No. 25 Colorado Takes On No. 11 Texas and Baylor

UP NEXT: No. 25 Colorado (13-7, 9-6 Big 12) hosts No. 11 Texas (18-3, 12-2) on Nov. 9 at 7 p.m. It is Youth Night at the Coors Events Center and anyone 13 and under gets in for \$1. The Buffs will then head to Waco, Texas, for a contest against Baylor on Nov. 12 at 6 p.m. MT.

WHAT'S ON TV?: The Nov. 9 match against No. 11 Texas will be televised by FSN Rocky Mountain. The match is set to start at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. Tickets can be purchased at the door or in advance by calling the CU Ticket Office at 1-303-49BUFFS (2-8337) .

BUFFS STAMPEDE INTO NATIONAL POLL: Colorado is making its debut at No. 25 on the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Poll. The poll was released on Monday with the Buffs collecting 91 points, besting Tennessee by 10 points for the final position.

Colorado has been receiving votes in the poll for the last three weeks prior to being ranked. This is the first national ranking for CU since the Buffs were ranked 25th from Sept. 20 through Oct. 3 in 2004. It also marks the 104th time the Buffs have been ranked in the poll. CU was ranked eighth on Sept. 14, 1993 to earn its best ranking and has been ranked in the top-10 on seven occasions.

The Big 12 Conference has five teams that are either listed in the top 25 or are receiving votes.

ON THE SEASON: Colorado is 13-7 overall and is 9-6 in the Big 12. CU is currently fourth in the Big 12 and is ranked for the first time this season.

The Buffs have won their last seven contests and are 8-2 in their last 10 matches. The last time CU won seven in a row was in 1998 when the Buffs won 10 straight.

CU has defeated three ranked teams in its last seven matches; with two of those wins coming on the road. CU took two consecutive matches against ranked opponents for the first time since 1996 when the Buffs stunned Kansas State and Texas A&M on Oct. 12 and 16.

The first of the two consecutive wins against ranked teams came against No. 20 Kansas State. It was the first win over a ranked opponent this season for Colorado as the Buffs beat the Wildcats 30-14, 30-25, 25-30, 28-30, 15-5. CU followed it up with a win at 24th-ranked Texas A&M. The Buffs rallied back from a 0-2 deficit and won 20-30, 25-30, 30-26, 30-28, 15-10.

Colorado's most recent victory against a ranked team came on Oct. 29 as the Buffs shocked eighth-ranked Missouri 20-30, 30-28, 23-30, 30-27, 15-12 in Columbia, Mo. CU played in front of 2,571, the fourth largest crowd in MU history.

Four of Colorado's losses have come to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents. CU's first loss of the season came at the hands of third-rated and defending national champion Stanford. The Buffs fell in four to 18th-ranked Texas in Austin on Sept. 14. Colorado came back home to face its second and third consecutive ranked opponents in top-ranked Nebraska and eighth-ranked Missouri. CU fell in three to both opponents.

Senior right side hitter **Allie Griffin** is averaging 4.96 kills per game while hitting .305 on the year. She ranks second in the Big 12 in kills and is 12th in hitting

percentage. She is ranked 17th in the NCAA in kills. Griffin has hit more than 20 kills in nine matches this season; including a career-high 29 against Kansas State on Oct. 12. She notched her 1,000th-career kill with her first kill in the fifth game against Kansas on Oct. 1. Sophomore **Amber Sutherland** is averaging 3.60 per game. She owns a .222 attack percentage. Sutherland ranks 10th in the league in kills. Colorado's 15.85 kills per game is fourth in the Big 12.

Freshman middle blocker **Lauren Schaefer** leads the Buffs with 69 total blocks (nine solo and 60 assists) on the season. She is averaging 0.92 blocks per game. Junior middle blocker **Lara Bossow** has two block solos and 60 assists on the season. The Buffs are averaging 2.27 blocks per game and are 11th in the Big 12.

Junior setter **Ashley Nu'u** has passed out 1,048 assists this season to average 13.27 per game, which ranks 15th in the NCAA. She currently ranks third in the Big 12 and leads Colorado to a .257 attack percentage that ranks fourth in the league.

The Buffaloes' defense is led by senior **Nicole Carr**. Carr has picked up 217 digs (2.75 per game) this season and has played five games as the team's libero. Carr notched her 1,000th-career dig on Oct. 1 versus Kansas. Sutherland ranks 15th in the Big 12 with 216 digs (2.77 per game). Sophomore libero **Therese Vinal** has collected 167. The Buffs are seventh in the Big 12 with 13.70 digs per game.

LAST TIME OUT: Colorado defeated Texas Tech 30-25, 30-23, 30-19 at the Coors Events Center on Nov. 5.

Colorado got on the board right away in the first game and took off with a 4-1 lead. The Buffs held on to the lead, but the Red Raiders closed in on CU at 13-12. **Amber Sutherland** hammered one down to put the Buffs up again by two and **Ashley Nu'u** tacked another on point. The Red Raiders closed in again on the Buffs, and tied the score at 17. CU took a timeout and took the next four points to regain the lead and forced TTU to use its own timeout. This time the Red Raiders came back with three of their own before **Allie Griffin** recorded a kill for CU. TTU came back again to tie the score at 23, but once again a kill from Sutherland put the Buffs ahead. **Lara Bossow** added another point for Colorado and the Red Raiders took their final timeout. CU went on to take the game 30-25, while hitting .444.

The second set started with each side exchanging points until the Buffs went up 12-10. The Red Raiders quickly tied it back up at 13 and the two teams continued to go back and forth. The Buffs took their

largest lead of the game at 20-17 and extended it to 23-19. Colorado controlled the rest of the game and went on to a 30-23 win in the second frame. The Buffs hit .368 in the frame and held TTU to a .184 attack percentage.

The Buffs got out to a 6-2 advantage in the third frame, but TTU came back with the next four points to even the score. Griffin came back with a kill to give the Buffs back the lead. CU went on a 6-0 run and led 12-6. Colorado continued the attack, forcing Texas Tech to take a timeout at 16-8. The Buffs wouldn't let up and finished the match 30-19. CU finished off the match hitting .312.

Lauren Schaefer was perfect with seven kills and hit .700 for a match-best. Sutherland collected 14 kills and hit .320 to lead the Buffs. Griffin tallied 13 kills and added four assists, five digs, an ace and one block. **Nicole Carr** came up with 10 kills, five digs and hit .391. Nu'u handed out 45 assists and added four kills and three blocks.

Colorado hit .377, the second-highest percentage of the season. The Buffs held the Red Raiders to a .107 attack percentage. CU amassed 55 kills on 106 attempts and committed just 15 errors while TTU collected just 36 kills on 103 attacks with 25 errors.

ABOUT THE LONGHORNS: Texas is currently ranked 11th in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. The Longhorns are 18-3 overall and are 12-2 in the Big 12. Their only two conference losses are to top-ranked Nebraska and Iowa State. Texas also lost to now-eighth-ranked Notre Dame in its second match of the season.

Texas has won its last six contests. The Longhorns are lead by Dariam Acevedo. She averages 3.69 kills, 2.27 digs, 0.57 blocks and hits .247. Leticia Armstrong records 3.32 kills and 1.41 blocks per game and hits .402. As a team, the Longhorns hit .280, which ranks third in the Big 12. UT's defense has held its opponents to a .173 attack percentage, which also ranks third.

ABOUT THE BEARS: Baylor is 14-12 overall and is 5-9 in the Big 12. The Bears are seventh in the conference.

Nicole LeBlanc is averaging 3.65 kills per game to lead Baylor. Desiree Guilliard-Young has 1.70 blocks, 2.47 kills and hits .228. She has only played in 47 of Baylor's 97 games due to an injury at the beginning of the year. The Bear's defense has picked up 14. 69 digs per game and holds its opponents to a .199 hitting percentage which ranks fourth in the Big 12. Baylor is attacking at a .226 mark with 15.10 kills per game.

SERIES RECORDS: The Buffs are 8-15 against the Longhorns. CU is 5-5 versus Texas in the last 10 matches. The last win against UT came on Nov. 19, 2003, in Austin.

The last time the Buffs defeated the Longhorns at home on Oct. 4, 2003. Both contests were won in three games.

Colorado is 18-2 against Baylor and has won the last 10 straight meetings. The Bears defeated CU in four games on Oct. 27, 1999, in Waco, Texas, for its first of two victories against the Buffs.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST TIME: Colorado fell 16-30, 30-27, 22-30, 19-30 to Texas on Sept. 14 in Austin. Allie Griffin recorded 17 kills, nine digs and two blocks, while Amber Sutherland notched 15 kills and eight digs. Leticia Armstrong led the Longhorns with 24 kills and hit .529. UT outthit the Buffs .368 - .211.

CU defeated Baylor 30-15, 24-30, 30-26, 30-32, 15-8 on Oct. 5 at the Coors Events Center for its second win in the Big 12 this season. Griffin hammered 22 kills and recorded 12 digs and six block assists, while Sutherland added 20 kills and 17 digs. Ashley Nu'u dished out a career-high 70 assists and led CU to a .273 attack percentage. Nicole LeBlanc recorded 17 kills, seven digs and four blocks for Baylor.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Pi'i Aiu (pronounced P-E I-U) is in his ninth season

as Colorado's head coach sporting a career record of 150-98. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to seven NCAA Tournaments in eight seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported three All-Americans, nine All-Region, and 20 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu, who has led the Buffs to a 107-68 record in Big 12 matches, is joined on the bench this season by sixth-year assistant Jil Thomason and second-year assistant, and USA Olympian, Erik Sullivan.

Aiu owns a 7-10 record versus Texas and is 15-2 against Baylor.

BUFFS AT HOME: Colorado will call the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 18th straight season. The Buffs are 185-61 all-time at the CECC for a winning percentage of .752.

SECOND TIME IS A CHARM: The Buffs are getting redemption from some of its earlier losses this season. CU lost to Texas, Nebraska, Missouri, Iowa State, Kansas and Texas Tech in the first half of the Big 12 schedule. The second time around, the Buffs defeated Iowa State, Missouri, Kansas and Texas Tech. Next on the list is Texas on Nov. 9. CU faces Nebraska on Nov. 23.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: The Buffs have just five matches left in the Big 12 Conference schedule, but have the toughest schedule of the 11 teams. The Buffs still face Texas (11), Baylor, Kansas State (RV), Texas A&M, and Nebraska (1). Iowa State has the easies schedule with Texas (11), Oklahoma, Texas Tech, Texas A&M and Kansas. WHAT A SCHEDULE!: Colorado faces some of the toughest competition in the country in the 2005 season. Three of its Big 12 opponents are currently ranked in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. Nebraska is the number one team in the

land, followed by Texas (11) and Missouri (12). CU will face fifth-ranked Florida in a non-conference match-up on Nov. 25. The Buffs fell to then-third-ranked Stanford on Sept. 8 at the Colorado Invitational. Kansas State, Kansas and Texas A&M have also been ranked this season.

ONE HUGE WEEK: Colorado recorded two consecutive wins against CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents for the first time since 1996. CU upset then-20th-ranked Kansas State at home in five games. Then the Buffs took to the road and upset then-24th-ranked Texas A&M in front of 1,605. CU rallied from a 0-2 deficit to defeat the Aggies.

GIVE ME FIVE: Five seems to be the Colorado Buffaloes favorite number this season. Colorado has played eight five-game matches out of 18 matches this season. The Buffs also played five consecutive five-game contests between Oct. 1-16. Both are school records. CU is 6-2 in those matches. Colorado has rallied back from 0-2 deficits against Marquette and Texas A&M.

ONE GRAND FOR ME, ONE GRAND FOR YOU: Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin recorded career milestones on Oct. 1, as the Buffs battled against Kansas. Carr picked up her 1,000th-career dig with her 14th dig in the match. Griffin hammered her 1,000th-career kill with her 25th kill of the match. Both became the 12th player in CU history to record each milestone.

CHASING HISTORY: Several current Buffs are in the CU record books, but they are looking to move up this season. Seniors Allie Griffin and Nicole Carr are moving up in the career kills list. Griffin owns 1,184 kills for ninth on the list and Carr is tied for 13th with 924. Carr is also ninth on the digs list with 1,093. Ashley Nu'u is fifth on the all-time career assists chart with 2,563.

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INDURANCE TEST: The CU volleyball team is showing off its off-season conditioning as the Buffs get deeper into the season. The Buffs played a school-record five straight five-game matches against Kansas, Baylor, Texas Tech, Kansas State and Texas A&M. CU has won three of the matches, including two consecutive contests against KSU and TAMU. Both were ranked in the top-25 at the time of CU's victories.

BUFF BITS: Four of CU's losses have been to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll ranked teams...Colorado won the American University Classic and took second at Colorado Invitational...Nicole Carr was named the American University Classic Most Valuable Player. Amber Sutherland and Allie Griffin were also named to the all-tournament team...Sutherland and Griffin were also named the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament Team...The Buffs snapped a three-match losing streak on Sept. 24 against Oklahoma in five games. The win was the first in the Big 12 for the Buffs this season...Alex Buth served five aces against Oklahoma, which is the most any Buff has served in a single match since the 2000 season. Lara Bossow tallied five in a five-game win over Missouri...The loss to Iowa State snapped an 18-match win-streak against the Cyclones for the Buffs...Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin each notched career milestones on Oct. 1 against Kansas. Carr recorded her 1,000th-career dig, while Griffin

hammered her 1,000th-career kill...Ashley Nu'u tallied a career-high 68 assists in the same match and followed it up with a new record of 70 against Baylor...When Griffin records 20 or more kills, the Buffs are 7-2... Head coach Pi'i Aiu recorded his 100th Big 12 victory on Oct. 5 against Baylor...Nicole Carr needs 86 kills to become the ninth Buff to record 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs...CU has played eight five-game matches this season and five consecutive five-game matches. Both are school records...Colorado has rallied back from 0-2 deficits to win matches twice this season...Allie Griffin was named the CVU.com National Player of the Week on Oct. 18...Colorado beat back-to-back ranked teams, Kansas State and Texas A&M, for the first time since the 1996 season...The three-game win against Oklahoma on Oct. 22 was the first three-game win for CU since Aug. 27...Ashley Nu'u was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Oct. 31...The Buffs' win against eighth-ranked Missouri was its first against at top-10 team since 1997 when CU defeated No. 5 Nebraska...Colorado has won seven straight matches for the first time since 1998 when the Buffs won 10 straight...Lauren Schaefer hit .700 for a career-high with seven kills on 10 errorless attempts.

20TH ANNIVERSARY: The 2005 season marks the 20th campaign for the Colorado volleyball program. Since debuting as a varsity program in the fall of 1986, the Buffs have an overall record of 372-228 (.620) including one conference title (Big Eight in 1993). CU has advanced to 14 NCAA Tournaments in 16 years, 13 of which have come since 1991. The Buffs are one of only 14 NCAA Division I programs with at least 13 NCAA appearances since 1991.

GRIFFIN AND NU'U NAMED TO THE PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM: University of Colorado senior Allie Griffin and junior Ashley Nu'u were selected to the 2005 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference volleyball team by a vote of league coaches the conference office announced on Wednesday.

Griffin, a 6-0 right side hitter from Baton Rouge, La., earned honorable mention to the 2004 AVCA All-America team while collecting AVCA All-Central Region and All-Big 12 first team honors. She led Colorado in kills as a junior with 420, the 12th best single-season mark in team history, and showed her versatility by ranking second on the team in digs and third in blocks during the regular season. Griffin was fifth in the Big 12 in kills per game (4.27 kpg) in 2004 and is the Buffaloes active career leader in kills (797) and blocks (189).

Nu'u, a 5-10 setter from Aurora, Colo., was given honorable mention to the 2004 All-Big 12 team in her first season as a full-time starter. She ranked fifth in the Big 12 in overall assists (12.19 apg) and was sixth in league-only contests (11.79 apg). Her sophomore season total of 1,146 assists is 12th on CU's single-season list and she is currently fifth on the Buffs' career chart with 1,515. For Nu'u, this is her second Big 12 preseason honor as she was voted the league's Preseason Freshman of the Year in 2003, only to miss a good portion of the season with a back ailment.

CU PICKED SEVENTH IN 2005 BIG 12 COACHES PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish tied for seventh in the annual Big 12 Conference preseason coaches poll released on Aug. 3.

Nebraska was a unanimous pick to repeat as Big 12 champions, capturing all 10 first-place votes for 100 points (coaches do not vote for their own teams). Missouri was picked second with 88 points followed by Texas (77), Texas A&M (72), Kansas (68) and Kansas State (56). Colorado and Baylor each pulled in 43 points while Oklahoma (24), Texas Tech (21) and Iowa State (13) rounded out the poll.

CU returns six starters and 11 letterwinners from a 2004 squad that finished 14-14 overall and tied for sixth with Kansas in the final league standings at 9-11.
