QUICKLY...The No. 11/10 University of Colorado Buffaloes (17-2, 6-1 Big 12) are back home in Boulder for the first time in two weeks this Wednesday, Feb. 4 at 7 p.m. to take on University of Nebraska Cornhuskers (14-5, 4-4 Big 12). The game will be carried live on the radio on KVCU 1190 AM with Tim Smile on play-by-play and Carol Callan on color analysis.

YOU REALLY DON'T HAVE TO SNEAK IN...One dollar will buy you long distance phone calls for 20 minutes, or a 40-minute game ticket to CU women's basketball against Nebraska. Feb. 4 is National Girls and Women in Sports Day, and to celebrate, CU is offering tickets to Wednesday's game for just \$1 for youth 18 and under as "Take A Kid To the Game Night." And as always, parking is free.

TRIBUTE TO SOX..The Buffaloes will wear a patch with the name "Sox" on their uniforms for the rest of the season in memory and in honor of former coach Russell "Sox" Walseth, who passed away on January 28 at the age of 77. Sox coached the CU women from 1980-83, compiling a record of 77-21, including an amazing 43-0 mark at the Coors Events Center. CU dedicated its 68-66 win over Mizzou to Sox.

SCOUTING THE BUFFALOES...Colorado returns eight letterwinners and welcomes five newcomers this season. Among the eight letterwinners are three returning starters in Big 12 Player of the Year candidate Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Maria Billingsley. Bjorklund is a consensus selection for preseason watch lists for every major award, including the Wade Trophy, Wooden Award and Naismith Award, and is the second-leading scorer in the Big 12 Conference. She's averaging a career-best 19.3 points per game and a career-best 7.5 rpg. CU's starting off-guard, Kate Fagan, shoots 43.7% from beyond the arc at 57-127 this season. Randie Wirt gets the nod at power forward and is CU's leading rebounder at 7.8 per game with four double-doubles this season. The point guard spot has been split between senior Maria Billingsley (1.7 ppg, 1.3 rpg) and CU's fourth-leading scorer this season, freshman Emily Waner (8.7 ppg, 25.7 mpg). Veronica Johns-Richardson rounds out the starting lineup, averaging 8.5 ppg and 3.1 rpg.

SCOUTING NEBRASKA...Nebraska senior guards Keasha Cannon-Johnson and Margaret Richards have been the Huskers' dynamic duo in the backcourt in 2003-04. Cannon-Johnson, a 5-10 guard from Kansas City, Kan., enters the Colorado game as the team's leading scorer and rebounder, averaging 11.7 points and 8.4 rebounds per contest, which ranks third in the Big 12. She has added 3.3 assists and 1.6 steals per game to rank second on the team in both categories.

LAST TIME OUT...Tera Bjorklund made two free throws in the final seconds and finished with 19 points to lead No. 11 Colorado to a 68-66 win over Missouri on Saturday. With the score tied at 66, Bjorklund was fouled by Christelle N'Garsanet with 4.7 seconds remaining and made both free throws. Kate Fagan scored 15 points, Randie Wirt 14 and Veronica Johns-Richardson 10 for Buffaloes (17-2, 6-1 Big 12), who improved to 16-1 when at least three players score in double figures.

JINX SCHMINX...For two-straight games, Colorado has gone on the road to a gym where a ranked opponent has lost in the previous tilt. First it was to Iowa State, where the Cyclones had knocked off No. 1 Texas Tech and No. 15 Oklahoma. Then it was Mizzou, where the Tigers were coming off a win over No. 20 Oklahoma.

I WILL SPELL IT OUT FOR YOU...Attention! Tera Bjorklund is a legit early favorite for Big 12 Player of the Year. Here's why: Second in the conference in scoring at 19.3 ppg, eighth in rebounding, first in field goal percentage. If you're still not convinced, then remember that her team is off to the second-best start in school history, the best start in school history in the Big 12, and she's leading the way. Stay tuned.

ROLLING ON THE ROAD...Colorado has won six-straight games on the road after losing their first at Minnesota in November. Overall, the red-hot Buffs are on a five-game win streak, the longest in the Big 12, and are tied for first place with No. 4 Texas.

PERFECT 10...Randie Wirt was a perfect 10 for 10 from the free throw line at Missouri and currently leads the Big 12 in conference games in free throw shooting at 95.6% (22-23) on the season. Both totals are career highs (attempts and makes).

BUFF ON A WIRE...CU has had its fair share of close wins this year en route to the second-best start in school history. On the season, CU is now 4-0 in games decided by 2-5 points, and CU is 2-0 in two point games.

FEELING THE LOVE...The Buffs are ranked No. 11 in the latest Associated Press Poll and No. 10 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. CU's mark of 11 is the highest for a CU team since they were No. 11 on Nov. 26,

NOTING THE NEBRASKA SERIES

THE SERIES...The Buffaloes lead the series with Nebraska 35-17, holding a 22-2 edge in Boulder, a 3-0 edge on neutral floors. The Huskers lead the series in Lincoln 15-10. CU has beaten the Huskers seven times in a row, dating back to the Boulder tilt during the 1999-2000 season. CU hasn't lost to Nebraska in Boulder since Feb. 13, 1985, a 85-60 loss. CU freshman Leslie Howard was born two days before that game, and she is the youngest player on the Buffalo team. Since that time, CU has won 19 consecutive meetings in the Coors Events Center. Prior to CU's sweep of NU in 2000-01, the teams had traded wins for eight-straight meetings with each team winning on their home court. Prior to Feb. 10, 2001, the last time either team had won on the opponent's home floor was Jan. 4, 1997 in Lincoln, a 65-58 CU win. CU's current seven-game win streak vs. NU matches the longest in series history.

NOTING THE POLLS...The Buffs check in this week at No. 11 in the Associated Press poll and No. 10 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. CU's highest regular season ranking in the past four seasons was No. 10 in March of 2002. This marks the 15th time CU has been ranked when the teams have met.

MAKING CONNECTIONS...Nebraska's Alexa Johnson was on the team of Big 12 All-Stars/USA Basketball team that traveled to Korea. Kate Fagan and Tera Bjorklund were CU's representatives on that squad.

YOU SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY...Well it's not, technically. But freshman Emily Waner will turn the big 1-9 at Midnight after the NU game.

LAST TIME OUT...Colorado (21-6, 11-5) was led by All-America candidate Tera Bjorklund, who finished with a game-high 22 points and helped Colorado to a 70-56 victory at Nebraska in the final regular season game last season. The 6-foot-5 center, was held to six points in the first contest between the teams in January, connected on 10 of her 17 field goal attempts to lead three players in double figures. On the evening, CU shot 52 percent from the field, including 7-of-14 from three-point range and enjoyed a slim 34-32 lead on the glass.

CAREER NUMBERS VS NEBRASKA...As is the case with most opponents, Tera Bjorklund has the best numbers against the Huskers, averaging 11.0 ppg and 5.3 rpg in six appearances and two starts.

2001. The No. 10 mark in the USA Today poll is the highest since reaching No. 9 in the final poll in 2001-02. CU was also rated No. 10 earlier that season in the Nov. 27 poll. It marks Colorado's 59th appearance in the top 10 of the coaches poll all time.

LEADING THE PACK...Colorado has a few leaders in the conference statistics. Tera Bjorklund leads the Jumbo Dozen in field goal percentage at 65.3% from the floor, and she's second in scoring at 19.3 ppg. Emily Waner leads in three point field goal shooting at 51.2%. Kate Fagan leads in free throw shooting at .886.

GOOD STARTS...This is Colorado's best start ever in the Big 12 Conference through seven games, currently sitting at 6-1. The previous best was 5-2, which the Buffs did in 2000-01 and 1996-97. The Buffs fought through 2-4, 2-4, and 1-5 starts from 1997-98 through 1999-2000 before opening the 2000-01 Big 12 season 5-1. In 2001-02 it was 3-3, but the Buffs went 11-5 in the conference that season.

GOOD STARTS PART II...CU's 17-2 record after 19 games is second only to a 18-1 open in 1992-93; it also matches one other 17-2 start (1994-95). In both 1981-82 and 1993-94 the Buffs were 16-2, but lost game No. 19. The 1994-95 team didn't lose until game No. 33, in the Elite Eight, finishing 30-3 on the season.

STREAKY...Kate Fagan's 22-game streak with at least one three pointer continues. Tera Bjorklund has played in 116 consecutive games in her career, the longest streak of any current player. Bjorklund, Amber Metoyer and Emily Waner are the only players on CU's roster that have played in every single game they've been eligible for.

DIFFERENCE MAKERS...It seems that the difference maker for CU in games won vs. games lost is the elusive third-leading scorer. When Colorado has three or more players score in double figures, they are 16-1 this season and were 23-1 last season. Which means CU is 2-8 over the past two seasons when two or less players score in double figures. Colorado's two leading scorers, Tera Bjorklund and Kate Fagan, are averaging double figures in both wins and losses. However, in Colorado's 17 wins, Randie Wirt is the Buffs' third leading scorer with 10.7 ppg.

DO I MAKE YOU RANDIE BABY YEAH?...Oh Austin. Senior forward Randie Wirt has stepped it up a notch this season overall, but especially in Big 12 play, averaging 10.3 ppg and a team-high 9.1 rpg in conference play. She's posted four double-doubles, to bring her career total to five. She's shooting 51.0% from the floor against conference opponents, as well as 95.6% from the free throw line.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL...Against Buffalo, Colorado set a new school record with 16 three pointers. With five different Buffs contributing to the mark (Fagan, Waner, Howard, Johns-Richardson and Nedovic) that included a new single half record of nine (second half). Fagan tied her own individual school record with seven, which she also tied previously this season vs. Harvard. They are hitting an average of 6.7 three's per game and shooting .387 as a team from downtown. Waner leads the Big 12 Conference in three point shooting with her 51.2% stroke.

SIMPLY...EN FUEGO...In extending its lead from 39-38 to 64-50 in the second half against Texas A&M, Colorado made 12-of-14 field goal attempts (85.7%; the Buffs made 15 of their last 18 shots in the game, 83.3%); that helped the Buffs to a season-best 60.4% shooting (29-of-48) from the floor. It marks the first time CU has shot over 60% in a game since clicking at 61.4% in an 86-65 win over LSU on Dec. 29, 2001.

MAKING THEIR OWN HISTORY...Colorado's nine game winning streak was the best the Buffs had since 1994-95 when CU won 25 consecutive games. Since then, the Buffs have had three different eight game winning streaks: 1996-97 (loss to Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament), 2001-02 (loss at Iowa State) and 2002-03 (loss at Kansas State). CU's current four game win streak is the best active streak in the Big 12.

ROAD WARRIORS...Colorado's Big 12 opening night win at No. 24 Baylor was Colorado's first over a ranked team in a road game since beating No. 13 Texas Tech 74-69 on Feb. 3, 2002. It was CU's eighth win in school history against a ranked team on the road. CU is 4-0 this year on the road in Big 12 action and 6-1 overall.

BLOWN AWAY...The Buffalo game marked the third time in school history that Colorado had won three straight games by 30 or more points. In addition to that run (71-39 over Wyoming, 80-45 over Syracuse and 98-47 Saturday over Buffalo), it also happened in 2001-02 (83-44 over San Diego, 96-44 over Bowling Green and 88-58 over Houston) and in 1980-81 (86-39 over Winnipeg, 83-49 over Utah and 134-33 over Fort Carson).

THE BUFFALOES REPRESENT...Colorado is a combined 23-2 over the past two seasons in non-conference play. CU's two losses were at No. 11 Minnesota and at home to Villanova in the 2002 Coors Classic. That's not the best in school history, however as CU went 21-1 in non-conference play from 1992-93 to 1993-94. The 1992-93 squad was undefeated in non-conference play, so the lone loss was in the fall of 1993, an 86-82 overtime loss at No. 1 Tennessee.

JUST PUT SOME WINDEX ON IT...All-American Tera Bjorklund has made improvements in almost every facet of her game, but this season her most notable improvement has been in rebounding. After averaging 6.8 last season, she's up to over 7.5 a game this year. She had a new single game career high with 15 at Kansas.

WANER FROM WAY BACK...Freshman guard Emily Waner hasn't had much trouble hitting from downtown early in her career. She finished the two experimental games going 7-14 from downtown, a .500 shooting percentage from three point land, and is currently 44-86 on the season for 51.2%.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS...Colorado is 54-2 in its last 56 games against unranked teams, dating back to the 2000-01 season. The losses were both last season to Villanova in the Coors Classic and at Missouri on Feb. 2.

COMEBACK KIDS...The CU comeback over Notre Dame after trailing 12-0 was the biggest deficit the Buffs have overcome since trailing Texas by 16 points on Feb. 19, 2000, and coming back to win the game 79-75. The Buffs scored 53 second half points in that one to come from behind led by Sabrina Scott with 24 points and 13 boards. Since then the Buffs have come from behind with a double-digit deficit to win three more times...first vs. Harvard at Minnesota when they trailed by as many as 15 and won by four, 85-81. Again it happened at CSU, when the Buffs trailed by 10 and won by seven, 81-74, and lastly vs. USC, trailing 12 at halftime and winning 69-67.

IS IT A CLUB IF YOU'RE THE ONLY MEMBER?...CU head coach Ceal Barry became the first coach in CU history to reach 400 wins with the Buff win over Idaho State. She currently boasts 496 total career wins, leaving her

WHAT'S COOLER THAN BEIN COOL?...She's more than just a witty former intern for Conan O'Brien: she's a dang good ball player too! Kate Fagan is having a solid senior season, averaging 14.4 ppg in 19 games. She's shooting 44.9% from beyond the arc with 57 threes on the season so far, in addition to 42-47 from the free throw line.

AMBER IS THE COLOR OF YOUR ENERGY...Sophomore Amber Metoyer has made leaps and bounds in her second season, averaging 6.7 ppg and 5.8 rpg. She recorded the first double-double of her career against Washington with 16 points and 12 rebounds in 26 minutes off the bench. She also got her first career start at USC.

GO AHEAD AND MOVE THE THREE POINT LINE BACK...The experimental 9-inch distancing of the three point line clearly wasn't a problem for the Buffaloes. Colorado was 12-for-25 from beyond arc in its opener, tying the CU school record for three's in a game, set twice (Jan. 13, 1999 vs. Iowa State and March 22, 2003 vs. BYU in the NCAA Tournament). Emily Waner (5), Kate Fagan (4) and Anna Nedovic (2) all helped the cause.

CHARGE!!!...Kate Fagan led the Buffs last year in charges taken, and is on the right track again this year with 18. She's taken at least one in 16 of 19 games this season.

NOT EXACTLY MARGINAL....In wins, the Buffs have an average scoring margin of +15.8, with an overall scoring margin of +12.0 per game.

LOST IN THE TRANSLATION...It's not a problem for Colorado, as between the 13 Buffaloes there are 10 different languages in the CU lockerroom. English, Swedish, Danish, Serbian, French, German, Spanish, Norwegian, American Sign Language, Hungarian.

YOUNG GUN...Emily Waner received her first career start at Minnesota, becoming the first true frosh since Randie Wirt to start a game for Colorado. She got her first home start against California.

CENTURY CLUB...It was a big weekend for Tera Bjorklund and Randie Wirt back home in Minnesota. Bjorklund played her 100th game as a Buffalo against Harvard, while Randie Wirt notched her 100th game against Minnesota on Sunday. Kate Fagan joined the club in the game against Southern California.

PLAYING WITH THE BIG DOGS...Historically, the Buffs are 47-81 against ranked opponents, and are 27-21 at home in the same scenario. With CU's win over Notre Dame in the second game of the season, the Buffaloes have wins over ranked opponents in 14-consecutive seasons. Colorado's biggest win ever over a ranked team came when unranked CU upset No. 16 Florida 98-62 in Boulder on Dec. 22, 2000, a 32-point win.

COLORADO UPSETS...In the 29 seasons of Colorado basketball, the Buffaloes have achieved upsets over 29 opponents. Colorado's most recent upset was November 15, 2003, 67-63 in overtime against No. 15 Notre Dame in Boulder.

HALFTIME TURNAROUNDS...It must have been some speech. Against Notre Dame, the Buffs allowed the Fighting Irish to open up a 12-0 lead. The Buffs used their stifling defense to get back in the game, and the result was an 18-point Irish second half. That ties for the seventh-fewest second half points for a CU opponent in program history.

THAT IS SO UNCOOL...Whitney Law became the first Buffalo in five years to suffer a season-ending ACL injury when she tore her anterior cruciate and medial collateral and meniscus (that's ACL and MCL and cartilage to you and me) against Minnesota at the Subway Classic. It's truly crummy for Law because she just finished sitting out a year after transferring from Georgia. Look at it this way: now she can maybe get a master's degree too.

DAZZLING DEBUT...Freshman Emily Waner wasted no time making an impact in a CU uniform, scoring a game high 17 points in the win over ODU. The 17 points are the third-most ever for a freshman in a debut (25, Lisa Van Goor; 19, Jamillah Lang; 17, Erin Scholz) and fifth most in a debut at CU. She made her first two buckets on her first two shots, both threes, one from the right baseline and one from the left. All told, she logged 31 minutes and finished 6-11 from the floor.

THERE MUST BE SOMETHING IN THE WATER...After Waner christened her kicks with a three on her first shot, classmate Anna Nedovic wasn't about to be outdone. Her first shot as a Buff: a three, nothing but net. Also not to be shown up was sophomore transfer Whitney Law, who made her first shot at CU...wait for it...a three. Four games later freshman Leslie Howard scored her first career bucket. Yeah, it was a three.

EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN...It took three years and 24.7 ppg in the 2003 NCAA Tournament, but the powers-that-be are sitting up and taking notice of Colorado's center of attention, senior Tera Bjorklund. After a selection to the All-Big 12 First Team last year, as well as the Big 12 All-Tournament team, she's been picked as a preseason All-American by the John R. Wooden Award and is on the watch list for the Wade Trophy as well. Her honors campaign website "The T In Team" is up and running for all the latest Tera news and information at <http://buffs.colorado.edu/tera/index.shtml>.

WADE WATCH, WADE WATCH...Not the same ring to it as Wayne's World. Eh. Well anyways, the WBCA has launched a website to follow the progress of this year's Wade Trophy Watch List types, of which Tera Bjorklund is one. It can be found at: <http://www.wbca.org/wadetrophyintro.asp>.

FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS...Coach Ceal Barry has a few of her former players in the coaching ranks this season. Former CU assistant Jen Warden is in her second season at Boise State University after working at Colorado for 10+ seasons. Also head coaching is Raegan Scott-Pebbley at Utah State University, which will start play this season for the first time since 1987. Lastly, there are four former Buffs that are assistant coaches: Linda Lappe (Drake), Benita Martin (Colorado State), Tracy Tripp (Denver) and Shelley Sheetz (San Diego).

CLIMBING THE CHARTS...Tera Bjorklund has made quick work of CU's statistical charts as a Buffalo. Last season, her 592 points were the most ever by a junior, and the fourth most ever by a Buff in a single season. Her single season average of 18.5 in 2002-03 was the third-best in school history. She's now third with 1,682 career points and will be aiming for Shelley Sheetz's 1,775 points and second place on the chart.

TOUGH OPENERS...The Buffs kicked off this season with their toughest early slate in school history, tipping off against four-consecutive NCAA Tournament participants from last season. The Buffs last opened with back-to-back NCAA teams in 1994-95, when they played Stephen F. Austin and San Diego State, both wins. The last time CU had three NCAA teams in the first four games was 1989-90, when they faced Providence, Illinois State and LSU in games 2, 3 and 4 that year. CU went 1-2 in those contests. This season also marked the first time in school history that CU opened the season with two games within the first four against teams in the Top 25.

WORLD TRAVELERS...Kate Fagan and Tera Bjorklund represented CU, the Big 12 and the United States on the USA Basketball World University Games this summer, which also doubled as the Big 12 All-Star team. The dynamic duo traveled to Daegu, South Korea with the rest of the All-Stars for three weeks in August.

PICKING FIGHTS WITH THE BIG DOGS...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing 10 2003 NCAA tournament teams. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as five members played in the NCAA a season ago, with Texas Tech making the Sweet 16 and Texas making the Final Four. The Buffs' opponents that danced last year: Old Dominion, Notre Dame, Harvard, Minnesota, Washington, Kansas State (twice), Texas, Oklahoma and Texas Tech. The Buffs will also take on WNIT participants Missouri, Baylor and Colorado State.

TURNING OVER A NEW LEAF...For the second this season, Colorado had a game in which the Buffs forced at least 30 turnovers. This season CU first did it against No. 5 Notre Dame, forcing the Irish to giveaway the ball 30 times, scoring 31 points on the freebies. The second time was against Cal, forcing 30 TO's again, scoring 21 points off of them.

CROWD CONTROL...CU has had success in the games with large groups of people present. Naturally, more of that success has come at home, where the Buffs are 17-9 with crowds of 5,500+. On the road, CU is 17-18 with 4,400+

fans, but 2-8 when there are 10,000 or more fans in the opposition's arena (it must be noted that on nine of those 10 occasions, the opponent was ranked). Take those 10 away, and CU holds their own at 13-8. The Buffs have proved themselves in front of a really big crowd, winning their first game ever in a visiting arena with 10,000+ with their OT win over Texas Tech in front of 13,123 fans in 2001-02, the biggest crowd CU has won in front of on the road. The win over Iowa State last season was in front of 10,222.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT...Colorado has six players, half the roster, that are left-handed! But not all of them shoot with their left hand. CU's lefties: Tera Bjorklund, Maria Billingsley, Cecily Jones, Sarah Lini, Whitney Law and Veronica Johns-Richardson. Just for measure, we'll include that assistant coach Tanya Haave is also a left-hander. That's pretty remarkable considering that statistics state that just 1 in 10 people are left-handed.

CU IN OT...With the win over Notre Dame in extra time on Nov. 15 of this season, Colorado moved to 15-15 in overtime games with a mark of 9-12 in road overtime games. The Buffs have played in overtime in back-to-back-to-back seasons. Five of CU's last six overtime games have been on the road, including double OT at Iowa State in 1997. CU is 4-1 in those last five road OT contests. Prior to the Notre Dame win on Nov. 15, the Buffs had not been taken to OT at home since the 1996 NCAA Tournament, when they lost to Auburn 68-61 on St. Patrick's Day.

CATCHING A LEGEND...Now in her 21st season at CU, Ceal Barry has now passed the late Russell "Sox" Walseth for the basketball record for a coach with the most seasons with an individual team. Walseth coached the CU men from 1957-76 for 20 seasons, then joined the women's team for a stint from 1980-83 for a total of 23 seasons between the two teams, the longest overall tenure for a CU basketball coach. Barry also just passed Walseth for the second-most games coached at Colorado. She's got 630, Sox had 604.

HALL OF FAMER...Colorado assistant coach and former Evergreen High School prep standout Tanya Haave was recently voted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame, one of the highest honors in the state. Her classmates include Patrick Roy, Terrell Davis and Bill Hanzlik.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 315-89 (.781) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 280-68 (.806). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 228-67 (.774) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 29 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s.

THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Net on Saturday mornings at 9:30 a.m. Hosted by Chuck Garfien, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS...Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Randie Wirt have been selected as the captains of the CU squad for the 2003-04 season. This marks the first time since 1999-2000 that the Buffs have rookie captains.

MOVE OVER BRIDGET JONES...Because the witty Kate Fagan has assumed official duties as CU's online diary writer for her second year. The Fagan Files, a feature on CU's website, will chronicle the season as experienced by Fagan, a fifth-year senior who has seen both the individual and collective ups and downs in her tenure thus far and has become one of the go-to players in Ceal Barry's starting lineup this year.

LOVE AND MARRIAGE...Buff guard Maria Billingsley is the atypical women's college basketball player. Why? She's 24, she's a native of Sweden and she's married. The former Maria Eriksson was married in December 2001 to Brent Billingsley, a former rodeo champion and graduate of Northern Arizona. She's also the oldest player on the CU roster and the only player NOT born in the 80's.

SHOWTIME...Colorado is scheduled to make a minimum of five regional or national television appearances this season, with the possibility of additional television if the Buffs advance in tournament play. Colorado is 2-1 this season on television (USC, W; Kansas State, L; Missouri, W)

2010...Colorado has won at least 20 games in a season 16 times in its history (29 seasons) and 12 times in Ceal Barry's 20-year tenure. The Buffs have also had at least 10 wins in the Big 12 four times in seven seasons.

THE WANER WAY...Well-adjusted? You be the judge. When asked what the biggest adjustment from high school to college has been, the Colorado native had this to say: "Time management and having the ability to address all the responsibilities you face daily. You have to budget your time to make sure you are prepared for everything. That means being mentally prepared for class, mentally and physically prepared for practice and disciplined enough to maintain good nutrition through all of that. Eat right, drink enough water during the day, and make sure you take the time throughout the day to get some homework done whenever the opportunity presents itself."

THE SECOND COMING OF KORDELL...I'VE GOT YOUR SLASH...Former Buff quarterback Kordell Stewart made a name for himself early in his NFL career as "Slash" since he was playing a little quarterback/wide receiver/running back. Well you can call Amber Metoyer the new Slash as she's playing some small forward/power forward/center. When CU backup center Cecily Jones went down with a partially torn ACL on Nov. 2, Coach Barry inserted Metoyer in at the post and liked her so much, she played there in the exhibition against South Dakota State. When the matchup is there, be looking for the 5-10 Metoyer to bang bodies in the post.

FOREIGN LEGION...Colorado boast four players from over there, three hail from what is technically Scandinavia. Maria Billingsley is a native of Sweden, Jasmina Ilic from Serbia, and Sarah Lini and Anna Nedovic come from Denmark. The four represent the most non-Americans on a CU roster ever.

BARRY SIGNS TWO PREPS TO LETTERS OF INTENT...Ceal Barry announced the signing of two high school seniors to Letters of Intent on Monday. Kara Richards, a 6-4 center from Graham, Texas and Jackie McFarland, a 6-3 forward from Derby, Kan. McFarland's sister Jessica plays at Kansas State.
