



CU women golfers stand second in Fort Collins

FORT COLLINS — The Colorado women's golf team stands second after its season-opening round Monday in the Ptarmigan Ram Classic.

The Buffs posted the best score of Round 2, a 292, to climb into second place, 11 strokes behind California, which stands at 581 after 36 holes.

CU's 292 in the second round marks the team's best total since tallying the same number a year ago at the Ram Classic.

In the individual competition, CU has three players in the top 10 as sophomore Julie Kim is tied for fifth and sophomore Dominique Pytlewski and senior Lindsay Senger are tied for 10th.

The final round will be held today at Ptarmigan Golf Club.
