**QUICKLY...**The University of Colorado (22-8, 11-5 Big 12 in 2003-04) will officially open the 2004-05 season at the University of Nevada Nugget Classic, Nov. 19-20, at the Lawlor Events Center in Reno, Nev. The Buffaloes will play Loyola Marymount University on Friday, Nov. 19, at 6:30 p.m. MST, while the host Wolfpack plays Cal-State University-Fullerton at 8 p.m. MST. Colorado will play its second game on Saturday against either Nevada or Cal State-Fullerton. With a win over LMU, the Buffs will play in Saturday's championship game at 7 p.m. MST. A loss would put CU in the consolation game at 2 p.m. MST.

**BUFFS ON THE AIR...**All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. **Tim Smile** will handle play by play duties and is joined by USA Basketball's **Carol Callan** with the color commentary.

**31st SEASON...**Colorado is embarking on its 31st season of varsity women's basketball with an all-time record of 577-314 (.647). The Buffaloes have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, all since 1988, including six Sweet 16 appearances and three trips to the Elite Eight (1993, 1995 & 2002).

**ABOUT THE BUFFS...**Colorado returns six letterwinners and one starter from a 2003-04 team that finished 22-8 and in third place in the Big 12 Conference at 11-5. Senior guard **Veronica Johns-Richardson** is the Buffs' lone returning starter averaging 7.5 points and 2.7 rebounds as a junior. Johns-Richardson played the majority of her minutes at forward last year, but is expected to move back to point guard -- a position she played in high school and her first year at CU.

The Buffs will look to offset the loss of seven letterwinners with a group of young players and a couple players who have been waiting patiently for their moment in the sun. Forward **Sarah Lini**, CU's other senior with Johns-Richardson, has spent the last three seasons backing up such Buffs' standouts as Sabrina Scott and Randie Wirt. Junior guard **Whitney Law** is just itching to get out on the court. Law sat out the 2002-03 season after transferring from Georgia and then just four games into 2003-04, she suffered a season-ending knee injury. Sophomore **Jasmina Ilic** played in six games last season after joining the team in December from Serbia. **Anna Nedovic** and **Leslie Howard** each played in the majority of games last season, combining for just over five points and two rebounds per contest.

**NEWCOMERS TO CONTRIBUTE...**Colorado welcomes six new players -- four true freshmen and two transfers -- for the 2004-05 season. Freshman center **Kara Richards** is expected to see the most playing time as the two-time Texas All-State selection has been penciled in as a starter. Forward **Jackie McFarland** has All-State credentials of her own from Derby (Kan.) High School where she was the Ark Valley League MVP. A pair of guards will give CU much needed depth. A true point guard, **Yari Escalera** averaged 24 points and eight assists for her Colegio San Antonio Abad program in Humacao, Puerto Rico. CU will also use the services of walk-on freshman **Lauren Lubin**, who is actually in her sophomore year as a student at Colorado, but did not play last year. Lubin played at New Trier High School in Winnetka, Ill., where she earned Illinois Basketball Coaches Association All-State honors.

Junior center **Tami Garnett** joins the Buffaloes after spending last season at Central Arizona College and is eligible immediately. Garnett helped CAC to a third place national tournament finish last winter. Forward **Courtney Wallace** is a walk-on player who transferred to CU after playing two seasons at CU-Colorado Springs. She will sit out and redshirt the 2004-05 season due to NCAA transfer rules and will have two years of eligibility remaining next winter.

**SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITIONS:** Colorado went 2-0 during its exhibition schedule, defeating a pair of NCAA Division II Tournament teams from 2003-04. Freshman **Jackie McFarland** scored a game-high 25 points off the bench as the Buffaloes defeated the University of South Dakota 81-69 on Nov. 12. McFarland hit 10-of-

15 from field and grabbed eight rebounds. Sophomore **Jasmina Ilic** also scored 20 points off the bench and sparked a 20-7 run in the second half allowing the Buffs to pull away. Senior forward **Sarah Lini** had eight points and eight rebounds while senior **Veronica Johns-Richardson** pitched in eight points and seven boards. In the exhibition opener, Johns-Richardson scored 22 points to lead Colorado to a 99-68 win over Fort Lewis College on Nov. 7. Johns-Richardson hit 8-of-13 from the field, including 4-of-9 from beyond the arc, as the Buffaloes hit 51.9 percent overall as a team (40-of-77). Freshman center **Kara Richards** made a strong debut for the Buffaloes recording a double-double with 13 points and a game-high 14 rebounds. In all five Buffs scored in double digits. Sophomore forward **Anna Nedovic** had 17 points and eight rebounds, Ilic had 16 points and **Tami Garnett** pitched in 12.

**ABOUT THE LIONS...**Loyola Marymount will open its regular season schedule against Colorado. The Lions dropped a pair of exhibition games during the preseason, 73-61 to Love & Basketball on Nov. 4, and 73-56 to the Playmode Allstars on Nov. 11. Senior forward Jackie Woods scored 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds in the two exhibitions to lead the Lions. LMU is coming off its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2003-04, winning the West Coast Conference regular season and tournament titles in the process (24-6, 13-1).

**COLORADO-LOYOLA SERIES...**Colorado and Loyola Marymount have met just once, on Dec. 30, 1999, in Boulder with the Lions taking an 82-72 decision.

**TRUE FRESHMAN STARTER????...**True freshman center Kara Richards is slated to start at center in the Buffs' season opener against Loyola Marymount. If the 6-4 post from Graham, Texas, does in fact start for the Buffs, it will mark the first time since the 1998-99 season a true freshman has started the first regular season game. Forward Linda Lappe was the last true freshman to start the opener as she debuted with the Buffs in a 70-58 win over Denver University on Nov. 14, 1998. Lappe would go on to lead the Buffs in scoring (10.7 ppg) and assists (110) as a freshman.

**A BARRY GOOD MILESTONE...**With the LMU game, head coach **Ceal Barry** will pass legendary track & field coach Frank Potts for the most events coaches in school history at 642. She already holds the CU record for wins in any sport (418) and has coached in more games (641) than any coach in school history.

**FOR OPENERS...**Colorado is 25-5 all-time in season openers and has won 16 of its last 17. The Buffs are 18-3 under Ceal Barry in season-opening games and have won the last four. This will mark the first time since the 1999-2000 season the Buffs don't open the season in Boulder (at Denver) and the first time since 1996-97 (at BYU) the Buffs won't begin the season in the state of Colorado.

**NOVEMBER SUNSHINE...**Colorado is 86-20 (.811) overall in regular season games during the month of November including a whopping 72-8 (.900) at home. CU was 5-1 in November last year including its 67-63 overtime win over No. 15/16 Notre Dame in the WBCA Classic championship game. The Buffs' lone loss came to eventual Women's Final Four participant Minnesota, 95-61, in Minneapolis.

**PRESEASON TOURNAMENTS...**Colorado is 84-29 all-time in preseason tournaments, including a solid 29-5 mark in the Coors Classic. The Buffaloes have won 21 of their last 25 preseason tournament games and went 5-1 last season winning the WBCA Classic and Coors Classic Tournament championships.

**ABOUT THE TITANS...**Cal State-Fullerton returns three starters and eight letterwinners from its 2003-04 squad that finished 9-20 overall and in fifth place in the Big West Conference at 8-10. The Titans' forward duo of Amber Pruitt and Charlee Underwood combined for 20.7 points and nearly 10 rebounds a game last fall. In its only exhibition game of the season, Cal State-Fullerton dropped a 78-57 decision to Love & Basketball on Oct. 30. Pruitt scored 18 points and Underwood had 13 points and nine rebounds to pace the Titans.

**COLORADO-FULLERTON SERIES...**Should the Buffaloes face Cal State-Fullerton on Saturday, it would be the fourth ever meeting between the two teams. Colorado won the first three meetings. The two

teams would play for the first time since a 77-63 CU win in Fullerton on Dec. 30, 1987. Colorado is 20-10 all-time against the Big West Conference, with the bulk of the record coming against Utah State (10-5).

**ABOUT THE WOLFPACK...**Nevada split the two games of its exhibition schedule defeating the Bay Area Pro-Am 66-50 and falling to Cal State-Chico 81-76. Senior forward April Bankston, who led the Wolfpack with 20 against Bay Area, averaged 10.4 points and 5.3 rebounds on last season's team that finished 3-26 and 10th in the Western Athletic Conference at 2-17. Nevada guards Traci Graham and Talisha Quick-Rath combined for 15.8 points and 6.1 rebounds last season.

**COLORADO-NEVADA SERIES...**This would be the first ever meeting between Colorado and Nevada. CU has a 9-4 record against current Western Athletic Conference schools and last played a school from the WAC in the 2002-03 season opener when the Buffs took care of Rice 85-66.

**LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUFFS...**The Colorado Athletic Department and Fox Sports Rocky Mountain have agreed to televise seven Buffs' women's basketball games this season. Add that to the three national Fox Sports Network games scheduled through a combination of Big 12 and Pac 10 Conference pacts, CU women's basketball is scheduled for a school-record 10 regular season television games this winter.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE...**Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing nine teams that played in the 2004 NCAA tournament. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as seven members played in the NCAA's a season ago, with Texas and Baylor making the Sweet 16. Colorado's Coors Classic alone features three teams who played in the NCAA Tournament last season. The Buffs will open with Pennsylvania and then play either LSU, a 2004 Women's Final Four participant or Maryland.

**HEAD COACH CEAL BARRY...**Ceal Barry begins her 22nd season at Colorado, and 26th overall has a collegiate head coach. Barry's overall coaching record is 501-265 with the win total ranking 20th among active NCAA Division I coaches. At Colorado Barry has led the Buffaloes to a 418-223 record, including 13 20-win seasons and 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

As a head coach Barry is 0-1 against Loyola Marymount, 2-0 against Cal State-Fullerton and has never faced Nevada.

**BUFFS PICKED SEVENTH, SIXTH IN BIG 12 POLLS...**Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Big 12 Coaches Preseason poll while the media said the Buffaloes would finish sixth in their preseason poll. Texas was the overwhelming favorite in both polls. The Longhorns received 11 of 12 first place votes in the coaches poll (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own teams) and 12 of 14 first place votes in the media poll. Colorado was picked fifth in both the 2003-04 and 2002-03 preseason polls only to achieve a higher standing by the end of the season. CU enjoyed a third-place finish last season and a fourth-place showing in 2002-03. The Buffs have not finished lower than fourth in the Big 12 standings since the 1999-2000 season.

**NATIONAL POLLS...**Colorado was not ranked but was among a host of teams receiving votes in the first regular season USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Top 25 Preseason Coaches Poll released on Nov. 16. The Buffaloes earned six votes and are 18 spots out of the Top 25. Seven of CU's potential opponents are in the current top 25 including four in the top 15. LSU, a possible Coors Classic opponent came in at No. 2 just behind preseason favorite Tennessee. Texas was third followed by Connecticut, Georgia, Duke, Stanford, Baylor, Ohio State and Texas. Texas Tech is 11th, Kansas State 19th while Oklahoma came in at No. 25. The Buffaloes did not receive any votes in the latest Associated Press poll, but like the coaches poll, seven possible CU opponents are listed among the Top 25 including No. 2 Texas, No. 3 LSU and No. 8 Baylor.

**HOME SWEET HOME...**The Buffs are 317-90 (.779) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 284-69 (.804). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 232-68 (.773) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s. The Buffs will enter the 2004-05 regular season riding a two game home win streak.

**THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...**Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain on Friday evenings at 7:30 p.m. Hosted by Sandy Williams, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

**UP NEXT...**Colorado will host the 18th annual Coors Classic on Nov. 26-27 at the Coors Events Conference Center. Four 2003-04 NCAA Tournament teams will be featured, as Pennsylvania, Maryland and Women's Final Four participant LSU come to Boulder. No. 2/3 LSU will face No. 24/24 Maryland on Friday, Nov. 26, at p.m. followed by Colorado vs. Penn at 7 p.m. The Buffs will play the 5 p.m. game on Saturday, Nov. 27, regardless of Friday's outcomes as the game will be televised by Fox Sports Rocky Mountain. Penn will play either LSU or Maryland in the 7 p.m. game.

Colorado's only returning starter from 2003-04...primarily played forward last season, but is the Buffs' starting point guard as a senior, a position she played in high school and her first year at CU...had a game-high 22 points on 8-of-13 shooting in the exhibition opener against Fort Lewis...had the most 3-pointers (5) and second-most points (30) of all Buffs in the two exhibitions...her first 3-point field goal of 2004-05 will move her in to sole possession of 15th place on CU's career list passing Nikki Weddle (1997-99)...both currently have 30 career 3-pointers...Johns-Richardson has already graduated from CU (May '04) with a bachelor's degree in business with an emphasis in marketing and is currently working on a second degree in sociology.
