OPENING TIP: Colorado is playing SMU for the first time since the 1979-80 season and holds a 3-1 advantage with a pair of victories in 1949 and other in 1979. The Mustangs defeated CU during the 1979-80 season. Tonight's game is doubleheader with the nationally ranked CU women, who play Pepperdine at 5:30 p.m., followed by the men at 8 p.m.

FOR STARTERS: CU has won seven games this season, equaling their total from last season • CU is 5-0 this season when shooting over 50 percent from the field, including their last two games (.533) • Richard Roby is averaging 23.3 points, 10.0 rebounds and shooting 49.0 percent in the last three contests • During his last five games, Marcus Hall has logged an average of 37.2 minutes with 13.0 points, 3.8 rpg., 3.6 apg. • Hall moved into seventh place on CU's all-time assists list passing Gordon Torp with 336 • Senior forward Marcus King-Stockton is averaging 6.7 rebounds over his last three games • Hall, Roby and Cory Higgins have started every game (12) • Hall and Roby have netted double-figures 10 of 12 games • Roby has led CU in scoring six times (including each of the last three), Hall five times, Xavier Silas, once • With seven career double-doubles, Roby is tied with Chauncey Billups for 27th place in school history • In his last three games, Higgins is averaging 12.6 ppg., 5.3 apg., 3.7 rpg., 2.0 apg. • Over the last two seasons, Xavier Silas has the most 3-pointers with 57, followed by Richard Roby (51), Marcus Hall (22), Levi Knutson (12), Cory Higgins (10) and Dwight Thorne (9).

six different leading scorers. The Mustangs are coached by former North Carolina great Matt Doherty, who enters his second year in Dallas. As a player under legendary head coach Dean Smith from 1980-84, Doherty became only the second player in ACC history to post 1,000 points, 400 rebounds and 400 assists.

CONFERENCE USA: Tonight is the first of two back-to-back match ups for the Buffaloes against Conference USA. After playing SMU on Friday, CU returns to the home court to play the Tulsa Golden Hurricane (7-4). The Buffs are 13-16 all-time against Conference USA.

NEXT FOUR DAYS: CU is playing three times over 10 days, including twice in four days. After playing SMU on Friday, the Buffs turn around and host Tulsa (7-4) on Monday, Jan. 7. It will be the

first time since the 1986-87 season that CU will be playing the Golden Hurricane.

M.I.A.: Sophomore guard Dwight Thorne will miss at least one game (SMU) and is day-to-day after suffering a joint effusion with a associated bone contusion (deep knee bruise) against Grambling State. Thorne is averaging 3.9 points and 1.7 rpg., and 1.0 apg. He is coming off his second career double-digit game (10 pts.) against Grambling State.

TEAM LEADERS: CU's leading scorers are Richard Roby (15.9 ppg.) and Marcus Hall (13.3 ppg.); leader on the glass is Roby (6.3 rpg.) and Jermyl Jackson-Wilson (4.9 rpg.); Hall tops the team in assists (3.4 apg.), steals (1.8 spg.) and 22 3-pointers.

ROBY WATCH: Richard Roby has led the team in scoring six times this year, including each of the last three outings. He is averaging 23.3 points and 10.0 rebounds while shooting 49.0 percent in the last three contests. Roby is inching his way up the school's all-time career scoring list with 1,647 points (sixth overall). Roby is 34 points from passing Emmett Lewis (1,680, 1976-79) and is first in team scoring (15.9 ppg.).

SEASONED VETERAN?: With 12 starts already under his belt, freshman Cory Higgins is making the most of his initial season. Higgins recorded his sixth double-digit scoring game with a season-best 15 points against Grambling; led the team in assists for the second straight game (7 at CSU, 6 vs. GSU) and is one of three players shooting 50 percent or better (38-of-76). He also has 10 3-pointers, ranking fifth overall.

COOL AT THE LINE: For the first time in 12 seasons, the Buffaloes are shooting a respectable 71.2 percent from the free throw (that's third in the Big 12). With under two minutes to play in the game, Marcus Hall is a perfect 18-of-18 during that stretch, while the team is 31-of-38 (.816 percent).

IRON MAN: Marcus Hall did not play 40 minutes against New Orleans (37 minutes), ending his streak of 161 consecutive minutes played. From Nov. 29-Dec. 22, Hall played 196 out of 200 possible minutes spanning five games (40 each at Air Force, Stanford, at Wyoming, New Orleans, at Colorado State)

BIG 12 OPENER: The Big 12 Conference season opener looms closer with a trip to College Station to take on the No. 12/10 nationally ranked Texas A&M Aggies, Saturday, Jan. 12 (ESPN Plus). Conference openers have not been kind to CU since the Big 12 inception, registering a 1-10 record (0-4 on the road). They have also lost their last 10 in a row conference openers.

20+ : Richard Roby has a team-best four 20-point games of the season (35th career). He also recorded seven career double-doubles (this season: New Or-

leans, Colorado State) and grabbed a season-best 14 boards against the Privateers.

3-POINT STREAK: Dating back to the 2001-02 season, CU has made a 3-pointer in 175 consecutive games. Last time they failed to make at least one trey was Jan. 16, 2002 against Iowa State in Boulder. The Buffs won 63-61.

REDSHIRT YEAR: Sophomore forward Jeremy Williams will be redshirted this season and will return next year with three full years of eligibility. He was academically ineligible for the fall semester. Williams averaged 7.7 points and 4.6 rpg. last season with 18 starts.

20-20: For the first time this season, Richard Roby fired up 20 shots making nine of them against New Orleans. Over his last four years when Roby has 20 attempts, the Buffalos win (CU is 5-3). Here's a breakdown from his freshmen year to the present.

CU IN THE PRO WORLD: There is a number of CU basketball members with ties to the professional ranks. From head coach Jeff Bzdelik to the five student-athletes.

Coach Bzdelik: Head Coach of the Denver Nuggets (2002-05);

Casey Crawford: father, Steve played with the Boston Red Sox;

Cory Higgins: father, Rod played in the NBA from 1982-95, currently the general manager of the Charlotte Bobcats;

Richard Roby: half-brother of Kenyon Martin (Denver Nuggets);

Xavier Silas: father, James, played professionally for 10 years, eight years with the San Antonio Spurs;

Dwight Thorne II: cousin Acie Law IV played for the Texas A&M Aggies and great uncle, Ernie Banks played with the Chicago Cubs.

BUFF BITS: Against Grambling State, CU performed a number of season-highs: points (93), FGS made (37), attempts (71), offensive rebounds (15), defensive rebounds (29), rebounds (44), blocks (8) an tied steals (11) • Five players netted 10 or more points, a season-first • The 46-point win over GSU was the most lopsided win for CU since blasting Savannah State by 64 points (116-52, Jan. 3, 2006) • The Buffaloes' win at Moby Arena was CU's first in four years and it snapped the Rams' 24-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents • CU had a team-high 21 assists and shooting percentage .549 at CSU • CU shot a season-high 33 3-pointers at Wyoming, their most since attempting 34 at Nebraska (Feb. 22, 2006) • Hall, Higgins, Knutson are the only players with more assists than turnovers • CU won three straight games for the first time since 2005-06 when they won five straight • Senior Marcus King-Stockton did not play at Air Force marking the first time he did not play in a game since his freshman season (Mar. 2 at Nebraska), a string of 66 consecutive games • For the first time since the 1998-99 season, CU won back-to-back road games (at Denver, at Air Force) • The Buffaloes win at Air Force ending the Falcons' 38-game home winning streak against non-conference foes • DU's 44 points were the fewest allowed by a CU team since a 71-44 win over Tennessee State on Dec. 19, 2003 • Xavier Silas' 24 points are the first 20+ point game on the road since Richard Roby's 21 at Iowa State (Feb. 21, 2007).

FUN 'n SUN: For the next two seasons the Buffaloes will be making multiple trips to the Hawaiian Islands. Next season, CU will be making their first-ever trip to the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu. In 2009-10, CU will play in the Maui Invitational. Hosted by Division II college Chaminade, and sponsored by EA Sports, the Buffaloes will be one of eight schools participating in the 26th edition of the tournament. Joining CU two years from now will be Arizona, Gonzaga, Louisville, Maryland, Vanderbilt, and Wisconsin.

ROSTER CHANGES: In the 2007-08 media guide, senior guard Richard Roby and freshman guard Cory Higgins are listed as #23 and #20, respectively. Both of those numbers are retired (#20 Cliff Meely, 1968-71; #22 by Burdette Halderson, 1952-55). Roby now wears #23 (the # worn his freshman, sophomore, junior seasons); Higgins has selected #11.

NO NAME JERSEYS: For the first time in many years the 2007-08 Buffaloes will not have their last name on the back of their uniforms. It was an idea always discussed in recent years, but never followed through until head coach Jeff Bzdelik decided that the name on the front is more important than the one on the back.

MEDIA GUIDE CORRECTION: On page 59 of the 2007-08 CU media guide it states that Cory Higgins' father, Rod is the general manager of the Golden State Warriors. In fact, he's the GM with the Charlotte Bobcats.

(Brewster Academy [Wolfeboro, N.H.]/Stony Brook). Both are redshirt sophomores with three years of eligibility remaining.

NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENTS: Head coach Jeff Bzdelik announced the signing of five student-athletes for the 2008-09 season during the NCAA early signing period. They are **Javonte Clanton, Austin Dufault, Trey Eckloff, Nate Tomlinson** and **Toby Veal**.

"I couldn't be more pleased with the signing of these five young men," Bzdelik said. "All of them will have a major impact on the future of Colorado Basketball. This is a class filled with quality and depth."

Clanton, a 6-foot, 185-pound guard from Reynoldsburg, Ohio will be a junior-transfer from Blinn Community College (Brenham, Texas). Clanton was one of five candidates for the 20th annual Mr. Ohio Basketball as a senior at Reynoldsburg High School where he averaged 23.1 points and 6.0 assists per game as a senior.

"Javonte brings experience, toughness, and a high skill level to blend in well within the Colorado system," Bzdelik said of the former (AP) Ohio Central District Player of the Year.

Dufault, a 6-8, 210-pound, power forward from Killdeer, N.D. averaged 20 points and eight rebounds per game leading Killdeer High School to 19 wins as a junior. He is rated as a three-star

athlete at ScoutHoops.com (33rd overall, power forward).

"Son of a coach, Austin brings a high school basketball IQ and a great shooting touch from long range," Bzdelik said. "His skill and 3.9 grade point average are a perfect fit for the University of Colorado."

Eckloff, a 6-9, 220-pound forward is from Englewood, Colo. Eckloff is three-star prospect by ScoutHoops.com as the 22nd rated center. He averaged eight points, six rebounds, and more than a block shot per game as a junior for Cherry Creek High School.

"Trey is a versatile, young big man who can pass, dribble, and shoot from long range," Bzdelik said. "Trey is also a perfect fit for the Colorado system, and he also excels in the classroom with a 3.9 GPA."

Tomlinson, a 6-2, 180-pound point-guard is from Lee Academy (Maine). The native Australian was a member of Australia's 19-and-under national team this past summer, and is three-star prospect by Rivals.com and Scout.com.

"Nate combines a high basketball IQ with great shooting and passing skills," Bzdelik said. "Both of his parents have a rich basketball background in Australia."

Veal is a 6-7, 210-pound power forward from Savannah, Ga., averaged 19 points and 12 rebounds as a junior at Johnson High School. Another three-star prospect by ScoutHoops.com, he is rated 86th of the top-100 Hoop Scoop prospects and the 32nd power forward overall.

"An explosive athletic rebounder and finisher around the rim," Bzdelik said. "Toby has the potential to be one of the premier rebounders and defenders in the Big 12."

With three scholarship seniors on the current roster, CU will have a youthful presence during the 2008-09 season with one senior (Jermyl Jackson-Wilson), three juniors (Xavier Silas, Dwight Thorne II, Jeremy Williams) and four sophomores (Casey Crawford, Cory Higgins, Levi Knutson, Caleb Patterson).

HEAD COACH JEFF BZDELIK

1st Season at Colorado/5th College Season Overall

Jeff Bzdelik, a man synonymous with success on both the professional and college levels in the state of Colorado, was named the 17th men's basketball head coach for the University of Colorado men's basketball program, athletic director Mike Bohn announced April 4, 2007.

Bzdelik (buzz-DEL-ik), 55, comes to Colorado from the United States Air Force Academy, where he guided the Falcons to a 50-16 record (a 75.8 winning percentage) in two seasons from 2005-07. During those two seasons he led the Falcons to a 2005-06 NCAA Tournament and a 2006-07 NIT Final Four appearance.

Bzdelik brings 29 years of coaching experience to the Boulder campus from the collegiate to the professional ranks. He returned to the college game in 2005-06 after 15 seasons as both a coach and scout in the NBA, including two-and-a-half seasons as head coach of the Denver Nuggets.

His two-year win total of 50 victories at the Academy was a school-best in any two-year span of the 51-year history of Air Force basketball, while his 26 victories in 2006-07 was also a school high. He's the only coach to have won at least 24 games in back-to-back seasons. Bzdelik guided the Falcons to a 31-1 home record, including a 15-0 mark in 2005-06 and 16-1 in 2006-07.

In 2005-06, Bzdelik led the Falcons to a 24-7 record and the school's fourth appearance ever in the NCAA Tournament. He also led the Falcons to a 12-4 record and second place finish in the Mountain West Conference. Air Force also capped the season leading the nation for the fourth consecutive season in scoring defense.

Prior to returning to the college ranks with the Air Force Academy, Bzdelik was the Denver Nuggets head coach for two-and-a-half seasons (2002-2005). He was named head coach in August of 2002 after spending one year as a scout for the Nuggets. Bzdelik engineered one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history during his second season in 2003-04, leading the Nuggets to the playoffs for the first time since 1994-95 while posting a 43-39 record. The 26-game improvement over the previous year was the sixth-best in NBA history.

Bzdelik also became the first coach in league history (since the adoption of an 82-game sched-

ule) to guide a team to the playoffs the year after winning less than 20 games. In his first season, Bzdelik earned NBA-wide praise for Denver's competitiveness, work ethic and never-give-up attitude. Despite having the youngest team in franchise history, Bzdelik's team shattered the franchise record for scoring defense by more than five points per game, giving up only 92.4 per outing. In addition, the Nuggets led the league in turnovers forced (17.1 per game) and had six of the top 12 marks for single-season scoring defense.

Surprisingly to many, he was let go by the Nuggets after just 28 games into the 2004-05 season, with the team off to a 13-15 start. But that decision would eventually become Air Force's and now Colorado's gain.

From 1995-2001, Bzdelik was an assistant coach under Pat Riley in Miami, holding the title of Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting during the final two years. With the Heat, he was responsible for the preparation of all game plans, video coordination and statistical data as well as player development.

In 2000, he was recognized by USA Today as one of the NBA's top five assistant coaches. In the 1998 Pro Basketball issue of Sports Illustrated, he was voted as the NBA's best advance scout by league general managers.

Prior to his tenure with the Heat, Bzdelik spent the 1994-95 season as the lead scout for Riley and the New York Knicks. He also served as an assistant coach with the Washington Bullets from 1988-94 and was Wes Unseld's first assistant in 1993-94. In addition, he coached the Bullets summer league team in 1988 and 1994.

The Illinois native began his coaching career in 1978 at Davidson (N.C.) College. In 1980, he was named an assistant coach at Northwestern University where he spent six seasons and was instrumental in the Wildcats' first NIT appearance in school history.

He then accepted his first head coaching position at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, one he would handle for two years before moving on to the NBA.

During the 1986-87 season at UMBC, his squad was cited by The Sporting News as having "One of College's Biggest Turnarounds," in the school's inaugural season in Division I. After going just 11-44 the previous two seasons as a Divi-

sion II program before Bzdelik's arrival, UMBC went 12-16 in his first year and 13-15 in 1987-88 in Division I. His teams excelled in the classroom as well, posting a 2.86 grade point average during his tenure.

Bzdelik is a 1976 graduate of the University of Illinois-Chicago, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned four varsity letters in basketball at UIC and was named team MVP as a senior in 1975-76. He still holds the school record for the best free-throw percentage in one season, shooting 88.1 percent (59-for-67) from the line in 1975-76 and still ranks among UIC's all-time leading scorers.

Bzdelik also spent six years in the Army National Guard during the early to mid 1970s.

He was born December 1, 1952 and graduated from Prospect High School in Mount Prospect, Ill. He is married to the former Nina Bernardzik, who was a standout volleyball player at UIC between 1974-76 and is a member of the Flames' Athletic Hall of Fame. They are the parents of two children, Brett (18) and Courtney (16).

Lobos Hold On, Defeat Buffs, 54-57

BOULDER, Colo. (AP/CU Sports Info.) - J.R. Giddens 18-foot jumper in the corner with 33 seconds remaining helped New Mexico to a 54-47 victory over Colorado, Friday evening at the Coors Events Conference Center.

After Marcus Hall converted a driving layup with 1:04 remaining in the game, cutting the Lobos deficit to 50-47, the UNM countered with Giddens' jump shot as the visitors won their first season-opening road game since the 1979-1980 season.

Buffaloes senior guard Richard Roby, who averaged 17.3 points last season, was nearly shut out for the first time in his career. His only point came on a free throw with 1:16 remaining that pulled Colorado to 50-45.

The Buffs trailed by double digits most of the game but began its run on Xavier Silas' 3-pointer with 2:20 remaining that cut the Lobos' lead to 49-43.

Bzdelik, a former coach of the Denver Nuggets and the Air Force Academy, bolted for Boulder after leading the Falcons to a 50-16 mark in two seasons, including a trip to the NIT Final Four last season. He replaced Ricardo Patton, who was let go after 11 years and a 7-20 season.

It was the largest attended regular season opening game in 26 years of the Coors Events Center.

The Lobos, who beat the Buffs 106-65 last season in Albuquerque, jumped out to an early lead and took a 30-19 cushion into the locker room after closing the first half on a 9-2 run that featured a 3-pointer and two free throws by Wills.

Roby, who ranks seventh on Colorado's all-time scoring list, was one of two Buffaloes starters shut out in the first half. The other was Hall, who redshirted last season and underwent minor thumb surgery last month.

Hall scored all of Colorado's nine points over the first 10:18 of the second half, but his teammates went cold and New Mexico maintained a double-digit lead. Hall then committed charges on back-to-back possessions, one of them wiping off a basket for the Buffs.

Freshman Cory Higgins added 10 points, five rebounds and three steals for Colorado.

Buff Rattle Florida A&M, 83-59

MADISON, Wis. (AP/CU Sports Info.) - Xavier Silas scored 24 points to lead Colorado to an 83-59 victory over Florida A&M, Thursday in the opening game of the America's Youth Classic.

The sophomore guard was 8-of-11 from the floor and scored 18 points in the first half as the Buffaloes (1-1) opened up a huge lead early and were never seriously threatened. Silas also had a career-best five assists.

Silas' jumper with 10:28 left in the first half gave Colorado a 25-7 lead.

The Rattlers (1-1), the defending Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference tournament champions, could get no closer than eight points the rest of the way.

Jermyl Jackson-Wilson scored 11 points, while Cory Higgins, Richard Roby and Levi Knutson each added 10 for the Buffaloes.

Marcus Hall added nine points, four rebounds and his four assists, bring his career total to 303. He also collected three steals.

Akini Akini paced Florida A&M with 21 points. The 6-foot-10 senior forward scored eight points during a 20-10 Rattler spurt that cut Colorado's lead to 35-27 just before halftime.

The Buffaloes used an 8-0 run early in the second half to stretch their advantage to 50-33, and the lead remained in double digits.

CU's victory tonight is the first win on a neutral court outside the state of Colorado in the regular season since Dec. 29, 2002 against the University of Loyola-Chicago at the Pepsi Classic (Charlotte, N.C.).

It was the first-ever meeting between the two schools, who are both breaking in new coaches: Eugene Harris at Florida A&M, and former Denver Nuggets head coach Jeff Bzdelik at Colorado.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) - Trevon Hughes scored 18 points as Wisconsin beat Colorado 78-52 in the final game of the America's Youth Classic Saturday night.

The Badgers (4-0) limited backdoor cuts by the up-tempo version of the Princeton-style offense being installed by first-year Buffaloes coach Jeff Bzdelik.

Wisconsin was ahead 44-27 at halftime, shooting 56 percent from the floor and hitting 6-of-13 from 3-point range.

Overall, Colorado shot 49% from the field, making 20-of-41 field goals, including 6-of-14 from the three-point line.

Wisconsin was careful on offense, turning the ball over only nine times. Colorado had 19 turnovers.

Colorado went into the locker room with what the team thought was a 26-19 lead, but Hall's shot at the buzzer was eventually waved off after officials took a second look on the video monitor.

Cardinal Pulls Away in Second Half, 67-43

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) -Anthony Goods and Lawrence Hill each scored 15 points to lift the Stanford Cardinal to a 67-43 win over Colorado on Sunday as part of the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series.

The Cardinal (8-1) have now won four straight since a 12-point loss at Siena on Nov. 17.

Colorado (5-3) had its three-game winning streak snapped. The team was led in scoring by Marcus Hall with 16. He also had four assists as he logged 40 minutes for the second straight game. Hall's four assists (322 career) put him ahead of Billy Law (years played 1990-1992) for eighth place on CU's assists list.

Cory Higgins tied a season-high with 10 points and Richard Roby, the Buffaloes' leading scorer, was held to just seven points.

Robin Lopez, the Cardinal's second-leading scorer, didn't score until the 18:48 mark of the second half. He finished with four points and six rebounds. Taj Finger provided a spark off the bench, scoring 11 points, and Hill grabbed a season-high 10 boards.

Colorado was down by three points, 25-22, after Levi Knutson hit a 3-pointer in the closing seconds of the first half.

However, the Cardinal went on a 16-4 run to start the second half to break open the contest.

The Buffaloes were coming off a 60-50 win at Air Force on Thursday night in coach Jeff Bzdelik's emotional return to the academy. Bzdelik bolted from Air Force to Colorado last April. The team had also won back-to-back road games for the first time since the 1998-99 season.

Stanford showed it was comfortable playing at the Buffaloes' slowed-down pace. The Cardinal scored 13 points under their season average.

The Cardinal won a school-record seven games during a busy November. The schedule slows down in December, though, as the Cardinal won't play again until Dec. 19 when they host Santa Clara.

It was the first meeting between the two schools since the Cardinal's 71-58 win on Nov. 30, 1991. Stanford now leads the all-time series 6-3.
