TOP-10 TIGERS TAKE ON COLORADO IN STIFF ROAD TEST SATURDAY

The Missouri Tigers (7-1 overall, 3-1 in Big 12 play) head to the mountains of Boulder, Colo., where they'll take on the Colorado Buffaloes (5-4, 3-2) Saturday evening in a game set for a 5:30 p.m. (central) kickoff. The game will be televised by FSN.

The 9th-ranked Tigers are coming off a workmanlike 42-28 home win over Iowa State, and look to stay in the hunt for a Big 12 North Division title – but the road will be hard, as 3 of MU's final 4 games will come away from Faurot Field. Mizzou is 2-1 playing away from home this year, including a road win at Ole Miss and a neutral-field win over Illinois to start the season.

Colorado is coming off a solid road win at Texas Tech (31-26) last Saturday that saw them end a 2-game losing skid at Kansas State and vs. Kansas. The Buffaloes ran for 217 yards at Tech last week, and intercepted Red Raider QB Graham Harrell 4 times to notch the win. CU needs just one more victory to become bowl-eligible.

AND DOWN THE STRETCH THEY COME

Saturday's game in Boulder, Colo. begins the final one-third of the regular season for the Missouri Tigers, and if Mizzou is going to fulfill pre-season prognostications of winning the Big 12 North Division title, it is possibly facing must-win situations the rest of the way, given the red-hot play of undefeated and division-leading Kansas. With four games left for both teams, KU holds a one-game lead in the North standings over MU, and a 1 1/2-game lead over both Colorado and Kansas State (both 3-2 in league play).

Only Iowa State, at 0-5 currently, has been eliminated from North contention at this point, and certainly both CU and K-State are still eyeing the crown – although things are tougher for both due to having already lost head-to-head matchups with Kansas. The head-to-head loss for both means that in order to win the division, they would have to finish either one full game ahead of KU, or finish in a tie involving three or more teams in which it wins a convoluted tiebreaker.

So with that, let's take a quick look at the remaining schedule of the five teams still in contention in the North. The numbers show that Mizzou has the toughest road to hoe the rest of the way among the top four teams, in terms of strength of schedule (with national ranking of toughest remaining schedule according to www.ncaa.org)...

TIGERS MOVE TO 7-1, 3-1 WITH 42-28 WIN OVER IOWA STATE

The Missouri Tigers improved to 7-1 overall and 3-1 in Big 12 Conference play with a 42-28 win last Saturday over the Iowa State Cyclones, in Columbia. The Tigers, installed as four-touchdown favorites coming in, got off to a rousing start, as they jumped out to a quick 14-0 lead after their 1st two possessions of the day, scoring on short runs by TB Jimmy Jackson (1 yd.) and TB Tony Temple (7 yds.), the latter who returned to the lineup after missing 2 games (ankle).

But the Cyclones wouldn't go away easily, as ISU made enough plays to hang around, and closed to within 17-14 with :24 seconds left in the 1st half. The Tigers, however, managed a 48-yard Jeff Wolfert field goal at the halftime gun to extend the lead to 20-14 at half, and scored a defensive TD on ISU's opening 2nd-half possession (NOSE Lorenzo Williams pounced on a fumble in the end zone caused on a QB sack by DE Stryker Sulak), and after a successful two-point conversion, MU led 28-14.

ISU still hung around, closing to 28-21 midway through the 3rd quarter, but MU's offense pulled away by scoring on consecutive possessions to make it 42-21 at the 11:24 mark of the 4th quarter, effectively ending the game and making Iowa State's last TD one for the stat sheets only.

Iowa State outgained Mizzou overall on the day by a 389-to-366 margin in total offense, thanks in large part due to a huge edge in time of possession of 38:22-to-21:38. The Cyclones ran 87 plays, compared to only 65 for Mizzou – season lows in both categories for MU.

TIGERS LOSE ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE PIG BROWN WITH INJURY

The win Saturday against Iowa State came at a heavy price for the Tiger defense, as senior co-captain SS Pig Brown was lost for the remainder of the year with a ruptured right Achilles tendon – suffered in the final five minutes of the game in a non-contact situation.

Brown was having an All-American-caliber season, and was very possibly a leading candidate for Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, and his presence will be missed dearly by the Tiger defenders. Brown had twice won Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors in 2007, for his stellar play against Illinois in the 2007 season opener (100-yard fumble return for TD and game-saving INT in the endzone to end the game) and also against Texas Tech (career-high 14 tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 2 PBUs, 1 INT and another pass deflection that ended up in a pick-six for MU's defense).

Brown had surgery to repair the injury Sunday in Columbia, and the surgery went well.

He ends his season having recorded 70 tackles, 8 TFLs, 3 INTs, 4 PBUs, 2 recovered fumbles (including the NCAA record-tying 100-yard return) and 1 forced fumble.

Likely replacing Brown in the lineup will be junior Justin Garrett, who has played well in his previous opportunities. Garrett missed Saturday's game against ISU due to a hyperextended elbow suffered in the Texas Tech game, but he's listed as probable for the game at Colorado.

Garrett has started 3 times this season when MU has gone with a nickel package to start the game, and he has 19 total tackles in 7 games. Garrett also has 2 INTs on the year, getting picks in back-to-back games at Ole Miss and against Western Michigan, while also forcing 1 fumble.

TIGERS RISE TO #9 IN A.P. POLL, ALSO STAND #9 IN BCS RANKINGS

After its 42-28 victory over Iowa State last Saturday, Mizzou moved up 4 spots in the Associated Press Top-25, to 9th. This marks the 6th-consecutive week the Tigers have been ranked, with the current ranking the highest for any Mizzou team since peaking at #8 in the A.P. poll during the 1981 season.

The 3rd week of BCS rankings was released Sunday, and the Tigers rose to #9, and were one of 4 Big 12 Conference teams included in this week's top-25: #6 Oklahoma, #8 Kansas, and #15 Texas were the others.

A few notes about MU carrying a ranking into a game:

- – MU is 92-59-1 overall (60.8%) in its previous 152 games as a ranked team, including 7-3 alltime as the #9-ranked team in the AP poll. Here's a look at those games...

- – Mizzou has played 66 previous times on the road as a ranked team, and the Tigers stand 35-30-1 alltime in those games (53.8%)...

- – Breaking that down further, Mizzou has played 45 times in its history on the road as a ranked team, playing against an unranked opponent. In those instances, MU sports an alltime mark of 30-14-1 (67.8%), but this week's foe – Colorado – has been a thorn in the proverbial side for MU, as the Buffaloes are 3-1 playing in Boulder, Colo., as an unranked team going against a ranked Tiger squad. Here's a quick glance at those instances...

TIGERS' SPOT IN BCS POLL IS HIGHEST IN PROGRAM HISTORY

The BCS standings (www.bcsfootball.org) this week reflect the Mizzou Tigers at #9, climbing from #16 after the initial rankings three weeks ago, and up 4 from last week's #13 spot.

This week is the 71st week a set of rankings has been compiled, and Mizzou's showing at #9 is the highest any Tiger team has stood in the rankings (which began in 1998), and only the 10th time overall that MU has made the BCS rankings. Here's a quick look at those times...

MIZZOU-COLORADO SERIES HISTORY

Mizzou and Colorado will meet for the 73rd time when they play Saturday in Boulder, Colo., with MU holding a slim 38-31-3 edge in the overall series. The Tigers have won two of the last three meetings (both in Columbia, Mo.), but the Buffs have won 7-of-11 since the formation of the Big 12 Conference in 1996.

If recent history holds true to form, then Saturday's game should be a tightly-contested one, as 8 of the 11 battles between the two teams have been decided by two scores or less. Boulder has been a tough place to play for Mizzou of late, as the Tigers have dropped their last four games there since last winning in 1997. Prior to that '97 win for MU, the Buffaloes had won six straight in Boulder, meaning that overall, CU has won 10-of-11 at home over the Tigers dating back to 1985.

Colorado dominated the series for a stretch beginning in 1985, when a 38-7 Buff win in Boulder began a streak that saw CU win 12-straight over Mizzou. And yes, here's where we feel obligated to make quick mention of the most infamous game in the series history – the 33-31 CU win in Columbia in 1990 that will henceforth and forever be known as the Fifth Down Game.

LAST YEAR REWIND: #25 MIZZOU 28, COLORADO 13 (2006)

The 25th-ranked Missouri Tigers beat Colorado 28-13 in their 2006 Big 12 Conference opener to improve to 5-0 and match their best start in a quarter-century.

Chase Daniel threw four touchdown passes as Missouri equaled the 5-0 start of the 1981 team. Daniel, a sophomore in his first season as a starter, completed 23 of 35 passes for 253 yards, with two interceptions.

Daniel and tight end Chase Coffman teamed up for first-quarter scoring passes of 2 and 9 yards. Daniel hit Missouri's other tight end, Martin Rucker, on a 1-yard score with 11 seconds left in the first half, and connected with wide receiver Jared Perry on a 9-yard score midway through the third quarter.

Both teams entered the game ranked in the top 10 nationally in team defense - Missouri (5-0, 1-0) was first and Colorado eighth. But the Tigers moved easily to touchdowns on their first two possessions, scoring on drives of 71 and 77 yards.

Colorado, ranked 113th in offense with just 223.5 yards per game coming in, actually outgained Missouri 373-353, but could manage just two Mason Crosby field goals - a 32-yarder in the first quarter and a 36-yarder in the second - and one third-quarter touchdown.

Missouri's third score was set up by a Colorado mistake when punter Matt DiLallo let a high snap slip through his hands late in the second quarter. He recovered but was tackled at the Colorado 14. Six plays later, on third-and-goal from the 1 and out of time-outs, Daniel hit Rucker to make it 21-6.

Colorado quarterback Bernard Jackson and wide receiver Dusty Sprague connected on a 63-yard pass on the first play of the third quarter, and Jackson scored from the 1 a play later to make it 21-13. Missouri answered with a 52-yard scoring drive ending with Perry's score.

Colorado went for it on fourth down five times. All five failed, including a second-quarter effort on fourth-and-goal from the Missouri 4 with the Buffaloes trailing 14-3.

Jackson was 13-of-27 for 190 yards and ran 15 times for 93 yards. Hugh Charles carried 13 times for 87 yards for Colorado. Tony Temple led Missouri runners with 70 yards on 18 carries.

Missouri converted 11-of-18 third down conversions, and its defense held the Buffaloes to only 3-of-12 on third downs, in addition to the 0-of-5 on fourth downs.

TIGERS LOOK TO IMPROVE ON 3RD-DOWN DEFENSE SATURDAY IN BOULDER

Mizzou's defense didn't exactly pitch a shutout last Saturday against Iowa State, but it didn't play as poorly as the 28 points allowed might indicate. The defense was only responsible for 21 points, as the Cyclones scored their 1st TD of the day off a deflected pass that was intercepted and returned for a pick six.

The Cyclones managed only 389 yards of offense on the day - the 6th-straight foe that MU has held to under 400 yards - and that was only one yard more than the previous week when MU held high-flying Texas Tech to only 388 yards in a 41-10 Homecoming win.

Mizzou's primary problem area against the Cyclones was on 3rd down, as ISU converted 11-of-20 attempts on the day. And when ISU didn't convert on 3rd down, they had mostly success on 4th down, converting 2-of-3 there. All of those conversions led to Iowa State owning a massive 38:22-to-21:38 edge in time of possession.

The Buffaloes have shown they can play the clock game with the best of them, as Colorado ranks 9th in the NCAA entering Saturday's game in time of possession. CU is averaging 32:13 of clock time so far.

For the season, MU's defense ranks 9th in the Big 12 on 3rd down defense, allowing opponents a conversion rate of 43.8% (57-of-130). Conversely, Colorado's offense ranks 11th in the Big 12, as they've converted at a 34.9% clip (51-of-146) through 9 games.

In 2006, 3rd and 4th down were a key in MU's 28-13 win over Colorado, as the Tiger defense held the Buffs to a combined 3-of-17 on conversions, including just 3-of-12 on 3rd down and 0-of-5 on 4th down.

Look for the Buffaloes to not be shy about giving it a go on 4th down this Saturday once again, as CU has the most 4th-down attempts in the nation this season, with 23 through 9 games (they've converted 11, for 47.8%). On the flip side, Mizzou has tried only 4 4th downs so far, converting a nation-best 100% to this point.

OFFENSE SCORING AT A REMARKABLE PACE

Mizzou ranks 8th nationally in scoring offense coming into Saturday's game, averaging 40.38 points per game. Perhaps, we would suggest, the most remarkable thing about this is the consistency with which the Tigers have scored this year – Mizzou has scored 30 points or more in each of their 8 games so far, and that's something that's never been done before at the school.

The previous longest stretch of consecutive games scoring 30 points or more was 5, and that was done only twice before, in 1997 under Coach Larry Smith, and in 2002 under Coach Gary Pinkel.

The 8 games of scoring 30 or more this season is tied for the MU single-season record, here's a quick look at those figures...

With 323 points scored so far, the current Tigers are on pace to shatter the school record of 399 points, set in 13 games by the 2003 squad. With a bowl game likely on the horizon, MU's current pace of 40.38 ppg extrapolates to a 13-game total of 525 points.

OFFENSE AVOIDING THE THREE-AND-OUT

Few things cripple an offense more than the dreaded failed possession that ends up going three-and-out with a punt. Mizzou's offense has proven astoundingly successful in 2007 at avoiding that pratfall, however, as through 8 games, MU has gone three-and-out (followed by a punt) only 11 times.

Five of those 11 times came in the season opener against Illinois, and another 2 came in game #2 in the 4th quarter at Ole Miss when MU had a big lead and was more concerned with milking clock than anything else. The chart below shows that Mizzou has had just 4 three-and-out offensive possessions total in the last 6 games...

DEFENSE MAKING STATISTICAL STRIDES

Mizzou's defense took some lumps from the peanut gallery/haters after its first two games, when it allowed 435 yards to Illinois and 534 yards to Ole Miss to begin the season.

But Defensive Coordinator Matt Eberflus' troops have worked hard to get better, and his young squad has done just that in the past month-and-a-half, as the Tigers have held 6 straight foes to under 400 yards of offense.

The Tiger defense kept ISU's offense in check last time out for the most part, as the Cyclones had 389 yards of total offense, but that was 60 yards more than ISU was averaging coming into the game. Also, ISU was able to convert 11-of-20 3rd down tries on the day, as the Tiger defense wasn't able to get off the field as much as desired.

Prior to that, Mizzou had a very impressive day against Texas Tech in which it held Tech's high-flying offense very much in check. The Red Raiders came into the game ranked 1st in the nation in passing offense (500.4 ypg) and total offense (582.0) and were 2nd nationally coming in in pass efficiency (177.9 rating) and 3rd in scoring (50.0 ppg). Eberflus was selected as the National Defensive Coordinator of the Week for his team's performance against the Red Raiders

The big plays have come down markedly, as MU has allowed only 13 plays of 20 yards or more in its last 6 games combined, compared to 14 of 20 or more in the 1st 2 games alone. Nebraska failed to produce a single offensive play of 20 yards or more, with the longest pass going for 18 yards, and the longest rush being 17 yards, while Texas Tech had just one play of 20 yards or more.

MISSOURI GETTING OFF TO FAST STARTS; PREVENTING OPPONENTS FROM THE SAME

Mizzou has proven through 8 games to be effective at both scoring on their initial possessions of either half, and also at preventing opponents from doing the same. Combining the opening drives for both teams in both the 1st and 2nd half, MU has outscored foes by a 63-14 margin.

In the 1st quarter, MU has outscored opponents by a 28-0 margin on opening drives. In fact, MU's defense has allowed a total of just four 1st downs all year to its 8 opponents (2 at Ole Miss, and 1 each to Texas Tech and Iowa State), while on offense, the Tigers have never gone three-and-out on their initial series.

The numbers are similar after halftime, as MU has outscored foes by a 35-14 margin in 3rd quarter opening drives. After the 1st two opponents (Illinois, Ole Miss) both scored a TD on their opening drives of the 3rd quarter, each of the last 6 foes have failed to score on their opening drive of the 2nd half.

TIGERS LEAD THE NATION IN 3RD-DOWN CONVERSIONS

The latest NCAA stats show that Missouri enters this weekend's games atop the nation's rankings in 3rd-down efficiency, converting a nation-best 56.9% (66-of-116). Mizzou maintained the top spot in the rankings after a 6-of-11 performance last Saturday against Iowa State.

Earlier, MU had a solid 9-of-16 showing (56.3%) on the road in the Tigers' 41-31 loss at 6th-ranked Oklahoma – that, despite the fact that OU came into the game ranked 3rd nationally in 3rd-down defense, allowing opponents a conversion rate of just 25.5%.

TIGERS AMONG NATION'S LEAST PENALIZED TEAM – RANK 3RD IN NCAA

One of Head Coach Gary Pinkel's tried and true lines has to do with Missouri beating Missouri, and how penalties and mistakes do just that. So far in 2007, his Tigers have done a good job of not beating themselves with penalties, as MU ranks 3rd in the nation in fewest penalty yards per game, with just 32.63 yards averaged. Mizzou's opponent this Saturday, Colorado, is about middle of the pack in the country, ranking 48th currently, with a per-game average of 50.78 yards.

Through 8 games, MU has been flagged 38 times for a grand total of 261 yards. They are coming off a game in which they were penalized just 1 time for 7 yards – a tough pass interference call that went against MLB Brock Christopher that extended an ISU drive on 3rd-and-long.

Prior to that, MU was flagged just 3 times for 33 yards against Texas Tech. Previously, the Tigers were cited 5 times for 25 yards at Oklahoma, after getting flagged 9 times for a season-high 79 yards against Nebraska the week before.

TIGER OFFENSIVE ATTACK AMONG NATION'S MOST BALANCED

Spread offensive attacks such as Mizzou's aren't usually thought of as strong in the run game, but the Tigers, through 8 games, have shown they can do more than just throw the ball.

Mizzou enters Saturday's game against Colorado ranked 40th in the NCAA in rushing (172.5 ypg), 5th in passing (326.1 ypg), 7th in total offense (498.6 ypg) and 8th in scoring (40.4 ppg).

The NCAA numbers show that MU is the only school in the country currently averaging at least 300 yards passing and 170 yards rushing. Here's a quick look at the numbers...

The last time out, MU was more productive passing the ball than running it, as the Tigers had 250 yards passing compared to 116 rushing. The number of attempts passing (37) and rushing (28) were fairly equal, and MU averaged 4.1 yards per rush attempt, but the Tigers just didn't have many opportunities offensively, as the Cyclones controlled the clock for more than 38 minutes and limited Mizzou to a season-low 65 offensive snaps.

Prior to that, the Tigers displayed virtually perfect balance against Texas Tech, as they rushed for 212 yards and threw for 210 yards in Mizzou's 41-10 win. That broke a string of 21 consecutive games where the Tigers had more passing yardage than rushing yardage in a game – the last previous instance of MU gaining more yards on the ground was in 2005 vs. Baylor (rush for 298, pass for 72).

DANIEL LEADING THE WAY FOR MIZZOU'S HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

There can't be many QBs in the nation playing at a higher level than Tiger signal caller Chase Daniel, who currently ranks 5th in the nation in total offense (342.75 ypg) and 17th nationally in passing efficiency (148.52 rating).

And he hasn't been putting up numbers against the sisters of the poor, exactly. Here's a look at Daniel's numbers this season against his 6 BCS-conference opponents...

Daniel had a scintillating night at Ole Miss, where he tied his own MU single-game record by tossing 5 TDs (all coming in a span of just 16:07), as he helped lead the Tigers to an important 38-25 road win. In the 2nd quarter alone at Ole Miss, Daniel was 12-of-17 passing for 177 yards and 4 TDs, good for a stout QB rating of 235.7.

Last season, Daniel smashed numerous season records that former QB great Brad Smith and others held, including passing yards (3,527 – almost 1,100 more than the old record of 2,436 by Jeff Handy in 1992), passing TDs (28), TDs responsible for (32) and total offense (3,906). Daniel ranked 5th in the NCAA in total offense with his per-game average of 300.5 ypg – that was the highest a Tiger has rated in total offense nationally since Bob Steuber finished 3rd in 1942.

Daniel, in his first year as a starter in 2006, led MU to its first 6-0 start since 1973, and an 8-win season for only the 10th time in school history. He enters Saturday's game against CU with a career record of 15-6 as a starter at Mizzou.

RUCKER LEADS ALL OF NCAA'S TIGHT ENDS IN RECEPTIONS & YARDAGE PER GAME

All-American candidate TE Martin Rucker bypassed the NFL draft after his junior year, in order to come back to help lead his team to great things in 2007, and also to help improve his draft status for next year. Through 8 games, his decision appears to have been an extremely good one, as Rucker has played like a man among children, as he leads all of the nation's tight ends with his per-game averages of 6.75 receptions and 73.88 yards (54 receptions, 591 yards, 4 TDs in all) He also ranks 19th nationally – among all position players – with his 6.75 catches per game.

It's hard to imagine a tight end playing more inspired ball right now, as Rucker has been a beast every time he's touched the ball – we're hyperbolizing a little here, probably, but it's hard to remember a time when he was brought down by any less than 3 people on a play when he's touched the ball this season.

The co-captain was a focal point of the offensive attack that rolled up 606 yards against Nebraska, as Rucker caught 9 passes for 109 yards and 1 TD against the Huskers. He followed with a 6-catch, 35-yard outing at Oklahoma where he caught a TD pass in the 4th quarter. Rucker is coming off a 3-catch, 51-yard outing against Texas Tech.

Rucker, who was voted a team co-captain by his teammates this off-season, caught 53 passes for 511 yards and 5 TDs a year ago. He entered his senior season (after bypassing the NFL Draft) already holding the MU career records for TEs in receptions (119) and yardage (1,341).

With updated career numbers of 173 receptions for 1,932 yards and 14 TDs, Rucker needs just 68 yards to become just the 3rd Tiger in history (and 1st tight end) to reach 2,000 yards. He also stands just 28 catches shy of the MU career receptions record of 200 held by former standout WR Justin Gage (200 from 1999-2002).

MACLIN LEADS BIG 12, RANKS 9TH IN NCAA IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDAGE

Redshirt freshman WR Jeremy Maclin was a highly-touted recruit in 2006 who figured to be a big part of the Tiger offense a year ago, before suffering a season-ending knee injury during summer drills prior to last season.

It didn't take long to show that he's fully recovered, and for MU fans to start looking for #9 jerseys in the Tiger Team Store at Memorial Stadium, as Maclin has been next-to-unbelievable thus far for Mizzou, as he enters Saturday's game at Colorado leading the Big 12 Conference, and ranking 9th nationally, in all-purpose yardage, at 186.88 yards per game.

In fact, Maclin is the only player among the NCAA's top-100 all-purpose players to currently have 200 yards in each of the 4 all-purpose categories, and there's now only one other player in Div. I-A (FBS) to have at least 100 yards in each category (WR Brandon Tate of North Carolina). Maclin enters the CU game with season totals of: rushing (235 yds.), receiving (488), punt returns (211) and kickoff returns (561).

J-Mac had his attack going last Saturday against ISU, as he had 170 all-purpose yards, including 65 receiving yards on 7 catches. He rushed for 26 yards, with 17 of them coming on a 4th-quarter end around that saw him score his 4th rushing TD of the season.

He rebounded nicely from being held to a season-low 66 yards against Texas Tech, as he didn't get a chance to return a single punt or kick, and rushed just 3 times due to a bruised shoulder he suffered in the first half that kept him out for awhile. Maclin did return after the injury to catch a 57-yard TD pass in the 3rd quarter from Chase Daniel.

At Oklahoma, Maclin scored a pair of rushing TDs, scoring from 5 yards out in the 1st quarter, and from 10 yards out in the 3rd quarter. He ended the night with 32 yards rushing (4 carries) and caught 5 passes for 53 yards, while returning 3 kickoffs for 104 yards total. Included in the kickoff number was a 56-yarder in the 1st quarter that was MU's longest kickoff return since 2002.

Maclin was a big part of MU's win against Nebraska, as he had 149 all-purpose yards, including 62 receiving (4 receptions) and 53 rushing (6 carries). Nebraska held him down in the return game, as he was able to make only 1 punt return (8 yds.) and kickoff return each (26).

His 4th-quarter punt return for a TD against Illinois State gave him 2 for the season, and that already ties him for the MU season and career records – only 4 others alltime at Mizzou have returned 2 punts for TDs. He was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week for his big day.

Prior to that, Maclin had a career-high 275-yard all-purpose outing against Western Michigan – the 5th-highest single-game total in MU history. On the day, Maclin had 7 receptions for a career-high 96 yards and 1 TD, he rushed 6 times for 52 yards and 1 TD, had 2 punt returns for 31 yards and returned 5 kickoffs for 96 yards.

Through 8 games, Maclin is on pace for 2,242 all-purpose yards so far (12-game season), which would obliterate the MU single-season record of 1,621 set in 1998 by former MU All-American, Devin West.

Maclin enters Saturday's game against Colorado currently 2nd in the Big 12 and 14th in the NCAA with his punt return average of 15.07 yards.

Maclin is currently 2nd on the team with 39 receptions, 2nd in scoring (60 points), 2nd in rushing (235 yards) and 2nd in receiving yards (488).

DON'T BLINK OR YOU'LL MISS MIZZOU'S QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE

The Tiger offense has shown its quick-strike nature often thus far this season, as its average time of possession in 48 offensive scoring drives thus far has been just 2:27.

Against Western Michigan, the Tigers struck quickly and often on the way to a 52-24 win. Every one of their 1st 7 scoring drives took 2:24 or less, including amazing back-to-back drives in the 2nd quarter that traveled 86 yards (TD) and 70 yards (TD) in just 1:04 and 0:52 seconds, respectively.

The game did end with the reserves methodically marching downfield in rather un-Mizzou-like fashion, grinding out a 14-play, 94-yard TD drive that took 5:18. Even with that 5:18 drive, the per-game average for MU's scoring drive against WMU was a mere 1:54. If that long drive is backed out of the equation, the other 7 scoring drives averaged only 1:25!!

Mizzou was actually a bit more methodical the last few games, as the Tigers had 4 scoring drives that took over 3 minutes apiece against Nebraska, and averaged 2:58 in 5 scoring drives at Oklahoma, while following with 6 scoring drives against Tech in an average of 3:03 apiece.

As per the chart below, of Mizzou's 36 offensive TD drives thus far, 22 have taken just 2:50 or less, including 16 in the last 6 games.

PINKEL STANDS 4TH ON ALLTIME MU COACHING WINS LIST

Mizzou Head Coach Gary Pinkel is in his 7th season at MU and touts a career record of 117-73-3 (61.4%).

Pinkel, who has led MU to a combined record of 35-22 over the past 5 seasons, and to bowl games in 2003, 2005 and 2006, has a 7-year record in Columbia of 44-36 (55.0%). Dating back to the 2005 Independence Bowl win over Steve Spurrier and South Carolina, Pinkel has won 16 of his last 22 games overall.

MU's 42-28 win last time out over Iowa State gave Pinkel his 44th MU win, and he stands 4th alltime on the coaching wins list at MU. Here's a quick look at the top 6...

Pinkel is in a select group of Mizzou coaches that includes College Football Hall of Famers Don Faurot and Dan Devine, as well as Warren Powers, to be the only coaches to have an MU record of above .500 (with at least one full season coached) dating all the way back to 1935.

The 2006 season got off to an historic start for Pinkel and his Tigers, as he led MU to its first 6-0 start since 1973, and its first 7-1 start to a season since 1969. He was awarded with a new five-year contract late in the year that will keep him on the Tiger sidelines through the 2011 season. The new deal trumped the old contract that was set to expire after the 2008 campaign.

Pinkel has led MU to 3 bowl games, and if his Tigers can reach a 4th in 2007, he would join Faurot (4 bowls), Devine (6 bowls), and Powers (5 bowls) as the only coaches to guide MU to 4 bowl games. After beating Nebraska in 2007 (41-6) for the 3rd time in 5 years, Pinkel became the first MU coach since Onofrio to defeat NU three times.

Pinkel has guided Mizzou to 4 winning seasons (8-5 in 2003, 7-5 in 2005, 8-5 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007), with those representing 4 of MU's 6 winning campaigns dating back to the 1983 season.

QUICK HITTERS

- – Senior P Adam Crossett has found his stroke of late, as he's averaging a solid 44.5 yds. per punt in 4 league games, which ranks him 2nd currently. Three of his last 5 punts have gone for 50 yards or more. Mizzou ranks 2nd in net punting in league play, as well (40.1 avg.)...

- – Junior PK Jeff Wolfert has found his stroke, as he's made 7 consecutive FGs since his last miss against Illinois State, to improve to 12-of-16 for the year (he's also a perfect 39-of-39 on PATs this season). Wolfert hit a clutch 48-yarder (a season long) at the halftime gun last Saturday against Iowa State that extended MU's lead to 20-14 going into the lockerroom...

- – Senior C Adam Spieker is a true Iron Man who will be making his 44th consecutive start Saturday in Boulder. The Rimington Award Candidate is only 4 starts shy of the school record of 48 held by QB Brad Smith (2002-05)...

HEAD COACH GARY PINKEL

In his seventh year directing the Missouri Tiger football program, Head Coach Gary Pinkel has built a solid foundation that has Mizzou pointed toward an exciting future.

While Pinkel himself would say that the program is still a work in progress, numerous accomplishments can be pointed to that already tell a nice success story. Mizzou enjoyed an exciting 2006 campaign that saw them win eight regular-season games for just the 10th time in school history, and the Tigers' appearance in the Brut Sun Bowl marked MU's third bowl game in the past four seasons – the first time in 25 years that Mizzou has had three bowls in four years.

Mizzou caught the attention of the national football community in 2006, as the Tigers got out to a scintillating 6-0 start, the first time since 1973 that MU had won its first six games. Mizzou was ranked for much of the season and had its name mentioned on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* and had its program prominently featured in other national publications such as *USA Today* and *The New York Times*. Exposure to the program has never been higher, as a record-tying nine of MU's 13 games were televised in 2006.

His success has led to an increased commitment to his program from the University, as Pinkel was awarded with a new five-year contract last November that will keep him on the Tiger sidelines through the 2011 season. With winning seasons in 2003 (8-5), 2005 (7-5) and 2006 (8-5), Pinkel is the first MU coach to achieve three winning seasons since Warren Powers.

Pinkel and his program successfully built on the momentum created from a thrilling 38-31 win over South Carolina in the 2005 Independence Bowl that saw his Tigers overcome a 21-point deficit. The landmark win marked the largest come-from-behind win in school history, and it gave Mizzou only its second bowl win in the last 24 years.

In the last five seasons, Pinkel has led the Tigers to a mark of 35-22 overall.

Pinkel now has led Mizzou to three bowl games, and that puts him in select company, as he joins Don Faurot, Dan Devine, Al Onforio, and Warren Powers as the only coaches to guide MU to three bowl games. After beating Nebraska (41-6 on Oct. 6th) for the 3rd time in 5 years, Pinkel



became the first MU coach since Al Onofrio to defeat the Huskers three times.

His seven-year Mizzou record stands at 44-36, and in 17 years, his record is 117-73-3 overall. The win over Nebraska in 2005 was the 100th of his head coaching career. His 44 wins at Mizzou is now 4th-most on the school's career coaching victories list.

After taking over a program that had fallen on hard times in 2001, Pinkel had increased success in each of his first three seasons, improving from four wins in 2001 to five wins in 2002, to the 2003 squad which went 8-5 and made the school's third bowl appearance since 1983.

ST. LOUIS (AP) - Chase Daniel threw three touchdown passes, Pig Brown intercepted a pass at the 1 with 51 seconds to play, and Missouri held off Illinois 40-34 in both teams' season opener at the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis, Mo.

The Tigers (1-0) scored on a 100-yard fumble return and a 66-yard punt return and were up 37-13 late in the third quarter.

Illinois redshirt freshman quarterback Eddie McGee - in the game after starter Juice Williams left after a blow to the head in the second quarter - scored from 16 yards with 4:08 to play in the third quarter to cut the margin to 17.

After Missouri's Danario Alexander fumbled on a double-reverse, McGee hit Kyle Hudson on a 41-yard scoring pass on the next play. The Illini got within three early in the fourth quarter after Daniel fumbled deep in his own territory. Rashard Mendenhall scored from the 4 two plays later to make it 37-34.

Missouri went ahead 40-34 on Jeff Wolfert's 32-yard field goal with 8:32 to play, then held on.

The Illini had one final shot, taking over at their 30 with 2:51 to play and driving to the Missouri 22. But Brown leaped high to intercept Brown's pass, and Missouri ran out the clock to claim its third straight win over Illinois in St. Louis, matching previous wins in 2002 and 2003.

McGee was 17-for-31 for 257 yards and a touchdown, but lost two fumbles and was intercepted twice. One of the fumbles came when McGee was inches from scoring on a quarterback draw in the second quarter. Missouri safety Pig Brown scooped up the ball and ran 100 yards the other way — tying an NCAA record in the process for longest fumble return.

Daniel was 37-for-54 for a career-high 359 yards and threw touchdown passes of 1 yard to Chase Coffman in the first quarter, 2 yards to Will Franklin in the second quarter and 25 yards to Jeremy Maclin in the third quarter.

Maclin also scored on a 66-yard punt return that put Missouri up 37-13 with 6:11 to play in the third quarter, before the Illini began the comeback.

Martin Rucker caught 10 passes for 86 yards for Missouri, and Alexander had nine catches for 82 yards, before dislocating his left wrist while being tackled on a key 33-yard reception in the fourth quarter that extended a crucial drive for the Tigers. Team officials said after the game they hoped to have Alexander back in time for the Nebraska game in Columbia on Oct. 5th.

Illinois rushed for 174 yards, led by Daniel Dufrene's 58 yards on six carries. Mendenhall had 42 yards and scored on runs of 25 and 4 yards.

Williams was scrambling near the sideline early in the second quarter when he appeared to take a helmet-to-helmet hit from Missouri cornerback Hardy Ricks. Ricks was playing despite suffering a dislocated shoulder just weeks prior in pre-season camp.

The Illini said Williams was held out for the remainder of the game as a precaution. He was 6-for-9 for 59 yards and rushed six times for 15 yards.

Both teams made the most of the opportunities presented them, as Illinois scored 20 of its points off Tiger miscues, including six on a blocked punt returned for a touchdown, and 14 more after recovering MU fumbles on the Tiger 5-yardline and 41-yardline.

Mizzou countered by scoring 16 points off of three Illini fumbles, with another seven coming on Maclin's punt return score — only the third non-blocked punt return for a touchdown at Missouri since 1990.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Chase Daniel accounted for a career-high 396 total yards and threw five touchdowns passes as Missouri sprinted to a 28-point lead over Mississippi then held on for a 38-25 win.

It was the eighth time in the last nine games that Daniel had at least 309 total yards. He faced little pressure as he masterfully ran the spread offense and picked apart the Ole Miss (1-1) defense in the first 35 minutes.

Rebels running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis had a career game with 226 yards rushing.

The Tigers (2-0) built a halftime lead of 28-7 with four touchdowns and 245 yards passing. Daniel then seemed to put the Rebels away with a 38-yard touchdown pass to Greg Bracey just 1:12 into the third quarter that gave the Tigers a 35-7 lead.

Daniel's five touchdown passes came on five consecutive series spanning the second and third quarters.

But Ole Miss quarterback Seth Adams led the Rebels' push, completing 23 of 41 passes for 305 yards and three touchdowns in his second start. His scoring passes of 68 yards to Mike Wallace and 3 yards to Greg Hardy in the third quarter cut Missouri's lead to 38-19.

Green-Ellis cut it to 38-25 with a 2-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter. But failed conversions cost Ole Miss 5 points, and the Rebels couldn't overcome their first-half mistakes, including Green-Ellis' fumble at the Missouri 7.

Daniel has thrown for 689 yards in two games, leading an offense that is averaging 39 points and 494 yards.

Not only was Daniel efficient, he was quick. All of Missouri's scoring drives lasted less than 3:05, with three coming in under 2 minutes.

The Ole Miss defense rarely pressured Daniel, giving him plenty of time to find an open receiver. The Rebels were often in position to stop big Tigers plays, but missed several key tackles that allowed first downs or scores.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Jeremy Maclin racked up 275 total yards and scored two touchdowns and Tony Temple add two TDs to lead Missouri to a 52-24 win over Western Michigan in Mizzou's 2007 home opener.

Chase Daniel threw for two touchdowns and ran for a third, completing 27 of 46 passes for 328 yards for Missouri.

As it did in season-opening victories against Illinois and Mississippi, Missouri (3-0) built a big first-half lead - going up 31-3 on the Broncos (0-3) - before withstanding a second-half comeback that briefly cut the lead to 14.

But the Tigers' defense stopped Western Michigan when it counted, including a fourth-and-goal from the 6 midway through the fourth quarter.

Missouri wasted little time at the outset, with Maclin catching a 24-yard touchdown pass from Daniel to cap a 6-play, 72-yard opening drive.

The Tigers extended the lead to 14-0 on a 1-yard touchdown run by Temple - Missouri's first rushing score of the season. Linebacker Brock Christopher's interception set up the 46-yard scoring drive, which also featured a 39-yard scramble by Daniel before he was knocked out of bounds at the 1.

The run was a career long for Daniel, who added a 35-yard run for a score in the fourth quarter.

Daniel entered the game with a chance to set the Division I record for consecutive passes without an interception, having thrown 235 in a row without a pick, a streak dating back to a Nov. 4, 2006 game against Nebraska.

He extended the mark with his first 20 passes Saturday before Western Michigan's Anthony Gebhart picked off Daniel with 3:31 remaining in the second quarter. That play preserved the national mark of 271 set by Trent Dilfer at Fresno State.

Maclin added his second touchdown early in the second quarter with a 17-

yard run on a direct snap to the receiver, who was lined up in the shotgun.

Maclin caught seven passes for 96 yards, rushed six times for 52 yards, returned five kickoffs for 96 yards and returned two punts for 31 yards. His 275 all-purpose yards ranked as the 5th-most in MU single-game history.

Maclin nearly had another long score on a third-quarter kickoff, but ran into the back of a blocker and had to settle for a 29-yard return. And his 23-yard punt return in the third quarter deep into Western Michigan territory set up Temple's second rushing touchdown to make it 38-10.

Tommy Saunders caught a 25-yard TD pass from Daniel just before half-time, and backup quarterback Chase Patton completed the Tigers' scoring with an 18-yard run with 1:33 remaining.

Mark Bonds had a 9-yard touchdown run and Branden Ledbetter added a 27-yard scoring reception for Western Michigan, both in the fourth quarter. Ledbetter's score allowed the Broncos to cut the lead to 38-24 before Daniel ran for a 35-yard touchdown.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - For No. 25 Missouri, every possession is a 2-minute offense.

The Tigers used their no-huddle spread offense to take care of business by beating Illinois State 38-17 going into an off week before the Tigers' Big 12 opener against Nebraska.

[Chase Daniel](#) threw three touchdown passes for Missouri (4-0), which had 581 total yards and 38 first downs.

The Tigers scored on drives lasting 17 seconds, 3:11, 2:40, 3:33 and 2:04, and on Maclin's punt return. On 24 scoring drives this season, the Tigers' average time of possession is 2:08.

"I want to score - I'm not worried about grinding it out," said coach [Gary Pinkel](#), who became the first-ever Missouri coach to start 4-0 in three different seasons. "Our offense is not milk the clock."

[Tony Temple](#) scored on a first-quarter pass and a third-quarter 1-yard run, and [Jeremy Maclin](#) caught a touchdown pass and scored on a 64-yard fourth-quarter punt return.

Daniel was 21-for-34 for 294 yards and threw two interceptions. He completed passes to 11 different receivers. He has thrown 13 touchdown passes this season after setting a school record with 28 in 2006 in his first year as a starter.

Temple rushed 18 times for 101 yards, his sixth career 100-yard game.

Luke Drone was 22-for-37 for 242 yards, one touchdown and one interception for Illinois State (2-2) of the Football Championship Subdivision - the former Division I-AA. Geno Blow gained 116 yards on 21 carries. Eyad Salem caught seven passes for 106 yards and a fourth-quarter 13-yard touchdown.

Daniel's receivers did most of the work on the scoring passes.

On the first play from scrimmage, Will Franklin caught a pass on a wide

receiver screen at the Missouri 43 and ran the distance.

"We had no idea they were going to come and blitz like that and we had our screen called," Daniel said. "It was scripted, so it worked out perfectly."

Later in the quarter, Daniel threw a short pass to Temple, who ran in for an 11-yard score.

Missouri drove 97 yards after Illinois State failed to convert on fourth-and-goal from the 3 early in the second quarter. The 8-yard touchdown to end the drive came as Daniel appeared to run, then flipped forward to Maclin, who ran it in.

Illinois State coach Denver Johnson defended the decision to pass on the field goal that would have cut Missouri's lead to 14-6.

"When you get down there, you've got to get points," Johnson said. "Field goals weren't going to do us any good. If we wanted any chance at all to win the game, we were going to have to score touchdowns."

Illinois State's Parrish Fisher scored on a 4-yard run in the second quarter.

[Jeff Wolfert](#) had a 26-yard field goal for Missouri and Tyler Funk had a 21-yarder for Illinois State.

In many ways, the win was typical of Missouri's other games this season.

Missouri came into the game tied for seventh nationally averaging 532 yards per game. Missouri is averaging 42 points per game.

But the Tigers were ranked 97th in total defense, allowing 447 yards per game. Illinois State had 397 yards.

Maclin, a redshirt freshman, became the first Missouri player in 32 years to return two punts for touchdowns in a season. He also had a 66-yard score in the opener against Illinois.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — Chase Daniel turned 21 a few minutes after No. 17 Missouri polished off a late-night victory over No. 25 Nebraska. His performance was one long birthday celebration.

Daniel passed for a career-best 401 yards and ran for two scores and the Tigers got a big game from their suspect defense in a 41-6 victory over No 25 Nebraska.

"We played our 'A' game in a lot of facets," Daniel said. "If our defense plays like that week-in and week-out and we keep scoring, the sky's the limit."

Nebraska, which entered the game averaging 36 points, was held without a touchdown for the first time since a 31-3 loss to Oklahoma on Nov. 13, 2004. Missouri's four nonconference opponents averaged 25 points, leading to anticipation of a high-scoring affair that never materialized.

"I was so proud," coach Gary Pinkel said. "It was as complete a game as we've played in a long time."

The Cornhuskers were outgained 606-297. Quarterback Sam Keller, who was 25-for-43 with 223 yards and one interception, felt responsible.

"Extremely disappointing," Keller said. "It's a horrible, horrible feeling, and I put all the blame on myself."

Daniel was 33-for-47 and also was Missouri's rushing leader with 72 yards on 11 carries. Chase Coffman and Danario Alexander each caught a touchdown pass to help the Tigers (5-0, 1-0 Big 12) beat Nebraska decisively at home for the third straight time and go to 5-0 for a second straight season.

Pinkel is 2-15 against ranked opponents in seven seasons, both victories coming at home over Nebraska. The Cornhuskers were ranked

10th when Missouri ended a 24-game losing streak in the series with a 41-24 victory in 2003, and Missouri won by the same score in 2005.

A game viewed as a key early Big 12 North matchup attracted a crowd of 70,049, Missouri's first sellout since the Nebraska game in 2003 with most fans clad in yellow for a so-called "Gold Rush" game. The Tigers had a ball and even scored a touchdown off a fake field goal early in the fourth quarter.

"I wish it was like that every game," Daniel said. "It was an unbelievable atmosphere, unlike anything I've ever been in."

The crowd was the largest at Mizzou since 1984, when 70,915 packed Faurot Field on Sept. 26 that year to see Notre Dame take on the Tigers.

Missouri put away Nebraska (4-2, 1-1) without leading rusher Tony Temple, who sprained his right ankle in the first half. Temple had one catch for 20 yards and three carries for minus-2 yards.

Marlon Lucky had 123 yards rushing and receiving for Nebraska, held to a pair of first-half field goals by Alex Henery. Nebraska had won eight in a row against Big 12 North opponents.

"It's not our standard of football," coach Bill Callahan said. "We just couldn't get off the field on third down and we didn't convert on third down."

Missouri led 14-0 in the first quarter and 20-6 at the half, a big change from last year's 34-20 loss at Lincoln, Neb., in which the Tigers trailed 27-3 in the second quarter. Nebraska capitalized on a pair of early interceptions off Daniel in that game.

Daniel set the tone from the start on Saturday, going 12-for-14 for 127 yards while leading Missouri to touchdowns on its first two drives. One of the incompletions came on a dropped ball.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) — Mizzou went toe-to-toe on the road with the 6th-ranked team in the nation, holding a 24-23 lead early in the 4th quarter, before the homestanding Sooners took advantage of key Tiger mistakes to hold on for a hardfought 41-31 over the 11th-ranked visitors.

The Tigers showed great resiliency all night long in the hostile environment of 85,041 in attendance, and clawed back from a 23-10 deficit in the 3rd quarter, to take a 24-23 lead into the last period.

The lead was regained with help from both sides of the ball, as the offense first scored on a 10-yard end-around by WR Jeremy Maclin (his 2nd rushing TD of the night) with 4:41 left in the 3rd, followed by TB Jimmy Jackson's 4-yard plunge with 1:30 remaining. The latter possession was set up when the Sooners' Juaquin Iglesias fumbled a kick-off return, giving the ball back to the Tigers.

Leading 24-23 in the 4th, Mizzou had a golden opportunity slip out of its hands, literally, when SS Pig Brown couldn't hold onto a potential interception in MU's endzone on an errant ball thrown by OU quarterback Sam Bradford. The drop proved costly, as Bradford regrouped and led the Sooners the remaining 33 yards needed to regain the lead, at 29-24 with 12:26 left.

Mizzou signal caller Chase Daniel, who would end the night 37-of-47 passing for 361 yards with 1 TD and 2 INTs, was ready to lead another drive downfield, but on the ensuing possession, a fumbled exchange with Maclin spelled doom, as OU's Curtis Lofton alertly scooped the ball up at the Tiger 12-yardline and rambled into the endzone for a quick score that pushed the Sooner lead to 35-24 with 11:40 left.

That bit of disaster put the Tigers in a big hole, and forced to abandon the run altogether, Oklahoma sat back in pass defense, and forced the Tigers to punt on their next possession after gaining one first down.

After the Tiger defense forced a punt, Daniel was intercepted on a tipped pass near the sideline, and OU converted by driving only 24 yards for a game-icing TD, on TB Chris Brown's 3rd TD of the game.

Mizzou wouldn't die easily, though, as Daniel led an 80-yard TD drive that culminated in a 5-yard TD pass to TE Martin Rucker to account for the final score.

A year after Oklahoma scored all 26 points in a 26-10 win over Mizzou in Columbia off of Tiger turnovers and drive-extending penalties, the Sooners once again capitalized on MU miscues to win for a second straight year. In all, Mizzou committed four turnovers on the night in Norman – three interceptions and one fumble – that Oklahoma converted into 21 key points.

The Tigers, looking for the schools' first win in Norman since 1966, did their part in forcing a pair of Sooner fumbles that MU converted into 14 points, but the 4th-quarter mistakes proved to be too costly to overcome.

Mizzou outgained Oklahoma on the night by a total offense margin of 418-to-384. The Tigers gained nearly 135 more yards than Oklahoma was allowing coming into the game, and its defense held the Sooners nearly 100 yards below their season average coming in – OU came into the game ranked 11th in both total defense (283.33 ypg) and total offense (482.17 ypg).

Maclin was an offensive star on the night in defeat, as he gained 189 all-purpose yards, including 104 on kickoff returns (one of which he returned 56 yards, representing the longest KOR for MU since 2002). He also ran 4 times for 32 yards and 2 TDs, while catching 5 passes for 53 yards.

TE Chase Coffman led all receivers on the night with 10 catches for 102 yards – both career high totals.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — [Chase Daniel](#) led the Missouri offense in the Tigers' most well-rounded effort of the season.

Missouri's improving defense intercepted Graham Harrell four times, returning one for a score, while throttling the nation's top offense in a 41-10 victory over No. 22 Texas Tech on Saturday.

Texas Tech forced Missouri, minus injured [Tony Temple](#) to run the ball, and the Tigers did so with great success. They gained 212 yards on the ground and Daniel had 210 yards passing on only 19 attempts, both season lows.

Backup tailback [Jimmy Jackson](#) had 59 yards and three touchdowns on 12 carries. Freshman [Derrick Washington](#) added 66 yards on nine carries for Missouri (6-1, 2-1 Big 12), which rebounded from a 10-point loss at Oklahoma last week and is 2-1 during a three-game stretch against ranked opponents.

"A game like that against such a good team, and the damage they can do in seconds, I'm very proud of our team," coach [Gary Pinkel](#) said.

Temple missed his second straight game with an ankle injury, adding a bruise to a sprain in practice on Wednesday. Missouri still won for the 13th time in 14 home games.

The scoring total was by far a season low for Texas Tech (6-2, 2-2), which entered the game first in points (50) and yards (582) per game. Missouri scored on its first four possessions of the second half to top its 40-point average, though the game didn't come close to fulfilling expectations of a points-fest featuring two of the most prolific passers in the country.

Texas Tech entered the rankings last week after a 35-7 victory over Texas A&M. The high point for the Red Raiders Saturday was a 68-yard touchdown pass from Harrell to Edward Britton in the second

quarter that cut Missouri's lead to 10-7. Harrell, who entered the game with 31 TD passes and only three interceptions, was 44-for-69 for 397 yards and wasn't helped by several drops.

The attempts were a season high and the yardage was second-lowest of the year and fewest against a major college opponent.

Texas Tech had 388 yards total offense, 101 yards fewer than the previous low against Iowa State.

Texas Tech was stopped in its first four attempts on fourth down against Missouri, which surrendered 41 points against Oklahoma. The Red Raiders finished 3-for-6 on fourth down.

Texas Tech's Michael Crabtree, who leads the nation in receiving and scoring with 17 touchdowns, had 10 catches for 76 yards to set an NCAA freshman record of 1,320 yards with four games plus a bowl appearance to go. He entered the game needing 22 yards to surpass the mark set by USC's Mike Williams in 2002, but was held out of the end zone for the second straight week.

Missouri kept it on the ground for the most part against a defense designed to stop the passing game. Daniel completed 14 passes, including a 57-yard touchdown to [Jeremy Maclin](#) in the fourth quarter.

Texas Tech was shut out in the first quarter for the second straight game, trailing 10-0, although the Red Raiders' defense kept it close. The lone touchdown came on a 38-yard interception return by [Stryker Sulak](#) on a ball tipped high in the air, and Missouri had to settle for a 21-yard field goal later in the quarter after a drive that fizzled at the 1.

Texas Tech ended its drought on a TD connection from Harrell to Britton with 6:39 left in the second quarter, but Missouri answered with its first offensive touchdown only 1:39 later on Jackson's 1-yard run for a 17-7 lead.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Coming off a pair of routs over ranked opponents at home, Missouri had a harder time of putting away one-win Iowa State.

Given the current climate in college football, however, the Tigers' postgame locker room seemed just as noisy as ever.

Lorenzo Williams recovered a fumble in the end zone at the start of the second half, giving No. 13 Missouri breathing room and momentum in a 42-28 victory over the Cyclones. The Tigers, who entered the game seventh in the nation in total offense at 518 yards per game, won despite being held to a season-low 366 yards. Mizzou averaged more than a full yard per play more than ISU, (5.6-to-4.5), but the Cyclones held a massive edge in time of possession (38:22-to-21:38), keeping the ball away from the potent Tiger offensive attack.

Jimmy Jackson, Tony Temple, Martin Rucker and Jeremy Maclin each scored for Missouri (7-1, 3-1 Big 12). The Tigers had been punishing teams at Faurot Field, beating then-No. 22 Texas Tech 41-10 last week and then-No. 25 Nebraska 41-6 three weeks ago.

"You want to win all these games 40-6 and go eat hot dogs in the fourth quarter, but that's not football," coach Gary Pinkel said. "There's going to be battles out there and we were in a battle in the fourth quarter to keep this game and that's OK, as long as we won."

Missouri lost safety Cornelius "Pig" Brown for the season with a ruptured Achilles tendon in the fourth quarter. Brown, twice named Big 12 defensive player of the week, has been a big factor in the Tigers' improving defense.

Backup Alexander Robinson had 149 yards on 21 carries with a 37-yard scoring run for Iowa State, his first career 100-yard game, and Devin McDowell had a 25-yard interception return. The Cyclones had

389 yards total offense and played their second straight Top 25 opponent tough after holding down No. 4 Oklahoma in a 17-7 loss last week.

Daniel was 28-of-37 for 250 yards with one touchdown and the interception on a high throw that Martin Rucker tipped.

Missouri's play at the end of the half and right after the break was instrumental in winning for the 14th time in the last 15 home games. Iowa State's Bret Meyer scored on a 1-yard run with 24 seconds left in the half to cut the deficit to 17-14, and Missouri got downfield fast enough for Jeff Wolfert's 48-yard field goal on the final play.

Stryker Sulak stripped Meyer on a sack inside the 5 on the third play of the second half. Williams fell on the ball in the end zone and Missouri added a 2-point conversion for a 28-14 cushion.

Williams beat Sulak in a footrace to the ball.

Iowa State scored on its next drive on a 1-yard pass from Meyer to Marquis Hamilton before Missouri put the game away on Rucker's 10-yard reception and Maclin's 17-yard run on a reverse, the latter coming early in the fourth quarter to make it 42-21.

Meyer became the second quarterback in Big 12 history to pass for 9,000 yards, also setting a school record with 33 completions in 48 attempts. Todd Blythe caught six passes for 54 yards to become the school's career reception leader with 168, four more than Lane Danielson from 2000-03.

Daniel was 11-of-11 for 103 yards on Missouri's first two drives, which ended on touchdown runs by Jackson and Temple, for a 14-0 lead with 6:52 to go in the first quarter. Missouri didn't face a third down until its 18th play, and Daniel also tied a school record with 15 straight completions set by Kent Kiefer in 1990 before throwing the ball away on the next-to-last play of the first quarter.
