#15 Kansas Football To Face Colorado On ESPN

QUICKLY -- #15 Kansas (6-0 overall, 2-0 Big 12) will hit the road for the second time this season, heading to Colorado (4-3, 2-1) on Saturday, Oct. 20 for a 4:31 p.m. Central time kickoff that will be televised by ESPN... Kansas is looking to match its best start since opening the 1995 season 7-0... KU's current six-game win streak is also its longest since 1995... KU has won nine of its last 10 games... KU has won two of its last three road games dating back to last year and is 1-0 on the road this season after winning at then 24th-ranked Kansas State on Oct. 6... KU is in a stretch with three of four games coming on the road... The Colorado game is the first of two straight road games (at Texas A&M next week), marking the first consecutive road games for KU since playing at Texas Tech and Kansas State the first two weeks of October in 2005.

KU ON ESPN -- Kansas will be making its eighth appearance all-time on ESPN and owns a 3-4 mark in games on the channel (KU is also 1-2 in games on ESPN2). Kansas' last appearance on ESPN was the 2005 Fort Worth Bowl when the Jayhawks defeated Houston 42-13. The last time KU had a regular season game broadcast on ESPN was its 38-17 win at Oklahoma in 1995. KU was ranked seventh in the nation and Oklahoma 15th in that game. LAST TIME OUT -- Quarterback Todd Reesing threw two touchdown passes while Jake Sharp gained 110 yards on 18 carries as 20th-ranked Kansas improved to 6-0 for the first time since 1995 with a 58-10 rout of Baylor Saturday at Memorial Stadium. The teams faced a one hour and 38 minute delay due to lightning prior to the game. After a Marcus Herford kickoff return for a score with 4:08 in the first quarter, the teams faced another 30-minute delay due to more lightning. The game finally ended at 5:03 p.m., more than five hours after its scheduled kickoff time of 11:37 a.m. The Jayhawks took advantage of great field position during the game as the Jayhawks' average starting position was its own 46-yard line. Baylor turned the ball over five times, leading to four Kansas scores, while the Jayhawks did not have a turnover for the third time this season. Kansas had seven different players score its seven touchdowns. In all, KU had six different rushers, eight different players with receptions, 13 different players with at least two tackles, 24 total tacklers, and four players with interceptions. KU produced 447 total yards, while holding Baylor to just 202 yards after the Bears entered the game averaging 393 yards per game. After the teams exchanged field goals to start the game, Marcus Herford returned a kickoff 88 yards for a score, his second kickoff return for a touchdown this year, and ignited a stretch of 35 straight points by the Jayhawks. KU came up with four interceptions, its most since picking off four against Louisiana Tech in the third game of 2005.

HEAD COACH MARK MANGINO -- Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his sixth season at Kansas and sixth overall as a collegiate head coach. In his first five years Mangino has guided the Jayhawks to three bowl-eligible seasons. During his tenure at KU the Jayhawks played in two bowl games (2003 and 2005) in a three-year span for the second time in school history (other was 1973-75). In each of the last two years, KU has won at least six games, a feat that had not been accomplished at the school since 1994 and 1995. In his tenure at KU, five different players have earned All-America recognition, 49 have earned All-Big 12 postseason honors, including seven first-team selections, two were named conference offensive newcomers of the year and one the conference defensive player of the year and 27 have earned Academic All-Big 12 First Team recognition. Prior to coming to KU, Mangino spent three seasons (1999-2001) at Oklahoma, including the final two years as the offensive coordinator. He also coached at Kansas State from 1991-98. Other coaching stints include New Castle (Pa.) High School (1981-84), Youngstown State (1985-86), Geneva College (1987-89) and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School (1990).

ASSISTANT COACHES

-- Here is a quick look at the KU assistant coaches:

* Offensive Coordinator/QB - Ed Warinner (3rd year)... Was run-game coordinator at KU in 2003 before serving in same position at Illinois in 2004-05... Was offensive coordinator at Army for 13 years (1987-99).

* Offensive Line/Running Game Coordinator - John Reagan (3rd year)... As run-game coordinator and offensive line coach, KU has averaged 40 more yards in each successive season (94 before he arrived in 2004 to 134 in 2005 and 176 last year).

* Tight Ends/Recruiting Coordinator - Brandon Blaney (6th year)... Is entering his eighth year on a coaching staff with Mark Mangino (was an offensive line graduate assistant at Oklahoma).

* Wide Receivers/Passing Game Coord. - Tim Beck (3rd year)... Very successful high school coach in Texas before joining the KU program in 2005.

* Running Backs/Special Teams Coordinator - Louie Matsakis (1st year)... Was at KU in 2004-05 as quality control coordinator... Has coached specials teams throughout his career and is working with running backs for first time this year.

* Defensive Coordinator/DL - Bill Young (6th year)... Has been a defensive coordinator at the college level for 20 years (Tulsa, Ohio State, Oklahoma, USC and KU)... KU was third in NCAA in rushing defense in 2005.

* Linebackers - Steve Tovar (1st year)... Spent 2006 as a defensive assistant with the Miami Dolphins... Played in the NFL for eight years after an All-America playing career at Ohio State.

* Safeties/Co-Defensive Coordinator - Clint Bowen (7th year)... Played at KU (1990, 92-93) and was the team's leading tackler as a senior... Named co-defensive coordinator in February... Grew up in Lawrence.

* Cornerbacks - Je'Ney Jackson (1st year)... Former assistant strength coach is in his first year as a field coach... Was an all-WAC cornerback during his collegiate career at Wyoming.

THE SERIES -- Colorado leads the all-time series by a 41-22-3 count, including a 23-8 margin in games played in Boulder. Last year KU posted a 20-15 win at Lawrence to stop a five-game Colorado winning streak in the series. KU has lost five straight at Boulder since posting a 40-24 win in 1995. Kansas will be looking for consecutive wins against the Buffaloes for the first time since 1980-81. KU head coach Mark Mangino is 1-4 vs. Colorado since taking over at Kansas. The Jayhawks are 11-15 against Big 12 North rivals in the Mangino era, posting a 3-2 mark against this side of the conference in both 2005 and 2006.

KU-CU LAST YEAR -- Quarterback Todd Reesing made his collegiate debut, coming off the bench to lead Kansas to a come-from-behind 20-15 victory against Colorado in Lawrence on Oct. 23, 2006. Colorado built up a 9-0 first half lead behind three field goals before Reesing sandwiched his own touchdown run in between two scoring passes to put KU up 20-9 with 7:57 remaining in the game. Reesing hit Jon Cornish on a 22-yard scoring toss with 4:35 left in the third quarter and five minutes later ran three yards for another score. He then found Derek Fine on a five-yard touchdown toss to complete the scoring with eight minutes left in the game. On the day, Reesing was seven of 11 for 106 yards, while also running seven times for 90 more yards. Kansas finished the day with 341 yards to Colorado's 316 and had just two turnovers to CU's four miscues. Aqib Talib recorded two interceptions in the game, while Jerome Kemp had 11 tackles. Current Jayhawks Joe Mortensen and Russell Brorsen, had nine and seven stops, respectively.

KU-CU LAST TIME AT BOULDER -- Colorado turned a close game in the first half into a blowout in the second half as after leading 16-13 at the break, Colorado scored 14 points in both the third and fourth quarters to post a 44-13 win on Oct. 22, 2005. CU was aided by four Kansas turnovers as the Jayhawks owned advantages in yards (354 to 304), time of possession (34:00 to 26:00), and first downs (22 to 14) and had fewer punts (five to seven) and penalties (five to 10) than Colorado.

KU-CU CONNECTIONS -- Kansas lists two players on its roster from the state of Colorado in OL Ian Wolfe (Forth Collins/Fort Collins HS) and walk-on LB Chris Heinz (Littleton/Highlands Ranch HS)... KU offensive coordinator Ed Warinner coached in the state of Colorado, as he was the offensive line coach at Air Force from 2000-02... KU football SID Mike Strauss is a CU graduate and worked in the CU media relations office as a student assistant for current CU SID Dave Plati... Colorado listed one player on its preseason roster from the state of Kansas in DE Drew Hudgins (Spring Hill, Kan.).

JAYHAWKS VS. CU -- Here is a look at how some current Kansas players have done statistically against Colorado in their careers: QB Todd Reesing made his collegiate debut last year against Colorado, coming off the bench to lead KU to three touchdowns and a 20-15 victory. He was seven of 11 for 106 yards and two touchdown passes (also rushed for one touchdown). His 90 rushing yards on seven carries in that game are still a career high... Last year TB Jake Sharp had 42 receiving yards (on one reception) which is his second-best receiving day total... DE Russell Brorsen recorded seven tackles against CU last year for his second-best career tackle total... CB Aqib Talib recorded two interceptions against the Buffs last year for the only multiple interception game in his career... TE Derek Fine had two catches against CU as a freshman and again as a sophomore and one last year for a touchdown.

COMMON OPPONENTS -- Kansas and Colorado share two common opponents in Kansas State and Baylor. KU won 30-24 at Kansas State, while CU fell 47-20 at Manhattan and KU defeated Baylor 58-10, while Colorado posted a 43-23 victory over the Bears at Waco.

CONFERENCE START -- After opening Big 12 play with a 2-0 record, its best two-game conference start since 1997, Kansas will be looking to make it 3-0 this week. The last time KU was 3-0 in league play was 1995 after defeating Colorado, Iowa State and Oklahoma before losing to Kansas State.

BOWL ELIGIBLE -- Kansas has already reached bowl-eligible status with six wins. This marks the third straight year KU has been bowl eligible and the first time the Jayhawks have won at least six games in three straight years since 1960-62. A bowl trip in 2007 would give KU three bowl games in the Mark Mangino era (2003 Tangerine and 2005 Fort Worth Bowls). No KU coach has ever guided the Jayhawks to more than two bowl games.

IN THE POLLS -- When Kansas entered the national polls ranked 20th in the country by Associated Press, *USA Today* and Harris Interactive on Oct. 7, it marked the first time Kansas was ranked by the AP since 1996. This year marks the 15th different season KU has been ranked in the AP poll all-time. KU is 45-27-2 when playing as a ranked team, including last week's victory against Baylor.

UPDATED POLLS -- The Jayhawks have been listed 13th in the season's first Bowl Championship Series (BCS) standings, as well as 15th in the Associated Press, *USA Today* and Harris Interactive polls as of Sunday, Oct. 14. The ranking of 15th in the AP poll is the highest KU has been listed in that poll since finishing the 1995 season ninth. KU finished that year listed 10th by UPI and 10th in the CNN/*USA Today* poll.

ON THE ROAD -- In the last two seasons, Kansas has posted a 2-4 road record, including a win at then 24th-ranked Kansas State earlier this month. Three of the four losses were games decided by one score as KU lost 37-31 in double overtime at Toledo, 39-32 in overtime at Nebraska, and 36-35 at Baylor last season.

DEFENSIVE DID YOU KNOW? -- The Kansas defense has made great strides this season and in fact is one of just four teams in the nation to rank in the top 10 in scoring, total, rushing and passing defense midway through the year. Kansas has joined LSU, Ohio State and Boise State in accomplishing that feat.

OFFENSIVE DID YOU KNOW? -- The Kansas offense has produced four 50-plus point games in a season for the first time in school history. The 1947 team was able to reach 50 points three times.

SPECIAL TEAMS DID YOU KNOW? -- Kansas is the only team in the nation with at least two kickoff returns and two punt returns for touchdowns this season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT -- Youth is the prominent feature of the Kansas depth chart. While the offense lists four senior starters, the defense has just one in DT James McClinton. On the two-deep, KU lists 12 freshmen, nine sophomores, 17 juniors and six seniors. Here is a look at who has started in KU's first five games this year:

FRESHMEN MAKING MARK -- Kansas has played 15 freshmen this season, including seven true freshmen in CB Chris Harris, TB Carmon Boyd-Anderson, LB Justin Springer, LB Drew Dudley, WR Dezmon Briscoe, DT Jake Laptad, and WR Jonathan Wilson.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS -- Nine Jayhawks have made their first career starts this year, including four freshmen in WR Tertavian Ingram, WR Dezmon Briscoe, OT Ian Wolfe, and CB Chris Harris... Others with their first career starts this year are LG Adrian Mayes, RG Chet Hartley and QB Todd Reesing on offense and DT Caleb Blakesley, DE John Larson, and S Patrick Resby on defense.

RUNNING BACK TANDEM -- With the loss of 2006 Big 12 rushing leader Jon Cornish after last season, the KU ground game has been a two-man attack with Brandon McAnderson and Jake Sharp sharing the load. McAnderson, the starter, has produced 461 yards on 74 carries (6.2 per attempt), while adding seven rushing touchdowns. Sharp has come off the bench and rushed for 498 yards on 76 carries (6.6 per attempt), while adding five touchdowns. Sharp ranks sixth in the Big 12 in yards per game, while McAnderson is eighth. Sharp has three 100-yard games and McAnderson two this season.

REESING ON THE RECORD LIST -- Here is a look at where first-year starting QB Todd Reesing ranks on the school's record charts in just six collegiate starts and nine career games:

FIELD POSITION -- Kansas has had great field position advantages this season, and in fact, averaged starting at the 50-yard line against Southeastern Louisiana and its own 46-yard line last week against Baylor. KU has started 18 drives on the opponents' side of the field this year and has scored 15 times (12 touchdowns and three field goals). Meanwhile, the opponent has not averaged a better starting field position than its own 35-yard line this year (Toledo, 35-yard line) and the opponents have started only six drives on the KU side of the field (three touchdowns).

TOP FIVE MISCELLANEOUS NCAA STAT RANKINGS -- Kansas is second in the nation in fewest penalties per game (3.67) to Iowa State (3.29)... Kansas is second in the NCAA in fewest tackles for loss allowed (3.67) to Florida (3.33)... KU is second in the NCAA in pass-efficiency defense (86.27) behind only LSU (83.75)... Kansas is third in the NCAA in third-down efficiency defense (25.0 percent) behind only UCLA (23.7) and South Florida (24.0).

DID YOU KNOW? -- KU has held the lead for 287 minutes and 39 seconds, been tied for 53 minutes and 44 seconds and played while behind for 18 minutes and 37 seconds this season.

OFFENSIVE NOTES -- KU enters the week ranked second in the nation in scoring offense (50.33), seventh in total offense (515.83), 13th in rushing offense (218.83) and 16th in passing offense (297.00)... Midway through the season KU is on school record pace for points per game (record is 34.5 in 1968), total offense (421.5 in 2003), and passing offense (286.0 in 1983)... In addition, KU's 218.83 rushing yards per game are the best since averaging 247.1 in 1994... KU has scored 50 points in four games this season, the most 50-plus point games in a season in school history... KU's 58 points vs. Baylor on Saturday were its most in a conference game in school history (previous best was 55 vs. Kansas State in 1947)... KU has produced at least 400 yards of total offense in all six games this year with a low of 437 at Kansas State (KU had just one game with more than 437 yards last season - 574 at Nebraska)... KU has rushed for at least 200 yards in five of six games... After starting the year with two straight games without a turnover, KU turned the ball over three times in three straight games... Last week against Baylor KU did not commit a turnover... KU has scored on 28 of 31 trips into the red zone this year (90.3 percent) with 19 touchdowns... KU has scored at least twice in 20 of 24 quarters this season... KU has produced 33 Explosives (plays of 20 or more yards) this year, scoring on 17 of those... In fact, four different players have rushes for 20-plus yards, while eight different players have receptions for at least 20 yards... KU has scored on 43 of its 83 possessions this season (51.8 percent)... Fifteen different players have at least one reception with 13 having at least two this season... Seven different players have a receiving touchdown and six different Jayhawks have a rushing touchdown (Jake Sharp is the only KU player with both a rushing and receiving score)... Kansas has produced three 90-plus yard scoring drives this year and all three have ended with an Aqib Talib touchdown reception.

DEFENSIVE NOTES -- Kansas enters the week ranked second in the NCAA in scoring defense (9.50), fourth in total defense (240.00), seventh in passing defense (160.00) and eighth in rushing defense (80.00)... Midway through the season KU's points allowed are the fourth fewest in school history and the fewest allowed since 1962 (8.1)... The 80.00 rushing yards allowed are on a school record pace (83.2 in 2005), while the 160.00 passing yards are the fewest allowed since 1999 (151.8) and the total yards of 240.00 are currently the fifth fewest ever allowed and the fewest since 1962 (235.8)... Last week KU held Baylor to 202 yards after the Bears entered the game averaging 393.7 yards per game... The KU defense has not allowed a touchdown in three different games this year (Southeastern Louisiana, Florida International and Baylor)... KU held its last two opponents to just 101 combined rushing yards as Kansas State ran for 53 and Baylor 48... The longest run by the opponent in the last two games was 14 yards... KU did not record an interception in the first two games, but has come up with 12 in the last four games, including four last week against Baylor... KU has forced 17 turnovers total in the last four games (one in the first two games combined)... Nine different players have KU's 12 interceptions this year, including two defensive linemen... The opponent has reached the red zone just nine times this year (scored six times)... The opponents have recorded only 14 Explosives (plays of 20-plus yards) this year and scored on just one of those (a 68-yard pass by Kansas State)... The opponents have only scored on nine drives this year (91 possessions) and three times they had extremely short fields, scoring on drives of 21, 13 and 16 yards... For the second time in the last three years, KU is allowing less than 100 yards rushing per game (86.4 this year and 83.2 in 2005)... KU had allowed just one individual 100-yard rusher in a stretch of 27 games (Leon Patton of Kansas State rushed for 102 yards last season) before DaJuane Collins of Toledo ran for 102 yards this year (now just two 100-yard rushers in the last 31 contests)... KU has started the same 11 players on defense in all six games this year... Eighteen different players started on that side of the ball last season.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES -- KU has two kickoff returns for scores in the same season for the first time since at least 1972... KU has averaged 10.4 yards per punt return to the opponents' 5.0 this season.

QUARTERBACK NOTES -- Sophomore Todd Reesing is in his first year as a starter and has etched his name into the KU record books already this season (see page four of this release)... In his starting debut he was 20 of 29 for 261 yards and four touchdowns vs. Central Michigan... He opened the year attempting 119 passes before throwing his first interception against Florida International... He did not play in the fourth quarter in any of the four non-conference games and averaged 299 yards per game in those contests... In his first collegiate game last year Reesing came off the bench to complete seven of 11 passes for 106 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for another to lead a come-from-behind win against Colorado... Sophomore Kerry Meier started eight games a year ago, but has come off the bench this year as both a quarterback and wide receiver.... He started the year completing his first seven passing attempts... He has started the last two games at wide receiver... He has five receptions for 51 yards... Meier had a 40-yard run against Southeastern Louisiana in the second game this year... Meier is the first KU player with a rush, pass, reception and punt in the same season since Donald Shanklin accomplished that feat in 1968... Tyler Lawrence, a redshirt freshman, who was the offensive scout team player of the year last season, saw his first collegiate action against SLU, but did not record any statistics.

RUNNING BACK NOTES -- Brandon McAnderson has rushed for at least 50 yards in every game this season, including two 100-yard efforts after entering his senior season with 228 career yards... His seven rushing touchdowns this year match his three-year career total before this season... He has just eight yards lost this season... Jake Sharp moved into the team rushing lead after running for 110 yards against Baylor on Saturday... He has three 100-yard rushing games this year and has scored at least one touchdown in five of six games (exception was his career-best 127-yard, zero touchdown game against Toledo)... Has just two yards lost this season... Sharp is the only player on the team with a rushing and receiving touchdown this year... The sophomore ran for 129 yards last season... Donte Bean has had carries in two games with five attempts for 16 yards against Florida International and one for one yard against Baylor... Angus Quigley made his KU debut against Baylor last Saturday and had eight rushing attempts for 47 yards and a 22-yard touchdown late in the game... Carmon Boyd-Anderson saw action in the first four games, but has not seen action in the last two contests... He had 54 yards on 13 carries against Southeastern Louisiana.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES -- Marcus Henry opened the season with a school-record tying three straight 100-yard receiving yardage games (on 19 combined receptions)... He has caught a combined five passes in the three games since then... His only catch against Baylor on Saturday was for a 54-yard touchdown... Dexton Fields has caught at least two passes in 17 consecutive games... Freshman Dezmon Briscoe's first collegiate reception was a 16-yard touchdown catch against Central Michigan in the season opener... Briscoe had just one catch in the first two games combined, but has averaged 3.5 in the last four games and has three touchdown catches in the last four games... Part-time wide receiver Aqib Talib did not record a reception against Baylor last week, stopping his streak with at least one reception at six consecutive games dating back to last year... Talib had also scored a touchdown in six straight games with five receptions and an interception return before that streak was stopped against Baylor... For his career offensively, Talib has eight receptions for 216 yards and five touchdowns... Raimond Pendleton, who caught three passes in the season opener, went four games without another reception before catching a five-yarder against Baylor on Saturday... Tertavian Ingram, who started the first two games of the season, recorded his first receptions of the year in game six against Baylor as he pulled in two for 15 yards.

TIGHT END NOTES -- Derek Fine has caught 15 passes in the last three games combined, including seven for 70 yards against Florida International... Last week vs. Baylor Fine had four catches and recovered a fumble on a punt return... Fine has caught at least two balls in eight of the last nine games... Senior Marc Jones is the only other tight end on the team with playing experience before this year, but he has not recorded a reception in his career... Freshman Bradley Dedeaux is listed as the backup and recorded his first career catch (11 yards) against Florida International.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES -- Senior Cesar Rodriguez started his team-best 35th game against Kansas State last Saturday... He started six games as a freshman, 11 as a sophomore and 12 as a junior... He started at right tackle his first year and left tackle the last two years before returning to right tackle this season (started this year's Toledo game at left tackle)... Junior Anthony Collins started all 12 games at right tackle last year and has 18 career starts, but did not start against Toledo for disciplinary reasons (was in on the second series)... Collins is the starter at left tackle... Junior Ryan Cantrell has been the starter at center and had started five games as a freshman and none as a sophomore... Junior Adrian Mayes made his first collegiate start at left guard against CMU... Junior college transfer Chet Hartley started in his first major college game against Central Michigan, manning the right guard spot... Redshirt freshman Ian Wolfe made his first collegiate start against Toledo manning the right tackle spot.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES -- DE Russell Brorsen recorded an interception at Kansas State two weeks ago, while also assisting on a sack in that game... DT James McClinton recorded just one tackle against Baylor last week, his fewest in the last 10 games (since recording just one against Baylor a year ago)... McClinton had six tackles at Kansas State the week before and had recorded at least five tackles in nine of his previous 11 games before Saturday... McClinton had a season-best nine stops against Toledo earlier in the year... DE John Larson did not have a tackle against Baylor after recording 22 in the first five games combined... Larson had an interception and a pass broken up against Toledo... Jake Laptad had three tackles against Baylor on Saturday... Earlier in the year he had a four-tackle game against Toledo, which included a sack... Maxwell Onyegbule leads the team with 2.5 sacks despite coming off the bench... He recorded a safety against Southeastern Louisiana and forced a fumble against Toledo.

LINEBACKER NOTES -- Joe Mortensen has produced two double-digit tackle games this year (13 vs. Florida International and 11 at Kansas State in consecutive weeks)... Mortensen has led the team in tackles in four of six games... Mortensen leads the Big 12 and ranks eighth in the NCAA in tackles for loss at 1.83 per game (11.5 total tackles for loss)... His return for a score against Southeastern Louisiana was the first for KU since 2002... His 88-yard return against Baylor on Saturday tied his 88-yard return vs. Northwestern State a year ago for the 10th longest in school history... Herford has moved into second on the KU career kickoff return yardage list and is just 33 yards shy of the top five on the school's season list... Raimond Pendleton had a 77-yard punt return for a touchdown in the season opener against Central Michigan, tying for the 11th longest return in KU history, but has not returned a punt in the last two games (Anthony Webb had four returns vs. Baylor)... Anthony Webb had a 14-yard return against Baylor last Saturday... PK Scott Webb is nine of 10 on field goal attempts this year and has made 14 of his last 15 attempts dating back to last year... Webb ranks high on a number of KU record lists (see page 24 of this release) and is the school record holder for PATs made and attempted... P Kyle Tucker has punted just 19 times on the season and has a long of 57 against Toledo... He landed three of his first six punts of the year inside the opponents' 20... Kerry Meier has punted four times, including three times last week against Baylor and owns a 32.2 average... Derek Fine rushed down on punt coverage against Baylor and recovered a fumble on Saturday.

KANSAS 52, CENTRAL MICHIGAN 7

The Kansas offense was firing on all cylinders in its season-opening game as the Jayhawks dominated Central Michigan 52-7 before a crowd of 46,815 at Memorial Stadium on Saturday night. The win gave the Jayhawks a season-opening victory for the fourth-straight year.

A pair of Jayhawk running backs notched 100-yard games for the first time since 2005 as senior Brandon McAnderson and sophomore Jake Sharp each eclipsed the century mark for the first time in their Kansas careers. McAnderson finished the game with 110 yards on 16 carries, all of which came in the first half. Sharp handled the load in the second half and finished the game with 106 yards on 15 rushes.

Central Michigan avoided the shut out with a seven-yard pass from Dan LeFevour to Kito Poblach to close out the third quarter of play.

Kansas piled up 538 yards of total offense on the evening, with six different players scoring touchdowns. Todd Reesing finished the game completing 20 of his 29 pass attempts, good for 261 yards and four TDs.

Henry led the Jayhawk receiving corps with seven receptions for 103, both career highs. Derek Fine hauled in five passes for 30 yards, while junior Dexton Fields had four catches for 49 yards.

The Jayhawk defense held Central Michigan to 294 yards of total offense and just seven points with junior linebacker James Holt and freshman cornerback Chris Harris leading the way with nine tackles a piece. Junior linebacker Joe Mortensen added eight tackles, including one sack for minus-10 yards.

KANSAS 62, SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA 0

Sophomore quarterback Todd Reesing threw for 257 yards and two scores, while the Kansas defense recorded its first shutout since 2000 as the University of Kansas trounced Southeastern Louisiana, 62-0 in front of 43,914 fans Saturday evening at Memorial Stadium.

Kansas dominated in nearly every phase of the game Saturday, outgaining SLU 474-75 and scoring as many as 62 points for the first time since 2004. KU's 62-point win tied for the fourth largest margin of victory in team history.

Reesing and senior wide receiver Marcus Henry led the Jayhawk offensive attack. The sophomore signal caller completed 13-of-23 passes for 257 yards and two scores, while Henry became the first Jayhawk since Harrison Hill to record back-to-back 100 yard receiving games, collecting five catches for 119 yards Saturday.

Junior fullback Brandon McAnderson led the Kansas rushing attack with 11 carries for 60 yards and two touchdowns in the first half. As a team, KU gained 209 yards on the ground and 280 through the air.

Senior defensive lineman James McClinton led the Kansas defense with five tackles and a sack as KU held the Lions to just 75 yards of total offense, marking the first time since 1992 that the Jayhawks held an opponent under 100 yards of offense.

KANSAS 45, TOLEDO 13

Todd Reesing threw for 313 yards and four touchdowns, while Brandon McAnderson rushed for two scores and the Kansas defense allowed just 251 yards as the Jayhawks improved to 3-0 on the season with a 45-13 victory against Toledo on Saturday.

The Jayhawks scored the game's first 17 points before Toledo scored just the second touchdown allowed by KU this year late in the second quarter. KU then scored 28 straight points before the Rockets found the endzone again with :05 left in the game after KU fumbled on its own 13-yard line.

Reesing's 313 yards were the 16th most in school history and the most by a Jayhawk since Adam Barmann threw for 405 vs. Nebraska last year. Marcus Henry was on the receiving end of seven of those completions for 133 yards and one score. Henry tied a school record with his third consecutive 100-yard receiving game. In all four, different KU players caught touchdown passes to go along with McAnderson's two rushing scores.

KU put up 557 yards of total offense for the 13th-best offensive day in school history. The KU defense also came up with its first interceptions of the year as Aqib Talib, Darrell Stuckey and defensive end John Larson all had pickoffs in the game. James McClinton led KU in tackles with nine, including one for loss.

KANSAS 55, FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL 3

Sophomore QB Todd Reesing accounted for 415 yards of total offense and two scores, while junior CB Aqib Talib highlighted the night with a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown as Kansas cruised to a 55-3 victory over Florida International back on Sept. 22. Reesing and fellow sophomore QB Kerry Meier led the team to 615 yards of total offense, KU's largest offensive output since posting 641 yards against Jacksonville State in 2003. Reesing was responsible for 415 yards of offense himself, throwing for 368 yards on 28-of-37 passing, while rushing for 47 yards on eight carries in just three quarters of action. Senior fullback Brandon McAnderson gained 105 yards on 13 carries and two scores, while senior TE Derek Fine had a career-high seven catches for 70 yards and a touchdown. For McAnderson it was his second 100-yard rushing effort of the season. Junior LB Joe Mortensen became the first Jayhawk to record double-digit tackle totals in a game this season as he recorded a career-high 13 tops. Fellow LB Mike Rivera added nine stops and added two fumble recoveries as the Jayhawks forced five turnovers on the night.

Dexton Fields hauled in the game-winning fourth-quarter touchdown to help Kansas defeat 24th-ranked Kansas State, 30-24 at Manhattan. The win was the fifth straight for KU, which started league play with a victory for the first time since 2003, defeated a ranked team for the first time since 2005 and defeated a ranked team on the road for the first time since 1995. The win also stopped KU's eight-game losing streak at Manhattan and gave the Jayhawks consecutive wins against its intrastate rival for the first time since 1988-90. KU has now won three of the last four against KSU. KSU scored first and had KU trailing for the first time this season. However the teams exchanged touchdowns in the first half and were tied at 14 at the break. KU then went ahead 21-14 on a Dezmon Briscoe 28-yard touchdown reception before KSU scored the next 10 points to go ahead 24-21. Dexton Fields caught a 30-yard scoring pass to put the Jayhawks back up 27-24 with 6:27 remaining. KU then added a field goal with 2:21 left to lead 30-24 and Aqib Talib's interception on KSU's final possessions sealed the game. After gaining just 38 yards on 16 plays in the first quarter, KU finished with 437 yards of total offense, while KSU managed 363. Three Jayhawks recorded interceptions in Talib, DE John Larson and CB Kendrick Harper, who was playing for the first time this year. Joe Mortensen recorded 11 tackles to reach double-digits in consecutive games.

Quarterback Todd Reesing threw two touchdown passes, while Jake Sharp gained 110 yards on 18 carries as 20th-ranked Kansas improved to 6-0 for the first time since 1995 with a 58-10 rout of Baylor. The teams faced a one hour and 38 minute delay due to lightning prior to the game. After a Marcus Herford kickoff return for a score with 4:08 in the first quarter, the teams faced another 30-minute delay due to more lightning. The game finally ended at 5:03 p.m., more than five hours after its scheduled kickoff time of 11:37 a.m. The Jayhawks took advantage of great field position during the game as their average starting position was its own 46-yard line. Baylor turned the ball over five times, leading to four Kansas scores, while the Jayhawks did not have a turnover for the third time this season.
