




BUDGETARY STATUS

For 2007-08, CU Athletic Department's budget was ranked:

- 10th of the Big 12 schools
- 56 of 66 BCS schools



BUDGETARY STATUS



By comparison, CU Athletic Department's budget was:

- Slightly less than one-half of the largest Big 12 budget
- Approximately one-third of the largest BCS school budget
- In the **bottom quartile** of all BCS budgets



Costs have increased.

Financial aid/Scholarships:

tuition and room and board increases have outpaced inflation



REVENUES




- Football ticket sales are over a quarter of total Department revenues
- Price level one ticket prices have remained flat since the 2004 season
- Price levels 2-5 have remained flat since 2005

SCHOLARSHIPS

All academic departments benefit from scholarship money

Many people assume athletic scholarships are simply free tuition for athletes. In reality, the Athletic Department pays CU's schools & departments the full tuition directly.

The football team's majors alone include economics, finance, ethnic studies, sociology, architectural engineering, film studies, international affairs, and many others.



SCHOLARSHIPS

For the 2008 season, the Athletic Department funded 230 scholarships total, two-thirds of which were for out-of-state students. The football program had 81 scholarship recipients, and 61 of those were out-of-state.

Between scholarship money and other traffic football brings to the campus, the university itself is the biggest beneficiary of the football program.


^{*}Tuition figures are for Arts & Sciences. Tuition rates vary and A&S represents the lower end, where business school tuition is \$9,450 (resident) and \$28,600 (non-resident) in 08/09 representing the higher end

While price levels stadium-wide have not increased since 2005:

- In-state tuition costs have increased 70%
- Out-of-state tuition costs have increased 23%
- Room and board costs have increased 28%

Premium season tickets will also be increased by \$5 per game




HISTORIC PRICE PLAN

- Price level 5 is back to approximately the same level it was in 1995 (\$175)
- Price level 1 has not changed since 2004
- Price levels 2-4 have not changed since 2005



INFLATIONARY EFFECTS



The CPI compound average increase was 2.7% per year over this five year span.

Price level 1 and 2 tickets were set at \$50 for the 2004 season

- To achieve the same real price as in 2004, tickets would need to be \$58 in 2009.
- Remember, even if CU does not change the ticket price, it still must fund costs that are rising with (or more than) inflation.
- Between 2005 and 2008, season ticket holders have saved \$90 because prices have not been increased with inflation.



COMPETITORS

Folsom Field's stadium capacity is approximately:

57% of Texas

65% of Oklahoma

65% of Texas A&M


63% of Nebraska

79% of Missouri

 With a comparatively smaller stadium, it is a challenge for CU to generate the same level of revenue necessary to compete in the Big 12. However...



2008 BIG 12 TICKET PRICES (STADIUM BOWL SEATING; DONATION INCLUDED)



- Kansas reseats by lifetime giving so donation is unknown and not included
- Oklahoma has an initial gift of \$32,000 for seats between 35s and is therefore not included.
- Baylor, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and CU have lower rates for less popular levels in each section
- -Texas Tech has also announced their new plan.




WHAT IS THE MOST IMPORTANT FACTOR FOR CU FANS WHEN PURCHASING FOOTBALL TICKETS




