Records

Kansas is 9-15 overall (2-11 Big 12), and has lost six-straight. Colorado is 20-5 overall (9-4 Big 12) and is coming off a win over Oklahoma State.

Rankings

Kansas is not nationally ranked. Colorado is ranked No. 13 in both major polls.

Coaches

Kansas interim head coach Lynette Woodard is 1-6. Colorado head coach Ceal Barry is 416-220 in her 21st season at CU and 499-263 in her 25th year overall.

Quick Points

- ▶ Kansas is 9-15 overall after falling to Texas A&M 69-63 on Feb. 21 in Lawrence. Sophomore Tamara Ransburg came off the bench to lead KU with 15 points, 10 boards and four blocks.
- ▶ Ransburg currently is tied for fourth (Nikki White) all-time at Kansas with 113 career blocked shots. Sophomore Erica Hallman ranks 10th all-time at KU with 51 three-pointers made.
- ▶ Ransburg (15 pts., 10 rebs.) and sophomore Crystal Kemp (13 pts., 10 rebs.) both recorded double-doubles against Texas A&M, marking the second time this season two KU players have done so in a single game. The last time was in the first meeting with Colorado on Jan. 13. (Kemp 15 pts., 13 rebs. and Aquanita Burras 13 pts., 12 rebs.)
- ▶ KU's reserves have averaged 30.3 points per game in the last three games with Ransburg coming off the bench.
- ▶ Colorado owns the all-time series lead over Kansas 27-25 and has won seven straight.

Tonight's Game

The Kansas women's basketball team (9-15 overall, 2-11 Big 12) travels to Boulder, Colo., to play the Colorado Buffaloes (20-5 overall, 9-4 Big 12) on Tuesday, Feb. 24 at 8 p.m. in the Coors Events Center.

Kansas is coming off a 69-63 loss at the hands of Texas A&M, Saturday in Lawrence. KU was led for the third game in a row by sophomore Tamara Ransburg off the bench, who scored 15 points, pulled down 10 rebounds and blocked four shots. Sophomore Crystal Kemp added 13 points and 10 boards, and junior Larisha Graves added 12 points and four assists.

For the season, Kemp has averaged 13.2 points and 5.5 boards per game with a shooting percentage of 50.8 percent. Junior Aquanita Burras is second on the team with 10.3 points per game to go with 5.8 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game. Freshman Lauren Ervin is the Jayhawks' top rebounder with 6.8 caroms per contest. KU averages 61.8 points and 36.6 rebounds per game and shoots 42.5 percent from the field, while opponents are managing 65.5 points and 36.2 boards per game and shooting 41.2 percent from the field.

Colorado enters the game 20-5 overall (9-4 Big 12) and is coming off a 72-57 win over Oklahoma State. Against the Cowgirls, the Buffaloes were led by senior center Tera Bjorklund with 18 points and 14 rebounds. Three other CU players reached double-figure scoring.

Through 25 games, the Buffaloes are led by Bjorklund with 19.0 points and 7.7 boards per game. Senior guard Kate Fagan is the only other CU player in double figures with 13.2 points per game and senior forward Randie Wirt checks in with 9.9 ppg and 7.7 rpg. Colorado averages 71.6 points per game on 44.4 percent shooting and pulls down 35.0 rebounds per contest. The Buffaloes are allowing 63.1 points per game on 41.9 percent shooting, and 34.9 boards per game to opponents.

Colorado defeated Kansas 59-49 earlier in the season in Allen Fieldhouse, and the Buffaloes lead the all-time series 27-25. KU owns a record of 8-13 playing in Boulder, Colo.

Last Time Out

Kansas fell to Texas A&M, 69-63, in front of 976 fans in Allen Fieldhouse Saturday night. The loss dropped the Jayhawks' record to 9-15 overall and 2-11 in the Big 12 Conference, while Texas A&M improved to 9-16 overall and 2-12 in the conference.

The game was back-and-forth throughout the entire first half with both teams exchanging baskets. Texas A&M held its largest lead of the first of five points at the 17:20 mark when it led 9-4. The Jayhawks held their largest lead of two points in the first half when they led, 32-30, as the horn sounded for halftime.

Kansas was led by sophomore Tamara Ransburg's 15 points and 10 rebounds. It was her third consecutive double-figure scoring game and third double-double of the season. Sophomore Crystal Kemp tossed in 13 points on 6-of-13 shooting and 10 rebounds, and junior Larisha Graves added 12 points and four assists.

In the first eight minutes of the second half, KU stretched its lead to as many as nine points using a 12-5 run. The Aggies, who had three players finish in double-figure scoring including senior guard Toccarra Williams with 21 points on 7-of-20 shooting from the field, responded with a 13-4 run over the next four minutes to tie the game at 48. The two teams exchanged baskets and remained tied at the 5:14 mark, 51-51.

A&M finished the game outscoring Kansas 8-3 over the last three minutes and held on for a 69-63 win at the final buzzer.

Kansas made a season-high 22 free throws on the night, and held a narrow 45-44 advantage on the boards.

A Quick Look At the Jayhawks

Kansas has used seven different starting lineups this season with the combination of Erica Hallman, Crystal Kemp, Nichelle Roberts, Aquanita Burras and Larisha Graves getting the nod the last three times out. Kaylee Brown, Lauren Ervin, Leila Mengüç, Tamara Ransburg, Sharita Smith and Blair Waltz have all also made at least one start. Burras and Kemp are the only two players to start every game.

KU returns five starters from 2002-03, and seven players total, who accounted for over 90 percent of the scoring and rebounding last season. Back in the Kansas frontcourt is the 2002-03 team MVP Ransburg, Kemp and Nichelle Roberts. Returning in the backcourt are Waltz, Burras, Mengüç and Hallman. Redshirt freshman Alicia Rhymes also returns for her first season on the court.

Kansas' five newcomers were rated as the 21st-best recruiting class in the nation by All Star Girls Report. KU bolstered the guard position with additions of freshman Sharita Smith, Brown and Graves. At the forward spot, KU added freshman Lauren Ervin and junior Kandis Bonner.

Interim Coach Lynette Woodard

After four and a half seasons as assistant coach, Lynette Woodard patrolled the KU sidelines as interim head coach for the first time against Oklahoma State. A four-time Kodak All-American and the all-time women's collegiate scoring champion, Woodard is the most storied player in the history of Kansas women's basketball. After playing for Marian Washington from 1978-81, Woodard enjoyed a successful professional playing career overseas, for the Harlem Globetrotters and in the WNBA. She also played for numerous U.S. National teams. Last year, Woodard was in attendance when the Harlem Globetrotters were inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame. Woodard was named as one of 16 finalists to be inducted individually as a player into the Naismith Hall of Fame on Feb. 15.

Tonight's Opponent - Colorado

Kansas travels to Boulder, Colo., for a rematch with the Colorado Buffaloes on Tuesday, Feb. 24 at 8 p.m. in the Coors Events Center. The Buffaloes enter the game with a 20-5 record (9-4 Big 12) after defeating Oklahoma State 72-57 on Saturday in Boulder.

The Buffaloes are led by senior center Tera Bjorklund with 19.0 points and 7.7 rebounds per game. Senior guard Kate Fagan adds 13.2 points and a team-leading 3.0 assists per outing.

Last game against Oklahoma State, CU upended the Cowgirls with three-point shooting and free throw accuracy. The Buffaloes nailed nine three pointers, including four from Fagan, and connected on 17-of-21 free throws. Bjorklund pumped in 18 points and grabbed 14 rebounds. Three other CU players reached double figures.

Despite the win over OSU, Colorado is going through its roughest patch of the season, losing three of its last five games to nationally ranked Big 12 opponents.

For the season, CU is scoring 71.6 points per game on 44.4 percent shooting and pulling down 35.0 rebounds per game. Colorado opponents have averaged 63.1 points and 34.9 rebounds and shot 41.9 percent.

Buffalo coach Ceal Barry is 416-220 in her 21st year at CU and 499-263 in her 25th year overall.

Colorado leads the all-time series over Kansas 27-25, and owns a 13-8 mark in games played in Boulder. CU has won the last seven matchups including earlier this season when the Buffaloes defeated the Jayhawks 59-49 on Jan. 13 in Lawrence.

Back From 2002-03

Kansas returns seven players and five starters from last year's team that finished 11-18 overall and 3-13 in the Big 12. Leading the returners is 2002-03 team MVP sophomore Tamara Ransburg who averaged 10.9 points and 7.8 rebounds for KU last year. Other returning starters include senior guard Leila Mengüç, junior guard Blair Waltz, junior guard Aquanita Burras and sophomore forward Crystal Kemp. Kemp Gaining Consistency

The versatile sophomore Crystal Kemp is only one of two players to start all 24 games for KU and leads the team with 13.2 points per game. The smooth lefty from Topeka, Kan., set a goal to become a more consistent player which she has done. She has scored in double figures in 19 games and is shooting 50.8 percent from the field. She possesses an impressive array of post moves and can also knock down the open jumper. Notched her fifth 20+ point game in the Oklahoma State win. Posted double-doubles against Colorado and Texas A&M.

Burras Doing The Dirty Work

Perhaps Kansas' top all-around player, junior Aquanita Burras does the little things with hustle and intense defense. She is third on the team with 5.8 rebounds per game and tied for second with 48 offensive boards. Her 48 steals rank first on the team and she is shooting just under 45 percent from the field. She exploded for a career-high 24 points against Ball State and is second on the team in scoring with 10.3 points per game. Notched her second 20-point game at Baylor when she scored 21. The only current player to have started every game in her career.

Ransburg Quietly Playing Effectively

Sophomore Tamara Ransburg is back for her second year as the Jayhawks' center after being named the team MVP as a freshman. She is posting 9.1 points and 6.1 boards per game while leading the team with 45 blocked shots. Her 46 steals rank second on the team. She currently ranks fourth all-time at KU with 113 career blocks. Ransburg has double-doubles this season against Ball State, Nebraska and Texas A&M. Scored a season-high 19 points at OU. Has had three of her finest showings this season coming off the bench in the last three games.

Graves Takes Over At Point

Junior transfer Larisha Graves has started 22 of 23 games she has played at point for KU and averages 2.9 assists per game. Graves sees the court very well and has the ability to settle the team down and get the offense started. She excels at penetrating and finding the open player or pulling up for the mid-range jumper. Also a hard-nosed rebounder as she pulls down 3.4 boards a game. She has scored in double figures in seven games. Notched a career high 17 points at Nebraska, and averages 6.9 points per game.

Hallman Still Steady

Sophomore Erica Hallman has played in all 24 games and started 11 contests. She provides KU with a solid ball-handling and long-range shooting option. She has hit 26-of-70 three-pointers and owns the team's best assist-to-turnover ratio (1.8-to-1). Her 51 career three-pointers rank 10th all-time at Kansas.

Ervin Making An Impact

Freshman Lauren Ervin has been impressive operating off the Kansas bench. She has posted five double-figure scoring games and leads the team with 6.8 rebounds per game. She is shooting 54.1 percent from the field and her 29 blocked shots rank second on the team. An active rebounder who runs the floor well and handles the ball well on the perimeter. Has pulled down double-figure rebound totals in two contests. Led KU in rebounding 11 times.

Waltz Provides Leadership And Balance

Junior Blair Waltz is one of only two players to suit up for KU for more than one season prior to this season. Waltz has played in 23 games with nine starting assignments and has played an all-around game with 4.0 points and 1.6 boards per game. Stepped up to tie a season-high 14 points in the first game with KSU.

Mengüç Back For Senior Season

Kansas' only senior, Leila Mengüç, is back for her final season at point guard. Mengüç started the season-opener and contributes 0.5 points and 0.5 rebounds per game. She is one of six foreign players to play at KU all-time.

Bonner A Bruising Presence

Junior transfer Kandis Bonner adds a physical presence to the KU frontcourt. She possesses a nice touch around the basket and quick feet. She is adding 2.3 points and 1.3 boards per outing and is shooting 47.6 percent from the floor. Had an impressive six points and four boards in only six minutes the second game against KSU.

Brown Adds Intangibles

Sophomore guard Kaylee Brown has played in 22 games with five starts. A hard-nosed player, Brown is not afraid to sacrifice her body to take a charge. A patient player who sees the floor well. Has the ability to score from long range, although she has struggled from beyond the arc of late. Owns an average of 2.6 ppg.

Roberts Gets It Done

Sophomore forward Nichelle Roberts is one of the hardest workers on the team. She has played in 22 games and made three starts. She sees just 5.1 minutes per game, but makes the most of those minutes with rebounding and defense. Always seems to be around the ball after a missed shot. An underrated free throw shooter. Averages 0.4 points and 1.2 boards per game.

Smith Steps Up

Freshman Sharita Smith has played sparingly this season, but had the best game of her career against ISU when she pumped in nine points to go with a board, an assist and a steal. She posts 1.8 points and 0.8 boards per game.

Freshman Lauren Ervin proved in her first collegiate game that she can flat out play. Against UMKC on Nov. 21, Ervin led the Jayhawks with 14 points and seven rebounds in addition to posting two blocks and a steal. The Inglewood, Calif., native was near perfect from the field, sinking 5-of-6 field goals and draining all four of her free throw attempts. Since then, she has continued her impressive play and picked up her first collegiate honor by being named to the Holiday Inn Jayhawk Classic All-Tournament Team.

Woodard Named A Finalist For Naismith Memorial Hall Of Fame

Kansas four-time Kodak All-American and current interim head Lynette Woodard has been named as one of 16 finalists for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, as announced on Feb. 15. The Class of 2004 will be announced on Monday, April 5 at a news conference in San Antonio, Texas, prior to the NCAA Men's Championship Game.

Trip To Mexico Proves Beneficial

The Jayhawks got a jumpstart to the season over the Labor Day weekend by taking a short trip to Monterrey, Mexico, where the team went 4-0. The trip additionally allowed Kansas 10 days of practice leading up to the weekend. In Mexico, the coaches and players were able to start coming together both on and off the court. Five players averaged double-figure scoring led by sophomore Crystal Kemp with 22.0 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. Also in double figures was junior Blair Waltz with 14.0 ppg, sophomore Tamara Ransburg with 13.3 ppg,

junior Kandis Bonner with 13.0 ppg and junior Aquanita Burras with 10.3 ppg. Freshman Lauren Ervin was spectacular on the boards, leading the team with 11.0 rebounds per game to go with 9.5 points per contest.

Building For The Future

Kansas signed Taylor McIntosh of Wichita, Kan., during the early signing period. McIntosh, a 5-11 guard, has led Wichita Heights High School to two-straight Kansas 6A state championships.

Washington Coaches 900th Game

Head coach Marian E. Washington reached another milestone when she coached her 900th game against No. 24 Oregon in the Oregon Classic on Nov. 28. Coaching against Bev Smith, one of her 2004 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame classmates, KU was edged 54-51. In honor of the milestone, and to the surprise of Washington, each KU player wore a wristband with "900" stitched into it.

Washington On Medical Leave

After 30 and a half years without missing a game, Kansas head coach Marian Washington took a medical leave of absence beginning on Jan. 29. One of the true legends in the history of women's basketball, she will soon be able to add "Hall of Famer" to her name when she is inducted in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in June. Washington ranks in the top 15 among active women's basketball coaches with 551 career victories entering the 2003-04 season. Washington helped pave the way for young women across the country as both a player and a coach. In her tenure, KU has captured seven conference titles, six league tournament titles, four All-Americans and three Academic All-Americans. Many players and coaches under Washington have gone on to playing and coaching careers in the WNBA, at other universities and at the high school level. Washington has been honored with league Coach of the Year in 1992, 1996 and 1997. Under Washington, KU also had the distinction of winning the last Big Eight title and first Big 12 title. Washington said the following at her Jan. 29 press conference announcing her medical leave:

"Obviously, I have been dealing with some health issues for quite some time. When you are in this business for as long as I have been, you tend to dismiss yourself because your commitments are to your players, your University and your program. I have tried to do that. This morning I met with Lew (Perkins). Most of you that know me, you know this is a difficult time -- mainly for my players. I am hopeful everything will be okay. I am going to do everything I can to take care of myself, which is long overdue. Even though my players have been stunned a bit, they have been very supportive. My staff is awesome. I want you to know they will work extremely hard for this program and for those young people. I have all the support in the world for Lynette Woodard. She is 'Miss Kansas.' Without a doubt, she will do everything in her power to continue getting our program to move forward."

KANSAS CITY, Mo. -- Despite 14 points and seven rebounds by freshman Lauren Ervin in her career debut, the Kansas women's basketball team fell to UMKC 63-50 in the teams' season opener Friday night at the Swinney Recreation Center in Kansas City.

The loss snapped KU's four-game season-opener win streak and makes the 'Hawks 14-6 in openers on the road under head coach Marian E. Washington.

Ervin was 5-6 from the field and 4-4 from the charity stripe and added two blocks and a steal in only 16 minutes of play. Crystal Kemp added eight points and six rebounds with eight other Jayhawks chipping in at least two points. Ervin, Kaylee Brown, Larisha Graves and Kandis Bonner made their career debuts in tonight's contest.

The Jayhawks were 0-5 from behind the arc and shot just 33.9 percent from the field. KU outrebounded the Kangaroos 40-36 and outblocked them 7-3 in the loss. The 'Hawks dominated in the paint, scoring 34 of their 50 points in the post, but committed 22 turnovers. KU scored just 25 points in each half.

The Kangaroos were led by Carlai Moore and Casey Ellis, who posted 16 points each in the win. Moore added 11 rebounds and five steals for UMKC, who is 1-0 on the season. UMKC shot 42.6 percent from the floor and 50 percent from behind the arc.

Despite the loss, KU still leads the all-time series advantage against UMKC 9-3.

EUGENE, Ore. -- In a thrilling seesaw battle between the University of Kansas women's basketball team and the No. 24 University of Oregon Ducks, the Jayhawks fell 54-51 at McArthur Court on Friday night. KU fell to 0-2 on the season while Oregon moved to 4-0.

After a disappointing effort in the season-opener at UMKC, the Jayhawks - led by head coach Marian E. Washington in her 900th career game on the KU sideline - came out on fire on Friday and led the nationally-ranked Ducks 7-0 through the first three minutes of the game.

Kansas used a balanced attack with Crystal Kemp notching 11 points, Kaylee Brown scoring nine points and Tamara Ransburg and Aquanita Burras pitching in eight apiece. Ransburg added eight rebounds and two blocked shots and Burras had seven boards.

In a game that saw six lead changes and four ties, Kansas took its last lead, 47-46, at the 2:10 mark on a lay-up by Kemp. The Ducks answered back with a lay-up from Brandi Davis at the 1:44 mark to take a 48-47 lead and then proceeded to hit six free throws to seal the game.

Kansas out shot Oregon from the field 38.6 percent (22-57) to 29.6 percent (16-54), but it was 18 Duck free throws compared to four Jayhawk free throws that proved to be the difference.

Davis and Andrea Bills paced Oregon with 14 points apiece while Catherine Kraayeveld was held to 10 points, well under her season average of nearly 20 points per game.

In honor of Coach Washington's 900th game, each player on the team wore a wristband with "900" printed on it.

With perfect shooting from junior Larisha Graves, sophomore Crystal Kemp and junior Aquanita Burras, the Jayhawks nailed their first eight shot attempts and led 14-7 at the first media timeout. The Bears clawed back as the two teams exchanged leads four times and Kansas led 40-37 at the half.

For the first 12 minutes of the second half, Kansas and Baylor continued to battle back and forth. Kansas held its last lead of 59-58 at the 10:22 mark, before Baylor went on a 27-7 run beginning at the 8:44 mark to win going away.

Kansas had two players hit the 20-point mark for the first time this season as Kemp dropped in 21 points and Burras hit for 20. Graves came up one short of a career-high with 12 points. Burras led the way on the glass with eight rebounds.

Baylor had three players with 20+ points including Steffanie Blackmon with 23, Jessica Stratton with 21 and Sophia Young with 20. Young grabbed 11 rebounds for the Lady Bears.

Baylor shot 51.7 percent from the field while KU shot 45.0 percent. Kansas led on the backboards, pulling down 34 rebounds compared to 28 for BU. The game was the first this season that Kansas led at halftime but did not win the game.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- Kansas fell to Missouri, 76-49, in Allen Fieldhouse in front of 2,877 fans. The loss drops the Jayhawks' record to 8-9 overall and 1-5 in the Big 12 Conference, while Missouri improves to 10-6 overall and 1-4 in the conference.

"This was a disappointing ballgame for us," head coach Marian Washington said. "I think Missouri came and did a very good job at being aggressive today."

The Jayhawks took the early lead, 2-0, eight seconds into the game, on a jumper by sophomore Tamara Ransburg, who grabbed a team-leading nine rebounds. The Tigers answered with a 16-4 run over the next 10 minutes, pushing their lead to as many as 10 points at the 9:13 mark.

Kansas, led by sophomore Crystal Kemp's 14 points and Ransburg's season-high five blocks, cut the Missouri lead to six before MU, which had four players in double-figures, ended the first half on a 13-6 run, and took a 33-20 lead into halftime.

In the second half, KU cut the Missouri lead to six points at the 15:02 mark, but it was as close as the Jayhawks would get. The Tigers, who had two players record double-doubles in senior Evan Unrau (19 points, 14 rebounds) and senior Stretch James (13 points, 11 rebounds), went on a 19-4 run over the next seven minutes to extend their lead to 23 points, 61-38.

MU finished the game outscoring Kansas 15-11 over the last eight minutes and held on for a 76-49 win at the final buzzer.

Kansas swatted a season-high 12 shots in the game, which ties for third all-time at KU. Freshman Lauren Ervin contributed a career-high four blocks as well as 10 points on 5-of-5 shooting from the field.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- The University of Kansas women's basketball team fell to Texas A&M, 69-63, in front of 976 fans in Allen Fieldhouse Saturday night. The loss dropped the Jayhawks' record to 9-15 overall and 2-11 in the Big 12 Conference, while Texas A&M improves to 9-16 overall and 2-12 in the conference.

"We felt like we should have won this ballgame," interim head coach Lynette Woodard said. "We had point-blank lay-ups, missed free throws. We lost a couple of defensive assignments, and were punished for it."

The game was back-and-forth throughout the entire first half with both teams exchanging baskets. Texas A&M held its largest lead of the first of five points at the 17:20 mark when it led 9-4. The Jayhawks held their largest lead of two points in the first half when they led, 32-30, as the horn sounded for halftime.

Kansas was led by sophomore Tamara Ransburg's 15 points and 10 rebounds. It was her third consecutive double-figure scoring game and third double-double of the season. Also contributing for the Jayhawks was sophomore Crystal Kemp who tossed in 13 points on 6-of-13 shooting from the field and 10 rebounds, and junior Larisha Graves with 12 points and four assists.

In the first eight minutes of the second half, KU stretched its lead to as many as nine points using a 12-5 run. The Aggies, who had three players finish in double-figure scoring including senior guard Toccara Williams with 21 points on 7-of-20 shooting from the field, responded with a 13-4 run over the next four minutes to tie the game at 48. The two teams exchanged baskets and remained tied at the 5:14 mark, 51-51.

A&M finished the game outscoring Kansas 8-3 over the last three minutes and held on for a 69-63 win at the final buzzer.

Kansas made a season-high 22 free throws on the night, and held a narrow 45-44 advantage on the boards.

Woodard was named the interim head coach for the Jayhawks. Woodard was in her fifth year on Washington's staff after joining the Jayhawk coaching staff as an assistant coach in May of 1999. Woodard retired from professional basketball after nearly 20 years of playing in leagues around the globe including her final stop, the WNBA.

A native of Wichita, Kan., Woodard was a four-time Kodak All-American and a two-time Academic All-American from 1978-81. While at KU, Woodard set numerous national and school records that she still holds today. She is the most prolific scorer in women's college basketball history with 3,649 points. Her 1,572 career field goals and 2,994 field goal attempts also still stand as the most in women's college basketball history. She still holds eight school career records including points, field goals, field goal attempts, rebounds (1,714), free throws made (505), free throws attempted (743), steals (522) and games played (139).

As an assistant, Woodard's responsibilities included assisting with practice sessions, recruiting prospective student-athletes, scouting and game preparations.

Prior to moving into the role of assistant coach, Woodard spent a year as the Special Assistant for External Relations and Women's Basketball. Woodard worked on a department-wide basis to enhance and build community and alumni relations. Woodard also assisted with various events which included women's basketball projects, administration of special events, including the Jayhawk Commerce Bank Classic, coaches' clinics and honorary coaches programs as well as coordinating video and film exchange.

While at Kansas, Woodard played for several national teams including the Select team in 1978, the 1979 Spartakiade Games team and the gold-medal winning World University Games Championship team later in 1979. Woodard was also selected to the 1980 Olympic team the summer before her senior season but that team did not play because of the U.S. boycott.

After her playing days as a Jayhawk were over, Woodard headed to an Italian women's professional basketball league where she led the league in scoring. After a two-year stint in Italy, Woodard returned to the United States to concentrate on training for the 1984 Olympic Games. Woodard captained the 1984 squad that captured gold in Los Angeles. Following the 1984 Olympic Games, Woodard made history by becoming the first female Harlem Globetrotter and toured with the team for two years before returning to competition. Woodard rejoined the USA World University Games team which would claim gold once again. The Big Eight Player of the Decade (1980s) then travelled back overseas to play three years in a professional women's basketball league in Japan.

In 1992, Woodard became athletic director for the Kansas City, Mo. School District for two years before moving to New York to become a registered Stockbroker for Magna Securities Corp. In 1997, Woodard was a WNBA elite draft selection going to the Cleveland Rockers where she played

one year prior to playing for the Detroit Shock in 1998. In addition to serving as a KU assistant coach, Woodard also works as an independent representative of Primerica Financial Services.

Marian E. Washington

Head Coach • West Chester State '70 • 31st Season • 559-356 (.612)

Over 550 career victories, seven conference titles, six league tournament titles, four All-Americans, 11 NCAA tournaments, two Sweet 16 finishes, three conference Coach of the Year awards, a mentor for seven WNBA players, the first African-American to coach a US national team against international competition, a coach of a gold-medal winning US Olympic Team, the list of accomplishments for University of Kansas women's basketball coach Marian E. Washington sometimes seems endless. As a leader and achiever, Washington has paved the way for young women across the nation.

In her 31st season at the helm of the Jayhawks, Washington brings a wealth of success, experience and tradition paralled by few. Not only is Washington the dean of the Big 12 coaches, but the West Chester, Pa., native ranks sixth on the NCAA Active Coaching Longevity list after coaching 30 seasons and a combined 898 games. Washington has guided KU onto the NCAA Top 25 of Women's Division I Basketball All-Time Victory List after compiling a 551-347 overall record and a 178-1130 record in conference action in her first 30 years.

Her life and career are so impressive that her latest honor comes as no surprise. At the 2003 Black Coaches Association Convention, Washington was honored with the BCA Lifetime Achievement Award

Over the last 17 years, Washington has led KU into the postseason 12 times, including 11 NCAA Tournament appearances and a WNIT berth. The 'Hawks, who have gone to the Big Dance nine times, including two Sweet 16 finishes in the last 12 seasons, have recorded 20-plus win seasons in 11 of the last 14 years. In fact, Washington-led teams have recorded 20-plus win seasons 17 times overall, including a 30-win season in 1978-79.

Before NCAA play, Washington guided three teams through extensive AIAW post season play. Under Washington, KU advanced to the AIAW Sectionals in 1979, 1980 and 1981. In 1978, the Jayhawks competed in the WNIT.

In her 30 years as head women's basketball coach at KU, Washington has amassed numerous honors and is highly respected and recognized for her efforts in the field. Washington has established KU as one of the most successful programs in women's basketball history, all while capturing seven league titles and three conference tournament championships. Teams under Washington's guidance have experienced 20 winning seasons in the last 30 years and she has been instrumental in building the KU women's basketball program as well as women's athletics across the nation.

During the 1998-99 season, the Jayhawks defeated Oklahoma, 58-54 on Feb. 20, making Washington just the fifth active coach to win 500 games at one school. In 1998-99, Washington guided her Jayhawks to a 23-10 record while they earned their eighth consecutive berth into the NCAA tournament. During the 1997-98 campaign, Washington's youth-laden Jayhawks advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament and to the championship game of the Big 12 Tournament. The campaign also marked the ninth straight year that Washington and her team had recorded 20-plus wins in a season.

In 1997, Washington was awarded the Big 12 Coach of the Year honor after guiding her Jayhawks to the first Big 12 title with a 14-2 league record. In 1996, Washington's successful coaching efforts earned her a spot on the Olympic coaching staff as an assistant coach. Together with the Women's Dream Team, Washington and the highly talented group of women representing the United States won the gold medal in Atlanta. Following her stint with the Olympic team, Washington was named as the recipient of the William I. Koch Outstanding Woman of the Year, recognizing a Kansas woman who achieves local or national success.

Washington was named the 1996 Big Eight and Black Coaches Association Coach of the Year after leading the Jayhawks to the Big Eight title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. After defeating Middle Tennessee State and Texas, respectively, in the first and second rounds of the 1996 NCAA Tournament, Washington and the Jayhawks advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time in the program's history.

Washington was named the 1992 BCA Women's Coach of the Year, Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year and the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association Women's Coach of the Year.
