SCOUTING THE KANGAROOS - The University of Missouri-Kansas City is 0-5 on the season and are coming off an one-point loss at home against Central Florida on Saturday, 57-56. Tim Blackwell and Quinton Day played their first game becoming eligible after transferring to UMKC at the semester break last season. UMKC head coach Rich Zvosec is in his fourth year as head coach (42-50) and 13th year overall (145-198).

CU vs. UMKC - Colorado leads the all-time series 7-1 and has won the last seven meetings with the Kangaroos. The two schools last played Dec. 7, 2002 when the Buffaloes escaped with a 62-59 road win. That was the season CU won twice on the road in 11 games (Texas A&M was win). Coach Patton teams are 4-0 vs. UMKC with two wins each at home and on the road.

LAST TIME OUT - Marcus Hall scored 22 points and Colorado hit 11 of 12 free throws in the final minute to hold off Colorado State, 89-83 Saturday night. Richard Roby added 17 points and Chris Copeland had 12 points and a career-best 13 rebounds. CU won its fifth straight and its 13th consecutive home victory over its in-state rival spanning the last 47 years.

RETURNING TO ACTION - Junior forward Andy Osborn may return to action tonight after missing the last three games with a mid-foot sprain at a Dec. 2 practice. Osborn tore a ligament between the first and second metatarsal in his left foot. He is averaging 1.0 point and 3.3 rebounds a game.

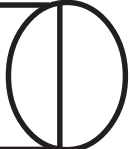
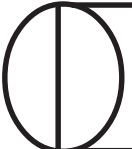

ATHLETIC MEDIA RELATIONS

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2008-09 CLASS - CU signed its lone scholarship student-athlete for next season by adding Calvin Williams (6'8, 200, Forward) from Hillcrest HS. The Memphis, Tenn. native signed a letter of intent during the early signing period in November. "Calvin is really a big-time athlete, a 6-8 guy who can run the floor and finish around the basket," said Patton.

NOW THERE WERE 14 - CU redshirt-freshman Keith Smith was released from the team last week after violating team rules according to Coach Patton. Smith played a mere 19 seconds at California for his only action this season.

BRIGHT FUTURE - There are no seniors on the current roster with the exception of walk-on Mac Mattingly. So far, CU has used a different starting line up in each of its first two games and have kept the same quintet for the last three. Here are the combinations so far:

RALLY CAPS - CU has rallied from their last three of four games with runs and producing two wins:

- at California, CU trailed by seven points at half-time, only to respond with an 11-2 early in the second half with 3-pointers from Copeland (2 treys) and Hall. CU was able to maintain a close game with Richard Roby scoring six of the team's final eight points and a key steal. Hall also had a blocked shot with 56 seconds remaining.

- Trailing Oregon State by as many as 16 points, twice in the first half, and 10 points in the second half, the Buffs rallied for the second straight game. CU took their first lead of the game at 70-68 (7:31) and 72-71 (6:46), however were outscored 26-16 the rest of the way.

- Against Northwestern, CU trailed by seven points with 11 minutes to play and rallied with a 7-0 run to tie the game at 44 with 8:37 and went on to defeat the Wildcats. It's the first time in two years (over nine games) that CU rallied from being down at the 10-minute mark of the second half and won the game.

5 PLAYERS = 10 OR MORE - Against California and Oregon State, CU had five players reach double-figure points in both games. The last time CU had back-to-back games with five players scor-

ing double figures was Dec. 12, 2000 (vs. UMKC) and Dec. 23, 2000 (Colorado State).

STAR OF THE GAME - After each victory, the CU radio duo of Johnson & Johnson - no relation (just like the special agent Johnson's in the first Die Hard) will select their player of the game. Richard Roby was CU's first honoree against Charleston; Chris Copeland (Northwestern), Marcus Hall (at California.), Julius Ashby (Colorado State).

10TH IN THE BIG 12 - The conference coaches are predicting CU to finish 10th overall in this season's standings. In eight full years, not one Coach Patton team has finished 10th or lower. Since 1996-97, CU has finished in second place (once), fourth (twice), fifth (once), seventh (three times), and ninth (once).

BUFFS TV - CU is making 19 appearances this season on the tube - believed to be the most ever. A total of eight telecasts will be featured on FSN (4 home, 4 away); nine appearances (three away, six home) on ESPN Plus, and one game on ABC.

CU IN THE EXTRA SESSION - Under coach Patton, CU teams are 5-6 in the extra session since 1996. Their lone double overtime game was over Texas Tech (Feb. 11, 1998).

CU IN SEASON OPENERS - With their impressive 72-57 win over the College of Charleston, head coach Ricardo Patton remains perfect in season openers improving his record to 9-0 (6-0 at home, 2-0 on the road, 1-0 neutral).

FAMILIAR FACES - Returning to the Buffs are six experienced veterans that have contributed over the last two seasons. Back for their third year are juniors Chris Copeland, Glean Eddy, Antoine McGee, Scott Senger, Jayson Obazuaye. Sophomore Marcus Hall also saw significant playing time his freshman year. Copeland returns as the team's top shot blocker; Hall is the top 3-pointer shooter; while Eddy, and Copeland are the top rebounders statically.

NEW LOOK BUFFS - Make sure you get a copy of the 2004-05 Colorado Men's Basketball media guide for this season's new faces on the court (inside back cover of the guide) and on the bench. With the exception of senior walk-on Mac Mattingly, the rest of the Buffaloes are underclassmen with 10 juniors, four of them junior-transfers. All total, 14 underclassmen, the most since the 1995-96 season when 13 graced the floor at the Coors Events Center. 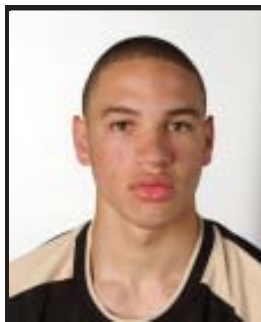

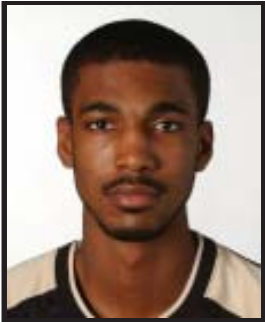

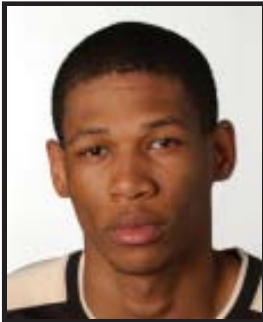

CU OPENS SEASON WITH WIN

BOULDER – Freshman guard Richard Roby scored 12 of his game-high 19 points in the second half to lead three Colorado players in double figures as the Buffaloes defeated the College of Charleston, 72-57, to open the 2004-05 season in the first round of the Preseason NIT Monday night.

“It is a good win against a very quality opponent,” said CU head coach Ricardo Patton. “That team (C of C) is going to win a lot of games, especially in their league. I think they did a good job of running it down our throats, they kept the intensity up the whole game.”

With the win, the Buffs improve to 9-0 in season openers under Patton, who claimed his 100th career win at the Coors Events Center. The Cougars have dropped their second season opener in a row, after winning 12 straight before last year.

Colorado led throughout the first half with their biggest margin reaching nine points with 3:37 to go; however, the Cougars trimmed their deficit to two points to narrow the margin to 35-33. Sophomore guard Marcus Hall then hit a three-pointer to push their lead back to five for a 38-33 halftime lead.

In the second stanza the Buffs upped their lead to 13 points at the 12:11 mark after consecutive baskets (Andy Osborn 3-pointer) and a Lamont Arrington dunk for a 54-41 advantage. C of C again rallied to cut the deficit to seven with 6:20 remaining, however CU outscored the Cougars by a 13-5 margin to end the game.

Colorado had 12 blocks compared to the Cougars two and out-rebounded the College of Charleston 48-46. Julius Ashby scored 13 points and Jayson Obazuaye added 10. Roby finished the night hitting 7-of -11 from the floor and grabbed eight rebounds in his debut. The Cougars' Josh Jackson had 12 points, while Robert Swain chipped in 10.

“Today we made some great steps as a team to get where we want to be,” said Obazuaye. “It excites me for the season and the games ahead especially the next one nationally televised (ESPN).”

BUFFS FALL AT MICHIGAN, 69-60 IN NIT 2ND ROUND

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Dion Harris scored a career-high 24 points and Lester Abram added 12 to lead Michigan to a 69-60 win over Colorado Wednesday in the second round of the Preseason NIT.

Courtney Sims also had 10 points, 10 rebounds and 5 blocked shots for the Wolverines who advance to the semifinals of the tournament to play the winner of the Arizona-Wright State second-round game.

Richard Roby scored 18 points for Colorado with Marcus Hall adding 16. Julius Ashby had a game-high six blocked shots tying the CU school record for blocks in a road game.

Michigan, which is looking to become the first team to win the postseason NIT and preseason NIT the following season, led from start to finish.

“I was excited to see the team continue to get better,” said CU head coach Ricardo Patton. “By the time we realized we could play with Michigan we had dug too deep a hole. The Buffaloes tightened the score to 65-58 on Roby’s 3-pointer with 56 seconds left, but a basket by Sims and two free throws by Harris sealed the win.

COPELAND, ROBY TALLY DOUBLE-DOUBLES

BOULDER – The Colorado Buffaloes overcame a tight first half to best the visiting Northwestern Wildcats 66-57 Sunday afternoon at the Coors Events Center.

Freshman guard Richard Roby led the Buffs with his first career double-double, tallying 16 points and 13 rebounds, and three other Buffs scored in double figures as CU pulled away after a first half which included eight lead changes and eight ties.

Down by one in the first half, Roby and junior forward/center Julius Ashby had back-to-back highlight-reel dunks off steals to ignite the home crowd of 2,167 and put the Buffs on top 28-25 going into the halftime.

After Chris Copeland hit a 5-foot jumper 34 seconds into the second half, the Wildcats went on a 12-3 run in a span of 4:20 to take a 37-33 lead.

The Buffs would stage a comeback with the help of Copeland, who finished with a career-high 15 points and 10 rebounds. His 3-pointer with 8:33 left tied the game, and sixteen seconds later he made a lay up to put the Buffs on top 46-44, a lead that they would never relinquish.

“It’s a good win against a great quality opponent, they execute to perfection,” said CU Head Coach Ricardo Patton. “Late when we were down 44-37 it was a pretty scary time for us. But we managed to get the right guys on the floor and changing into zone defense helped us get the lead.

Jayson Obazuaye scored 14 points for his second best career scoring output, and Ashby added 10 points and 7 rebounds for the Buffs, who improved to 53-6 in non-conference home games under Head Coach Ricardo Patton.

Northwestern (1-3) was led by forward Vedran Vukusic, who finished with 25 points and nine rebounds. Sophomore forward Tim Doyle finished the game with 11 points, as he was the only other Wildcat in double figures.

The game was the second meeting between the two teams in as many years. CU opened the 2003-04 season with a 67-56 road win against the Wildcats. The victory improved the Buffs’ overall record in the series to 6-3, with the first seven meetings taking place from 1949-1968.

OREGON STATE OUTSCORES CU, 98-87

CORVALLIS, Ore. - Chris Stephens had a career-high 27 points and freshman Sasa Cuic added 22 to give Oregon State a 98-87 victory over Colorado on Saturday.

Marcus Hall had 22 of his 29 points in the first half for Colorado (2-2), single-handedly bringing the Buffaloes back from a 16-point deficit. Hall tied a school record for consecutive points made tying Donnie Boyce’s mark of 20 points at Oklahoma State, March 5, 1994. Hall’s offensive explosion also were career-highs in field goals made (12) and attempts (16).

Oregon State’s Jason Fontenet had 20 points, including four 3-pointers, for the Beavers (4-2), while J.S. Nash added 13 points and four steals. Oregon State shot 64 percent from the field in the first half and 59 percent for the game. Only one Beaver, reserve Derek Potter who was 0-for-2, shot worse than 50 percent.

Oregon State led 38-22 after Fontenet made two free throws. That’s when Hall took over, scoring the Buffaloes’ final 18 points of the first half.

The sophomore point guard outscored the Beavers 18-7 during the nearly five minute stretch and cut the score to 45-40 by halftime.

The Buffaloes came close early in the second half, taking a brief 70-68 lead on Jayson Obazuaye’s 3-pointer, but Stephens countered with his own 3-pointer and the Beavers went out on a 10-2 run. CU shot a season-best 58 percent (33-of-57) from the field.

Hall, who made 12 of his 16 shots, couldn’t maintain his first-half production, scoring only seven points in the second half.

All five Colorado starters scored in double-figures, including Obazuaye and Chris Copeland, who each had 15 points.

SECOND HALF RALLY KEYS CU WIN OVER CAL

BERKELEY, Calif. - Chris Copeland scored all 11 of his points after halftime and Colorado rallied with a big second half to win at California for the first time in eight meetings, 63-60 on Tuesday night.

Richard Roby scored four points in the final 2:47 and also had a late steal for Colorado, sending the Golden Bears to their second narrow defeat at home in a week after a 73-72 loss to UNLV last Tuesday. Marcus Hall (five assists) scored with 12.2 seconds left for the Buffaloes (3-2).

Rod Benson had career highs of 25 points and 10 rebounds for the Bears, who missed several important shots in the final minute. Richard Midgley's 3 at the buzzer wasn't enough for Cal (4-3). Midgley finished with 14 points.

It was the teams' second meeting in two seasons. The Buffaloes won 78-60 last season in Boulder, Colo., but Cal leads the series 9-7. Colorado last played in Haas Pavilion in 2000. Copeland played only three minutes in the first half, had two fouls and didn't score. He was one of several Colorado players to pick up their game in the second half.

The Buffaloes have five players averaging in double figures, and five scored more than 10 - Copeland, Roby (11), Hall (12), Jayson Obazuaye (12) and Julius Ashby (11). It's the second straight game all five CU players scored in double-digits.

Ashby grabbed a game-high 17 rebounds, the most by a CU player since Lamar Harris hauled down 19 against Iowa State last season.

The Buffaloes made three 3-pointers (Copeland - 2, Obazuaye) during an 11-2 spurt early in the second half to get back in the game after getting just nine field goals and shooting 37.5 percent in the first half.

Ashby's two free throws with 8:40 left gave Colorado a 47-44 lead, then DeVon Hardin answered with a three-point play on the other end to tie it. After Obazuaye made one of two free throws - he got another try on his second attempt after a Cal lane violation - freshman Eric Vierneisel made a 3 for a 50-48 Bears' lead. The Bears' poor 3-point shooting has plagued them all season, and they went 3-for-12 from long range Tuesday.

FREE THROWS HELP CU HOLD OFF RIVAL CSU

BOULDER (AP) - Marcus Hall scored 22 points and Colorado hit 11 of 12 free throws in the final minute to hold off Colorado State 89-83 Saturday night.

Richard Roby added 17 points and Chris Copeland had 12 points and 13 rebounds for Colorado (4-2), which won its fifth straight over Colorado State. Copeland's 13 rebounds were a career-high.

Matt Nelson had 26 points and Matt Williams added 16 for the Rams, who had trouble overcoming a shaky first half. Colorado State (5-4) had just three turnovers and shot 58 percent in the second half, but it still wasn't enough for its first win in Boulder since 1957.

Trailing by 11 at halftime, Colorado State tried to get back in it by pounding the ball inside in the second half.

The Rams went to Nelson and Jason Smith on just about every possession in the early going, with Nelson scoring 10 points in the first six minutes and Smith cutting Colorado's lead to 48-45 with 12 minutes left on a driving layup.

Colorado State tied it at 52 two minutes later on Michael Morris' long 3-pointer and kept it close until Colorado went on a 10-4 run to lead 75-69 with 1:29 left. Nelson hit two free throws at the other end, but the Buffaloes broke Colorado State's press and Julius Ashby scored on a dunk to make it 78-71.

CSU kept coming, including a four-point play by Jon Rakiecki, but Hall hit six free throws and Ashby sealed it with two more in the closing seconds to give CU its 13th straight home victory over its in-state rival.

Colorado State had a huge size advantage - four players at least 6-foot-10 to just one for Colorado.

The Buffaloes led by 11 at halftime and it could have been more had they been more patient offensively. Colorado shot just 13-of-34.
