. I felt prepared mentally and physically for this game."

With Spears' strong start the game opened up for CU's all-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** who had a game-high 22 points including 15 in the second half.

"The ball movement was great," McFarland said. "Before (opponents) have been able to double-down on me the entire game and tonight after a couple plays in the first half when we were getting good shots (outside), it opened up the post a lot and allowed me to move around."

Freshman guard **Britney Blythe** made her collegiate debut in her own back yard scoring 11 points with two steals and two assists. The San Mateo, Calif., native led a Colorado bench effort that outscored the USF bench 26-6. Sophomore **Aija Putnina** corralled nine rebounds and had six points, including her first career 3-point field goal.

"We have several options for players coming off the bench and tonight we wanted players on the floor that could score and I thought that was the difference," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "We had five players that could shoot the ball and USF had a difficult job of figuring out who to guard. In the past we've had just one (who could score) and now we have more offensive weapons."

"We wanted to improve our performance on the road this year and I was very pleased with the mental toughness of this team and the decision making on the floor. This team was prepared for what we were going to do and our staff had a confidence level going into the game tonight the way the players have worked in the off season and preseason."

The Buffaloes, which have won just one road game each of the last two years, enjoyed their widest margin of victory on the road since a 71-50 win over Kansas on Jan. 18, 2003. It's also the fewest points CU's allowed on the road since a 45-42 win over Pacific on Dec. 18, 2004.

Colorado's defense shut down San Francisco as the Dons were held to just 37 percent shooting for the game and just 32 in the second half (9-of-28). The Buffaloes had 11 steals — nine in the first half — and overall forced 18 USF turnovers. Lisa Olden led USF with 14 points and seven rebounds while Necolia Simmons had 11 points and seven rebounds.

LOS ANGELES — Southern California took advantage of hot perimeter shooting, rallying 11 3-point field goals to claim a 70-57 decision over Colorado Sunday afternoon at the Galen Center on the USC campus.

USC (1-1) hit a scorching 50 percent from the 3-point arc (11-of-22) and hit timely shots each time the Buffaloes made a run. Brynn Cameron was 4-of-6 from downtown and led USC with 16 points. Simone Jelks, who had just seven 3-pointers all of last season, was 3-of-3 for the afternoon scoring 10 total.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** led Colorado with 19 points, 14 of which came in the second half. Sophomores **Aija Putnina** and **Bianca Smith** each had nine points off the bench.

Colorado's had a first half to forget netting just 16 points while committing 15 turnovers. The Buffaloes made just 5-of-21 from the field (23.8 percent) and had trouble getting All-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** involved in the game. McFarland was held to just one free throw for the first 20 minutes with two rebounds.

McFarland finished with seven points and seven rebounds.

Southern California began the game on a 21-7 run, forcing seven Buffaloes turnovers in the first nine minutes and holding CU to just 17 percent from the field (2-of-12). Camille LeNoir, playing in her first game of the season, had seven of her nine points in the opening minutes of the game.

Colorado closed the gap with a 7-0 run on a Spears free throw, and back-to-back 3-point field goals by Spears and Putnina, but Cameron scored five straight to ignite a 16-2 USC run to end the half. The guard combo of Cameron and LeNoir combined for 17 first half points on 7-of-11 shooting, including three 3-point field goals.

McFarland was able to get back on track early in the second half with six points in the opening moments, but each time USC had an answer on the other end. McFarland and junior center **Kara Richards** combined for six straight to knock the score down to 39-22, but Allison Jaskowiak, and Cameron answered with 3-pointers as the Trojans pushed the lead back to 47-24.

Spears then hit a 3-pointer and followed it up with back-to-back scores as the Buffs went on a 11-2 run to narrow the margin to 49-35 with 12:13 left. However, once again Cameron and Jelks hit back-to-back from downtown to push the USC lead back to 20 (55-35).

Overall Colorado committed 26 turnovers and shot just 38 percent for the game (21-of-55).

BOULDER — Senior **Jackie McFarland** and sophomore **Aija Putnina** each tallied double-doubles as Colorado defeated Rice, 72-55, in the consolation game of the 21st Annual Coors Class Saturday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Clemson won the Coors Classic with a 77-67 win over Siena in the championship game.

Putnina, making her first start since a game at Cal State Fullerton on Dec. 7, 2006, led the Buffaloes with a career-high 15 points to go along with 12 rebounds. It's her third career double-double, all three of which have come when she's in the starting lineup. Putnina also added three steals and two blocked shots.

She has a way to go to catch McFarland's numbers, as the All-Big 12 forward registered career double-double No. 39 and her second-straight as she earned All-Tournament honors for the third time. McFarland had 12 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high seven assists. She's actually been closer to a triple-double has she had a school-record eight blocks to go along with a traditional points-rebound double-double in 2005 against South Dakota State.

Colorado shot an overall season-high 47 percent from the field and spread the wealth around as four players scored in double-digits and two others had seven or more. Senior **Susie Powers**, held scoreless for the first three games of the season, had 11 while freshman **Brittany Spears** had 10 points to go with seven rebounds and six assists.

Junior **Hannah Skildum** had eight points and four rebounds off the bench and **Kara Richards** pitched in seven on a perfect 3-of-3 from the field.

"Last night our look was a result of our shots not going down, and we were also struggling on the defensive end," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "But they were excited about this game and the tournament, and they went into this game with good energy. We knew that things were going to change and I thought they responded well from a very tough loss last night."

Colorado found itself down 13-4 right out of the gate. The Buffaloes, which shot just under 40 percent last night against Siena, made just 2-of-10 to start the game.

Colorado finally found its rhythm by embarking on a 13-0 run capped off by back-to-back 3-point field goals by McFarland and Spears to take a 17-13 lead with 9:18.

The good fortunes continued for the Buffaloes after their initial struggle. Colorado made 11-of-16 to close the half (69 percent) and at one point outscored the Owls 21-2 and led by as many 10 in the first 20 minutes.

Colorado pulled away quickly, beginning the second half on an 8-2 run to take a 47-33 lead and never let the advantage dip below 11.

Rice was led by guard Kadie Riverin who had 14 points, four rebounds and three assists en route to All-Tournament team honors.

BOULDER — When Colorado needed a shot in the arm to get going against Northern Colorado, the Buffs looked to their seniors to step it up, and they answered.

Forward **Jackie McFarland** scored a game-high 26 points and point guard **Susie Powers** had 12 points, eight assists and seven rebounds to lead Colorado to a 69-60 win over Northern Colorado Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado improves to 3-2 overall while the Bears fall to 3-3.

McFarland, who became the ninth player in team history to reach 1,400 career points (1,424), sparked a 23-4 first-half run to overcome a slow start by the Buffaloes. UNC hit its first four 3-point field goal attempts and built a 19-11 lead in the first 8:56 of the game.

Coming out of a media timeout with 10:56 remaining in the first half, McFarland took over. The All-Big 12 Conference performer scored 10 straight points capped off by a 3-pointer to give CU a 21-19 lead. After Kate Kevorken tied the game at 21, CU sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** kept the momentum by in the home team's favor by hitting three 3-pointers in a span of 2:17. **Caley Dow** and **Whitney Houston** finished off the run with back-to-back buckets to give the Buffs a 34-23 advantage.

Powers had six of her career-high eight assists in the first 20 minutes, two of which went to McFarland during her 10-0 run. Powers, whose 16 assists against only three turnovers this season leads the Big 12, scored nine of her career-best tying 12 points in the second half.

CU built its lead to 55-41 early in the second half as McFarland and Powers each hit a pair of 3-pointers during the run. UNC answered with six straight to cut CU's lead to eight, but Powers' third 3-pointer of the half sparked a 7-0 run to give the Buffs their largest lead of the game at 62-47.

The 3-pointer was a big weapon for the Buffs against UNC. CU made 13 from downtown, its most since a similar baker's dozen against Iowa State on Jan. 10, 2007. Colorado was 8-of-21 in the first half alone, with the 21 attempts breaking the school record of 20 attempts in one half set against Buffalo on Jan. 3, 2004. Colorado ended up at 13-of-36, with the 36 attempts just one short of the school record for a game which is 37 against Buffalo. CU, which had 10 3-pointers against Rice on Saturday, has hit double-digits in 3-pointers in back-to-back games for the first time in school history.

Sophomore **Aija Putnina** had a career-high 15 rebounds and tied a personal best with four blocked shots for Colorado, which held UNC to just 34 percent from the field. McFarland finished with eight rebounds and three blocks while shooting 8-of-11 from the field.

Whitley Cox led Northern Colorado with 21 points and five assists. Courtney Stoermer had 13 points and nine rebounds while Danielle Hagen had a team-high 12 rebounds.

BOULDER — Jackie McFarland scored 21 points, Brittany Spears matched her career high with 19 and Colorado upset No. 21 Wyoming 69-55 on Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado (5-2) snapped a 23-game losing streak against ranked opponents and ended a three-game series skid against the Cowgirls. CU's last win against a ranked opponent was a 69-59 win over then-No. 24 Baylor on Jan. 7, 2004. The Buffaloes were ranked 14th at the time. In ending that streak, the Buffs prevented Wyoming (6-1) from its first 7-0 start in nearly 30 years. Overall, CU has won four straight for the first time since winning five in a row in December of 2004.

Wyoming built a 14-7 lead as the Buffaloes made just three of their first 19 shots from the field. The Buffaloes then heated up as a pair of Bianca Smith 3-pointers and one by Spears capped off an 11-2 run to knot the game at 18-18. CU eventually held a 27-26 lead at the break.

Colorado opened it up early in the second half as Spears had eight points in a 10-0 run that gave CU a 50-38 lead with 10:54 remaining. Spears, who had 14 second-half points, capped the streak by hitting all three free throws after being fouled by Megan McGuffey on a 3-point attempt.

Wyoming responded to that surge with a 14-3 run that cut the Colorado lead to one at 53-52 with 5:11 left in the game. Smith answered for the Buffaloes with two consecutive 3-pointers that led to a 12-0 run, allowing CU to pull away.

McFarland had 15 points in the second half, including eight in the final 4 minutes. Smith ended with a season-high 16 points and also dished out three assists.

"I thought tonight's game came at a very pivotal time for us," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "I thought that we were coming off our best performance of the year (against CSU). To host a nationally ranked Wyoming team with such experience, was very pivotal. With this game we could have gone either way and I thought the timing of the game was good. Wyoming is a great team."

Susie Powers had another solid game for Colorado finishing with a career high nine assists and tying a personal best seven rebounds. The Buffaloes, who had averaged more than 20 turnovers in their first six games, committed a season-low 13. The Buffaloes had 21 assists on their 23 baskets and have 20-plus assists in three straight games for the first time since the 2001-02 season.

"This was a huge game for us for a lot of different reasons," McFarland said. "Wyoming is just as much as an instate rival as Colorado State is. To play them for three years and have not (defeated) them, is definitely the best win of my career. How this team plays when we have a ranked team in here, and to get a win is a sign that we are definitely moving up."

Colorado shot 61 percent in the second half and outscored Wyoming 42-29 in the final 20 minutes. Justyna Podziemska led the Cowgirls with 19 points, and Hanna Zavec scored 16.

McFarland had 15 points in the second half, including eight in the final 4 minutes.

Wyoming was off to its best start since going 8-0 to open the 1978-79 season. Colorado also handed the Cowgirls their first loss that season, too, 81-66.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Sophomore guard Bianca Smith scored a career-high 22 points off the bench, and Colorado held off No. 20 (AP)/17 (WBCA) Vanderbilt for a 62-51 win Sunday.

Colorado (6-2) has won five straight for the first time since the 2004-05 season and has wins over ranked teams in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2002 NCAA Tournament. CU defeated No. 22/21 Wyoming at home on Wednesday 69-55. Smith had 16 points off the bench in the win over the Cowgirls.

"(This week) has been a great confidence booster for me and the the whole team heading into the rest of the preseason," Smith said. "It's also motivating for us to continue to work hard, being able to see what we can do (against a ranked team)."

Much like the Wyoming game, Colorado built a sizeable second half lead, had it almost vanish, but recover and pull away at the end. The Buffaloes led 52-32 with 7:07 to play before the Commodores went on a 17-0 run to cut the lead to 52-49 with 3:01 remaining. But Colorado made 10 consecutive free throws in the final 1:47 to secure the victory.

"We are playing with a lot of confidence right now and that shows in our execution and the way in which we have prepared," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "Most importantly we've got five players on the floor that can make plays."

Jackie McFarland scored 12 points in a 27-5 run in the second half that helped the Buffaloes build a 20-point lead.

McFarland had 16 points for Colorado. Liz Sherwood led Vanderbilt (8-3) with 22 points. Redshirt freshman center Courtney Dunn, whose 6-4 size provided a key defensive match up against Sherwood, had five points and five rebounds.

Brittany Spears had eight points, a team-high seven rebounds and three steals.

Both teams struggled offensively in the first half, with Vanderbilt shooting 40.9 percent from the floor and Colorado 38.9, and the Buffaloes couldn't have imagined a worse start committing eight turnovers and missing two field goals on their first 10 possessions. Despite the turnovers, Vanderbilt could only build an 8-0 lead before the Buffaloes fought back.

Smith gave CU its first points with a long two with 13:54 remaining in the half and just kept on going. Smith scored 13 of CU's first 17 points on 5-of-7 shooting and her 3-pointer at the 7:57 mark gave the Buffaloes their first lead at 17-14.

Colorado struggled with turnovers early, but so did the Commodores. The Buffaloes had 15 in the first half, but Vandy nearly countered with 14. The Commodores were held scoreless for nearly nine minutes before Sherwood and Jennifer Risper scored consecutive baskets as Vanderbilt retook the lead at 18-17.

The Buffaloes were able to get to the free-throw line in the final minutes of the half as McFarland and Hannah Skildum hit four straight to give CU a 21-18 halftime lead. Later in the half, Vanderbilt went 8-34 without scoring. Colorado took advantage, as Smith scored 13 of the team's first 17 points, capped by back-to-back 3-pointers, to give the Buffaloes a 17-14 advantage.

BOULDER - Three players scored in double-digits and a solid defensive effort propelled Colorado to its seventh-straight win with a 57-43 decision over Dartmouth Friday night at the Coors Events Center.

Colorado (8-2) has its best record to begin a season and longest winning streak since its 2003-04 NCAA Tournament team won nine-straight during a 12-2 start.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** had a game-high 13 points and senior **Jackie McFarland** recorded her 41st career double-double by netting 12 points and 11 rebounds. Junior **Kara Richards** had season-highs with 11 points and seven rebounds while hitting a perfect 5-of-5 from the field.

The Buffaloes won their second-straight game with defense. Colorado shot just 39 percent and equaled its lowest offensive output of the season, but the Buffs defense held its own holding the Big Green 23 percent shooting. Colorado blocked 13 Dartmouth shots, the second-highest single-game total in team history trailing only a 16-block effort against Sam Houston on Dec. 14, 2000. Spears and McFarland led the way with four blocks apiece.

CU, which gave up just 29 points against Texas Southern in its last game, held an opponent under 50 points for the fourth time this season.

Dartmouth started off on the right foot as Koren Schram's third 3-point field goal of the first half gave the Big Green a 20-15 with 10 minutes left in the period.

Colorado started to come alive immediately after thanks to its bench. Sophomore Bianca Smith answered Schram just under a minute later with a 3-pointer of her own to begin a 20-4 Buffs run over the final 9:15 of the half. Richards had four of her seven first-half points during the run, but more importantly countered Dartmouth's ability to crash the boards.

After Dartmouth held a 14-8 rebounding edge early, seven of which came on the offensive end, Richards 6-4 size allowed the Buffaloes to even out the rebounding total by halftime and would eventually claim a 43-40 edge for the game.

Spears narrowly missed a double-double by corraling nine rebounds. Freshman Courtney Dunn had five.

Dartmouth scored the first five points of the second half to narrow the gap to six at 35-29, but Smith once again answered a Big Green run hitting a 3-point field goal. CU never allowed the lead to dip below seven after that, but cold shooting on both sides prevented either team from making any type of move. Colorado was 30 percent from the field in the second half while Dartmouth shot just 23 percent.

Schram and Kristen Craft each had 11 points to lead the Big Green.

BOULDER - Jackie McFarland scored 22 points and Brittany Spears added 17, guiding No. 25 Colorado to an 81-38 win over Southern Utah on Friday night.

The Buffaloes (9-2) have won eight straight games. The streak has helped vault the team into the top 25 for the first time in three years.

Southern Utah (2-9) lost its 30th straight road contest, including seven straight this season. The Thunderbirds haven't won on the road since a win over St. Mary's on Dec. 10, 2005.

With her 22-point outing, McFarland moved into eighth place on the Buffaloes' all-time scoring list. She now has 1,510 career points.

Bianca Smith came off the bench to score 12, including three 3-pointers. Ajla Putnina had six points and Susie Powers dished out seven assists.

Spears entered the game as the leading scorer among freshmen in the Big 12 Conference, averaging 13.3 points. She also had five rebounds and two steals.

Kaila Goff led Southern Utah in scoring with seven points. Anne Westwood, the Thunderbirds' leading scorer, finished with six points, and didn't score her first basket until early in the second half. She also had eight rebounds.

The Buffaloes closed the first half on a 13-0 run to take a 44-20 lead into the break. It's the third straight game the Buffaloes have closed the opening half on a big spurt, going on a 20-4 run in a win over Dartmouth and a 15-0 burst against Texas Southern.

Colorado started the second half where it left off, going on a 12-0 run to up the lead to 36 points. The Buffaloes led by as many as 43 points. The Thunderbirds finished with 21 turnovers, which is one below their season average.
