A NOTE TO OUR FANS AND LETTERMEN ABOUT

MEDIA GUIDES: NCAA legislation (April 2005) limited media guides for all sports to a maximum of 208 pages; this meant at Colorado that we had to cut 284 pages from the previous publication to conform to the new limitation. Most of that came from our in-depth history and records section, which we feel was second-to-none in the nation. Many schools along with CU that labored to pay great tribute to their histories and alumni were unfairly penalized due to those who were wasteful. We at Colorado, along with all other schools in the Big 12 Conference, did not agree with the legislation, but for the immediate future, there are no changes on the horizon. Hopefully, schools one day will be able to return to recording and presenting their history as they desire without these ridiculous limitations. 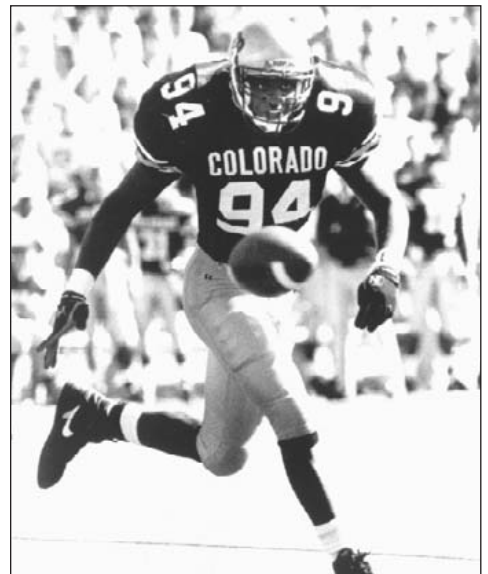

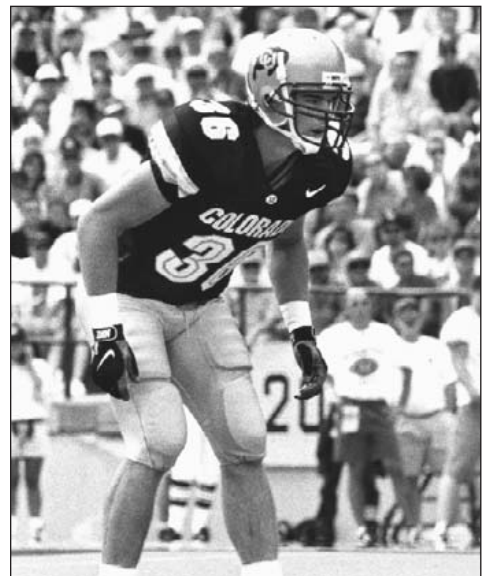

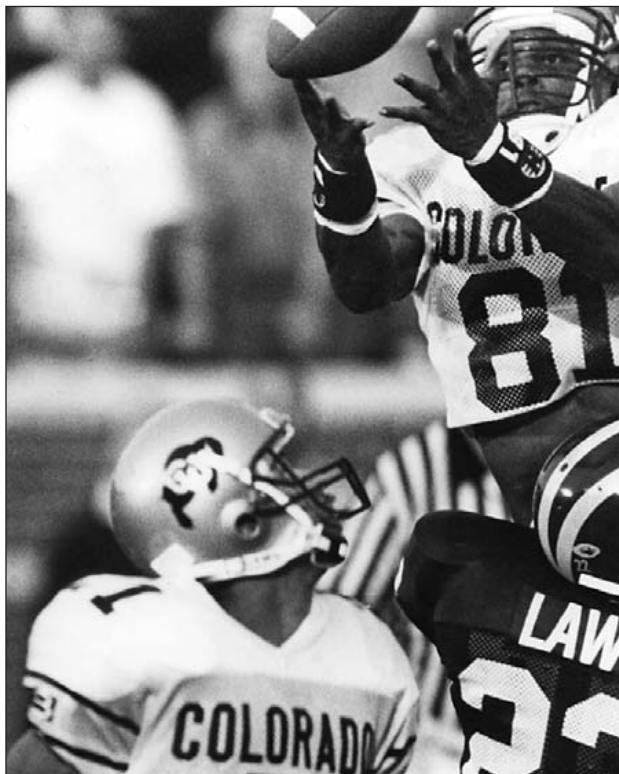
