QUICKLY: Colorado leads the series 2-0 against the Matadors with both wins coming in Boulder • Last played Jan. 17, 1994 (100-85) and Nov. 23, 1990 (113-89) • The last time the Buffs scored 100 points occurred Jan. 3, 2006 (116-52, Savannah State) • CU is 5-0 at home to begin the season, the last time they began a home season 6-0 in Boulder was 2005-06 (7-0).

CSU NORTHRIDGE UPDATE: The Matadors are the defending Big West champions and bring a 4-6 record into Boulder, in addition to a three-game losing streak. They were selected to finish third overall in the Big West Pre-season Poll behind Long Beach State and UC Santa Barbara. Cal State Northridge also brings an 0-4 road record into Boulder having lost at Purdue (89-64), Western Kentucky (68-67), Washington (88-76) and Denver (89-82).

TODAY'S POSTER FEATURE: Freshman guard Alec Burks takes a turn on the sixth game day poster of the season. The Grandview, Mo. native is second on the team in scoring and rebounding averaging 16.1 points and 4.3 rebound per game. He's shooting a team-best 57.4 percent from the field with 10 starts. Burks has five games where he has scored 18 or more points, including pair of 20+ point efforts. He has led CU in scoring four times (twice shared), three times in rebounding (one shared), steals and assists twice, and blocks once. After 10 games, Burks ranks as the second-best freshman in points per game average, only behind Chauncey Billups (17.9, 1995-96).

ON THE ROAD: Even though the NCAA determined the Buffaloes' 73-58 win over Chaminade at the EA Sports Maui Invitational was declared a road victory, the Buffs still have an 20-game skid against Division I opponents on the road. CU's last road win came on Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State, 73-70.

SUPER FRESHMAN: Alec Burks has started all 10 games and netted over 10 or more points in every game. With 161 points, he ranks third among other CU greats in their freshman year. Top of the list is Chauncey Billups (204, 1995-96) and Emmett Lewis (175, 1975-76). Only Billups, Roby and Lewis have at least made it to 10-straight games with 10 or more points. Lewis is the only one with 11-straight games.

TOP CU FRESHMEN: If the season ended today, freshman guard Alec Burks would rank second among freshmen scorers in the school's history. Here's the top-five to-date.

THREE-YEAR REVIEW: Coach Bzdelik has 102 career collegiate wins • CU has scored 80 points in five of 10 games this season (previously 80+ five games in his first two years) • Team has shot 50 percent or better in 12 of 20 halves • have made 65 3-pointers, the most in three years after 10 games • team is shooting .495, another three-year best.

CLOSE CALLS: During the last three plus years, the CU men's team has suffered 46 losses. If you take a closer look, 23 of those losses were by single-digits, an average of 4.6 points.

HIGGINS UPDATE: Cory Higgins has led the team in scoring seven of 10 games (one shared); has six 20-plus scoring efforts with 28 points against Arizona, his third highest scoring game, in addition to 18 career 20-point efforts • Scored 1,001 career points (26th at CU) • Started every game as a Buff (73), ranking t-15th • 13th in career steals (110) • 15th in minutes played (2,548) • 27th in assists (180) • Last season, Higgins was one of 13 players nationally to lead team in 5 categories • 2008-09 All-Big 12 Third Team; 1st Big 12-only steals (1.9 apg.).

10-GAME REVIEW: CU's 5-0 home start matches the 2005-06 season for wins at home to begin the season • CU has made a three-pointer in 236 consecutive games (seventh overall in the Big 12) • CU's 47 points in the first half against CCU set a season high for most points scored in the first half. The amount was a point less for first half points since Jan. 6, 2007 vs. Texas when they scored 48 first half points • CU is 6-2 this season when leading at the half • CU has scored at least 70 points in eight of 10 games • CU has had at least 3 players in double digits in nine of 10 games (at Colorado State, two players).

MAUI INVITATIONAL WRAP: The Buffaloes lost a pair of close games in their first-ever visit at the EA Sports Maui Invitational falling to Gonzaga, 76-72 and Arizona, 91-87 (overtime). CU defeated Chaminade on day three, 73-58. In the first game against the Bulldogs, four players scored double-digits with Cory Higgins scoring a team-high 19 points with six rebounds. The following day, the Buffs, again placed four players in double-figures with Higgins and Alec Burks scoring 28 and 20 points, respectively. On day three, the Buffs received 13 points each from Burks and Marcus Relphorde against Chaminade.

BUFF NOTES (individual): Austin Dufault recorded his first career double-double (14 points, 11 rebounds); he's the first CU player to tally a double-double since Cory Higgins last year (Western State, 24 pts., 10 rebounds) • Nate Tomlinson scored a career-best 20 points, he's the first CU player other than Higgins and Dwight Thorne to score 20 or more in a game since Richard Roby scored 22 at Oklahoma State (Feb. 6, 2008) • Tomlinson had a career-high eight assists against Gonzaga and Chaminade, also had a career-best five steals against the Silverswords • CU placed a pair of 20-point scorers against Arizona (Higgins 28,

McClain went 2-2, however Coach Bzdelik is credited with the wins/losses.

TEAM NOTES: Colorado's 78-54 over San Francisco saw some stellar performances not highlighted in the final box score. Nate Tomlinson and Marcus Relphorde each led the Buffs in assists with six apiece. That's a school-first since Dec. 19, 2003 (2003-04) against Tennessee State • Austin Dufault swatted a career-best three shots • Cory Higgins made his first eight shots against the Dons (first miss 15:49, second half). He went 6-for-6 in the first half • CU shot a first half best .615 from the field in the first half (16-of-26) • CU committed only six turnovers against USF, the third time this season with single-digits turnovers. That's the lowest since five, Dec. 2, 2005 (Cal Poly).

CU IN THE BIG 12/PAC-10 HARWOOD SERIES: CU is now 0-3 against the Pac-10 in the series. The Buffs have fallen on the road to Oregon State, 74-69, and in the previous two year lost twice to Stanford (76-62 in 2008; 67-43 in 2007). Iowa State is also 0-3 against the Pac-10.

Cory Higgins started his first game (Nov. 9, 2007) with a 10-point, five-rebound, three-assist performance against New Mexico. Last year, Austin Dufault (13 pts.) and Nate Tomlinson (12 pts.) started against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

NEW UNIFORMS: The 2009-10 season marks the first time in 19 years the Colorado men's basketball team will don new home uniforms. This season's new look will be silver, a first since the 1990-91 season. They also wore black and silver for both home and away games. This season, the 2009-10 Buffs will have silver, gold and black jerseys.

OUT FOR SEASON: Freshman guard Shannon Sharpe will miss the 2009-10 basketball season with season-ending knee surgery after injuring his left knee during pre-season workouts. Sharpe successfully had a microfracture procedure. Sharpe, a 6-1, 200-pound guard from Corona, Calif. is one of four true freshmen on the 2009-10 roster. He will be medically redshirted.

DEFENDING THE OPPOSITION (Scoring Defense): In the last two years under Coach Bzdelik, CU's defense has allowed the opposition an average of 66 points per game (67.5: 2008-09; 64.4: 2007-08). That two-year total ranks only second to the 1980-81 season (64.5 ppg.) and 1979-80 (67.3 ppg.). Those two years averaged out to 65.9 ppg.

The "experience" category basically is the average number of years the members of the team have been playing (i.e. A senior is given a 3, a junior a 2, a sophomore a 1 and a freshman a 0). The findings did not take into account redshirt years, and it's obviously not based on Division I experience, since a juco transfer would be assigned a 2 just like a third-year junior. Missouri's Tyler Stone is the youngest player in the Big 12 (born Sept. 8, 1991), while Brady Morningstar of Kansas is the oldest (born Jan. 23, 1986).

DEFENSE THROUGH THE YEARS: In his six years as a collegiate coach and two-plus seasons in the NBA, head coach Jeff Bzdelik has installed playing defense as a major part of the game. Here's a look at his teams over the years. His 2005-06 season at Air Force was a nation's best in scoring defense of all 970 collegiate schools in Division I (326), D-II (265), and D-III (379).

You're entering your third year, what's the one thing you are looking forward to this year?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if our players improve on a daily basis and play collectively up to their potential."

The team looks bigger and stronger. Was each student-athlete responsible for his own off-season workout?

"It's the direct result of having a weight room for basketball (at the Events Center) and having a strength and conditioning coach just for basketball. That piece has been sorely missing from this program and we now have it."

What's the difference from this year compared to last year with your team?

"We didn't have success on the scoreboard last year because we weren't deep enough, strong enough, mature or experienced enough. We have gotten deeper because of the five additional players, in addition to Trent Beckley (Beckley missed all of last season with a stress fracture in his lumbar spine). We have gotten stronger because of the weight room and with the strength coach coupled with the dedication of our players since last April. We are now a little bit more experienced based on the number of quality minutes of all our young players received last year and are a little more mature."

Is this team better than the perception with only one senior?

"We are getting better, there's no question in my mind. I'm really excited about coaching this basketball team. I finally can coach; I think my first two years were spent with a lot of energy, time and emotion helping build the facilities, recruiting, drumming up support for the program; creating a culture that's positive and now a lot of those pieces are in place. So it's about developing our basketball team. Pretty much all my energy and

focus will be, opposed to just part of it."

Four returning starters averaged at least 30 or more minutes a year ago. Will that happen again?

"Not really, that was born out of necessity, but the days of Cory Higgins and Dwight Thorne playing 37 minutes a game are gone."

Your thoughts on senior guard Dwight Thorne?

"Maturity, energy ... to me he's the face of the Colorado program in terms of what you would want a Colorado basketball player to be like both on and off the court."

Your thoughts on junior guard Cory Higgins?

"One of the nation's best players at his position. Cory also leads by example; he has a quiet demeanor in some ways camouflages his intense fierce competitiveness."

Sum up your newcomer class (four freshman, one transfer)?

"They're all going to contribute. From a coaching perspective, the depth now is a player can't take a possession off, if they do, they're coming out. In the past, I would walk down to the bench and look, and I would walk back to my seat. I don't have to rant and rave, and be boisterous. With this group, I like what I see, I enjoy it."

Entering the season, a high percentage of scoring (86.9%), rebounding (90.3%) among other stats return. How does that play into the 2009-10 outlook?

"It's what I envisioned for this program. What really excites me is that you are going to be saying the same thing a year from now will only be one senior. It's what fuels my cautious optimism about the future of Colorado basketball. I say cautious because we're in the Big Nasty, the Big 12 ... everybody is good. It's a beast."

What do you like about your non-conference schedule?

"Anybody who says anything negative about our schedule doesn't understand. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has everyone coming back from last year; the Maui Invitational is a monster; San Francisco has one of the top power forwards in the nation who's in a senior; Oregon State is picked at the higher echelon of the Pac-10; Miami OH is always a perennial threat to win the MAC and are extremely well-coached with a great basketball tradition; Tulsa is rated in the preseason top-25 and they have everyone coming back; at Colorado State, 'you don't think they're going to have Moby packed for that game?'; Cal State Northridge almost beat Memphis in the NCAA Tournament first round last year. Northridge has three starters returning, two of their top players come off the bench and they signed five junior college transfers. If we can have a winning record with this kind of schedule, we'll be in contention for some kind of postseason play."

What will constitute a successful season for you?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if my team plays to its fullest potential."

GAME #7 REVIEW: The Buffs improved to 5-2 overpowering San Francisco 78-54. Cory Higgins led all scorers with 22 points and was one of four Buffs players in double figures. Alec Burks added 12 while Dwight Thorne II and junior Marcus Relphorde, who was celebrating his 21st birthday, contributed 10 each.

It was the seventh consecutive game that CU has scored 70 or more points, as well as the seventh straight game CU has had four players reach double figures.

In a 16-2 Buffs run, Higgins scored six points as CU opened a 32-20 lead. But over the next 31/2 minutes, the Buffs got sloppy again and allowed the Dons to creep back to within five points (35-30).

Bzdelik quickly called a time out, and whatever was discussed in his huddle was taken to heart. The Buffs outscored the Dons 7-2 in the final 4:14 of the half and went to the locker room leading 42-32.

Higgins hit all six of his first-half field goal attempts - including a pair of three-pointers - and both free throw tries to finish the first 20 minutes with 16 of his total.

CU opened the second half with pressure on both ends. An 8-0 run pushed the Buffs ahead 50-32. The Buffs got another pair of baskets from Higgins and Relphorde - they hit their first six shots of the last half - to extend their run to 12-0 before USF guard Dontae Bryant hit a free throw at 16:13 for the Dons' first points of the second half.

But by then, the Buffs had surged ahead 54-33.

GAME #8 REVIEW: Freshman Alec Burks scored 19 points and junior Cory Higgins added 15, but it wasn't enough as the CU fell to Oregon State 74-69.

Oregon State's Calvin Haynes tied for a game-high with 19 points, including a critical jump shot with 1:08 left in the game to give the Beavers a 70-69 lead.

Facing a 64-61 deficit, junior Marcus Relphorde came up big for CU, hitting three-pointers on consecutive possessions to put Colorado ahead 67-64 with 2:34 remaining.

The Buffs led 69-68 before Haynes hit his jumper to give the Beavers the lead for good in a back-and-forth second half that saw seven lead changes. Burks led the way for Colorado in the first half, scoring 13 points, as the only time CU trailed in the half was 2-0.

Haynes kept the game close for the Beavers though, leading them with 11 first-half points. Higgins hit a jumper to beat the halftime buzzer and the Buffs took a 36-31 advantage into the break.

The Buffaloes were effective on the offensive glass, recording 15 offensive rebounds and scoring 23 second-chance points. Burks led with a career-high six offensive boards. Relphorde finished with 13 points, going along with Burks' 19 and Higgins' 15.

For the first time this season, CU failed to have at least four scorers reach double digits. Burks recorded a career-high nine rebounds to lead the team. Higgins and sophomore Nate Tomlinson each notched three assists.

GAME #10 REVIEW: The Colorado men's basketball team did what was expected, rolling over Division II Colorado Christian 84-65 at the Coors Events Center.

Nonetheless, his Buffaloes (6-3) got far more than a brisk workout - particularly after the Cougars (1-5) trimmed a 30-point first-half deficit to 10 midway through the second half.

To finally dispose of the visitors, CU needed 13 consecutive points during a key second half stretch by junior Cory Higgins, who finished with a game-best 25 points. Teammates Alec Burks and Levi Knutson added 11 each, with Burks recording team highs in rebounds (six) and assists (four).

Knutson, recovering from a hip injury, played 22 minutes - his most of the season.

Colorado Christian, located in Lakewood, opened with four consecutive losses, then defeated Western State College on Saturday before making the trip to Boulder.

The Buffs could have named their halftime score, so they went with 47-27. But a little over 5 minutes earlier, it was 41-11 - and in reality, the first 20 minutes weren't that close.

CU promptly embarked on a 20-3 run, opening a 20-point lead (28-8) that would ebb and flow until intermission. Bzdelik used 10 players in the first half and nine of them scored, led by Higgins' 10 points.

The Buffs shot 60.7 percent (17-of-28) from the field in the opening 20 minutes, while the Cougars checked in at 39.1 percent (9-of-23) and were forced into a dozen turnovers while CU committed half that many and finished the game with 10.

With the Buffs' lead trimmed to 10, Bzdelik called a time out with 9:03 to play. Over the next 31/2 minutes Higgins hit 13 consecutive points to help CU reestablish an 18-point margin (76-58) with 5:15 remaining.
