



CU's Pytlewski holds Heather Farr lead

Buff golfers share team lead with Sooners

BROOMFIELD — Colorado's Dominique Pytlewski had a career day Monday and now she's in position to notch her first-ever tournament win.

The sophomore grabbed the individual lead at CU's Heather Farr Memorial by posting a 1-under 71 in the first round and a 2-under 70 in the second. The 70 is a career-best for Pytlewski and the back-to-back rounds under par is also a first for her.

"I think every putt that I hit had a chance to go in," Pytlewski said. "Overall I'm happy with how I played, but I am still working on some things. I had some good practice swings today and I'm getting closer to where I want to be."

If she holds on in today's final round at Omni Interlocken, the victory would be Pytlewski's first.

The Buffs are also looking for a victory today. Led by Pytlewski's effort and Julie Kim, who is tied for second at 143, CU is tied for first in the team standings with Oklahoma. The Buffs and Sooners each have a two-round total of 588. Idaho (590), Colorado State (592) and UC-Davis (596) and Hawaii (596) round out the top five.

"This morning was somewhat frustrating," CU head coach Anne Kelly said, referring to the team's 301 first round. "The team played well but we missed a lot of putts and that is still an area that we can improve on. This afternoon I was really proud of the team and the strong effort they put forth."

The Sooners are tied with the Buffs because four OU players are in the top 13, led by former Skyline standout Kelly Jacques. She is tied for ninth after carding rounds of 71 and 75.

Also tied for ninth is former Broomfield High and current CSU golfer Stefanie Ferguson. Her rounds of 71 and 75 mirrored Jacques.

The final round of the tournament begins today with a shotgun start at 8:30 a.m.
