Colorado Faces #1 Nebraska, #4 Florida and Northern Colorado

UP NEXT: Colorado (14-10, 10-9 Big 12) heads to the road for a trio of matches this week. First, the Buffs will face top-ranked Nebraska (27-0, 18-0 Big 12) on Wednesday, Nov. 23 at 6 p.m. MT. CU will return to Colorado and drive down I-25 for a pair of matches at the University of Denver Thanksgiving Tournament. The Buffs will face fourth-ranked Florida (28-2) on Friday, Nov. 25 at 5 p.m. Colorado will cap off its regular season on Saturday, Nov. 26 with a match against Northern Colorado (14-14) at 5 p.m.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SELECTION SHOW: The NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship 64-team bracket will be announced on ESPNNEWS between 12:30 and 1 p.m. (MT) on Sunday, Nov. 27.

Colorado has participated in the tournament 14 times.

ON THE SEASON: Colorado is 14-10 overall and is 10-9 in the Big 12. CU is currently fourth in the Big 12.

The Buffs are 7-3 in their last 10 matches.

CU has defeated three ranked teams this season; with two of those wins coming on the road. CU took two consecutive matches against ranked opponents for the first time since 1996 when the Buffs stunned Kansas State and Texas A&M on Oct. 12 and 16.

The first of the two consecutive wins against ranked teams came against No. 20 Kansas State. It was the first win over a ranked opponent this season for Colorado as the Buffs beat the Wildcats 30-14, 30-25, 25-30, 28-30, 15-5. CU followed it up with a win at 24th-ranked Texas A&M. The Buffs rallied back from a 0-2 deficit and won 20-30, 25-30, 30-26, 30-28, 15-10.

Colorado's most recent victory against a ranked team came on Oct. 29 as the Buffs shocked eighth-ranked Missouri 20-30, 30-28, 23-30, 30-27, 15-12 in Columbia, Mo. CU played in front of 2,571, the fourth largest crowd in MU history.

Five of Colorado's losses have come to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents. CU's first loss of the season came at the hands of third-rated and defending national champion Stanford.

The Buffs fell in four to 18th-ranked Texas in Austin on Sept. 14 and then again on Nov. 9 in five when UT was ranked 11 and CU was 25. Colorado came back home to face its second and third consecutive ranked opponents in top-ranked Nebraska and eighth-ranked Missouri. CU fell in three to both opponents.

Senior right side hitter **Allie Griffin** is averaging 4.71 kills per game while hitting .286 on the year. She ranks second in the Big 12 in kills and is 15th in hitting percentage. Griffin has hit more than 20 kills in nine matches this season; including a career-high 29 against Kansas State on

Oct. 12. She notched her 1,000th-career kill with her first kill in the fifth game against Kansas on Oct. 1. Sophomore **Amber Sutherland** is averaging 3.76 per game. Sutherland ranks ninth in the league in kills. Colorado's 15.87 kills per game is fourth in the Big 12.

Junior middle blocker **Lara Bossow** has four block solos and 76 block assists to lead the Buffs. Bossow is averaging 0.82 blocks per game. Freshman middle blocker **Lauren Schaefer** is second with 79 total blocks (10 solo and 69 assists) on the season. She is averaging 0.92 blocks per game. The Buffs are averaging 2.27 blocks

per game and are 10th in the Big 12.

Junior setter **Ashley Nu'u** has passed out 1,282 assists this season to average 13.22 per game. She currently ranks third in the Big 12 and leads Colorado to a .260 attack percentage that ranks fourth in the league.

The Buffaloes' defense is lead by Sutherland. She has picked up 254 digs this season and averages 2.65 per game. She is 15th in the league. Senior **Nicole Carr** has picked up 252 digs (2.60 per game) this season and has played five games as the team's libero. Carr notched her 1,000th-career dig on Oct. 1 versus Kansas. Sutherland is second with 242 digs (2.73 per game). Sophomore libero **Therese Vinal** has collected 206. The Buffs are ninth in the Big 12 with 13.41 digs per game.

LAST TIME OUT: Colorado sophomore Amber Sutherland had 19 kills and 12 digs, but Texas A&M's Laura Jones and Christi Hahn rallied the Aggies to a five-game win over the No. 24 Buffaloes in front of 1,864 on senior night at the Coors Events Conference Center. Games scores were 30-22, 28-30, 28-30, 30-23, and 15-7 in the final frame.

CU played in its school-record 11th 5-game match of 2005, falling to 6-5 in those contests.

Jones had a match-high 33 kills and hit .314. She had four kills early in game five to give the Aggies a 9-5 margin they would never give up. Hahn had 23 kills, six blocks and hit a match-best .514.

Senior Allie Griffin had 18 kills and 10 digs while junior Lara Bossow had 11 kills and senior Nicole Carr had 10. Junior setter Ashley Nu'u gave the Buffaloes a third double-double with 63 assists and 11 digs.

Led by Jones and Hahn, Texas A&M hit .331 overall and a solid .533 in the deciding game five. Colorado managed just .062 in the final game, and hit .247 overall, just below its Big 12 season average of .250.

In game one Texas A&M had kills on eight of their first 11 hits to build a 13-5 lead. CU then settled down and scored seven straight points to get to within one at 13-12 on the serve of Therese Vinal, including a pair of aces by the sophomore defensive specialist. However, the Buffaloes had no answer for the Jones-Hahn duo who combined for 12 kills and a .375 hitting percentage. A&M never trailed and took game one 30-22.

After hitting just .159 in game one, Colorado bounced back strong in game two hitting .400. The Aggies continued to hit strong as well, netting a .316 percentage in game two, but it cooled just

enough in the latter stages of the game for CU to take advantage. Texas A&M led 20-15, but the Buffs went on a 12-4 run sparked by four Griffin kills and a pair of blocks by Griffin and Bossow, and the eventual 30-28 win.

Colorado led the entire way in game three, receiving a big lift from an unlikely hero. Playing in her final match at the CECC, senior middle hitter Lynsey Mann accounted for six points on three kills and three blocks, two of which were solo, to spark CU to an 18-11 lead. Mann, whose career high in points for a match had been seven, finished with a personal best seven kills, hit .385 and had 10 points. Texas A&M fought back to within one on two occasions, but the Buffs prevailed again 30-28.

Texas A&M hitting returned in a big way in game four as the Aggies led the entire way. A&M built a 16-8 lead hitting .474 and never looked back. Colorado couldn't match offensively hitting .256.

ABOUT THE HUSKERS: Nebraska has held the top spot on the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll since the preseason poll. The Huskers are undefeated and own 27 overall victories and 18 Big 12 wins. Only seven of NU's matches have gone past three games. The Huskers have five hitters with 200 or more kills this season: Melissa Elmer (246), Sarah Pavan (343), Chris Houghtelling (330), Jordan Larson (256) and Jennifer Saleaumua (200). Saleaumua leads NU with 3.84 digs per game and Elmer is the top blocker with 2.26 blocks per game. The Huskers run a 6-2 offense with Maggie Griffin and Dani Busboom directing them to a .323 attack percentage. NU holds its opponents to a .119 hitting percentage and averages 4.24 blocks per game.

ABOUT THE GATORS: Florida is currently ranked fourth in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. The Gators are 28-2 overall and are 15-1 in the Southeastern Conference. Florida has won seven straight matches after dropping a five-game match to Tennessee, which ended a 14-match win streak. Jane Collymore leads the Gators with 4.52 kills and 2.94 digs per game while hitting .239. Angie McGinnis has led Florida to a .298 hitting percentage and is averaging 13.28 kills per game. Rachel Engel is picking up 5.25 digs per game and Marcie Hampton is adding 3.14 digs per game. Florida is averaging 17.05 digs and 2.82 blocks per game on defense.

ABOUT THE BEARS: Northern Colorado owns a 14-14 record. The Bears hosted the Division I Independents tournament Nov. 10-12. UNC is currently on a three-match losing streak and have won five of their last 10 matches. The Bears are led by Amanda Wiggins. Wiggins records 3.57 kills, 3.61

digs and 0.70 blocks per game. Corrine Chapin directs UNC's offense with 11.44 assists per game. The Bears are hitting .186 and are averaging 14.45 kills per game. Abby Mayne is averaging 4.53 digs per game while the Bears are recording 17.86 digs per game.

SERIES RECORDS: Nebraska owns a 39-5 record over the Buffs, including winning the last 15 straight. The last time CU defeated the Huskers was in 1997 when the Buffs swept the series. CU defeated NU in five in Lincoln and then in three at the Coors Events Center.

This is the first meeting against Florida and Northern Colorado for the Buffs.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST TIME: Nebraska took down Colorado in three games on Sept. 17 at the Coors Events Center in front of 1,882. The game scores were 22-30, 20-30, 23-30.

Allie Griffin led the Buffs with 16 kills and Amber Sutherland added 11. Sarah Pavan recorded 13 kills and hit .579 and Chris Houghtelling notched 12 kills and a .500 attack percentage for the Huskers.

Colorado hit just .153 in the contest, while Nebraska collected a .394 hitting percentage. The Huskers tallied 12 blocks in the match. Pavan collected one block solo and five assists. CU notched three.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Pi'i Aiu (pronounced P-E I-U) is in his ninth season as Colorado's head coach sporting a career record of 162-101. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to seven NCAA Tournaments in eight seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported three All-Americans, nine All-Region, and 20 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu, who has led the Buffs to a 108-71 record in Big 12 matches, is joined on the bench this season by sixth-year assistant Jil Thomason and second-year assistant, and USA Olympian, Erik Sullivan.

Aiu is 2-15 against Nebraska. He has never faced Florida or Northern Colorado.

BUFFS AT HOME: Colorado will call the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 18th straight season. The Buffs are 185-63 all-time at the CECC for a winning percentage of .746.

SECOND TIME IS A CHARM: The Buffs are getting redemption from some of its earlier losses this season. CU lost to Texas, Nebraska, Missouri, Iowa State, Kansas and Texas Tech in the first half of the Big 12 schedule. The second time around, the Buffs defeated Iowa State, Missouri, Kansas and Texas Tech. The Buffs were unable to defeat Texas the second time around and will face Nebraska on Nov. 23.

WHAT A SCHEDULE!: Colorado faces some of the toughest competition in the country in the 2005 season. Four of its Big 12 opponents are currently ranked in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. Nebraska is the number one team in the land, followed by Missouri (10), Texas (11) and Kansas State (25). CU will face fourth-ranked Florida in a non-conference match-up on Nov. 25. The Buffs fell to then-third-ranked Stanford on Sept. 8 at the Colorado Invitational. Colorado, Kansas and Texas A&M have also been ranked this season.

MORE THAN LAST YEAR: The Buffs have recorded more Big 12 wins this year than last with 10 and still have three matches left. Last season CU went 9-11 in conference play and this year owns a 10-9 record. Colorado has also tallied the same amount of overall wins as last year with 14.

There are still three matches left in the regular season.

ONE HUGE WEEK: Colorado recorded two consecutive wins against CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents for the first time since 1996. CU upset then-20th-ranked Kansas State at home in five games. Then the Buffs took to the road and upset then-24th-ranked Texas A&M in front of 1,605. CU rallied from a 0-2 deficit to defeat the Aggies.

GIVE ME FIVE: Five seems to be the Colorado Buffaloes favorite number this season. Colorado has played 11 five-game matches out of 24 matches this season. The Buffs also played five consecutive five-game contests between Oct. 1-16. Both are school records. CU is 6-5 in those matches. Colorado has rallied back from 0-2 deficits against Marquette and Texas A&M.

ONE GRAND FOR ME, ONE GRAND FOR YOU: Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin recorded career milestones on Oct. 1, as the Buffs battled against Kansas. Carr picked up her 1,000th-career dig with her 14th dig in the match. Griffin hammered her 1,000th-career kill with her 25th kill of the match. Both became the 12th player in CU history to record each milestone.

CHASING HISTORY: Several current Buffs are in the CU record books, but they are looking to move up this season. Seniors Allie Griffin and Nicole Carr are moving up in the career kills list. Griffin owns 1,249 kills for sixth on the list and Carr is 13th with 969. Carr is also ninth on the digs list with 1,128. Ashley Nu'u is fifth on the all-time career assists chart with 2,806.

BUFF BITS: Five of CU's losses have been to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll ranked teams...Colorado won the American University Classic and took second at Colorado Invitational...Nicole Carr was named the American University Classic Most Valuable Player. Amber Sutherland and Allie Griffin were also named to the all-tournament team...Sutherland and Griffin were also named the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament Team...The Buffs snapped a three-match losing streak on Sept. 24 against Oklahoma in five games. The win was the first in the Big 12 for the Buffs this season...Alex Buth served five aces against Oklahoma, which is the most any Buff has served in a single match since the 2000 season. Lara Bossow tallied five in a five-game win over Missouri...The loss to Iowa State snapped an 18-match win-streak against the Cyclones for the Buffs...Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin each notched career milestones on Oct. 1 against Kansas. Carr recorded her 1,000th-career dig, while Griffin hammered her 1,000th-career kill...Ashley Nu'u tallied a career-high 68

assists in the same match and followed it up with a new record of 70 against Baylor...When Griffin records 20 or more kills, the Buffs are 7-2... Head coach Pi'i Aiu recorded his 100th Big 12 victory on Oct. 5 against Baylor...Nicole Carr needs 31 kills to become the ninth Buff to record 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs...CU has played 11 five-game matches this season and five consecutive five-game matches. 20TH ANNIVERSARY: The 2005 season marks the 20th campaign for the Colorado volleyball program. Since debuting as a varsity program in the fall of 1986, the Buffs have an overall record of 373-232 (.617) including one conference title (Big Eight in 1993). CU has advanced to 14 NCAA Tournaments in 16 years, 13 of which have come since 1991. The Buffs are one of only 14 NCAA Division I programs with at least 13 NCAA appearances since 1991.

GRIFFIN AND NU'U NAMED TO THE PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM: University of Colorado senior Allie Griffin and junior Ashley Nu'u were selected to the 2005 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference volleyball team by a vote of league coaches the conference office announced on Wednesday.

Griffin, a 6-0 right side hitter from Baton Rouge, La., earned honorable mention to the 2004 AVCA All-America team while collecting AVCA All-Central Region and All-Big 12 first team honors. She led Colorado in kills as a junior with 420, the 12th best single-season mark in team history, and showed her versatility by ranking second on the team in digs and third in blocks during the regular season. Griffin was fifth in the Big 12 in kills per game (4.27 kpg) in 2004 and is the Buffaloes active career leader in kills (797) and blocks (189).

Nu'u, a 5-10 setter from Aurora, Colo., was given honorable mention to the 2004 All-Big 12 team in her first season as a full-time starter. She ranked fifth in the Big 12 in overall assists (12.19 apg) and was sixth in league-only contests (11.79 apg). Her sophomore season total of 1,146 assists is 12th on CU's single-season list and she is currently fifth on the Buffs' career chart with 1,515. For Nu'u, this is her second Big 12 preseason honor as she was voted the league's Preseason Freshman of the Year in 2003, only to miss a good portion of the season with a back ailment.

CU PICKED SEVENTH IN 2005 BIG 12 COACHES PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish tied for seventh in the annual Big 12 Conference preseason coaches poll released on Aug. 3.

Nebraska was a unanimous pick to repeat as Big 12 champions, capturing all 10 first-place votes for 100 points (coaches do not vote for their own teams). Missouri was picked second with 88 points followed by Texas (77), Texas A&M (72), Kansas (68) and Kansas State (56). Colorado and Baylor each pulled in 43 points while Oklahoma (24), Texas Tech (21) and Iowa State (13) rounded out the poll.

CU returns six starters and 11 letterwinners from a 2004 squad that finished 14-14 overall and tied for sixth with Kansas in the final league standings at 9-11.
