**QUICKLY...**The No. 17/16 University of Colorado Buffaloes (22-7) will travel to Santa Barbara, Calif., as the No. 6 in the East Region of the 2004 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. This is CU's fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and 12th overall. Colorado will take on the host and No. 11 seed UC Santa Barbara Fagan and Maria Billingsley (19-11) on Saturday, March 20 at approximately 9:30 p.m. MST at the UCSB Thunderdome. The game will be carried live on 760 AM with Tim Smile on play-by-play and Jan Whitbeck on color analysis. The game will be broadcast on ESPN 2 with Dave Strader (play-by-play) and Krista Blunk (color commentary). The winner of the CU/UCSB game will play the winner of No. 3 seed Houston and No. 14 seed Wisconsin-Green Bay on Monday, March 22. The game will be broadcast live on www.cubuffs.com and is free.

**SCOUTING THE BUFFALOES...**Colorado returns eight letterwinners and welcomes five newcomers this season. Among the eight letterwinners are three returning starters in Kodak All-America finalist Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Maria Billingsley. Bjorklund is a consensus finalist for every major national player of the year award, including the Wade Trophy, Wooden Award and Naismith Award, and is the leading (active) scorer in the Big 12 Conference. She's averaging 18.2 points per game and a career-best 7.8 rpg. CU's starting off-guard, Kate Fagan, shoots 43.6% from beyond the arc at 79-181 this season. Randie Wirt gets the nod at power forward and is CU's leading rebounder at 8.0 per game with seven double-doubles this season. The point guard spot has been split between senior Maria Billingsley (2.2 ppg, 1.4 rpg) and CU's fifth-leading scorer this season, freshman Emily Waner (7.2 ppg, 25.8 mpg).

**COLORADO'S SEEDING AND REGIONAL HISTORY...**Following is where the selection committee has placed Colorado in previous years. CU has been in the West Region six times, the Midwest Region four times, the Mideast one time and now the East region one time in the 12 trips the Buffaloes have made to the NCAA. CU's highest seed in the tournament was a No. 1 in 1995, and their lowest was a No. 7 in both 1988 and 1992.

**CU IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS...**This should be Colorado's 12th trip to the Big Dance, where the Buffs have posted a record of 17-11. They have advanced to the tournament as the Big 12's automatic bid one time, 1997, and were the Big Eight's automatic bid in 1989, 92, 95 and 96. They were at-large selections in 1988, 93, 94, 2001, 02, 03 and again in 2004. Here's a quick summary of the Buffs' NCAA results by year and by game:

**THEIR DANCE CARD IS FULL...**With this year's bid to the Big Dance, CU has had every single recruiting class since 1984 extended at least one invite. That's 20-straight classes. The senior class earns their fourth straight bid in four years here, the first class to do so since the classes of 1995,96 and 97 and just the fourth in school history.

**SECOND TIME FOR EVERYTHING...**Tera Bjorklund was named to First Team All-Big 12 by the league's coaches for the second-straight year. Last year she was CU's first ever first team selection since the inception of the Big 12 Conference. She joins Lisa Van Goor and Shelley Sheetz as the only three players in CU history to be named First Team All Conference in more than one season. Van Goor did it from 1981-83 (Intermountain and Big Eight), Sheetz did it from 1993-95 (Big Eight).

**NOTING THE UCSB SERIES...** Colorado and UCSB have met three previous times, with the Gauchos holding the edge 1-2. The first meeting between the two schools was in 1993 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Boulder, where CU defeated UCSB 81-54 to advance to its first-ever Sweet 16. The teams last met on Dec. 30, 1997, an 83-77 Gaucho victory in Boulder, and UCSB has won the past two meetings. The teams have some common opponents this year in Texas Tech and USC. UCSB lost to Texas Tech 68-41 in Lubbock, and lost 76-61 at USC, accounting for two of their six losses. Connections? UCSB's Kate Bauman formerly played at Iowa State and played AAU ball with CU senior captain Randie Wirt. Gaucho Lindsay Taylor was at the USA Basketball National Team Trials along with CU center Tera Bjorklund. CU's Veronica Johns-Richardson is friends with UCSB's Kristen Mann. UCSB assistant coach Carter Shaw used to work at CSU.

**HOUSTON SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...** This will be the first trip to the NCAA Tournament for Houston since 1992. The Lady Cougars last trip to the Big Dance took them to Santa Barbara where they were knocked out in the first round by UC-Santa Barbara 80-69. Houston picked up a school record 27 wins, while also tying the league mark for the most victories. In addition, Houston had their best record ever in C-USA play with a 13-1 conference mark, while earning the highest ranking in conference history with a No. 10 showing in this week's ESPN/USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll. The Lady Cougars are currently on a school best 12-game win streak heading into the NCAA Tournament. Colorado and Houston last met on Nov. 24, 2001, an 88-58 CU victory in the Coors Classic. UH is led by senior Chandi Jones, a national player of the year finalist.

**WISCONSIN-GREEN BAY SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...** The UW-Green Bay women's basketball team (23-7) completed its miracle run, defeating the University of Detroit Mercy Monday evening, 66-54, in the 2004 Horizon League Women's Basketball Championship title game at the Klotsche Center in Milwaukee. The Phoenix, which played more than half of the season with just eight healthy players after losing a pair of senior starters to injury, rode the shoulders of Tournament MVP Abby Scharlow's 24 points to gain the league's automatic bid for the NCAA tournament. The postseason berth marks the third straight NCAA tournament bid and sixth in the past seven seasons for UW-Green Bay.

**MORE NOTES ON COLORADO AND SANTA BARBARA...**Colorado boasts a record of 20-9 against the Big West, good for a 68.9 winning percentage against the conference. CU is 5-2 against Conference USA all-time and 1-0 against the Horizon League (UWGB). Santa Barbara is the 14th different city in California the Buffaloes have played in. This marks CU's second trip to California this year after having traveled to L.A. to take on USC in December. Colorado has one player in its history from Santa Barbara: Elise McConnell, who played on the 1975-76 team.

**OBSCURE NOTE OF THE WEEKEND...**The Denver-Boulder area as well as Santa Barbara were settings for two major soap operas. Denver played host to "Dynasty" while Santa Barbara was the setting for the NBC daytime drama of the same name.

**SIGNED, CEALD AND DELIVERED....**Ceal Barry became the 24th active coach in the NCAA to win her 500th game with CU's win over KU, 417 of which have come at Colorado (in 640 games). Ceal is also just one game away from coaching the most events ever by a CU coach, trailing Frank Potts' 641 (616 track, 25 football). She'll tie Potts in the game vs. Santa Barbara and a Buffalo win will make her the all-time leader at CU.

**SHE'S NUMBER TWO, AND THAT AIN'T BAD...**With her third point in the Oklahoma State game, senior Tera Bjorklund became the second all-time leading scorer in CU history. Currently sitting with 1,843 points, barring the most remarkable postseason statistically speaking in the history of basketball (about 40 points per game the rest of the way), the No. 1 spot held by Lisa Van Goor at 2,067 points is likely out of reach as it's now 224 points away. Bjorklund reached the second place mark in just 122 games, catching Sheetz in five less games than the former Kodak All-American used to reach her mark of 1,775 (in 127 games), and did so averaging almost 10 minutes less per game (33.5 to 24.4).

**LAST TIME OUT...**Colorado shot just 33 percent from the field and Oklahoma held a sizeable rebounding advantage as the No. 6 seed Sooners knocked off the No. 3 seed Buffaloes, 63-56, in the quarterfinals of the Big 12 Tournament Wednesday night at Reunion Arena. Colorado, 22-7 overall, will await Sunday's NCAA Tournament announcement while Oklahoma, 21-8, will face No. 2 seed Kansas State in Thursday's semifinals. The Buffaloes made just 16-of-48 field goals on the night and were out-rebounded 40-23 by the Sooners. OU's Dionnah Jackson had a game high 19 points with nine rebounds while Maria Villarroel had nine points and 14 rebounds.

**FEELING THE LOVE...**The Buffs are ranked No. 13 in the latest Associated Press Poll and No. 16 in the latest USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll.

**FEELING THE LOVE, PART II...**All three of the National Player of the Year lists have been cut down to 20, and Tera Bjorklund has made all three of the cuts. The Wooden Award, Wade Trophy and Naismith Award all announced their top 20 candidates respectively with CU's center of attention making all their lists.

**ONE CLASSY GAL...**Bjorklund has been named one of 10 finalists for the Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented to the outstanding male and female senior NCAA Division I basketball player. Other women's finalists include Alana Beard of Duke, Chandni Jones of Houston, Kelly Mazzante of Penn State, Nicole Ohlde of Kansas State, Nicole Powell of Stanford, Stacy Stephens of Texas, Diana Taurasi of Connecticut, Lindsay Whalen of Minnesota, and Shereka Wright of Purdue.

**NEVER TRAILING HELPS...**The Kansas game marked the sixth time this season that Colorado led a game from wire-to-wire in never trailing.

**EVERYTHING'S BRIGHTER DOWNTOWN...**With 6 three-point field goals made vs KU, Kate Fagan hit 73 for the season, a new single-season record at Colorado as she topped the old mark of 71 set by Shelley Sheetz (1992-93) and Jenny Roullet (2001-02). Her 20 points led the team for the fifth time this season, the second time she has scored 20 this season (24 vs. Buffalo). She currently sits at 79.

**IRON WOMAN...**Against Kansas, Tera Bjorklund became the 14th player in CU history to play 3,000 or more career minutes (36 for 3,009 total). She has played three complete games this season at 40 minutes, as well as playing 44 against Notre Dame in the second game of the year.

**THE OTHER IRON WOMAN...**Bjorklund isn't the only Buffalo ironwoman. Kate Fagan has played five complete games this season, the most of any Buffalo this year.

**DOUBLE YOUR STATS, DOUBLE YOUR FUN...** Bjorklund (14 points, 13 rebounds) and Randie Wirt (17, 10) have now combined for 12 double doubles this season (Wirt 7, Bjorklund 5), but the Kansas game marked the first time this year both did it in the same game. Bjorklund (26, 11) and Amber Metoyer (16, 12) did it in a 78-64 win over Washington back on December 9. Randie is now second in the Big 12 in conference games in double doubles with six, and is fifth in overall games with seven. She had double-digit rebounds in four straight games at the end of Big 12 games.

**A PERFECT 10...**This is the second time in school history that Colorado has strung together four 10-plus conference win seasons, the first time since the Big 12 was formed for the 1996-97 season. The Buffaloes have won 10 or more league games 13 times (5 times in the Big 12, 6 times in the Big Eight and twice in the Intermountain Conference). The previous streak of four happened in the Big Eight: 11-3 in 1991-92, 12-2 in 1992-93 and 1993-94, and 14-0 in 1994-95. The current run includes 11-5 in 2000-01, 2001-02 and 2002-03 and 11-5 this season.

**2010...**Colorado has won at least 20 games in a season 16 times in its history (29 seasons) and 13 times in Ceal Barry's 20-year tenure. The Buffs have also had at least 10 wins in the Big 12 five times in eight seasons.

**SMARTY PANTS...**Senior forward Randie Wirt was named to the District VII Academic All-America Team as selected by the Collegiate Sports Information Directors of America. She is CU's first Academic All-District selection ever.

**SMARTY PANTS PART II...**Colorado had four players named to the Academic All-Big 12 teams. Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Randie Wirt were all First Team Selections for the third straight year, while junior Veronica Johns-Richardson was named to the Second Team.

**PLAYING WITH THE BIG DOGS...** Historically, the Buffs are 47-85 against ranked opponents, and are 27-22 at home in the same scenario. With CU's win over Notre Dame in the second game of the season, the Buffaloes have wins over ranked opponents in 14-consecutive seasons. Colorado's biggest win ever over a ranked team came when unranked CU upset No. 16 Florida 98-62 in Boulder on Dec. 22, 2000, a 32-point win.

**DIFFERENCE MAKERS...** It seems that the difference maker for CU in games won vs. games lost is the elusive third-leading scorer. When Colorado has three or more players score in double figures, they are 20-3 this season and were 23-1 last season. Which means CU is 2-10 over the past two seasons when two or less players score in double figures.

**COLORADO UPSETS...** In the 29 seasons of Colorado basketball, the Buffaloes have achieved upsets over 29 opponents. Colorado's most recent upset was November 15, 2003, 67-63 in overtime against No. 15 Notre Dame in Boulder.

**DIAPER BRIGADE...** Colorado started two freshmen, Emily Waner and Anna Nedovic, at Oklahoma. It marked the first time CU had started multiple freshmen since the trio of Mandy Nightingale, Linda Lappe and Britt Hartshorn got the nod multiple times in 1998-98.

**BUFF ON A WIRE...** CU has had it's fair share of close wins this year en route to the second-best start in school history. On the season, CU is 6-0 in games decided by 2-5 points, and CU is 2-0 in two point games.

**DO I MAKE YOU RANDIE BABY YEAH?...** Oh Austin. Senior forward Randie Wirt has stepped it up a notch this season overall, but especially in Big 12 play, averaging 10.4 ppg and a team-high 8.8 rpg in conference play. She's posted seven double-doubles, to bring her career total to eight. She's shooting 52.5% from the floor against conference opponents, as well as 84.3% from the free throw line. Wirt is ranked in the Big 12 in rebounding, offensive and defensive as well as overall, and appears in scoring and steals as well as field goal and free throw percentage.

**JUST PUT SOME WINDEX ON IT...** All-American Tera Bjorklund has made improvements in almost every facet of her game, but this season her most notable improvement has been in rebounding. After averaging 6.8 last season, she's up to 7.8 a game this year. She had a new single game career high with 15 at Kansas.

**CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL...** Against Buffalo, Colorado set a new school record with 16 three pointers. With five different Buffs contributing to the mark (Fagan, Waner, Howard, Johns-Richardson and Nedovic) that included a new single half record of nine (second half). Fagan tied her own individual school record with seven, which she also tied previously this season vs. Harvard. They are hitting an average of 6.0 three's per game and shooting .366 as a team from downtown.

**SIMPLY...EN FUEGO...** In extending its lead from 39-38 to 64-50 in the second half against Texas A&M, Colorado made 12-of-14 field goal attempts (85.7%; the Buffs made 15 of their last 18 shots in the game, 83.3%); that helped the Buffs to a season-best 60.4% shooting (29-of-48) from the floor. It marked the first time CU has shot over 60% in a game since clicking at 61.4% in an 86-65 win over LSU on Dec. 29, 2001.

**MAKING THEIR OWN HISTORY...** Colorado's nine game winning streak earlier this season was the best the Buffs had since 1994-95 when CU won 25 consecutive games. Since then, the Buffs have had three different eight game winning streaks: 1996-97 (loss to Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament), 2001-02 (loss at Iowa State) and 2002-03 (loss at Kansas State).

**ROAD WARRIORS...** Colorado's Big 12 opening night win at No. 24 Baylor was Colorado's first over a ranked team in a road game since beating No. 13 Texas Tech 74-69 on Feb. 3, 2002. It was CU's eighth win in school history against a ranked team on the road. CU is 5-3 this year on the road in Big 12 action and 7-4 overall.

**BLOWN AWAY...** The Buffalo game marked the third time in school history that Colorado had won three straight games by 30 or more points. In addition to that run (71-39 over Wyoming, 80-45 over Syracuse and 98-47 Saturday over Buffalo), it also happened in 2001-02 (83-44 over San Diego, 96-44 over Bowling Green and 88-58 over Houston) and in 1980-81 (86-39 over Winnipeg, 83-49 over Utah and 134-33 over Fort Carson).

**THE BUFFALOES REPRESENT...** Colorado is a combined 23-2 over the past two seasons in non-conference play. CU's two losses were at No. 11 Minnesota and at home to Villanova in the 2002 Coors Classic. That's not the best in school history, however as CU went 21-1 in non-conference play from 1992-93 to 1993-94. The 1992-93 squad

was undefeated in non-conference play, so the lone loss was in the fall of 1993, an 86-82 overtime loss at No. 1 Tennessee.

**WANER FROM WAY BACK...**Freshman guard Emily Waner hasn't had much trouble hitting from downtown early in her career. She is currently 51-128 on the season for 39.8%. That's the second-most three's ever for a Colorado freshman, passing Mandy Nightingale (46-120, 38.3%) and trailing just Shelley Sheetz (57-157, 36.3%).

**TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS...**Colorado is 58-2 in its last 60 games against unranked teams, dating back to the 2000-01 season. The losses were both last season to Villanova in the Coors Classic and at Missouri on Feb. 2.

**COMEBACK KIDS...**The CU comeback over Notre Dame after trailing 12-0 was the biggest deficit the Buffs have overcome since trailing Texas by 16 points on Feb. 19, 2000 and coming back to win the game 79-75. The Buffs scored 53 second half points in that one to come from behind led by Sabrina Scott with 24 points and 13 boards. Since then the Buffs have come from behind with a double-digit deficit to win three more times...first vs. Harvard at Minnesota when they trailed by as many as 15 and won by four, 85-81. Again it happened at CSU, when the Buffs trailed by 10 and won by seven, 81-74, and lastly vs. USC, trailing 12 at halftime and winning 69-67.

**IS IT A CLUB IF YOU'RE THE ONLY MEMBER?...**CU head coach Ceal Barry became the first coach in CU history to reach 400 wins with a single team with the Buff win over Idaho State. She currently boasts 501 total career wins, becoming the 24th active coach in NCAA women's basketball to win 500 games in a career. She's already the winningest women's basketball coach in CU history, and she's coached more games, events and matches in a single sport than any other coach in CU history. **WHAT'S COOLER THAN BEIN COOL?...**She's more than just a witty former intern for Conan O'Brien: she's a dang good ball player too! Kate Fagan is having a solid senior season, averaging 13.1 ppg in 28 games. She's shooting 43.6% from beyond the arc with 79 threes on the season so far, in addition to 60-67 from the free throw line for a league-leading 89.6%.

**AMBER IS THE COLOR OF YOUR ENERGY...**Sophomore Amber Metoyer has made leaps and bounds in her second season, averaging 6.1 ppg and 4.9 rpg. She recorded the first double-double of her career against Washington with 16 points and 12 rebounds in 26 minutes off the bench. She also got her first career start at USC. Metoyer has also added some distance to her stroke, hitting a three in wins over California and Nebraska. She's .500 from downtown, going 2-4.

**GO AHEAD AND MOVE THE THREE POINT LINE BACK...**The experimental 9-inch distancing of the three point line clearly wasn't a problem for the Buffaloes. Colorado was 12-for-25 from beyond arc in its opener, tying the CU school record for three's in a game, set twice (Jan. 13, 1999 vs. Iowa State and March 22, 2003 vs. BYU in the NCAA Tournament). Emily Waner (5), Kate Fagan (4) and Anna Nedovic (2) all helped the cause.

**CHARGE!!!...**Kate Fagan led the Buffs last year in charges taken, and is on the right track again this year with 29. She's taken at least one in 25 of 29 games this season.

**NOT EXACTLY MARGINAL...**In wins, the Buffs have an average scoring margin of +14.8, with an overall scoring margin of +7.5 per game.

**LOST IN TRANSLATION...**It's not a problem for Colorado, as between the 13 Buffaloes there are 10 different languages in the CU lockerroom. English, Swedish, Danish, Serbian, French, German, Spanish, Norwegian, American Sign Language and Hungarian.

**Y3K Club...**There are now 19 players that are members of Colorado Basketball's 1,000 point club. What follows is a breakdown of Colorado's 19 1,000 point scorers, their current totals, and when they got there:

**YOUNG GUN...**Emily Waner received her first career start at Minnesota, becoming the first true frosh since Randie Wirt to start a game for Colorado. She got her first home start against California.

**CENTURY CLUB...**It was a big weekend for Tera Bjorklund and Randie Wirt back home in Minnesota. Bjorklund played her 100th game as a Buffalo against Harvard, while Randie Wirt notched her 100th game against Minnesota on Sunday. Kate Fagan joined the club in the game against Southern California.

**HALFTIME TURNAROUNDS...**It must have been some speech. Against Notre Dame, the Buffs allowed the Fighting Irish to open up a 12-0 lead. The Buffs used their stifling defense to get back in the game, and the result was an 18-point Irish second half. That ties for the seventh-fewest second half points for a CU opponent in program history.

**THAT IS SO UNCOOL...**Whitney Law became the first Buffalo in five years to suffer a season-ending ACL injury when she tore her anterior cruciate and medial collateral and meniscus (that's ACL and MCL and cartilage to you and me) against Minnesota at the Subway Classic. It's truly crummy for Law because she just finished sitting out a year after transferring from Georgia. Look at it this way: now she can maybe get a master's degree too.

**DAZZLING DEBUT...**Freshman Emily Waner wasted no time making an impact in a CU uniform, scoring a game high 17 points in the win over ODU. The 17 points are the third-most ever for a freshman in a debut (25, Lisa Van Goor; 19, Jamillah Lang; 17, Erin Scholz) and fifth most in a debut at CU. She made her first two buckets on her first two shots, both threes, one from the right baseline and one from the left. All told, she logged 31 minutes and finished 6-11 from the floor.

**THERE MUST BE SOMETHING IN THE WATER...**After Waner christened her kicks with a three on her first shot, classmate Anna Nedovic wasn't about to be outdone. Her first shot as a Buff: a three, nothing but net. Also not to be shown up was sophomore transfer Whitney Law, who made her first shot at CU...wait for it...a three. Four games later freshman Leslie Howard scored her first career bucket. Yeah, it was a three.

**WADE WATCH, WADE WATCH...**Not the same ring to it as Wayne's World. Eh. Well anyways, the WBCA has launched a website to follow the progress of this year's Wade Trophy Watch List types, of which Tera Bjorklund is one. It can be found at: <http://www.wbca.org/wadetrophyintro.asp>.

**FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS...**Coach Ceal Barry has a few of her former players in the coaching ranks this season. Former CU assistant Jen Warden is in her second season at Boise State University after working at Colorado for 10+ seasons. Also head coaching is Raegan Scott-Pebley at Utah State University, which will start play this season for the first time since 1987. Lastly, there are four former Buffs that are assistant coaches: Linda Lappe (Drake), Benita Martin (Colorado State), Tracy Tripp (Denver) and Shelley Sheetz (San Diego).

**CLIMBING THE CHARTS...**Tera Bjorklund has made quick work of CU's statistical charts as a Buffalo. Last season, her 592 points were the most ever by a junior, and the fourth most ever by a Buff in a single season. Her single season average of 18.5 in 2002-03 was the third-best in school history. She's now second with 1,843 career points and has only Lisa Van Goor ahead of her with 2,067.

**TOUGH OPENERS...**The Buffs kicked off this season with their toughest early slate in school history, tipping off against four-consecutive NCAA Tournament participants from last season. The Buffs last opened with back-to-back NCAA teams in 1994-95, when they played Stephen F. Austin and San Diego State, both wins. The last time CU had three NCAA teams in the first four games was 1989-90, when they faced Providence, Illinois State and LSU in games 2, 3 and 4 that year. CU went 1-2 in those contests. This season also marked the first time in school history that CU opened the season with two games within the first four against teams in the Top 25.

**WORLD TRAVELERS...**Kate Fagan and Tera Bjorklund represented CU, the Big 12 and the United States on the USA Basketball World University Games this summer, which also doubled as the Big 12 All-Star team. The dynamic duo traveled to Daegu, South Korea with the rest of the All-Stars for three weeks in August.

**PICKING FIGHTS WITH THE BIG DOGS...**Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing 10 2003 NCAA tournament teams. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as five members played in the NCAA a season ago, with Texas Tech making the Sweet 16 and Texas making the Final Four. The Buffs' opponents that danced last year: Old Dominion, Notre Dame, Harvard, Minnesota, Washington, Kansas State (twice), Texas, Oklahoma and Texas Tech. The Buffs will also take on WNIT participants Missouri, Baylor and Colorado State.

**TURNING OVER A NEW LEAF...**For the second this season, Colorado had a game in which the Buffs forced at least 30 turnovers. This season CU first did it against No. 5 Notre Dame, forcing the Irish to giveaway the ball 30 times, scoring 31 points on the freebies. The second time was against Cal, forcing 30 TO's again, scoring 21 points off of them.

**EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN...**It took three years and 24.7 ppg in the 2003 NCAA Tournament, but the powers-that-be are sitting up and taking notice of Colorado's center of attention, senior Tera Bjorklund. After a selection to the All-Big 12 First Team last year, as well as the Big 12 All-Tournament team, she's been picked as a preseason All-American by the John R. Wooden Award and is on the watch list for the Wade Trophy as well. Her honors campaign website "The T In Team" is up and running for all the latest Tera news and information at <http://buffs.colorado.edu/tera/index.shtml>.

**CROWD CONTROL...**CU has had success in the games with large groups of people present. Naturally, more of that success has come at home, where the Buffs are 18-10 with crowds of 5,500+. On the road, CU is 17-20 with 4,400+ fans, but 2-10 when there are 10,000 or more fans in the opposition's arena (it must be noted that on 11 of those 12 occasions, the opponent was ranked). Take those 12 away, and CU holds their own at 13-8. The Buffs have proved themselves in front of a really big crowd, winning their first game ever in a visiting arena with 10,000+ with their OT win over Texas Tech in front of 13,123 fans in 2001-02, the biggest crowd CU has won in front of on the road. The win over Iowa State last season was in front of 10,222.

**TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT...**Colorado has six players, half the roster, that are left-handed! But not all of them shoot primarily with their left hand. CU's lefties: Tera Bjorklund, Maria Billingsley, Cecily Jones, Sarah Lini, Whitney Law and Veronica Johns-Richardson. Just for measure, we'll include that assistant coach Tanya Haave is also a left-hander. That's pretty remarkable considering that statistics state that just 1 in 10 people are left-handed.

**TRIBUTE TO SOX...**The Buffaloes will wear a patch with the name "Sox" on their uniforms for the rest of the season in memory and in honor of former coach Russell "Sox" Walseth, who passed away on January 28 at the age of 77. Sox

coached the CU women from 1980-83, compiling a record of 77-21, including an amazing 43-0 mark at the Coors Events Center. CU dedicated it's 68-66 win over Mizzou to Sox.

**CU IN OT...**With the win over Notre Dame in extra time on Nov. 15 of this season, Colorado moved to 15-15 in overtime games with a mark of 9-12 in road overtime games. The Buffs have played in overtime in back-to-back-to-back seasons. Five of CU's last six overtime games have been on the road, including double OT at Iowa State in 1997. CU is 4-1 in those last five road OT contests. Prior to the Notre Dame win on Nov. 15, the Buffs had not been taken to OT at home since the 1996 NCAA Tournament, when they lost to Auburn 68-61 on St. Patrick's Day.

**CATCHING A LEGEND...**Now in her 21st season at CU, Ceal Barry has now passed the late Russell "Sox" Walseth for the basketball record for a coach with the most seasons with an individual team. Walseth coached the CU men from 1957-76 for 20 seasons, then joined the women's team for a stint from 1980-83 for a total of 23 seasons between the two teams, the longest overall tenure for a CU basketball coach. Barry also recently passed Walseth for the second-most games coached at Colorado. She's got 640, Sox had 604.

**HALL OF FAMER...**Colorado assistant coach and former Evergreen High School prep standout Tanya Haave was recently inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame, one of the highest honors in the state. Her classmates include Patrick Roy, Terrell Davis and Bill Hanzlik.

**HOME SWEET HOME...**The Buffs are 319-90 (.781) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 284-69 (.806). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 232-68 (.774) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 29 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s.

**THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...**Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Net on Saturday mornings at 9:30 a.m. Hosted by Chuck Garfien, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

**OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS...**Tera Bjorklund, Kate Fagan and Randie Wirt have been selected as the captains of the CU squad for the 2003-04 season. This marks the first time since 1999-2000 that the Buffs have rookie captains.

**MOVE OVER BRIDGET JONES...**Because the witty Kate Fagan has assumed official duties as CU's online diary writer for her second year. The Fagan Files, a feature on CU's website, will chronicle the season as experienced by Fagan, a fifth-year senior who has seen both the individual and collective ups and downs in her tenure thus far and has is one of the go-to players in Ceal Barry's starting lineup this year.

**LOVE AND MARRIAGE...**Buff guard Maria Billingsley is the atypical women's college basketball player. Why? She's 24, she's a native of Sweden and she's married. The former Maria Eriksson was married in December 2001 to Brent Billingsley, a former rodeo champion and graduate of Northern Arizona. She's also the oldest player on the CU roster and the only player NOT born in the 80's.

**SHOWTIME...**Colorado is scheduled to make a minimum of five regional or national television appearances this season, with the possibility of additional television if the Buffs advance in tournament play. Colorado is 3-3 this season on television (USC, W; Kansas State, L; Missouri, W; at Kansas State, L; Oklahoma State, W; Oklahoma, L)

**THE WANER WAY...**Well-adjusted? You be the judge. When asked what the biggest adjustment from high school to college has been, the Colorado native had this to say: "Time management and having the ability to address all the responsibilities you face daily. You have to budget your time to make sure you are prepared for everything. That means being mentally prepared for class, mentally and physically prepared for practice and disciplined enough to maintain good nutrition through all of that. Eat right, drink enough water during the day, and make sure you take the time throughout the day to get some homework done whenever the opportunity presents itself."

**THE SECOND COMING OF KORDELL...I'VE GOT YOUR SLASH...**Former Buff quarterback Kordell Stewart made a name for himself early in his NFL career as "Slash" since he was playing a little quarterback/wide receiver/running back. Well you can call Amber Metoyer the new Slash as she's playing some small forward/power forward/center. When CU backup center Cecily Jones went down with a partially torn ACL on Nov. 2, Coach Barry inserted Metoyer in at the post and liked her so much, she played there in the exhibition against South Dakota State. When the matchup is there, be looking for the 5-10 Metoyer to bang bodies in the post.

**FOREIGN LEGION...**Colorado boasts four players from over there, three hail from what is technically Scandinavia. Maria Billingsley is a native of Sweden, Jasmina Ilic from Serbia, and Sarah Lini and Anna Nedovic come from Denmark. The four represent the most non-Americans on a CU roster ever.

**BARRY SIGNS TWO PREPS TO LETTERS OF INTENT...**Ceal Barry announced the signing of two high school seniors to Letters of Intent on Monday. Kara Richards, a 6-4 center from Graham, Texas and Jackie McFarland, a 6-3 forward from Derby, Kan. McFarland's sister Jessica plays at Kansas State.

Jackson added 10 points and 11 rebounds for Texas (23-2, 11-1 Big 12), which posted its ninth straight victory despite shooting 26 percent, its worst performance of the season.

Colorado (19-4, 8-3) got 10 points and 12 rebounds from Randie Wirt, and Anna Nedovic also had 10 points. Tera Bjorklund, the Buffaloes' leading scorer and rebounder, scored only five points before fouling out with 7:59 remaining.

Texas, which trailed 25-18 at halftime, opened the second half with an 18-8 run, capped by Mercedes Williams' three-point play, for a 36-33 lead with 9:43 left.

Wirt's two free throws put Colorado back in front 41-39, but the Longhorns then began converting from the free throw line. Jackson's layup, on a pass from Heather Schreiber, was Texas' lone field goal during that span and gave the Longhorns a 48-43 lead.

Nedovic scored eight points in the first half to spark the Buffs. Colorado shot only 31 percent in the half, but Texas was even worse at 22 percent.

NORMAN, Okla. - Maria Villaroel scored 28 points, Dionnah Jackson had 12 points and 11 assists and No. 24 Oklahoma beat 13th-ranked Colorado 78-58 Wednesday night.

Tera Bjorklund scored 19 points to lead Colorado (19-5, 8-4), which also got 11 points from Kate Fagan and 11 rebounds from Randie Wirt. The Buffaloes have lost three of four following a six-game winning streak.

The Sooners extended their lead to 57-41 before Colorado started chipping away. The Buffaloes got as close as 64-57 after Bjorklund hit two free throws to cap an 8-0 spurt.

But the Sooners stormed back, scoring 14 of the game's final 15 points. Oklahoma held Colorado without a basket goal for the final 4:42.

Overall, the Sooners outrebounded Colorado 35-23.

Both teams had 17 turnovers, but Oklahoma had 23 assists on 28 baskets.

Senior Tera Bjorklund had a team-high 15 points but was just 3-of-12 from the field and was held scoreless in the first half. Wirt had 13 points, seven rebounds and two assists. The Buffs kept it close in part from the free-throw line, hitting 21-of-24 foul shots while Oklahoma hit just 9-of-13.
