QUICKLY...The University of Colorado (1-1, 0-0 Big 12 Conference) will host the 18th annual Coors Classic on Nov. 26-27 at the Coors Events Conference Center. The Buffaloes welcome in a trio of 2003-04 NCAA Tournament teams for a very competitive field. On Friday, Nov. 26, No. 2/2 LSU and No. 22/22 Maryland will tip off at 5 p.m., followed by Colorado vs. Pennsylvania at 7 p.m. On Saturday, Nov. 27, Colorado will play either LSU or Maryland at 5 p.m., regardless of Friday's results, as the game will be broadcast live on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain. Penn will then finish the tournament with either LSU or Maryland in the 7 p.m. game.

BUFFS ON THE AIR...All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. **Tim Smile** will handle play by play duties and is joined by USA Basketball's **Carol Callan** with the color commentary.

31st SEASON...Colorado is embarking on its 31st season of varsity women's basketball with an all-time record of 578-315 (.647). The Buffaloes have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, all since 1988, including six Sweet 16 appearances and three trips to the Elite Eight (1993, 1995 & 2002).

SILVER AT THE NUGGET...Colorado opened the 2004-05 season with a second place finish at the University of Nevada Nugget Classic in Reno. The Buffaloes took the opener 75-58 against Loyola Marymount but fell to the host Wolfpack 69-59 in the championship game. Senior guard **Veronica Johns-Richardson** averaged 13 points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals on the weekend and was named to the Nugget Classic All-Tournament team.

In the Nevada game, Colorado led 30-28 at halftime, but the Wolfpack sprinted out with a 24-10 run to open the second half. Nevada (2-0) had consecutive 3-point field goals from Traci Graham, Jessica Pressler and Talisha Anderson to take a 52-40 lead with 11:47 remaining. Nevada hit 14-of-27 from the field in the second half including 4-of-8 from beyond the arc.

The Buffaloes cut the lead to five (59-54) with just under five minutes left but could not get any closer. The Wolfpack took advantage of a 40-31 edge on the boards, including 12 on the offensive side. Nevada was also perfect from the free-throw line in the second half (9-for-9), hitting 17-of-22 overall (77.3 percent), while Colorado hit just 11-of-20 from the line (55 percent).

Freshman center **Kara Richards** had 14 points on 7-of-10 from the field. Sophomore **Jasmina Ilic** had career-highs with 11 points and six rebounds. **Sarah Lini** also had a personal best nine points.

Sophomore forward **Anna Nedovic** scored a career high 23 points and grabbed 10 rebounds to lead Colorado past Loyola Marymount in the first round game on Nov. 19. Nedovic, who hit 7-for-11 from the floor, was the first Buff to record a 20-point, 10-rebound double double since Tera Bjorklund had 26 and 11 against Washington early last season. Nedovic, making her second career start, also netted personal bests in field-goals made and attempted, free-throws made and attempted and 3-point field goals.

Four players scored in double digits for Colorado. Johns-Richardson had 15 points, four assists and three steals. Richards, who became the first true freshman to start a season opener for the Buffaloes since Linda Lappe in 1998, had 13 points and six rebounds. Junior guard **Whitney Law** had a career-high 10 points and five rebounds off the bench.

Colorado trailed 16-13 with 6:46 remaining in the first half before going on a 14-4 run to end the period. Loyola Marymount closed to within one at 33-32 with 15:53 in regulation, but the Buffs scored nine straight on 3-point field goals from Nedovic and Law with a 3-point play from Richards in between. Colorado, which shot 51.7 from the field in the second half (15-of-29), never let the lead dip below eight after its 9-0 run.

SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITIONS: Colorado went 2-0 during its exhibition schedule, defeating a pair of NCAA Division II Tournament teams from 2003-04. Freshman **Jackie McFarland** scored a game-high 25 points off the bench as the Buffaloes defeated the University of South Dakota 81-69 on Nov. 12. McFarland hit 10-of-15 from field and grabbed eight rebounds. Sophomore **Jasmina Ilic** also scored 20 points off the bench and sparked a 20-7 run in the second half allowing the Buffs to pull away. Senior forward **Sarah Lini** had eight points and eight rebounds while senior **Veronica Johns-Richardson** pitched in eight points and seven boards. In the exhibition opener, Johns-Richardson scored 22 points to lead Colorado to a 99-68 win over Fort Lewis College on Nov. 7. Johns-Richardson hit 8-of-13 from the field, including 4-of-9 from beyond the arc, as the Buffaloes hit 51.9 percent overall as a team (40-of-77). Freshman center **Kara Richards** made a strong debut for the Buffaloes recording a double-double with 13 points and a game-high 14 rebounds. In all five Buffs scored in double digits. Sophomore forward **Anna Nedovic** had 17 points and eight rebounds, Ilic had 16 points and **Tami Garnett** pitched in 12.

ABOUT THE QUAKERS... Pennsylvania has started the 2004-05 season at 2-0 and is coming off a thrilling 51-49 win against La Salle in Philadelphia on Nov. 23. Senior guard Amanda Kammes capped off a career-high 12-point evening with a finger-roll layup as time expired to clinch the win. Kammes' winning bucket came from a Karen Habrukowich half-court pass with three seconds remaining in regulation. The Quakers opened the 2004-05 season with a 76-48 home win over Northeastern on Nov. 19. Senior guard Cat Makarewich netted a career-high 23 points on a school-record tying seven 3-point field goals earning Ivy League and Big 5 Player of the Week honors.

COLORADO-PENN SERIES... Colorado and Pennsylvania have only met once before, an 84-38 Buffaloes' win in Boulder on Jan. 3, 1987.

ABOUT THE TIGERS... LSU has started the 2004-05 season 5-0, proving worthy of its No. 2 national ranking in the latest *USA Today*/ESPN/WBCA and Associated Press Top 25 polls. The Tigers are led by 2004 Kodak All-American and National Player of the Year candidate Seimone Augustus who is averaging 21.4 points, four rebounds and three assists while hitting 57 percent from the field through five games. Augustus is joined in the back court by senior Temeka Johnson, a first-team All-Southeastern Conference performer, who is averaging 9.4 points while dishing out 5.4 assists per contest. LSU also sports one of the best freshman in the country in 6-5 center Sylvia Fowles who is second on the Tigers' in scoring 11.4 and leads in rebounding (8.8 rpg) off the bench.

ABOUT THE TERRAPINS... Maryland has won its two opening games by a combined 41 points and is currently ranked No. 22 in both the *USA Today*/ESPN/WBCA and Associated Press Top 25 polls. Sophomore guards Shay Doron and Kalika France, both members of the 2004 Atlantic Coast Conference All-Freshman team, have combined for 70 points, 18 rebounds and 17 assists over the Terrapins' first two contests. Freshman forward Laura Harper averaged 12 points and 10.5 rebounds over the season's first two games.

COLORADO-LSU SERIES...Colorado leads its series with LSU 2-1. The Buffaloes earned both of their wins against the Tigers during the 2001-02 season. CU topped LSU 86-65 on Dec. 29, 2001, during the Triple Crown Classic in Lubbock, Texas and then hosted the Tigers in the second round NCAA Tournament, coming away with a 69-58 victory. LSU's lone win in the series came on Dec. 2, 1989, a 63-60 decision, in Columbus, Ohio.

COLORADO-MARYLAND SERIES...A Colorado-Maryland game on Saturday would mark the first ever meeting between the two programs. The Buffaloes are 3-3 against the ACC with their last win coming over North Carolina, 86-67, in the second round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament.

RICHARDS NAMED BIG 12 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK...True freshman center **Kara Richards** was named the Big 12 Women's Basketball Rookie of the Week in the first awards announced for the 2004-05 season. Players are nominated by each school's sports information office and voted on by a panel of media who cover Big 12 women's basketball. Richards, a 6-4 freshman center, averaged 13.5 points, three rebounds and 1.5 blocks in her first two collegiate games. The Graham, Texas, native scored 13 points and pulled down six rebounds in her first game, a Colorado win over Loyola Marymount. She was the first Buff freshman to start the season opener since Linda Lappe in 1998. Richards hit 7-of-10 from the floor for 14 points in CU's loss to Nevada.

A BARRY GOOD MILESTONE...By coaching the Buffaloes against Loyola Marymount in the season opener, head coach **Ceal Barry** passed legendary track & field coach Frank Potts for the most events coaches in school history at 642. She already holds the CU record for wins in any sport (419) and has coached in more games (643) than any coach in school history.

FOR OPENERS...Colorado improved to 26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of its last 18. The Buffs are 19-3 under Ceal Barry in season-opening games and have won the last five. This season marked the first time since the 1999-2000 season the Buffs didn't open the season in Boulder (at Denver) and the first time since 1996-97 (at BYU) the Buffs didn't begin the season in the state of Colorado.

NOVEMBER SUNSHINE...Colorado is 87-21 (.811) overall in regular season games during the month of November including a whopping 72-8 (.900) at home. CU was 5-1 in November last year including its 67-63 overtime win over No. 15/16 Notre Dame in the WBCA Classic championship game. The Buffs' lone loss came to eventual Women's Final Four participant Minnesota, 95-61, in Minneapolis.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENTS...Colorado is 85-30 all-time in preseason tournaments, including a solid 29-5 mark in the Coors Classic. The Buffaloes have won 22 of their last 27 preseason tournament games and went 5-1 last season winning the WBCA Classic and Coors Classic Tournament championships.

COORS CLASSIC 2003...Colorado claimed its 12th Coors Classic title in 17 years with a 74-63 win over California at the Coors Events Center on No. 29. Senior Tera Bjorklund was named tournament MVP with 21 points and nine rebounds in the championship game while Randie Wirt was named to the All-Tournament team. Colorado defeated Idaho State 95-65 in the first round while California defeated Lehigh 74-66 to reach the title game. Idaho State topped Lehigh 95-52 for the consolation crown.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUFFS...The Colorado Athletic Department and Fox Sports Rocky Mountain have agreed to televise seven Buffs' women's basketball games this season. Add that to the three national Fox Sports Network games scheduled through a combination of Big 12 and Pac 10 Conference pacts, CU women's basketball is scheduled for a school-record 10 regular season television games this winter.

TOUGH SCHEDULE...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing nine teams that played in the 2004 NCAA tournament. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as seven members played in the NCAA's a season ago, with Texas and Baylor making the Sweet 16. Colorado's Coors Classic alone features three teams who played in the NCAA Tournament last season. The Buffs will open with Pennsylvania and then play either LSU, a 2004 Women's Final Four participant or Maryland.

HEAD COACH CEAL BARRY...Ceal Barry is in her 22nd season at Colorado, and 26th overall has a collegiate head coach. Barry's overall coaching record is 502-266 with the win total ranking 20th among active NCAA Division I coaches. At Colorado Barry has led the Buffaloes to a 419-224 record, including 13 20-win seasons and 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

As a head coach Barry is 1-0 against Pennsylvania, 2-1 against LSU and has never faced Maryland.

BUFFS PICKED SEVENTH, SIXTH IN BIG 12 POLLS...Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Big 12 Coaches Preseason poll while the media said the Buffaloes would finish sixth in their preseason poll. Texas was the overwhelming favorite in both polls. The Longhorns received 11 of 12 first place votes in the coaches poll (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own teams) and 12 of 14 first place votes in the media poll. Colorado was picked fifth in both the 2003-04 and 2002-03 preseason polls only to achieve a higher standing by the end of the season. CU enjoyed a third-place finish last season and a fourth-place showing in 2002-03. The Buffs have not finished lower than fourth in the Big 12 standings since the 1999-2000 season.

NATIONAL POLLS...Colorado was not ranked in either of the major polls this week. Seven of CU's potential opponents are in the current top 25 including four in the top 15. LSU, a possible Coors Classic opponent came in at No. 2 just behind preseason favorite Tennessee. Texas is fourth in both polls, Baylor is ninth in the AP poll and 12th in the coaches poll. Texas Tech is 11th in the coaches poll and 12th in the AP poll. Kansas is 16th in both polls, Maryland is 22nd in both polls and Oklahoma is 21st in the AP poll and 23rd in the coaches poll.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 317-90 (.779) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 284-69 (.804). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 232-68 (.773) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s. The Buffs will enter the 2004-05 regular season riding a two game home win streak.

THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain on Friday evenings at 7:30 p.m. Hosted by Sandy Williams, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

UP NEXT...Next week Colorado will travel north for a border war with Wyoming in Laramie on Wednesday, Dec. 1, at 7 p.m. The Buffaloes will then return to the Coors Events Center to face Creighton on Saturday, Dec. 4, at 7 p.m.
