Rams Open '05 Season at Colorado

Colorado State opens the 2005 football season against in-state rival Colorado Saturday, Sept. 3 in Boulder before a national television audience on TBS. Following the opener, the Rams face Minnesota in Minneapolis Sept. 10. The Rams then face Nevada in the Grand Reopening Game of Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. Leading the returning players is WR David Anderson, a semifinalist a year ago for the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's top receiver. Anderson and OT Mike Brisiel were preseason All-MWC choices. Brisiel and OC Albert Bimper enter their fourth season as starters along the offensive line. Seniors LB Courtney Jones and LB Jahmal Hall anchor the team's defense.

Openers

Colorado State is 51-50-2 all-time in season opening games, 8-4 under Sonny Lubick. Colorado State lost its last two season openers to Colorado, in 2003 at INVESCO Field at Mile High in Denver, 42-35, and last year's game in Boulder, 27-24.

Harbinger Of Success

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in Fort Collins, Colorado State has beaten in-state rival Colorado three times. In those three seasons, the Rams have averaged 9.3 wins (28-10 record), won or shared the conference title each time, and played in three bowl games. In seasons where the Rams lost to Colorado, the team averaged 7.4 victories (52-33 record), won or shared a pair of conference titles and played in four bowl games.

On The Road

Colorado State was 1-4 on the road in 2004, the first time since 1993 - Sonny Lubick's first year at the CSU helm - the team did not finish with at least a .500 record away from Hughes Stadium. Prior to last season, Colorado State had a 42-21 (66.7) road record. It was also only the second time, along with 1993, the team did not win at least three road games in a season.

Series In Boulder

Colorado leads the series in Boulder, 30-8-1. Colorado has won five in a row at home in the series, dating back to the Rams' 23-7 victory in 1986.

Big 12 Opponents

Colorado State is 3-10 against Big 12 opponents during Sonny Lubick's 13-year tenure. All three victories have come against Colorado.

Last Win

Colorado State's most recent victory over a Big 12 opponent came in 2002, a 19-14 win over Colorado at INVESCO Field at Mile High in Denver.

Last Road Win vs. Big 12

Colorado State's last road win against a Big 12 Conference member came in 1986, when the Rams won 23-7 in Boulder against Colorado.

Media Guidelines

- All interviews must be coordinated through director for media relations Gary Ozzello or assistant Mike Lefler.
- Interviews are prohibited from conflicting with classes, practice sessions, meetings or medical treatment.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance.
- Home telephone numbers for student-athletes will not be released to the media.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes the day before a game are restricted to network television for use during a game telecast.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Media members are prohibited from interviewing student-athletes on the sidelines during all practices, including injured student-athletes not participating in a practice session.
- Coach Lubick is available for radio and newspaper interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to athletic media relations director Gary Ozzello at least 24 hours in advance of a requested interview.
- Coach Lubick is available for questions via the MountainWest Conference Coaches Teleconference scheduled each Tuesday morning throughout the season.

Postgame Procedures

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.
- Coach Sonny Lubick will meet with the media in a designated interview area at the conclusion of a 10-minute cooling period. When his remarks have concluded, he will then appear on a live network radio show, and the team locker room is open to the media.



All-Time Colorado Openers

Colorado State's in-state rivalry with Colorado dates back to 1893 - the first year of competition on the Fort Collins campus. The series renews for the 77th time Sept. 3 in Boulder. The Rams are 5-11 against Colorado when the game is CSU's season-opener.

Combined Records

Colorado State's 2005 opponents had a cumulative 67-61 record in 2004, including a perfect 12-0 record by Utah, which defeated Pittsburgh in the Fiesta Bowl as the Mountain West Conference's first-ever BCS bowl game participant. Five of the 11 opponents won at least seven games.

Bowl Opponents

Colorado State's 2005 schedule includes five opponents who participated in bowl games a season ago: Colorado (Houston Bowl), Minnesota (Music City Bowl), New Mexico (Emerald Bowl), Utah (Fiesta Bowl), and Wyoming (Las Vegas Bowl). All but New Mexico won postseason games last season.

Before And After

Prior to QB Justin Holland's injury in 2004, WR David Anderson - who would go on to become a semifinalist for the Fred Biletnikoff Award - had caught 39 passes for 665 yards and two touchdowns. Once Holland was sidelined, Anderson the rest of the season caught 18 passes for 375 yards and no touchdowns.

Holland Returns

Senior QB Justin Holland returns for his final season of competition. Holland, from Lakewood, Colo., was on a record-setting pace in 2004 before he suffered an ankle injury which required surgical repair in the sixth game of the season at San Diego State. He threw for 1,622 yards and six touchdowns to that point. Holland had thrown for more yards through five games than any quarterback in school history. His backup, true freshman Caleb Hanie, threw for 1,204 yards and eight touchdowns.

Two Times Turf

Colorado State played one game - at Utah - on an artificial surface in 2004. In 2005, Colorado State has two games on artificial turf: at Minnesota, and at UNLV. In Sonny Lubick's 12 seasons the Rams are 10-11 all-time in games played on an artificial surface.

Special Teams Streaks

Colorado State will be out to break two special team streaks in 2005. The Rams have returned 146 kick-offs without running one back for a score. The last touchdown return came Sept. 29, 2001 when Dexter Wynn scored on a kickoff return at Wyoming. Wynn was the last Ram to return a punt for a touchdown, Sept. 14, 2002 against Louisville. The Rams have since returned 84 punts without a score.

Special Teams Streaks, Part II

Ram opponents, by comparison, have returned 673 kickoffs without a touchdown, dating back to Sept. 10, 1988 against Hawaii.

Second Longest

Coach Sonny Lubick, the winningest coach in school history, enters his 13th year at the helm in 2005. He has a record of 95-51-0, a winning percentage of .652. Only Harry Hughes coached more years at CSU - 31 - that Lubick. Lubick is one of but four coaches in school history with a winning percentage. Bob Davis (9 years, 54-33-2, .618) is second behind Lubick, followed by Hughes (31 seasons; 125-93-18, .568) and C.J. Griffith (3 years; 7-7-2, .500).

MWC Coaches

Lubick is second behind Air Force coach Fisher DeBerry in terms of longevity. DeBerry has coached 20 seasons at AFA, followed by Lubick's 12. Next on the list is Rocky Long of New Mexico (8 years), TCU's Gary Patterson (3 years) San Diego State's Tom Craft (3 seasons), Joe Glenn of Wyoming (2 seasons), and first-year coaches Bronco Mendenhall of BYU, Mike Sanford of UNLV, and Utah's Kyle Whittingham, respectively.

Rams' Schedule Challenging

Colorado State faced arguably the most difficult nonconference schedule in school history in 2004. The Rams played the University of Colorado in Boulder, at Southern California, and hosted Minnesota in three of the team's nonleague games. Colorado won the Big 12 Conference North Division title then lost in the championship game to Oklahoma then played in the Houston Bowl. USC won the national championship for a second year in a row by defeating Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl, while Minnesota defeated Alabama in the Music City Bowl. The Rams' conference schedule also included a date at Utah, which defeated Pittsburgh in the Fiesta Bowl, the first BCS bowl bid in Mountain West Conference history. The 2005 season offers little respite. The Rams open the season at Colorado, and two weeks later play Minnesota in Minneapolis.

Rams At Home

Colorado State is 45-18 (71.4 percent) in home games during Lubick's tenure. The Rams are 24-5 (82 percent) in home nonconference games since 1993. The nonconference losses have been at the hands of Oregon (1993), Colorado (1996), Fresno State (2001), Miami of Ohio (2003), and Minnesota (2004).

Rams On The Road

Colorado State is 42-26 (61.7 percent) in 68 road games since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993. The Rams were 1-4 on the road in 2004.

Eighteen Return

Colorado State loses six departing seniors from the 2004 squad who have exhausted their playing eligibility. The Rams will welcome back 18 starters from this season's team for 2005, 10 on offense, eight on defense.

MWC Record

Colorado State is 29-13 in 41 MWC games since 1999 when the conference was formed. The Rams are 15-6 at home, 14-7 on the road in MWC action.

Opening Drives

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival at Colorado State in 1993, the Rams are **31-10** in games the Rams have scored on the opening drive of the game. CSU is **12-25** in games the opponent has scored on the opening drive.

First Scores

Colorado State is **65-12** since 1993 when the Rams score first in a game. The Rams are **29-36** since 1993 when the opponent scores first.

League Play

Colorado State has an impressive 65-25 (72 percent) record in 89 conference games since Sonny Lubick's arrival as head coach in 1993.

Rushing Defense

Colorado State has allowed **59** individual 100-yard rushing performances since 1993. The Rams are **31-24** in games where an opponent rusher has gained 100 or more yards and **57-22** when an opponent does not have a 100-yard rusher.

Stadium Facts

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of the team's home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus area and in one of the most scenic settings to be found anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed int he north end zone for the beginning of the 2004 season.

Colorado State football coach Sonny Lubick has been paid many tributes during his 13 seasons at the helm.

For instance, he has been honored as the conference coach of the year four times.

In 1994, *SPORTS ILLUSTRATED* honored the personable Lubick as its national coach of the year. That same year he received several national recognition from several other organizations as well.

But perhaps the greatest tribute and a testimony to what he has meant not only to Colorado State's football program but the entire athletics department, university community and the region came in May of 2003.

During the announcement of a \$15.2 million gift by Pat Stryker and the Bohemian Foundation to renovate and expand the school's football stadium, officials announced that the field would be named in Lubick's honor.

That "Sonny" spring day will long be remembered as one of the greatest moments in Rams' athletics history. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium is undergoing significant changes that will expand the capacity, provide two new scoreboards including a state-of-the-art video replay board, expanded premium club level seating, and

the addition of luxury suites. There will also be a new playing field installed, as well as other fan amenities to provide Ram fans the finest spectator experience.

More than anything else, the gift and the ensuing renovation and expansion serve as daily reminders what Lubick has meant not only to the football program, but to the athletic department in general and the university as a whole.

It is more than his performance on the field, which has been remarkable: 6 conference titles, 8 bowl appearances, and ranking among the top 15 programs nationally in total victory.

Lubick has won 95 games in 12 seasons including four times guiding the Rams to 10 or more victories in a campaign.

It is more about who he is as a person, a husband, and father, more about what he stands for and cares about.

In December of 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his

community service work and success with the Rams' program.

In the summer of 2003, he was recognized by the American Diabetes Association's Colorado Chapter as a "Father of the Year." He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities, including the St. Jude's Children's Hospital campaign.

Each spring, Lubick can be spotted visiting local elementary schools to visit students about the importance of education and being a solid citizen.

On the school's campus, he has achieved celebrity status, not because of the success and recognition he has generated for the entire institution, but for his gentle nature and caring personality.

In May of 2005, he was accorded another honor, having been named the Citizen of the Year by the Fort Collins Board of Realtors.

Those who have had the pleasure of dealing with Lubick quickly recognize why he has succeeded as a coach.

Personal Philosophy

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him - from the members of his coaching staff to every player on the roster. He has built Colorado State's program into one of the nation's finest with hard work, dedication, and a commitment to helping people attain success.

He has a philosophy he shares not only with his team, but with the community and Ram fans nationwide:

- **Responsibility:** Having each member of Colorado State's program take responsibility for their actions and impact on the success of the team.
- **Character:** Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- **Respect:** Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity.
- **Keep winning and losing in perspective:** Sonny Lubick keeps his program on an even keel - not too high after a monumental victory, of which there have many during his career, nor too low following defeat. Lubick has the presence in the program to keep his program focused on the goal ahead.

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- **Work hard and enjoy what you do:** Sonny Lubick's work ethic, dedication and enthusiasm is contagious to those around the Rams' program. He also firmly believes that individuals in any situation perform at peak levels when they enjoy what they are doing.

Lubick's philosophy has paid tremendous dividends to Colorado State's program. Consider that in 11 seasons, he has won 91 games and appeared in 8 bowl games while win-

Rams' Success Unmatched

In 11 seasons prior to his arrival, the Rams' program tasted victory only 47 times and played in a single bowl game.

He is without question the most successful coach in school history and has earned the reputation as one of the nation's finest football coaches. He has brought unmatched success and popularity to the base of the Rocky Mountains with his style and grace.

"People know who Colorado State is now. When we go to a bowl game, and see the fans and students enjoying the game, that's what we talk about as coaches and makes us excited," Lubick said.

Lubick is quick to credit his staff and the student-athletes for the program's prominence.

"It's about good coaches and having good student-athletes. Players know they are being treated fairly and that this is a good place," said Lubick

"It takes all of us to have a good program: the student-athletes, coaches, staff, the student body. Those are the little things that make big things happen."

While Lubick is pleased with the program's progress, he is not satisfied or complacent.

"I'm proud to be part of something like this," he said of the Rams' achievements. "But we're going to keep pushing to get better. We want to maintain a solid program that has respect throughout

the country. Other coaches from around the country look at our program and know something good is going on here."

Program Milestones

The Rams under Lubick have:

- Earned 8 bowl invitations in 10 seasons, more than any other MWC team and among the most appearances nationally;
- Won or shared six conference titles;
- Won conference games since than any other MWC program;
- The Rams rank among the top 15 programs nationally in total victories since 1994;
- Seven times since 1994, the team has won eight or more games in a season. Four times - the only times in school history it has happened- the Rams have won 10 (three times) or more (11) games in a season.
- Twice, in 1999 and again in 2002, the Rams completed a "Front Range" sweep by beating Air Force, Colorado and Wyoming.
- In 2002 for the first time in school history, Colorado State owned wins over AFA, BYU, Colorado, Utah and Wyoming in the same season.

MWC head coach. The veteran coach also ranks among the national leaders in career victories.

The Rams' program has attained lofty status with 10 consecutive winning seasons from 1994-2002, among the highest totals in the nation.

Success on the field has been transformed into overall popularity of the program. Colorado State, since Lubick's arrival, has appeared in 97 regional and national television games.

In 2003, Colorado State finished among the top 15 programs nationally in percent capacity, 102.1, having drawn more than 183,000 fans for 6 home games, 30,631 per contest. All of those figures rank among the top three in school history.

Additionally, the top eight home season and individual game attendance records have come during Lubick's career at Colorado State.
