THE MATCHES: Colorado will continue Big 12 Conference play by hosting No. 10 Texas on Wednesday, Nov. 3, at 7 p.m. in the Coors Events Conference Center. The Buffaloes will then play at No. 14 Texas A&M on Sunday, Nov. 7, at 12:30 p.m. MST in College Station, Texas.

TEXAS MATCH ON CUBUFFS.COM: The Colorado-Texas match will be broadcast on campus television by the CU Journalism School and will also be available live on the internet at www.CUbuffs.com as part of the Stampede Online subscription service (formerly Buffs Backstage Pass). ON THE SEASON: Colorado is 11-9 overall in 2004 and in sixth place in the Big 12 at 6-7. CU's four-game win over Texas Tech on Oct. 30 snapped a four-match losing streak and kept the Buffs 1 1/2 games ahead of Kansas and two up on the Red Raiders in the league standings. Colorado, which would need to win the rest of its matches to equal last season's 13-7 Big 12 campaign, plays its next three matches against ranked teams (No.10 Texas, at No. 14 Texas A&M, at No. 18 Kansas State) and will close the 2004 regular season with four straight against teams at the bottom of the Big 12.

Junior right side hitter **Allie Griffin** and junior outside **Maragda Santillana** are both averaging over four kills per game and are ranked fifth and sixth in the Big 12 respectively. However, the Buffaloes are likely to be without Santillana this week as she is out indefinitely with a shoulder injury. In her place, sophomore **Amber Nu'u** started against Texas Tech responding with five kills and 12 digs.

Sophomore **Ashley Nu'u** runs the Buffs' offense at setter averaging 12.40 assists per game. She is currently sixth on the school's all-time assists (1,212) and needs just 157 assists to become the 15th setter in team history with 1,000 assists in a season. Senior setter **Allison Barnes** has played more of a defensive role in 2004, but is still second on the squad in assists (71) and is averaging nearly two digs per game during the conference season.

Junior outside **Nicole Carr** continues to lead the Buffaloes in digs (2.60 dpg) while ranking third on the team in kills (2.35 kpg). CU's middle blocker combination of sopho-

mores **Lara Bossow** and **Austin Zimmerman** are combining for 3.49 kills and 2.10 blocks per game. Defensively, junior **Kelly Masumiya** and freshman **Therese Viñal** have been solid in the libero position averaging 1.27 and 2.33 digs per game respectively.

LAST TIME OUT: **Allie Griffin** and **Nicole Carr** combined for 45 kills, 24 digs and nine blocks to lead Colorado past Texas Tech 30-19, 32-30, 28-30, 30-28 in a Big 12 match on Oct. 30 at the CECC.

Griffin tied a season-high with 25 kills and added 14 digs and five blocks, tying a personal-best with 28.5 points. Carr also hit the 20-kill plateau for the second time in

her career, recording exactly 20 to tie a career-high set as a freshman in 2002 against Texas-Arlington. Carr also had a personal-best four blocks and 10 digs en route to her 23rd career double-double.

After winning game one rather swiftly at 30-19, CU fell behind 21-15 in game two before a 14-6 run gave the Buffs a 29-27 lead. Colorado couldn't hold, as the Red Raiders scored three straight to have a game-point of their own at 30-29. Consecutive kills by Carr and **Amber Nu'u** put the Buffs back up and Nu'u closed the game with an ace. Nu'u, who started her second match of the season in place of injured **Maragda Santillana** (shoulder), had five kills and a season-high 12 digs.

Texas Tech trailed 20-15 in game three, but fought back to send the match to a fourth game behind the hitting of Kelly Johnson and Amy Charlebois. Johnson had a match-high 27 kills while Carlebois had 12.

Griffin took over in game four recording 10 kills including Colorado's final three points to close out the match. Her 25 kill, 28.5 point effort matches her output at Oklahoma on Oct. 16.

Austin Zimmerman had 11 kills and tied a career-high with seven blocks. **Therese Viñal** had a personal-best 15 digs.

No. 4 Nebraska hit .368 as a team, handing Colorado its fourth-straight Big 12 Conference setback 31-29, 30-12, 30-23, on Oct. 27 at the Nebraska Coliseum.

Nebraska sophomore Dani Mancuso led all players with 18 kills and hit .424. The Huskers had 56 kills on 117 attacks with just 13 errors, marking the second-straight match a CU opponent has hit .350 or above.

Colorado managed to hit just .110 in the match with 36 kills on 109 attacks and 24 errors. Griffin had a team high 12 kills and was the only one to reach double-digits.

Nebraska, the top blocking team in the Big 12, had 10.5 team blocks which contributed to CU's overall hitting percentage.

Carr had a team-best 10 digs for the Buffaloes. Santillana had eight kills and five digs.

CU IN THE RANKINGS: In the fifth RichKern.com/AVCA Division I Region rankings released on Oct. 18, the Buffaloes ranked sixth in the Central Region, down from fifth a week ago. The RichKern.com rankings mimic the NCAA RPI published at the end of the season. They are not associated with the official NCAA rankings, but are provide a ranking which uses a computerized formula similar to the NCAA.

Colorado did not receive any votes in the latest American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA)/USA Today/CSTV Top 25 poll released on Nov. 1. The Buffaloes were ranked No. 25 for two-straight weeks early in the season (Sept. 20-Oct. 3).

19TH SEASON: The 2004 season is the 19th for the Colorado volleyball program. Since debuting as a varsity program in the fall of 1986, the Buffs have an overall record of 357-216 including one conference title (Big Eight in 1993). CU has advanced to 13 NCAA Tournaments in 18 years, 12 of which have come since 1991. The Buffs are one of only 15 NCAA Division I programs with at least 12 NCAA appearances since 1991.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Pi'i Aiu (*pronounced P-E I-U*) is in his eighth season as Colorado's head coach sporting a ca-

reer record of 145-85. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to six NCAA Tournaments in seven seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported two All-Americans, eight All-Region, and 18 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu, who has led the Buffs to a 95-58 record in Big 12 matches, is joined on the bench this season by fifth-year assistant **Jil Thomason** and first-year assistant **Erik Sullivan**.

As a head coach Aiu is 7-8 against Texas and 5-10 against Texas A&M.

ABOUT THE LONGHORNS: No. 10 Texas is 19-2 overall and in second place in the Big 12 at 11-2. The Longhorns are two games behind Nebraska for first place and one game ahead of Texas A&M, who is in third. Texas won its first 16 matches before being upset at Texas A&M on Oct. 16. The Longhorns have won three-straight since a 3-2 loss at home to Nebraska on

Oct. 20. Outside hitter Mira Topic leads the Big 12 in kills by a full kill per game (5.75) and ranks seventh in the league with a .332 hitting percentage. The Longhorns are the top hitting team in the conference, averaging .318 as a team. Middle blocker Bethany Howden leads UT individually and is third overall in the Big 12 at .384.

ABOUT THE AGGIES: No. 14 Texas A&M is 14-5 overall and in third place in the Big 12 at 10-3, one game behind Texas. The Aggies have won six-straight including a four-game triumph over previously undefeated Texas on Oct. 16, and a four-game decision over Colorado in Boulder on Oct. 20. Laura Jones leads the Aggies offensive attack with 4.75 kills per game, ranking second in the Big 12. Texas A&M is one of the better blocking teams in the league (3.37 bpg) led by Melissa Munsch who ranks second in the Big 12 at 1.78 per game.

SERIES RECORDS: Texas holds a 13-8 series lead over Colorado. The Longhorns snapped a three-game losing streak in the series earlier this year in a five-game thriller in Austin. Colorado led 2-0 when the Longhorns, led by Topic's 27 kills, rallied to take the next three games, including a 20-18 score in the final game. Texas' last win in Boulder came during the 2002 season.

Texas A&M owns a 13-5 series lead over the Buffaloes. The Aggies snapped a string of four straight five-game matches between the two teams with a four-game win in Boulder on Oct. 20. Colorado has dropped two straight in College Station, last winning at A&M in 2001.

EXCUSED ABSENCE: First-year assistant coach Erik Sullivan missed all of fall preseason practice with the Buffs, but he had a pretty good excuse. He was a member of the U.S. National Volleyball team that competed in the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece. The U.S team compiled an overall record of 4-4, advancing to Bronze Medal match. Sullivan, an eight-year veteran of the U.S. National Team, also participated in the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia.

BUFFS AT HOME: Colorado calls the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 17th straight season. The Buffs are 179-58 all time at the CECC for a winning percentage of .755. The Buffs are 18-6 at home in their last 24 matches with five of the six losses coming to teams ranked in the AVCA Top 20 at the time.

BARNES, NU'U BOTH RANK AMONG ASSIST LEADERS: Allison Barnes resides in fifth place on CU's all-time assists list

while Ashley Nu'u is now in sixth. Nu'u became the fifth CU player to reach 1,000 assists on the final play of the Buffs' 3-0 win over Kansas on Oct. 9.

BUFF BITS: After snapping a 10 match losing streak against ranked teams last November against Texas A&M, CU has won three of its last eight against the nation's top 25...CU hit over .400 as a team in its first two matches this year, marking the first time since 1988 that the Buffs hit .400 in back-to-back matches. In fact, CU had not hit .400 or above twice in the same season since 1994...Colorado overcame an 0-2 deficit to defeat San Diego in five games. The last time the Buffs overcame an 0-2 deficit to win was in Boulder on Oct. 31, 2001 against Baylor... Conversely, CU saw a 23 match winning streak when up 2-0 end with a five-game loss at Texas...Game five of that Texas match was 20-18, marking the highest game five score CU has been involved in since defeating Ball State 24-22 on Sept. 4, 1995 in Boulder...Against Denver, CU set a team record for hitting percentage in a four-game match with a

.402 performance (71k-18e-132att). The old record was .394 against Wyoming in 1995...Colorado started the season 5-2 marking the 16th consecutive season that the Buffaloes have come out of the non-conference schedule with a record of .500 or above...CU won its fourth-straight Colorado Invitational title and took second place at the University of Oregon Classic Sept. 3-4. Allie Griffin was named MVP of the Colorado Invitational and was joined by Ashley Nu'u and Maragda Santillana on the All-Tournament team. Nu'u and Griffin were also members of the Oregon Classic All-Tournament team.

CU PICKED SIXTH IN 2004 BIG 12 COACHES PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish sixth in the annual Big 12 Conference preseason coaches poll released Aug. 9.

Six-time Big 12 champion Nebraska was the unanimous first place pick, receiving 100 points and all 10 first-place votes. 2003 Big 12 Champion Kansas State was second with 80 points followed by Texas, Texas A&M, Missouri and Colorado.

Last season, CU was picked seventh by the coaches in the preseason poll and eventually finished in a three-way tie for third place with Texas A&M and Kansas in the final league standings.

No Buffs were selected to the Big 12 Conference preseason team.
