QUICKLY...The University of Colorado (2-4, 0-0 Big 12 Conference) will host Colorado Sate University (5-1, 0-0 Mountain West Conference) on Wednesday, Dec. 8, at 7 p.m. in the Coors Events Conference Center. The game will be televised live on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain with **Mich Hyder** on the call and **Sandy Williams** with the color commentary.

BUFFS ON THE AIR...All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. **Tim Smile** will handle play by play duties and is joined by USA Basketball's **Carol Callan** with the color commentary.

31st SEASON...Colorado is in the early stages of its 31st season of varsity women's basketball with an all-time record of 579-318 (.645). The Buffaloes have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, all since 1988, including six Sweet 16 appearances and three trips to the Elite Eight (1993, 1995 & 2002).

BUFFS CAN'T STOP JAYS...Creighton forward Angie Janis scored 22 points and grabbed 13 rebounds to lead the Creighton Bluejays to an 84-68 victory over Colorado, Dec. 4, at the Coors Events Conference Center.

Jackie McFarland led the way for the Buffs with a double-double scoring 19 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Colorado trailed by only four at halftime (36-32), but the Bluejays opened the second half on a 12-2 run to build their lead to 48-34 with 14:35 remaining. The Buffaloes responded with an 18-6 run to pull with in two at 54-52 with 10:06 remaining.

Creighton scored six of the next seven points to go up 60-53, but the Buffs responded once again. **Anna Nedovic** hit two 3-pointers in a span of 1:15 as Colorado narrowed the Bluejays lead to 62-59 with 6:18 remaining. However, Creighton's Kristi Woodard responded with 3-pointer of her own just 10 seconds later to put the Bluejays back up by six and the Buffs would not get any closer.

Creighton (4-2) had four players score in double digits including two with 20 or more. Laura Spanheimer had 20 points, Woodard had 19 and Christy Erickson had 12 points with a team-high five assists.

Whitney Law tied a career-high, which she set Wednesday against Wyoming, with 12 points and Nedovic added 16 for the Buffs. Nedovic hit 3-of-5 from the field and was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free-throw line.

RAMS ON A ROLL...Colorado State is enjoying a four-game winning streak since a 22-point loss at then-No. 6 ranked Notre Dame on Nov. 22. The Rams are coming off a 77-36 pounding of Texas-Pan American in Fort Collins on Dec. 4. Junior center Lindsay Thomas, who scored a game-high 16 points against UTPA, is averaging a team-best 13.7 points and 9.8 rebounds per contest. Juniors Melissa Dennett and Vanessa Espinoza join Thomas as players who average double digits per game. Dennett, a 6-2 forward, is scoring 13.5 points per game while averaging nine rebounds. Espinoza, a 5-3 guard, is averaging 12 points per game and has a team-high 25 assists.

COLORADO-COLORADO STATE SERIES...This will be the 36th meeting between Colorado and Colorado State with the Buffaloes holding a commanding 26-9 lead in the series. The Rams have had success in recent years winning three straight from 1999-2001 before the tide turned back to CU with wins in the last two meetings (2002 & 2003). The 26 wins CU has over Colorado State is the second most the Buffs have over a non-conference opponent (32 vs. Wyoming) and the eighth most over all opponents.

2-4 STARTS...It's not that common for Colorado to start off the season 2-4 or lower, in fact its happened just three times (including this season) in the Ceal Barry regime and just five overall. The Buffaloes last

started 2-4 during the 1999-2000 season which was also CU's last year with an overall record of below .500 (10-19).

SOME STREAKS ENDING...Prior to the loss against Creighton, Colorado had won 10 straight games at home following a road loss. The three-game losing streak is also the program's first since the 2001-02 season (78-67 at No. 3 Oklahoma on Jan. 2, 70-68 vs. No. 21 Texas on Jan 6. and 75-72 at No. 14 Kansas State on Jan. 9) and the losses to Wyoming and Creighton are CU's first back-to-back setbacks against unranked teams since the 2000-01 season (72-70 vs. CSU on Dec. 6 and 92-66 at Iowa on Dec. 10).

TWO-FOR-THREE BIG 12 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK...For the second time in three weeks a Colorado women's basketball player has been named the Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week. **Jackie McFarland**, a 6-3 forward, from Derby, Kan., received the honor today from the league office for her performance in games during the week of Nov. 29-Dec. 5.

McFarland led Colorado and established career-highs with 23 points and eight rebounds in CU's five-point loss at Wyoming on Dec. 1. She hit 8-of-14 from the field (.571) and 7-of-8 from the line (.875) against the Cowgirls. She then registered her first career double-double with 19 points and a new career-best 10 rebounds against Creighton on Dec. 4. She hit 9-of-10 from the free-throw stripe and added two blocks, one steal and one assist. For the week McFarland averaged 21.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg and 1.0 bpg.

McFarland, who shared Big 12 Rookie of the Week honors with Texas A&M's Patrice Reado, joins classmate **Kara Richards** who was the league's Rookie of the Week on Nov. 22. Richards was named the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in the first awards announced for the 2004-05 season. She averaged 13.5 points, three rebounds and 1.5 blocks in her first two collegiate games. The Graham, Texas, native scored 13 points and pulled down six rebounds in her first game, a Colorado win over Loyola Marymount. She was the first Buff freshman to start the season opener since Linda Lappe in 1998. Richards hit 7-of-10 from the floor for 14 points in CU's loss to Nevada.

A BARRY GOOD MILESTONE...By coaching the Buffaloes against Loyola Marymount in the season opener, head coach **Ceal Barry** passed legendary track & field coach Frank Potts for the most events coaches in school history at 642. She already holds the CU record for wins in any sport (420) and has coached in more games (645) than any coach in school history.

HOWARD LEAVES THE BUFFALOES...Leslie Howard, a 5-10 sophomore forward from Salem, Mo., has left the CU basketball program for personal reasons. Howard played in the first four games of the season averaging 6.3 points and 3.5 rebounds per game including a career-high 14 points against Pennsylvania on Nov. 26. She played 24 games in a Colorado uniform averaging three points and just over one rebound per contest.

FOR OPENERS...Colorado improved to 26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of its last 18. The Buffs are 19-3 under Ceal Barry in season-opening games and have won the last five. This season marked the first time since the 1999-2000 season the Buffs didn't open the season in Boulder (at Denver) and the first time since 1996-97 (at BYU) the Buffs didn't begin the season in the state of Colorado.

DOMINANT IN DECEMBER...Despite a rough start to the month, Colorado is traditionally a strong team in the month of December. The Buffaloes are 134-55 (.709) all-time in the month. Prior to their loss to Wyoming, the Buffaloes had won 12 straight in December dating back to a 61-50 loss at No. 20 Florida on Dec. 21, 2001.

ROPED IN WYOMING...Freshman **Jackie McFarland** led all scorers with a career-high 23 points and pulled down eight rebounds, but it was not enough as the Colorado Buffaloes fell to Wyoming, 72-67, on Dec. 1, in Laramie, Wyo. Colorado had a chance to take the lead in the final minute but **Jasmina Ilic's**

3-point attempt fell short. Wyoming made three free throws to put the game out of reach, including two from Ashley Elliott who led the Cowgirls with 21 points and nine rebounds.

Wyoming came out on fire in the 5 1/2 minutes, shooting 86 percent from the floor including 3-of-4 from behind the arc. The Buffaloes only gave up 15 more field goals on 56 shots during the rest of the game, however, the damage was done at the free-throw line and from 3-point range. The Cowgirls were 20-for-25 from the line and hit nine 3's to hold the Buffs at bay.

SECOND AT COORS...Colorado placed second at the 18th annual Coors Classic, Nov. 26-27, at the Coors Events Center. The Buffaloes took care of business with a 69-49 win over Pennsylvania in the first round, but fell to then No 2 ranked, and now top-ranked, LSU 75-44. Freshman **Kara Richards** was awarded All-Tournament team honors after achieving career-highs with 11 rebounds and six assists against Penn and 10 rebounds, three steals and two blocks against the Tigers. Leslie Howard scored a career-high 14 points against Penn while **Anna Nedovic** and **Whitney Law** each had 10. LSU held Colorado to a school record low 24 percent shooting in the championship game. Preseason Player of the Year candidate Seimone Augustus took home tournament MVP honors.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENTS...Colorado is 86-31 all-time in preseason tournaments, including a solid 30-6 mark in the Coors Classic. The Buffaloes have won 23 of their last 29 preseason tournament games and went 5-1 last season winning the WBCA Classic and Coors Classic Tournament championships.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUFFS...The Colorado Athletic Department and Fox Sports Rocky Mountain have agreed to televise seven Buffs' women's basketball games this season. Add that to the three national Fox Sports Network games scheduled through a combination of Big 12 and Pac 10 Conference pacts, CU women's basketball is scheduled for a school-record 10 regular season television games this winter.

TOUGH SCHEDULE...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing nine teams that played in the 2004 NCAA tournament. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as seven members played in the NCAA's a season ago, with Texas and Baylor making the Sweet 16. Colorado's Coors Classic alone featured three teams who played in the NCAA Tournament last season, Penn, LSU and Maryland.

HEAD COACH CEAL BARRY...Ceal Barry is in her 22nd season at Colorado, and 26th overall has a collegiate head coach. Barry's overall coaching record is 503-269 with the win total ranking 20th among active NCAA Division I coaches. At Colorado Barry has led the Buffaloes to a 420-227 record, including 13 20-win seasons and 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

As a head coach Barry is 11-6 against Colorado State.

BUFFS PICKED SEVENTH, SIXTH IN BIG 12 POLLS...Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Big 12 Coaches Preseason poll while the media said the Buffaloes would finish sixth in their preseason poll. Texas was the overwhelming favorite in both polls. The Longhorns received 11 of 12 first place votes in the coaches poll (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own teams) and 12 of 14 first place votes in the media poll. Colorado was picked fifth in both the 2003-04 and 2002-03 preseason polls only to achieve a higher standing by the end of the season. CU enjoyed a third-place finish last season and a fourth-place showing in 2002-03. The Buffs have not finished lower than fourth in the Big 12 standings since the 1999-2000 season.

NATIONAL POLLS...Colorado was not ranked in either of the major polls this week. Five of CU's 2004-05 opponents are in the current top 25 including four in the top 15. LSU is ranked first in both polls after its 8-0 start. Texas is fourth in both polls, but owns a win over preseason No. 1 Tennessee. In the coaches poll Baylor is 10th, Texas Tech is 13th and Kansas State is 22nd. In the AP poll, Baylor is sixth, Texas Tech is 13th and Kansas State is 25th.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 318-92 (.776) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 285-71 (.801). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 233-70 (.772) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s.

THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain on Friday evenings at 7:30 p.m. Hosted by Sandy Williams, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

UP NEXT...Finals begin at Colorado on Thursday, so the Buffaloes will be off for a season-high 10 days before their next game. Colorado will play its last two road non-conference games on a west coast swing playing at Pacific in Stockton, Calif., on Dec. 18 and at Washington in Seattle on Dec. 21.
