FSN NATIONAL BROADCAST: Friday's Colorado/Oregon State game will be joined in progress due to the University of Denver hockey telecast on FSN Rocky Mountain. Of the 18 networks covering the CU/OSU game, only FSN Rocky Mountain and Comcast Chicago will be joined in progress. FSN Rocky Mountain will re-air the CU/OSU game immediately following the live broadcast.

SERIES WITH OREGON STATE: The Buffaloes are 5-1 all-time against the Beavers having last played in 2004 when OSU took a 98-87 victory. This is coach Bzdelik's first-ever meeting against Oregon State.

CU IN THE BIG 12/PAC-10 HARWOOD SERIES: CU is 0-2 in the series with both losses coming against Stanford (76-62 in 2008; 67-43 in 2007). Oregon State is also 0-2 losing to Iowa State (71-64 in 2007; 63-50 in 2008). Over the three years, the Pac-10 holds a slim 13-12 edge.

OSU UPDATE: The Beavers bring a 2-3 mark into Friday's game with wins over South Dakota (62-47) and on the road against George Washington, 64-57. OSU returns nine letterwinners and four starters from its CBI title team that went 18-18 in Craig Robinson's first year at the helm. OSU went 12-7 at home last year.

BROADCAST: All Colorado men's basketball games can be heard live on KKZN AM 760. Mark Johnson will deliver play-by-play with Charles Johnson color commentary. Live internet audio of all CU basketball games is available on BuffsRadio, a subscription service through CUBuffs.com. Live internet video streaming of Sunday's game is available on BuffsTV, also a subscription service through CUBuffs.com. QUICKLY: Even though CU broke an 18-game road losing skid when they defeated Chaminade, 73-58 at the EA Sports Maui Invitational (the NCAA later ruled it was road game), the Buffs still have an 18-game skid against Division I opponents on the road. CU's last road win came on Dec. 22, 2007 at Colorado State, 73-70 -- CU's opponent Dec. 10.

MAUI INVITATIONAL WRAP: The Buffaloes lost a pair of close games in their first-ever visit at the EA Sports Maui Invitational falling to Gonzaga, 76-72 and Arizona, 91-87 (overtime). CU defeated Chaminade on day three, 73-58. In the first game against the Bulldogs, four players scored double-digits with Cory Higgins scoring a

team-high 19 points with six rebounds. The following day, the Buffs, again placed four players in double-figures with Higgins and Alec Burks scoring 28 and 20 points, respectively. On day three, the Buffs received 13 points each from Burks and Marcus Relphorde against Chaminade.

WHAT'S AHEAD: CU returns home to play Colorado Christian on Monday, Dec. 7 at 7 p.m. The Buffs are 1-0 against CCU (last played in 2007). After that, CU will travel to in-state rival Colorado State, Thursday, Dec. 10, 7:30 p.m. CU holds an 87-33 advantage. Since 2000, the Buffs are 7-2 against the Rams and have won the last two games. Coach Bzdelik is 6-0 all-time against CSU.

BUFF NOTES (individual): Austin Dufault recorded his first career double-double (14 points, 11 rebounds); he's the first CU player to tally a double-double since Cory Higgins last year (Western State, 24 pts., 10 rebounds) • Nate Tomlinson scored a career-best 20 points; first CU player other than Higgins and Dwight Thorne to score 20 or more in a game since Richard Roby scored 22 at Oklahoma State (Feb. 6, 2008) • Tomlinson had a career-high eight assists against Gonzaga and Chaminade, also had a career-best five steals against the Silverswords • CU placed a pair of 20-point scorers against Arizona (Higgins 28, Tomlinson 20), that's twice this year with a pair w/ a least 20+ a game (the other, Texas Southern) • Alec Burks tallied 19 points against Arizona, his second highest scoring game and seventh game over double-digits • Associate Head Coach has replaced Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik four of the seven games this season due to family concerns. McClain is 2-2, however Coach Bzdelik is credited with the wins/losses.

TEAM NOTES: Colorado's 78-54 over San Francisco

saw some stellar performances not highlighted in the final box score. Nate Tomlinson and Marcus Relphorde each led the Buffs in assists with six apiece. That's a school-first since Dec. 19, 2003 (2003-04) against Tennessee State • Austin Dufault swatted a career-best three shots • Cory Higgins made his first eight shots against the Dons (first miss 15:49, second half). He went 6-for-6 in the first half • CU shot a first half best .615 from the field (16-of-26) • CU committed only six turnovers against USF, the third time this season with single-digits turnovers. That's the lowest since five back on Dec. 2, 2005 (Cal Poly) • Keegan Hornbuckle had a season-best three assists.

HIGGINS UPDATE: Cory Higgins has led the team in scoring six of seven games (one shared); netted his fifth 20-plus scoring effort with 28 points against Arizona, his third highest scoring game and has 17 career 20-point effort of career • He has 949 career points (28th at CU) and has started every game as a Buff (70), ranking 16th • 13th in career steals (106) • 17th in minutes played (2.451) • 31st in assists (170) • Last season was one of 13 players nationally to lead team in 5 categories • 2008-09 All-Big 12 Third Team; 1st Big 12-only steals (1.9 apg.).

KEEP AN EYE ON: Alec Burks has started all seven games and has netted over 10 or more points in every game so far. With 109 points, he ranks fourth behind CU greats Chauncey Billups (162, 1995-96); Emmett Lewis (131, 1975-76); Richard Roby (114, 2004-05) in their rookie campaign after seven games. Billups, Roby and Lewis have at least made it to nine straight games of 10 or more points. Burks is also shooting .559 percent (33-of-59) from the field, good enough for second on the team.

THREE-YEAR SUCCESS-SO FAR: Coach Bzdelik has 101 career collegiate wins • CU scored 80 points in four of seven games this season (previously 80+ five games in first two years) • Team has shot 50 percent or better in 11 of 14 halves; 53 3-pointers after seven games, is a school-best • Team shooting .515 after seven games from field, a best in Coach Bzdelik's three years • As of Nov. 30, CU is 14th nationally in FG percentage.

CLOSE CALLS: During the last three years, the CU men's team has suffered 44 losses. If you take a closer look, 22 of those losses were by single-digits, an average of 4.6 points.

2009-10: 2 games (8 points, 4.0 ppg.)

2008-09: 11 games (three non-conference, eight Big 12 games): 50 points (4.5 ppg.)

2007-08: nine games (three non-conference, six Big 12 games): 43 total points (4.8 ppg.).

FRESHMAN STARTERS: In his first three years, Coach Bzdelik has started at least one freshman in the starting line up on opening night. Against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Alec Burks started (10 pts., three assists, two rebounds). Cory Higgins started his first game (Nov. 9, 2007) with a 10-point, five-rebound, three-assist performance against New Mexico. Last year, Austin Dufault (13 pts.) and Nate Tomlinson (12 pts.) started against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

NEW UNIFORMS: The 2009-10 season marks the first time in 19 years the Colorado men's basketball team will don new home uniforms. This season's new look will be silver, a first since the 1990-91 season. They also wore black and silver for both home and away games. This season, the 2009-10 Buffs will have silver, gold and black jerseys.

ENTERING 2009-10: This will be the third year of head coach Jeff Bzdelik and his staff. Here's a brief synopsis who and what is returning for the 2009-10 season:

OUT FOR SEASON: Freshman guard Shannon Sharpe will miss the 2009-10 basketball season with season-ending knee surgery after injuring his left knee during pre-season workouts. Sharpe successfully had a microfracture procedure. Sharpe, a 6-1, 200-pound guard from Corona, Calif. is one of four true freshmen on the 2009-10 roster. He will be medically redshirted.

DEFENDING THE OPPOSITION (Scoring Defense): In the last two years under Coach Bzdelik, CU's defense has allowed the opposition an average of 66 points per game (67.5: 2008-09; 64.4: 2007-08). That two-year total ranks only second to the 1980-81 season (64.5 ppg.) and 1979-80 (67.3 ppg.). Those two years averaged out to 65.9 ppg.

BIG 12 AGE AVERAGES: With only one senior on the Colorado roster, the men's team is the second youngest school in the Big 12 Conference. The following breakdown is courtesy of Mike Noteware of Oklahoma State. These averages are as of Oct. 15, 2009.

The "experience" category basically is the average number of years the members of the team have been playing (i.e. A senior is given a 3, a junior a 2, a sophomore a 1 and a freshman a 0). The findings did not take into account redshirt years, and it's obviously not based on Division I experience, since a juco transfer would be assigned a 2 just like a third-year junior. Missouri's Tyler Stone is the youngest player in the Big 12 (born Sept. 8, 1991), while Brady Morningstar of Kansas is the oldest (born Jan. 23, 1986).

DEFENSE THROUGH THE YEARS: In his six years as a collegiate coach and two-plus seasons in the NBA, head coach Jeff Bzdelik has installed playing defense as a major part of the game. Here's a look at his teams over the years. His 2005-06 season at Air Force was a nation's best in scoring defense of all 970 collegiate schools in Division I (326), D-II (265), and D-III (379).

CAPTAINS NAMED: Colorado men's basketball head coach Jeff Bzdelik announced that senior Dwight Thorne II and junior Cory Higgins were named captains for the 2009-10 season. Both earned the honor for the second straight year. Thorne II, the lone senior on the team, enters his senior campaign coming off his best season-to-date finishing second in team scoring (12.0 ppg.), steals (35), made field goals (128) and made free throws (70). He was the team leader with 45 3-pointers. Higgins, originally from Danville, Calif., also enters the new season after a stellar sophomore campaign that earned him an All-Big 12 Conference third team selection. Higgins was also associated with elite company last year as one of 13 players nationally ranked first or second on their team in five major statistical categories (points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks). He was the only sophomore on that list. Last season, he averaged a team-best 17.4 points per game.

BIG 12 PLAY SETBACKS: Winning on the road is sometimes a difficult task, especially in the Big 12. CU has lost 29-straight Big 12 Conference road games since Feb. 5, 2006. All eight games in 2008-09, 2007-08 and 2006-07; and the last five games of the 2005-06 season.

vs. RANKED OPPONENTS: The Buffaloes have lost eight straight games to nationally ranked opponents dating back to the 2006-07. Their last win came in Boulder against then-No. 18/19 Oklahoma State, 84-75 (Feb. 15, 2007).

ON THE ROAD vs. RANKED FOES: CU has fallen on the road to ranked opponents 25-straight times. CU's last win on the road came at No. 20 Texas Tech, 80-78 (Jan. 11, 1997).

The Buffs have lost 32-straight nationally ranked games away from Boulder, including 25 on the road, seven on neutral courts. Their last road win against a nationally ranked school came at No. 20 Texas Tech, 80-78, Jan. 11, 1997; last win over a top-10 opponent on the road: never.

You're entering your third year, what's the one thing you are looking forward to this year?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if our players improve on a daily basis and play collectively up to their potential."

The team looks bigger and stronger. Was each student-athlete responsible for his own off-season workout?

"It's the direct result of having a weight room for basketball (at the Events Center) and having a strength and conditioning coach just for basketball. That piece has been sorely missing from this program and we now have it."

What's the difference from this year compared to last year with your team?

"We didn't have success on the scoreboard last year because we weren't deep enough, strong enough, mature or experienced enough. We have gotten deeper because of the five additional players, in addition to Trent Beckley (Beckley missed all of last season with a stress fracture in his lumbar spine). We have gotten stronger because of the weight room and with the strength coach coupled with the dedication of our players since last April. We are now a little bit more experienced based of the number of quality minutes of all our young players received last year and are little more mature."

Is this team better than the perception with only one senior?

"We are getting better, there's no question in my mind. I'm really excited about coaching this basketball team. I finally can coach; I think my first two years were spent with a lot of energy, time and emotion helping build the facilities, recruiting, drumming up support for the program; creating a culture that's positive and now a lot of those pieces are in place. So it's about

developing our basketball team. Pretty much all my energy and focus will be, opposed to just part of it."

Four returning starters averaged at least 30 or more minutes a year ago. Will that happen again?

"Not really, that was born out of necessity, but the days of Cory Higgins and Dwight Thorne playing 37 minutes a game are gone."

Your thoughts on senior guard Dwight Thorne?

"Maturity, energy ... to me he's the face of the Colorado program in terms of what you would want a Colorado basketball player to be like both on and off the court."

Your thoughts on junior guard Cory Higgins?

"One of the nation's best players at his position. Cory also leads by example; he has a quiet demeanor in some ways camouflages his intense fierce competitiveness."

Sum up your newcomer class (four freshman, one transfer)?

"They're all going to contribute. From a coaching perspective, the depth now is a player can't take a possession off, if they do, they're coming out. In the past, I would walk down to the bench and look, and I would walk back to my seat. I don't have to rant and rave, and be boisterous. With this group, I like what I see, I enjoy it."

Entering the season, a high percentage of scoring (86.9%), rebounding (90.3%) among other stats return. How does that play into the 2009-10 outlook?

"It's what I envisioned for this program. What really excites me is that you are going to be saying the same thing a year from now will only be one senior. It's what fuels my cautious optimism about the future of Colorado basketball. I say cautious because we're in the Big Nasty, the Big 12 ... everybody is good. It's a beast."

What do you like about your non-conference schedule?

"Anybody who says anything negative about our schedule doesn't understand. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has everyone coming back from last year; the Maui Invitational is a monster; San Francisco has one of the top power forwards in the nation who's in a senior; Oregon State is picked at the higher echelon of the Pac-10; Miami OH is always a perennial threat to win the MAC and are extremely well-coached with a great basketball tradition; Tulsa is rated in the pre-season top-25 and they have everyone coming back; at Colorado State, 'you don't think they're going to have Moby packed for that game?'; Cal State Northridge almost beat Memphis in the NCAA Tournament first round last year. Northridge has three starters returning, two of their top players come off the bench and they signed five junior college transfers. If we can have a winning record with this kind of schedule, we'll be in contention for some kind of postseason play."

What will constitute a successful season for you?

"The winning and losing will take care of itself if my team plays to its fullest potential."

Coach Quotes - Game-by-Game**Nov. 13 vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff (W, 88-72)****Associate Head Coach Steve McClain**

ON THE WIN – “I thought we played with energy. I thought we played with passion and played through mistakes. When we would make a mistake, I wouldn’t see guys getting down on themselves.. I saw guys down there picking each other up. As I told the team, we did some good things and we did some bad things. You only play 30 games in a season, and every time you have choice, win or lose, and I thought there were some really good things, but like any team in the country we have some things to work on. No game is easy this time of year. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has their whole team back from last year so we knew they would come in and be a good challenge. I give our kids credit for giving a good gap at half time and then finishing the game.”

ON FILLING IN FOR COACH JEFF BZDELIK – “We were prepared all week, it wasn’t like today I said let’s change things. I think it was easy for us because of the fact that coach lets us do so much in practice. For the guys it wasn’t that much of a shock. Our players handled it well. I told Cory (Higgins) before the game that I am going to coach to my personality and they see that every day in practice. I have always believed that if you don’t have that passion, then how do you expect your team to? We talked to the kids about bringing energy and I wanted to bring that too.”

Nov. 16 vs. Coppin State (W, 82-58)**Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik**

GENERAL – “We need to sustain our energy. In game one against Arkansas-Pine Bluff we played a good 20 minutes and today it was about 27 minutes. We need some improvement, we will just keep working.”

ON SECOND HALF – “That’s where we have to show maturity. We have to sustain for 40 minutes. We are not going to shoot the ball all the time like we started shooting tonight. Offense is a variable and defense and the effort has to be there all 40 minutes.”

Nov. 18 vs. Texas Southern (W, 88-77)**Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik**

On the Student Section – “I want to thank our students. Our students are awesome, they really are. We need them and they are a big part of our basketball team. We are going to play hard, and we are going to play with enthusiasm and passion. We are going to do the best we can. We really appreciate our students and our fans. We are going to give it everything we have.”

On Rebounding – “We have to rebound the basketball. We are playing a dangerous game right now, just trying to outscore teams. We have to get stops and we have to rebound the ball. We have to do a better job in both of those areas. We got beat off the dribble. We stood around on the defensive glass. It’s something we work on first thing every day in practice. That is the big thing we have to do better; rebound and contain the ball.”

Nov. 23 Gonzaga (L, 76-72)**Associate Head Coach Steve McClain**

On the game – “It became a back and forth game. When they got it back even, it was you have to score or they are going to score. I thought (Gonzaga guard) Matt Bouldin was going to try to win the game for them and he made a big shot. Yet I thought our guys made some big shots, stepped up and made some big plays. It was a battle. It was Big 12-type game out there. Like I told the kids, I walked out of the locker room for the first time since I’ve been at Colorado and felt like our kids believed we were going to win that game. At halftime, I knew they were going to come back. That team isn’t where they are at because they quit. I knew they’d come back and be even, and we would have to fight. But I give our kids lots of credit. I thought we showed passion. I thought we were prepared. They made a shot where we didn’t. We had a couple turnovers, but again, that’s easy to say when you’re sitting on the sideline. Give them credit, they found a way to win and we didn’t.”

On Colorado’s performance – “We love our young players. (Cory) Higgins is going to be a really good player. Alec’s (Burks) going to be a very good player. Again, our young players looked like they belonged out there. They weren’t intimidated by it. Alec got a couple charges that I felt could have gone either way. But you know what, I know this: you expect your team to compete and leave it all on the court and I think our kids did that. We got a nice run going early, our kids kept their composure and got up, yet you knew they’d come back. I think Cory knows he’s got help out there and it probably came down to one play. We pushed it, we had Casey (Crawford) wide open here, but the ball goes in and out. If we go up three it might have changed the whole thing. But he at least shot the ball like he believed he was going to make it and you live with the misses. I’m not going to fault our effort. We played like we believed in CU today.”

Nov. 24 Arizona (L, 91-87, overtime)**Associate Head Coach Steve McClain**

General – “When it looked like we were out of it, we found a way to get to overtime, we found a way. We got up three, and then we couldn’t make just that one play to get a stop. You always come back to the mistakes on the offensive end, but the mistakes that kill you are on the defensive end. I guarantee you most people thought that when we were down eight at the end of regulation that the game was over. We had some big steals and some big shots and we’re right there. I don’t know, I told the coaches that I don’t know what to say to them because we took charges, we did some things you have to do to win that game, and yet it doesn’t guarantee it. You have to just keep fighting.”

On Colorado’s performance – “Cory (Higgins) made some big plays, he hit some big free throws when he had never stood there and had to do that. You got to have some guts and he had them. Matt Bouldin did that and I thought Nic Wise, when the game was there, he wanted the ball in his hands. Again, we’ll get to that. I got to keep my guys believing that going into tomorrow. Like we talked about coming in here, it was going to be two hard games. We didn’t come here to play at nine o’clock tomorrow morning (Hawaiian time), but it will be a better opportunity. I thought our bench play was good tonight and guys just got to step up. We got to come back ready to go tomorrow

"On Arizona's hot shooting - "Last night (Janelle) Horne goes 1-of-5 from three, and he shot an air ball, then he went 5-of-5. Yet the kids kept believing. I thought we kept ourselves in the game at that point. You think when they're hitting shots that at some point they aren't going to hit all of them. Right there at the end Nic Wise missed a three at the end of regulation and we got the rebound. I thought Austin Dufault made a lot of big plays in there today. I thought Shane Harris-Tunks off the bench really stepped up and made some big plays."

**Nov. 25 Chaminade (W, 73-58)
Associate Head Coach Steve McClain**

On Colorado's energy level - "You come here and you lay it all on the line the first couple nights. Even one of the referees came up to me before the game and said, 'Steve you could easily be 2-0 and playing in the championship tonight.' I knew the kids had the right attitude in the locker room, but I also knew that the same energy wouldn't be there. When you line up and leave it all out there every night, to come back and play a Division II team, you can say everything you want in your own mind, but it isn't the same. My whole goal was to manage it to the point where we could get out of here with a win."

On what to take away from Maui - "I know our fans have been watching these games, and if you don't walk away from these games wanting to come to our next home game, wanting to be a part of this. Everyone will find negatives and there are things we have to get better at. But I'm going to tell you this; I don't know how many texts and calls from throughout the country I got saying, 'Steve, that team is playing their tails off.' ESPN asked me what did you want to accomplish when you walked out of here and I said that I wanted people to know Colorado basketball is different than it was last year. I wanted them to feel like we are a hard-playing group of kids. I think we accomplished that. I think we found that we have some depth and that on different nights somebody else can step up."

Head Coach Jeff Bzdelik**

ON THE ASSIST TO TURNOVER RATIO - "We just need to continue to share the basketball, and not turn it over. If you do that, you will put yourself in position to get great opportunities to score. I know that offense is a variable, but we have some guys who score. So if we are unselfish and the spacing is good, and the appropriate cuts are made and we don't turn it over then we will get opportunities to score efficiently."

ON THE OFFENSE - "Players make the offense, the offense does not make the player. In order to play offensively, you have to be able to score at every position, and in the past couple of years we haven't had that. We have always had a couple of players on the court that teams have not had to guard, and that makes it hard. If you look at our roster right now, we have some players that can make some shots. Also, some players can make shots in a variety of ways, so that makes the offense more efficient."

CU led by 15 in the first half and by 11 at half-time, but could not hold on to the lead in the second half. Gonzaga tied the game at 57 with 8:23 remaining on an Elias Harris basket and free throw. The game would be tied five additional times down the stretch before the Bulldogs pulled ahead for good.

The Buffaloes made seven of their first nine three-point attempts. BOULDER - That effort and intensity displayed by the Colorado men's basketball team in last week's EA Sports Maui Invitational?

It accompanied the Buffaloes back to the mainland. Confidence made the trip home, too.

With coach Jeff Bzdelik returning to the bench after leaving the holiday tournament to be with his ill mother in Chicago, the Buffs overran and ultimately out-worked San Francisco 78-54 on Tuesday night at the Coors Events Center.

The Buffs, improving to 5-2, play at Oregon State Friday night as part of the Big 12-Pac 10 Hardwood Series. USF, which lost Sunday in double overtime (91-75) at Colorado State, dropped to 2-5 after opening 2-0.

CU junior Cory Higgins led all scorers Tuesday night with 22 points and was one of four Buffs players in double figures. Freshman Alec Burks added 12 while senior Dwight Thorne II and junior Marcus Relphorde, who was celebrating his 21st birthday, contributed 10 each.

It was the seventh consecutive game that CU has scored 70 or more points, as well as the seventh straight game CU has had four players reach double figures.

"I know offense is a variable," Bzdelik said. "But we've got some guys who can score." Bzdelik also has some guys who can pass and find the open man. The Buffs finished with an assist-to-turnover ratio - 20-6 - that

Bzdelik will take every night.

"We need to continue to share the basketball and not turn it over," he said. "If you do that, you will put yourself in position to get great opportunities to score."

The Buffs started slowly, giving up nine second-chance points and trailing until the 12:33 mark when guard Nate Tomlinson capped a run of three consecutive treys - the other two were by Thorne and Higgins - and gave his team its first advantage of the night (16-15).

USF, The Sporting News' preseason pick to finish next-to-last in the West Coast Conference, and CU traded the lead for the next two possessions before Higgins asserted himself.

In a 16-2 Buffs run, the 6-foot-5 guard from Danville, Calif., scored six points as CU opened a 32-20 lead. But over the next 31/2 minutes, the Buffs got sloppy again and allowed the Dons to creep back to within five points (35-30).

Bzdelik quickly called a time out, and whatever was discussed in his huddle was taken to heart. The Buffs outscored the Dons 7-2 in the final 4:14 of the half and went to the locker room leading 42-32.

Higgins hit all six of his first-half field goal attempts - including a pair of three-pointers - and both free throw tries to finish the first 20 minutes with 16 of his total.

CU opened the second half with pressure on both ends. An 8-0 run pushed the Buffs ahead 50-32 and forced Dons coach Rex Walters,

the former Kansas star, to sit his team down with a time out.

It didn't help. The Buffs got another pair of baskets from Higgins and Relphorde - they hit their first six shots of the last half - to extend their run to 12-0 before USF guard Dontae Bryant hit a free throw at 16:13 for the Dons' first points of the second half.

But by then, the Buffs had surged ahead 54-33 and, barring another lapse, appeared ready to name their margin of victory. After it went to 25 (59-34) on a trey by Burks, the Dons were all but done with about 12 minutes to play.

In the second half, said Higgins, "We basically wanted to stomp on them. In the past, we've had leads and let teams come back on us. We wanted to show that killer instinct."

The Buffs' lead never dropped below 21 points for the remainder of the game and they led by as many as 27 (74-47) in the final 31/2 minutes.

Higgins said he and his teammates wanted to return from Maui "and get accustomed to how we'd been playing (there). And we wanted to stay sharp for our fans."

Consider it done.
