

Buffs earn first Big 12 win of season

Smith sinks seven 3-pointers at Missouri

Junior Bianca Smith tied a Colorado school record Saturday in a 61-56 victory at Missouri by making seven 3-point field goals as the Buffs broke into the win column for the first time this season in Big 12 Conference play.

Smith scored 25 points in the game -- one off her career best -- and made seven of 11 3-point attempts. Smith and several former Buffs already shared the record for most 3-pointers in a game, but no one would have predicted she would hit a hot streak again Saturday.

Smith had made just three of 22 3-point attempts in the Buffs' four road losses this season. She did most of her damage in the first half, going 5-for-5 from behind the arc.

"I think I took a three on the left wing in the first half and I kind of got bumped and felt like it was a foul and the ball still went in," Smith said during a postgame interview with KKZN radio. "At that point I figured, tonight may be a good night."

The Buffs overcame a 10-point deficit in the first half and led by 10 points early in the second half. They needed the cushion.

Coach Kathy McConnell-Miller's team has been dogged by long, scoreless stretches this season, and the Buffs were forced to fight through another one against the Tigers. CU went more than 5 minutes at one point without scoring and registered just nine points in the final 10 minutes of the game.But they won for the 50th time in McConnell-Miller's tenure as coach with defense, holding the Tigers to just 13 points in the final 10 minutes.

"I'm really proud of them right now," McConnell-Miller said in her postgame radio interview. "There was a stretch where I thought we got up and probably got a little bit careless. ... I thought the maturity tonight was a result of the first four games where they just battled and battled and battled."

McConnell-Miller is now 50-61 at CU midway through her fourth season in Boulder. The victory put Missouri in the conference cellar and allowed the Buffs to climb out, at least for a few days.

Colorado was desperate for a win after starting Big 12 play 0-4 with all four losses coming against teams ranked in the top-25. McConnell-Miller said her staff continued to stay positive through the fourgame stretch reinforcing successes within those four losses, and it seemed to pay off.

The Buffs had a little more confidence in Mizzou Arena than they do most nights on the road. They have now won five conference road games since 2005 and three of them have come on the Tigers' home

court.

Smith wasn't the only CU player with a strong outing. Sophomore Brittany Spears, the team's leading scorer this season, produced her fifth double-double of the year with 11 points and 13 rebounds. Spears and Smith both played all 40 minutes for the Buffs.

The Buffs improved to 9-8 overall and 1-4 in conference play.
