North Texas (0-2) at Colorado (2-0)

Sept. 18, 2004 • Folsom Field (53,750) Boulder, Colorado • 6:05 p.m. CDT

The Particulars - North Texas (0-2) will battle Colorado (2-0) at Folsom Field in Boulder, Colo. Kickoff is scheduled for 6:05 p.m. CDT (5:05 p.m. MDT). The game will shown live on FOX Sports Net Rocky Mountain on Pay per View Basis and can be heard live on KWRD (100.7 FM) and KNTU (88.1 FM) in Dallas/Fort Worth.

The Principals - North Texas dropped its home-opener 20-13 against Florida Atlantic and fell to 0-2 after a season-opening loss at Texas the previous week. The Mean Green will be trying to snap a six-game losing streak to non-Sun Belt Conference opponents. Colorado improved to 2-0 with a win over Washington State in Seattle Saturday, after defeating Colorado State 27-24 in week one. Colorado has been impressive with its rushing offense and rushing defense, averaging 151.0 yards on the ground, while allowing its opponents just 59 total yards rushing in two games.

The Coaches - North Texas head coach Darrell Dickey is in his seventh year at North Texas and has an overall record of 30-43, including a 23-12 conference record. He has been named the Coach of the Year in the Sun Belt Conference in each of the last three seasons after leading the Mean Green to three conference championships and New Orleans Bowl appearances. Colorado head coach Gary Barnett is in his sixth year and has an overall record of 36-28. Barnett was a long-time assistant coach with the Buffaloes before becoming the head at Northwestern from 1992-98. He has coached in 10 bowl games and has a 14-year career record of 79-84-2.

The Colorado Series - This is the first ever meeting between the two teams. North Texas and Colorado have had two common opponents last season in Baylor and Oklahoma. The Buffaloes were 0-2 against those teams while the Mean Green defeated Baylor and lost to Oklahoma.

The Last Mean Green Game - North Texas lost its first game at Fouts Field since Oct. 5, 2002 - a span of eight games. The Mean Green came back from a 13-3 deficit in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 13 with 1:25 to play. Florida Atlantic returned the ensuing kickoff 50 yards and proceeded to drive for a game-winning touchdown with 29 seconds to play. North Texas was out-gained 457-281 in total offense and had just 13 first downs compared to 23 for Florida Atlantic. Senior running back Patrick Cobbs was forced out of the game with a knee injury in the third quarter after rushing for 57 yards, while quarterback Scott Hall completed 8-of-22 passes for 165 yards.

North Texas vs. The Big XII Conference Since moving to Div. I-A in 1995 North Texas is 3-15 against current members of the Big XII Conference. The Mean Green defeated Texas Tech in 1997 and 1999 and Baylor in 2003. North Texas has lost games to Missouri, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and Baylor.

Mean Green Loses Teammate - The North Texas football team suffered its biggest loss before the season even began when junior quarterback Andrew Smith died in an automobile accident while traveling back to Denton from his home in Bay City, Texas. Smith had played in 20 games in his first two years, starting 16 of those and leading the Mean Green to its only bowl victory in the last 57 years. As a redshirt freshman in 2002 Smith led his team to an 8-4 record as a starter and a win over Cincinnati in the New Orleans Bowl. Smith started the first four games of the 2003 season before Hall regained his starting position back. Smith will be honored by his teammates this season as an honorary captain. His locker will be preserved behind glass and his No. 12 jersey will hang in the locker room for both home and away games. The team will wear a No. 12 decal on the back of their helmet and the coaching staff has a 12 embroidered on their sleeves in his memory.

Seeing First Action - There have been 17 players who have seen their first action for North Texas in the first two games. Of those 17, six are true freshmen, with the rest being redshirt freshmen or transfers. Three of the players seeing their first action have started both games, offensive tackle Jeremy Brown, linebacker Brandon Monroe and cornerback T.J. Covington. Comparing this year to seasons past, there were nine players who saw their first action in last year's season opener and only five in the 2002 season opener.

Home Opening Loss - North Texas lost its first home-opener since 2001 with the loss to Florida Atlantic Saturday. The Mean Green defeated Nicholls State 23-0 in the 2002 home-opener and Baylor 52-14 in the 2003 home-opener.

Captains Named – Head coach Darrell Dickey has announced that four players will serve as team captains for the Mean Green in the 2004 season. Seniors Adrian Awasom, Andy Brewster, Jonas Buckles and Patrick Cobbs will represent the team as captains after a vote by their teammates. Andrew Smith, who passed away in an automobile accident on Aug. 7 will be an honorary captain for the team.

Home Grown - Mean Green head coach Darrell Dickey has built his program around the talent found in the Lone Star State. Of the 109 players currently on the roster, 95 come from Texas. Only nine of the 47 players on the most recent two-deep are from outside the state of Texas. The state

with the next most players on the roster is Oklahoma, which has nine. The remaining five roster spots are filled by players from Florida, Idaho, Kansas (2) and Missouri.

TV Time - North Texas will play seven games on television this season, including five as part of the Sun Belt Conference deal with ESPN. The Mean Green will be shown on FOX Sports Net for both the Texas and Colorado games before getting into the Sun Belt schedule. Games at home against New Mexico State, Louisiana-Monroe and Idaho as well a game at Arkansas State will be shown on ESPN Regional, which will be shown on KFWD - Channel 52 in Dallas/Fort Worth. North Texas will play Louisiana-Lafayette live on ESPN2, Friday, Nov. 5.

Darrell Dickey Radio Show - Mean Green head coach Darrell Dickey can be heard each week on his radio show live from El Guapo's restaurant in Denton. The half-hour show is hosted by George Dunham and Hank Dickenson and is aired live on KNTU 88.1 FM beginning at 6:30 p.m. each Monday.

Walk-Ons Earn Scholarships - Head coach Darrell Dickey has awarded two former walk-on players with full athletic scholarships for the 2004 season. Senior defensive end Aaron Chavers and senior wide receiver T.J. Culberson both came to North Texas as walk-ons and will now be listed as one of the 85 scholarship players on the team. Chavers and Culberson have both worked their way into the two-deep this season and both have played in every game.

Coaching Changes – There are two new assistant coaches for the Mean Green in 2004. Harold Etheridge will coach the offensive line after the departure of Eric Wolford to Arizona. Etheridge coached the offensive line at Army for the past five seasons and has 23 years of coaching experience. Duke Atterberry also joined the staff as the tight ends coach. Atterberry was a successful high school coach in Oklahoma and Texas for nearly 30 years. There were also position changes among the returning staff, with Bruce Bell moving from wide receivers to running backs and Rick Gailey moving from tight ends to wide receivers.

Where They Work During the Game North Texas offensive and defensive coordinators Ramon Flanigan and Kenny Evans implement their game plans from the press box while the remaining position coaches work on the sideline. Flanigan and Evans are joined in the press box by graduate assistant and student assistant coaches.

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dickey will be on the call from 10:56-11:03 a.m. each week.

Young Gun – North Texas offensive coordinator Ramon Flanigan is the youngest coordinator in Div. IA. The 29-year old Flanigan was named offensive coordinator in 2002 and has helped with the maturation and development of quarterback Scott Hall. Flanigan also tutored Andrew Smith who led the Mean Green to its first bowl win in 56 years before being tragically killed in an automobile accident prior to this season.

Mean Green Picked to Repeat - North Texas, coming off its third consecutive Sun Belt Conference championship, has been selected as the favorite to win the conference title in 2004 according to the league's preseason poll that is voted on by a panel of coaches, sports information directors and media. The Mean Green received 15 of a possible 18 first-place votes and totaled 159 points, while Troy State was second in the voting with 116 points. North Texas has won 18 straight Sun Belt games, dating back to the 2001 conference opener when North Texas lost 19-17 at Louisiana-Monroe.

Awasom, Cobbs Tabbed Preseason Players of the Year - North Texas claimed a clean sweep of the Sun Belt Conference preseason individual awards for the second consecutive year as defensive end Adrian Awasom was named the league's preseason Defensive Player of the Year and running back Patrick Cobbs was named the league's preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Cobbs was named the preseason Offensive Player of the Year for the second straight year after leading the nation in rushing with an average of 152.7 yards per game and in scoring with an average of 11.5 points per game as a junior. Awasom was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year, marking the third consecutive season that a Mean Green player was named the preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Awasom is a two-time all-conference selection and has been named to several national preseason "watch" lists.

Eight Players Named Preseason All-Conference - North Texas placed a league-high eight players on the Sun Belt's 2004 preseason all-conference team, which is twice as many honorees as any other team. Andy Brewster

(OL), Andy Blount (TE), Johnny Quinn (WR), Scott Hall (QB), Patrick Cobbs (RB), Adrian Awasom (DE), Evan Cardwell (DL) and Jonas Buckles (FS) were all tabbed as preseason allconference members.

Keeping an Eye on the Watch Lists - The Mean Green has placed more players on 2004 preseason "watch" lists than ever before. Five different players are found on eight different lists that highlight preseason favorites for national awards. Patrick Cobbs is found on the Walter Camp, Maxwell and Doak Walker lists. Adrian Awasom is on the Rotary Lombardi and Bronko Nagurski lists. Andy Brewster is on the Rimington and Lombardi lists. Scott Hall is on the Davey O'Brien list and Brad Kadlubar is on the Ray Guy list.

Against Ranked Opponents - North Texas has played 21 teams ranked in the Associated Press top 25 poll since 1974, losing all but one of those games. The Mean Green defeated No. 20 San Diego State 14-0 in 1974 and has since lost 20 straight games to ranked opponents, including 11 which were ranked in the top 10.

Opponents Undefeated - North Texas' first three opponents have a combined 6-0 record through the early weeks of the 2004 season. Those six wins have also come with some impressive road performances. Texas broke a 22-game non-conference winning streak for Arkansas in Fayetteville while Florida Atlantic defeated Hawaii in Honolulu, where the Warriors were 6-1 last year. Colorado is also coming off a win over Washington State on the road.

Passing Fancy - For the second straight week North Texas will bring a very different type of offense than its opponent saw the week before. Both Florida Atlantic and Colorado faced pass-happy offenses the week before facing the Mean Green. Florida Atlantic came to North Texas after defeating Hawaii, which threw the ball 66 times against the Owls. Colorado saw Washington State attempt 52 passes against the Buffaloes Saturday. North Texas has not attempted 50 passes in a game since Mitch Maher attempted 56 against Stephen F. Austin in 1994.

First Down Trends... - In two games, North Texas has had 53 first down plays and has ran the ball on 37 of those plays (70 percent). The 37 first-down running plays have netted a total of 94 yards (2.5 yards per play). Of the 16 first-down passing plays, seven have been completions for a total of 139 yards (8.7 yards per attempt and 19.9 yards per completion).

Which lead to Long Second Downs - The Mean Green has been faced with a total of 34 second down plays in its first two games. Of those situations, only four have been second and short situations (four yards or less to gain). North Texas has been faced with more than seven yards to gain on 27 of the 34 second down situations.

How About Third Down? - North Texas has faced third down 28 times and has faced third and long (seven yards or more) 19 of those times. The average distance to gain for all 28 third down conversions has been 8.0 yards, which leads to the Mean Green's poor conversion percentage of 14 percent (4-of-28). Below is the average down and distance the Mean Green has faced in the first two games:

Score by Quarters - North Texas has yet to score any points in the first or third quarters in its first two games. The Mean Green been outscored 27-0 in the first quarter and 14-0 in the third quarter. In the second quarter, North Texas has been outscored 27-3. The Mean Green's only touchdown came in the fourth quarter, but the team has still been outscored 17-10 in that stanza.

Climbing Uphill - North Texas' struggles against non-conference opponents in the last three-plus years have not been aided by giving up early leads. The Mean Green has a 4-17 record in non-conference games since 2001 and in all but two of those games, the team leading at the end of the first quarter has gone on to win. North Texas has led four times at the end of the first quarter and gone on to win three of those games (Arizona in 2002 the only exception). The only time North Texas trailed at the end of the first quarter and went on to win was against Cincinnati in the 2002 New Orleans Bowl. Of those 21 non-conference games, North Texas has led at the half five times and has gone on to win four of those, with a loss at Troy State in 2001 being the only exception.

Get on the Board First - Since the beginning of the 2002 season, North Texas has a 13-2 record when its scores the first points of a game. In contrast, during the same time the Mean Green is 4-9 when the opponent has scored first.

The Magic Century Mark - North Texas' success over the past three years has come in large part from its ability to run the ball. In 37 games, the Mean Green has had a 100-yard rusher 27 times. In those 27 games, North Texas is 21-6. In the 10 games when the Mean Green has not had a 100-yard rusher, its record is 1-9.

Watch That Guy - Both punters in Saturday's North Texas-Colorado game have been named to the preseason Ray Guy Award Watch List for the nation's top punter. North Texas' Brad Kadlubar has punted 18 times this season with an average of 41.8 yards per punt. Colorado's John Torp has an average of 45.9 yards on 13 punts. Thanks in part to a good punt coverage team, Kadlubar's net average when you figure in returns is 40.3, compared to Torp's 39.9

Mean Green Offensive Notes

Not Enough Time on Our Hands - In its first two games this year, North Texas has struggled trying to sustain long, timeconsuming drives. In losses to Texas and Florida Atlantic, the Mean Green has had only one drive of more than 10 plays and only two drives have covered more than 50 yards. The Mean Green is losing the time of possession by an average of nearly 10 minutes per game. Last season North Texas averaged over 30 minutes of possession per game, compared to an average of just 25 minutes in the first two games this year. In the loss to Texas, North Texas held possession of the football for only 23:47, which is the least amount of possession time since a 14-10 loss to Arkansas State in 1999 when the Mean Green held the ball for 22:32.

First Shutout in 25 Games - The 65-0 loss to Texas in the season-opener was the first time the North Texas offense has been held scoreless since it opened the 2002 season at Texas - a span of 25 games. The Mean Green had scored at least one touchdown in 24 of its last 25 games, with Oklahoma being the only exception in the 2003 season opener.

Cobbs Plays Hurt - Senior running back Patrick Cobbs started in the season-opener against Texas but played sparingly, due in large part to the thumb injury that kept him out of practice for more than a week leading up to the game. Against Florida Atlantic, Cobbs rushed for 57 yards until injuring his left knee midway through the third quarter. His status for the Colorado game will be determined early this week.

Cobbs' Streak Broke - Cobbs streak of nine straight games with over 100-yards rushing was broke against Texas, when he was held to a career-low, minus one-yard rushing on eight carries. Cobbs' previous career-low was during his freshman season when he was held to one yard on three carries against South Florida. Last season, Cobbs started the season by rushing for 38 yards against Oklahoma in the opening game before going on to lead the nation in rushing with an average of 152.7 yards per game.

Howard Has Career Night - Senior wide receiver Kevin Howard caught four passes for a career-best 94 yards against Florida Atlantic. Howard's 54-yard catch against the Owls was also a career-long.

Bazaldua Finally Gets on the Field - Junior kicker Nick Bazaldua didn't see any action against Texas in the season opener as the Mean Green was shutout 65-0. Bazaldua - who does not handle kickoff duties - made his

first action of the season count as he connected on a 49-yard field, which tied a career long. He was also good on a 31-yard field goal that tied the game at 13 late in the fourth quarter and perfect on his only PAT attempt.

Hall Battles Through Slow Start - Senior quarterback Scott Hall struggled completing only 41 percent of his passes through two games. Hall has however, led the team in total offense with 284 of the team's 411 total yards and has yet to throw an interception. Hall also rushed for 35 yards against Florida Atlantic.

Muzzy Comes Back From Injury - Wide receiver Zach Muzzy is seeing his first action since suffering a season-ending injury in the early stages of the fourth game last year. Muzzy injured his knee while returning a kickoff on North Texas' first possession against Arkansas and spent the remainder of the season and all spring rehabilitating. Muzzy has two receptions for 14 yards and leads the team with eight kickoff returns for 156 yards (19.5 avg.).

Quinn Continues Catch Streak - Sophomore wide receiver Johnny Quinn caught two passes against Florida Atlantic, extending his streak to 15 games with at least one reception. Quinn has caught at least one pass in every game he has played for the Mean Green and led the team in both receptions (34) and receiving vards (709) as a freshman in 2003.

Blount Goes Long Again - Senior tight end Andy Blount leads the team in receptions through his first two games and continues to catch long passes. Blount had one catch for 20 yards against Florida Atlantic, making it the sixth straight game he has had a reception of more than 15 yards. In the final four games of the 2003 season, Blount averaged 23.5 yards per catch and led the team with 10 receptions and three touchdowns.

Byerly Sees First Action - Redshirt freshman Joey Byerly saw his first action with the Mean Green in the loss at Texas. Byerly came into the game in the third quarter and attempted six passes, completing two. Byerly also rushed three times for a total of nine yards.

True Freshmen get Stats - A pair of true freshman showed up on the final statistics against Texas as running back Jamario Thomas had two carries for minus one yard and wide receiver Roy Covington had one catch for eight yards.

Still Looking For First Pick - After leading the Sun Belt Conference with 18 interceptions last year, the Mean Green is still looking for its first pick of the 2004 season. North Texas had four interceptions in its first two games last year. Colorado quarterback Joel Klatt has thrown one interception in each of his first two games.

Get In and Get Out - In two games, the North Texas defense has spent a lot of time on the field. The Mean Green has only forced two, three-and-out situations and has fought through 13 drives of 50 yards or more. Florida Atlantic took the opening drive of the game Saturday 55 yards on 14 plays, consuming 6:46 of the first quarter.

Not in a While at Fouts - Florida Atlantic put up 457 yards of total offense against North Texas, which is the most yards allowed by a Mean Green defense at Fouts Field since Idaho had 469 in 2000. Last season, North Texas allowed just 240.8 yards of total offense per game at Fouts.

Uncommon For a Dickey Defense - The North Texas defense, which has been highly touted under head coach Darrell Dickey the past few years, allowed uncommon numbers against Texas in the season opener. The Longhorns totaled 673 yards of total offense and 513 yards rushing, which are both the most ever allowed by a Mean Green defense. North Texas led the Sun Belt Conference in both rushing and total defense last season, allowing a total of just 582 yards on the ground in seven conference games.

To Their Defense - North Texas started six players on defense who were not regular starters at the end of the 2003 season, including three linebackers who had never started a single game before this year. Two starters on defense were playing in their first-ever game for the Mean Green, true freshman linebacker Brandon Monroe and transfer cornerback T.J. Covington. Only three players on this year's defense have more than 100 career tackles, safeties Jonas Buckles and Markeith Knowlton and cornerback Walter Priestley. By comparison, last year there were six players on the roster with over 100 career tackles.

Stopping the Long Runs - Part of North Texas' downfall at Texas was the inability to stop the long plays. Longhorn running back Cedric Benson scored on a 38-yard touchdown run the first time he touched the ball and his backup Selvin Young had a 48-yard scoring run in the second quarter. In all, five different

Longhorn players had runs of more than 30 yards in the game, which is a stark comparison from last season when the Mean Green only allowed four runs of more than 30 yards in all 13 games.

You Need to Knowl - Senior safety Markeith Knowlton had a career-high 12 tackles against Texas and followed that up with an 11-tackle performance against Florida Atlantic. Before this season, Knowlton's previous best was the 10 tackles that he posted against Oklahoma as a true freshman in 2001. Knowlton has been the game's leading tackler in both games and is the team's third-leading career tackler with 128 stops.

Cover Man - Cornerback T.J. Covington is seeing his first action with the Mean Green after transferring to North Texas from Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College this season. Covington has started both games and looked good in pass defense. He is tied for third on the team with nine tackles and had a big tackle for a loss on a second-and-goal situation against Florida Atlantic that forced a field goal.

Monroe Makes Debut - True freshman Brandon Monroe has made a big impression in his short time with the Mean Green. Monroe has started both games at outside linebacker and is second on the team with 15 tackles. Monroe came to North Texas from Electra High School, where the school's total enrollment is 200 and he was a star offensive and defensive player for the Tigers. Monroe was named the Defensive Most Valuable Player in District 7-2A last season.

Setting the Bar - Punter Brad Kadlubar has been named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List for the nation's top punter. Kadlubar has been impressive in the first two games, averaging 41.8 yards on 18 punts, which is slightly better than his career average of 41.6 yards. He punted a career-high 12 times against Texas, which is only two punts shy of a school record that was set by David Yaege in 1972. Kadlubar had 494 total yards on punts against the Longhorns, which was only 24 yards shy of a record.

Head Coach Darrell Dickey

In his seventh year as a head coach, Darrell Dickey has built North Texas into the elite program in the Sun Belt Conference and a bona fide contender on the national scene.

Dickey was awarded by his peers as Sun Belt Coach of the Year in 2001, 2002 and 2003 after leading North Texas to an 18-1 record since the league began play. His 18-game conference winning streak is the longest in the nation.

He has faced some of the toughest competition in the nation, playing six teams in the past two years that spent some time in the top 25 during that span. His teams have increased their offensive production in each of the last three years and his defense has been ranked in the top 25 nationally the past two seasons.



Dickey has placed 20 players on the Sun Belt first team all-conference list over the last two years and has had six Players of the Year over the past three seasons.

Dickey Coaching Highlights

- Feb. 25, 1998 Dickey named 15th head coach in North Texas history, taking over for Matt Simon who compiled a 18-26 record in four years.
- Oct. 10, 1998 Dickey's first career win as a head coach was a 21-13 upset victory at Boise State. North Texas entered the game 0-4 while Boise State was 3-1. The Mean Green scored 14 fourth-quarter points to secure the win.
- Sept. 18, 1999 Dickey led North Texas to only its third win ever at Texas Tech when the Mean Green defeated the Red Raiders 21-14 at Lubbock.
- Oct. 13, 2001 Dickey records one of the biggest upsets in North Texas history as the 0-5 Mean Green defeated 5-0 Middle Tennessee 24-21on homeoming.
- Nov. 17, 2001 North Texas clinched its first bowl appearance in 42 years as Dickey led the Mean Green to a 50-27 win at Idaho. It was North Texas' first-ever win at Idaho and the first time in 14 years that North Texas had won five straight games.
- Dec. 4, 2001 Dickey named 2001 Sun Belt Coach of the Year.
- Dec. 18, 2001 Dickey led North Texas in it's fourth bowl game in school history and its first 42 years. It was also Dickey's first bowl game as a head coach.
- Nov. 16, 2002 Dickey defeated New Mexico State 38-27 at Fouts Field to earn North Texas its second Sun Belt title in two years and send the Mean Green to its second straight New Orleans Bowl.
- Nov. 23, 2002 Dickey became the first coach since Rod Rust in 1967 to complete a perfect conference record, concluding the Sun Belt schedule with a 6-0 record. With the win Dickey improved the Mean Green's Sun Belt winning streak to 11 games the second longest in the nation.
- Dec. 3, 2002 Dickey named Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year, becoming the first coach in school history to win the award in consecutive years.
- Dec. 17, 2002 Dickey led North Texas to only its second bowl win in school history and the first since 1946 when it defeated Conference USA co-champion Cincinnati 24-19 in the New Orleans Bowl.
- \bullet Nov. 15, 2003 Dickey coached North Texas in a win over Arkansas State that clinched its third straight New Orleans Bowl appearance making him the only coach in North Texas history to coach in three bowl games.
- \bullet Dec. 2, 2003 Dickey named 2003 Sun Belt Coach of the Year his third consecutive Sun Belt Coach of the Year award.

Game 1 North Texas 0 at Texas 65

AUSTIN (9/4/04) The No. 7 Texas Longhorns scored on their first five possessions of the game en route to a 65-0 win over North Texas in front of a sellout crowd of 82,956 at Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. Senior running back Cedric Benson set the tone for the Longhorns early, scoring on a 38-yard run two minutes into the game on Texas' first possession. Texas scored three rushing touchdowns in the first quarter and added a field goal to lead 24-0 after the first 15 minutes. North Texas was unable to recover, recording only four first downs and one third down conversion in the game. Texas continued its offensive surge in the second quarter with two more rushing touchdowns by Benson and Selvin Young and two field goals by senior Dusty Mangum. The Longhorns added three touchdowns in the second half to seal the win. Texas backs Benson and Young paced the Longhorn attack, combining for 283 rushing yards and four touchdowns. The Longhorns' defense held the Mean Green offense to 38 rushing yards and 130 total yards. Senior linebacker Derrick Johnson forced three fumbles, resulting in 14 Texas points. Trailing 17-0, North Texas mounted a 43-yard drive, its best of the night, before seeing it end with a fumble at the Texas 37-yard line. North Texas senior quarterback Scott Hall completed 8-of-17 passes for 78 yards, and senior tight end Andy Blount posted a team-high four receptions for 49 yards. Kevin Moore was the Mean Green's leading rusher, finishing with 27 yards on nine carries.

DENTON (9/11/04) — North Texas had its eight-game winning streak at Fouts Field snapped with a 20-13 loss to Florida Atlantic, the last lost at home since a 24-17 setback to South Florida in 2002. Down 13-3 at the start of the fourth quarter, North Texas scored 10 straight points to tie the game at 13 with 1:25 left. Quarterback Scott Hall engineered the comeback, beginning with a 54-yard pass to Kevin Howard. Howard caught four passes for a career-high 94 yards. On the next play, Hall found Johnny Quinn for a 34-yard reception. On fourth and goal, Kevin Moore rushed into the end zone to bring NT within three, 13-10, with 7:12 left in the game. North Texas regained possession of the ball with 3:50 on the clock after Aaron Chavers forced a fumble on FAU's 47yard line. After failing to convert on third and eight at the 14-yard line, Nick Bazaldua came in and converted a 31-yard field goal to tie the game at 13. The Mean Green was 3-of-14 on third-down conversions. Bazaldua was 2-for-3 in field goal attempts on the day, including a 49yard field goal in the second quarter that tied his career best. Florida Atlantic's Anthony Jackson returned the ensuing kickoff 50 yards to the midfield to set up the Owls for their game-winning drive. After a 50-yard drive, Doug Parker ran in the winning touchdown from the one-yard line with 29 seconds remaining. Parker ran for 126 yards and scored two touchdowns for the Owls, while quarterback Jared Allen completed 18-of-25 passes for 245 yards.
