QUICKLY...The University of Colorado (3-4, 0-0 Big 12 Conference) travels to play the University of the Pacific (2-3, 0-0 Big West) on Saturday, Dec. 18, at 6 p.m. MST at the Spanos Center in Stockton, Calif.

BUFFS ON THE AIR...Colorado's game at Pacific will be broadcast live on KHOW AM 630, due to a conflict with the men's game which will air on AM 760. **Tim Smile** will handle play by play duties and is joined by USA Basketball's **Carol Callan** with the color commentary.

31st SEASON...Colorado is in the early stages of its 31st season of varsity women's basketball with an all-time record of 580-318 (.646). The Buffaloes have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, all since 1988, including six Sweet 16 appearances and three trips to the Elite Eight (1993, 1995 & 2002).

BUFFS LOOKING UP...Colorado avoided its longest losing streak in five years with a six point win over intrastate rival Colorado State on Dec. 8 to improve to 3-4 on the young season. Sophomore forward **Anna Nedovic** leads a balanced CU scoring attack at 12.6 points per contest. Nedovic, who also posts a team-high 6.4 rebounds per game, is one of six Buffs averaging at least seven points per game. Freshman forward **Jackie McFarland** is at 10 points an outing, leads the team in free-throw percentage (20x22, .909) and is third in rebounds (5.2 rpg). Classmate **Kara Richards** rounds out CU's front court averaging 9.1 points, 5.6 rebounds and a team-best 1.14 blocks per game. Junior shooting guard Whitney Law is third on the squad in the scoring column (9.4 ppg) and leads the team and Big 12, in 3-point field-goal percentage as she has hit nine of her first 13 shots (.692). Senior point guard **Veronica Johns-Richardson** is averaging just under eight points per contest and paces the Buffaloes in steals (17) and assists (19).

BUFFS ROLL OVER RAMS...**Kara Richards** and **Veronica Johns-Richardson** scored 16 points each as Colorado ended a three-game losing streak with an 83-77 victory over Colorado State on Dec. 8 at the Coors Events Conference Center.

Anna Nedovic added 15 points and a career-high tying 10 rebounds for Colorado (3-4) which defeated Colorado State for the third consecutive time. Nedovic netted her second career double double as the Buffaloes won the battle of the boards (35-30) for the first time in four games.

Richards scored 10 of Colorado's first 22 points in a highly competitive first half in which neither team led by more than five. Leading by two at the break, Colorado opened the second half with an 18-9 run, four coming from Nedovic, to increase its lead to 59-46. Baskets by Lindsay Thomas and Annika Walseth with 4:20 left got Colorado State (5-2) got as close as 71-65.

Johns-Richardson sealed the win with two short jumpers in a 30-second span to make it 75-67. Richards and Johns-Richardson each set career highs in points as the Buffs netted the highest point total in this series since a 91-61 win in Boulder on Dec. 3, 1989. The Buffaloes also reached their highest point total of the young season and it was the first game in which all five starters hit double digits. **Whitney Law** had 11 and was a perfect 3-of-3 from the 3-point line. **Jackie McFarland**, the reigning Big 12 Rookie of the Week, had 10 in her second career start.

PACIFIC ON THE HORIZON...Pacific is making its way through one of the nation's tougher preseason schedules at 2-3 heading into the CU game. The Tigers have faced two Top 10 teams on the road, falling to Stanford (82-26) and Duke (86-30). Pacific's bright spot has been at home where the Tigers are 2-0 with wins over Northern Arizona (59-50) and Weber State (62-56). Sophomore forward Jessica Brantley tops the Tigers in scoring at 7.4 points on a team that averages just 41.6 points per game. The Tigers have been held to 31 points or less in all three of their losses while averaging just over 60 in their two wins. Junior forward Carolina Ruiz is Pacific's top rebounder (6.0 rpg) and is second in scoring (6.2 ppg).

COLORADO-PACIFIC SERIES... This will be the first ever meeting between Colorado and Pacific. The Buffaloes have a favorable record against teams from the Big West Conference over the years sporting a 20-10 mark. Most of CU's games against the Big West have come against Utah State, although those two teams haven't met since 1986. The Buffs are 10-5 all-time against USU.
GARNETT OUT THE NEXT TWO GAMES... Junior center Tami Garnett will miss the next two games after a scope taken last week revealed a meniscus tear in her left knee. She is expected back for the Dec. 29 game against Northern Colorado. Garnett had played in six of the first seven games averaging four points and just over two rebounds per game
TWO-FOR-FOUR BIG 12 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK... The Big 12 Conference has named the Rookie of the Week four times this season, and twice the Buffaloes have been represented. Jackie McFarland , a 6-3 forward, from Derby, Kan., received the honor today from the league office for her performance in games during the week of Nov. 29-Dec. 5.
Jackie McFarland took honors during the week of Nov. 29-Dec. 5 as she led Colorado and established career-highs with 23 points and eight rebounds in CU's five-point loss at Wyoming on Dec. 1. She hit 8-of-14 from the field (.571) and 7-of-8 from the line (.875) against the Cowgirls. She then registered her first career double-double with 19 points and a new career-best 10 rebounds against Creighton on Dec. 4. She hit 9-of-10 from the free-throw stripe and added two blocks, one steal and one assist. For the week McFarland averaged 21.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg and 1.0 bpg.
Kara Richards was the league's first Rookie of the Week for the 2004-05 being named on Nov. 22. She averaged 13.5 points, three rebounds and 1.5 blocks in her first two collegiate games. The Graham, Texas, native scored 13 points and pulled down six rebounds in her first game, a Colorado win over Loyola Marymount. She was the first Buff freshman to start the season opener since Linda Lappe in 1998. Richards hit 7-of-10 from the floor for 14 points in CU's loss to Nevada.
SOLID FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE... One of the bright spots for the Buffaloes this season has been their ability to get to the free-throw line and then cashing in on their opportunity. Colorado leads the Big 12 Conference in free-throw percentage at .731 and has two of the league's top 10 individuals and three of CU's top four in terms of attempts are shooting 80 percent or better. Jackie McFarland leads the way for CU, ranking third in the Big 12 and 22nd in the nation at 90.9 percent (20x22). Anna Nedovic is ninth in the league standings at 81.3 percent (26x32) and is in a four-way tie for the Big 12 lead for the top individual game performance as she hit a perfect 8-of-8 from the line against Creighton. Nedovic actually has equalled McFarland's 20-for-22 performance over the last four games. Sophomore guard Jasmina Ilic has hit 11 of her first 13 attempts to come in at 84.6 percent.
NO RUST FROM FINALS... Colorado's game against Pacific will be its first in 10 days following the University's finals week which ends with Friday's graduation. The Buffs have had little trouble dusting off the cobwebs from Finals week in recent years going 11-3 since the 1990-91 season in the first game after the traditional finals week. Colorado has won two straight in such games with its last loss coming at No. 20 Florida on Dec. 21, 2001.
CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'... Colorado has had recent success against teams from the state of California. The Buffaloes are 10-1 against California squads since the 2000-01 season with the lone loss coming at UC-Santa Barbara in the 2004 NCAA Tournament. The Buffs took care of business against Loyola-Marymount in this year's season opener and have victories against perennial powers Stanford and UCLA during that streak.
GUNNIN FOR .500... The Buffaloes will be looking to climb back to .500 with a win over Pacific. Colorado has only been below .500 twice after eight games. The first time was 1975, CU's first season as a varsity program when the Buffs were just 2-11 overall. Ceal Barry's second season in Boulder, 1984-85, was the only other sub-.500 record after eight games as the Buffs started out 2-8 before ending at 6-22.

SOME STREAKS ENDING...Prior to the loss against Creighton, Colorado had won 10 straight games at home following a road loss. The three-game losing streak is also the program's first since the 2001-02 season (78-67 at No. 3 Oklahoma on Jan. 2, 70-68 vs. No. 21 Texas on Jan 6. and 75-72 at No. 14 Kansas State on Jan. 9) and the losses to Wyoming and Creighton were CU's first back-to-back setbacks against unranked teams since the 2000-01 season (72-70 vs. CSU on Dec. 6 and 92-66 at Iowa on Dec. 10).

A BARRY GOOD MILESTONE...By coaching the Buffaloes against Loyola Marymount in the season opener, head coach **Ceal Barry** passed legendary track & field coach Frank Potts for the most events coaches in school history at 642. She already holds the CU record for wins in any sport (420) and has coached in more games (645) than any coach in school history.

HOWARD LEAVES THE BUFFALOES...Leslie Howard, a 5-10 sophomore forward from Salem, Mo., has left the CU basketball program for personal reasons. Howard played in the first four games of the season averaging 6.3 points and 3.5 rebounds per game including a career-high 14 points against Pennsylvania on Nov. 26. She played 24 games in a Colorado uniform averaging three points and just over one rebound per contest.

FOR OPENERS...Colorado improved to 26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of its last 18. The Buffs are 19-3 under Ceal Barry in season-opening games and have won the last five. This season marked the first time since the 1999-2000 season the Buffs didn't open the season in Boulder (at Denver) and the first time since 1996-97 (at BYU) the Buffs didn't begin the season in the state of Colorado.

DOMINANT IN DECEMBER...Despite a rough start to the month, Colorado is traditionally a strong team in the month of December. The Buffaloes are 135-55 (.710) all-time in the month. Prior to their loss to Wyoming, the Buffaloes had won 12 straight in December dating back to a 61-50 loss at No. 20 Florida on Dec. 21, 2001.

SECOND AT COORS...Colorado placed second at the 18th annual Coors Classic, Nov. 26-27, at the Coors Events Center. The Buffaloes took care of business with a 69-49 win over Pennsylvania in the first round, but fell to then No 2 ranked, and now top-ranked, LSU 75-44. Freshman **Kara Richards** was awarded All-Tournament team honors after achieving career-highs with 11 rebounds and six assists against Penn and 10 rebounds, three steals and two blocks against the Tigers. Leslie Howard scored a career-high 14 points against Penn while **Anna Nedovic** and **Whitney Law** each had 10. LSU held Colorado to a school record low 24 percent shooting in the championship game. Preseason Player of the Year candidate Seimone Augustus took home tournament MVP honors.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENTS...Colorado is 86-31 all-time in preseason tournaments, including a solid 30-6 mark in the Coors Classic. The Buffaloes have won 23 of their last 29 preseason tournament games and went 5-1 last season winning the WBCA Classic and Coors Classic Tournament championships.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUFFS...The Colorado Athletic Department and Fox Sports Rocky Mountain have agreed to televise seven Buffs' women's basketball games this season. Add that to the three national Fox Sports Network games scheduled through a combination of Big 12 and Pac 10 Conference pacts, CU women's basketball is scheduled for a school-record 10 regular season television games this winter.

TOUGH SCHEDULE...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing nine teams that played in the 2004 NCAA tournament. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as seven members played in the NCAA's a season ago, with Texas and Baylor making the Sweet 16. Colorado's Coors Classic alone featured three teams who played in the NCAA Tournament last season, Penn, LSU and Maryland.

HEAD COACH CEAL BARRY...Ceal Barry is in her 22nd season at Colorado, and 26th overall has a collegiate head coach. Barry's overall coaching record is 504-269 with the win total ranking 20th among active NCAA Division I coaches. At Colorado Barry has led the Buffaloes to a 421-227 record, including 13 20-win seasons and 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

As a head coach Barry has never faced Pacific.

BUFFS PICKED SEVENTH, SIXTH IN BIG 12 POLLS...Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Big 12 Coaches Preseason poll while the media said the Buffaloes would finish sixth in their preseason poll. Texas was the overwhelming favorite in both polls. The Longhorns received 11 of 12 first place votes in the coaches poll (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own teams) and 12 of 14 first place votes in the media poll. Colorado was picked fifth in both the 2003-04 and 2002-03 preseason polls only to achieve a higher standing by the end of the season. CU enjoyed a third-place finish last season and a fourth-place showing in 2002-03. The Buffs have not finished lower than fourth in the Big 12 standings since the 1999-2000 season.

NATIONAL POLLS...Colorado was not ranked in either of the major polls this week. Five of CU's 2004-05 opponents are in the current top 25 including four in the top 15. LSU is ranked first in both polls after its 8-0 start. Texas is fourth in both polls, but owns a win over preseason No. 1 Tennessee. In the coaches poll Baylor is ninth, Texas Tech is 12th and Kansas State is 22nd. In the AP poll, Baylor is sixth, Texas Tech is 12th and Kansas State is 25th.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 319-92 (.776) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 286-71 (.801). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 234-70 (.772) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s.
