QUICKLY: Entering tonight's game, Colorado is tied with Oklahoma State and Texas A&M in conference play, their opponents this week • Marcus Relphorde was named Big 12/Phillips 66 Co-Rookie of the Week • Cory Higgins tallied his third career 30-point effort against K-State. He now has 1,125 points (20th all-time at CU) • Fourteen players have fouled out this season equalling all of last year. In three Big 12 games, CU has been called 82 times (27.3 a game) • CU has shot 50 percent or better in all three Big 12 games (.523) • Despite shooting a .691 percentage (67-of-97) in Big 12 play, CU remains the top team in all games played at line among Big 12 schools (.762).

STREAKS: CU has lost 30-straight Big 12 Conference road games since Feb. 5, 2006. Last Big 12 Road Win: Jan. 21, 2006 at Oklahoma State, 80-78 (ot). CU also brings a 22-game road losing streak against Division I opponents. CU last won on the road over a D-I opponent Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State (73-70).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES:

Alec Burks remains the only true freshman in the country to score in double-digits every game this season • Burks' last five games lead CU: 7.2 rpg., .778 FT%, and five blocks • Nate Tomlinson has led the team in assists nine times, including six times with six or more. He leads the team with 72 assists. Last year, Tomlinson had 54 assists after 17 games • In three Big 12 games,

four players average 10 or more points (Higgins 21.0, Relphorde 19.7, Burks 17, Thorne 10) • Cory Higgins and Alec Burks are fourth and eighth in conference scoring (all games), while Burks and Higgins are third and fourth, respectively in FG percentage.

AGAINST THE COWBOYS: Oklahoma State leads the all-time series, 59-47 and holds an 8-6 edge in Big 12 play. OSU has won two in a row in the series and the teams are 2-2 in the last four games against one another. Last year, OSU defeated CU in Boulder, 76-55 as Levi Knutson and Casey Crawford scored Big 12 career-bests 19 and 14 points, respectively.

OSU UPDATE: Oklahoma State brings a 13-4 record (1-2 in Big 12) into tonight's game with the Buffaloes. OSU is also 9-0 at home and have defeated Texas Tech (81-52) back on Jan. 9. James Anderson is the Big 12 Conference leading scorer (21.6 ppg.) and OSU's leader on the scoreboard having led his team in scoring 12 times. The Cowboys are coached by Travis Ford, who is in his second year in Stillwater (36-16, .692). OSU was a NCAA Tournament a year ago making the second round.

TEAM NOTES: CU has shot 50 percent or better in the second half 10 times (6-4 in those games). They made 61.5 percent against Baylor (Texas Southern .636 was the highest) • CU is 7-0 when four of the five starters net double-digits • CU is 8-3 when shooting over 50 percent from the field • CU has scored over 70 points in 13 of 17 games and are 9-4 in those games • Over the last 14 years, CU is performing a best in field goal percentage (.492), 3pt% (.385), FT% (.762) and a low in turnovers per game (13.1).

STEPPING UP: Ever since going scoreless at Tulsa, junior Marcus Relphorde has dominated the stat sheet. Over his last four games: 18.3 ppg., 4.5 rpg. and .615 from the field (24-of-39). His 24 field goals is second to Cory Higgins (28), however his eight treys lead the team. On Monday, he was named Co-Big 12 Rookie of the Week.

BIG 12 HONOR: Marcus Relphorde was named co-Big 12 Phillips 66 Rookie of the Week for games played Jan. 11-17 in voting by a panel of media covering the Conference. This is Relphorde's first rookie of the week honor and first Colorado player to earn the award since Dec. 27, 2004 (Richard Roby). Relphorde helped the Buffaloes to a 1-1 week against two nationally ranked opponents. He started with 17 points and seven rebounds as CU topped No. 22 Baylor, 78-71. The junior guard

then chipped in 18 points and three boards as Buffs dropped an 87-81 decision to No. 12 Kansas State. In two outings, he averaged 17.5 points and 5.0 rebounds, and shot 57.9 percent (11-of-19) from the field. He also made 4-of-7 (.571) from 3-point range while adding three assists and two steals. Overall in three Big 12 Conference games, Relphorde ranks first on the Buffs in three-point percentage (.538) and three-pointers made with seven. He ranks second on the team in points per game (19.7 ppg.), rebounding (5.0 rpg.) and field goal percentage (.594).

ONE STREAK DOWN: The Buffaloes ended a nine-game losing streak to nationally ranked opponents by beating No. 22/24 Baylor (Jan. 12), 78-71 in Boulder. It's the first win against a ranked opponent dating back to the 2006-07 season when they defeated No. 12/14 Oklahoma State, 89-77 (Feb. 3, 2007).

HOME vs. THE ROAD: CU is averaging 80.8 points per game with four players in double figures in 10 home games (.527 FG%). Cory Higgins (21.8 ppg.), Alec Burks (15.7), Marcus Relphorde (12.6), Dwight Thorne (11.4). In the seven combined away/neutral court games, the Buffs are averaging 72.6 ppg., shoot .447 from the field and average only two players in double figures (Alec Burks 17.4 ppg., Cory Higgins 15.4 ppg.).

FRESHMAN STUD: Alec Burks has started all 17 games and netted over 10 or more points in every game. With 279 points for the season, Burks is eighth overall of all CU freshmen.

TEAM NOTES: CU committed a season-low five turnovers against Baylor, the lowest any CU team has made since five against Cal Poly (Dec. 3, 2005) and five against Texas (Feb. 8, 2005), both CU wins • CU committed 36 fouls against Kansas State, the most a CU has made since being called for 35 at Kansas, Jan. 31, 1995 • This season marks only the third time in the Big 12 schedule (1998-99 & 2006-07) that CU has opened conference play with back-to-back games against southern schools. The previous two years were a pair of losses each year to Texas and Oklahoma • CU made 30 or more field goals in a game four times this season (30 at Texas). That's the second-most since having five in the 2006-07 season against the 'Horns • CU is shooting 50 percent from the field in 19 of the 34 halves this year. CU tied a first-half best 61.5 percent at Texas.

ON THE ROAD vs. RANKED FOES: CU has fallen on the road to ranked opponents 26-straight times. CU's last win on the road came at No. 20 Texas Tech, 80-78 (Jan. 11, 1997). The Buffs have also lost 33-straight nationally ranked games away from Boulder, including 26 on the road and seven on neutral courts. Their last win over a top-10 opponent on the road: never.

BIG 12 OPENERS: Colorado has now dropped 13-straight Big 12 openers after Saturday's 103-86 loss at No. 2 Texas, including seven on the road. The Texas game was also the

ON THE ROAD: Even though the NCAA determined the Buffaloes' 73-58 win over Chaminade at the EA Sports Maui Invitational was declared a road victory, the Buffs still have an 20-game skid against Division I opponents on the road. CU's last road win came on Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State, 73-70.

BUFF NOTES (individual): Austin Dufault recorded his first career double-double (14 points, 11 rebounds) against Arizona; he's the first CU player to tally a double-double since Cory Higgins last year (Western State, 24 pts., 10 rebounds) • Nate Tomlinson scored a career-best 20 points against Zona, he's the first CU player other than Higgins and Dwight Thorne to score 20 or more in a game since Richard Roby scored 22 at Oklahoma State (Feb. 6, 2008) • Tomlinson had a career-high eight assists against Gonzaga and Chaminade, also had a career-best five steals against the Silver-swords • CU placed a pair of 20-point scorers against Arizona (Higgins 28, Tomlinson 20), that's twice this year with a pair w/ a least 20+ a game (the other, Texas Southern) • Associate Head Coach replaced Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik four of the 12 games

this season due to family concerns. McClain went 2-2, however Coach Bzdelik is credited with the wins/losses.

MAUI INVITATIONAL WRAP: The Buffaloes lost a pair of close games in their first-ever visit at the EA Sports Maui Invitational falling to Gonzaga, 76-72 and Arizona, 91-87 (overtime). CU defeated Chaminade on day three, 73-58. In the first game against the Bulldogs, four players scored double-digits with Cory Higgins scoring a team-high 19 points with six rebounds. The following day, the Buffs, again placed four players in double-figures with Higgins and Alec Burks scoring 28 and 20 points, respectively. On day three, the Buffs received 13 points each from Burks and Marcus Relphorde against Chaminade.

CU IN THE BIG 12/PAC-10 HARWOOD SERIES: CU is now 0-3 against the Pac-10 in the series. The Buffs lost on the road to Oregon State, 74-69 back on Dec. 4, and in the previous two years lost twice to Stanford (76-62 in 2008; 67-43 in 2007).

FRESHMAN STARTERS: In his first three years, Coach Bzdelik has started at least one freshman in the starting line up on opening night. Against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Alec Burks started (10 pts., three assists, two rebounds). Cory Higgins started his first game (Nov. 9, 2007) with a 10-point, five-rebound, three-assist performance against New Mexico. Last year, Austin Dufault (13 pts.) and Nate Tomlinson (12 pts.) started against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

NEW UNIFORMS: The 2009-10 season marks the first time in 19 years the Colorado men's basketball team will don new home uniforms. This season's new look will be silver, a first since the 1990-91 season. This season the 2009-10 Buffs will have silver, gold and black jerseys.

OUT FOR SEASON: Freshman guard Shannon Sharpe will miss the 2009-10 basketball season with season-ending knee surgery after injuring his left knee during pre-season workouts. Sharpe successfully had a microfracture procedure. Sharpe, a 6-1, 200-pound guard from Corona, Calif. is one of four true freshmen on the 2009-10 roster. He will be medically redshirted.

Entering this week, Oklahoma's Tony Crocker needed 28 boards to join the group.

The "experience" category basically is the average number of years the members of the team have been playing (i.e. A senior is given a 3, a junior a 2, a sophomore a 1 and a freshman a 0). The findings did not take into account redshirt years, and it's obviously not based on Division I experience, since a juco transfer would be assigned a 2 just like a third-year junior. Missouri's Tyler Stone is the youngest player in the Big 12 (born Sept. 8, 1991), while Brady Morningstar of Kansas is the oldest (born Jan. 23, 1986).

DEFENSE THROUGH THE YEARS: In his six-and-a-half years as a collegiate coach and two-plus seasons in the NBA, head coach Jeff Bzdelik has installed playing defense as a major part of the game. Here's a look at his teams over the years. His 2005-06 season at Air Force was a nation's best in scoring defense of all 970 collegiate schools in Division I (326), D-II (265), and D-III (379).

You're entering your third year, what's the one thing you are looking forward to this year?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if our players improve on a daily basis and play collectively up to their potential."

The team looks bigger and stronger. Was each student-athlete responsible for his own off-season workout?

"It's the direct result of having a weight room for basketball (at the Events Center) and having a strength and conditioning coach just for basketball. That piece has been sorely missing from this program and we now have it."

What's the difference from this year compared to last year with your team?

"We didn't have success on the scoreboard last year because we weren't deep enough, strong enough, mature or experienced enough. We have gotten deeper because of the five additional players, in addition to Trent Beckley (Beckley missed all of last season with a stress fracture in his lumbar spine). We have gotten stronger because of the weight room and with the strength coach coupled with the dedication of our players since last April. We are now a little bit more experienced based on the number of quality minutes of all our young players received last year and are a little more mature."

Is this team better than the perception with only one senior?

"We are getting better, there's no question in my mind. I'm really excited about coaching this basketball team. I finally can coach; I think my first two years were spent with a lot of energy, time and emotion helping build the facilities, recruiting, drumming up support for the program; creating a culture that's positive and now a lot of those pieces are in place. So it's about developing our basketball team. Pretty much all my energy and

focus will be, opposed to just part of it."

Four returning starters averaged at least 30 or more minutes a year ago. Will that happen again?

"Not really, that was born out of necessity, but the days of Cory Higgins and Dwight Thorne playing 37 minutes a game are gone."

Your thoughts on senior guard Dwight Thorne?

"Maturity, energy ... to me he's the face of the Colorado program in terms of what you would want a Colorado basketball player to be like both on and off the court."

Your thoughts on junior guard Cory Higgins?

"One of the nation's best players at his position. Cory also leads by example; he has a quiet demeanor in some ways camouflages his intense fierce competitiveness."

Sum up your newcomer class (four freshman, one transfer)?

"They're all going to contribute. From a coaching perspective, the depth now is a player can't take a possession off, if they do, they're coming out. In the past, I would walk down to the bench and look, and I would walk back to my seat. I don't have to rant and rave, and be boisterous. With this group, I like what I see, I enjoy it."

Entering the season, a high percentage of scoring (86.9%), rebounding (90.3%) among other stats return. How does that play into the 2009-10 outlook?

"It's what I envisioned for this program. What really excites me is that you are going to be saying the same thing a year from now will only be one senior. It's what fuels my cautious optimism about the future of Colorado basketball. I say cautious because we're in the Big Nasty, the Big 12 ... everybody is good. It's a beast."

What do you like about your non-conference schedule?

"Anybody who says anything negative about our schedule doesn't understand. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has everyone coming back from last year; the Maui Invitational is a monster; San Francisco has one of the top power forwards in the nation who's in a senior; Oregon State is picked at the higher echelon of the Pac-10; Miami OH is always a perennial threat to win the MAC and are extremely well-coached with a great basketball tradition; Tulsa is rated in the preseason top-25 and they have everyone coming back; at Colorado State, 'you don't think they're going to have Moby packed for that game?'; Cal State Northridge almost beat Memphis in the NCAA Tournament first round last year. Northridge has three starters returning, two of their top players come off the bench and they signed five junior college transfers. If we can have a winning record with this kind of schedule, we'll be in contention for some kind of postseason play."

What will constitute a successful season for you?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if my team plays to its fullest potential."

GAME #4 REVIEW: Cory Higgins scored a team-high 19 points in a 76-72 loss in the opening game of the Maui Invitational. CU led by 15 in the first half and by 11 at halftime, but could not hold on to the lead in the second half. Gonzaga tied the game at 57 with 8:23 remaining on an Elias Harris basket and free throw. The game would be tied five additional times down the stretch before the Bulldogs pulled ahead for good.

The Buffaloes made seven of their first nine three-point attempts. Powered by their hot shooting, CU went on a 27-6 run to take their largest lead of the game at 36-21 with 5:35 remaining in the first period. Junior Casey Crawford led the Buffs with eight points at the break as CU went into halftime with a 40-29 lead.

Gonzaga came storming back in the second half though, led by Highlands Ranch, Colo. native Matt Bouldin. Bouldin scored 16 of his 21 points after halftime, including a contested bank shot with 39 seconds left to put the Zags ahead 72-69. Steven Gray scored a game-high and career-high 27 points for the Bulldogs.

The Buffs still shot 53.1 percent from the field for the game and for the first time since the 1994-95 season have shot over 50 percent in four straight games.

Freshman Alec Burks scored 11 points adding to Higgins' 19. Nate Tomlinson dished out a career-high eight assists to go with his eight points. Higgins and Burks tied for the team lead with six rebounds apiece.

GAME #7 REVIEW: The Buffs improved to 5-2 overpowering San Francisco 78-54. Cory Higgins led all scorers with 22 points and was one of four Buffs players in double figures. Alec Burks added 12 while Dwight Thorne II and junior Marcus Relphorde, who was celebrating his 21st birthday, contributed 10 each.

It was the seventh consecutive game that CU has scored 70 or more points, as well as the seventh straight game CU has had four players reach double figures.

The Buffs got another pair of baskets from Higgins and Relphorde - they hit their first six shots of the last half - to extend their run to 12-0 before USF guard Dontae Bryant hit a free throw at 16:13 for the Dons' first points of the second half.

GAME #10 REVIEW: After glimmers of progress in previous road trips to Hawaii and the Pacific Northwest, the Colorado Buffaloes took a shorter junket - and regressed.

Staying in-state for a road game didn't help CU. Neither did coach Jeff Bzdelik's past "Moby jojo."

Inspired Colorado State surged to a 10-point halftime advantage, increased its lead to 18 midway through the second half, then held on to defeat CU 77-62 in Moby Arena.

The Buffs surged back in the final 4 minutes, closing to within seven points twice, but could get no closer.

CU lost its 20th consecutive road game to a Division I opponent. The Buffs last won on a Division I opponent's home court on Dec. 22, 2007 - and that 73-70 win was at CSU.

Bzdelik, meanwhile, entered Thursday's game with a 6-0 mark against CSU and was undefeated in three previous trips to Moby. No more, and Bzdelik knew why.

CU's lack of discipline, said Bzdelik, was most apparent in the way it attempted to run his offense. The Buffs entered the game knowing they should kick the ball out to a perimeter shooter when Rams defense collapsed - but CU failed to do it with any regularity.

He also was perturbed by CSU players stripping the ball from CU players and beating Buffs to loose balls and getting 12 offensive rebounds which translated to 13 second-chance points. The Buffs, dropping to 6-4, were outrebounded 41-27 and their 16 turnovers were the second-most of the season.

The Buffs' 36-26 halftime deficit was their largest of the season and their 34.8 field goal percentage in the first 20 minutes also was a season low. They finished the night at 37.3 percent from the field, hitting just 19 of 51.

GAME #11 REVIEW: As non-conference play trickles toward a conclusion, Jeff Bzdelik continues to call for more intensity and consistency from his Colorado men's basketball team.

Call it an early Christmas present, but he received a nice dose of each - plus some fairly impressive three-point shooting - in his team's 92-58 victory over Cal State Northridge. Improving to 7-4 and staying perfect (7-0) in the Coors Events Center this season, the Buffs recorded season-highs in points, three-pointers attempted (25) and steals (15). Their 10 treys made were second to the 11 hit against Colorado Christian earlier this month.

Senior Dwight Thorne II, coming off the bench for the first time in 10 games, led CU with 19 points. Freshman Alec Burks and junior Cory Higgins added 14 each, with junior Marcus Relphorde contributing 13 and sophomore Austin DuFault 12.

Higgins also was his team's main delivery man, recording a career-best eight assists. Seven came in the first half as the Buffs opened a 41-21 lead at intermission and effectively buried the Matadors.

Mainly on the strength of seven three-pointers and a pair of conventional three-point plays, CU opened its 20-point halftime lead and put Cal State Northridge on the ropes.

CU forced Northridge, which features 10 junior college transfers on its 15-man roster, into 15 first-half turnovers while committing 11. The Buffs finished with 32 points off the Matadors' 26 total turnovers and outscored the visitors 34-18 in the paint. Of the Buffs' 14 first-half field goals, half were treys, with three of them coming on consecutive possessions (Nate Tomlinson hit two, Thorne one) and enabling them to go up 17-3 with 13:05 before intermission.

The Matadors, winless (0-3) in true road games this season, steadily fell behind in the second half as the Buffs kept up their defensive pressure. The visitors trailed by 32 points (78-46) with just under 5:00 left and by 35 (92-57) in the final minute.

GAME #13 REVIEW: The University of Colorado men's basketball team fell to the University of Tulsa Golden Hurricane, 84-59, at the Donald W. Reynolds Center in Tulsa, Okla. Saturday afternoon.

Colorado extends their on-the-road losing streak to 21 games while holding an 8-5 record in non-conference play. The Buffs' last road win over a Division I opponent occurred Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State (73-70).

Tulsa improved its record to 10-3 this season and remains undefeated at home (10-0).

Colorado battled Tulsa through much of the first half until the Golden Hurricane went on a 10-0 run putting them up 24-14 with 5:21 left. Cory Higgins contributed a three-point play after being fouled in the paint and making his free throw to put the Buffs down by a mere seven points (24-17).

A pair of good free-throws shots by Shane Harris-Tunks and a layup by Nate Tomlinson pulled the Buffs within four (25-21) with 3:30 left in the first half.

The Golden Hurricane pulled ahead making the score 36-29 at the half.

The Buffalos struggled from the beginning shooting a season low 10-of-30 (.333) from the field in the first half.

Despite being unsuccessful from the field, Colorado stayed aggressive committing a total of 15 fouls in just the first half and grabbed a season high eight offensive rebounds (19 total).

Colorado's improved shooting percentage in the second half cannot be blamed on the ball going through the hoop but on the decreased number of shots taken. The Buffs shot 10-of-24 (41.7%) from the field in the final 20 minutes. "progressed."

CU was outrebounded by only two (27-25) and committed the same number of turnovers (14) as Miami.

The Buffs led 32-25 at halftime, but their biggest lead before intermission was 10 points. A 12-2 run in the game's first 7 minutes opened that gap - but CU couldn't hold it, allowing Miami to even regain the lead by a point (18-17) before the Buffs were able to take some semblance of temporary control once more.

With 6:54 to play, Higgins scored after a hard drive down the right lane - and it happened at an opportune time. When Higgins laid the ball off the glass, the Buffs went up 49-40. He then stole the ball at midcourt and made another layup, capping a 10-0 run that pushed CU in front 51-40 for the home team's biggest advantage of the night.

GAME #16 REVIEW:

Cory Higgins, whose 18 points was the highest among five CU players in double figures.

Committing a season-low five turnovers to Baylor's 18 and getting double-figure scoring from five players, CU rallied from a five-point halftime deficit and held Baylor at bay in the final 1:37.

The Buffs shot 50 percent from the field (26-of-52) and were 16-of-26 (61.5 percent) in the second half.

Higgins got ample assistance from Marcus Relphorde (17), Burks (16), Nate Tomlinson (11) and Dwight Thorne II (10).

Badly outsized, CU compensated in the early going with defensive positioning and hustle, trailing Baylor by only three rebounds (17-14) at halftime and by five (32-27) on the scoreboard. Baylor eventually won the board battle 38-25.

Baylor forward Epke Udoh, honored in consecutive weeks as the Big 12's player-of-the-week, didn't get his first basket until the 17:11 mark of the second half. The 6-foot-10, 240-pound junior transfer (Michigan) finished with 14 points, 14 rebounds, five assists and a pair of blocked shots.

CU promptly embarked on a 9-3 run and went ahead 59-51 - its largest margin of the game to that point - with 5:15 to play. The Buffs' advantage increased to nine (64-55) on a trey by Relphorde, then 10 (66-56) on a layup by Higgins with 2 minutes left.

GAME #17 REVIEW: Jeff Bzdelik didn't dally in searching for a game comparable to the one his Colorado Buffaloes played Saturday against No. 13 Kansas State.

This Big 12 Conference game didn't give the impression of lasting quite that long, but it did require nearly 2 1/2 hours to complete, mainly because of the 68 fouls called -- a Coors Events Center record -- and 94 free throws attempted.

Neither Bzdelik nor his players wanted to pin their 87-81 loss against the Wildcats on what seemed like a whistle every 20 seconds, but they did acknowledge it's difficult to establish any offensive rhythm against the backdrop of an almost constant "tweet." "Yeah, it started, stopped, sputtered," Bzdelik said of what loosely passed for a pace in the Buffs' first home loss (9-1) of the season before the season's largest crowd (10,852). Bzdelik and the Buffs saluted their boisterous fan and student support.

Guard Cory Higgins called the crowd "the best Colorado crowd since I've been here," and Bzdelik added, "Our fans have been absolutely awesome. I sincerely hope they'll continue to support this team and create the kind of environment we had (Saturday) "We'll have some fun in this building."

Fun appeared to be on Saturday's menu, but there were those whistles . . . Understated CU senior guard Dwight Thorne II: "There were a lot of fouls called . . . It was hard for both teams to get in a rhythm. You have to deal with it."

However, the Buffs, trying to defeat

back-to-back ranked men's opponents for the time ever, had more to deal with than the adverse effects of a foul-fest. Consider: They were out-rebounded 44-27, gave up 23 points on 17 turnovers and saw their bench outscored 32-18 by the Wildcats.

The Buffs (10-7, 1-2) hit just 27 of their 40 attempts, while the Wildcats (15-2, 2-1) were 38-of-54 from the line. A telling companion stat: K-State shot 41.5 percent from the field (22-of-53), CU shot 53.2 percent (25-of-47). The Buffs were whistled for 36 fouls, the Wildcats 32.

CU's other double-figure scorers were Marcus Relphorde (18), Alec Burks (14) and Thorne (12). K-State had five players in double figures, led by Jacob Pullen's 18.

Relphorde wasn't among the three Buffs who fouled out (Trey Eckloff, Austin DuFault, Thorne), but he and three of his teammates finished with four fouls each.

And Relphorde, averaging 14.0 points in CU's previous four games, scored only three first-half points as a result of spending most of the half on the bench.

CU endured a jittery opening and a late 7-0 run by K-State to only trail 38-34 after a foul-a-rama of a first half - with more to come. A total of 36 fouls were called in the first 20 minutes - 19 on CU, 17 on the visitors.

But aside from quick whistles, errant whistles or whatever, for most of the first 20 minutes the Buffs simply weren't sharp offensively. They also suffered early turnover problems, committing five of their 17 - the Wildcats had the same total - in the first 4:10.

CU trailed 38-34 at halftime, holding K-State without a field goal in the half's final 2:43 and outscoring the Wildcats 7-3 to close to within four at the break.

Relphorde opened the second half apparently wanting to make up for his missed time. After making one of two free throws, he buried a three-pointer to tie the score at 40-40 with 16:53 remaining. Higgins then scored consecutive baskets to push the Buffs up 44-42 less than 5 minutes into the second half. It would be CU's last lead.

Meanwhile, Relphorde couldn't escape the whistles; he picked up his fourth personal with 11:14 to play and immediately went to the bench. The Buffs stayed close until Austin DuFault failed to convert a three-point play that would have tied the score at 52-52.

That might have been the opening the Wildcats needed; they went on a 9-2 run for an eight-point (61-53) lead and increased it to nine (78-69) with 2:13 to play.
