No. 24 Colorado Heads To Kansas State; Hosts Texas A&M

UP NEXT: No. 24 Colorado (14-8, 10-7 Big 12) will head to Manhattan, Kan. for a match against Kansas State (17-9, 8-8 Big 12) on Wed., Nov. 16 at 6 p.m. MT. The Buffs come home for their final home match against Texas A&M (12-12, 5-10 Big 12) on Sat., Nov. 19 at 7 p.m. It will be senior night as **Nicole Carr**, **Allie Griffin**, **Kelly Masumiya** and **Lynsey Mann** play in their final home-match as a Buff.

COLORADO MOVES UP TO 24: Colorado has moved up to 24th in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. Last week the Buffs earned their first ranking of the season at 25 and received votes for three weeks prior to being ranked.

The 24th-place ranking is the best for CU since the Buffs were ranked 23 in Sept. 2002.

The Big 12 Conference has five teams that are either listed in the top 25 or are receiving votes.

ON THE SEASON: Colorado is 14-8 overall and is 10-7 in the Big 12. CU is currently fourth in the Big 12 and is ranked at 24 in the national poll.

The Buffs are 8-2 in their last 10 matches. Texas just ended a seven-match win streak for the Buffs on Nov. 9, but CU rebounded with a sweep of Baylor on Nov. 12.

CU has defeated three ranked teams in its last eight matches; with two of those wins coming on the road. CU took two consecutive matches against ranked opponents for the first time since 1996 when the Buffs stunned Kansas State and Texas A&M on Oct. 12 and 16.

The first of the two consecutive wins against ranked teams came against No. 20 Kansas State. It was the first win over a ranked opponent this season for Colorado as the Buffs beat the Wildcats 30-14, 30-25, 25-30, 28-30, 15-5. CU followed it up with a win at 24th-ranked Texas A&M. The Buffs rallied back from a 0-2 deficit and won 20-30, 25-30, 30-26, 30-28, 15-10.

Colorado's most recent victory against a ranked team came on Oct. 29 as the Buffs shocked eighth-ranked Missouri 20-30, 30-28, 23-30, 30-27, 15-12 in Columbia, Mo.

CU played in front of 2,571, the fourth largest crowd in MU history.

Five of Colorado's losses have come to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents. CU's first loss of the season came at the hands of third-rated and defending national champion Stanford. The Buffs fell in four to 18th-ranked Texas in Austin on Sept. 14 and then again on Nov. 9 in five when UT was ranked 11 and CU was 25. Colorado came back home to face its second and third consecutive ranked opponents in top-ranked Nebraska and eighth-ranked Missouri. CU fell in three to both opponents.

Senior right side hitter **Allie Griffin** is averaging 4.85 kills per game while hitting .300 on the year. She ranks second in the Big 12 in kills and is 11th in hitting percentage. Griffin has hit more than 20 kills in nine matches this season; including a career-high 29 against Kansas State on Oct. 12. She notched her 1,000th-career kill with her first kill in the fifth game against Kansas on Oct. 1. Sophomore **Amber Sutherland** is averaging 3.67 per game. Sutherland ranks ninth in the league in kills. Colorado's 15.90 kills per game is fourth in the Big 12.

Freshman middle blocker **Lauren Schaefer** leads the Buffs with 76 total blocks (10 solo and 66 assists) on the season. She is averaging 0.94 blocks per game. Junior middle blocker **Lara Bossow** has four block solos and 67 assists on the season. The Buffs are averaging 2.32 blocks per game and are 10th in the Big 12.

Junior setter **Ashley Nu'u** has passed out 1,153 assists this season to average 13.25 per game. She currently ranks third in the Big 12 and leads Colorado to a .258 attack percentage that ranks fourth in the league.

The Buffaloes' defense is led by senior **Nicole Carr**. Carr has picked up 236 digs (2.71 per game) this season and has played five games as the team's libero. Carr notched her 1,000th-career dig on Oct. 1 versus Kansas. Sutherland is second with 235 digs (2.73 per game). Sophomore libero **Therese Vinal** has collected 181. The Buffs are eighth in the Big 12 with 13.60 digs per game.

LAST TIME OUT: The 25th-ranked University of Colorado handled Baylor University 30-25, 30-21, 30-27 in Waco, Texas.

The Buffs hit .267 in the match and recorded 51 kills on 120 attempts with 19 errors. CU picked up 42 digs to BU's 41 and both teams notched 11 blocks. Colorado is 8-0 when it takes the first two games.

Colorado started off with a 3-1 lead, but Baylor answered back with a 7-1 run to take an 8-4 lead; causing CU to use an early timeout. The Bears continued to pull ahead, but the Buffaloes answered back and tied the score at 16 with a block from Lynsey Mann. CU eventually pulled ahead with a 23-20 lead, forcing Baylor to use its last timeout of the game. The Buffs held strong and finished the game 30-25. CU put up seven blocks in the set.

The Buffs started the second game strong and lead the whole way. The Bears came within two points a couple of times, but CU pulled away. The Buffs increased their lead to seven points at 26-19 with an ace from Alex Buth. CU finished the set with a pair of aces from Kelly Masumiya. Colorado hit .441 in the game with 19 kills and just four errors.

The third game was a back and forth affair. Neither side had larger than a three-point lead until Baylor took a 24-20 advantage. The Buffs rallied back with three straight points and the Bears took a timeout. After the timeout, CU took another three points and regained the lead at 26-20 and BU used its final timeout. The Bears came back within one at 28-27, but the Buffs sealed the game at 30-27.

Amber Sutherland recorded a match-high 15 kills and hit .407. Allie Griffin notched 11 kills, five assists, eight digs and five blocks in the win. Lara Bossow tallied seven kills, three digs and five blocks. Mann collected six kills and four blocks while hitting .600. Ashley Nu'u passed out 39 assists and added five kills, three digs and two blocks.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: Kansas State is 17-9 overall and is 8-8 in the Big 12. The Wildcats are receiving votes in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. They are hitting .228 in the conference and hold their opponents to a .209 attack percentage. K-State is led by Agata Rezende. She averages 3.73 kills per game and hits .292. Rezende adds 1.00 digs and 0.90 blocks per game. Stacey Spiegelberg has dished out 12.38 assists per game and Angie Lastra leads the team with 4.04 digs per game.

ABOUT THE AGGIES: Texas A&M is 12-12 overall and is 5-10 in the Big 12. The Aggies are led by senior All-American Laura Jones. Jones leads the Big 12 with 6.65 points and 5.95 kills per game while hitting .264. Christi Hahn is the team blocks leader with 74 (0.84 per game) and hits at a .291 clip. Holly Clay is digging 4.18 balls per game for the Aggies.

SERIES RECORDS: Colorado is 23-15 against Kansas State and have won two in the last five meetings. Both of the wins for the Buffs have been while K-State has been ranked in the top-25.

Texas A&M owns a 14-6 advantage over CU in the series. Colorado has won two of its last five contests against the Aggies, including a win at College Station.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST TIME: The last time the Buffs faces K-State and Texas A&M, both teams were ranked and CU recorded two five-game upsets.

On Oct. 12, at the Coors Events Center, CU dropped then-20th-ranked K-State 30-14, 30-25, 25-30, 28-30, 15-5. Allie Griffin recorded a career-high 29 kills. Lara Bossow was errorless with 16 kills on 23 attempts to hit .696. Amber Sutherland picked up a double-double with 13 kills and 18 digs.

Colorado took to College Station, Texas, on Oct. 16 and rallied back from a 0-2 deficit to knock off then-24th-ranked Texas A&M 20-30, 25-30, 30-26, 30-28, 15-10. Griffin hammered another 21 kills and added 14 digs and five block assists. Sutherland added another double-double with 15 kills and 16 digs. Bossow and Nicole Carr notched 13 and 11 kills, respectively.

Griffin was named the Collegiate Volleyball Update (CVU.com) National Player of the Week for her performances in the

matches. She was also featured in Sports Illustrated last week in the Faces In the Crowd section for those performances.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Pi'i Aiu (pronounced P-E I-U) is in his ninth season as Colorado's head coach sporting a career record of 162-99. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to seven NCAA Tournaments in eight seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported three All-Americans, nine All-Region, and 20 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu, who has led the Buffs to a 108-69 record in Big 12 matches, is joined on the bench this season by sixth-year assistant Jil Thomason and second-year assistant, and USA Olympian, Erik Sullivan.

Aiu is 7-10 against K-State and is 6-11 against the Aggies.

BUFFS AT HOME: Colorado will call the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 18th straight season. The Buffs are 185-62 all-time at the CECC for a winning percentage of .750.

CU's 2005 Opponents in Bold

SECOND TIME IS A CHARM: The Buffs are getting redemption from some of its earlier losses this season. CU lost to Texas, Nebraska, Missouri, Iowa State, Kansas and Texas Tech in the first half of the Big 12 schedule. The second time around, the Buffs defeated Iowa State, Missouri, Kansas and Texas Tech. The Buffs were unable to defeat Texas the second time around and will face Nebraska on Nov. 23.

WHAT A SCHEDULE!: Colorado faces some of the toughest competition in the country in the 2005 season. Three of its Big 12 opponents are currently ranked in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. Nebraska is the number one team in the land, followed by Texas (10) and Missouri (11). CU will face fourth-ranked Florida in a non-conference match-up on Nov. 25. The Buffs fell to then-third-ranked Stanford on Sept. 8 at the Colorado Invitational. Kansas State, Kansas and Texas A&M have also been ranked this season.

MORE THAN LAST YEAR: The Buffs have recorded more Big 12 wins this year than last with 10 and still have three matches left. Last season CU went 9-11 in conference play and this year owns a 10-7 record. Colorado has also tallied the same amount of overall wins as last year with 14. There are still five matches left in the regular season.

ONE HUGE WEEK: Colorado recorded two consecutive wins against CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents for the first time since 1996. CU upset then-20th-ranked Kansas State at home in five games. Then the Buffs took to the road and upset then-24th-ranked Texas A&M in front of 1,605. CU rallied from a 0-2 deficit to defeat the Aggies.

GIVE ME FIVE: Five seems to be the Colorado Buffaloes favorite number this season. Colorado has played nine five-game matches out of 21 matches this season. The Buffs also played five consecutive five-game contests between Oct. 1-16. Both are school records. CU is 6-3 in those matches. Colorado has rallied back from 0-2 deficits against Marquette and Texas A&M.

ONE GRAND FOR ME, ONE GRAND FOR YOU: Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin recorded career milestones on Oct. 1, as the Buffs battled against Kansas. Carr picked up her 1,000th-career dig with her 14th dig in the match. Griffin hammered her 1,000th-career kill with her 25th kill of the match. Both became the 12th player in CU history to record each milestone.

CHASING HISTORY: Several current Buffs are in the CU record books, but they are looking to move up this season. Seniors Allie Griffin and Nicole Carr are moving up in the career kills list. Griffin owns 1,214 kills for ninth on the list and Carr is 13th with 945. Carr is also ninth on the digs list with 1,112. Ashley Nu'u is fifth on the all-time career assists chart with 2,668.

FINISHING IT OFF: Colorado finished its match against No. 20 Kansas State with a 15-5 victory in the fifth game. The 10-point gap was the largest fifth-game difference recorded among Big 12 Conference teams this season to that point.

INDURANCE TEST: The CU volleyball team is showing off its off-season conditioning as the Buffs get deeper into the season. The Buffs played a school-record five straight five-game matches against Kansas, Baylor, Texas Tech, Kansas State and Texas A&M. CU has won three of the matches, including two consecutive contests against KSU and TAMU. Both were ranked in the top-25 at the time of CU's victories.

BUFF BITS: Five of CU's losses have been to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll ranked teams...Colorado won the American University Classic and took second at Colorado Invitational...Nicole Carr was named the American University Classic Most Valuable Player. Amber Sutherland and Allie Griffin were also named to the all-tournament team...Sutherland and Griffin were also named the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament Team...The Buffs snapped a three-match losing streak on Sept. 24 against Oklahoma in five games. The win was the first in the Big 12 for the Buffs this season...Alex Buth served five aces against Oklahoma, which is the most any Buff has served in a single match since the 2000 season. Lara Bossow tallied five in a five-game win over Missouri...The loss to Iowa State snapped an 18-match win-streak against the Cyclones for the Buffs...Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin each notched career milestones on Oct. 1 against Kansas. Carr recorded her 1,000th-career dig, while Griffin hammered her 1,000th-career kill...Ashley Nu'u tallied a career-high 68 assists in the same match

Head coach Pi'i Aiu recorded his 100th Big 12 victory on Oct. 5 against Baylor...Nicole Carr needs 86 kills to become the ninth Buff to record 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs...CU has played nine five-game matches this season and five consecutive five-game matches. Both are school records...Colorado has rallied back from 0-2 deficits to win matches twice this season...Allie Griffin was named the CVU.com National Player of the Week on Oct. 18...Colorado beat back-to-back ranked teams, Kansas State and Texas A&M, for the first time since the 1996 season...The three-game win against Oklahoma on Oct. 22 was the first three-game win for CU since Aug. 27...Ashley Nu'u was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Oct. 31...The Buffs' win against eighth-ranked Missouri was its first against at top-10 team since 1997 when CU defeated No. 5 Nebraska...Colorado has won seven straight matches for the first time since 1998 when the Buffs won 10 straight...Lauren Schaefer hit .700 for a career-high with seven kills on 10 errorless attempts...No. 11 Texas defeated Colorado in five games on Nov. 9 to end its seven-match win streak...The Buffs are ranked 24th in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Poll released on Nov. 14...CU is 8-0 win it takes the first two games.

20TH ANNIVERSARY: The 2005 season marks the 20th campaign for the Colorado volleyball program. Since debuting as a varsity program in the fall of 1986, the Buffs have an overall record of 373-228 (.621) including one conference title (Big Eight in 1993). CU has advanced to 14 NCAA Tournaments in 16 years, 13 of which have come since 1991. The Buffs are one of only 14 NCAA Division I programs with at least 13 NCAA appearances since 1991.

GRIFFIN AND NU'U NAMED TO THE PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM: University of Colorado senior Allie Griffin and junior Ashley Nu'u were selected to the 2005 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference volleyball team by a vote of league coaches the conference office announced on Wednesday.

Griffin, a 6-0 right side hitter from Baton Rouge, La., earned honorable mention to the 2004 AVCA All-America team while collecting AVCA All-Central Region and All-Big 12 first team honors. She led Colorado in kills as a junior with 420, the 12th best single-season mark in team history, and showed her versatility by ranking second on the team in digs and third in blocks during the regular season. Griffin was fifth in the Big 12 in kills per game (4.27 kpg) in 2004 and is the Buffaloes active career leader in kills (797) and blocks (189).

Nu'u, a 5-10 setter from Aurora, Colo., was given honorable mention to the 2004 All-Big 12 team in her first season as a full-time starter. She ranked fifth in the Big 12 in overall assists (12.19 apg) and was sixth in league-only contests (11.79 apg). Her sophomore season total of 1,146 assists is 12th on CU's single-season list and she is currently fifth on the Buffs' career chart with 1,515. For Nu'u, this is her second Big 12 preseason honor as she was voted the league's Preseason Freshman of the Year in 2003, only to miss a good portion of the season with a back ailment.

CU PICKED SEVENTH IN 2005 BIG 12 COACHES PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish tied for seventh in the annual Big 12 Conference preseason coaches poll released on Aug. 3.

Nebraska was a unanimous pick to repeat as Big 12 champions, capturing all 10 first-place votes for 100 points (coaches do not vote for their own teams). Missouri was picked second with 88 points followed by Texas (77), Texas A&M (72), Kansas (68) and Kansas State (56). Colorado and Baylor each pulled in 43 points while Oklahoma (24), Texas Tech (21) and Iowa State (13) rounded out the poll.

CU returns six starters and 11 letterwinners from a 2004 squad that finished 14-14 overall and tied for sixth with Kansas in the final league standings at 9-11.
