THE GAME: The University of Colorado continues Big 12 Conference action by taking on No. 16 (AP)/17 (WBCA) ranked University of Texas on Saturday, Jan. 17, at 6 p.m. MST at the Frank Erwin Center in Austin.

BROADCAST: Saturday's game will broadcast live on KKZN 760 AM with Mike Rice giving the play-by-play and Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. Live internet audio of all CU basketball games is available through Yahoo! Sports.

OPENING TIP: Kathy McConnell-Miller is after her 50th win as Colorado's head coach and leads her team into a challenging start to the Big 12 season. The Buffaloes play the third of four straight games against Big 12 Southern Division teams, all four of which are currently ranked in both the Associated Press and WBCA Coaches polls. Colorado will be out for its first Big 12 road win since a 70-58 win over Missouri on Jan. 9, 2008 game and its first win at a Big 12 Southern Division team since defeating Baylor in Waco on Jan. 7, 2004, a span of 15-straight losses.

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 8-6 overall and 0-2 in the Big 12, dropping two straight after entering the league season on a five-game win streak. The Buffaloes will be looking for their second road win of the season, third away from Boulder. Colorado capped off its noncon-

ference schedule on a high note, winning the 2009 Paradise Classic in Honolulu, with wins over Pepperdine and Hawaii. The Buffaloes are 5-11 on the road in the last two seasons after winning just five games in 33 tries in the three previous years (2004-07).

Sophomore **Brittany Spears** leads Colorado and ranks second in the Big 12 in scoring at 18 points per game. A member of the 2008 Big 12 All-Rookie Team, Spears has been held to 14 and 11 points in her first two conference games. She was named MVP of the Paradise Classic after averaging 16 points, seven rebounds and three blocks per game. Spears has five games of 20-plus points, including a 21 point performance in the win over Saint Louis on Dec. 22, where she had one of the better shooting nights of her young career hitting on 8-of-10 from the field including all three 3-point attempts. She has three double-doubles this season, most recently scoring 14 points and grabbing 13 rebounds against Idaho State on Dec. 30. She has the highest individual scoring output in the Big 12 this season, notching 36 against UMass in the first round of the Coors Classic, a Classic record and tying for the third best total in team history (Jasmina Ilic scored 36 against Nebraska on Jan. 4, 2006). Spears, who was named to the Coors Classic All-Tournament Team, ranks third in the Big 12 in minutes (33.5 mpg), eighth in blocked shots (1.3 bpg), ninth in rebounding (7.6 rpg) and 3-point field-goal percentage (.353), 10th in field-goal percentage (.444), 12th in 3-point field-goals made (1.7 3mpg) and 13th in free-throw percentage (.687).

Senior center **Kara Richards** had a strong nonconference season and has carried it over to the Big 12, averaging 12.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per game while hitting 57.6 percent from the field (68-of-118). She's among the league's top 20 players in scoring, rebounding and free-throw percentage and would rank second in the Big 12 in field-goal percentage but has two less field goals than the minimum of five made per game. Richards has recorded back-to-back games of 15 rebounds to start the Big 12 season, her first two double-digit rebounding efforts of the season and a single-game personal best. Richards was named to the Rainbow Classic All-Tournament team averaging 14 points and seven rebounds while hitting 71 percent from the field (12-of-17). Richards, who has already more points, field goals and rebounds than she had in 30 games as a junior, has eclipsed the 20 point mark twice this season, including a career-high 25 in the win over Colorado State, which included a personal best 9-of-9 performance from the free throw line.

Junior guard **Bianca Smith** is third on the team in scoring at 10.2 points per contest. Smith is Colorado's leading 3-point shooter with 32 on the season, second in the Big 12. She has made 13 of her last 26 field goal attempts (.500) and 8-of-18 from 3-point range (.444). Named to the Paradise Classic All-Tournament team, Smith had a game-high 23 points against Hawaii on 6-of-7 from 3-point range, a personal best from downtown in terms of accuracy. She's third on the team in rebounding at 5.1 per game, a substantial improvement from her career 1.7 average entering this season. Smith has six or more rebounds in eight of 14 games including a career high 12 -- all defensive -- against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, her first double-digit rebounding total.

True freshman guard **Alyssa Fressle** has given the Buffaloes good all-around play. Fressle leads CU in steals (1.9 spg) and assists (3.9 apg). She tops all Big 12 freshmen in steals and assists and is second in scoring at 9.1 per game. Overall in the conference rankings she is seventh in assists and 10th in steals.

Sophomore **Britney Blythe** has been the starting point guard for the last seven games with sophomore **Kelly Jo Mullaney** coming off the bench, a lineup that has produced a 5-2 record. Blythe, who is more of a natural point guard, had a career night against Baylor, hitting her first four 3-point field goals for a personal-best 12 points.

Blythe, who finished the night a career-best 4-of-6 from the field, had made just 1-of-12 3-point field goals this season and 5-of-33 in her career prior to the Baylor game. Mullaney has also responded well to coming off the bench. She has made 15 of her last 31 field goal attempts spanning the last nine games. She is fifth on the team in scoring (4.6 ppg) and is second in assists with 30.

Freshman forward Julie Seabrook recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds against Idaho State. She ranks fourth among freshmen in the Big 12 in rebounding at (3.8 rpg) and fifth in field-goal percentage (.500). Senior guard/forward **Hannah Skildum** is averaging 2.6 points and 2.3 rebounds, pitching in six points in the win over Hawaii. Sophomore center **Courtney Dunn** is providing minutes at the low post, averaging 2.3 points and 2.0 rebounds per game. Senior forward **Dina Piterniece** has played in nine games, eclipsing her total from last year, pitching in seven points and four rebounds. Colorado's bench has grown by one as sophomore guard **Chelsea Dale** returned from ankle surgery to make her season debut in the closing minutes against UMKC.

Colorado is averaging 64.5 points per game while allowing 62.4 to opponents. The Buffaloes are shooting 42 percent from the field and 67 percent from the free throw line. Colorado's field goal percentage defense has been good, limiting opponents to just 37.4 percent from the floor and 26.3 percent from 3-point range.

The Buffaloes have struggled to score on the road, averaging just 48.2 points in four true road games. CU has made just 33 percent of its field goals and 48 percent from the free-throw line. Opponents are also outrebounding the Buffaloes 52-34 on the road.

ABOUT THE LONGHORNS: No. 16/17 Texas is 13-3 overall and 1-1 in the Big 12, picking up its first league victory with a 74-60 decision over Nebraska on Jan. 14. The Longhorns have lost three of their last five since beginning the season 11-0 and assuming a No. 4 national ranking in both polls on Dec. 29. Texas, a perfect 9-0 at home, is averaging 77.8 points per game while holding its opponents to 54.3 a contest. The Longhorns defense has been solid, leading the Big 12 in opponent field-goal percentage (.332) and blocked shots (6.5 bpg). UT also leads the Big 12 in scoring margin (+23.4) and free-throw percentage (.750).

Junior guard Brittainey Raven leads Texas in scoring at 14.6 points per game, hitting 49 percent from the field. Sophomore guard Kathleen Nash, despite coming off the bench in nearly half the games, is UT's second leading scorer (14.2 ppg) and top rebounder (6.7 rpg) and leads the Big 12 Conference in free-throw percentage (.879). She has split time with junior Erika Arriaran who ranks third in scoring at 9.1 per game. Down low, Ashley Lindsey is a 51 percent

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the 18th meeting between Colorado and Texas with the Longhorns holding a 13-4 series lead. The Buffaloes snapped an eight-game Texas winning streak in the series with a 67-52 win in Boulder on Feb. 16, 2008. The Longhorns are 6-1 at home against CU, winning the last five. Colorado's lone win in Austin was a 60-56 decision on Feb. 26, 1997.

of the season, including a 70-58 win at Missouri in 2008 to open league play. The Buffaloes are 20-15 all-time in conference openers, including the Big Eight and Intermountain Conferences.

CHALLENGING START TO LEAGUE PLAY: With the latest AP poll out, Colorado will open its Big 12 schedule with four straight games against ranked teams, a first in team history. The Buffaloes opened with losses to No. 6/5 Baylor and No. 22/22 Oklahoma State and is set for No. 16/17 Texas before returning home to host No. 3 Oklahoma on Jan. 21. Colorado opened the 2002 Big 12 season with three straight games against ranked league opponents. The Buffaloes, who were ranked themselves between No. 14-21 during that stretch, lost all three of those matchups, falling to No. 3 Oklahoma, No. 21/20 Texas and No. 14/18 Kansas State. That stretch was the final three games of a five-game span against ranked opponents as the Buffaloes ended nonconference play with a loss at No. 20 Florida and win over No. 21/22 LSU. CU's upcoming four straight games against ranked teams are the most since that same five-game stretch during the 2001-02 season. The Buffaloes would go on to play a school record 16 games against ranked teams that season, winning six. CU's tough schedule paid dividends that season as the Buffaloes won 14 of their final 16 games, advancing to the 2002 Elite Eight.

MORE SMITH FROM DOWNTOWN: Bianca Smith, who set a CU single season record with 80 3-point field goals last year, is beginning to heat up once again from downtown as the Big 12 season begins. After starting the season by hitting just 12 of her first 49 3-point attempts (.245), she has rebounded to hit 20-of-42 (.476) over the last seven games. Smith had a career night in terms of accuracy in the win over Hawaii hitting 6-of-7 from 3-point range en route to a season-high 23 points. She is tied for sixth with former teammate Jasmina Ilic (2003-07) on CU's career list for 3-point field goals made (144) and ranks seventh in attempts (400). Smith needs just six 3-pointers to move into fifth place.

BALANCED SCORING ATTACK: Colorado had its most balanced scoring attack in over two years as five players scored in double-digits during the Buffs 73-57 win over Idaho State. **Brittany Spears** and **Kara Richards** each had 14 points, **Julie Seabrook** and **Bianca Smith** each had 12 and **Alyssa Fressle** had 11. It was almost six

in double-digits as **Kelly Jo Mullaney** had eight off the bench. It was CU's first game with five in double-digits since a 77-71 win at Kansas on Feb. 1, 2006. Current CU senior **Hannah Skildum** was one of the five with double digits in that game, scoring 11 off the bench as a freshman.

SEABROOK LEADS STRONG BENCH EFFORT: Freshman **Julie Seabrook** recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds in the win over Idaho State. Seabrook, who surpassed her previous career best in rebounds (5) with six in the first half alone, corralled eight offensive rebounds in the win, the most on that side of the ledger for CU since Jackie McFarland had eight against Oklahoma on Jan. 20, 2007. Seabrook's 12 points off the bench were the most by a Buff this season and the team's 22 bench points tied for the best output of the season, matching the effort in the season-opening win over UCF.

SOUTHERN GAME CANCELLED: Colorado's home game with Southern University scheduled for Friday, Dec. 12, was cancelled due to inclement weather. A rare southern snow storm, which left 3-5 inches in and around the Baton Rouge area the morning of Dec. 11, shut down many businesses, schools and flights. Southern's travel plans were cancelled and the Jaguars were not able find travel alternatives to Boulder for the Dec. 12 date. The game will not be rescheduled in 2008-09.

CU women's basketball season ticket holders and fans who purchased single game tickets for the Southern contest can redeem their tickets for any other game remaining on the women's schedule. For more information, contact the CU Athletic Ticket Office at 303-49BUFFS or 800-87BUFFS.

SCORING EARLY AND OFTEN AT COORS: The Buffaloes offense started the season red hot, breaking the 80-point mark in their first two games (89.5 ppg). It was the first time CU opened the season with back-to-back 80-plus point games since the 2002-03 campaign when the Buffs began with home wins over Rice (85-66) and Detroit Mercy (86-43). The 179 combined points were CU's most since 2000-01 when the Buffs scored 189 in wins over Albany (93-43) and Howard (96-45).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 50-110 all-time against ranked teams, after falling to No. 22/22 Oklahoma State on Jan. 14. CU had one of its more successful years against ranked teams in 2007-08, sporting a 3-4 records. Prior to the 2007-08 season, the Buffs had suffered 23 straight losses against ranked opponents from 2004-07.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: Colorado improved to 30-5 (.857) all-time in season openers and an outstanding 33-2 (.942) all-time in home openers. Colorado has never lost its overall season opener when played at home (23-0).

HOUSTON TO MISS SEASON, DALE RETURNS: Junior guard **Whitney Houston** will miss the 2008-09 season after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in her left knee on Sept. 24 during team individual workouts. She had successful surgery in October and will be able to use her redshirt season and have two years of eligibility remaining.

Houston has averaged 6.1 points and 1.8 assists for the Buffaloes in 59 games over the past two seasons. She was a starter in 20 of those and was in the mix for the starting point guard position once again. Houston was CU's leader in scoring (4.3 ppg) and assists (1.4 apg) among those that primarily came off the bench in 2007-08 and averaged 6.5 points and just under two assists over the final 15 games.

Sophomore guard **Chelsea Dale**, who underwent successful surgery to stabilize ligaments in her right ankle in early September, made her season debut against UMKC, playing in the final two minutes of the game. She saw action in 12 games as a true freshman in 2007-08.

BUFFS PICKED 11TH...AGAIN: For the third straight season Colorado was picked to finish 11th in the annual Big 12 Conference Preseason Coaches Poll.

Oklahoma was picked to win the 2009 title with seven first place votes and 124 points overall. Texas, earning one first place vote, edged out Iowa State for second place with 95 points. The Cyclones, who actually claimed a pair of first place votes came in third with 93. Baylor was fourth with 89 (and one first place vote), followed by Texas A&M (85), Oklahoma State (79, and one first place vote), Kansas State (71), Nebraska (56), Kansas (41), Texas Tech (36), Colorado (18) and Missouri (15).

The Buffaloes have fared better than the Big 12 coaches preseason prediction each of the last three seasons under Kathy McConnell-Miller:

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Colorado once again faces a tough schedule with no less than 17 games against 2008 NCAA or WNIT tournament teams. Eight of CU's opponents are ranked in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and Associated Press polls while Texas A&M, Baylor and Oklahoma are in the top 10 of both.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 328-101 all-time record at the Coors Events/Conference Center (.765). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CECC in 20 of the previous 30 years including a 15-6 mark in 2007-08. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CECC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's schedule features seven games that will be televised either regionally or nationally, all at home and on FSN Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes will host Nebraska on Saturday, Jan. 31 in a nationally televised contest on FSN. Other games on CU's FSN Rocky Mountain schedule are Colorado State (Nov. 19), Baylor (Jan. 10), Oklahoma (Jan. 21), Texas Tech (Jan. 28), Iowa State (Feb. 7) and Missouri (Feb. 28).

UP NEXT: Colorado will return home to host No. 3/3 Oklahoma on Wednesday, Jan. 21, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center. The game will be televised live on FSN Rocky Mountain.



Kathy McConnell-Miller
Head Coach
Fourth Season

When Kathy McConnell-Miller took over the University of Colorado program three years ago, there's no question the Buffaloes were rebuilding and the team was a work in progress.

In three seasons at Colorado, there is no question that McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes have made progress and the program is heading in the right direction.

McConnell-Miller's three seasons at Colorado have been marked by significant improvement each year. From a nine-win season her first year in Boulder, to a 13-17 mark in 2006-07, this past season she guided the Buffaloes to a 19-15 record and the team's first winning season and postseason berth since the 2003-04 campaign.

McConnell-Miller experienced quite a few firsts during CU's memorable 2007-08 season. She led Colorado to its first Associated Press national ranking in four seasons, peaking at No. 23, and in the process became the 22nd person in NCAA Division I women's history to coach and play for an AP ranked team.

McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes beat three ranked teams in 2007-08 – another first in four years – and finished ninth in the tough Big 12 Conference at 5-11. With a league-record eight Big 12 teams advancing to the NCAA Tournament, CU gained the conference's automatic bid into the WNIT where the Buffaloes proceeded to advance to the semifinals before falling to eventual tournament champion Marquette. It was CU's first ever appearance in the semifinals of a postseason event and for McConnell-Miller, she claimed the first three postseason wins of her head coaching career (3-3).

The signs of progress were also evident in her second season, 2006-07, when the Buffaloes finished tied for seventh in the Big 12 at 6-10. CU's six league wins in 2006-07 were more than the previous two years combined (3-13 in 2005-06 and 2-14 in 2004-05) and the Buffs won their first Big 12 Tournament game since 2003.

McConnell-Miller, who officially became the sixth head coach in the history of CU women's basketball on April 27, 2005, presided over the development of Jackie McFarland, one of the top players in the Big 12 over the past four years. McFarland was a two-time AP honorable mention All-American and three-time All-Big 12 selection including back-to-back first team honors in 2007 and 2008. All-league selections are nothing new to McConnell-Miller as she has had at least one first or second team all-conference performer in each of her nine seasons as a collegiate head coach.

The Buffaloes have also had academic success in the McConnell-Miller era. In her three seasons, McConnell-Miller has coached 10 Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball team members and helped guide McFarland to three ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors, including first team acclaim in 2007-08.

She has done well with the players inherited from legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry, but she has also excelled in bringing in her own players. This past season she brought in Brittany Spears who proceeded to have one of the best seasons of any CU freshman in team history. Spears was named to the Big 12 All-Rookie Team and earned honorable mention to the all-conference team. She led all Big 12 freshmen in scoring, rebounding and blocks and became the first player in CU history to record 50 blocks, 50 steals and 50 assists in one season.

McConnell-Miller, who from day one has established a family type atmosphere in the lockerroom and a fighting spirit in her players, and her staff have two Top 40 recruiting classes, including the No. 29 class in 2006 according to the All-Star Girls Report. What was remarkable about the class of 2006 is McConnell-Miller and her staff didn't even have the chance to start on the recruiting trail until April when they arrived in Boulder. Despite that late start, McConnell-Miller and her staff managed to sign five top 150 players, including Whitney Houston and Aija Putnina who made significant contributions in their first two seasons.

Before arriving at CU, McConnell-Miller spent six seasons as head coach at the University of Tulsa where she constructed an impressive turnaround of the Golden Hurricane program. Before her arrival in 1999-2000, Tulsa had just one winning season in its 14-year history, an overall record of 81-250 (.324), and was actually dropped as a varsity sport for nine years following the 1986-87 campaign. In her six seasons at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller recorded a program-best 91 wins (15.2 wins per year), winning seasons in three of the last four years and two postseason appearances.

She left as Tulsa's all-time leader for coaching victories with a record of

91-88 and owns the longest tenure in school history by a women's basketball coach. McConnell-Miller, who earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in her rookie season as a collegiate head coach in 1999-00, led Tulsa to 14 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

Under the direction of McConnell-Miller, Tulsa placed at least one player on either the All-WAC first or second team, each of her six seasons. McConnell-Miller also had the Golden Hurricane excelling in the classroom sporting four ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District first and second team performers. Tulsa players also earned 23 All-WAC Academic Team honors. One of McConnell-Miller's prize players was Allison Curtin who was an AP honorable mention All-American for the Golden Hurricane and was drafted by the Houston Comets in the first round of the 2003 WNBA Draft.

Prior to her appointment at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller spent four seasons on Theresa Grentz's staff at the University of Illinois (1995-99). She was an assistant coach for her first three years before being promoted to associate head coach for her final season. The Fighting Illini posted an overall record of 76-45 and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments with McConnell-Miller on the bench. Illinois won the Big Ten Conference Championship in 1997 and twice advanced to the Sweet 16. While at Illinois, McConnell-Miller was vital in the signing of a pair of recruiting classes that ranked among the top five in the nation.

McConnell-Miller coached with Grentz for a total of six years as she went with Grentz to Illinois from Rutgers University in 1995. McConnell-Miller was a Rutgers assistant for two seasons (1993-95), helping the Lady Knights post a pair of winning campaigns, the 1994 Atlantic 10 Championship and a spot in the NCAA Tournament.

Her first collegiate assistant coaching job came at her hometown school, the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the Panthers in 1991 and served as the recruiting coordinator. She was also an assistant coach for the 1993 Big East All-Star Team which played in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

She is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, and was inducted into the Seton LaSalle High School Hall of Fame in October of 2006.

McConnell-Miller enjoyed a four-year playing career at guard for the University of Virginia (1985-89). She played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight. BOULDER – Brittany Spears had a game-high 23 points to lead Colorado to an 86-59 win over UCF Sunday afternoon at the Coors Events Center in the season opener for both teams.

Spears, just one off her career high of 24 points, set last season against Missouri, was 9-of-17 from the field with three 3-pointers and added eight rebounds and five steals.

She scored 15 of CU's first 21 points as the Buffaloes built a 21-11 lead in the first 8:09 of the game. Spears totaled 18 points in the first half, a career-high for one period, as Colorado led 41-28 after the first 20 minutes.

The Buffaloes pressured UCF into 31 turnovers and held the Knights to just 34 percent from the field.

"I felt nice to be out there playing someone other than the (male) practice players," Spears said.

Colorado struggled from the free-throw line, making just 16 of 26 attempts and was out rebounded 52-35, but it was an overall good start for a team debuting a new starting back court. True freshman guard **Alyssa Fressle** fought off two early fouls to finish with 10 points, three rebounds and four steals. Sophomore point guard **Kelly Jo Mullaney**, making her official CU debut, had two points, three rebounds and one assist, but overall handled the UCF pressure well.

"I thought I could have done a little better," Fressle said. "I think (the early fouls) may have shaken me up a little, but that's just something to learn from."

Colorado's front court, the topic of much discussion during the off season, had a productive afternoon. Fifth-year senior center **Kara Richards** had 13 points on 5-of-6 from the field with seven rebounds and two blocked shots. Freshman **Julie Seabrook** came off the bench to score five points and four rebounds while **Courtney Dunn** had six points on a pair of 3-pointers.

"The stat line on Kara is what we see every day in practice," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "She's got the heart of a lion and the work ethic of a Division I athlete. For us to be able to go forward and continue to do what we want to do, Kara's a huge key to that. Her consistency is going to be a major factor."

The Buffaloes fell into a little foul trouble in the second half with Richards picking up her fourth foul with 16:27 remaining and Spears notching her fourth with 13:56 left, but the Buffaloes didn't miss a beat.

Junior guard **Bianca Smith** took over from that point as the Buffaloes pulled away and led by as much as 33 late in the game. Smith had 14 of her 16 points in the second half, tied a personal best with six rebounds and added two assists and two steals. Senior guard/forward **Hannah Skildum** added nine points, a game-high five assists, three rebounds and two blocks.

"It was a tough opening game," McConnell-Miller said. "When you think about the time we had to prepare from October to November 16, just their (UCF) style of play was difficult to prepare for. I was proud of our girls."

Emma Cannon led UCF with 19 points and 17 rebounds. Aisha Patrick also logged a double-double for the Knights finishing with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

BOULDER – Senior center Kara Richards scored a career high 25 points and grabbed eight rebounds to vault Colorado to a 93-63 win over instate rival Colorado State Wednesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Brittany Spears matched her own personal best with 24 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for her eighth career double-double as the Buffaloes move to 2-0 for the first time since the 2003-04 season.

Colorado used an 11-0 run to open the second half to pull away from the Rams (0-2). The Buffaloes shot 57 percent in the second period, outscoring Colorado State 51-28.

Richards dominated the inside in her best all around game in a Colorado uniform. She was 8-of-12 from the field and a perfect 9-of-9 from the free-throw line.

"I became a little bit more aggressive," Richards said. "I started calling for the ball more. As a post, the only way I'm going to have a good game is if the guards get me the ball and we have guards that can all do that."

Richards reached 20 points for the fifth time in her career and surpassed her previous career best of 24 points set twice in her freshman year in 2005 (vs. Manhattan and Iowa State).

The teams played a tight and entertaining first half. Spears hit her first five shots from the floor and scored 10 of CU's first 12 points, and the Buffaloes hit a solid 49 percent from the floor in the first 20 minutes (16-of-33). But the Rams stayed within striking distance. Although the Buffaloes never trailed in the game, Colorado State stayed within three to eight points throughout the first 20 minutes. CSU's Kandy Beemer and Bonnie Barbee each hit a pair of 3-pointers as CU's lead at halftime was just 42-35.

CSU cooled off considerably in the second half hitting just 29 percent (11-of-38) from the field. Richards also went to work, scoring 18 of her 25 points and grabbing six of her eight rebounds in the final 20 minutes.

"I started on the defensive end, but initially we just went right inside and just tried to establish a presence," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "I thought Kara [Richards] really dominated on the interior, she was phenomenal. I think the adjustments defensively gave this team the extra bounce, the extra step that they needed. I think the adjustments were big; not necessarily what I said, but what they did."

Coming off a poor performance from the free throw line against UCF in its season opener, making just 16 of 26, Colorado responded in a big way by making its first 17 free-throw attempts of the game and finishing 22-of-24 from the line. The 17 straight made to start the game were CU's best since its school record 19-of-19 performance against Nebraska on Feb. 7, 1987.

Facing her former team, sophomore guard Kelly Jo Mullaney scored 14 points and dished out six assists. The Buffaloes had a well rounded game from junior Bianca Smith who had nine points and a career-high eight rebounds.

Richards wasn't the only CU frontcourt player to have success on the blocks Wednesday. Freshman Julie Seabrook had nine points on 4-of-5 shooting and five rebounds while sophomore center Courtney Dunn had six points and four rebounds.

Beemer finished with 15 points and four assists to lead Colorado State while Barbee pitched in 13.

BOULDER – Colorado sophomore Brittany Spears scored a career-high and Coors Classic record 36 points, but UMass rallied from a late eight-point deficit to hand the Buffaloes a 70-62 loss in the first round of the 22nd Annual Coors Classic, Friday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

The loss puts Colorado (2-2) in Saturday's consolation game against Drexel (2-3) at 5 p.m. MST. Minnesota (5-1) defeated Drexel 74-50 in Friday's early game and will play UMass (3-2) in the championship game at 7:30 p.m. MST.

Spears' 36 points tied for the third best total in team history, matching Jasmina Ilic's total against Nebraska on Jan. 4, 2006, and just two off the school record of 38 held by current Director of Operations Tracy Tripp against Oklahoma State on Feb. 4, 1987 and Susan Horner against Weber State on Mar. 10, 1979.

Spears also set career-highs in field goals made (12) and attempted (25) and free throws made (9) and attempted (11). Her 25 field goal attempts tied a Coors Classic record.

Despite Spears' record night, Colorado struggled as whole from the field. The Buffaloes shot just 36 percent overall (22-of-61) and just 25 percent from 3-point range (7-of-28). UMass' zone defense caused some trouble for CU and led to rushed shots.

"When teams sit in zone, we have four shooters on the floor," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "We took shots too fast, and took dumb shots. UMass took advantage. We weren't taxing them defensively and didn't play on both ends of the floor."

Colorado trailed for nearly all of the first 27 minutes of the game, but took its first lead since the opening seconds at 50-48 on an Alyssa Fressle 3-point field goal that capped a 10-2 CU run with 13:07 remaining in the game.

Tied at 52 with 9:21 remaining, Colorado looked like it was beginning to pull away as the Buffs scored eight straight on a Spears layup and back-to-back 3-pointers by Spears and Bianca Smith.

UMass made the final and most important push though, outscoring Colorado 18-2 over the final 6:57 of the game. CU missed 7-of-8 down the stretch, gaining only a Spears layup which came with just 42 seconds remaining to end a string of 15 straight points by the Minutewomen.

"I wish we could play that game over again," Spears said. "We need to play better defense. We need more ball pressure and to use more time on offense. We are just rushing shots. We have to believe in each other."

UMass forward Teya Wright recorded a double-double with 24 points and 13 rebounds. Guards Kim Benton and Stefanie Gerardot each scored 12 points and were a combined 7-of-15 from 3-point range. The Minutewomen made 11 3-pointers, hitting 39 percent from downtown.

Fressle finished with 11 points, six rebounds and four steals. Smith had nine points and six rebounds. Spears added nine rebounds and four assists to her strong statline.

"We are in a similar position to where we were a year ago," McConnell-Miller said. "The sign of a really good team is one that is able to put the last possession, the last game behind them. That's what we have to do."

BOULDER – Drexel forward Gabriela Marginean scored 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half to lead Drexel to a 67-63 win over Colorado in the consolation game of the 22nd Annual Coors Classic Saturday at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Colorado (2-3), which dropped both games of its Classic for the first time in team history, fell for the second straight night after holding a late second half lead.

The Buffaloes led 56-49 with 6:33 remaining in the game when Drexel went on a 12-3 run over the next 2:11. Marginean made six consecutive free throws during that stretch and was a perfect 12-of-12 from the line during the game, tying a Coors Classic record and setting a mark for a CU opponent.

After CU's Brittany Spears tied the score at 61 with a pair of free throws, Marginean responded with a jumper to give the Dragons a 63-61 lead with 2:10 remaining.

Both teams traded missed shots and with 33 seconds remaining, Spears scored on a layup to tie the score at 63. Once again Marginean responded, giving the Dragons a 2-point lead with 17 seconds left. The Buffaloes never got the chance for a last shot to tie or win. Marginean, who added eight rebounds, closed out the game with a steal in the CU backcourt and went coast-to-coast for a layup and her 12th straight point.

Colorado led UMass 60-52 with just under seven minutes left on Friday before the Minutewomen ended the game on an 18-2 run.

Colorado freshman Alyssa Fressle had the best game of her young career in a losing effort. She scored a career-high 19 points on 8-of-14 from the floor, and scored in just about every way – 3-pointers, short jumpers, and layups in transition. Fressle filled out the box score nicely with four rebounds, three assists, three steals and topped it off with a blocked shot.

Senior Hannah Skildum finished with 10 points on 4-of-7 from the field, her first game in double-digits since last year's Coors Classic game against Siena (11). Senior Kara Richards had 12 points and four rebounds before fouling out with 4:48 remaining in the contest.

Spears, who was named to the five-player All-Tournament team, had 16 points and nine rebounds. She finished the weekend with Classic records for points (36) and field goals (12) in one game (both against UMass) and a 2-game record for field goals attempted (40).

Drexel kept the game close early at the line. The Dragons, who ranked second in NCAA Division I in free-throw percentage last year, hit their first 11 free throws and finished 12-of-14 for the first half. The problem facing Drexel was free throws were the only shots going down in the first half. The Buffaloes held Drexel to just four field goals – one off CU's opponent record for one half – and none over the final 12:51 of the first half.

The drought allowed Colorado to close the half on a 20-6 run and take a 29-21 advantage into the locker room, led by Fressle who scored 12 points in the first 20 minutes.

Colorado led by as many as 13 early in the second half (40-27) before Drexel chipped away at the CU lead. The Dragons shot 53 percent in the second half (16-of-30) and 88.5 percent from the free throw line for the game (23-of-26).

Drexel guard Jasmina Rosseel finished with 10 points and six rebounds. Andrea Peterson chipped in nine points and six rebounds.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. – Colorado was limited to a school record low 13 first half points and never recovered as Seton Hall claimed a 77-40 decision Tuesday evening at Walsh Gymnasium.

Colorado (3-4) trailed 43-13 at halftime in a period filled with missed shots and mistakes. The Buffaloes shot just 19 percent in the first half (5-of-27) and committed 12 turnovers.

Colorado missed its first six shots and added four turnovers as Seton Hall scored the first 11 points of the game. The Buffaloes didn't score until junior **Bianca Smith** hit a 3-pointer at the 15:08 mark of the first half.

Seton Hall (6-1) kept right on trucking along. The Pirates made 7-of-9 to open the game and 63 percent overall in the first half (17-of-27).

The Buffaloes, who have lost nine straight road games dating back to last season, struggled with Seton Hall's pressure defense and never could get into a rhythm. Most of CU's 12 first-half turnovers came on errand passes and the Pirates took advantage, outscoring the Buffaloes 16-2 off turnovers in the first 20 minutes.

"The caliber of (opponent) and the youth of our team is contributing to the outcome of these games, but right now we're looking like we don't have a solid point guard," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "Not that **Kelly Jo (Mullaney)** isn't a solid player or **Britney Blythe** isn't a solid point guard, but we're just not getting into (our offense) right now, we're totally on our heels half the time."

Seton Hall's defense held Colorado's top two scorers, **Brittany Spears** and **Kara Richards**, to just one point in the first half – a Spears' free throw. The duo was a combined 0-of-12 from the field, several of the misses coming from point-blank range.

CU's 13 first half points eclipsed the previous low of 14 for a first half, done twice, and most recently at Pacific on Nov. 18, 2004. It's the second lowest total regardless of half, trailing only the 10 scored in the second half of a game against Texas Tech on Jan. 17, 1998.

Spears finished with a team-high 13 points, most coming at the tail end of the second half. **Britney Blythe** scored a season-high seven points and had three rebounds off the bench while sophomore center **Courtney Dunn** had five points and three rebounds.

The Buffaloes fared better in the second half, scoring 27 points and hitting 43 percent, but it took a **Kelly Jo Mullaney** jumper in the key with one second remaining to get Colorado to 40, tying for the 10th lowest total in team history and the lowest since an 86-40 loss at Baylor on Feb. 22, 2006.

"It got away from us early. If we would have put forth the energy and execution that we did in the last 14 minutes, it's a different game," McConnell-Miller said. "(Seton Hall) got hot early and it gave them a little confidence. We looked so stiff and so methodical on open layups and shots. Seton Hall noticed it, the sign of an experienced team and a team that really wants it, and they attacked and came at us good."

Seton Hall dominated the front court, outrebounding the Buffaloes 52-24 and outscoring them in the paint 34-8. The Pirates were led by Noteisha Womack who recorded a double-double with 12 points and seven rebounds. Ebonie Williams and Nicole Emery each had 16 points for Seton Hall. Kandice Green had eight points and 10 rebounds off the bench.

BOULDER – Bianca Smith scored 21 points, nailing six 3-pointers to lead Colorado to a 71-49 win over UMKC Saturday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Smith, who had been hitting just 24.5 percent from 3-point range through seven games (12-of-49) hit her first four attempts and finished the night 6-of-8 from long range, the most accurate night from downtown in her career.

"That's hard work paying off," Smith said. "I've been in the gym shooting night in and night out."

Colorado (4-4) sprinted out to a 22-6 lead thanks to Smith's four first half 3-pointers. On the defensive end, the Buffaloes forced 12 UMKC turnovers in the first seven minutes of the game accounting for 12 points.

But after Smith's fourth 3-pointer at the 10:09 mark, the Buffaloes went cold for the rest of the half. CU missed its next nine shots, sinking only two free throws until Brittany Spears connected on a 3-pointer with 27 seconds remaining before halftime.

Once Colorado's shots stopped falling, UMKC (4-7) was able to climb back into the game. Chazny Morris and Heather Davis hit back-to-back 3-pointers to spark a 17-1 UMKC run during CU's shooting slump and a Davis layup with 42 seconds left tied the game at 24.

Spears' 3-pointer allowed the Buffaloes to take a 27-26 lead at halftime, but UMKC came right back in the second and led 33-29 with 16:50 remaining. Needing a spark, Smith hit her fifth 3-pointer and after a Spears steal, Kara Richards connected on a layup as CU retook the lead at 34-33.

After a Morris 3-point play briefly put UMKC back on top, the Buffaloes took over. Spears scored the next four points to give CU the lead for good as the Buffaloes outscored the Kangaroos 37-13 over the final 15:21 of the contest.

With Smith providing the first half fireworks, Spears and Richards stepped up to put the game away in the second half. Richards, who had three fouls in the first eight minutes of the game, scored 10 of her 15 points and grabbed six of her eight rebounds in the second period. Spears scored 12 of her 19 points in the second 20 minutes.

"It was a tale of two halves," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "The difference in the game was Kara being on the floor in the second half. We need to emphasize her being on the floor for us to be successful."

Spears added seven rebounds, three assists and three steals to her totals. Sophomore point guard Britney Blythe, making her first career start, added seven points and dished out a career-best five assists with no turnovers.

Morris led UMKC with a game-high 23 points and 10 rebounds.

BOULDER – Freshman Julie Seabrook had a big night off the bench, recording career highs with 12 points and 13 rebounds to lift Colorado to a 73-57 victory over Idaho State Tuesday night at the Coors Events/Conference Center.

Seabrook, replacing senior Kara Richards who fell into early foul trouble, recorded her first double-double in a season-best 27 minutes.

With the win, Colorado (6-4) records its first three-game winning streak of the season while moving to two games above .500 for the first time since opening the season with two wins.

Seabrook's double-double off the bench was key, but it was a team effort that led the Buffs to victory.

Four other Buffaloes also scored in double digits—the first time Colorado has had five players score in double digits this season. Sophomore Brittany Spears and Richards each tallied a team-high 14 points, Richards doing so in only 15 minutes of floor time. Spears also recorded her third double-double this season grabbing 13 rebounds. Junior Bianca Smith contributed 12 points, nine of which came from behind the 3-point line. Freshman Alyssa Fressle added 11 points of her own.

"I am happy with the balanced scoring," CU coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "Most important was the rebounding, assist-to-turnover ratio, and balanced scoring – all were positives for us."

The Buffaloes started and ended the game strong, never allowing the Bengals to take the lead in the game, but the Bengals gave the Buffs a scare early in the second half when they cut the Buffs' lead to only five.

Colorado showed Idaho State (3-10) that it meant business early with a layup from Richards only 15 seconds into the game. A 7-0 run gave Colorado a 19-8 lead at the 13:21 mark. Smith dished out back-to-back treys and Richards added two consecutive buckets from the paint as the Buffs began to pull away.

Richards, who scored more than half of the Buffs' first 19 points, recorded her second foul at the 9:56 mark, and that's when it was Seabrook's turn to step up and take over for Richards under the basket.

"I was happy to come in and fill Kara's shoes and step-up," Seabrook said.

It didn't take much time for Seabrook to make her presence known. Not long after fellow freshman Fressle put up three layups in a row, Seabrook kept the freshmen frenzy going by sinking two free throws and putting up a layup of her own. After yet another 3-pointer by Smith, Seabrook grabbed a rebound off a Fressle miss and scored on the put back to put the Buffs up 34-21 with 4:09 left in the first.

Colorado entered the second half with a 13-point cushion (39-26), but the Buffaloes soon saw their lead dwindle as the Bengals started out the second half just as quick as the Buffs had started out the first with a layup by Idaho State junior Oana Iacovita 17 seconds in.

Over the next 3:47, the Bengals went on 6-0 run as the Buffs shot 0-for-7 from the field during that span. The Bengals seemed to have the momentum as they came within just five points of the Buffs lead, but fouls would hurt Idaho State as Colorado recorded 17 of its 34 second-half points off of free throws. Colorado shot 17-for-28 from the line in the second.

Those 17 free throws proved key in helping Colorado regain a steady lead, as the Buffs finished the game with a 16-point advantage.

Three players led Idaho State by scoring in double digits. Freshman Sheila Adams and Colorado native, senior Cara Lambert, both came off the bench to contribute 25 combined points. Adams scored a career-high 15 points, including three baskets from behind the arc. Senior Michelle Grohs added another 13 points for the Bengals.

HONOLULU – Alyssa Fressle scored 16 points and dished out seven assists to lead Colorado to a 63-55 win over Pepperdine Saturday in the first game of the 2008 Paradise Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center on the University of Hawaii campus.

Colorado (7-4) wins its fourth-straight overall and ends a streak of 10 losses in a row away from Boulder dating back to January 2008.

Brittany Spears led all scorers with 18 points and eight rebounds. Kara Richards had 16 points and seven rebounds.

"Our last two games on the road we didn't play Colorado Basketball and we know we're so much better than that," Fressle said. "Being in Hawaii it's great not just off the court, but to also prove that we can win on the road."

Fressle, just three points and one assist off her career high, keyed big moments in each half for Colorado. She scored the first five points of a 7-0 run that gave Colorado its first lead at 14-12 in the first half and had big shots in the second as Pepperdine tried to close the gap.

Pepperdine led early 12-7 when Fressle made a baseline jumper to cut the lead to three. After a missed 3-point attempt by Pepperdine's Nakeya Isabell, Spears got the long rebound and immediately found Fressle on the break for the layup. Isabell fouled Fressle, who hit the free throw to tie the game at 12. The foul was costly for the Waves as it was Isabell's second and starting center and leading scorer Miranda Ayim was already on the bench with two of her own.

The Buffaloes took advantage with their best defensive half of the season. Pepperdine scored just one basket over the final 9:36 of the first half and the 17 points scored by the Waves was the lowest half total for a CU opponent this year. Richards scored eight straight points and Fressle hit a couple free throws as the Buffs extended their lead to nine at the half, 26-17.

"We played a very good Pepperdine team today," CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller said. "We had to work hard and grind that one out. (Ayim and Isabell) got into foul trouble early and our players responded on the defensive end, challenging shots. It was a great team effort."

It was Spears' turn early in the second half as the sophomore scored 10 of CU's first 12 points as the Buffaloes built a 14-point lead (38-24) with 16:15 remaining. But Ayim and Isabell returned to the lineup and kept the game close. Ayim scored 11 of her team-high 15 points in the second half as the Waves cut the CU lead down to 48-44 with 6:44 left.

Richards and Bianca Smith each hit layups to put Colorado back up by eight, but the Waves chipped back to a 5-point deficit at 52-47 with 4:28 remaining. After Spears hit a jumper, Pepperdine answered with a Jazmine Jackson free throw.

Pepperdine, pressuring the Colorado back court all day to the tune of 20 turnovers, looked to get the ball back late again as the Buffaloes were struggling to get a shot off. But Fressle came through one final time, as a 24-foot 3-pointer to beat the shot clock gave the Buffaloes some breathing room at 57-48 just 2:49 left in the game.

Just five players scored for the Buffaloes as Kelly Jo Mullaney had eight off the bench and Smith finished with five. Colorado had its best overall shooting performance of the season hitting 56.3 percent from the field (27-of-48) while holding Pepperdine to just 37.7 percent for the game (23-of-61).

"Alyssa and Brittany are two players we know we can go to and handle the pressure and make plays," McConnell-Miller said. "They have both really made the transition to understanding defensive concepts, stopping scorers and they know what we are trying to accomplish. We saw some great effort on the defensive end and a better understanding of what we are trying to do."

BOULDER- Colorado sophomore Britney Blythe netted a career-high 12 points off of a career-best four 3-pointers, but it was not enough to lift the Buffaloes as they fell to No. 6 (AP)/5 (WBCA) ranked Baylor, 63-50, at the Coors Events/Conference Center Saturday afternoon.

The game was much closer than the final score read as the Buffs (8-5, 0-1 Big 12) trailed the Lady Bears (13-1, 1-0 Big 12) by only two points (50-48) with 7 minutes, 11 seconds remaining in both teams' first conference game of the season. Up until that point, the score had been tied eight times and the lead had changed six times.

But the Lady Bears pulled away in the last 6:52 of the game, going on a 13-2 run.

Right from the get-go, the game would prove to be very intense, and the speed of play quick, for both teams. In the first 4:16 of the game, the Buffs jumped ahead to a 10-6 lead off back-to-back jumpers by junior Bianca Smith and sophomore Brittany Spears, followed by Blythe's first trey of the night and another 3-pointer from Spears.

Colorado went into halftime trailing Baylor 35-28, but came out on fire after the half as they went on a 14-1 run over 5:57 to open the second half. Spears started this run with a layup 21 seconds into the half. That's when Blythe went into action nailing three consecutive 3-pointers and earning a standing ovation from the announced crowd of 3,273. Up until today's game, Blythe was only 5-for-33 from behind the arc in her career and 1-for-12 on the season. But she changed those numbers today as she went 4-for-6 from 3-point range, totals also serving as career highs for both 3-point shots and overall from the floor.

Smith followed Blythe's impressive performance with a 3-pointer of her own to give the Buffaloes their biggest lead of the game (42-37), but that's when the tables turned and Baylor followed solid Colorado play with a 12-2 run of their own over the next 3:32. This run brought Baylor ahead 49-44 with less than 10 minutes remaining in the game and the Lady Bears would hold onto this lead until the final buzzer sounded.

The Buffaloes recorded six steals, two blocks, and forced 15 Baylor turnovers on the night, but their strong effort was not enough to stop the explosiveness down low of the Lady Bears who, led by junior Danielle Wilson (16 points), outscored CU 44-14 in the paint, including 18 second chance points and 14 points off fast breaks.

"Baylor's best offense is on second chance opportunities. A lot of their looks are not on what they ran, but on broken plays and missed shots," said CU head coach Kathy McConnell-Miller. "We're not a front court team and that's where (Baylor) gets their points—in the paint."

Richards finished with a career-high and team season-high 15 rebounds and added nine points. Spears had a team-high 14 points and had six rebounds and two steals. Fressle had eight points, four rebounds and two assists.

Despite the outcome of the game, neither McConnell-Miller nor her players were upset with the team's effort. And they will look for the mental toughness the team showed against Baylor to carry them into the next stretch of games as they take on three more Big 12 South teams, all of which are currently ranked both in the Associated Press and WBCA Coaches polls

STILLWATER, Okla. – A long scoring drought cost Colorado in its season-opener against Baylor and another prolonged drought was the deciding factor again, but this time a lot earlier.

Colorado didn't score for the first 7 minutes, 49 seconds of the first half which allowed No. 22 (AP & WBCA) ranked Oklahoma State to finish the period on a 19-0 run as the Cowgirls claimed a 79-43 decision in a Big 12 Conference game Wednesday night at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Buffaloes (8-6, 0-2) shot just 28 percent in the first half (7-of-25), missing their final seven shots and committing six turnovers. CU had twice as many turnovers (14) as field goals in the period which resulted in 15 points for the Cowgirls.

Oklahoma State (12-3, 1-1 Big 12) meanwhile made 51 percent in the first half and an Andrea Riley 3-pointer to open the second to actually extended the Cowgirl run to 22-0 before **Brittany Spears** finally ended the Buffaloes drought with a 3-pointer with 17:57 remaining.

Colorado's top two scorers – Spears and **Kara Richards** – were held to a combined 20 points on 8-of-29 from the floor. Despite a season-low in field goal percentage, Richards (4-of-12) was CU's bright spot on the low post equaling a career-high with 15 rebounds, which she initially set Saturday against Baylor. She added nine points.

Spears led Colorado with 11 points, eight of which came in the second half, and recorded six rebounds, two blocks and two steals.

Oklahoma State scored the first eight points of the game as Riley and Taylor Hardeman each hit 3-pointers. **Alyssa Fressle** responded for CU with a 3-pointer of her own and a Richards layup settled the Buffaloes down at the start.

The Cowgirls, who made 7-of-11 from the field out of the gate, built their lead up to 17-9 but the Buffaloes were able to claw back. Spears scored her first jumper at 9:47 to cut the OSU lead to 21-15, but Tegan Cunningham cashed in on a turnaround jumper and scored a transition bucket after a CU turnover to give OSU a 10 point advantage.

The transition game served Oklahoma State well. Led by the All-American candidate Riley, the Cowgirls outscored CU 20-4 on the break. Riley recorded her fifth double-double of the season with 18 points and 12 assists. Kristin Hernandez was the game's high-scorer with 19 off the bench for OSU

Fressle, who finished with nine points, scored at 7:49 on a baseline jumper to cut Oklahoma State's lead to 25-17, but that would be it for the Buffaloes for the half. Hernandez hit back-to-back 3-pointers out of the 8:00 media time out as OSU began its run.

Julie Seabrook had four points and five rebounds off the bench. **Bianca Smith** and **Britney Blythe** each had five points.
