Working Overtime

Two weeks into the season and teams from the Big 12 have been involved in two overtime games (Iowa State/Toledo - 3OT; Texas Tech/UTEP). Including a 2-0 record in 2006, Big 12 teams are 7-3 all-time in non-conference overtime tilts.

Big 12 BCS Success

The 2005 season marked the third straight and fifth time in the last six years that a Big 12 team played in the BCS National Championship game. Since the inception of the BCS, the Big 12 is 2-3 in the National Championship game and leads all conferences with its five appearances. Texas (2005) and Oklahoma (2000) have won titles, while Nebraska (2001) and Oklahoma (2003, '04) were denied crowns.

Big 12 Preseason Media Poll

Media covering the conference have correctly predicted the division champions in three of the last four seasons (UT/CU-05, OU/KSU-03, CU/OU-02). Last year the media accurately predicted Texas to win the South and Colorado to win the North. Overall the top spot in each division has been accurately picked by the league's media corps 11-of-20 times. Following are this season's projections.

BAYLOR (1-1, 0-0)

This Week: Washington State (Seattle)
Next Week: Army

Wide receiver Trent Shelton has caught at least one pass in 35 straight games, setting a school record. Shelton established a career high with 158 yards receiving, his first career 100-yard receiving game. His 158 yards were the most by a Baylor player since Reggie Newhouse had 173 yards against Kansas State in 2002.

Cornerback C.J. Wilson is the first Baylor player with a multiple-interception game since Samir Al-Amin had two against Southern Illinois in 2001.

The Baylor defense forced five turnovers in the win over Northwestern State, while the offense had five TD passes.



COLORADO (0-2, 0-0)

This Week: Arizona State
Next Week: at Georgia

The Buffs have scored all 20 of their points this season in the first half.

The 73-yard punt by redshirt freshman Matt DiLallo was the longest-ever by a CU freshman (true or redshirt) and tied for the 12th-longest in school history.

Colorado's rushing defense has allowed just 65 yards on 69 attempts. It is the third straight year that the Buffs have held their first two opponents under the century mark.

The Buffs have scored in 212-consecutive games, the sixth-longest streak in the nation.



IOWA STATE (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: at Iowa
Next Week: at Texas

Stevie Hicks moved up to ninth on ISU's career rushing chart with 2,276 career yards. He tallied his 10th career 100-yard rushing game with a 109-yard effort in the win over UNLV. Iowa State is 8-2 when Hicks rushes for 100-plus yards.

Iowa State defense has held the opposition to 119 yards rushing through two games.

Dan McCarney is 25-9 since 1998 against non-conference foes.

Bret Meyer is third in career completions (407) and passing yards (5,239) at ISU. He has completed at least 50 percent of his passes in 14 consecutive games.



KANSAS (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: at Toledo (Friday)
Next Week: South Florida

Kansas' eight-game home winning streak is the longest at Memorial Stadium since the 1967-68 seasons, when the Jayhawks also won eight straight under then-head coach Pepper Rogers.

KU held ULM to 51 yards rushing, marking the 11th time in the last 14 games that the KU defense has held its opponent to under 100 yards rushing for a game.

Senior running back Jon Cornish has tallied back-to-back 100-yard rushing games with 140 vs. Northwestern State and 103 against ULM.



KANSAS STATE (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: Marshall
Next Week: Louisville

Justin McKinney returned the opening kickoff 88 yards for his first career return for a touchdown. It also marked the first time a K-State player has returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown since Red Elder returned a 74-yarder against Oklahoma in 1936.

Kansas State has now scored in 117 straight games, dating back to the 1996 Colorado game.

The Wildcats have scored at least one special teams touchdown in three straight games and in four of their last eight games, dating back to the 2005 Texas Tech contest.

Kansas State's shutout of FAU was its first since 2003 against Iowa State. The K-State defense held the Owls to 200 total yards last Saturday.



MISSOURI (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: at New Mexico
Next Week: Ohio

Marcus Bacon garnered Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors after turning in an 11-tackles, one-interception, and a forced fumble performance in the win over Ole Miss.

Through two games, Daniel has thrown for 563 yards, six TDs (with zero interceptions), and has completed 65.3 percent of his passes for a passer rating of 158.46.

Through two games, Mizzou ranks among the nation's Top 10 in six different statistical categories: Total Defense (2nd – 156.00); Total Offense (5th – 530.00); Tackles for Loss (T-5th – 9.50); Scoring Defense (7th – 7.00); Pass Defense (8th – 106.50); Pass Efficiency Defense (9th – 83.85).



NEBRASKA (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: at USC
Next Week: Troy

Nicholls State did not complete a pass against Nebraska, marking the 10th time in school history an NU opponent has not completed a pass. The last time was Oklahoma State in 1992.

Zac Taylor became the seventh Husker player to surpass 3,000 career passing yards. He ranks seventh in school history with 3,142 career passing yards.

Senior tight end Matt Herian caught four passes for 38 yards, and now has 60 receptions in his career, just one reception shy of the NU tight end record of 61 receptions by Jerry List from 1970 to 1972.



OKLAHOMA (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: at Oregon
Next Week: Middle Tennessee State

Oklahoma's win over Washington came on Bob Stoops' 46th birthday. It was the second time (2-0) the Sooners played on their coach's birthday.

Adrian Peterson carried 32 times for 165 yards against Washington. The junior moved up to No. 6 on the school career rushing list and now has 3,337 yards. He rushed for a pair of touchdowns in the game to bump his career total to 32, good for No. 9 in OU history.

Reggie Smith registered a 62-yard punt return against Washington. It was the longest of his short career as OU's punt returner. In just two games in that role, he has returned nine punts for an average of 15.7 per return. Last season, the Sooners averaged 7.4 yards per punt return.



OKLAHOMA STATE (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: Florida Atlantic
Next Week: at Houston

One week after returning the opening kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown, a punt 41 yards and an interception 21 yards, True freshman Perrish Cox set up Oklahoma State's second-quarter touchdown with a 49-yard return of an Arkansas State quick kick.

Nine different Cowboys have reached the end zone through two games in 2006.

OSU has scored 38 points in the second quarter of its first two games. Last season, the Cowboys scored 61 second-quarter points all season.

The Cowboys have scored in nine of 10 possessions in the red zone this season, all TDs.



TEXAS (1-1, 0-0)

This Week: at Rice
Next Week: Iowa State

Texas had its winning streak stopped at 21 games. It will go in the books as the second-longest in school history, trailing only a 30-game run from 1968-1970.

UT has held its opponents scoreless on the opening drive in the last 18 consecutive games.

Jamaal Charles reached 1,000 career rushing yards in the Ohio State game and now has 1,025.

Through the first two games of the season the Texas defense has held opponents to a combined 87 yards rushing.



TEXAS A&M (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: Army (San Antonio)
Next Week: Louisiana Tech

Sophomore Jorvorskie Lane's four rushing touchdowns in the win over UL-Lafayette were the most by an Aggie since Darren Lewis had four rushing scores against SMU in 1990. Lane's effort ties for second-most in a single game in school history with Lewis.

A&M has held opponents to 145 passing yards through the first two games.

The Aggies held the Cajuns to 17 yards passing. UL Lafayette quarterbacks combined to complete 2-for-12. The 17 yards allowed passing is the lowest given up by the Aggies since Arkansas failed to gain any passing yards (0-3 attempts/completions) on Nov. 16, 1991.



TEXAS TECH (2-0, 0-0)

This Week: at TCU
Next Week: Southeastern Louisiana

Quarterback Graham Harrell is averaging 359 passing yards over his first two career games and has completed 73.3 percent of his passes.

Safety Darcel McBath registered his first two career interceptions in the win over UTEP. He grabbed a deflected pass on UTEP's first overtime possession, setting up the Red Raiders' win on a field goal.

Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week, Alex Trlica's career-long 49-yard field goal in the extra period gave the Red Raiders a 38-35 win. He holds the school and Big 12 record for career PATs made with 123 and no misses.
