

- In the 3,000 Meter Steeplechase, there are 35 barriers to cross (including the water pit jumps). Therefore in order to finish the race, you need to answer all 35 questions
- The goal is to finish all 35 questions in 17 minutes, 44.13 seconds (Billy Nelson’s and Jenny Barringer’s PR’s).
- The water jump questions will be the hardest.

- **Register for the Eligibility Center.**

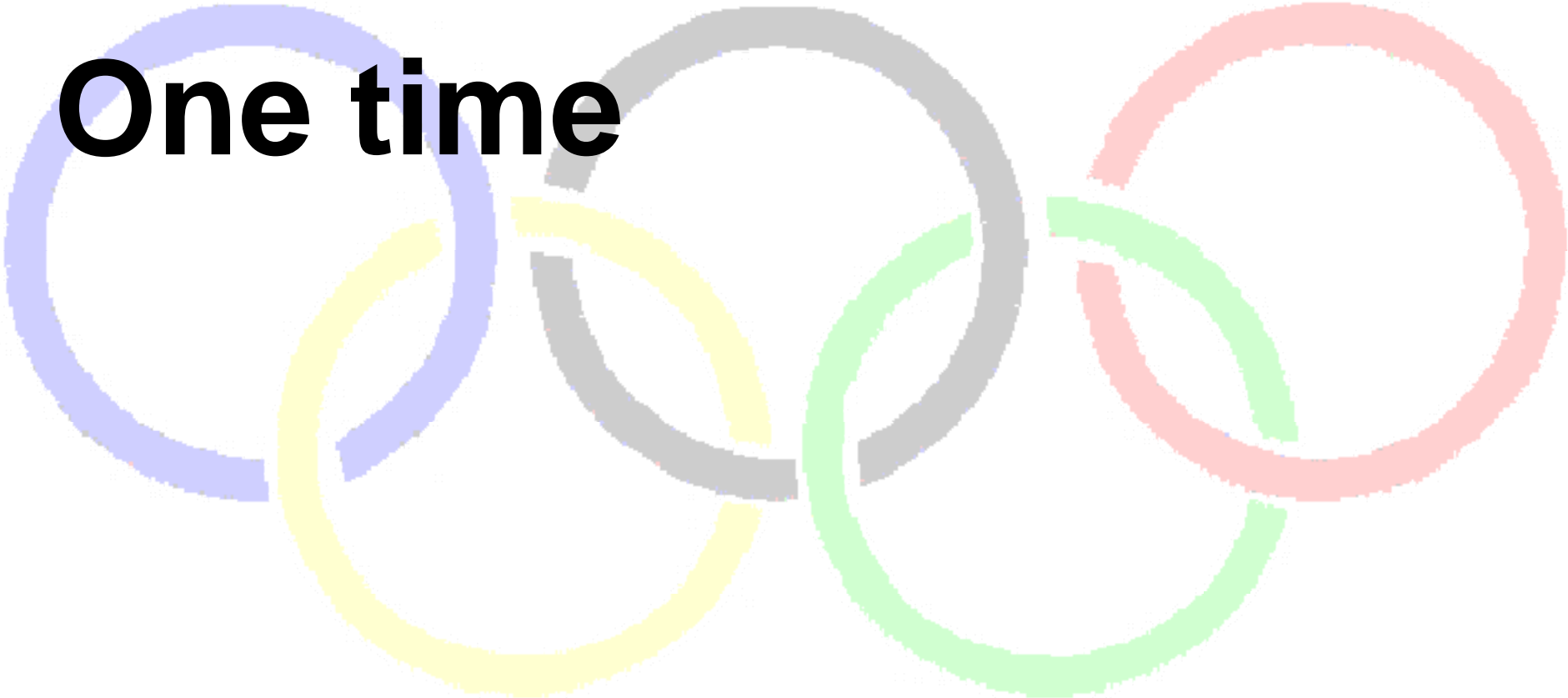


Barrier # 3, Lap 1

If we are recruiting a prospect in three different sports, how many times can that prospect take an official visit to CU?

Answer

One time






Barrier # 4, Lap 1

If WBB has a game at the Pepsi Center, can Men's Golf transport prospects to that game if the prospects are visiting CU unofficially?

Answer

No, WBB is the only sport who can transport unofficial visitors to the game at Pepsi Center because it is their contest

Answer

Answer

- **The prospect**
- **The prospect's parents or guardians.**





Barrier # 2, Lap 2

When does the official visit start if a CU coach picks a prospect up at their home and drives them to CU campus?

Answer

It starts when the coach begins to transport the prospect and his/her parents/guardians to CU campus, not when the vehicle arrives on campus

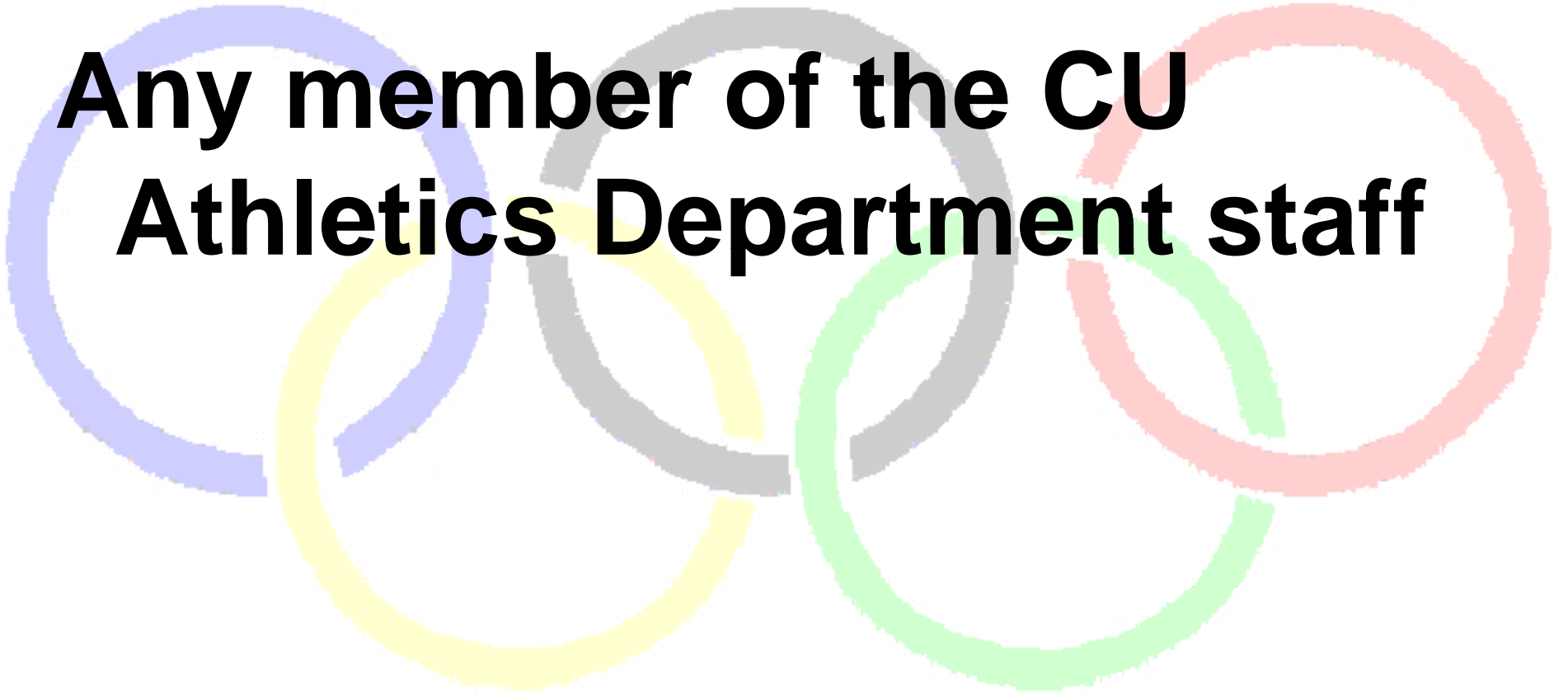


Barrier # 3, Lap 2

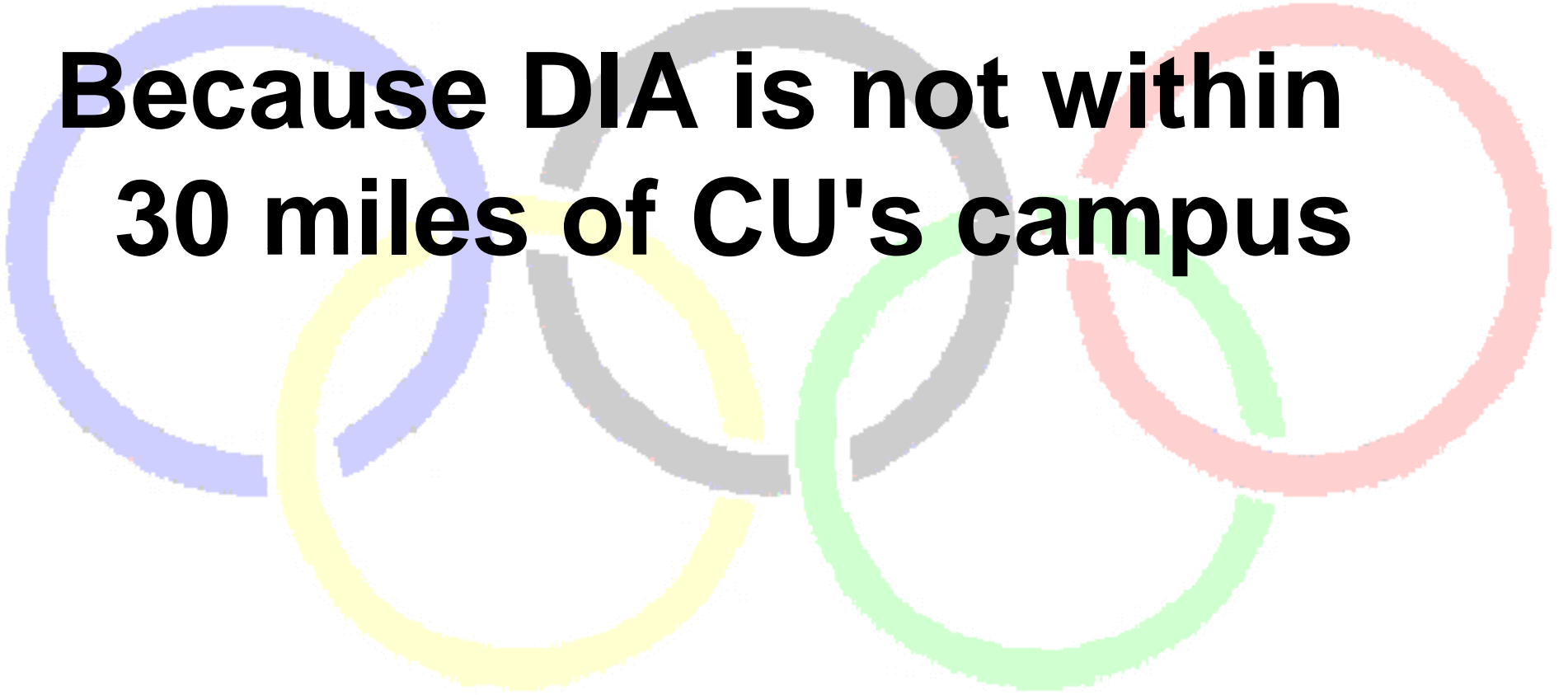


Barrier # 5, Lap 2


Answer

opportunities**



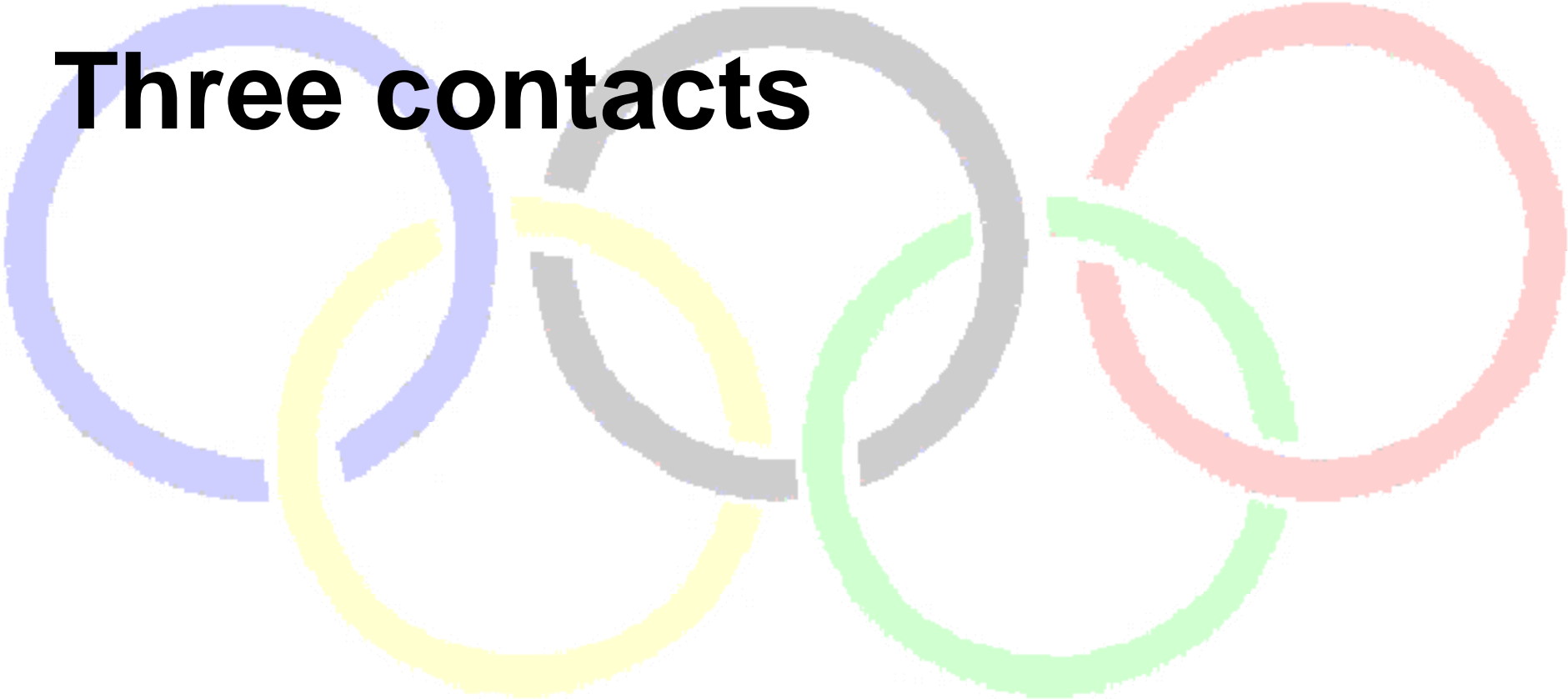

Barrier # 4, Lap 3


You receive a phone call from a prospect, and you request that either Dr. David Clough or Ceal Barry return the phone call.

True or False: you would still have your phone call to use with the prospect?

Answer

False: If the FAR or SWA returns a phone call to a prospect, that counts as a phone call. In sports other than Men's Basketball, you would have to wait until the following week to call that prospect again

Starting on the calendar day after a prospect signs an NLI with CU, how many contacts can you have with that prospect?

Answer


There is no limit on contacts coaches can have with prospects who signed an NLI with CU (in sports other than FB and WBB)

only?**




Answer

No, all camps must be open to the general public, limited only by number of participants, age, grade level and/or gender




Barrier # 2, Lap 4

Can CU HOST any event devoted to agility, flexibility, speed, or strength (e.g. a combine)?



Answer

No, we cannot have anything to do with hosting any "combine-like" activities

Yes, in every sport except football. The event must be off-campus and we cannot have any other involvement.

Any CU coach (except basketball) can be involved in a local sports club. The club must be within a (x) mile radius of CU's campus.

Answer

50 mile radius; in the sport of basketball you can be involved in any other sport **BESIDES basketball.**

If a prospect contacts you via email wanting information about your program, but does not tell you his/her age, how can you respond to that prospect?

Answer

- **You can ask what the prospect's age/grade in school is (ONLY!), and/or**
- **You can refer them to the Admissions office.**
- **Neither example triggers athletic recruitment.**

If the Daily Camera writes a glowing article about you or your program, what are the permissible methods you can send that article to a prospect?

Answer

- **You can make a photocopy of the article and attach it to general correspondence. It must be in black ink on white paper.**
- **You can also send a link of the article to the prospect via email.**
- **You can copy & paste the text of the article and email it to the prospect**

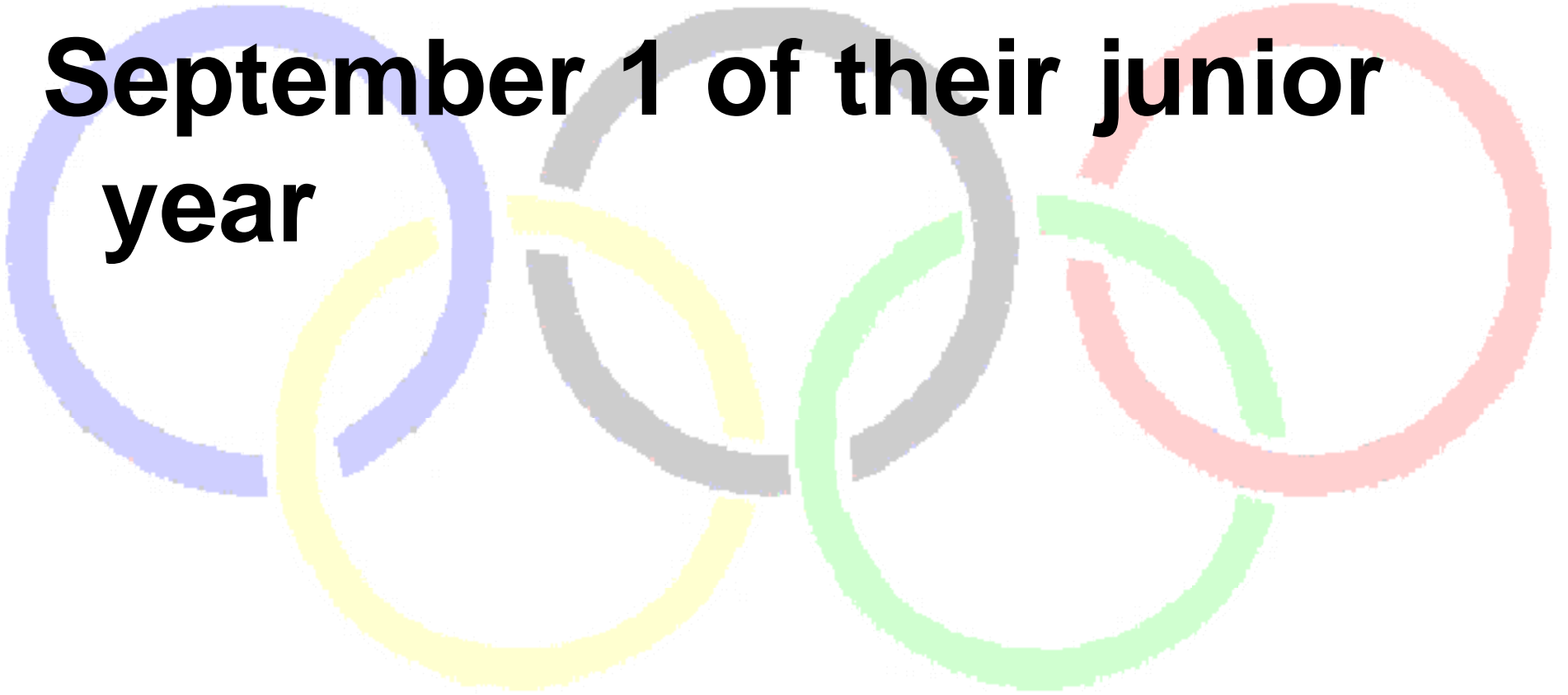



True or False: There are no legislative restrictions on correspondence to PSA's coaches?



Answer

False: All correspondence sent for recruiting is subject to the same restrictions. For example, you could not send a permissible note card to a prospect, then send a note card to a prospect's coach that has a full photo spread with pre-printed information on the inside.



Prospect Issues



Barrier # 1, Lap 7



If one of our incoming freshmen is here for summer school, can that freshman be employed to work the camp of their sport program?

Answer

No, even though the freshman is here for summer school, technically he/she is still a prospect and prospects cannot be employed at our camps

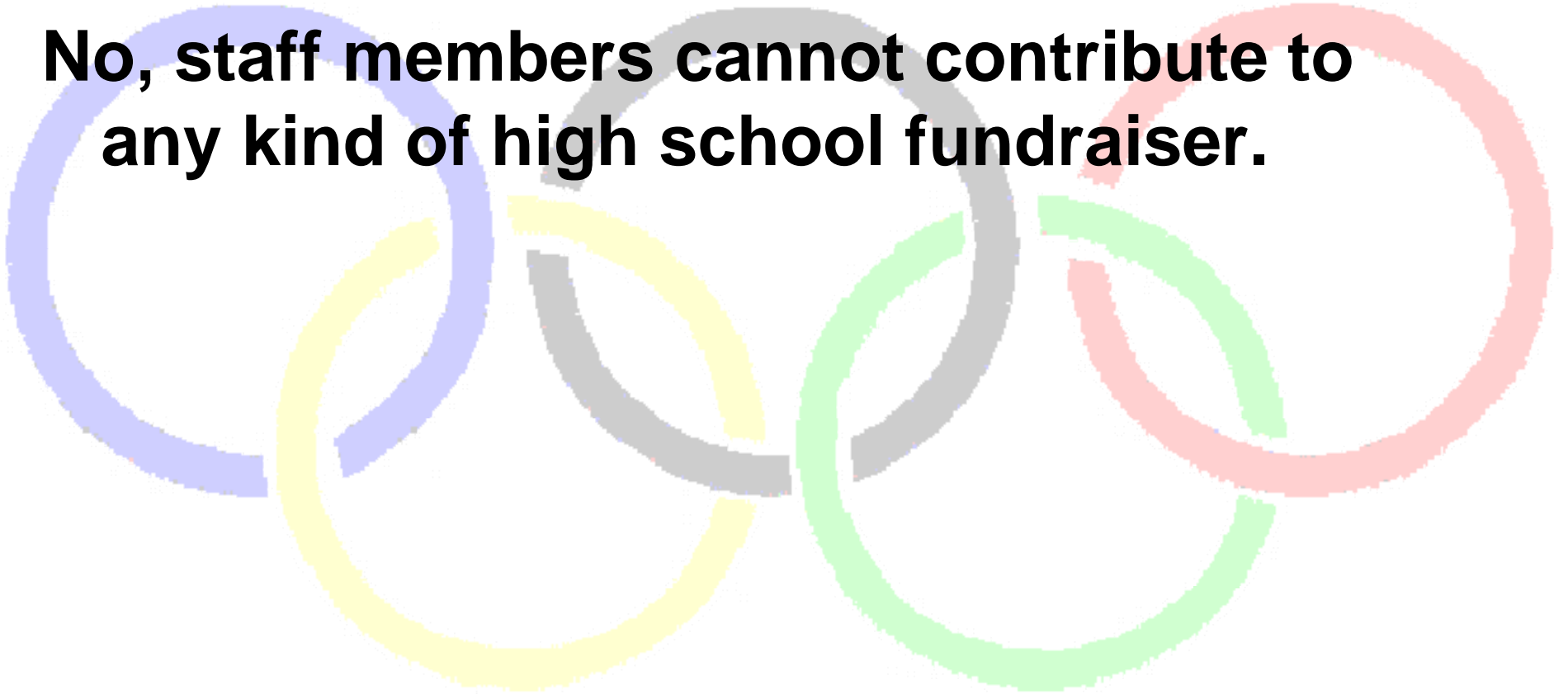


Barrier # 2, Lap 7

Your high school contacts you and wants you to donate CU gear and tickets to a Buffs football game to help in their athletic booster club fundraiser. Can you donate the items?

Answer

No, staff members cannot contribute to any kind of high school fundraiser.





Barrier # 3, Lap 7

A prospect is missing his/her test score at the Eligibility Center in order to determine “qualifier” status. What can CU do to get the PSA’s test score from the Testing Agency to the Eligibility Center?


Answer

CU can pay for the test to be sent to the Eligibility Center from the testing agency. Can also be done via FedEx

You and your sport program produce a permissible power point presentation to show to prospects you are recruiting. In what permissible locations can you show the presentation?




Answer

**In any location where a permissible
recruiting contact can occur**

Barrier # 5, Lap 7

A 4-4 transfer wants to come to CU. We request permission to contact that prospect. That permission is denied by her previous school. She decides to come to CU anyway. What can her involvement with your program be when the prospect arrives?

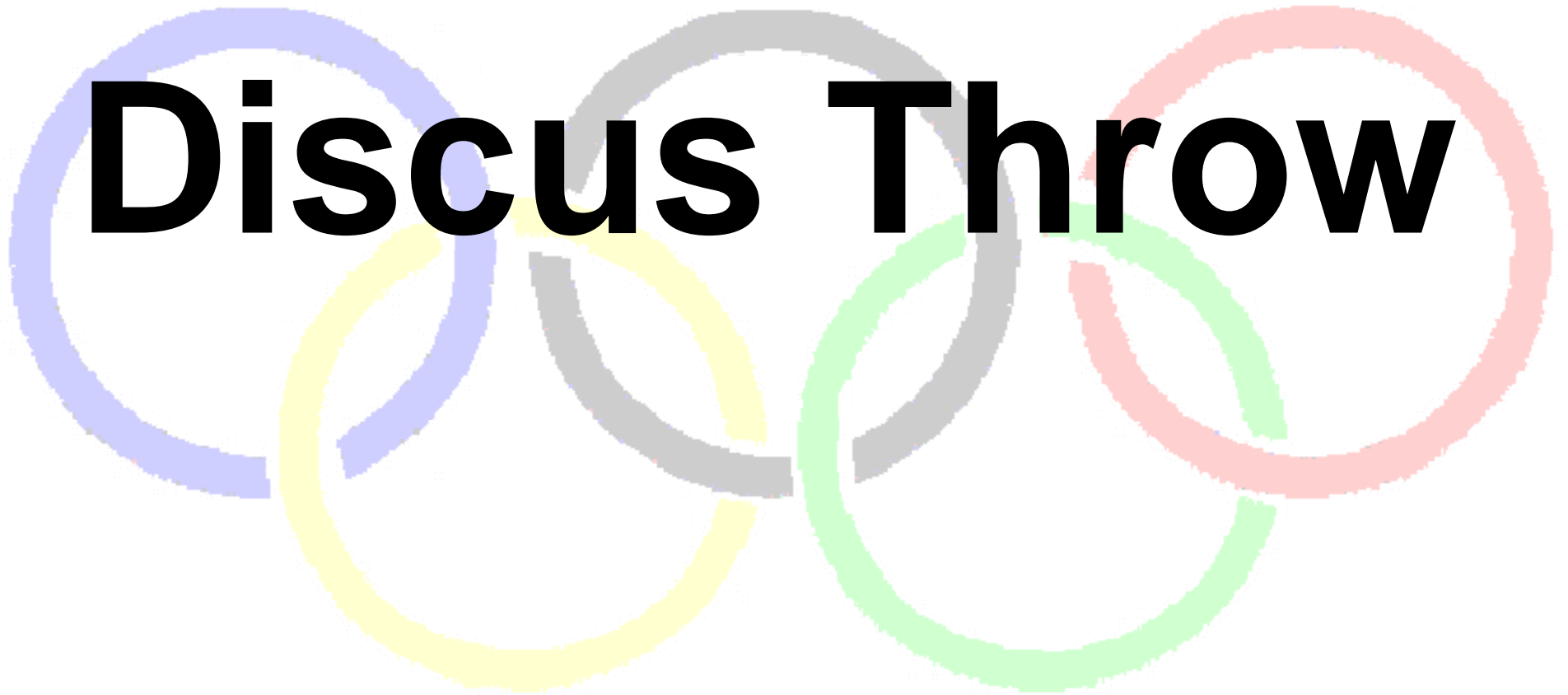
Answer

- **We cannot encourage the transfer in any way.**
- **The prospect must sit a year in residence.**
- **He/she cannot compete or receive financial aid.**
- **However, if the prospect successfully walks on to your team, he/she can practice with your program.**

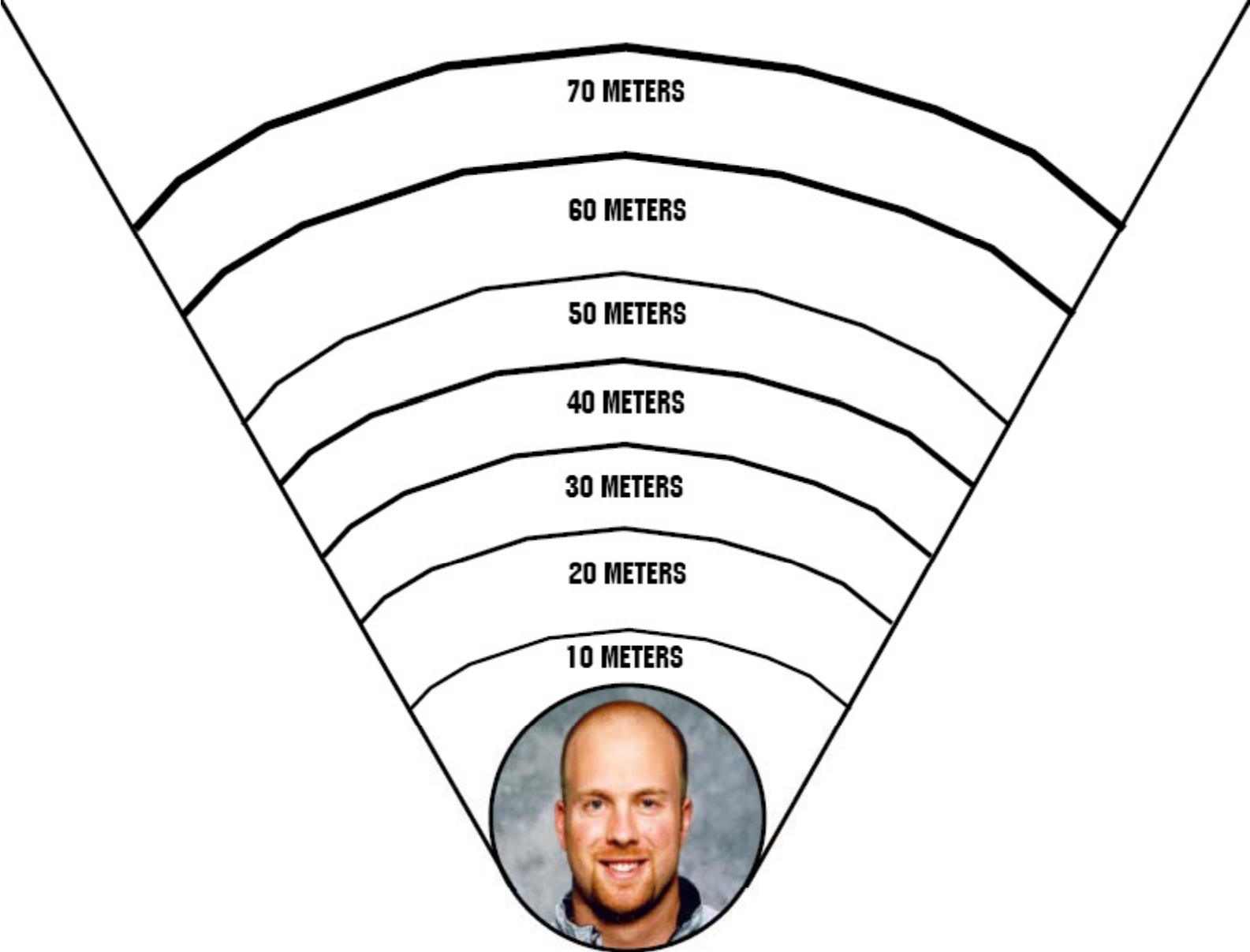
Event # 2

- If you answer 7 questions correct, Casey will win the Gold medal

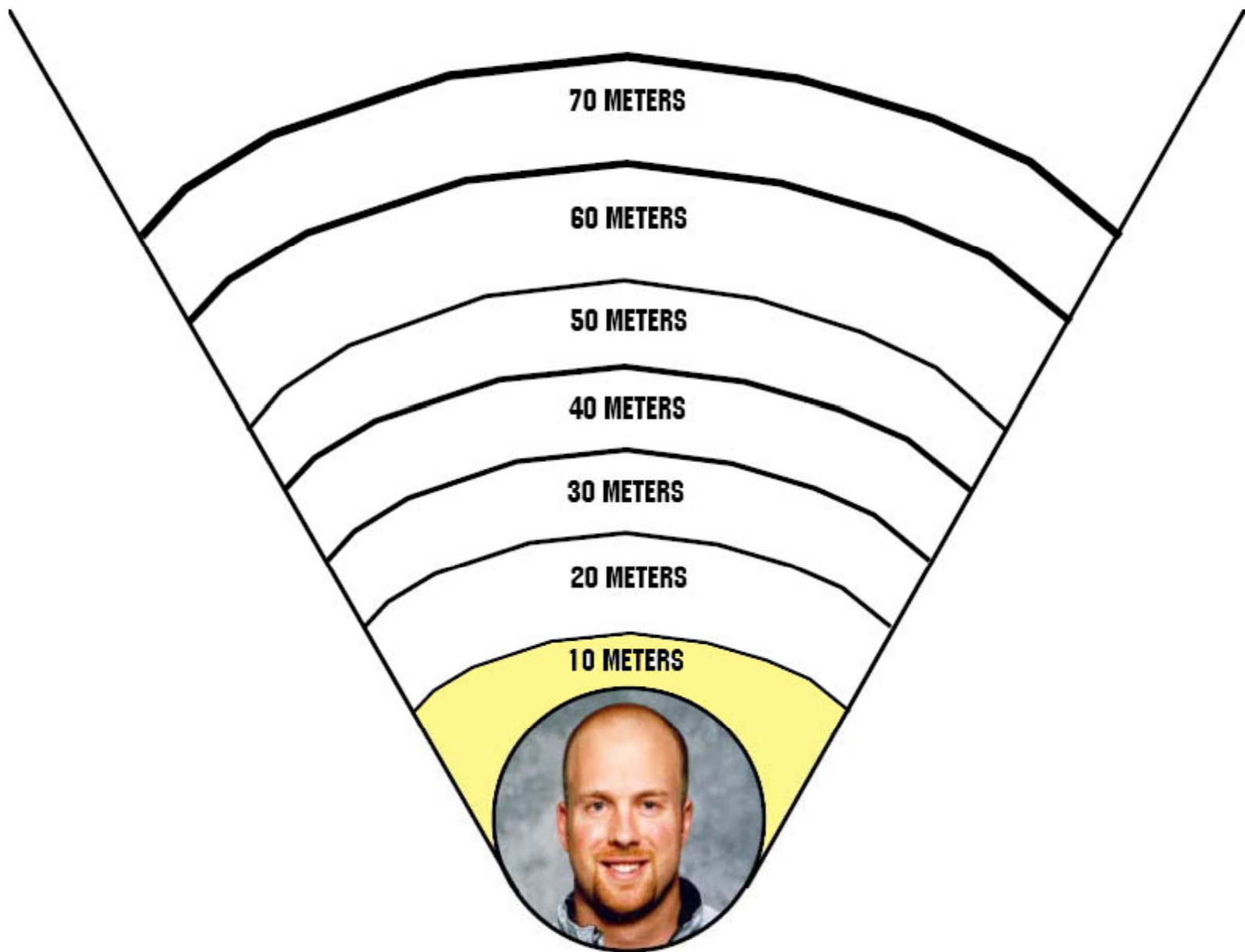


Question #1

What are the 2 forms of permissible electronic correspondence you can send to a prospect prior the PSA signing a National Letter of Intent?

Answer # 1

 - 2. Facsimiles (Faxes)**



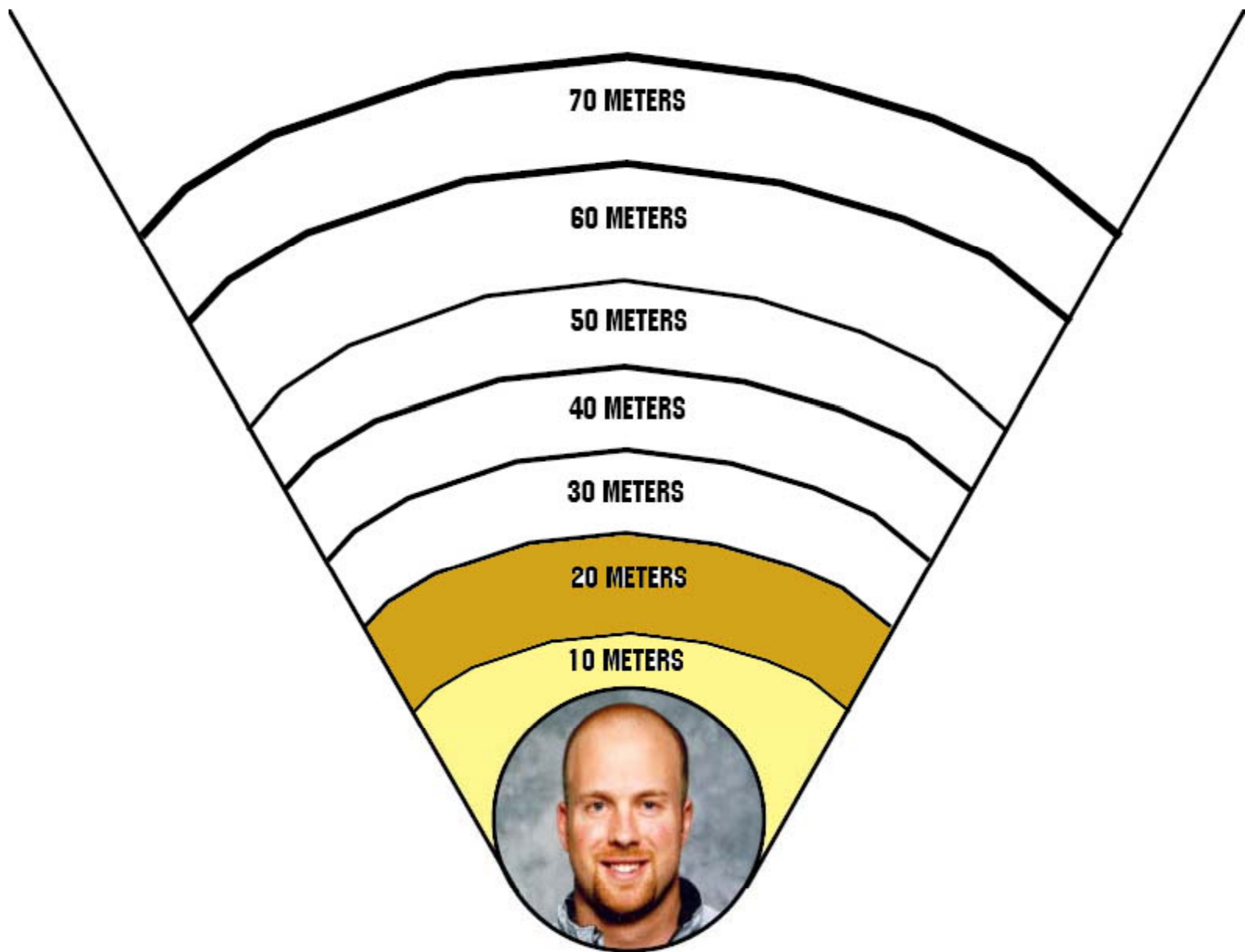
Question # 2



What is the limit on calls a coach can accept from a prospect?

Answer # 2

There is no limit on accepting calls. Calls made by a prospect, at the prospect's own expense, can be accepted at any time.

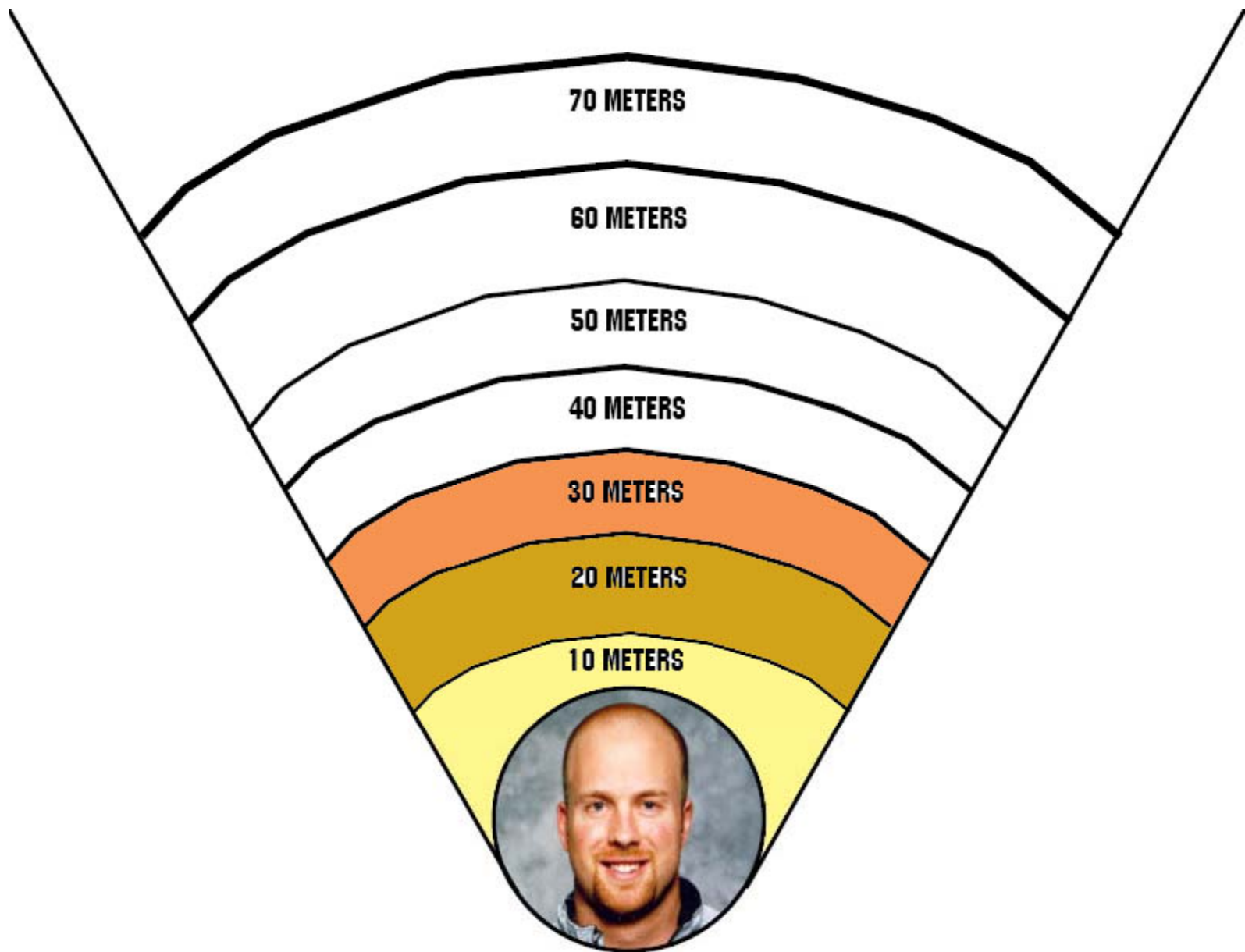


Question # 3

What are the restrictions on calls made by a prospect using CU's 1-800 line or if the prospect calls us collect??

Answer # 3

If CU is footing the bill for the call, then the prospect must be of “callable” age. If a prospect is not old enough for us to call them, then we cannot accept calls which we pay for from them until they reach “callable” age.



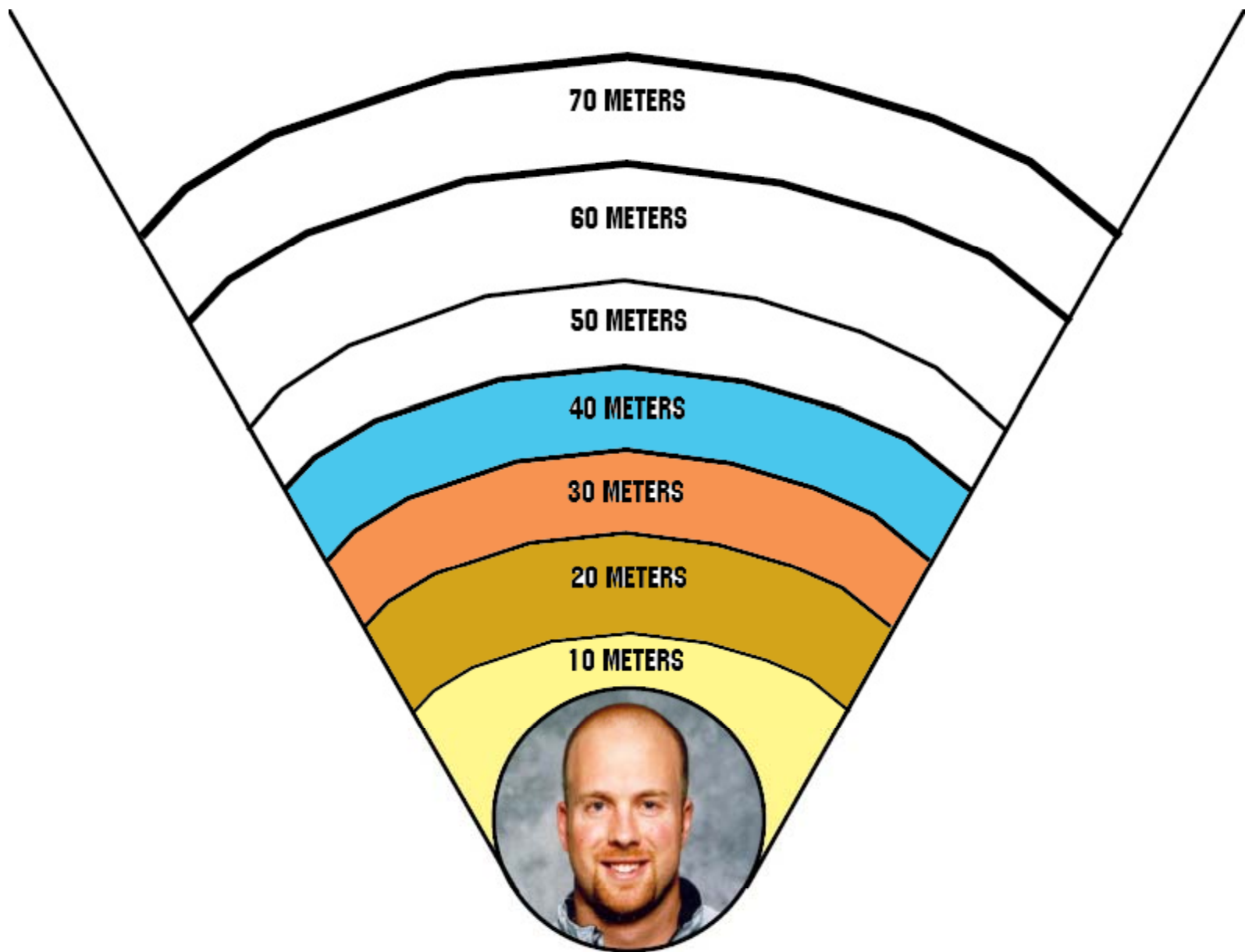
Question # 4



If we are holding a CU camp on our campus, can we invite the media to attend the camp?

Answer # 4

If we are holding a camp on campus, we are not allowed to invite the media. Even if the camp is open to the public, we have to do our due diligence to not facilitate contact between the media and prospects attending our camp.



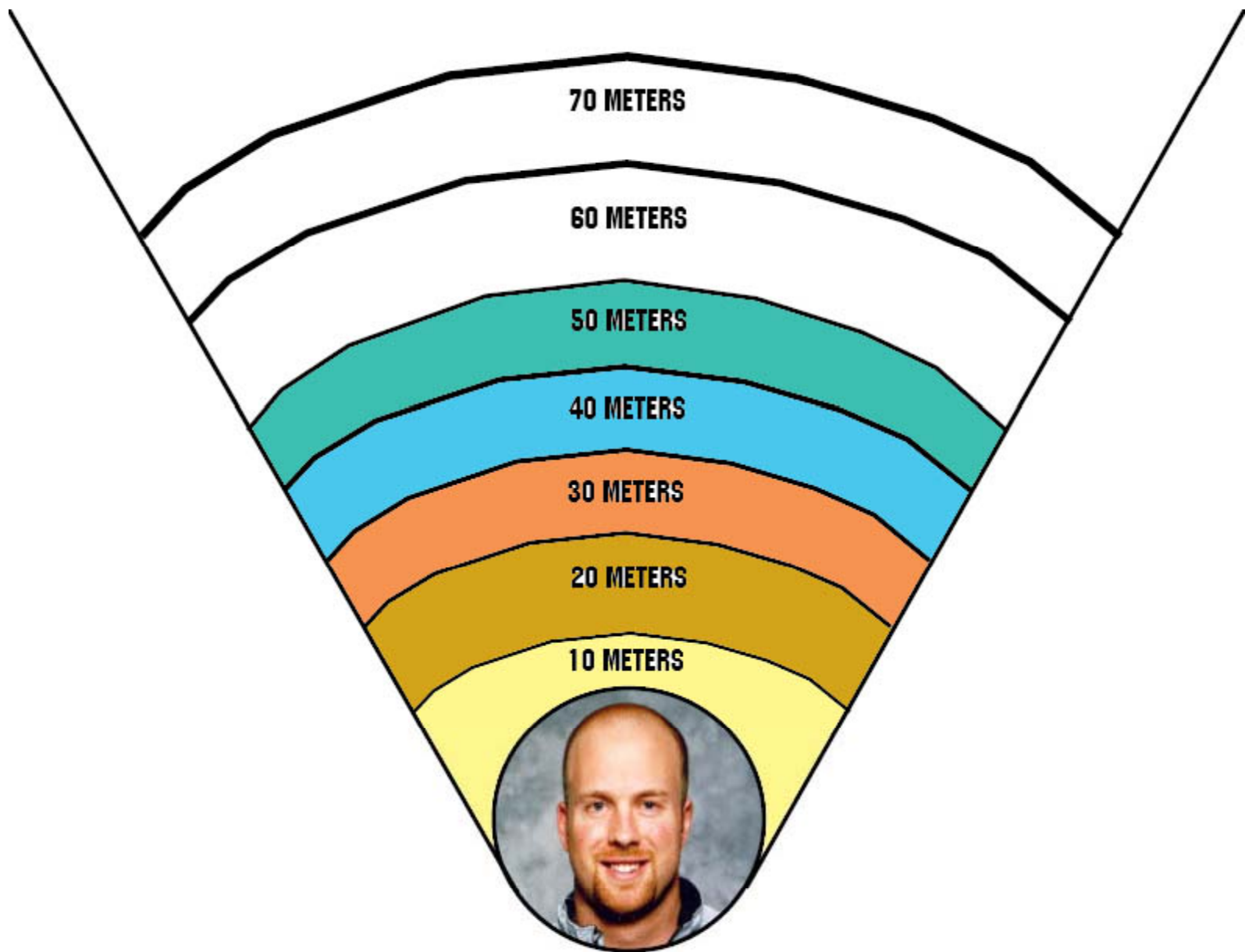
Question # 5

When The Bubble opens up again on October 1st, is it permissible for us to show a video of the facility to prospects? If so, how?

Answer # 5

We can show the video to recruits if:

- **It is readily accessible to the general public (e.g. on CUBuffs.com, not in a separate recruiting section)**
- **Is not specifically created for recruiting purposes (i.e. we can name the other purpose(s) the video was created for).**

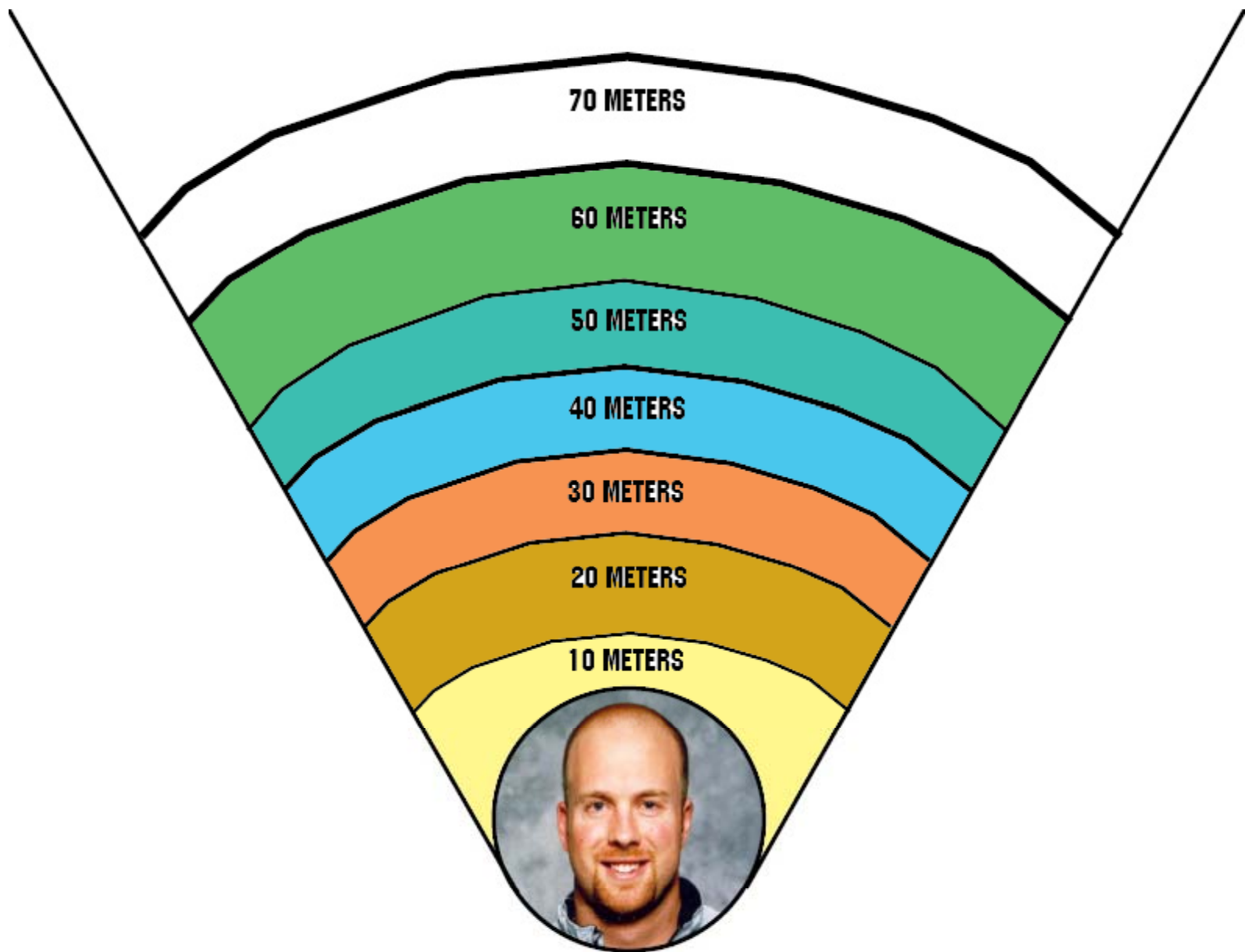


Question # 6

One of your incoming student-athletes does not have his/her housing application complete. The incoming student-athlete has signed an NLI with CU. Who on CU's staff can contact this PSA and notify him/her of the deficiency?

Answer # 6

If the PSA has signed an NLI with CU, then any athletics staff member can call or correspond with that PSA to speak with them regarding pre-enrollment information.



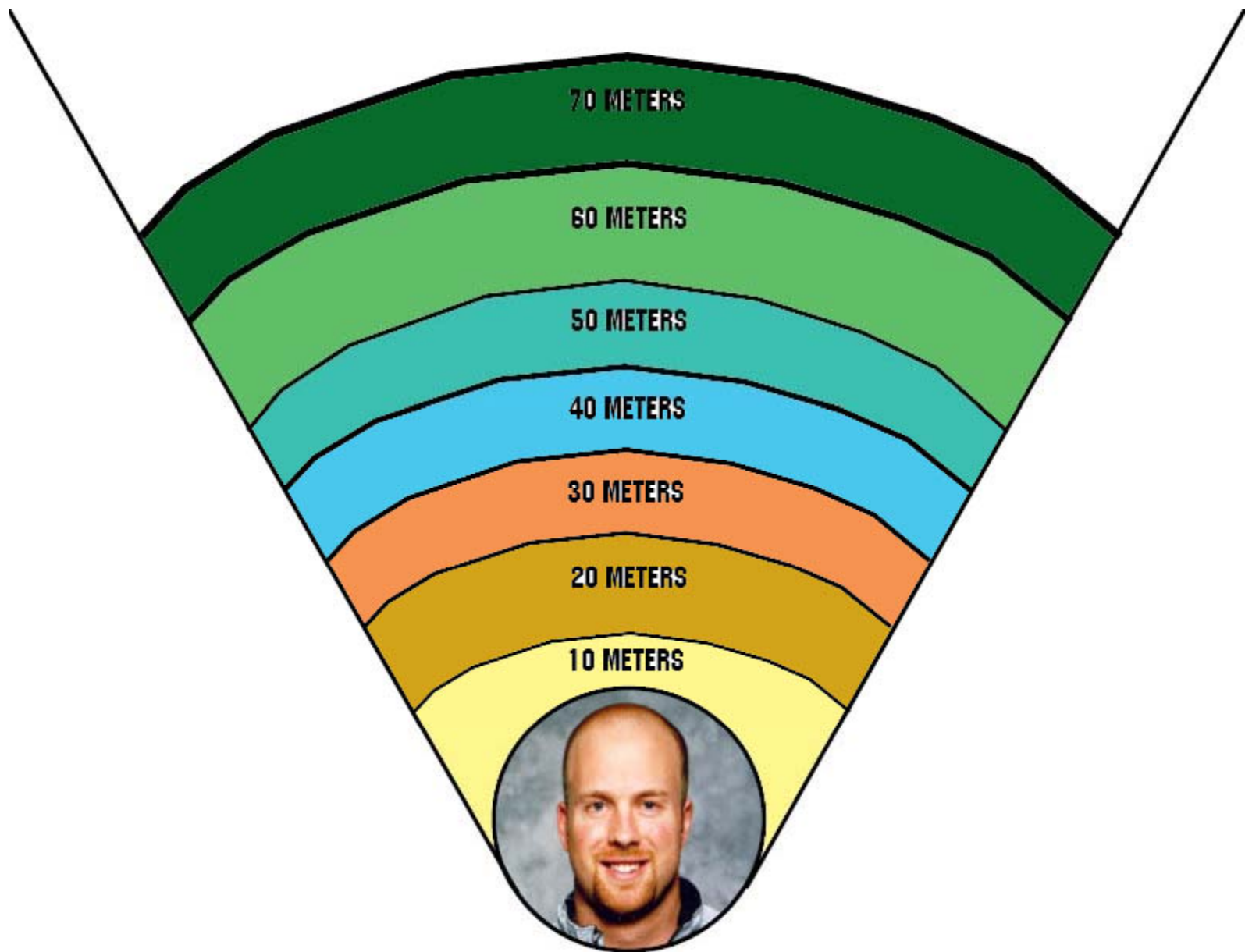
Question # 7

If that PSA does not have a copy of a housing application, is it permissible to send it via express mail (e.g. FedEx, UPS, etc.)?

Answer # 7

Yes, because the housing application deals with pre-enrollment information. Therefore, it can be sent via express mail.

Note: Items can be sent to international PSA's via express mail at any time.
