

## **Buffs score 32 points in loss to Longhorns**

## Point total lowest in school history

AUSTIN, Texas -- The Colorado women's basketball program reached a new low on Saturday night.

The Buffs fell to 0-3 in the Big 12 with a 62-32 loss to No. 16 Texas at the Irwin Center.

The 32 points were the fewest CU has ever scored in a game.

"This league is tough. We've got to be better," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said on the KKZN post-game radio show. "We're going to come back. I told them in the locker room just like I did when I recruited them that we're going to challenge them to elevate their game."

The Buffs -- who lost to No. 5 Baylor (63-50) and No. 22 Oklahoma State (79-43) to begin a brutal fourgame stretch against ranked opponents -- shot just 27.7 percent (13-for-47) from the field.

CU returns to the Coors Events Center on Wednesday to face No. 3 Oklahoma.

"I know I sound like the ultimate optimist, but I saw a lot of good things," McConnell-Miller said. "I know we lost this game by 30 points, but I saw a lot of good stretches for this team."

Brittany Spears (11 points, 10 rebounds) was one bright spot for CU with her fourth double-double of the season.

The sophomore forward made her team's only 3-pointer of the game as the Buffs finished 1-for-12 (8.3 percent) from behind the arc.

Freshman guard Alyssa Fressle was the only other CU player in double figures scoring with 12 points on 4-for-13 shooting against a tough Texas defense.

"They were switching everything and we could never adjust," McConnell-Miller said. "They had such good ball pressure that we couldn't get the ball to the wings. ... On the fly it never translated to the floor."

The Buffs (8-7 overall) trailed 29-12 at halftime but were able to cut the deficit to nine points with an 11-3 run to open the second half.

But after not scoring for the first 5:28 of the second half, the Longhorns finally woke up and put the game away with a 13-0 run.

"There's a lack of maturity sometimes in situations like that," McConnell-Miller said. "It got away from us at the end, but for 30 minutes, although we weren't scoring, we played well defensively."

The Longhorns (14-3, 2-1) were led by Kathleen Nash's 16 points and seven rebounds. She scored all 10 points in a 10-0 run to give Texas a 28-9 lead in the first half.

Erika Arriaran added 11 points off the bench for the home team.

Texas out-rebounded CU 41-24 and went 8-for-15 (53.3 percent) from behind the arc.
