



No. 10 Cavaliers hand Buffs 1st loss

Colorado shut out in second consecutive game

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — The Colorado women's soccer team lost for the first time this season on Friday when the Buffs fell to No. 10 Virginia, 4-0.

The Buffs trailed 1-0 at halftime and the match got away from them in the second half.

"Some days we're good enough, and some days we're not," CU coach Bill Hempen said. "Today we weren't. We had the chance to tie it early on but we missed a wide open goal and that could have changed things."

It was the second consecutive game that CU (2-1-2) was held scoreless.

The Buffaloes nearly scored in the 59th minute when senior Allison Kidd took a shot that went beyond the out-stretched hands of Virginia goalkeeper Chantel Jones but it hit the post and was sent back into play by the Cavalier defense.

"(Virginia) was a very good team," said junior midfielder Alex Cousins. "I think the defense played well, but we had a tough time stringing passes together and we couldn't generate a lot of offense. They're defenders were right up on us. It's all about timing and movement and tonight we didn't have it."

Virginia finished the match out-shooting the Buffaloes 12 to five. The Cavaliers put eight shots on goal while the Buffs only managed two.

"Virginia is good," Hempen said. "We had some bad clearances and we were unable to hold onto the ball. They were more aggressively defensively. It shows us that we have a long way to go."

Colorado junior transfer Genna Gorman made her first appearance for the Buffs this season when she entered in the 20th minute of the game, replacing forward Nikki Marshall.

Colorado returns to action at 9 a.m. Sunday to take on the New Mexico Lobos in the second day of the Virginia Nike Soccer Classic.

Buff men tied for second at Tucker Invite

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — The Colorado men's golf team is tied for second and just three strokes out of the lead after the first two rounds Friday in the 53rd Annual William H. Tucker Invitational.

The Buffs posted a 3-over par 579 to tie San Diego State. Pepperdine leads with a 576 with Ohio State, the first-round leader, four strokes off the pace.

CU's ThunderRidge High School pipeline paved the way through two rounds, as junior Derek Tolan is tied for fifth with a 2-under 142, while sophomore Luke Symons is at 1-under 143.

Senior Jim Grady and true freshman Michael Imperato both scored rounds of 72 the second time around the 7,350-yard, par-72 UNM Championship Course, as both rallied from over-par morning rounds. Grady closed at 148 (28th place), while Imperato is in at 150 through 36 holes.

CU's other senior, Michael Baird, generally considered the team's No. 1 man heading into the year, opened with a 74 but posted a second round 78 to finish the day at 8-over (152).
