#16/15 Kansas Returns Home To Host Colorado

QUICKLY -- #16 Associated Press/#15 Coaches/#16 Harris Polls Kansas (4-1 overall, 1-0 Big 12) will host Colorado (3-2 overall, 0-1 Big 12) on Saturday, Oct. 11 in an 11:30 a.m. kickoff which will be televised on ESPN2... KU is 2-3 all-time on ESPN2, including a 37-34 loss at South Florida this year... KU has won eight of its last nine Big 12 games... KU has won 19 of its last 22 games overall... KU has won 12 consecutive home games, as well as 21 of its last 23 played at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium... KU is 15-3 in its last 18 games as a ranked team... KU has won 17 of its last 18 games against un-ranked teams with the lone loss at Missouri in 2006... Kansas is beginning a stretch with three of its next four games at home (the lone road game is at current #1 Oklahoma on Oct. 18).

NATIONAL ANNOUNCERS -- ESPN2's announcing crew includes Joe Tessitore and Rod Gilmore, while the Westwood One Radio crew features Tom McCarthy and Bobby Ross.

KU MARKETING ACTIVITIES FOR CU GAME

Few Tickets Remain: Less than 500 tickets are available for purchase for the Colorado game and less than 1,000 tickets are available for the Jayhawks' homecoming game against Texas Tech on Oct. 25. Single game tickets for the Colorado and Texas Tech games are \$55 each. Fans can purchase tickets to both games for just \$90 (a \$20 savings) when they sign up for the Colorado/Texas Tech Pack. Home games against Kansas State (Nov. 1), and Texas (Nov. 15) are sold out.

Faculty/Staff Appreciation Day: The Colorado game is the annual KU Faculty and Staff Appreciation Day. A special ticket price of \$25 is available for KU employees and their immediate family members. KU Faculty and Staff can take advantage of the special offer by presenting their Faculty/Staff ID on gameday at any Memorial Stadium ticket booth. Tickets can be purchased in advance with a Faculty/Staff ID at the Allen Fieldhouse ticket office. In addition, the ING Excellence in Teaching Award will be presented to a distinguished member of the KU Faculty during the first quarter break.

Family Fun Zone: The Kansas Football Family Fun Zone is back. Located just south of the new Anderson Family Football Complex, the Fun Zone includes interactive inflatable games for kids, promotional materials, special appearances by Big and Baby Jay, and visits from KU student-athletes. Junior Jayhawks can also pickup their gifts at the Fun Zone. The Fun Zone opens two hours prior to kickoff.

LAST TIME OUT -- Behind 186 all-purpose yards from Jake Sharp and an impressive second-half passing performance from Todd Reesing, Kansas turned a 20-point halftime deficit into a 35-33 win against Iowa State in its Big 12 opener at Jack Trice Stadium. The come from behind victory tied the third biggest comeback in school history behind only a 26-point deficit at Iowa State in 1992 and a 21-point deficit vs. Colorado in 1950. A sea of 47,847 Cyclone fans were riding high as Iowa State jumped out to a fast 14-0 lead in the first quarter. By halftime KU was down 20-0 and had mustered just 93 yards and only five first downs. KU went three and out on each of its first three possessions. Everything changed in the second half when Kansas scored touchdowns on five of its six drives, before sitting on the ball to end the game. Reesing was 10-of-12 for 260 yards and three TDs in the second half to finish the game 18-of-26 for 319 yards. Meier hauled in seven catches for 125 yards and two scores. He now has 26 catches for 381 yards and three TDs over the last three games and tied the school record with his third-straight game with more than 100 yards receiving. Linebackers James Holt and Joe Mortensen each had eight tackles to lead the KU defense, while four different players broke up passes including Jake Laptad, who batted down a crucial pass at the line in the final minute. Laptad and Mortensen each posted one sack.

UP NEXT -- Kansas will travel to Oklahoma to meet the top-ranked Sooners on Saturday, Oct. 18. KU has faced the nation's number one team 14 times and six times it was Oklahoma in that spot. KU's only win vs. number one was a 23-7 win vs. Missouri in 1960. Oklahoma is playing Texas in Dallas this Saturday.

DID YOU KNOW? -- Kansas owns the nation's fourth-longest active home field winning streak at 12 straight. Oklahoma leads the nation with 20 straight home wins, followed by Boise State (16) and BYU (15).

HEAD COACH MARK MANGINO -- Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his seventh season at Kansas and seventh overall as a collegiate head coach with a 41-37 record... He was the consensus National Coach of the Year in 2007 after guiding Kansas to a school-record 12 wins... He is the first coach in history to win the Broyles National Assistant Coach of the Year honor (won in 2000 while at Oklahoma) and a National Head Coach of the Year honor... He has been a part of 12 bowl games in his last 15 years of coaching... He inherited a program which did not have a winning season for six straight years and has won at least six games in four of the last five seasons... He is the first coach in KU history to lead the Jayhawks to three bowl games... In his first six years, KU placed 41 of its players on the Academic All-Big 12 Team, including 14 in 2007... In his first six years, KU landed 63 players on All-Big 12 postseason teams, including 14 in 2007... Five Jayhawks have earned Associated Press All-America honors in his tenure... Prior to coming to KU, Mangino spent three seasons (1999-2001) at Oklahoma, including the final two years as the offensive coordinator... He also coached at Kansas State from 1991-98... Other coaching stints include New Castle (Pa.) High School (1981-84), Youngstown State (1985-86), Geneva College (1987-89) and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School (1990).

* Offensive Coordinator/QB - Ed Warinner (4th year)... Was offensive line and run-game coordinator at KU in 2003 and 2004 before serving in same position at Illinois in 2005-06... Was offensive coordinator at Army for 13 years (1987-99).

* Defensive Coordinator/Safeties - Clint Bowen (8th year)... After spending the last two years as co-defensive coordinator, has taken over the KU defense this season... Played at KU (1990, 92-93) and was the team's leading tackler as a senior... Grew up in Lawrence.

* Offensive Line/Running Game Coordinator - John Reagan (4th year)... As run-game coordinator and offensive line coach, KU has averaged more rushing yards in each successive season (94 before he arrived in 2004 to 134 in 2005, 176 in 2006 and 188 in 2007).

* Tight Ends/Recruiting Coordinator - Brandon Blaney (7th year)... Is entering his ninth year on a coaching staff with Mark Mangino (was an offensive line graduate assistant at Oklahoma).

* Running Backs/Special Teams Coordinator - Louie Matsakis (2nd year)... Was at KU in 2004-05 as quality control coordinator... Has coached special teams throughout his career and is working with running backs for second straight season.

* Cornerbacks - Je'Ney Jackson (2nd year)... Former assistant strength coach is in his second year as a field coach... Was an all-WAC cornerback during his collegiate career at Wyoming.

* Linebackers - Steve Tovar (2nd year)... Spent 2006 as a defensive assistant with the Miami Dolphins... Played in the NFL for eight years after an All-America playing career at Ohio State.

* Wide Receivers - David Beaty (1st year)... First year at Kansas after coaching wide receivers at Rice in 2006 and 2007... Was a highly successful high school coach in the state of Texas before going to Rice.

* Defensive Line - Joe Bob Clements (1st year)... Joined the KU staff after spending the past two seasons at San Diego State... Coached at his alma mater Kansas State, where he was a defensive end... Lived in Lawrence during his youth.

2008 CAPTAINS -- Captains for the 2008 Jayhawks are OC Ryan Cantrell, LB Joe Mortensen, QB Todd Reesing and LB Mike Rivera. All four are first-time captains. Cantrell, Mortensen and Rivera are all seniors, while Reesing is a junior.

FOOTBALL FACILITY COMPLETED -- The Anderson Family Football Complex, a \$31 million facility that houses the Kansas football team was completed in July this year. The building is adjacent to the southwest side of Memorial Stadium. The 80,000-square foot building includes offices, academic areas, a weight room, locker rooms, an audio-visual room, meeting rooms, a cardio room, a hydro-therapy room, a nutrition area and a display area. In addition, two practice fields were built just southeast of the stadium.

DID YOU KNOW? -- Kansas is looking to start conference play 2-0 for the second straight year and just the third time since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996 as the Jayhawks opened 2-0 in 1997 as well.

THE KU-CU SERIES -- Colorado leads the all-time series by a 41-23-3 count, including a 17-14-3 advantage in games played in Lawrence. Kansas has won the last two meetings after CU posted five straight victories from 2001-05. The Jayhawks will be looking to win three straight against CU for just the second time in the series which dates back to 1903. KU beat the Buffs three consecutive times from 1962-64. Since the formation of the Big 12 Conference, the teams have split the previous six meetings in Lawrence.

KU-CU LAST YEAR -- Behind the leadership of quarterback Todd Reesing, then 15th-ranked Kansas held off Colorado 19-14 at Folsom Field on Oct. 20, 2007. Kansas built up a 19-7 lead after scoring on a 15-play, 94-yard drive with 10:23 left in the game. Colorado scored a touchdown to pull within 19-14 at the 3:42 mark. After Colorado forced KU to punt, the Buffaloes took over at their own 42-yard line with 2:16 remaining in the game. Kansas stopped the Buffs on four plays (CU lost eight yards on the possession) and the Jayhawks won their seventh straight game of the year. Reesing completed 20 of 29 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown while also rushing seven times for 84 yards. KU's defense registered seven tackles for loss, including three sacks, and came up with three turnovers.

KU-CU LAST TIME IN LAWRENCE -- Then freshman QB Todd Reesing came off the bench in the second half to throw two touchdown passes and run for another to rally KU from a 9-0 deficit to a 20-15 win against Colorado on Oct. 28, 2006, the ninth game of the year. The game was Reesing's first collegiate action. Reesing ran for 90 yards in the game, while Jon Cornish gained 80 and went over the 1,000 yard mark for the season en route to the first 1,000-yard season by a Jayhawk in 10 years.

KU-CU NOTABLE -- Kansas has two players from the state of Colorado in LB Chris Heinz, a redshirt freshman from Littleton (Highlands Ranch HS) and OL Ian Wolfe, a sophomore from Fort Collins (Fort Collins HS)... Colorado has one player from the state of Kansas in DE Drew Hudgins... KU offensive coordinator Ed Warinner coached in the state of Colorado as the OL coach at Air Force from 2000-02... KU OL coach John Reagan coached the offensive line at Air Force from 2003-04... KU football SID Mike Strauss worked in the CU SID office as a student... CU AD Mike Bohn is a Kansas graduate and lettered in football and baseball for the Jayhawks in the early 80s.

KU-CU NUMBERS GAME -- QB Todd Reesing's top two rushing yardage games have both come against Colorado as he had 90 vs. the Buffs in 2006 and 84 last season... RB Jake Sharp's career receptions high of six came at Colorado last year... DE Russell Brorsen's seven tackles vs. Colorado in 2006 are the second most of his career... LB James Holt had a career-best 15 tackles at Colorado last season... S Patrick Resby had a career-high tying four tackles at Colorado last season (also had four at Kansas State)... The last time a Kansas player kicked a 50-yard field goal was a 59-yarder by Johnny Beck at Colorado in 2001... Ten years ago (1998) David Winbush rushed for 268 yards against Colorado for the fourth most yards in a single game at KU... Bill Whittemore's 422 passing yards vs. CU in 2003 ranks second in school history... The longest pass play in KU history was a 98-yard pass from Kelly Donohoe to Willie Vaughn vs. Colorado in 1987... In 1986 Vaughn set a school record with 11 receptions against CU, a mark which has never been topped, but tied four times... Bob Johnson's 203 receiving yards vs. CU in 1983 is one of only three 200-yard receiving games in school history... June Henley had a 100-yard kickoff return against CU in 1993... In 1974 Steve Towle set a school record with 25 tackles vs. Colorado (tied twice since)... In 1988 KU limited Colorado to zero passing yards to tie a school record.

ISU COMEBACK -- Kansas matched the third-biggest comeback in school history last week at Iowa State as the Jayhawks rallied from a 20-0 deficit to post a 35-33 victory. KU scored 28 consecutive points to open the second half before ISU responded with a touchdown and missed extra point. Here is a look at the top come from behind wins in school history:

1. 26 (trailed 21-47 at Iowa State before winning 50-47 in 1992)
2. 21 (trailed 0-21 vs. Colorado before winning 27-21 in 1950)
3. 20 (trailed 0-20 at Iowa State before winning 35-33 in 2008)
3. 20 (trailed 0-20 vs. Loyola (Calif.) before winning 34-26 in 1951)

THE POLLS -- Kansas is listed in the Associated Press poll for the 17th consecutive week, a school record (previous mark was 14 straight polls between 1995 and 1996). The Jayhawks' current streak ranks as the ninth longest active streak in the nation. Here is a look:

HOME -- Kansas has won 12 consecutive home games as well as 21 of its last 23 played at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium. The two losses in the last four seasons were to Texas A&M and Oklahoma State in consecutive weeks in 2006. In addition, the Jayhawks have won 17 straight against non-conference opponents in Lawrence.

AND AWAY -- In its last 11 road games, Kansas is 6-5 with four of the five losses by one score. In its last road outing at Iowa State on Oct. 4, the Jayhawks rallied from a 20-0 deficit to win 35-33, matching the third biggest comeback in school history.

THE LAST 22 -- Kansas has won 19 of its last 22 games dating back to the last part of the 2006 season. That is the best 22-game stretch for the program since going 21-1 from 1908-1910.

MANGINO REACHES 40 -- Kansas head coach Mark Mangino became the fourth coach in Kansas history to record 40 wins at the school when the Jayhawks posted a win against Sam Houston State. Here is a look at the top KU coaches by victories:

MEIER AMONG NATION'S BEST IN NEW POSITION -- Junior QB/WR Kerry Meier has adapted to the wide receiver position after starting at quarterback as a freshman. Here are some quick notes on Meier:

- Ranks second in the NCAA in receptions per game at 8.80.
- Is tied for 11th in the NCAA in receiving yards per game at 102.80.
- Tied school record last week with third straight 100-yard receiving game.
- Tied school record for single-game receptions with 11 at South Florida.
- Owns a school receiving record (single game receptions) and a school passing record (most touchdown passes by a freshman with 13).
- Has caught at least two passes in 13 consecutive games.
- Has caught at least seven passes in all five games this year.
- His 44 receptions already this season are tied for 15th most in a season in school history.
- After starting at quarterback as a freshman and throwing for 1,193 yards, he has been the team's backup and was 25 of 29 for 275 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions last season. Meier has not played a down at quarterback this year.
- Attends quarterback meetings and sees limited time at wide receiver in practice.
- Is the team's holder on place kicks and is also the team's backup punter.
- In 2007 he became the first KU player to record a rushing touchdown, passing touchdown and receiving touchdown in the same season since Garfield Taylor in 1981.
- In 2007 he became the first KU player to record a rush, pass, reception and punt in the same season since Donald Shanklin in 1968.

MEIER AND THE OTHERS -- While Kerry Meier has become Todd Reesing's favorite target this season with 44 receptions for 514 yards, Meier is not the only Jayhawk to get open. Here are a few receiving notes:

- Five different Jayhawks have recorded 100-yard reception games this season as Meier has three, Dezmon Briscoe two and Johnathan Wilson, Daymond Patterson and Jake Sharp one each.
- KU is on a current streak with two players recording 100-yard receiving games in four consecutive games. Prior to this season there had been only five games in school history that the Jayhawks had two players with 100 receiving yards in the same game.
- KU has recorded 25 explosives (plays of 20 yards or more) in the passing game this year by seven different players. Kerry Meier leads the way with eight, including a KU season-long 68-yarder. Dezmon Briscoe has six, Johnathan Wilson five, Daymond Patterson and RB Jake Sharp two apiece, and RB Jockes Crawford and Dexter Fields one each.
- Six different Jayhawks have touchdown receptions this season.
- Kerry Meier tied a school single-game record with 11 catches at USF.
- Johnathan Wilson was one shy of the school single-game reception mark with 10 at USF.
- Wilson's 179 yards at USF was the seventh-best single-game yardage mark in school history.
- RB Jake Sharp became the first Jayhawk running back to record 100 receiving yards in a game with 107 at Iowa State.

TAKING ADVANTAGE -- Kansas has scored on all seven opportunities it has had to start a drive on the opponents side of the field. KU has turned six of those seven possessions into touchdowns. KU has also scored seven times off nine opponent turnovers, including six touchdowns. On the other side of the ball, the KU defense has allowed the opponent to score just twice after eight KU turnovers and both of those scores were field goals.

DID YOU KNOW? -- DE Maxwell Onyegbule's interception at Iowa State last Saturday was the fifth by a Kansas defensive lineman in the last 16 games. Current Jayhawk defensive ends John Larson (two) and Russell Brorsen (one) recorded pickoffs in that stretch, as did former Jayhawk defensive tackle James McClinton.

OFFENSIVE NOTES -- Kansas scored touchdowns on five of its first six possessions in the second half against Iowa State on Saturday (fumble at the ISU 11 was the exception)... KU's first six possessions to start the game against ISU last Saturday included three straight three and outs before two turnovers and a punt... KU's 26 pass attempts (18 completions) against Iowa State were its fewest since the second game of 2007 when KU was 14 of 24 vs. Southeastern Louisiana... KU averaged 17.7 yards per completion against Iowa State on Saturday... KU has produced a 60-yard pass in two straight games... KU committed four turnovers against Iowa State (one was a muffed punt), its most in the last 19 games... KU has committed just three penalties in each of the last two games... After producing two rushing touchdowns in the first three games combined, the Jayhawks have run for five scores in the last two games combined... KU has scored eight touchdowns from outside the redzone, including six from at least 30 yards out this year.

DEFENSIVE NOTES -- KU ranks in the top four of the Big 12 Conference in pass efficiency defense (second), rushing defense (third), total defense (third) and scoring defense (fourth)... After allowing Iowa State to score on four of its first five possessions last Saturday, KU forced the Cyclones into five punts and two turnovers on its next seven possessions (ISU then scored two touchdowns late in the game before KU held on ISU's final possession of the game)... KU has limited the opponent to less than 100 yards rushing in three of five games this season... KU did not allow a first-quarter point in the first four games before Iowa State scored 14 in the first period last Saturday... KU is allowing the opponent less than 100 yards rushing per game for the third time in the last four years... The opponents have reached 30 points in a game twice this season, the same number as all of last year.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES -- After ranking seventh in the NCAA in kickoff return average (25.21) a year ago, the Jayhawks are 119th this season at 13.23 per return... KU is listed 18th in punt return average (16.17) after ranking 103rd (5.97) a year ago.

QUARTERBACK NOTES -- Todd Reesing - Owns a 16-2 record as a starter... In 21 career games he has thrown 50 touchdowns to just 13 interceptions and in 18 games as a starter he has tossed 47 TDs to 10 pickoffs... Has thrown for 300 yards in four straight games and nine times in his career. Kerry Meier - The backup quarterback has not played a single down at the position this year, instead excelling as a wide receiver... Last year he completed 25 of 29 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns... Started eight games at quarterback in 2006 and threw for 1,193 yards and a KU freshman record 13 touchdowns.

RUNNING BACK NOTES -- Angus Quigley -- Earned his first college start against Sam Houston and responded by rushing for 61 yards on 16 carries... Started, but had just 13 yards on four attempts against Iowa State on Saturday... Has been the most productive KU back on the season with 227 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 44 attempts (5.2 per carry), while also catching 13 passes for 54 yards and one touchdown as the third back in the first three games... Had 98 yards on 17 carries in 2007. Jake Sharp -- Had his breakout game of the season at Iowa State on Saturday with a season-best 79 rushing yards and a school record for a running back, 107 receiving yards... Scored one touchdown rushing and one touchdown receiving vs. ISU... Started the first three games of the year and rushed 21 times for 62 yards in those three contests... Posted three 100-yard rushing games in 2007. Jocques Crawford - Has averaged seven carries for 23 yards in five games as a backup... Was the 2007 Junior College Offensive Player of the Year last season at Cisco JC.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES -- Kerry Meier - Ranks second in the NCAA with 8.80 receptions per game and tied for 11th nationally with 102.80 receiving yards per game... Has recorded 100-plus receiving yards in three straight games... Has recorded at least seven receptions in five straight games and at least two catches in 13 consecutive contests. Dezmon Briscoe - Recorded career-best nine catches vs. FIU in opener and career-best 146 yards vs. Louisiana Tech in second game... Posted second 100-yard receiving game of the year with 124 yards on just five catches against Sam Houston State. Johnathan Wilson -- Recorded 10 receptions, one shy of school record, for 179 yards, the seventh most in school history against South Florida... In two games since then, has one catch for 31 yards... Was voted by his teammates as the player who would be the biggest surprise this season. Daymond Patterson - True freshman had eight catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns against Louisiana Tech in second game... Has had just three receptions for two yards in the three games since then... Handles punt return duties and had four for 135 yards and a 75-yard touchdown in season opener against FIU. Dexton Fields - Returned to action against Iowa State last Saturday after missing three games with an injury... Responded with a start and caught two passes for 56 yards, including a 50-yarder... Has caught at least one pass in 26 consecutive games he has played in and at least two passes in 24 of his last 26 games... Was team's receptions leader in 2006 and 2007.

DID YOU KNOW? -- Todd Reesing's first collegiate action came against Colorado in the ninth game of 2006 when he rallied the Jayhawks from a 9-0 deficit to a 20-15 win with two touchdown passes and a scoring run. He was seven of 11 for 106 yards and an interception in that game, all in the second half.

JAYHAWK FANS FLOCKING TO KIVISTO -- After three straight years of record-setting season attendance averages, the Jayhawks appear to be on the way to a fourth straight record. KU sold out two of its first three games with a school record 52,112 against FIU and 51,767 vs. Sam Houston State. KU also drew 48,621 on a rainy day against Louisiana Tech. Last week KU officials announced that two remaining home games - Kansas State and Texas - are sold out and that there were fewer than 500 tickets left for this week's Colorado game and less than 1,000 for the homecoming game against Texas Tech. Here is a look at some attendance highlights:

- Kansas is on pace for its fourth straight year of breaking the season attendance average mark. Through three games KU has averaged 50,833 fans per game. Last year's record-breaking attendance average was 46,784.
- KU's attendance of 52,112 vs. FIU in the 2008 season opener was a school record beating the 51,910 set against Nebraska last year.
- The 51,767 in attendance vs. Sam Houston State ranks as the fourth-best single-game attendance mark in KU history.

KU NOTE-ABLE -- A total of 33 different players have started games for Kansas through five games this season as compared to 29 different players all of last season... Twelve different Jayhawks have made their first career starts this season... LB Joe Mortensen has started a team-best 30 consecutive games, followed by DE Russell Brorsen (26), and S Darrell Stuckey (22)... Mortensen also leads in career starts (30), followed by LB Mike Rivera (28) and Brorsen (28).

KU FOOTBALL PROGRAM NOTABLE -- Here are a few notes about the Kansas football program in the Mark Mangino era:

- KU was the only school to rank in the top five nationally in both scoring offense (second) and scoring defense (fourth) in 2007.
- When KU entered the national polls in 2007, it marked the first time since 1996 the Jayhawks were listed.
- KU has set season attendance records in each of the previous three seasons.
- KU has been to three bowl games in the last five years after seven straight years without a bowl game.
- KU has produced at least six wins in three straight years for the first time since 1960-61-62.
- KU has landed 63 players on postseason All-Big 12 teams in the Mark Mangino era.
- KU has had 41 players earn Academic All-Big 12 First Team honors in the Mangino era.
- KU has produced five of the top 10 passing yardage season averages in school history, three of the top 10 total offensive yardage seasons and three of the top six scoring averages in the Mark Mangino era.
- In 2007, KU produced a 3,000-yard passer (Todd Reesing), 1,000-yard rusher (Brandon McAnderson) and a 1,000-yard receiver (Marcus Henry) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- KU improved its rushing yardage average in three straight seasons, going from 94.0 in 2004 to 188.8 in 2007.
- KU has kept the opponent under 120 yards rushing per game in each of the past four seasons, including just 83.2 in 2005 and 94.8 in 2007.
- KU has held its opponent to less than 200 yards rushing in 30 consecutive games.

JAYHAWKS IN THE NFL -- There are eight former Jayhawks on regular NFL rosters, including four who were part of the 2007 Kansas Orange Bowl Championship team. Last year's players, who were all drafted and made NFL squads include OT Anthony Collins (Cincinnati), TE Derek Fine (Buffalo), CB Aqib Talib (Tampa Bay) and WR Marcus Henry (New York Jets). Henry was waived in late September. Other former Jayhawks in the NFL include Rodney Allen (Green Bay), Charles Gordon (Minnesota), Justin Hartwig (Pittsburgh) and Adrian Jones (Kansas City).

DID YOU KNOW? -- Four of KU's last six opponents this season are ranked in the top seven of this week's Associated Press poll including #1 Oklahoma, #3 Missouri, #5 Texas, and #7 Texas Tech. KU already played #19 South Florida.

Junior QB Todd Reesing connected with Dezmon Briscoe for three touchdown passes, while true freshman Daymond Patterson had 75-yard punt return for a touchdown in his first collegiate game to lead 14th-ranked Kansas to a convincing 40-10 victory against the FIU Golden Panthers in front of a record crowd of 52,112 at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium. Reesing completed a school-record 37 passes on 52 attempts, amassing 256 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. Briscoe finished the night with a career-best nine catches for 55 yards. His three touchdown grabs also tied a career high he set against Nebraska in 2007. Kerry Meier pulled in a career-best nine balls for 62 yards as 10 different Jayhawks had receptions. It took almost two-thirds of the first quarter for the Jayhawks to get going, but once they did they didn't look back. KU scored on five of six offensive possessions with a punt return for a score in that stretch as well. The KU defense limited FIU to just 139 yards of total offense, including just 73 passing yards. The Jayhawks forced three turnovers and turned those into 10 points.

GAME #2 Sept. 6 at Lawrence, Kan.**KANSAS 29, LOUISIANA TECH 0**

Not even soggy conditions could stop 14th-ranked Kansas quarterback Todd Reesing, as the junior connected on 32-of-38 passes for a career-high 412 yards and three touchdowns in KU's 29-0 shutout victory against Louisiana Tech. The victory was KU's 11th straight home victory and 16th consecutive win at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium against non-conference opponents. Defensively, KU posted its second shutout in the Mark Mangino era. Last season the Jayhawks posted a 62-0 win against Southeastern Louisiana on Sept. 8. A crowd of 48,621, the second largest non-conference home crowd at KU, saw Reesing's 412 passing yards for the game rank third on the KU single-game list. Reesing now holds four of the top 13 single-game passing yards in KU history. His 84.2 completion percentage against the Bulldogs ranks fifth on the KU single-game list. Freshman Daymond Patterson and sophomore Dezmon Briscoe combined for 15 catches and 276 yards receiving from Reesing. Patterson ended the game with eight catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns, while Briscoe had seven receptions for a career-high 146 yards and one score. Patterson and Briscoe became the first two Jayhawks to record 100 receiving yards in the same game since the 2006 season against Nebraska - Brian Murph (8-129) and Dexton Fields (8-108). Not to be outshined, junior Kerry Meier led all receivers with nine receptions for 71 yards on the night.

SOUTH FLORIDA 37, KANSAS 34

In a back and forth battle #13 Kansas fell to the 19th-ranked USF Bulls 37-34, on a 43-yard field goal by Bulls kicker Maikon Bonani as time expired. After jumping out to a 20-3 first-half lead, the Jayhawks gave up 31 unanswered points to fall behind 34-20 with 13:59 to go in the game. Quarterback Todd Reesing proceeded to lead a KU rally, engineering back-to-back touchdown drives that he capped off with touchdown passes to wide receiver Johnathan Wilson and running back Angus Quigley, respectively to tie the score at 34 with 5:32 left in the game. The Jayhawks had a chance to win the game with under a minute to go, having advanced the ball to their own 40-yard line with 0:41 to go in the game. However, Reesing's pass on first and 10 was picked off by USF defensive back Nate Allen and returned all the way to the KU 27-yard line. The Bulls ran the clock all the way down to 0:02, and Bonani's field goal attempt hooked inside the right upright to give USF the victory. Reesing had a remarkable game in a losing effort, completing 34 of 51 passes for 381 yards, three touchdowns and an interception. The junior from Austin, Texas, also had a rushing touchdown, a four-yard scamper in the second quarter that gave KU a 20-3 lead. Wilson caught 10 passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns, all three career highs. Kerry Meier tied a school record with 11 receptions, which resulted in 120 yards. Defensively James Holt had 13 tackles, including three for loss and two forced fumbles.

KANSAS 38, SAM HOUSTON STATE 14

Kansas junior quarterback Todd Reesing threw for 356 yards and two touchdowns to lead the No. 19 Jayhawk football team to a 38-14 victory against Sam Houston State. In a battle of quarterbacks, Reesing went 23-for-38 for 356 yards and two touchdowns to outshine SHSU's Rhett Bomar, who went for 26-for-46 for 340 yards, a touchdown and three interceptions. The three KU interceptions led to 21 of Kansas' 38 points. For Reesing, it marked his third-straight game of 350-plus passing yards this season. Additionally, the junior from Austin, Texas, broke the school record for most 200-yard passing games with 14 for his career, including all four games in 2008. For the second straight week, one of Reesing's favorite targets was junior Kerry Meier, who had eight catches for a career-high 136 yards, surpassing his career best of 120 receiving yards set at South Florida on September 12. Jayhawk sophomore wide receiver Dezmon Briscoe had his second 100-yard receiving game of the year with 124 yards on five catches. Both Meier and Briscoe were recipients of Reesing touchdown throws in the game. Kansas' defense allowed a season-low 45 rushing yards on 16 attempts for the Bearkats as the Jayhawks outgained SHSU 528 to 385 in total offense.

Behind 186 all-purpose yards from Jake Sharp and an impressive second-half passing performance from Todd Reesing, Kansas turned a 20-point halftime deficit into a 35-33 win against Iowa State in its Big 12 opener at Jack Trice Stadium. The come from behind victory tied the third biggest comeback in school history behind only a 26-point deficit at Iowa State in 1992 and a 21-point deficit vs. Colorado in 1950. A sea of 47,847 Cyclone fans were riding high as Iowa State jumped out to a fast 14-0 lead in the first quarter. By halftime KU was down 20-0 and had mustered just 93 yards and only five first downs. KU went three and out on each of its first three possessions. Everything changed in the second half when Kansas scored touchdowns on five of its six drives, before sitting on the ball to end the game. Reesing was 10-of-12 for 260 yards and three TDs in the second half to finish the game 18-of-26 for 319 yards. Meier hauled in seven catches for 125 yards and two scores. He now has 26 catches for 381 yards and three TDs over the last three games and tied the school record with his third-straight game with more than 100 yards receiving. Linebackers James Holt and Joe Mortensen each had eight tackles to lead the KU defense, while four different players broke up passes including Jake Laptad, who batted down a crucial pass at the line in the final minute. Laptad and Mortensen each posted one sack.
