



2009 COLORADO FOOTBALL / SPRING GAME NOTES

April 25, 2009 (Folsom Field, 1:00 p.m.)

Quickly Today marks the third and final major scrimmage of the spring, as CU has scrimmaged on April 11 and 17 prior to today ... The Buffs have also scrimmaged regularly at times during most of the practices, especially dealing with the red zone and situational scrimmages ... For the first time since 2005, all 15 practices took place after spring break; the previous three years a handful took place prior to the week off ... CU coach **Dan Hawkins** is wrapping up his fourth spring practice session; he indicated that captains would not be selected until the fall ... There are about 200 football alumni in town rekindling friendships and taking part in the annual favorite events (Friday golf, evening reception, Saturday breakfast, autograph session and postgame barbecue). **Daniel Graham** was the featured alumni speaker at this morning's breakfast.

Format The format today will be the standard Offense vs. Defense scrimmage; but with just two quarterbacks, the "BLACK" team will be when Cody Hawkins is at quarterback; the "GOLD" team will be when Tyler Hansen is the QB (both will start the same number of possessions against both the Nos. 1 and 2 defenses). There will be 10 minute quarters (40-second play clock) and three time outs per team per half.

Roster Moves Only four position changes were made ahead of spring practice: senior **Trace Adams** has moved from safety to fullback; sophomore **Arthur Jaffee** has moved from tailback to safety; **Ray Polk** is moving from tailback to safety; and redshirt freshman **Cameron Wright** has moved from quarterback to wide receiver. After practice started, Jaffee moved to cornerback, as did **Paul Vigo** (from safety); **Josh Hartigan** moved from outside to inside linebacker, while **Tyler Ahles** and **Guy Sergent** moved from inside 'backer to outside. Tailbacks **Kevin Moyd** and **Corey Nabors** started attending receiver meetings and are listed at both positions.

Three non-senior players will not return from the 2008 squad for assorted reasons: **DE Jason Brace**, **WR Sean Lieb** and **CB Lamont Smith**. Brace was actually finished prior to the end of the season due to medical reasons (concussions). Two players decided to leave the team after spring drills began, **WR Chance Blackmon** (citing a desire to play closer to home due to family reasons) and **QB Matt Ballenger**.

Colorado has 62 players on scholarship for spring practice; no walk-ons have been placed on scholarship in the off-season. There are 94 players on the roster at present; 12 of whom will either miss practice (3) or participate on a limited basis (9) due to injury at this point.

Wireless & Ethernet Info

Several stadiums have had wireless issues within the recent year; Invesco Field at Mile High did away with it all together. At Folsom Field, some problems have been traced to iPod and other electronic use in the stands, which have caused users to be kicked off the system. To help battle these issues, CU Information Technology has installed a new wireless network (or SSID) strictly for the **Fred Casotti Press Box**. Media should select the wireless network **PBNET** and follow the instructions below. Returning media should disconnect from **UCB WIRELESS** and connect to **PBNET**. Additionally, there are several Ethernet connections along the first row, with a connection box complete with cords every three or four seats. There is one thing all should be aware of: you will be going through the CU system to access the Internet, so you will need to have the latest virus protection software and all windows updates should be installed to protect both our system and your laptops (otherwise, you may not attain access).

Spring Game Attendance

As most know, for the second year in a row, former head coach **Bill McCartney** challenged the 1,500-plus in attendance at CU's annual recruiting luncheon in Denver (Feb. 5) to help fill Folsom Field for the spring game. The challenge worked to the point where CU had its all-time spring record of 17,800 last year; however this year, with the date a week later, CU is competing with the third game of the Denver Nuggets-New Orleans Hornets playoff series, as well as the first day of the NFL Draft. Admittance to the game is free and there is no hard ticket, thus CU officials have no idea what to expect today.
