## NON-SCHOLASTIC VIDEO

The NCAA determined that it is not permissible to obtain video (e.g., live streaming video, recorded video) of any non-scholastic activities, including regular game and all-star competition, or any summer camp or clinic competition, through a subscription to a recruiting or scouting service. The only permissible activities to obtain via video would be regularly scheduled **SCHOLASTIC** activities.

Recently, two student-athletes were involved in a situation during competition that led to their suspension from the team for the remainder of the season and academic year. However, these student-athletes were allowed to remain in school. One student-athlete decided to withdraw from school immediately and seek a transfer from his institution. The other student-athlete, however, elected to stay in school with the hopes of earning his way back on the team the following year. The student-athlete then decided to try and return to his club team he played on prior to enrolling in college. Had this student-athlete done so, he would have been RENDERED INELIGIBLE in his sport for the remainder of his eligibility clock. Except for a few exceptions, NCAA rules do not allow a student-athlete to participate in outside competition while they are enrolled in school.

## SCOUTING OPPONENTS

*The NCAA has a variety of different rules when it comes to coaches scouting opponents.*

### ***In Football, Basketball, and Volleyball:***

*Coaches are prohibited from scouting opponents in-person, unless they are at a multi-team event (e.g. tournament) where future opponents are playing at your team's site. Also, teams are prohibited from purchasing video of opponents to scout teams, **unless it is the post-season.***

### ***In All Other Sports:***

*CU cannot pay expenses to coaches to go scout future opponents off-campus. We can also not pay others to do so (e.g. professional scouting services). It is important to also note that if a coach goes recruiting, that coach is NOT allowed to incorporate scouting into his/her trip!*
