**QUICKLY:** Tonight's game is the last non-conference game of the 2009-10 regular season • CU is 7-0 at home matching the 2005-06 season for consecutive home victories, the last 8-0 start at home was the 1982-83 season (9-0) • Alec Burks last four games: 18 ppg., 5.0 rpg., .533 FG% (24-of-45); .875 FT% -- all team highs • CU is only shooting .385 over the last two games (40-of-104), poorest any two-game total of the season • Cory Higgins holds the top five scoring games • CU is 5-0 when four of the five starters net double-digits • Nate Tomlinson has led CU in assists seven times (twice shared) • CU is 6-1 when shooting over 50 percent from the field • CU has scored over 70 points in 10 of 13 games and are 8-2 in those games.

**BIG 12 OPENERS:** Colorado brings a 12-game losing streak in conference openers with six of those coming on the road. The 2010 Big 12 opener is also the fourth time the Buffaloes will playing Texas and second time in Austin (2005-06). CU's lone Big 12 conference opening win came in the first season of the Big 12 (Jan. 4, 1997, Nebraska, 79-73).

**AGAINST THE LONGHORNS:** CU trails in the series, 13-8 and have lost the last four in a row, however, the last three games have been an average of 7.3 points. The Buffs are 2-6 at the Erwin Center and the last time in Austin, CU dropped a 69-67 decision, Jan. 19, 2008.

**HOME vs. THE ROAD:** CU is averaging 83.1 points per game with four players in double figures in seven home games (.532 FG%). In the six combined away/neutral court games, the Buffs are averaging 70.3 ppg., shoot .432 from the field and average two players in double figures.

**BROADCAST:** All Colorado men's basketball games can be heard live on KKZN AM 760. Mark Johnson will deliver play-by-play with Charles Johnson color commentary. Live internet audio of all CU basketball games is available on BuffsRadio, a subscription service through CUBuffs.com. Live internet video streaming of Sunday's game is available on BuffsTV, also a subscription service through CUBuffs.com. Please note the BuffsRadio audio and Buffs TV video are separate subscriptions.

**SUPER FRESHMAN:** Alec Burks has started all 13 games and netted over 10 or more points in every game. With 211 points for the season, Burks is 15th overall of all CU freshmen. Here's the list including a trio of current Buff players.

**TOP CU FRESHMEN:** If the season ended today, freshman guard Alec Burks would rank second among freshmen scorers in the school's history. Here's the top-five to-date.

**THREE-YEAR REVIEW:** Coach Bzdelik has 104 career collegiate wins • CU has scored 80 points in six of 13 games this season (previously 80+ five games in his first two years) • Team has shot 50 percent or better in 14 of 26 halves • have made 83 3-pointers, the most in three years after 13 games • team is shooting .484, another three-year best.

**CLOSE CALLS:** During the last three plus years, the CU men's team has suffered 46 losses. If you take a closer look, 23 of those losses were by single-digits, an average of 4.6 points.

- 2009-10: 3 games (13 points, 4.3 ppg.)
- 2008-09: 11 games (three non-conference, eight Big 12 games): 50 points (4.5 ppg.)
- 2007-08: 9 games (three non-conference, six Big 12 games): 43 total points (4.8 ppg.).

**HIGGINS UPDATE:** Cory Higgins has led the team in scoring eight of 13 games (one shared); has seven 20-plus scoring efforts with 28 points against Arizona, his third highest scoring game, in addition to 19 career 20-point efforts • Scored 1,051 career points and ranks 23rd overall. Next on the list is Larry Vaculik (1975-78, 1,084) • Started every game as a Buff (76, t-13th) • 10th in career steals (116) • 13th in minutes played (2,645) • 23rd in assists (193) • Last season , Higgins was one of 13 players nationally to lead team in 5 categories • 2008-09 All-Big 12 Third Team; 1st Big 12-only steals (1.9 apg.).

**ON THE ROAD:** Even though the NCAA determined the Buffaloes' 73-58 win over Chaminade at the EA Sports Maui Invitational was declared a road victory, the Buffs still have an 20-game skid against Division I opponents on the road. CU's last road win came on Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State, 73-70.

**MAUI INVITATIONAL WRAP:** The Buffaloes lost a pair of close games in their first-ever visit at the EA Sports Maui Invitational falling to Gonzaga, 76-72 and Arizona, 91-87 (overtime). CU defeated Chaminade on day three, 73-58. In the first game against the Bulldogs, four players scored double-digits with Cory Higgins scoring a team-high 19 points with six rebounds. The following day, the Buffs, again placed four players in double-figures with Higgins and Alec Burks scoring 28 and 20 points, respectively. On day three, the Buffs received 13 points each from Burks and Marcus Relphorde against Chaminade.

**CU IN THE BIG 12/PAC-10 HARWOOD SERIES:** CU is now 0-3 against the Pac-10 in the series. The Buffs lost on the road to Oregon State, 74-69 back on Dec. 4, and in the previous two years lost twice to Stanford (76-62 in 2008; 67-43 in 2007).

**FRESHMAN STARTERS:** In his first three years, Coach Bzdelik has started at least one freshman in the starting line up on opening night. Against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Alec Burks started (10 pts., three assists, two rebounds). Cory Higgins started his first game (Nov. 9, 2007) with a 10-point, five-rebound, three-assist performance against New Mexico. Last year, Austin Dufault (13 pts.) and Nate Tomlinson (12 pts.) started against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

**NEW UNIFORMS:** The 2009-10 season marks the first time in 19 years the Colorado men's basketball team will don new home uniforms. This season's new look will be silver, a first since the 1990-91 season. This season the 2009-10 Buffs will have silver, gold and black jerseys.

**ENTERING 2009-10:** This will be the third year of head coach Jeff Bzdelik and his staff. Here's a brief synopsis who and what is returning for the 2009-10 season:

**OUT FOR SEASON:** Freshman guard Shannon Sharpe will miss the 2009-10 basketball season with season-ending knee surgery after injuring his left knee during pre-season workouts. Sharpe successfully had a microfracture procedure. Sharpe, a 6-1, 200-pound guard from Corona, Calif. is one of four true freshmen on the 2009-10 roster. He will be medically redshirted.

**DEFENDING THE OPPOSITION (Scoring Defense):** In the last two years under Coach Bzdelik, CU's defense has allowed the opposition an average of 66 points per game (67.5: 2008-09; 64.4: 2007-08). That two-year total ranks only second to the 1980-81 season (64.5 ppg.) and 1979-80 (67.3 ppg.). Those two years averaged out to 65.9 ppg.

**BIG 12 AGE AVERAGES:** With only one senior on the Colorado roster, the men's team is the second youngest school in the Big 12 Conference. The following breakdown is courtesy of Mike Noteware of Oklahoma State. These averages are as of Oct. 15, 2009.

**BIG 12 PLAY SETBACKS:** Winning on the road is sometimes a difficult task, especially in the Big 12. CU has lost 29-straight Big 12 Conference road games since Feb. 5, 2006. All eight games in 2008-09, 2007-08 and 2006-07; and the last five games of the 2005-06 season.

**Last Big 12 Road Win:** Jan. 21, 2006 at Oklahoma State, 80-78 (ot).

**Last Big 12 Road Win (Regulation):** Jan. 14, 2006 at Missouri, 74-71.

**vs. RANKED OPPONENTS:** The Buffaloes have lost eight straight games to nationally ranked opponents dating back to the 2006-07. Their last win came in Boulder against then-No. 18/19 Oklahoma State, 84-75 (Feb. 15, 2007).

**ON THE ROAD vs. RANKED FOES:** CU has fallen on the road to ranked opponents 25-straight times. CU's last win on the road came at No. 20 Texas Tech, 80-78 (Jan. 11, 1997). The Buffs have lost 32-straight nationally ranked games away from Boulder, including 25 on the road and seven on neutral courts. Their last road win against a nationally ranked school came at No. 20 Texas Tech, 80-78, Jan. 11, 1997; last win over a top-10 opponent on the road: never.

### You're entering your third year, what's the one thing you are looking forward to this year?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if our players improve on a daily basis and play collectively up to their potential."

### The team looks bigger and stronger. Was each student-athlete responsible for his own off-season workout?

"It's the direct result of having a weight room for basketball (at the Events Center) and having a strength and conditioning coach just for basketball. That piece has been sorely missing from this program and we now have it."

### What's the difference from this year compared to last year with your team?

"We didn't have success on the scoreboard last year because we weren't deep enough, strong enough, mature or experienced enough. We have gotten deeper because of the five additional players, in addition to Trent Beckley (Beckley missed all of last season with a stress fracture in his lumbar spine). We have gotten stronger because of the weight room and with the strength coach coupled with the dedication of our players since last April. We are now a little bit more experienced based on the number of quality minutes of all our young players received last year and are a little more mature."

### Is this team better than the perception with only one senior?

"We are getting better, there's no question in my mind. I'm really excited about coaching this basketball team. I finally can coach; I think my first two years were spent with a lot of energy, time and emotion helping build the facilities, recruiting, drumming up support for the program; creating a culture that's positive and now a lot of those pieces are in place. So it's about developing our basketball team. Pretty much all my energy and

focus will be, opposed to just part of it."

### Four returning starters averaged at least 30 or more minutes a year ago. Will that happen again?

"Not really, that was born out of necessity, but the days of Cory Higgins and Dwight Thorne playing 37 minutes a game are gone."

### Your thoughts on senior guard Dwight Thorne?

"Maturity, energy ... to me he's the face of the Colorado program in terms of what you would want a Colorado basketball player to be like both on and off the court."

### Your thoughts on junior guard Cory Higgins?

"One of the nation's best players at his position. Cory also leads by example; he has a quiet demeanor in some ways camouflages his intense fierce competitiveness."

### Sum up your newcomer class (four freshman, one transfer)?

"They're all going to contribute. From a coaching perspective, the depth now is a player can't take a possession off, if they do, they're coming out. In the past, I would walk down to the bench and look, and I would walk back to my seat. I don't have to rant and rave, and be boisterous. With this group, I like what I see, I enjoy it."

### Entering the season, a high percentage of scoring (86.9%), rebounding (90.3%) among other stats return. How does that play into the 2009-10 outlook?

"It's what I envisioned for this program. What really excites me is that you are going to be saying the same thing a year from now will only be one senior. It's what fuels my cautious optimism about the future of Colorado basketball. I say cautious because we're in the Big Nasty, the Big 12 ... everybody is good. It's a beast."

### What do you like about your non-conference schedule?

"Anybody who says anything negative about our schedule doesn't understand. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has everyone coming back from last year; the Maui Invitational is a monster; San Francisco has one of the top power forwards in the nation who's in a senior; Oregon State is picked at the higher echelon of the Pac-10; Miami OH is always a perennial threat to win the MAC and are extremely well-coached with a great basketball tradition; Tulsa is rated in the preseason top-25 and they have everyone coming back; at Colorado State, 'you don't think they're going to have Moby packed for that game?'; Cal State Northridge almost beat Memphis in the NCAA Tournament first round last year. Northridge has three starters returning, two of their top players come off the bench and they signed five junior college transfers. If we can have a winning record with this kind of schedule, we'll be in contention for some kind of postseason play."

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if my team plays to its fullest potential."

Facing a 64-61 deficit, junior Marcus Relphorde came up big for CU, hitting three-pointers on consecutive possessions to put Colorado ahead 67-64 with 2:34 remaining.

The Buffs led 69-68 before Haynes hit his jumper to give the Beavers the lead for good in a back-and-forth second half that saw seven lead changes. Burks led the way for Colorado in the first half, scoring 13 points, as the only time CU trailed in the half was 2-0.

Haynes kept the game close for the Beavers though, leading them with 11 first-half points. Higgins hit a jumper to beat the halftime buzzer and the Buffs took a 36-31 advantage into the break.

The Buffaloes were effective on the offensive glass, recording 15 offensive rebounds and scoring 23 second-chance points. Burks led with a career-high six offensive boards. Relphorde finished with 13 points, going along with Burks' 19 and Higgins' 15.

For the first time this season, CU failed to have at least four scorers reach double digits. Burks recorded a career-high nine rebounds to lead the team. Higgins and sophomore Nate Tomlinson each notched three assists.

**GAME #10 REVIEW:** After glimmers of progress in previous road trips to Hawaii and the Pacific Northwest, the Colorado Buffaloes took a shorter junket - and regressed.

Staying in-state for a road game didn't help CU. Neither did coach Jeff Bzdelik's past "Moby jojo."

Inspired Colorado State surged to a 10-point halftime advantage, increased its lead to 18 midway through the second half, then held on to defeat CU 77-62 in Moby Arena.

The Buffs surged back in the final 4 minutes, closing to within seven points twice, but could get no closer.

CU lost its 20th consecutive road game to a Division I opponent. The Buffs last won on a Division I opponent's home court on Dec. 22, 2007 - and that 73-70 win was at CSU.

Bzdelik, meanwhile, entered Thursday's game with a 6-0 mark against CSU and was undefeated in three previous trips to Moby. No more, and Bzdelik knew why.

CU's lack of discipline, said Bzdelik, was most apparent in the way it attempted to run his offense. The Buffs entered the game knowing they should kick the ball out to a perimeter shooter when Rams defense collapsed - but CU failed to do it with any regularity.

He also was perturbed by CSU players stripping the ball from CU players and beating Buffs to loose balls and getting 12 offensive rebounds which translated to 13 second-chance points. The Buffs, dropping to 6-4, were outrebounded 41-27 and their 16 turnovers were the second-most of the season.

The Buffs' 36-26 halftime deficit was their largest of the season and their 34.8 field goal percentage in the first 20 minutes also was a season low. They finished the night at 37.3 percent from the field, hitting just 19 of 51.

**GAME #11 REVIEW:** As non-conference play trickles toward a conclusion, Jeff Bzdelik continues to call for more intensity and consistency from his Colorado men's basketball team.

Call it an early Christmas present, but he received a nice dose of each - plus some fairly impressive three-point shooting - in his team's 92-58 victory over Cal State Northridge. Improving to 7-4 and staying perfect (7-0) in the Coors Events Center this season, the Buffs recorded season-highs in points, three-pointers attempted (25) and steals (15). Their 10 treys made were second to the 11 hit against Colorado Christian earlier this month.

Senior Dwight Thorne II, coming off the bench for the first time in 10 games, led CU with 19 points. Freshman Alec Burks and junior Cory Higgins added 14 each, with junior Marcus Relphorde contributing 13 and sophomore Austin DuFault 12.

Higgins also was his team's main delivery man, recording a career-best eight assists. Seven came in the first half as the Buffs opened a 41-21 lead at intermission and effectively buried the Matadors.

Mainly on the strength of seven three-pointers and a pair of conventional three-point plays, CU opened its 20-point halftime lead and put Cal State Northridge on the ropes.

CU forced Northridge, which features 10 junior college transfers on its 15-man roster, into 15 first-half turnovers while committing 11. The Buffs finished with 32 points off the Matadors' 26 total turnovers and outscored the visitors 34-18 in the paint. Of the Buffs' 14 first-half field goals, half were treys, with three of them coming on consecutive possessions (Nate Tomlinson hit two, Thorne one) and enabling them to go up 17-3 with 13:05 before intermission.

The Matadors, winless (0-3) in true road games this season, steadily fell behind in the second half as the Buffs kept up their defensive pressure. The visitors trailed by 32 points (78-46) with just under 5:00 left and by 35 (92-57) in the final minute.
