FOR STARTERS: Today in the first of three consecutive games Colorado will play at the Kohl Center on the University of Wisconsin campus. On Thursday, the Buffaloes will play the Florida A&M Rattlers; the Savannah State Tigers on Friday; then the host Badgers, Saturday at 6:30 p.m. All three games are part of the America's Youth Classic. For those not able to watch the action, can listen to CU's own radio duo of play-by-play voice Mark Johnson and analyst Charles Johnson. Thursday's game against Florida A&M can be heard on Sirius satellite radio channel 122; and the Savannah State broadcast on Sirius channel 143.

THREE STRAIGHT GAMES: Playing three straight games is a school-first since playing three in a row from March 9-11, 1990 at the Big 12 Tournament. Eighth-seeded CU won its first two games (upset wins) over Missouri and Oklahoma State to reach the Big Eight final against Oklahoma becoming the first eight seed to reach the final. CU lost to the Sooners, 92-80 as Shaun Vandiver (scored 75 pts. in three games) becoming the third tournament MVP on a losing team.

OPPONENT PREVIEW: Thursday's match up with Florida A&M (1-0) is CU's first-ever against the Rattlers. Florida A&M is from the Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference and reigns as the defending MEAC Tournament champions after posting a 21-14 record last season, finishing second overall in the regular season with a 12-6 conference record. On Monday, Nov. 12, the Rattlers opened the season with an 86-83 win over Carver (Ga.) College in head coach Eugene Harris' coaching debut. FAMU shot 50 percent (19-of-38) from the floor and dominated the boards, 31-16. The Rattlers had four players score in double figures, led by Akini Akini (18 pts., 11 rebounds), while Lamar Twitty finished with 14 points and seven rebounds.

They are seven schools on CU's schedule that went tournament dancing last year. On Friday, CU will play Savannah State (an Independent) for the third time since 2004; and then play the Badgers for the first-time ever. On Saturday, the Buffs match up against a school from the Big Ten for the first time since the 2004-05 season after losing at Michigan, 69-60 (Pre-season NIT Tournament), then defeating Northwestern at home, 66-57, nine days later. • CU is 4-0 vs. the Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference • 10-0 vs. Independents • 15-19 against the Big Ten Conference.

FROSH DUO: Freshmen guards Cory Higgins (10 pts.) and Levi Knutson (9 pts.) combined for 19 points in the season opener and were a combined 6-for-12 (.500) from the field. They were the lone freshmen pair to play and outscored CU's senior trio (14 pts.). Knutson scored seven

of his points in the second half sparking CU's rally.

DEFENSIVE PRESENCE: Freshman Cory Higgins made his college debut as a starter (10 pts., three steals, two assts.) and on the defensive end held UNM's leading scorer from a year ago J.R Giddens to four points, his second lowest output of his career.

PLAYING THE MWC: Last season, CU played five schools from the Mountain West Conference achieving a 1-4 record. This season, the new coaching staff inherits four opponents from that conference. After falling to New Mexico in the season opener, 54-47, last Friday, the Buffs CU travel to Air Force (Nov. 29), Wyoming (Dec. 8) and Colorado State (Dec. 22).

BUFF TIDBITS: CU's 47 points scored against New Mexico was the fewest since only netting 46 against Air Force last season (Nov. 18, 2006, 84-46 • CU held the Lobos to 54 points this season after allowing New Mexico to score 106 the year before • Marcus Hall scored 11 points with four assists bettering his first game output in three other season openers • Hall has 299 career assists and needs 23 more to pass Billy Law for 8th place in all-time CU assists • Richard Roby's one point against UNM was his fewest scored in a game since having one point at Nebraska (Jan. 20, 2007) and his three attempts against the Lobos was a career-low.

NOT ROAD FRIENDLY: Coach Bzdelik looks to turn CU's misfortune of playing on the road into a positive. Looking at history, the last 11 years produced a 39-92 (.298) road mark and a 17-20 neutral court record (.460). Excluding the Big 12 Tournament, CU last won a road game Nov. 21, 2006 (at Utah, 60-59), and a neutral court game vs. St. Mary's (Nov. 26, 2005, Pepsi Center, 73-54). Last neutral court game won outside the state of Colorado was the 2002-03 season when the Buffs defeated Loyola-Chicago, 76-72 in Charlotte on Dec. 29, 2002. That's the season CU earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

CU vs. RANKED TEAMS: Before CU plays a number of nationally ranked schools from the Big 12 Conference, Nov. 17's game at Wisconsin is

the closest CU will be playing a ranked opponent outside the Big 12. Wisconsin is currently receiving votes (21-AP, 36-USA Today). The Buffs have not played a road ranked nonconference opponent since Nov. 25, 2001 at No. 19 St. Joseph's. In the last 12 years, CU is 12-51 (.191) against ranked schools. However, on the road it's a much different story having lost 22-straight; 29-straight including road and neutral court games. CU's last win away from Boulder came at No. 20 Texas Tech, Jan. 11, 80-78.

ROSTER CHANGES: In the 2007-08 media guide, senior guard Richard Roby and freshman guard Cory Higgins are listed as #23 and #20, respectively. Both of those numbers are retired (#20 Cliff Meely, 1968-71; #22 by Burdette Haldorson, 1952-55). Roby now wears #23 (the # worn his freshman, soph., junior seasons), Higgins has selected #11.

FALL 2007 INELIGIBLE: Sophomore forward Jeremy Williams will be academically ineligible for the fall semester. Williams averaged 7.7 points and 4.6 rpg. last season for the Buffs with 18 starts. Williams may return to the line up the first week in January when CU wraps up the nonconference schedule (Jan. 4 SMU; Jan. 7 Tulsa).

the Golden State Warriors. In fact, he's the GM with the Charlotte Bobcats.

NO NAME JERSEYS: For the first time in many years the 2007-08 Buffaloes will not have their last name on the back of their uniforms. It was an idea always discussed in recent years, but never followed through until head coach Jeff Bzdelik decided that the name on the front is more important than the one on the back.

OPENING TIPS: CU plays seven schools (Florida A&M, Kansas, Stanford, Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Tech, Wisconsin) that earned NCAA Tournament berths a year ago including three schools that made the NIT (Air Force, Kansas State, Oklahoma State).

- First-year head coaches in the Big 12 (Kansas State, Texas A&M).

- First-year head coaches in non-conference (Air Force, Colorado State, Denver, Florida A&M, New Mexico, New Orleans, Wyoming).

- CU opens the conference season for the second straight year on the road; it's the fifth time the Buffs open on the road since the inception of the Big 12, all against South schools (Baylor, 2000-01; Oklahoma, 2002-03 and 2004-05; Texas, 2005-06)

- For the first time since the 1997-98 season, CU closes the conference regular season on the road with a pair of road games, also a first since 1997-98.

- Roby was named in Lindy's preseason Magazine as the 20th best small forward nationally

SENIOR ENCORE: Senior guard Marcus Hall returns to the Buffaloes after sitting out the 2006-07 season with academic issues. Hall joins fellow seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton for their final year in Boulder. Hall, a Houston, Texas native averaged 8.7 points, 4.1 assists and 2.6 rebounds per game during his junior year in 2005-06. Hall is among the school's all-time leaders in assists, ranking ninth with 299 (3.4 avg.).

REDSHIRT SEASON: Of the 15 players on the 2007-08 roster, two of them are ineligible to suit up for the Buffaloes after transferring from other schools. Casey Crawford (6-9, Forward, 230) from Overland Park, Kan. (Blue Valley North HS/Wake Forest); the other is Kyle Wright (6-5, Guard, 195) from Hartford, Conn. (Brewster Academy [Wolfeboro, N.H.]/Stony Brook). Both are redshirt sophomores with three years of eligibility remaining.

FOUR STRAIGHT? - Senior Richard Roby will be looking to become only the third player in school history to lead the team in scoring four consecutive seasons. From 2004-05 (16.0 ppg.), 2005-06 (17.0) through last year (17.3), Roby has made it three straight. Here are the others:

HEAD COACH JEFF BZDELIK

1st Season at Colorado/5th College Season Overall

Jeff Bzdelik, a man synonymous with success on both the professional and college levels in the state of Colorado, was named the 17th men's basketball head coach for the University of Colorado men's basketball program, athletic director Mike Bohn announced April 4, 2007.

Bzdelik (buzz-DEL-ik), 54, comes to Colorado from the United States Air Force Academy, where he guided the Falcons to a 50-16 record (a 75.8 winning percentage) in two seasons from 2005-07. During those two seasons he led the Falcons to a 2005-06 NCAA Tournament and a 2006-07 NIT Final Four appearance.

Bzdelik brings 29 years of coaching experience to the Boulder campus from the collegiate to the professional ranks. He returned to the college game in 2005-06 after 15 seasons as both a coach and scout in the NBA, including two-and-a-half seasons as head coach of the Denver Nuggets.

His two-year win total of 50 victories at the Academy was a school-best in any two-year span of the 51-year history of Air Force basketball, while his 26 victories in 2006-07 was also a school high. He's the only coach to have won at least 24 games in back-to-back seasons. Bzdelik guided the Falcons to a 31-1 home record, including a 15-0 mark in 2005-06 and 16-1 in 2006-07.

In 2005-06, Bzdelik led the Falcons to a 24-7 record and the school's fourth appearance ever in the NCAA Tournament. He also led the Falcons to a 12-4 record and second place finish in the Mountain West Conference. Air Force also capped the season leading the nation for the fourth consecutive season in scoring defense.

Prior to returning to the college ranks with the Air Force Academy, Bzdelik was the Denver Nuggets head coach for two-and-a-half seasons (2002-2005). He was named head coach in August of 2002 after spending one year as a scout for the Nuggets. Bzdelik engineered one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history during his second season in 2003-04, leading the Nuggets to the playoffs for the first time since 1994-95 while posting a 43-39 record. The 26-game improvement over the previous year was the sixth-best in NBA history.

Bzdelik also became the first coach in league history (since the adoption of an 82-game sched-

ule) to guide a team to the playoffs the year after winning less than 20 games. In his first season, Bzdelik earned NBA-wide praise for Denver's competitiveness, work ethic and never-give-up attitude. Despite having the youngest team in franchise history, Bzdelik's team shattered the franchise record for scoring defense by more than five points per game, giving up only 92.4 per outing. In addition, the Nuggets led the league in turnovers forced (17.1 per game) and had six of the top 12 marks for single-season scoring defense.

Surprisingly to many, he was let go by the Nuggets after just 28 games into the 2004-05 season, with the team off to a 13-15 start. But that decision would eventually become Air Force's and now Colorado's gain.

From 1995-2001, Bzdelik was an assistant coach under Pat Riley in Miami, holding the title of Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting during the final two years. With the Heat, he was responsible for the preparation of all game plans, video coordination and statistical data as well as player development.

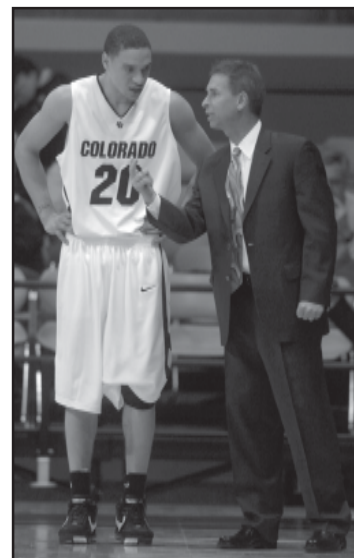
In 2000, he was recognized by USA Today as one of the NBA's top five assistant coaches. In the 1998 Pro Basketball issue of Sports Illustrated, he was voted as the NBA's best advance scout by league general managers.

Prior to his tenure with the Heat, Bzdelik spent the 1994-95 season as the lead scout for Riley and the New York Knicks. He also served as an assistant coach with the Washington Bullets from 1988-94 and was Wes Unseld's first assistant in 1993-94. In addition, he coached the Bullets summer league team in 1988 and 1994.

The Illinois native began his coaching career in 1978 at Davidson (N.C.) College. In 1980, he was named an assistant coach at Northwestern University where he spent six seasons and was instrumental in the Wildcats' first NIT appearance in school history.

He then accepted his first head coaching position at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, one he would handle for two years before moving on to the NBA.

During the 1986-87 season at UMBC, his squad was cited by The Sporting News as having "One of College's Biggest Turnarounds," in the school's inaugural season in Division I. After going just 11-44 the previous two seasons as a Divi-

sion II program before Bzdelik's arrival, UMBC went 12-16 in his first year and 13-15 in 1987-88 in Division I. His teams excelled in the classroom as well, posting a 2.86 grade point average during his tenure.

Bzdelik is a 1976 graduate of the University of Illinois-Chicago, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned four varsity letters in basketball at UIC and was named team MVP as a senior in 1975-76. He still holds the school record for the best free-throw percentage in one season, shooting 88.1 percent (59-for-67) from the line in 1975-76 and still ranks among UIC's all-time leading scorers.

Bzdelik also spent six years in the Army National Guard during the early to mid 1970s.

He was born December 1, 1952 and graduated from Prospect High School in Mount Prospect, Ill. He is married to the former Nina Bernardzik, who was a standout volleyball player at UIC between 1974-76 and is a member of the Flames' Athletic Hall of Fame. They are the parents of two children, Brett (18) and Courtney (16).

Lobos Hold On, Defeat Buffs, 54-57

BOULDER, Colo. (AP/CU Sports Info.) - J.R. Giddens 18-foot jumper in the corner with 33 seconds remaining helped New Mexico to a 54-47 victory over Colorado, Friday evening at the Coors Events Conference Center.

After Marcus Hall converted a driving layup with 1:04 remaining in the game, cutting the Lobos deficit to 50-47, the UNM countered with Giddens' jump shot as the visitors won their first season-opening road game since the 1979-1980 season.

Buffaloes senior guard Richard Roby, who averaged 17.3 points last season, was nearly shut out for the first time in his career. His only point came on a free throw with 1:16 remaining that pulled Colorado to 50-45.

The Buffs trailed by double digits most of the game but began its run on Xavier Silas' 3-pointer with 2:20 remaining that cut the Lobos' lead to 49-43.

Bzdelik, a former coach of the Denver Nuggets and the Air Force Academy, bolted for Boulder after leading the Falcons to a 50-16 mark in two seasons, including a trip to the NIT Final Four last season. He replaced Ricardo Patton, who was let go after 11 years and a 7-20 season.

It was the largest attended regular season opening game in 26 years of the Coors Events Center.

The Lobos, who beat the Buffs 106-65 last season in Albuquerque, jumped out to an early lead and took a 30-19 cushion into the locker room after closing the first half on a 9-2 run that featured a 3-pointer and two free throws by Wills.

Roby, who ranks seventh on Colorado's all-time scoring list, was one of two Buffaloes starters shut out in the first half. The other was Hall, who redshirted last season and underwent minor thumb surgery last month.

Hall scored all of Colorado's nine points over the first 10:18 of the second half, but his teammates went cold and New Mexico maintained a double-digit lead. Hall then committed charges on back-to-back possessions, one of them wiping off a basket for the Buffs.

Freshman Cory Higgins added 10 points, five rebounds and three steals for Colorado.
